



Paris Sweater

This wonderfully draping sweater looks great on *everyone*. While the piece is simple a large rectangle, the bias flow of the fabric and the unexpected placing of arm, neck, and waist openings creates a beautiful, couture sweater for all seasons.

Materials: any gauge yarn (yardage varies) and appropriately sized needles for yarn


- This sweater may be knit in either Stockinette stitch (knit one row, purl one row) or 1x1 Ribbing (k1, p1 across all rows).
- Determining the yardage required for this project is tricky. The most accurate method is to begin the project as directed below. Once you have used one entire ball of your yarn, take a measurement of the length of your work. Divide 66" (the entire length of the project) by the length you measure, and that resulting number is how many balls of yarn you will need (round up).



Sweater:

With your chosen yarn, knit a 4" x 4" swatch in either Stockinette stitch or 1x1 Ribbing to determine your stitch gauge (number of stitches in one inch). Multiply your stitch-to-the-inch gauge by 22 to determine your cast on amount. Cast on. Knit in Stockinette stitch or 1x1 Ribbing until piece measures 66".

Sew according to Schematic.
