OSLO HAT



Sizes: baby (child) junior small (junior large) adult S (adult M) adult L

Measurements: Fits head circumference 47-48 (49-50) 51-52 (53-54) 55-56 (57-59) 60-63 cm [18½-19 (19¼-19¾) 20-20½ (20¾-21¼) 21¾-22 (22½-23¼) 23½-24¾ inches]

Gauge: 23 sts x 32 rows = 10 x 10 cm [4 x 4 inches] in stockinette stitch on 3 mm [US3] needles

Needles: Circular needles: 3 mm [US3] / 40 cm [16 inches]

Double-pointed needles: 3 mm [US3]

Materials: **Suggestion 1:** 50 (50) 50 (50) 50 (100) 100 g Sunday by Sandnes Yarn (50 g = 235 m [257 yds]) **or** 50 (50) 50 (50) 100 (100) 100 Arwetta by Filcolana (50 g = 210 m [230 yds]) **held together with** 25 (25) 25 (25-50) 50 (50) 50 g Tilia by Filcolana (25 g = 210 m [232 yds]) **or** Brushed Lace by Mohair by Canard (25 g = 210 m [232 yds]) **or** Silk Mohair by Isager Yarn (25 g = 212 m [232 yds]) **or** Tynn Silk Mohair by Sandnes Garn (25 g = 210 m [232 yds])

Suggestion 2: 100 (100) 100 (150) 150 (150) 150 g Double Sunday by Sandnes Garn (50 g = 108 m [118 yds]) (knitted with one strand) **or** Arwetta by Filcolana (50 g = 210 m [230 yds]) (knitted with two strands held together) **or** Sunday by Sandnes Garn (50 g = 235 m [257 yds]) (knitted with two strands held together)

PATTERN

The Oslo Hat is worked from the bottom up in stockinette stitch. The first part of the hat is worked on a 40 cm [16 inches] circular needle, while the top of the hat is worked either on double-pointed needles or on a circular needle using the Magic Loop technique.

Hat

Cast on 92 (96) 100 (104) 108 (112) 120 sts on a 3 mm [US3] / 40 cm [16 inches] circular needle. Join to work in the round and place a marker for the beginning of the round.

Work 16 (17) 18 (19) 20 (20) 21 cm [6¼ (6¾) 7 (7½) 7¾ (7¾) 8¼ inches] in stockinette stitch.

Now knit together the sts of the next round and the sts from the cast-on edge, stitch by stitch, with the RS facing out as follows (see video on www.petiteknit.com):

Using the right needle pick up the first stitch of the cast-on edge and slip it onto the left needle, then knit this stitch together with the first stitch on the left needle. Continue in this way, picking up the sts of the cast-on edge one by one and knitting each together with the next stitch on the left needle until all the sts from the cast-on edge have been knitted together with a stitch on the needle – taking care not to knit the edges together crookedly.

Work 2 cm [¾ inch] in stockinette stitch measured from where the cast-on edge has been knitted together.

Turn the work using the German Short Rows technique (see video on www.petiteknit.com). This is now the RS.

Work 12 (13) 14 (14) 14 (15) 15 cm [4¾ (5) 5½ (5½) 5½ (6) 6 inches] in the round in stockinette stitch measured from where the work was turned.

Decreases

Now work decreases to shape the top of the hat. Change to 3 mm [US3] double-pointed needles when necessary.

Place a marker for every 23th (24th) 25th (26th) 27th (28th) 30th stitch to the end of the round (a total of 4 markers, counting the beginning of the round marker).

Now work decreases on **every other round** as follows:

Round 1: * K1, k2tog, knit to 3 sts before marker, slip 1 stitch knit-wise, k1, pass the slipped stitch over the knitted stitch, k1, slip marker *, repeat from * to * to end of round. (8 sts have been decreased)

Round 2: Knit across.

Work Rounds 1 and 2 a total of 7 (8) 8 (9) 9 (10) 11 times. There are now a total of 36 (32) 36 (32) 36 (32) 32 sts left on the needle.

Now work decreases on **every round** as follows:

Round 1: * K1, k2tog, knit to 3 sts before marker, slip 1 stitch knit-wise, k1, pass the slipped stitch over the knitted stitch, k1, slip marker *, repeat from * to * to end of round. (8 sts have been decreased)

Work this round a total of 2 times for all sizes. There are now a total of 20 (16) 20 (16) 20 (16) 16 sts left on the needle.

Work k2tog to end of the round. There are now a total of 10 (8) 10 (8) 10 (8) 8 sts left on the needle.

Break the yarn and pull the end through the remaining sts on the needle.

Weave in all ends.

Fold the bottom edge of the hat where the cast-on edge was knitted together with the sts on the needle.
