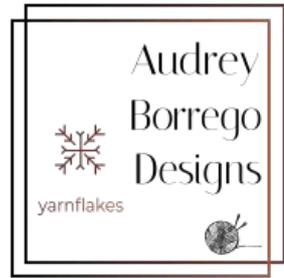


Oread



Notes

Oread is a simple drop shoulder tee knitted from the top down featuring panels of twisted stitches on the front and back sides. It starts with the shoulders and the upper body worked flat with a round neck that can easily be adjusted into a lower scoop neckline. The body can be worked flat and seamed or joined in the round. The basic construction and comfortable ease makes for a light flowy garment best worked with drapery yarns.

Yarn :

You will need :

680 (750 / 820 / 920 / 1020), 1140 (1250 / 1350 / 1480 / 1600) meters

745 (820 / 900 / 1010 / 1115), 1250 (1370 / 1480 / 1620 / 1750) yds
of sport weight yarn.

The sample is knit with De Rerum Natura Antigone (260 m – 284 yds / 100 g) in Mordoré.

Needles :

Main Fabric : 3.25 mm (US 3) circular needles with appropriate length to knit in the round.

Ribbing : 3 mm (US 2.5) circular needles with appropriate length to knit in the round.
or size required to get gauge

Gauge :

21.5 sts x 33 rows per 10 cm – 4" with larger needles in stockinette after blocking

One cable panel : 30 sts = 11 cm – 4 1/4" wide

Notions :

Stitch markers, tapestry needle and scissors

Scrap yarn to place sts on hold

Cable needle (optional)

Row counter recommended

Techniques used :

Top down drop shoulder tee

German Twisted Cast-on, Knitted Cast-on, Backwards Loop Cast-on

Round neck shaping

Motif panel with Right and Left Twists as well as 3 twisted-st cables

Body worked flat and seamed with mattress stitch OR joined at the armholes and worked in the round

Slipped stitches

Picking up stitches

Twisted ribbing

German short rows in pattern on the shoulders (optional)

Pattern includes charted and written instructions

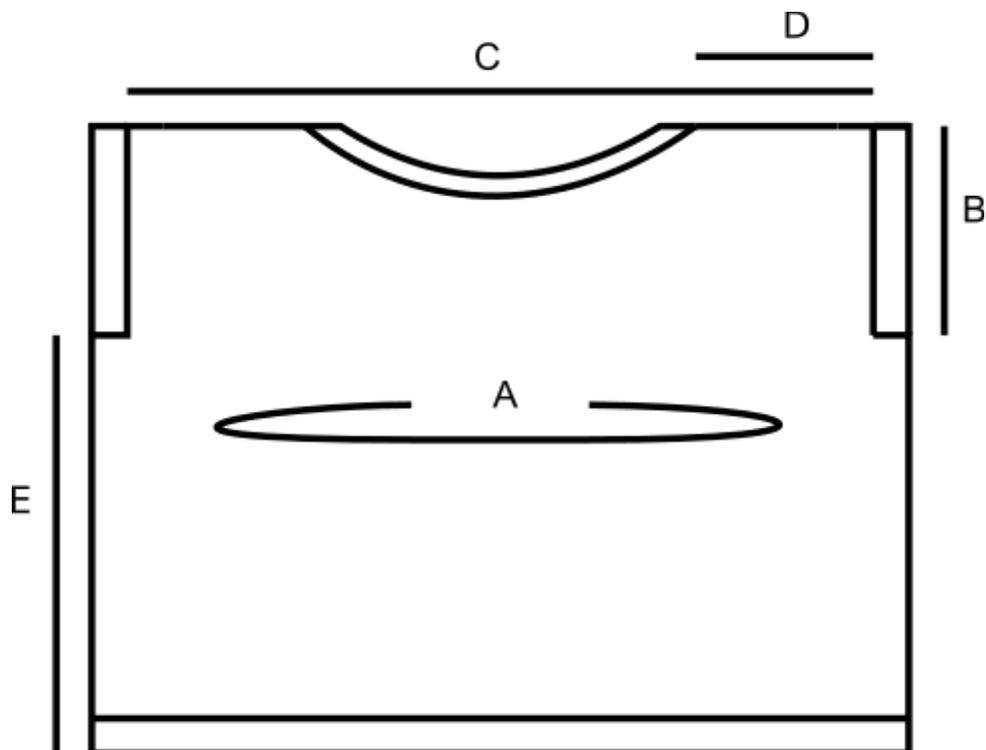
Sizes :

1 (2 / 3 / 4 / 5), 6 (7 / 8 / 9 / 10)

All measurements are those of the finished tee.

Choose a size with up to 25 cm – 9 ¾" positive ease at bust.

Shown in size 3 on a 90 cm – 35 ½" bust.

Abbreviations :

- CO : cast-on
- st(s) : stitch(es) / rnd(s) : round(s)
- BOR : beginning of round
- RS : right side / WS : wrong side
- m : marker / pm : place marker / sm : slip marker
- inc : increase
- k : knit stitch / p : purl stitch
- ktbl : knit the st through its back loop / ptbl : purl the st through its back loop
- sl1wyib : slip the st purlwise with yarn in back
- RT (see tutorial below) : right twist, knit 2 sts together without dropping the stitches off the needle, then knit into the first stitch again
- LT (see tutorial below) : left twist, ktbl the second st on the left needle, then k2togtbl with the first stitch of the left needle
- 2/1 RT : slip the next st onto a cable needle and hold in back, k2tbl from left needle then k1 from cable needle
- 2/1 LT : slip the next 2 sts onto a cable needle and hold in front, k1 from left needle then k2tbl from cable needle
- p2tog : purl the next 2 sts together (1 decrease)
- DS : double stitch for German short rows (counts as 1 st)
- *-* : repeat instructions between asterisks

Notes :

Left and Right refer to the top when worn.

Reading the Charts :

When knitting flat, read the Charts back and forth : RS rows from right to left and WS rows from left to right.

Back Right Shoulder

With the main needles, CO 42 (**48** / 52 / **52** / 54), **56** (60 / **62** / 64 / **66**) sts using the [German Twisted Cast-on](#).

(German Twisted Cast-on tutorial by Very Pink Knits)

Note: the following set-up instructions between the markers correspond to row 2 of the Shoulder Chart.

set-up row (WS) : p7 (**10** / 12 / **12** / 13), **14** (16 / **17** / 18 / **19**), pm, p2tbl, k2, p2tbl, k1, p1tbl, (k2, p2tbl) x 3, k2, p1tbl, k1, p2tbl, k2, p2tbl, pm, p5 (**8** / 10 / **10** / 11), **12** (14 / **15** / 16 / **17**)

shoulder row 1 (RS) : knit to m, sm, Shoulder Chart to m, sm, knit to end

shoulder row 2 (WS) : purl to m, sm, Shoulder Chart to m, sm, purl to end

Work shoulder rows 1-2 once more.

Adding short rows :

I do not recommend working short rows when knitting with linen. If you are working in a smoother yarn, consider adding some on each shoulder as follows.

(German short-rows tutorial by Very Pink Knits)

short row 1 (RS) : work as established to last 6 sts, turn

short row 2 (WS) : DS, work as established to end

short row 3 : work as established to 3 (**3** / 3 / **3** / 4), **4** (6 / **6** / 8 / **8**) sts before last DS, turn

short row 4 : DS, work as established to end

Work short rows 3-4 two more times.

Resolve DS on the next row (shoulder row 3) by working them normally as one st.

You will start working the Main Chart from row 1.

shoulder row 3 (RS) : CO 2 sts using the [knitted cast-on](#), knit to m, sm, Main Chart to m, sm, knit to end (2 inc)

(Knitted Cast-on Tutorial by Very Pink Knits)

shoulder row 4 (WS) : purl to m, sm, Main Chart to m, sm, purl to end

Work shoulder rows 3-4 once more.

46 (**52** / 56 / **56** / 58), **60** (64 / **66** / 68 / **70**) sts

Cut yarn and put sts on hold.

Back Left Shoulder

With the main needles, CO 42 (**48** / 52 / **52** / 54), **56** (60 / **62** / 64 / **66**) sts using the [German Twisted Cast-on](#).

set-up row (WS) : p5 (**8** / 10 / **10** / 11), **12** (14 / **15** / 16 / **17**), pm, p2tbl, k2, p2tbl, k1, p1tbl, (k2, p2tbl) x 3, k2, p1tbl, k1, p2tbl, k2, p2tbl, pm, p7 (**10** / 12 / **12** / 13), **14** (16 / **17** / 18 / **19**)

shoulder row 1 (RS) : knit to m, sm, Shoulder Chart to m, sm, knit to end

shoulder row 2 (WS) : purl to m, sm, Shoulder Chart to m, sm, purl to end

Work shoulder rows 1-2 once more.

If adding short rows, only repeat shoulder row 1.

Adding short rows :

short row 1 (WS) : work as established to last 6 sts, turn

short row 2 (RS) : DS, work as established to end

short row 3 : work as established to 3 (**3** / 3 / **3** / 4), **4** (6 / **6** / 8 / **8**) sts before last DS, turn

short row 4 : DS, work as established to end

Work short rows 3-4 two more times.

Work shoulder row 2 once more, resolving the DS by working them normally as one st.

You will start working the Main Chart from row 1.

shoulder row 3 (RS) : knit to m, sm, Main Chart to m, sm, knit to end

shoulder row 4 (WS) : CO 2 sts using the [knitted cast-on](#), purl to m, sm, Main Chart to m, sm, purl to end (2 inc)

Work shoulder rows 3-4 once more.

46 (**52** / 56 / **56** / 58), **60** (64 / **66** / 68 / **70**) sts

Joining back shoulders

You will join the two back shoulders by casting-on extra sts for the neck.

Back Left Shoulder sts (RS) : knit to m, sm, Main Chart to m, sm, knit to end

With the Back Left Shoulder sts still on the right hand needle :

CO 16 (**16** / 16 / **18** / 18), **18** (20 / **22** / 24 / **26**) sts using the [backwards loop cast-on](#), (*Backwards Loop Cast-on tutorial by Very Pink Knits*)

Place the Back Right Shoulder sts on the left hand needle with RS facing, joining them to the newly cast-on sts, and work them as follows :

knit to m, sm, Main Chart to m, sm, knit to end

108 (**120** / 128 / **130** / 134), **138** (148 / **154** / 160 / **166**) sts

Upper Back

upper back row 1 (WS) : (purl to m, sm, Main Chart to m, sm) x 2, purl to end

upper back row 2 (RS) : (knit to m, sm, Main Chart to m, sm) x 2, knit to end

Work upper back rows 1-2 until the upper back measures about 19 (**20** / 21 / **22** / 23), **25** (26 / **27** / 28 / **28**) cm – 7 1/2 (7 3/4 / 8 1/4 / **8 3/4** / 9), **9 3/4** (10 1/4 / **10 3/4** / 11 / **11**)", measuring from cast-on along the armhole edge and ending after a WS row.

Count how many rows you work or note where you stop in the Chart so you can replicate the length on the upper front later.

Note : Here is where you can choose to work the body in the round if you prefer to. See instructions for this modification on page 10.

Lower Back

You will cast-on a few sts at the edges for the underarms, then work a slipped st edge to prepare for seaming.

set-up row 1 (RS) : CO 2 (**2** / 3 / **7** / 10), **12** (12 / **14** / 15 / **18**) sts using the [knitted cast-on](#), (knit to m, sm, Main Chart to m, sm) x 2, knit to end

set-up row 2 (WS) : CO 2 (**2** / 3 / **7** / 10), **12** (12 / **14** / 15 / **18**) sts using the [knitted cast-on](#), (purl to m, sm, Main Chart to m, sm) x 2, purl to end

112 (**124** / 134 / **144** / 154), **162** (172 / **182** / 192 / **202**) sts

back row 1 (RS) : sl1wyib, (knit to m, sm, Main Chart to m, sm) x 2, knit to last st, sl1wyib

back row 2 (WS) : (purl to m, sm, Main Chart to m, sm) x 2, purl to end

Work back rows 1-2 until the back body measures 25 cm – 9 3/4" from the underarm cast-on sts or 3 cm – 1 1/4" less than desired body length, ending after a WS row.

Count how many rows you work or note where you stop in the Chart so you can replicate the length on the front later.

Back Hem

Switch to smaller needles. Remove markers on the following row.

set-up row (RS) : sl1wyib, p2tog, *k1tbl, p1* to last st, sl1wyib

111 (**123** / 133 / **143** / 153), **161** (171 / **181** / 191 / **201**) sts

hem row 1 (WS) : p1, *k1, p1tbl* to last 2 sts, k1, p1

hem row 2 (RS) : sl1wyib, *p1, k1tbl* to last 2 sts, p1, sl1wyib

Work hem rows 1-2 until hem measures 3 cm – 1 ¼" or desired hem length, ending after a WS row.

Loosely bind-off all sts in pattern.

Front Left Shoulder

With the main needles, looking at the RS and starting at the neckline edge, pick up and knit 42 (**48** / 52 / **52** / 54), **56** (60 / **62** / 64 / **66**) sts from the back left shoulder cast-on.

set-up row (WS) : p7 (**10** / 12 / **12** / 13), **14** (16 / **17** / 18 / **19**), pm, p2tbl, k2, p2tbl, k1, p1tbl, (k2, p2tbl) x 3, k2, p1tbl, k1, p2tbl, k2, p2tbl, pm, p5 (**8** / 10 / **10** / 11), **12** (14 / **15** / 16 / **17**)

shoulder row 1 (RS) : knit to m, sm, Shoulder Chart to m, sm, knit to end

shoulder row 2 (WS) : purl to m, sm, Shoulder Chart to m, sm, purl to end

Work shoulder rows 1-2 once more.

Adding short rows :

Work short rows like you did for the Back Right Shoulder.

You will start working the Main Chart from row 1.

shoulder row 3 (RS) : knit to m, sm, Main Chart to m, sm, knit to end

shoulder row 4 (WS) : purl to m, sm, Main Chart to m, sm, purl to end

Work shoulder rows 3-4 until the Front Left Shoulder measures 5 (**6** / 6 / 7 / 7), 7 (8 / **8** / 8 / **8**) cm – 2 (**2** / 2 / **2 ¾** / 2 ¾), **2 ¾** (3 ¼ / **3 ¼** / 3 ¼ / **3 ¼**)" from picked up sts, measuring along the armhole edge and ending after a WS row.

Note : if you want a more open, lower scoop neckline, add extra length here.

Count how many rows you work or note where you stop in the Chart so you can replicate the length on the other front later.

Neck shaping

row 1 (RS) : CO 1 st using the [knitted cast-on](#), knit to m, sm, Main Chart to m, sm, knit to end (*1 inc*)

row 2 (WS) : purl to m, sm, Main Chart to m, sm, purl to end

row 3 : knit to m, sm, Main Chart to m, sm, knit to end

row 4 : purl to m, sm, Main Chart to m, sm, purl to end

Work rows 1 to 4 once more.

44 (**50** / 54 / **54** / 56), **58** (62 / **64** / 66 / **68**) sts

row 9 (RS) : CO 1 st, knit to m, sm, Main Chart to m, sm, knit to end (*1 inc*)

row 10 (WS) : purl to m, sm, Main Chart to m, sm, purl to end

Work rows 9-10 three more times.

48 (**54** / 58 / **58** / 60), **62** (66 / **68** / 70 / **72**) sts

SIZES 7 TO 10 ONLY

Work rows 9-10 two more times.

- (- / - / - / -), - (68 / 70 / 72 / **74**) sts

ALL SIZES RESUME

Cut yarn and put sts on hold.

Front Right Shoulder

With the main needles, looking at the RS and starting at the armhole edge, pick up and knit 42 (**48** / 52 / **52** / 54), **56** (60 / **62** / 64 / **66**) sts from the back right shoulder cast-on.

set-up row (WS) : p5 (**8** / 10 / **10** / 11), **12** (14 / **15** / 16 / **17**), pm, p2tbl, k2, p2tbl, k1, p1tbl, (k2, p2tbl) x 3, k2, p1tbl, k1, p2tbl, k2, p2tbl, pm, p7 (**10** / 12 / **12** / 13), **14** (16 / **17** / 18 / **19**)

shoulder row 1 (RS) : knit to m, sm, Shoulder Chart to m, sm, knit to end

shoulder row 2 (WS) : purl to m, sm, Shoulder Chart to m, sm, purl to end

Work shoulder rows 1-2 once more.

If adding short rows, only repeat shoulder row 1.

Adding short rows :

Work short rows like you did for the Back Left Shoulder.

You will start working the Main Chart from row 1.

shoulder row 3 (RS) : knit to m, sm, Main Chart to m, sm, knit to end

shoulder row 4 (WS) : purl to m, sm, Main Chart to m, sm, purl to end

Work straight like you did for the left shoulder, stopping on the same Chart row.

Neck shaping

row 1 (RS) : knit to m, sm, Main Chart to m, sm, knit to end

row 2 (WS) : CO 1 st using the [knitted cast-on](#), purl to m, sm, Main Chart to m, sm, purl to end (*1 inc*)

row 3 : knit to m, sm, Main Chart to m, sm, knit to end

row 4 : purl to m, sm, Main Chart to m, sm, purl to end

Work rows 1 to 4 once more.

44 (**50** / 54 / **54** / 56), **58** (62 / **64** / 66 / **68**) sts

row 9 (RS) : knit to m, sm, Main Chart to m, sm, knit to end

row 10 (WS) : CO 1 st, purl to m, sm, Main Chart to m, sm, purl to end (*1 inc*)

Work rows 9-10 three more times.

48 (**54** / 58 / **58** / 60), **62** (66 / **68** / 70 / **72**) sts

SIZES 7 TO 9 ONLY

Work rows 9-10 two more times.

- (- / - / - / -), - (68 / **70** / 72 / **74**) sts

ALL SIZES RESUME

Joining Front Shoulders

You will join the two front shoulders by casting-on extra sts for the neck.

Front Right Shoulder sts (RS) : knit to m, sm, Main Chart to m, sm, knit to end

With the Front Right Shoulder sts still on the right hand needle :

CO 18 (**18** / 18 / **20** / 22), **24** (24 / **24** / 28 / **30**) sts using the [backwards loop cast-on](#).

Place the Front Left Shoulder sts on the left hand needle with RS facing, joining them to the newly cast-on sts, and work them as follows :

knit to m, sm, Main Chart to m, sm, knit to end

114 (**126** / 134 / **136** / 142), **148** (160 / **164** / 174 / **178**) sts

Upper Front

upper front row 1 (WS) : (purl to m, sm, Main Chart to m, sm) x 2, purl to end

upper front row 2 (RS) : (knit to m, sm, Main Chart to m, sm) x 2, knit to end

Work upper front rows 1-2 until the upper front's length matches the upper back's, stopping on the same Chart row.

Lower Front

set-up row 1 (RS) : CO 2 (2 / 3 / 7 / 10), 12 (12 / 14 / 15 / 18) sts using the [knitted cast-on](#), (knit to m, sm, Main Chart to m, sm) x 2, knit to end

set-up row 2 (WS) : CO 2 (2 / 3 / 7 / 10), 12 (12 / 14 / 15 / 18) sts using the [knitted cast-on](#), (purl to m, sm, Main Chart to m, sm) x 2, purl to end

118 (130 / 140 / 150 / 162), 172 (184 / 192 / 204 / 214) sts

front row 1 (RS) : sl1wyib, (knit to m, sm, Main Chart to m, sm) x 2, knit to last st, sl1wyib

front row 2 (WS) : (purl to m, sm, Main Chart to m, sm) x 2, purl to end

Work front rows 1-2 until the front body length matches the back's, stopping on the same row.

Front Hem

Switch to smaller needles. Remove markers on the following row.

set-up row (RS) : sl1wyib, p2tog, *k1tbl, p1* to last st, sl1wyib

117 (129 / 129 / 149 / 161), 171 (183 / 191 / 203 / 213) sts

hem row 1 (WS) : p1, *k1, p1tbl* to last 2 sts, k1, p1

hem row 2 (RS) : sl1wyib, *p1, k1tbl* to last 2 sts, p1, sl1wyib

Work hem rows 1-2 until the front hem's length matches the back's.

Loosely bind-off all sts in pattern.

Seaming the Sides

Using [mattress stitch](#), seam both sides of the body from underarm to hem. Use the slipped stitch edges as a guide.

(*Mattress stitch tutorial by Very Pink Knits*)

Collar

With larger needles and RS facing, start at the right shoulder seam and pick up and knit

2 out of 3 sts from back right curve, 16 (16 / 16 / 18 / 18), 18 (20 / 22 / 24 / 26) sts from back neck CO,

2 out of 3 sts from back left curve and front left curve,

18 (18 / 18 / 20 / 22), 24 (24 / 24 / 28 / 30) sts from front neck CO,

2 out of 3 sts from front right curve.

Make sure to pick up an even number of sts.

Join to work in the rnd and PM for BOR.

collar rnd : *k1tbl, p1* to end

Work the collar rnd 3 total times.

Using a larger needle size if necessary and a [simple stretchy bind-off](#), loosely bind-off all sts in pattern.

(*simple stretchy bind-off tutorial by Very Pink Knits*)

Sleeves

With smaller needles and RS facing, start at the underarm seam and pick up and knit 2 out of 3 sts around the armholes, making sure to pick up an even number of sts.

Join to work in the rnd and PM for BOR.

sleeve rnd : *k1tbl, p1* to end

Work the sleeve rnd until the ribbing measures 3 cm – 1 1/4" or desired length.

Loosely bind-off all sts in pattern.

Repeat for second sleeve.

Finishing

Weave in all ends and gently block the tee.

Working the body in the round

Once you have completed the upper back, cut yarn and place sts on hold then work the upper front.

Once the upper front is complete, join the body as follows :

front sts (RS) : (knit to m, sm, Main Chart to m, sm) x 2, knit to end

CO 2 (2 / 4 / 12 / 18), **22** (22 / **26** / 28 / **34**) underarm sts using the [backwards loop cast-on](#).

Replace back sts on the left needle with RS facing, joining them to the newly cast-on sts and work them as follows :

(knit to m, sm, Main Chart to m, sm) x 2, knit to end

CO 2 (2 / 4 / 12 / 18), **22** (22 / **26** / 28 / **34**) underarm sts.

Join to work in the round and PM for BOR.

226 (**250** / 270 / **290** / 312), **330** (352 / **370** / 392 / **412**) sts

Reading the Chart :

You will work from the Main Chart, but in the round instead of back and forth. When knitting in the round, always read the chart from right to left.

body rnd : (knit to m, sm, Main Chart to m, sm) x 4, knit to end

Work the body rnd until until the body measures 25 cm – 9 ¾" or 3 cm – 1 ¼" less than desired body length, ending with any even rnd of the Chart.

Switch to smaller needles.

hem rnd : *k1tbl, p1* to end

Work the hem rnd until it measures 3 cm – 1 ¼".

Loosely bind-off all sts in pattern.

Finish the sleeve cuffs and neckline as per main instructions.

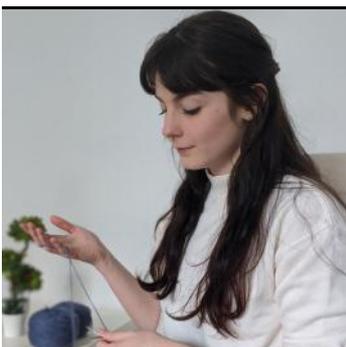
