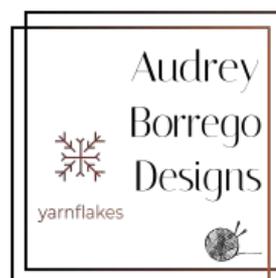


Phaedra



Notes

Phaedra is a cropped comfortable sweater with a texture panel on the front and a dot motif on the rest of the body and sleeves.

With intuitive motifs and easy adjustments, it's an easy to wear autumnal piece.

The pattern contains charted instructions and detailed instructions on how to maintain the motif and read your knitting, as well as optional bust darts for the front.

The center panel is wider for the larger sizes with small sections of twisted ribbing spacing the different motifs.

Yarn :

You will need

1100 (1200 / 1300 / **1450**), 1600 (**1700** / 1800 / **1950**) meters
1205 (**1315** / 1425 / **1585**), 1750 (**1860** / 1970 / **2135**) yards
of light fingering weight yarn

and

1000 (1100 / 1200 / 1350), 1500 (**1600** / 1700 / **1850**) meters
1095 (**1205** / 1315 / **1480**), 1640 (**1750** / 1860 / **2025**) yards
of lace weight yarn

The sample is knit with Knitting for Olive Merino in Hazel and Soft Silk Mohair in Plum Clay held together.

If substituting for a single strand of yarn, you will need :

1100 (1200 / 1300 / **1450**), 1600 (**1700** / 1800 / **1950**) meters
1205 (**1315** / 1425 / **1585**), 1750 (**1860** / 1970 / **2135**) yards
of sport to DK yarn.

Needles :

Main Fabric : 3.75 mm (US 5) circular needles with appropriate length to knit in the round and magic loop or DPNs.

Ribbing : 3.5 mm (US 4) circular needles with appropriate length to knit in the round and magic loop or DPNs.

or size required to get gauge

Gauge :

21.5 sts x 30 rnds per 10 cm – 4" with larger needles in dot motif after blocking
To swatch, cast-on 40 sts and work Chart B on page 13.

Notions :

Stitch markers, tapestry needle and scissors

Scrap yarn to place sts on hold

Spare needle for three needle-bind-off

Cable needle (optional)

Row counter recommended

Techniques used :

Bottom up drop shoulder sweater

Split ribbed hem, longer on the back

All over dot motif on the body and sleeves

Texture panel on the center front featuring twisted stitches, bobbles and small leaf motifs

Shoulders shaped with German Short rows and closed with a three needle bind-off

Picking up stitches

Straight sleeves with long ribbed cuffs

Optional German short-rows bust darts (based on Cup size)

Pattern includes charted instructions

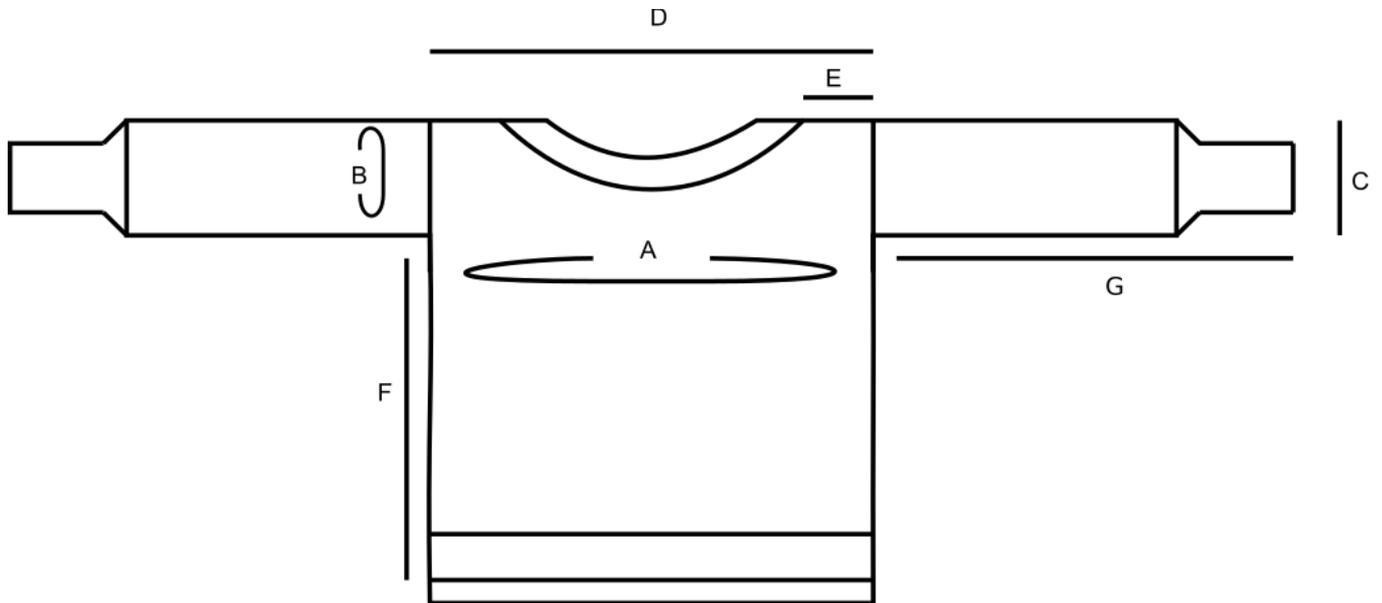
Sizes :

1 (2 / 3 / 4), 5 (6 / 7 / 8)

All measurements are those of the finished sweater.

Choose a size with about 20 cm – 7 ¾" positive ease at bust.

Shown in size 2 on a 88 cm – 34 ¾" bust.

Abbreviations :

- CO : cast-on / st(s) : stitch(es) / rnd(s) : round(s)
- BOR : beginning of round
- RS : right side / WS : wrong side
- m : marker / pm : place marker / sm : slip marker / rm : remove marker
- inc : increase / dec : decrease
- k : knit stitch / p : purl stitch
- ktbl : knit the st through its back loop
- ptbl : purl the st through its back loop
- slwyif : slip the st purlwise with yarn in front
- slwyib : slip the st purlwise with yarn in back
- yo : yarn over
- kyok : (k1, yo, k1) in one st (2 inc)
- Make bobble (see tutorial below) : [(k1, yo) x3, k1] into next st, yo pass all the 7 bobble strands over ; pick up the thread on the WS below the bobble, knit it together with the last st on the right needle
- LT (see tutorial below) : left twist, ktbl the second st on the left needle, then k2tog through the back loop with the first stitch of the left needle
- RT (see tutorial below) : right twist, k2tog without dropping the stitches off the needle, then knit into the first stitch again
- 1/1/1 RPT : slip the next 2 sts on a cable needle and hold in back, k1tbl, slide the leftest st from the cable needle back onto the left needle and p1 then k1tbl from cable needle
- m1L : make 1 left, lift the bar between the stitches onto the left needle from front to back, knit through the back loop (1 inc)
- k2tog : knit the next 2 sts together (1 dec)
- s2kp : slip the next 2 st together knitwise, k1, pass the slipped sts over (2 dec)
- DS : double stitch for German short rows
- *-* : repeat instructions between asterisks

Notes :

Left and Right parts refer to the sweater once worn.

Reading the Chart :

When knitting in the round, always read the Charts from right to left.

When knitting flat, read the Charts back and forth : RS rows from right to left and WS rows from left to right.

Back hem

With smaller needles, CO 100 (**112** / 124 / **136**), 148 (**160** / 172 / **184**) sts using the [German Twisted Cast-on](#).
(*German Twisted Cast-on tutorial by Very Pink Knits*)

hem row 1 (WS) : sl1wyif, *p2, k2* to last 3 sts, p3
hem row 2 (RS) : sl1wyib, *k2, p2* to last 3 sts, k3

Work hem rows 1-2 until the back hem measures 5 cm – 2" or desired length, ending after a WS row.

Cut yarn and put sts on hold.

Front hem

With smaller needles, CO 108 (**120** / 132 / **144**), 156 (**168** / 180 / **192**) sts using the [German Twisted Cast-on](#).

hem row 1 (WS) : sl1wyif, *p2, k2* to last 3 sts, p3
hem row 2 (RS) : sl1wyib, *k2, p2* to last 3 sts, k3

Work hem rows 1-2 until the front hem measures 3 cm – 1 ¼" or desired length, ending after a WS row.

Joining hems

Switch to larger needles.

Sizes 1, 3, 4 only :

next row (RS) : k3 (- / 2 / **4**), *m1L, k21 (- / 26 / **28**)* to end of front hem sts (*5 inc*)

Size 2 only :

next row (RS) : k12, *m1L, k24 * to last 12 sts of front hem sts, m1L, knit to end (*5 inc*)

Sizes 5 to 8 only :

next row (RS) : k1 (**0** / 2 / **1**), *m1L, k22 (**24** / 25 / **27**)* to last 1 (**0** / 3 / **2**) sts of front hem sts, knit to end (*7 inc*)

ALL SIZES

PM for side.

Replace back hem sts on the needle with RS facing, joining them to the front hem sts and knit to end.

Join to work in the rnd and PM for BOR.

213 (**237** / 261 / **285**), 311 (**335** / 359 / **383**) body sts

Body

Now, you will start working the dot motif (Chart B) on the back and on the sides of the front, while following Chart A between the markers on the center front.

Treat the two side fronts and the back separately : do not work continuously Chart B across the side and BOR markers. Instead stop at the markers and restart after slipping them.

If you need a memory tip to work the dot motif more intuitively : the purl sts only happen on rnds 1, 7, 13 and 19, where you will find the little dot symbol to the right of Chart A. You should easily see how to align them after a few repeats.

set-up rnd : work rnd 1 of Chart B over the next 28 (**34** / 40 / **46**), 40 (**46** / 52 / **58**) sts – 4 (**5** / 6 / **7**), 6 (**7** / 8 / **9**) repeats, **PM**, work rnd 1 of Chart A over the next 57 (**57** / **57**), 83 (**83** / 83 / **83**) sts, **PM**, work rnd 1 of Chart B – 4 (**5** / 6 / **7**), 6 (**7** / 8 / **9**) repeats to side m, sm,
work rnd 1 of Chart B – 16 (**18** / 20 / **22**), 24 (**26** / 28 / **30**) repeats to end

Note : you may place additional markers within the Chart A section to help you follow the different little motifs like so :

Sizes 1 to 4 :

4 sts, PM, 10 sts, PM, 4 sts, PM, 21 sts, PM, 4 sts, PM, 10 sts, PM

Sizes 5 to 8 :

10 sts, PM, 10 sts, PM, 10 sts, PM, 21 sts, PM, 10 sts, PM, 10 sts, PM

body rnd : Chart B to m, sm, Chart A to m, sm, Chart B to side m, sm, Chart B to end.

Bust darts :

If you wear a cup size greater than B or your full bust measurement is more than 8 cm – 3 ¼" larger than your upper chest measurement, consider adding bust darts on the body. See instructions on page 10.

Work the body rnd until the body measures at least 30 cm – 11 ¾" from the front hem cast-on or desired length to the underarm, measuring along the side and ending after an uneven rnd of the Chart.

Separating Front and Back

next rnd : Chart B to m, sm, Chart A to m, sm, Chart B to 1 (1 / 7 / 10), 12 (12 / 14 / 14) sts before side m, bind-off next 2 (2 / 14 / 20), 24 (24 / 28 / 28) sts removing side m, Chart B (starting with st 3) to 1 (1 / 7 / 10), 12 (12 / 14 / 14) sts before end, bind-off next 2 (2 / 14 / 20), 24 (24 / 28 / 28) sts removing BOR marker.

Notice where you stopped on the dot motif (Chart B) so you can resume it on the back later.

Leave the 98 (110 / 110 / 116), 124 (136 / 144 / 156) back sts on hold.

111 (123 / 123 / 129), 139 (151 / 159 / 171) front sts

Front

From now on, maintain the dot motif as established, keeping the purl sts aligned and spaced by 5 sts and 5 rows as before.

Note that on the first row, you have already work the first st with the bind-off.

front row 1 (RS) : dot motif to m, sm, Chart A to m, sm, dot motif to end

front row 2 (WS) : dot motif to m, sm, Chart A to m, sm, dot motif to end

Work the front rows 1-2 until it measures 9.5 (11 / 12 / 13), 14 (15 / 16 / 17) cm 3 ¾ (4 ¼ / 4 ¾ / 5), 5 ½ (6 / 6 ¼ / 6 ¾)" from the armhole, ending after a WS row between rows 10 and 24 of Chart A.

If you cannot reach the correct measurement without working rows 1 to 9, work them without making the leaf motifs and continue the line of twisted sts instead.

From now on, you will maintain the motif of Chart A on the remaining sts while binding-off for the neckline according to the following principles :

- *work as established the twisted stitches and purl stitches,*
- *do not work the leaf motif, keep the line of twisted sts instead.*
- *avoid working a bobble closer than 2 sts from the neck edge,*
- *if you do not have enough sts to work a LT or RT, work them as ktbl or purls instead as established.*

next row (RS) : dot motif to m, sm, Chart A over the next 19 (17 / 17 / 16), 28 (28 / 28 / 28) sts, bind-off next 19 (23 / 23 / 25), 27 (27 / 27 / 27) sts, Chart A to m, sm, dot motif to end

Note down where you stopped on Chart A and dot motif so you can resume it later on the left front shoulder.

46 (50 / 50 / 52), 56 (62 / 66 / 72) sts for each front shoulder

Leave left front shoulder sts on hold.

Right Front Shoulder

row 1 (WS) : dot motif to m, sm, Chart A to end

row 2 (RS) : bind-off 4 sts, Chart A to m, sm, dot motif to end

Work last 2 rows twice more, then work row 1 once more.

34 (**38** / 38 / **40**), 44 (**50** / 54 / **60**) sts

row 8 (RS) : bind-off 2 sts, Chart A to m, sm, dot motif to end

row 9 (WS) : dot motif to m, sm, Chart A to end

Work last 2 rows once more.

30 (**34** / 34 / **36**), 40 (**46** / 50 / **56**) sts

Sizes 1 to 4 only :

next row (RS) : bind-off 1 st removing the marker, dot motif to end

Sizes 5 to 8 only :

next row (RS) : bind-off 1 st, Chart A to m, sm, dot motif to end

29 (**33** / 33 / **35**), 39 (**45** / 49 / **55**) sts

If necessary, work straight in dot motif and the remaining Chart A for sizes 5 to 8 until the right front shoulder measures

15.5 (**16.5** / 18.5 / **19.5**), 21.5 (**23.5** / 24.5 / **25.5**) cm

6 (**6 1/2** / 7 1/4 / **7 3/4**), 8 1/4 (**9 1/4** / 9 3/4 / **10**)"

from the armhole, ending after a WS row. Count how many rows you work to replicate it on the other shoulder.

Shoulder shaping :

If you have never knit German short rows, here is a [helpful tutorial](#) on how to make Double Stitches.

(German short-rows tutorial by Very Pink Knits)

short-row 1 (RS) : work as established to last 6 sts, turn

short-row 2 (WS) : DS, work as established

to end

short-row 3 : work as established to 3 sts before last DS, turn

short-row 4 : DS, work as established to end

Work short-rows 3-4 twice more.

next row (RS) : knit to end, knitting the DS normally as one st

Cut yarn and put sts on hold.

Left Front Shoulder

Rejoin yarn on the WS of the left front shoulder sts on the neck edge. Resume Chart A where you stopped it.

row 1 (WS) : bind-off 4 sts, Chart A to m, sm, dot motif to end

row 2 (RS) : dot motif to m, sm, Chart A to end

Work last 2 rows twice more.

34 (**38** / 38 / **40**), 44 (**50** / 54 / **60**) sts

row 8 (WS) : bind-off 2 sts, Chart A to m, sm, dot motif to end

row 9 (RS) : dot motif to m, sm, Chart A to end

Work last 2 rows once more.

30 (**34** / 34 / **36**), 40 (**46** / 50 / **56**) sts

Sizes 1 to 4 only :

next row (WS) : bind-off 1 st removing the marker, dot motif to end

Sizes 5 to 8 only :

next row (WS) : bind-off 1 st, Chart A to m, sm, dot motif to end

29 (**33** / 33 / **35**), 39 (**45** / 49 / **55**) sts

If necessary, work straight in dot motif as you did for the right front shoulder, ending with a RS row.

Shoulder shaping :

short-row 1 (WS) : work as established to last 6 sts, turn

short-row 2 (RS) : DS, work as established to end

short-row 3 : work as established to 3 sts before last DS, turn

short-row 4 : DS, work as established to end

Work short-rows 3-4 twice more.

next row (WS) : purl to end, purling the DS normally as one st

Cut yarn and put sts on hold.

Back

Rejoin yarn on the RS of the back sts.

Resuming dot motif where you stopped it, work the back until it measures

14 (**15** / 17 / **19**), 20 (**22** / 23 / **24**) cm

5 1/2 (**6** / 6 3/4 / **7 1/2**), 7 3/4 (**8 3/4** / 9 / **9 1/2**)" from the armhole, ending after a WS row.

next row (RS) : dot motif over 35 (**39** / 39 / **41**), 45 (**51** / 55 / **61**) sts, bind-off next 28 (**32** / 32 / **34**), 34 (**34** / 34 / **34**) sts, dot motif to end

Note down where you stopped on the dot motif so you can resume it later on the right back shoulder.

*35 (**39** / 39 / **41**), 45 (**51** / 55 / **61**) sts for each back shoulder*

Leave right back shoulder sts on hold.

Left Back Shoulder

row 1 (WS) : dot motif to end

row 2 (RS) : bind-off 4 sts, dot motif to end

row 3 : like row 1

row 4 : bind-off 2 sts, dot motif to end

*29 (**33** / 33 / **35**), 39 (**45** / 49 / **55**) sts*

If necessary, work straight in dot motif until the left back shoulder measures

15.5 (**16.5** / 18.5 / **19.5**), 21.5 (**23.5** / 24.5 /

25.5) cm

6 (**6 1/2** / 7 1/4 / **7 3/4**), 8 1/4 (**9 1/4** / 9 3/4 / **10**)"

from the armhole, ending after a WS row. Count how many rows you work to replicate it on the other shoulder.

Shoulder shaping :

short-row 1 (RS) : dot motif to last 6 sts, turn

short-row 2 (WS) : DS, dot motif to end

short-row 3 : dot motif to 3 sts before last DS, turn

short-row 4 : DS, dot motif to end

Work short-rows 3-4 twice more.

next row (RS) : knit to end, knitting the DS normally as one st

Cut yarn, leaving a 120 cm – 47 1/4" tail and put sts on hold.

Right Back Shoulder

Rejoin yarn on the WS of the right back sts on the neck edge.

row 1 (WS) : bind-off 4 sts, dot motif to end

row 2 (RS) : dot motif to end

row 3 : bind-off 2 sts, dot motif to end

row 4 : like row 2

*29 (**33** / 33 / **35**), 39 (**45** / 49 / **55**) sts*

If necessary, work straight in dot motif with one more row than you did for the left back shoulder to end with a RS row.

Shoulder shaping :

short-row 1 (WS) : dot motif to last 6 sts, turn

short-row 2 (RS) : DS, dot motif to end

short-row 3 : dot motif to 3 sts before last DS, turn

short-row 4 : DS, dot motif to end

Work short-rows 3-4 twice more.

next row (WS) : purl to end, purling the DS normally as one st

Joining Shoulders

Flip the sweater inside out so you are looking at the WS.

With the yarn still attached to the right back shoulder, place the corresponding front shoulder sts on another needle. Using the [three-needle bind-off method](#), join front and back shoulders together.

(3-needle bind-off tutorial by Very Pink Knits)

When you have 1 st left, thread working yarn through it and fasten off.

Place the sts from the left shoulders back on two needles. With the long tail you left attached to the back left shoulder, repeat the three-needle bind-off method for this side.

Sleeves

With larger needles and RS facing, starting at the center of the underarm, pick up and knit

60 (**66** / 78 / **84**), 96 (**108** / 114 / **126**) sts around the armhole.

If you'd like to adjust the sleeve circumference, simply make sure to pick up a multiple of 6 sts.

Join to work in the round and PM for BOR.

Work the dot motif repeat from Chart B

10 (**11** / 13 / **14**), 16 (**18** / 19 / **21**) times around until the sleeve measures 30 cm – 11 ¾" from the underarm or 15 cm – 6" less than desired length.

Cuff :

Switch to smaller needles.

Sizes 1, 2 only :

next rnd : *k1, k2tog* to end

Sizes 3 to 8 only :

next rnd : k - (- / 9 / **10**), 4 (**2** / 3 / **1**)

k2tog to last - (- / 9 / **10**), 4 (**2** / 3 / **1**) sts, knit to end

40 (**44** / 48 / **52**), 52 (**56** / 60 / **64**) sts

cuff rnd : *k2, p2* to end

Work the cuff rnd until the cuff measures 15 cm – 6" or desired length.

Loosely bind-off all sts in pattern.

Repeat for second sleeve.

Neckline

With smaller needles and RS facing, starting at the right shoulder seam, pick up and knit

15 sts from back right curve

24 (**24** / 24 / **26**), 26 (**26** / 26 / **26**) sts from back neck

15 sts from back left curve

20 (**20** / 22 / **22**), 23 (**23** / 25 / **27**) sts from front left curve

18 (**18** / 18 / **20**), 22 (**22** / 22 / **22**) sts from front neck

and 20 (**20** / 22 / **22**), 23 (**23** / 25 / **27**) sts from front right curve

112 (**112** / 116 / **120**), 124 (**124** / 128 / **132**) sts

If you'd like to adjust the neck opening, simply make sure to pick up a multiple of 4 sts.

Join to work in the round and PM for BOR.

neck rnd : *k2, p2* to end

Work the neck rnd until the collar measures 4 cm – 1 ½" or desired length.

Loosely bind-off all sts in pattern.

Bust darts instructions :

Work the body until it measures 28 cm – 11" from the front hem or 2 cm – ¾" less than desired body length, ending after an even rnd of the Chart.

Here is a [helpful tutorial](#) on how to make Double Stitches.

(German short-rows tutorial by Very Pink Knits)

Note : making the short rows will mean that some of the dot motif will be irregular on the sides of the front, with purl sts closer to one another. Do not take this into account and continue following Chart B normally regardless.

CUP C AND D ONLY

Full bust measurement at least 8 cm – 3 ¼" more than upper chest measurement.

Short row 1 (RS) : work as established to 2 sts before side M, turn

Short row 2 (WS) : DS, work as established to 2 sts before BOR m, turn

Short row 3 : DS, work as established to 3 (4 / 5 / 5), 6 (7 / 7 / 8) sts before last DS, turn

Short row 4 : DS, work as established to 3 (4 / 5 / 5), 6 (7 / 7 / 8) sts before last DS, turn

Repeat short rows 3-4 : 2 more times.

short row 9 : DS, work as established to end, closing the short-rows by working the DS normally.

CUP E AND F ONLY

Full bust measurement at least 12 cm – 4 ¾" more than upper chest measurement.

Short row 1 (RS) : work as established to 2 sts before side M, turn

Short row 2 (WS) : DS, work as established to 2 sts before BOR m, turn

Short row 3 : DS, work as established to 3 (3 / 4 / 4), 5 (5 / 6 / 7) sts before last DS, turn

Short row 4 : DS, work as established to 3 (3 / 4 / 4), 5 (5 / 6 / 7) sts before last DS, turn

Repeat short rows 3-4 : 3 more times.

Short row 11 : DS, work as established to end, closing the short-rows by working the DS normally.

CUP G AND H ONLY

Full bust measurement at least 16 cm – 6 ¼" more than upper chest measurement.

Short row 1 (RS) : work as established to 2 sts before side M, turn

Short row 2 (WS) : DS, work as established to 2 sts before BOR m, turn

Short row 3 : DS, work as established to 2 (3 / 3 / 3), 4 (4 / 5 / 6) sts before last DS, turn

Short row 4 : DS, work as established to 2 (3 / 3 / 3), 4 (4 / 5 / 6) sts before last DS, turn

Repeat short rows 3-4 : 4 more times.

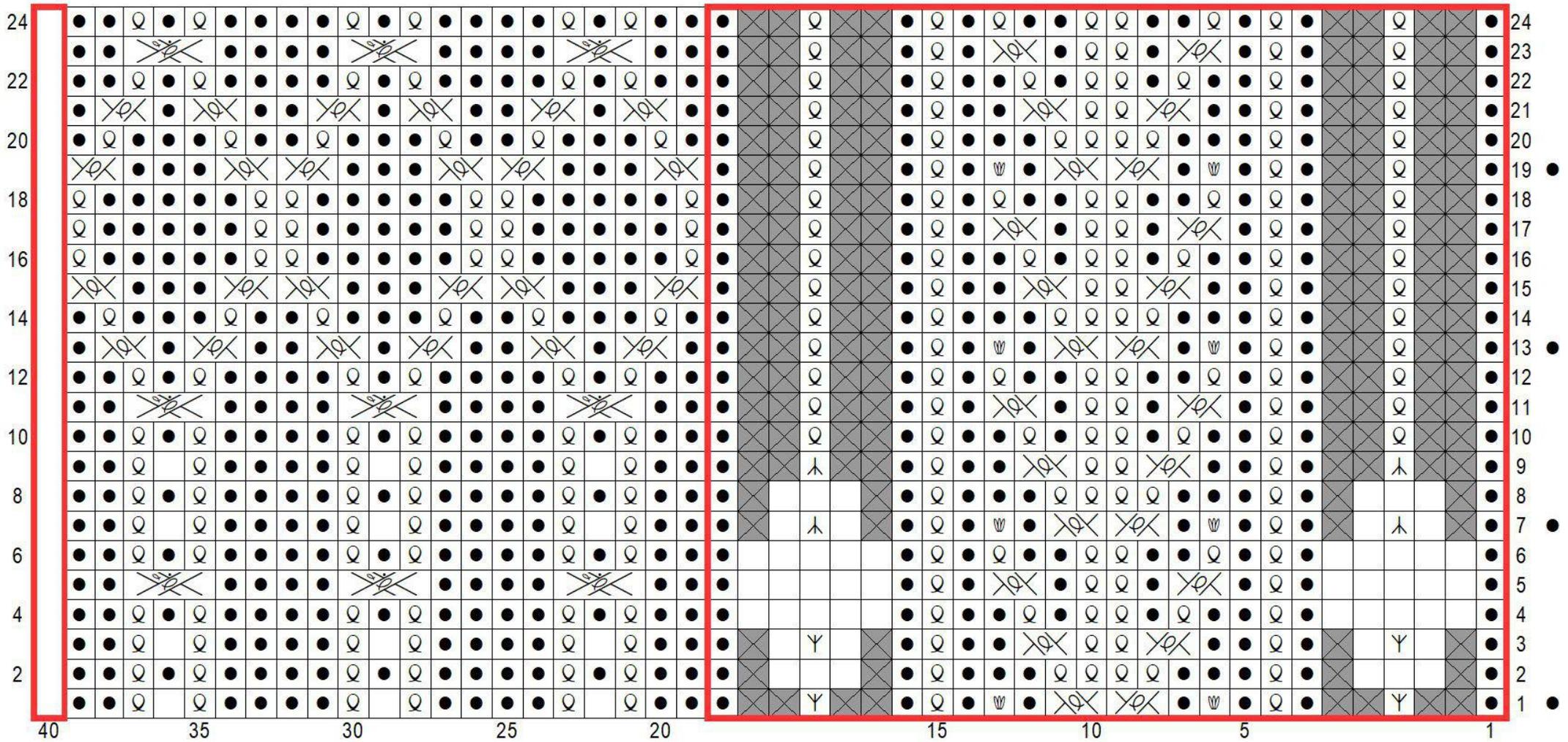
Short row 13 : DS, work as established to end, closing the short-rows by working the DS normally.

ALL CUPS RESUME

On the next round, close the remaining short-rows by working the DS normally.

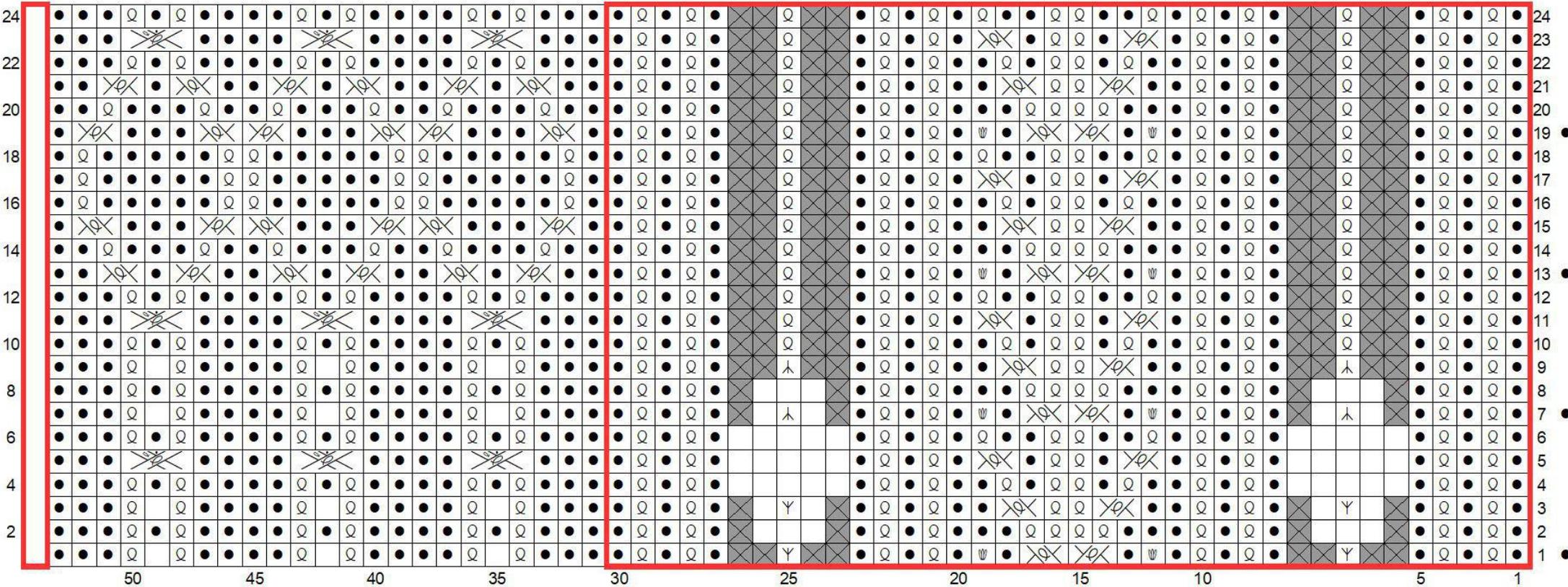
Continue with the body per main instructions.

CHART A SIZES 1 TO 4



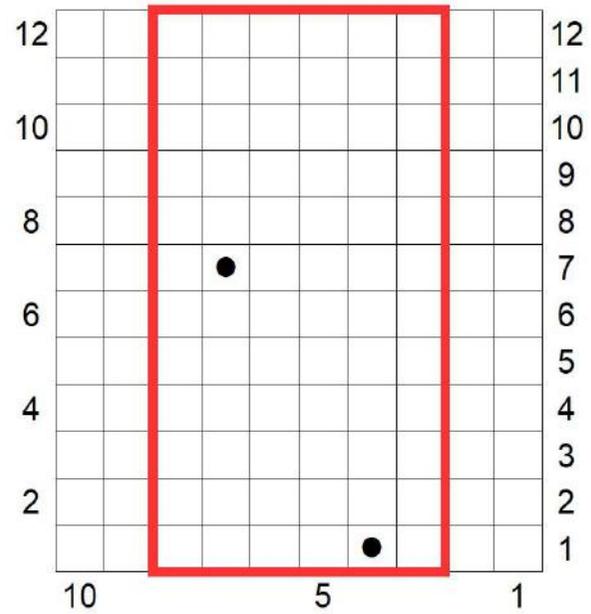

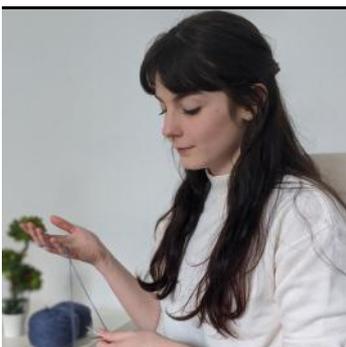
