



STEP 1: CHOOSE YOUR BASE PATTERN

Your Base Doodle Pattern is the “blank canvas” for your design. Here, you’re not only choosing your **pattern shape**, but also **features** on your pattern, such as brim or crown, and **yarn weight**! Use this info to determine your Doodle chart height!


- DK weight
- Folded brim - 3" tall
- 4.5" colorwork (27 rnds)
- 4-part crown decrease
- Pom pom




STEP 2: CHOOSE & ARRANGE YOUR CHARTS

Your unique chart design is created by assembling your favorite Doodles.

Pick a theme (or two) and then arrange into a landscape, a story, or any other design you can think of! Multiple charts come together to build your unique chart to work from for your project!

STEP 3: CHOOSE YOUR YARN PALETTE

Your yarn and color palette impact the entire vibe of your project. Pick a neutral to start and make a mini-fade out of a few color families for a high contrast and cohesive kit!



STEP 4: START KNITTING

That's it – you're ready to go!



STEP 1: CHOOSE YOUR BASE PATTERN

Your Base Doodle pattern is the “blank canvas” for your design.

Your **Base Doodle Pattern** is the “blank canvas” for your design. With these simple patterns, you can create a colorful scarf, a simple mitten with just a little colorwork flair, a color-blocked cowl, a custom pair of socks, or anything else you can think of to make!

1 CHOOSE YOUR PATTERN SHAPE

Base Patterns come with instructions, modifications, and where to add colorwork. These simple shapes are easy to customize to make your project unique to you!

2 CHOOSE YOUR MODIFICATIONS

Many features of **Base Patterns** are interchangeable! You may want to adjust based on personal preference:

- Circumference or width
- Height or length
- Ribbing and cuff options
- Brim, crown, heel, or toe techniques



3 DETERMINE YOUR YARN WEIGHT

If you're working the pattern with the suggested yarn weight/gauge – no action, you're good to go!

If you've decided to use a different yarn weight or gauge (such as adapting a pattern to use fingering weight rather than DK weight yarn) that's totally fine!

Note that adjusting the gauge will affect the yardage.

Use the schematic space on the next page to decide on your **Base Pattern** and desired features!

CHOOSE PLAIN VS COLORWORK

While all our **Base Doodle Patterns** work with all our Doodle Charts, they are also excellent wardrobe (and pattern library) staples all on their own – **even without colorwork!**



MODIFYING YARN WEIGHT/GAUGE

For simple accessories, you can often use the steps below to figure out **how many stitches you would need to cast on** to still get the dimensions in the pattern, while working the rest of the pattern as written.

Step 1: Find your [stitches per inch] in your swatch.

Step 2: To find out how many stitches to cast on:

$$[\text{desired dimension in inches}] \times [\text{sts per inch}] = \text{NUMBER OF STS}$$

For example, if you want your cowl to be 24 inches circumference and your gauge is 8 sts per inch:

$$[24 \text{ inches}] \times [8 \text{ sts per inch}] = 192 \text{ sts}$$



HOW TO DETERMINE YOUR CHART HEIGHT


Once you know your pattern shape, either use the pattern information provided or the following formula to calculate your approx. **Doodle Chart Height** to use for **Step 2: Choose your Charts**.

$$\text{Desired length/height} \times \text{Rnds/in} = \# \text{ of Doodle Rnds}$$

EXAMPLE: DOODLE BEANIE 2

The colorwork on a beanie takes place above the brim, but before the crown decreases start.

$$4.5 \text{ in of colorwork} \times 6 \text{ rnds/in} = \text{plan for } 27 \text{ rnds}$$



FILL IN YOUR OWN PROJECTS:

2 GET OUT SOME COLORS

If you already have your yarn picked out, see if you can find some colored pencils or markers (or even crayons) to correspond to your color palette.

Don't worry if you don't have an exact match, you can start drawing out your charts in any colors and still end up with a good sense of the look of your project.

Not sure about the colors yet? Just use a black marker! You can still figure out spacing and layout and then come back to determine colors when you're ready.

3 START DRAWING

Time to get creative! You can lay out and stack your Doodle Cards before you get started, or you can design directly onto the Coloring Pages - there's no wrong way to be creative!


Are you designing for a kiddo? Get them involved! Give them the blank coloring page and let them do the design. Then you can find charts and colors to make it later.



STEP 2: CHOOSE YOUR CHARTS

Pick a theme or grab a few Doodle charts to mix-and-match!

Your unique colorwork design is created by selecting and arranging your favorite Doodle charts. In this way, you can create exactly what you want, whether that's an integrated landscape scene, a simple motif repeated in varying colors, a cuff detail, or any other design you can think of!

1 CHOOSE YOUR THEME(S)

Each set of Doodle Charts is a "theme". **Core Doodles** are the most beginner-friendly charts with timeless seasonal themes, focusing on simple motifs with short floats. **Expansion Doodles** are more intermediate level and include more niche thematic charts! While **Destination Doodles** are location-based themes!



2 CHOOSE YOUR CHARTS


EVERY DOODLE CHART is 24 stitches wide (with lots working within smaller repeats), and they all work together across themes, so choose any charts to build your design!

Ex: Cat chart is 24 sts wide, with 12 st "minimum" repeat




HOW TO MODIFY A CHART (OPTIONAL)


Add or remove CC stitches to adjust float catching:



Work half charts for smaller circumferences:



Change a 3-color chart to 2-colors to simplify a motif:



Other modifications to consider:

- **Shift charts** so you start offset from the last chart
- **Mirror charts** vertically or horizontally
- **Crop charts** to use just part of a motif
- **Combine different charts** horizontally in a scene

CREATIVE WAYS TO ASSEMBLE

ARRANGE YOUR CHARTS

Your personal Doodle Chart is created by combining micro charts together in different arrangements. All the charts work together within the Doodle Framework, so you can get creative with how to use them!

Once they're stacked, the individual charts can now be read as one complete chart from which to work your project.





DOODLE MASH-UPS


Doodle Mash-up? Yes please! We love to see creative uses of more than one theme, so don't be afraid to use charts from multiple themes in a single design.

Have a favorite book or movie? Find your heroes, villains, locations, and props in the Doodle Charts to build your own custom design.


The opportunities are endless for what you can create!



Create Stripes: Great for beginners, you can put charts in ANY order. Try alternate dark/light or big/small for visual interest and balance.



Create a Scene: Good for telling stories, try using thematic charts to create a scene, such as a mountain or ocean landscape.



Use just One Chart: Pick a feature chart and repeat, either aligning or offsetting, and shift color palettes through the motifs.



HOW TO ASSEMBLE CHARTS

Cut and paste, redraw, use cards, or go digital!

Wondering how to organize your chosen Doodle Charts so you can get started knitting? Here are some quick tips!

1 DOWNLOAD/PRINT BLANK CHART

Download your [Blank Doodle Master Chart](#) using the QR code on the following page. This chart is formatted and sized to work with all of our Doodle Charts, so everything fits together, making it easy to build your design.

2 PICK CHARTS AND PLAY AROUND



One of our favorite ways to play around with placement is to **print and cut out your Doodles** for your pattern.

Stack them, duplicate them, offset them, add in some border motifs – anything you want!

3 ASSEMBLE YOUR CUSTOM CHART

Got your design ready? Tape your selected charts to your Blank Master Chart to create your final design!

That's it – now you can just knit from your chart just like a traditional pattern!



OTHER WAYS TO ASSEMBLE CHARTS

How you organize or assemble your Doodle Charts is a matter of **personal preference** – try cutting/pasting your charts, re-drawing them with markers, or even digitally!




STUCK? COPY THE SAMPLE!

Use the sample chart as your starting point and just make 1-2 small changes to make it unique to you! This is a really easy way to get started with minimal effort.



BLANK DOODLE MASTER CHART

Re-draw or tape your Doodle charts in your order and with your colors!



PRO TIP: Print and cut out your Doodle Charts and re-arrange on this master chart – they are the same scale, so they work together to design your project!

Are you ready to start designing your own chart?

This blank master chart enables you to **re-draw or cut/tape all of your selected Doodle charts in order** and with your preferred contrast/colors!

Follow the guidelines on [Ultimate Guide: Choosing & Arranging your Doodle Charts](#). Remember, you can shift charts left or right, if necessary, add or eliminate MC rounds between charts, repeat charts, or even design your own motifs!

This chart is set up for 60 rounds of colorwork, or approx. 10 in [25 cm] height with gauge at 6 sts x 6 rounds per 1 in [2.5 cm]. Create as many charts as necessary to reach desired finished height.

STEP 3: CHOOSE YOUR YARN

Grab a main color and a few accents or create the perfect stash buster!

Building a color palette for your Doodle can impact the entire vibe of your project. You can use bright rainbows, moody deep tones, subtle lower contrast colors, pops of neon against a neutral, or anything else you can think of!

1 CHOOSE THE NUMBER OF COLORS

You don't have to use tons of colors – **Doodles often work great with just two colors!** If you're just beginning with colorwork, simplifying the palette can make it easier.

If you're more advanced, you can choose more colors – there is no hard rule to how many colors you need!

2 CONSIDER YOUR THEME

Think about the theme, such as Winter, Fantasy, Garden, etc. and think about what colors make sense.

Stuck on inspiration? Simply head over to Pinterest and type "Haunted Palettes" or "Garden colors" to get ideas!


3 COLOR THEORY & CONTRAST

The prettiest color palette in the world won't always work with colorwork, because it requires **contrast between colors**, or variation in the darkness/lightness of colors.

Use color theory to choose complimentary and contrasting colors. Colors that are opposite each other on the color wheel (ex. blue/orange) will stand out against each other, while colors that are closer (ex. purple/red) are more subtle.

CHECK YOUR COLOR CONTRAST!

Take out your phone and **take a black and white photo.** You're looking for **variation between the gray tones** for good contrast that will make your colorwork knits pop!

Example 1 is GOOD contrast because the dark black yarn and lighter yarn are very different in grayscale tone.



Example 2 is POOR contrast because the yarns are almost the same color in grayscale, so they won't "pop."

3-STEP PALETTE FOR COLORWORK

Build a cohesive palette quickly and easily from your stash or LYS!

Looking for some tips & tricks on how to create a yarn color palette? This super simple 3-step guide will show you the easiest way to pull together the perfect palette!

1 CHOOSE ONE NEUTRAL COLOR

Neutral colors ground the entire palette and **will work with every one of your contrast colors**. It can be used as either a main color or a contrast color on any of your charts.

Pick a **white, cream, gray, black, navy, or brown** that will work well with whatever other yarns or themes you choose.

2 CHOOSE TWO ACCENT COLORS

Choose **two main color families** that will work well with the charts that you are using for your pattern, such as orange and blue for Autumn or teal and coral for Ocean.

3 CHOOSE THREE TONES WITHIN EACH ACCENT COLOR

Look for a **light, medium, and dark version of each of your accent color families**. It might be as simple as a dark, medium, and light blue. Or maybe stretch it by doing a navy, and bright peacock, and a pale seafoam. Either way, if the additional colors are in the same family, you already know they'll work together!

That's it – now you have a cohesive colorwork palette!

PRO TIP: You can actually make **as many “mini fades”** as you want to build your palette! Just keep adding additional color fades until you have the palette you need.

Gain confidence in building your own Doodle Yarn Kit!

BUILDING YOUR OWN YARN KIT

Do you want to try your hand at putting together your own yarn kit for a Doodle Project, but aren't sure where to start? In addition to picking your colors, it can be hard to know exactly how much of each color you need.

WHAT SIZE SKEIN DO I NEED?



Skeins of yarn usually come in one of three sizes: 100g, 50g, or 20g ("minis"). You can mix-and-match these sizes to create your yarn kit, depending on how many colors you want to use!

Different yarns and brands can vary a lot in how many yards you'll get in a 100g skein. Most of the numbers here are based on DK weight for 250yd/100g, for simplicity.

DOODLE YARDAGE RULES OF THUMB

Because of the flexibility of design choices, we prefer to give overall yardage, rather than yardage per color. However, we do have a few rules of thumb that can help you estimate your yardage better.

When working on accessories, generally, a 20g mini in DK weight will last for approximately:

- 3-5 charts in contrast color (motif) or
- 2-4 charts in main color (background)

Typically, your main color should make up approx. 60% of the overall yardage, with your contrast colors making up the remaining 40% across one or more colors.

If you find you're always using a specific amount of yarn, note it down and now you've got your own guide! Try using these rules the next time you're at your local yarn shop to create your first Doodle yarn kit!

TYPICAL DOODLE YARN KITS

DOODLE INFINITY COWLS

Total yardage: 320-980 yards [293-896 meters]

Total weight: 130-400 grams

Yarn kit suggestions:

- (3-4) 100g skeins OR
- (1) 100g skein + (6) 50g skeins OR
- (1) 100g skein + (12) 20g minis

DOODLE STANDARD COWLS

Total yardage: 200-675 yards [183-617 meters]

Total weight: 80-270 grams

Yarn kit suggestions:

- (2-3) 100g skeins OR
- (1) 100g skein + (2-4) 50g skeins OR
- (1) 100g skein + (6) 20g minis

DOODLE HATS or MITTS

Total yardage: 175-300 yards [160-274 meters]

Total weight: 70-120 grams

Yarn kit suggestions:

- (2) 100g skeins OR
- (1) 100g skein + (4-6) 20g minis
