

# LUNCH AT TIFFANY'S

LunchatTiffanysdress is a shaped dress with a wrap look. It is knitted seamlessly top down in double rib pattern, with offset details in single rib pattern. The fit can be adjusted individually by cross sizing, please read the size guide carefully. The wrap look of the top is also picked up in the skirt, which ends in a slightly sideways slit in the front. The slit length as well as the length can be adjusted individually to personal taste. If you prefer to knit the blouse, you will find the appropriate modification after your work has been joined to the round. At first the blouse is worked identically to the dress.

Additionally, there is also the possibility to decide between 3 sleeve solutions. Described are a long sleeve - once with single rib finish, once throughout in double rib pattern, a short sleeve and a sleeveless solution.

This dress is a real all-rounder and with the right combination it can be styled for almost any occasion.

## Measurements

Bust: 65 (70) 75 (80) 85 (90) 95 cm

Waist: 45 (50) 55 (60) 65 (70) 70 cm

Hip: 70 (75) 80 (85) 90 (95) 100 cm

Length dress: 105 (105) 105 (108) 108 (108) 110 (110) cm

Length blouse: 52 (52) 52 (54) 54 (54) 56 (56) cm

*Note: As orientation – I'm 1.65 m tall.*

## Suggested Needles

Circular needles 3.5 mm (80 cm)

Double pointed needles 3.5 mm

Double pointed needles 2.75 mm

*Note: I'm knitting very tight, maybe you'll need a smaller needle size. Please knit a swatch to check gauge. Also, if you tend to knit loosely, better use double pointed needles 2.5 mm.*

## Gauge

Held double, in double rib pattern  
with needle size 3.5 mm  
24 sts x 17 rows = 10 x 5 cm  
(washed and blocked)

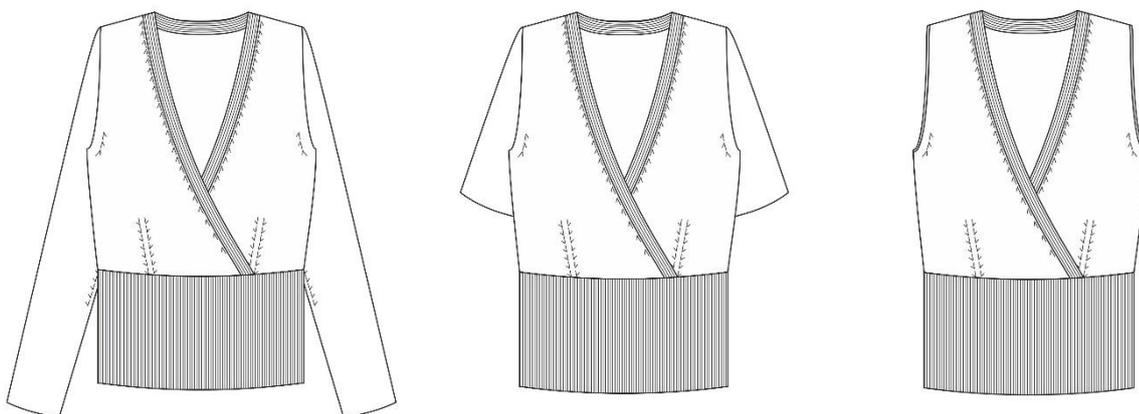

## Yarn

Shiny Yak by Knitloop 100g/466m (if you are mixing sizes, take the amount of yarn from the biggest size) Work with two threads of yarn held together.

## **Size guide**

The dress should be knitted with a negative ease of around 10 cm. The sizes are matching with a bust circumference of 75 (80) 85 (90) 95 (100) 105 (110) cm.

If you are between two sizes with your body measurement, I would always advise to choose the smaller one! If your bust circumference measures 93 cm, I would still recommend choosing size S though this size 'only' measures 80 cm.

## **Cross sizes**

In the size chart you can find the recommended bust, waist and hip circumferences for every size to have an orientation on which size you need to choose. Of course, it's possible that your body measurements don't go along with just one size. In this case you should go for a cross size (for example bust and waist circumference = size S and hip circumference = size M). You can easily adapt the pattern on your individual size. You just need to know that it is knitted up in 5 sections.

1. Increases are knitted at the neckline in the front part.
2. Continue to knit increases at the neckline, but at the same time work decreases to shape the waist.
3. Waist is worked without decreases or increases in single rib pattern.
4. After the waist section knit increases for the hips.
5. From hip to hem the dress is knitted straight without decreases or increases, first in rounds, later in rows, after the slit has been worked.

If you want to knit a cross size, sections 2 and 4 are important for you, because you need to adapt the number of increases and decreases.

First you choose the size that fits your bust circumference and start knitting the dress according to this size. Now knit until you reached the height of the bust. Then you may need to adjust the number of decreases for the waist (section 2). The instructions describe three ways to knit this second section. Now you need to check whether bust and waist need to be knitted in the same size (version 1), whether the waist needs to be one size smaller than the bust (version 2) or whether the waist needs to be one size larger than the bust (version 3).

In section 4, the same principle applies. First, you need to check whether your waist and hip measurements are matching to one size (version 1), whether the hip should be one size smaller than the waist (version 2) or whether the hip should be one size larger than the waist (version 3).

# KNITTING TECHNIQUES

## Edge stitches

Unless noted otherwise the edge stitches need to be knitted like following:  
The first and last stitch of every RS-row needs to be knitted.  
The first and last stitch of every WS-row needs to be slipped with yarn in front.

## Decreases

**K2tog**: knit two stitches together

**SKPO**: Slip one stitch as if to knit, knit the next stitch, pass slipped stitch over

**P2tog**: purl two stitches together

## Increases

**M1R-K**: Insert the left needle from back to front underneath the bar between the sts. Knit through the front loop.

**M1L-K**: Insert the left needle from front to back underneath the bar between the sts. Knit through the back loop.

**M1R-P**: Insert the left needle from back to front underneath the bar between the sts. Purl through the front loop.

**M1L-P**: Insert the left needle from front to back underneath the bar between the sts. Purl through the back loop.

## German short rows

To get a nice shaped sleeve, you need to add some extra length to your sleeve head. Therefore, you knit German short rows. This technique is knitted as followed:

You start knitting a row, knit to the point where you will have to turn. Turn your work and slip the first stitch on the left needle purlwise with the yarn in front. Put the yarn above the needle, then behind your work and pull, the slipped stitch turns out as a double stitch.

Work the WS row until the next turn. On the next row the double stitch is knitted/purled (depending on the rib pattern) as one stitch.

# INSTRUCTIONS

## Neckband (Back)

The neckband is knitted in single rib pattern and worked in two parts so that the cast-on edge is at the neck. Along one side a knotted edge is knitted, to pick up stitches for the back in the next step.

## Right neckband:

Cast on 8 sts on a double pointed needle 2.75 mm with a provisional cast-on.

The first row is a RS-row.

1. row (RS): k 1, \*k 1, p 1\*, repeat \*-\* until 1 st remains, e-st, turn
2. row (WS): e-st, \*k 1, p 1\*, repeat \*-\* until 1 st remains, k 1, turn

Knit these two rows until your work measures 8 (9) 9 (9) 10 (10) 10 (11) cm. You're ending with a WS-row. Break the yarn and put the stitches on a piece of waste yarn.

## Left neckband:

Now knit the left part. Place the 8 sts of the provisional cast-on edge on a 2.75 mm needle. Remove the auxiliary thread.

The first row is a RS-row.

1. row (RS): e-st, \*p 1, k 1\*, repeat \*-\* until 1 st remains, k 1, turn
2. row (WS): k1, \*p 1, k 1\*, repeat \*-\* until 1 st remains, e-st, turn

Knit these two rows until you knitted 8 (9) 9 (9) 10 (10) 10 (11) cm. Your work has a total length of 16 (18) 18 (18) 20 (20) 20 (22) cm. You're ending with a WS-row. Break the yarn and put the stitches on a piece of waste yarn.

## Back

In a RS-row, new stitches for the back piece are picked up from right to left on the side of the neckline with the knot edge. Additionally, the stitch that was set aside and formed the knot edge is also collected on both sides on the 3.5 mm needle. All other stitches of the neckline are worked together with the front piece and remain set aside on a piece of waste yarn until then. The back is worked separately.

RS: place the stitch, which built the knot edge of the left part of the neckband on a circular needle 3.5 mm, k this st, now pick up 40 (44) 44 (44) 48 (48) 48 (52) new sts evenly on the long side of the neckline (with knot edge), place the stitch, which built the knot edge of the right part of the neckband on your circular needle 3.5 mm, k this st

There are now 42 (46) 46 (46) 50 (50) 50 (54) sts on your circular needles 3.5 mm.

In the next WS-row, the rib pattern for the back is built up and 2 stitches are newly cast on, which are always knitted in the following rows to form a knot edge.

1. row (WS): cast on 1 new st (check the video), p 2, k 2, p 2, place stm, \*k 2, p 2\*, repeat \*-\* until 8 sts remain, k 2, place stm, p 2, k 2, p 2, cast on 1 new st

2. row (RS): k 1, work in rib pattern until next stm, slip stm, **M1L-k**, \*p 2, k 2\*, repeat \*-\* until 2 sts before the next stm remain, p 2, **M1R-k**, slip stm, work 6 sts in rib pattern, k1
3. row (WS): k 1, work in rib pattern until next stm, slip stm, p 1, \*k 2, p 2\*, repeat \*-\* until 3 st before the next stm remains, k 2, p 1, slip stm, work 6 sts in rib pattern, k 1
4. row (RS): k 1, work in rib pattern until next stm, slip stm, **M1L-k**, k 1, \*p 2, k 2\*, repeat \*-\* until 3 sts before the next stm remain, p 2, k 1, **M1R-k**, slip stm, work 6 sts in rib pattern, k1
5. row (WS): k 1, work in rib pattern until next stm, slip stm, p 2, \*k 2, p 2\*, repeat \*-\* until next stm, slip stm, work 6 sts in rib pattern, k 1
6. row (RS): k 1, work in rib pattern until next stm, slip stm, **M1L-p**, k 2, \*p 2, k 2\*, repeat \*-\* until next stm, **M1R-p**, slip stm, work 6 sts in rib pattern, k1
7. row (WS): k 1, work in rib pattern until next stm, slip stm, k 1, p 2, \*k 2, p 2\*, repeat \*-\* until 1 sts before the the next stm remain, k 1, slip stm, work 6 sts in rib pattern, k 1
8. row (RS): k 1, work in rib pattern until next stm, slip stm, **M1L-p**, p 1, k 2, \*p 2, k 2\*, repeat \*-\* until 1 st before the next stm remains, p 1, **M1R-p**, slip stm, work 6 sts in rib pattern, k1
9. row (WS): k 1, work in rib pattern until next stm, slip stm, \*k 2, p 2\*, repeat \*-\* until 2 sts before the the next stm remain, k 2, slip stm, work 6 sts in rib pattern, k 1

Work rows 2-9 a total of 3 (3) 4 (5) 5 (6) 7 (8) times. In the last WS-row (9. row) place stitch markers in both edge stitches, these mark the end of the shoulder towards the armhole and help when you pick up stitches for the front part. You now have 68 (72) 80 (88) 92 (100) 108 (118) sts on your needles. Next, knit 8 (9) 9 (9) 10 (10) 11 (11) cm without decreases in rib pattern, leaving the markers in place. Repeat these two rows:

RS: k 3, p 2, k 2, slip stm, work the rib pattern until 7 sts remain, slip stm, k 2, p 2, k 3

WS: k 1, p 2, k 2, p 2, slip stm, work the rib pattern until 7 sts remain, slip stm, p2, k 2, p 2, k 1

You end with a WS-row. Next, knit 1x rows 2-9 to form the armhole. The stitch markers can be removed in the last WS-row. You now have 76 (80) 88 (96) 100 (108) 116 (128) sts on your needles. Break the yarn and put the sts on a piece of waste yarn.

### **Right Front**

Pick up 17 (17) 21 (25) 25 (29) 33 (37) sts evenly in a RS-row from the right shoulder of the back piece. Stitches are picked up from right to left, yarn end is at right edge (armhole). The first st is picked up from the stitch with stm, the marker can be removed afterwards. To finish this RS-row, the 7 sts of the right neckline that have been set aside are knitted with the 2.75 mm needle:

K 1, p 1, k 1, p 1, k 1, p 1, e-st

The right front now consists of 17 (17) 21 (25) 25 (29) 33 (37) sts, which are knitted in double rib pattern with 3.5 mm needles, and 7 sts, which are knitted in single rib pattern with 2.75 mm needles. The front part is formed by increases placed right next to the single rib pattern in every third row. Knit as follows:

1. row (WS): (2.75 mm) e-st, k 1, p 1, k 1, p 1, k 1, p 1, (3.5 mm) \*k 2, p 2\*, repeat \*-\* until 1 st remains, k 1
2. row (RS): (3.5 mm) k 1, \*k 2, p 2\*, repeat until 7 sts remain, (2.75 mm) k 1, p 1, k 1, p 1, k 1, p 1, e-st
3. row (WS): (2.75 mm) e-st, work the next 6 sts like established, (3.5 mm) **M1R-p**, \*k 2, p2\*, repeat \*-\* until 1 st remains, k 1

4. row (RS): (3.5 mm) k 1, \*k 2, p 2\*, repeat until 8 sts remain, k 1, (2.75 mm) work the next 6 sts like established, e-st
5. row (WS): (2.75 mm) e-st, work the next 6 sts like established (3.5 mm) p 1, \*k 2, p2\*, repeat \*-\* until 1 st remains, k 1
6. row (RS): (3.5 mm) k 1, \*k 2, p 2\*, repeat until 8 sts remain, k 1, **M1R-k**, (2.75 mm) work the next 6 sts like established, e-st
7. row (WS): (2.75 mm) e-st, work the next 6 sts like established, (3.5 mm) p 2, \*k 2, p2\*, repeat \*-\* until 1 st remains, k 1
8. row (RS): (3.5 mm) k 1, \*k 2, p 2\*, repeat until 9 sts remain, k 2, (2.75 mm) work the next 6 sts like established, e-st
9. row (WS): (2.75 mm) e-st, work the next 6 sts like established, (3.5 mm) **M1R-k**, p 2, \*k 2, p2\*, repeat \*-\* until 1 st remains, k 1
10. row (RS): (3.5 mm) k 1, \*k 2, p 2\*, repeat until 10 sts remain, k 2, p 1 (2.75 mm) work the next 6 sts like established, e-st
11. row (WS): (2.75 mm) e-st, work the next 6 sts like established, (3.5 mm) k 1, p 2, \*k 2, p2\*, repeat \*-\* until 1 st remains, k 1
12. row (RS): (3.5 mm) k 1, \*k 2, p 2\*, repeat until 10 sts remain, k 2, p 1, **M1R-p**, (2.75 mm) work the next 6 sts like established, e-st

Work rows 1-12 a total of 4 (5) 5 (5) 6 (6) 6 (7) times. You now have 33 (37) 41 (45) 49 (53) 57 (65) sts on 3.5 mm needles and 7 sts on 2.75 mm needles.

Next, knit another 12 rows with additional increases to form the armhole.

1. row (WS): (2.75 mm) e-st, work the next 6 sts like established, (3.5 mm) \*k 2, p 2\*, repeat \*-\* until 1 st remains, k 1
2. row (RS): (3.5 mm) k 1, \*k 2, p 2\*, repeat until 7 sts remain, (2.75 mm) work the next 6 sts like established, e-st
3. row (WS): (2.75 mm) e-st, work the next 6 sts like established, (3.5 mm) **M1R-p**, \*k 2, p2\*, repeat \*-\* until 1 st remains, k 1
4. row (RS): (3.5 mm) k 1, \*k 2, p 2\*, repeat until 8 sts remain, k 1, (2.75 mm) work the next 6 sts like established, e-st
5. row (WS): (2.75 mm) e-st, work the next 6 sts like established, (3.5 mm) p 1, \*k 2, p2\*, repeat \*-\* until 1 st remains, k 1
6. row (RS): (3.5 mm) k 1, k 2, p 2, k 2, **M1L-k**, p 2, \*k 2, p 2\*, repeat until 8 sts remain, k 1, **M1R-k**, (2.75 mm) work the next 6 sts like established, e-st
7. row (WS): (2.75 mm) e-st, work the next 6 sts like established, (3.5 mm) p 2, \*k 2, p2\*, repeat \*-\* until 10 st remain, k 2, p 3, k 2, p 2, k 1
8. row (RS): (3.5 mm) k 1, k 2, p 2, k 2, **M1L-k**, k 1, p 2, \*k 2, p 2\*, repeat until 9 sts remain, k 2, (2.75 mm) work the next 6 sts like established, e-st
9. row (WS): (2.75 mm) e-st, work the next 6 sts like established, (3.5 mm) **M1R-k**, p 2, \*k 2, p2\*, repeat \*-\* until 11 st remain, k 2, p 4, k 2, p 2, k 1
10. row (RS): (3.5 mm) k 1, k 2, p 2, k 2, **M1L-p**, \*k 2, p 2\*, repeat until 10 sts remain, k 2, p 1 (2.75 mm) work the next 6 sts like established, e-st
11. row (WS): (2.75 mm) e-st, work the next 6 sts like established, (3.5 mm) k 1, p 2, \*k 2, p2\*, repeat \*-\* until 8 st remain, k 1, p 2, k 2, p 2, k 1
12. row (RS): (3.5 mm) k 1, k 2, p 2, k 2, **M1L-p**, p 1, \*k 2, p 2\*, repeat until 10 sts remain, k 2, p 1, **M1R-p**, (2.75 mm) work the next 6 sts like established, e-st

Work the first row (WS) one last time. You now have 41 (45) 49 (53) 57 (61) 65 (73) sts on 3.5 mm needles and 7 sts on 2.75 mm needles. Break the yarn and put the sts on a piece of waste yarn.

### **Left Front**

Now work the left front in the opposite direction to the right front.

Start in a RS-row and work the stitches of the right neckline that have been set aside with the 2.75 mm needle:

e-st, p 1, k 1, p 1, k 1, p 1, k 1

Then, using your 3.5 mm needle, pick up 17 (17) 21 (25) 25 (29) 33 (37) sts evenly from the left shoulder of the back part. The stitches are picked up from right to left, the last st is picked up from the stitch with the stm, the marker can be removed afterwards.

The front piece now consists of 17 (17) 21 (25) 25 (29) 33 (37) sts, which are knitted in double rib pattern with 3.5 mm needles, and 7 sts, which are knitted in single rib pattern with 2.75 mm needles. The front piece is formed by increases placed right next to the single rib pattern in every third row. Work as follows:

1. row (WS): (3.5 mm) k 1, \*p 2, k 2\*, repeat \*-\* until 7 sts remain, (2.75 mm) p 1, k 1, p 1, k 1, p 1, k 1, e-st
2. row (RS): (2.75 mm) e-st, p 1, k 1, p 1, k 1, p 1, k 1, (3.5 mm) \*p 2, k 2\*, repeat \*-\* until 1 st remains, k 1
3. row (WS): (3.5 mm) k 1, \*p 2, k 2\*, repeat \*-\* until 7 sts remain, **M1L-p**, (2.75 mm) work the next 6 sts like established, e-st
4. row (RS): (2.75 mm) e-st, work the next 6 sts like established, (3.5 mm) k 1, \*p 2, k 2\*, repeat \*-\* until 1 st remains, k 1
5. row (WS): (3.5 mm) k 1, \*p 2, k 2\*, repeat \*-\* until 8 sts remain, p 1, (2.75 mm) work the next 6 sts like established, e-st
6. row (RS): (2.75 mm) e-st, work the next 6 sts like established, (3.5 mm) **M1L-k**, k 1, \*p 2, k 2\*, repeat \*-\* until 1 st remains, k 1
7. row (WS): (3.5 mm) k 1, \*p 2, k 2\*, repeat \*-\* until 9 sts remain, p 2, (2.75 mm) work the next 6 sts like established, e-st
8. row (RS): (2.75 mm) e-st, work the next 6 sts like established, (3.5 mm) k 2, \*p 2, k 2\*, repeat \*-\* until 1 st remains, k 1
9. row (WS): (3.5 mm) k 1, \*p 2, k 2\*, repeat \*-\* until 9 sts remain, p 2, **M1L-k**, (2.75 mm) work the next 6 sts like established, e-st
10. row (RS): (2.75 mm) e-st, work the next 6 sts like established, (3.5 mm) p 1, k 2, \*p 2, k 2\*, repeat \*-\* until 1 st remains, k 1
11. row (WS): (3.5 mm) k 1, \*p 2, k 2\*, repeat \*-\* until 10 sts remain, p 2, k 1, (2.75 mm) work the next 6 sts like established, e-st
12. row (RS): (2.75 mm) e-st, work the next 6 sts like established, (3.5 mm) **M1L-p**, p 1, k 2, \*p 2, k 2\*, repeat \*-\* until 1 st remains, k 1

Work rows 1-12 a total of 4 (5) 5 (5) 6 (6) 6 (7) times. You now have 33 (37) 41 (45) 49 (53) 57 (65) sts on 3.5 mm needles and 7 sts on 2.75 mm needles.

Next, knit another 12 rows with additional increases to form the armhole.

1. row (WS): (3.5 mm) k 1, \*p 2, k 2\*, repeat \*-\* until 7 sts remain, (2.75 mm) p 1, k 1, p 1, k 1, p 1, k 1, e-st

2. row (RS): (2.75 mm) e-st, p 1, k 1, p 1, k 1, p 1, k 1, (3.5 mm) \*p 2, k 2\*, repeat \*-\* until 1 st remains, k 1
3. row (WS): (3.5 mm) k 1, \*p 2, k 2\*, repeat \*-\* until 7 sts remain, **M1L-p**, (2.75 mm) work the next 6 sts like established, e-st
4. row (RS): (2.75 mm) e-st, work the next 6 sts like established, (3.5 mm) k 1, \*p 2, k 2\*, repeat \*-\* until 1 st remains, k 1
5. row (WS): (3.5 mm) k 1, \*p 2, k 2\*, repeat \*-\* until 8 sts remain, p 1, (2.75 mm) work the next 6 sts like established, e-st
6. row (RS): (2.75 mm) e-st, work the next 6 sts like established, (3.5 mm) **M1L-k**, k 1, \*p 2, k 2\*, repeat \*-\* until 7 sts remain, **M1R-k**, k 2, p 2, k 2, k 1
7. row (WS): (3.5 mm) k 1, p 2, k 2, p 3, \*k 2, p 2\*, repeat \*-\* until 7 sts remain, (2.75 mm) work the next 6 sts like established, e-st
8. row (RS): (2.75 mm) e-st, work the next 6 sts like established, (3.5 mm) k 2, \*p 2, k 2\*, repeat \*-\* until 10 st remain, p 2, k 1, **M1R-k**, k 2, p 2, k 2, k 1
9. row (WS): (3.5 mm) k 1, p 2, k 2, p 4, \*k 2, p 2\*, repeat \*-\* until 7 sts remain, **M1L-k**, (2.75 mm) work the next 6 sts like established, e-st
10. row (RS): (2.75 mm) e-st, work the next 6 sts like established, (3.5 mm) p 1, k 2, \*p 2, k 2\*, repeat \*-\* until 7 sts remain, **M1R-p**, k 2, p 2, k 2, k 1
11. row (WS): (3.5 mm) k 1, p 2, k 2, p 2, k 1, p 2 \*k 2, p 2\*, repeat \*-\* until 8 sts remain, k 1, (2.75 mm) work the next 6 sts like established, e-st
12. row (RS): (2.75 mm) e-st, work the next 6 sts like established, (3.5 mm) **M1L-p**, p 1, k 2, \*p 2, k 2\*, repeat \*-\* until 8 sts remain, p 1, **M1R-p**, k 2, p 2, k 2, k 1

Work the first row (WS) one last time. You now have 41 (45) 49 (53) 57 (61) 65 (73) sts on 3.5 mm needles and 7 sts on 2.75 mm needles. Break the yarn and put the sts on a piece of waste yarn.

## **Body**

Now both front parts are connected to the back part. The dress is then knitted in rows up to the waist. You start in a RS-row with the left front:

RS: (2.75 mm) e-st, p 1, k 1, p 1, k 1, p 1, k 1, (3.5 mm) \*p 2, k 2\*, repeat \*-\* until 1 st remains, p 1

Next, place the set-aside sts of the back piece back on the left needle and knit as follows:

(3.5 mm) p 1, \*k 2, p 2\*, repeat \*-\* until 3 sts remain, k 2, p 1

You now have 172 (184) 200 (216) 228 (244) 260 (288) sts on your needles. Continue knitting the body in rows and with increases in the front.

### Waist

From now on, waist decreases are worked to get a shaped fit. To determine the position of the decreases, stitch markers are placed in the next WS-row:

WS-row: (2.75 mm) e-st, work the next 6 sts like established, (3.5 mm) \* k 2, p 2\*, repeat \*-\* 5 (5) 5 (6) 6 (7) 7 (8) times, k 2, p 1, place stm, p 1, \*k 2, p 2\*, repeat \*-\* 11 (12) 14 (14) 15 (16) 17 (18) times, k 2, p 1, place stm, p 1, \*k 2, p 2\*, repeat \*-\* 7 (8) 8 (10) 11 (11) 13 (16) times, k 2, p 1, place stm, p 1, \*k 2, p 2\*, repeat \*-\* 11 (12) 14 (14) 15 (16) 17 (18) times, k 2, p 1, place stm, p 1, \*k 2, p 2\*, repeat 5 (5) 5 (6) 6 (7) 7 (8) times, k 2, (2.75 mm) work the next 6 sts like established, e-st

There are 30 (30) 30 (34) 34 (38) 38 (42) sts on your needles before the first marker.

Between the first two markers, there are 48 (52) 60 (60) 64 (68) 72 (76) sts on your needles.

Between the second and third marker, there are 32 (36) 36 (44) 48 (48) 56 (68) sts on your needles.

Between third and fourth marker, there are 48 (52) 60 (60) 64 (68) 72 (76) sts on your needles.

After the fourth marker, there are 30 (30) 30 (34) 34 (38) 38 (42) sts on your needles.

Now there are three different possible ways to work the waist decreases.

- **version 1:** you stay with the size you started to knit
- **version 2:** for the waist you go one size down compared to the bust
- **version 3:** for the waist you go one size up compared to the bust

Therefore, the last 40 (40) 44 (48) 48 (52) 56 (68) sts of this round (meaning the red marked stitches of the right front part) are placed on a second needle 3.5 mm. To create the wrap look, these stitches are now placed in front of the left needle with the

working thread (= you now have 2 left needles, as shown in the photo). Now always knit two sts - one from each left needle - together, work as follows:



RS: place stm, \*k 1, p 1\*, repeat \*-\* until all sts of the front needle are worked, place stm – here's the new BOR, \*k 1, p 1\*, repeat until BOR.

You now have 108 (120) 132 (144) 156 (168) 180 (196) sts on your needles.

13. round: **M1L-p**, work all sts as they appear until next stm, **M1R-p**, slip stm, work all sts as they appear until next stm, slip stm, **M1L-p**, work all sts as they appear until next stm, **M1R-p**, slip stm, work all sts as they appear until BOR
14. – 18. round: = work all sts as they appear
19. round: = 13. round
20. – 24. round: = work all sts as they appear

Work these 24 rounds 3 times in total. You now have 167 (179) 191 (203) 215 (227) 243 (/) sts on your needles.

### version 3:

1. round: **M1L-k**, work all sts as they appear until next stm, **M1R-k**, slip stm, work all sts as they appear until next stm, slip stm, **M1L-k**, work all sts as they appear until next stm, **M1R-k**, slip stm, work all sts as they appear until BOR
2. – 3. round: work all sts as they appear
4. round: = 1. round
5. – 6. round: = work all sts as they appear
7. round: **M1L-p**, work all sts as they appear until next stm, **M1R-p**, slip stm, work all sts as they appear until next stm, slip stm, **M1L-p**, work all sts as they appear until next stm, **M1R-p**, slip stm, work all sts as they appear until BOR
8. – 9. round: = work all sts as they appear
10. round: = 7. round
11. – 12. round: = work all sts as they appear

Work these 12 rounds 5 times in total. You now have / (187) 199 (211) 223 (235) 247 (259) sts on your needles.

### All sizes continue here

Now work in rounds until the dress measures 42cm from the bottom of the waist section (single rib pattern). The stitch markers can be removed, only the marker at the beginning of the round remains. All stitches are knitted as they appear.

*Note: Before you work the slit, try on your dress and check if the height is right for you. If necessary, continue knitting in rounds until you reach the desired length.*

### Slit

After the mentioned 42 cm are knitted, the slit is worked at the beginning of the round. Then the dress is worked in rows. To do so, turn your knitting at the beginning of the round and start with a WS row:

e-st, knit all sts as they appear until the end of the row, then pick up 5 new sts out of the first 5 sts starting at the beginning of the round. You are looking at the wrong side of your work, the newly picked up stitches will form the single rib end on the left side of the slit. Turn.

1. row (RS): e-st, p 1, k 1, p 1, k 1, work all sts as they appear until 1 st remains, e-st
2. row (WS): e-st, work all sts as they appear until 1 st remains, e-st

Repeat these two rows until the slit measures 24 cm or the desired length.

In a RS row, bind off all sts using the tubular bind-off method for double rib pattern.

## **Modification blouse**

If you prefer to knit a blouse, follow the instructions below. You have just worked the wrap look, closing to the round while knitting the front pieces together according to the instructions. You can remove all stms in the first round, only the at BOR remains. Continue as follows:

1. round: \*k1tbl, p 1\*, repeat \*-\* until BOR

Work this round until you have knitted 16 (16) 16 (17) 17 (17) 18 (18) cm. Bind off all sts using the tubular bind-off method.

## **Sleeves**

Now you can choose between sleeveless, short sleeve and long sleeve. All 3 sleeve solutions start as follows:

Pick up 72 (72) 76 (76) 80 (84) 88 (92) sts evenly from the armhole with your circular needles 3.5 mm, you will start centered under the arm. Make sure that the two purl stitches under the arm are also knitted continuously purl in the sleeve, the beginning of the round is between these stitches, place a stm.

### **sleeveless**

For the sleeveless version, cast off all stitches in the first round after picking up stitches. What we want to achieve, is to get a nice edge on the armholes. Work as follows:

p 1, \*p 1, bind off the first stitch by passing it over\*, repeat \*-\* until BOR, break the yarn.

Be careful not to bind off too tightly! Work the second armhole similarly.

### **short/long sleeve**

Short & long sleeves are initially worked identically. The short sleeve ends approximately in the middle of the upper arm in double rib pattern using the Tubular bind-off method. The long sleeve can either be knitted in double rib pattern all the way through, or you can work an 8cm hem in single rib pattern before binding-off all stitches with the Tubular bind-off method.

You start as follows:

#### **XXXS (XXS) M (XL):**

1. row: p 1, \*k 2, p 2\*, repeat \*-\* 8 (8) 9 (10) times, k 2, p 1, place stm, p 1, k 2, p 1, turn, now work German short rows

1. row (WS): DS, p 2, k 1, slip stm, k 1, p 2, k 1, turn

2. row (RS): DS, k 2, p 1, slip stm, p 1, k 2, p DS, p 1, turn

3. row (WS): DS, k 1, p 2, k 1, slip stm, k 1, p 2, k DS, k 1, turn

4. row (RS): DS, work all sts as they appear until next stm, slip stm, work all sts as they appear until DS, p DS, k 1, turn

5. row (WS): DS, work all sts as they appear until next stm, slip stm, work all sts as they appear until DS, k DS, p 1, turn

6. row (RS): DS, work all sts as they appear until next stm, slip stm, work all sts as they appear until DS, k DS, k 1, turn
7. row (WS): DS, work all sts as they appear until next stm, slip stm, work all sts as they appear until DS, p DS, p 1, turn
8. row (RS): DS, work all sts as they appear until next stm, slip stm, work all sts as they appear until DS, k DS, p 1, turn
9. row (WS): DS, work all sts as they appear until next stm, slip stm, work all sts as they appear until DS, p DS, k 1, turn
10. row (RS): DS, work all sts as they appear until next stm, slip stm, work all sts as they appear until DS, p DS, p 1, turn
11. row (WS): DS, work all sts as they appear until next stm, slip stm, work all sts as they appear until DS, k DS, k 1, turn

Work rows 4-11 another 1 (1) 2 (2) times. Work rows 4-7 1 (1) 0 (1) more time. The German short rows are now done, in the next RS-row complete the first round:

DS, knit all sts as they appear until next stm, remove stm, knit all sts as they appear until DS, k (k) p (k) DS, continue in double rib pattern until 1 st remains before next stm, p 1.

#### **XS (S) L (XXL):**

1. row: p 1, \*k 2, p 2\*, repeat \*-\* 9 (9) 10 (11) times, k 1, place stm, k 1, p 2, k 1, turn, now work German short rows

1. row (WS): DS, k 2, p 1, slip stm, p 1, k 2, p 1, turn
2. row (RS): DS, p 2, k 1, slip stm, k 1, p 2, k DS, k 1, turn
3. row (WS): DS, p 1, k 2, p 1, slip stm, p 1, k 2, p DS, p 1, turn
4. row (RS): DS, work all sts as they appear until next stm, slip stm, work all sts as they appear until DS, k DS, p 1, turn
5. row (WS): DS, work all sts as they appear until next stm, slip stm, work all sts as they appear until DS, p DS, k 1, turn
6. row (RS): DS, work all sts as they appear until next stm, slip stm, work all sts as they appear until DS, p DS, p 1, turn
7. row (WS): DS, work all sts as they appear until next stm, slip stm, work all sts as they appear until DS, k DS, k 1, turn
8. row (RS): DS, work all sts as they appear until next stm, slip stm, work all sts as they appear until DS, p DS, k 1, turn
9. row (WS): DS, work all sts as they appear until next stm, slip stm, work all sts as they appear until DS, k DS, p 1, turn
10. row (RS): DS, work all sts as they appear until next stm, slip stm, work all sts as they appear until DS, k DS, k 1, turn
11. row (WS): DS, work all sts as they appear until next stm, slip stm, work all sts as they appear until DS, p DS, p 1, turn

Work rows 4-11 another 1 (1) 2 (2) times. Work rows 4-9 1 (1) 0 (1) more time and rows 4-5 another 0 (0) 1 (0) times. The German short rows are now done, in the next RS-row complete the first round: DS, knit all sts as they appear until next stm, remove stm, knit all sts as they appear until DS, k (k) p (k) DS, continue in double rib pattern until 1 st remains before next stm, p 1.

## All sizes continue here

From now on the sleeve is knitted in rounds. To achieve a shaped fit, decreases are worked. Here it is useful to switch to double pointed needles 3.5 mm, alternatively use the Magic Loop technique.

### Short sleeve

1. round: p 1, k 1, **SKPO**, work all sts as they appear until 4 sts remain before next stm, **k2tog**, k 1, p 1

Work 5 rounds without decreases

7. round: = 1. round

Work 5 rounds without decreases

13. round: = 1. round

Work 5 rounds without decreases

19. round: = 1. round

Work 10 rounds without decreases

You now have 64 (64) 68 (68) 72 (76) 80 (84) sts on your needles. Bind off all sts using the tubular bind-off method for double rib pattern.

Work the second sleeve similarly.

### Long sleeve

1. round: p 1, k 1, **SKPO**, work all sts as they appear until 4 sts remain before next stm, **k2tog**, k 1, p 1

Work 5 rounds without decreases

7. round: = 1. round

Work 5 rounds without decreases

13. round: = 1. round

Work 5 rounds without decreases

19. round: = 1. round

Work 10 rounds without decreases

Work these 29 rounds a total of 3 times. It is useful to try on after each repetition to check the sleeve width. If you feel the sleeve is tight enough after the first or second repetition, continue knitting without decreases. Work the sleeve without decreases until it has a length of 42 cm (measured under the arm).

You now have 48 (48) 52 (52) 56 (60) 64 (68) sts on your needles. Now change to single rib pattern. Work as follows:

1. round: \*k 1, p 1\*, repeat \*-\* until BOR

Work in single rib pattern until you have knitted 8cm. Bind off all stitches using the Tubular bind-off method.

Alternatively, you can work the sleeve in double rib pattern until it has a length of 50cm (measured under the arm) and then using the Tubular bind-off method for double rib pattern.

Whichever option you choose, work the second sleeve similarly.

Finally, wave in all ends. Then there's just washing and blocking left (be careful with blocking, because the elasticity of the ripped structure is important to get a nice fit! However, the slit necessarily needs to be blocked, so that it falls visually straight after.), now you're done.

*Note: If you feel the neckline is a bit too 'open' after blocking, there is always the option to insert a thin elastic thread in a color that matches your knit to adjust the width. Here you can find a tutorial: <https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=w0UuHC2e-7I>*

*Alternatively, it is also possible to simply fix the front pieces at the neckline in one place.*
