Oversized boat neck pullover



Knit Cafe Midori



3/4 sleeve, with lace weight wool yarn

Elbow length sleeve with 2 strands of alpaca lace & mohair lace weight yarn held together

Yarn: Lace or light fingering weight yarn. The degree of transparency depends on the weight of yarn.

Sizes: One size. You can adjust the size very easily. (around arm, around bust, body length, sleeve length)

Sleeve: Elbow length sleeve (3/4 sleeve) in the pattern.

Yardage: 453 (522) m [497 (571) yds], excluding yarn for knitting swatch.

Gauge: 14 stitches x 20 rows = 10 cm [4"], in stockinette stitch after wet blocking.

Needles: 6 mm [US 10] circular needle 100 cm [40"] or longer. Adjust needle size if necessary to get gauge.

Notions: 2 stitch markers, tapestry needle, spare needle (same size or smaller than main needle), 140 cm [55"] of waste yarn.

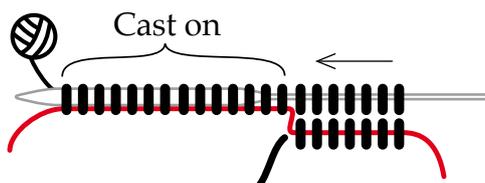
SECTION 1: Back body and sleeves



Using about 1/4 of waste yarn (140 cm [55"] or longer), for elbow length (3/4) sleeve pullover, with provisional method, CO 28 (38) sts. ([see video](#))



Row 1 (RS): P12, k1, PM, k15 (25), do not turn, undo slip knot, with provisional method, CO 112 (122) sts. ([see CO video](#))



Row 2 (WS): K12, p1, PM, p114 (134), SM, p1, k12.

Row 3 (RS): P12, k1, SM, k to marker, SM, k1, p12.

Row 4 (WS): K12, p1, SM, p to marker, turn.

Row 5 (RS): Sl-gsr, k to marker, turn.

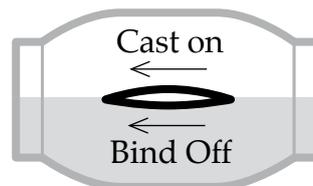
Row 6 (WS): Sl-gsr, p to 1st before marker, p-gsr, SM, p1, k12.

Row 7 (RS): P12, k1, SM, k to 1 st before marker, k-gsr, SM, k1, p12.

Repeat Rows 4–7 until Cuff measures 12 cm [4 ¾"] or a half of your arm circumference + 1cm [3/8"].

Repeat Row 4.

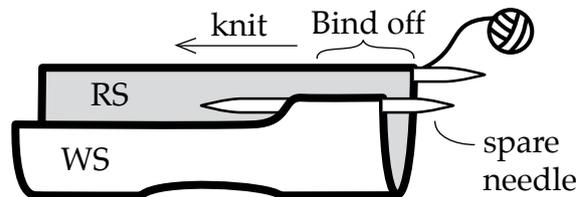

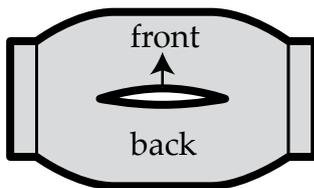
Row 5 with BO & CO (RS): Sl-gsr, k31(41), bring the yarn to front of work, slip the next stitch purlwise, then return the yarn to the back, [slip the next st, pass the 2nd st over the slipped st and drop it off the needle](= without knitting BO) 50 times, sl the last st to LHN, *you have 32 (42) sts before marker*, turn work. PM (to count CO sts easily, RM in the next row), using cable method, CO 51 sts, turn work, slip 2 sts, pass the extra CO st over slipped 2 sts to close the hole, pull the working yarn, k to marker, turn (see video). BO is tighter than CO. So that the front neck line, although knitted straight, goes deeper and looks more round in a relaxed way. Check the width of the neck opening.

on spare needle together knitwise (*insert RHN same way as k2tog and slip 2 st without knitting*), pass the 3rd st over the slipped 2 sts and drop it off the needle, pull the yarn, PM, k to marker, RM, k1, p12.



Sleeve 2: Place 110 (120) provisional CO sts to spare needle, fold your work with RS facing together, with 3 needle method, BO 28 (38) sts, (= 82 sts remain on spare needle), from LHN (= main needle) slip 2 sts purlwise to RHN, pass the 3rd st over the slipped 2 sts and drop it off the needle, pull the yarn, remove the slipped 2 sts to LHN, k all sts on spare needle, k2, SM. = 168 sts

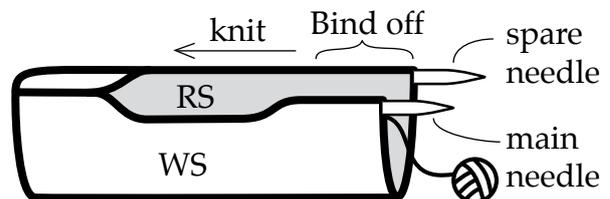
SECTION 3: Front body and sleeves



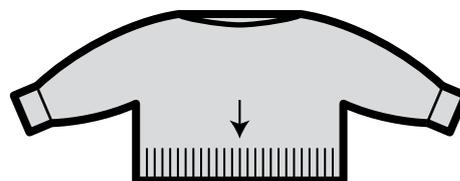
Repeat Rows 6 – 7 of Section 1. (once)

Repeat Rows 4 – 7 of Section 1 until Cuff measures 24 cm or your arm circumference + 2 cm [3¼"]. = Back body has one row more than front body.

Set up Row (WS): K12, p1, SM, p to marker, RM, p1, k12. = Back body rows are same as front body.



SECTION 5: Lower body



SECTION 4: Under arm seams

Sleeve 1: Place 30 (40) provisional CO sts to spare needle, fold your work with RS facing together, with 3 needle method, BO 28 (38) sts loosely (see video). Slip last 2 sts

Knit in round until body (*upper + lower*) measures 37 cm [14½"].

Work [k2, p2] rib until rib measures 8 cm [3¼"].

With Traditional method, BO all sts (*knitted sts knitwise, purled sts purlwise*).

Weave in all ends and wet block.

Abbreviations & Techniques:

BO = bind off

CO = cast on

gsr = german short row stitch

k = knit

LHN = left hand needle

p = purl

PM = place marker

RHN = right hand needle

RM = remove marker

RS = right side

SM = slip marker

sl = slip

st; sts = Stitch; Stitches

WS = wrong side

k-gsr = knit slipped gsr. K through both legs (through the centre of the entire bundle) as if the gsr were a normal single stitch. Work following sts as usual.

p-gsr = purl slipped gsr. P through both legs (through the centre of the entire bundle) as if the gsr were a normal single stitch. Work following sts as usual.

German short row:

You can find [video list](#) on Ravelry pattern page.

sl-gsr = slip 1 stitch purlwise with yarn in front. Bring yarn up, over and back to pull on the slipped st until it slides around to show two legs. It will look like a double st, but count this as a single st. Work following sts as usual while keeping the tension on the slipped st.
