10 Cheese Doodle Motifs included are cheese slices, cheese wedges, blue cheese, gouda, single slice, cheese slices, spray cheese, nacho cheese, grilled cheese, and cheesecake!

HOW TO DOODLE WITH YARN

HOW DOODLE PATTERNS WORK

Doodles by Pacific Knit Co. use modular patterns & whimsical colorwork motifs to inspire makers to design and knit their perfect project in an easy to follow structure.


Base Pattern Shape + Charts + Colors = Unique Design!

Use ANY [Base Pattern](#) to add ANY Doodle charts. It's basically endless customization with just one pattern!

4 EASY STEPS TO DOODLE

- **Choose your Pattern:** Simply pick the base shape to create the canvas to build your design!
- **Choose your Motifs:** Dozens of whimsical colorwork motifs help you find your personal vibe! Mix-and-match and play with the order to create your design!
- **Choose your Yarn & Colors:** Learn to build your own color kit using single skeins, stash yarn, or leftovers, because you can use as little as 10g per color!
- **Start Knitting!** That's it!

TIPS FOR DOODLES:

- Head to [Your Ultimate Guide for How to Doodle Patterns](#) for a guided walkthrough or use the [FREE Doodle Workbook](#) to get it as a PDF!
- **Don't know where to start?** Copy the sample! After choosing your chart set, recreate the sample by using the pre-made charts included in each pattern.
- **Need inspiration?** Check out the hashtags on Instagram or Ravelry project pages to see what others have done with their Doodles!
- **Ready to design your own?** Print and cut out charts to rearrange, draw your charts on graph paper or [My Doodle Chart](#) (pg. 8), or check out the Doodle Card Deck options available on www.pacificknitco.com.
- **Not sure what colors to use?** To build a cohesive palette, start with a neutral main color as a baseline, and add 2-3 gradient fades to it for contrast colors.
- **Wondering about yardage?** This pattern is the perfect stash buster: changing yarns with every chart repeat to use just 5-10g per color.
- **Worried about contrast?** Use the Black and White filter on your phone to ensure your color choices have enough variation in values between them.
- **Want your motifs to stand out?** Make sure to hold the contrast color dominant for each chart to make it pop off the background.
- **Not ready for 3-color charts?** Try using [Duplicate Stitch](#) for the third color in a row, especially if that row only has 2-3 sts in that color.

PATTERN INFORMATION FOR STANDARD COWL

SIZE(S)

Approx. 16, 20 (24, 28, 32) in [40, 50 (60, 70, 80) cm] finished cowl circumference*

Size	Circumference	Height
Child	16 in [40 cm]	8 in [20 cm]
Teen	20 in [50 cm]	10 in [25 cm]
Adult	24 in [60 cm]	12 in [25 cm]
	28 in [70 cm]	12 in [30 cm]
	32 in [80 cm]	14 in [35 cm]

*Adjust circumference by casting on greater or fewer stitches in multiples of 12 or 24 sts (for colorwork charts). Adjust height by working chart longer or shorter than written.

YARN

Any DK, light worsted, or sport weight yarn that meets gauge. Doodles are designed to use leftover yarn, yarn adverts, or any other small batches of colorways in your stash. Yarn shown is a suggestion from the Designer. Alternative yarns are encouraged.

Recommended yarn by [Yarnaceous Fibers](#) and [Fangirl Fibers](#) Merino DK base, 100% Superwash Merino Wool, 100 g skeins, 231 yards [211 m]. Colors: Cheese Kit

Yardage listed in total yards per size in colorwork due to the customizable nature of this pattern.

- 200, 300 (430, 500, 675) yards
- 183, 274 (393, 457, 617) meters

NEEDLES

US 5 / 3.75 mm or size needed to obtain gauge
One size smaller for ribbing (optional)
16 or 24 in [40 or 60 cm] circular needles based on size

GAUGE

24 sts & 24 rnds = 4 in [10 cm] in colorwork

NOTIONS

Stitch Markers (one in different color)
Tapestry Needle

SHARING

GENERAL NOTES

Special techniques include stranded colorwork in the round and twisted ribbing.

Construction. This pattern is worked in the round, beginning with a ribbed bottom edge, followed by design-your-own stranded colorwork, and finished with ribbing along the top edge.

Charts are provided in both Standard and Inverted.

Select the chart based on the contrast between your chosen yarns, as listed below.

- Standard works well with a darker MC
- Inverted works well with a lighter MC

Catching Floats & Weaving Ends. Plan to catch floats every 5-7 stitches, or as necessary, and weaving in your ends as you go using [this](#) method.

ABBREVIATIONS

BOR	Beginning of Round
CC	Contrast Color, or “accent color”
DEC	Decrease
K	Knit
K1 TBL	Knit 1 through the back loop
K2TOG	Knit 2 together
MC	Main Color, or “background color”
P	Purl
Rnd	Round
ST(S)	Stitches

INSTRUCTIONS FOR STANDARD COWL

CAST ON

With smaller needles and lower ribbing color, cast on 96, 120 (144, 168, 192) sts using long tail cast on, or preferred method. Join to work in the round being careful not to twist sts. Place marker for BOR.

LOWER RIBBING

Work twisted ribbing (k1tbl, p1) or preferred ribbing style to end of round. Continue working ribbing for approx. [1 in 2.5 cm], or desired length.

Switch to larger needles and knit 2 rounds in ribbing color, placing marker every 24 sts on the second round.

DOODLE COLORWORK

See [How to Doodle with Yarn](#) (pg. 2) for more information about selecting and working Doodle charts.

NOTE: Join new MC/CC colors at the beginning of each new chart and break them when the chart is completed or carry up the inside, if desired. Weave in ends as you go.

Select your first Doodle chart and work it around the circumference. Once complete, work the next chart in the same manner.

Continue working colorwork charts until the cowl measures approx. 6, 8 (10, 10, 12) in [15, 20 (25, 25, 30) cm], **approx. 36, 48 (60, 60, 72) rounds**, or desired height (i.e. height of colorwork minus upper ribbing).

Break all yarns, except yarn to use for upper ribbing.

UPPER RIBBING

Knit 2 rounds in ribbing color, removing all markers except BOR. Switch to smaller needles.


Work twisted ribbing (k1tbl, p1) or preferred ribbing style to end of round. Continue working ribbing for approx. [1 in 2.5 cm], or desired length.

Bind off loosely in pattern.

FINISHING











Weave in ends and block to measurements.

SAMPLE ASSEMBLED CHART















