

PICTUS PULLOVER

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Pictus from Latin “embellished” is for those, who like me, love colourwork. The pullover is knit top-down in the round with a floral colourwork pattern running down the yoke, body and part of the sleeve. The pattern on the underarm sections of the body and sleeves is different in each size, making each size even more unique.

SIZES

The pattern is written for nine sizes 1 (2, 3, 4, 5) (6, 7, 8, 9) with a finished bust circumference of ca. 80 (92, 103, 115, 127) (138, 150, 162, 173) cm // 32 (36.75, 41.25, 46, 50.75) (55.25, 60, 64.75, 69.25) in incl. ca. 10 cm (4 in) of the recommended positive ease.

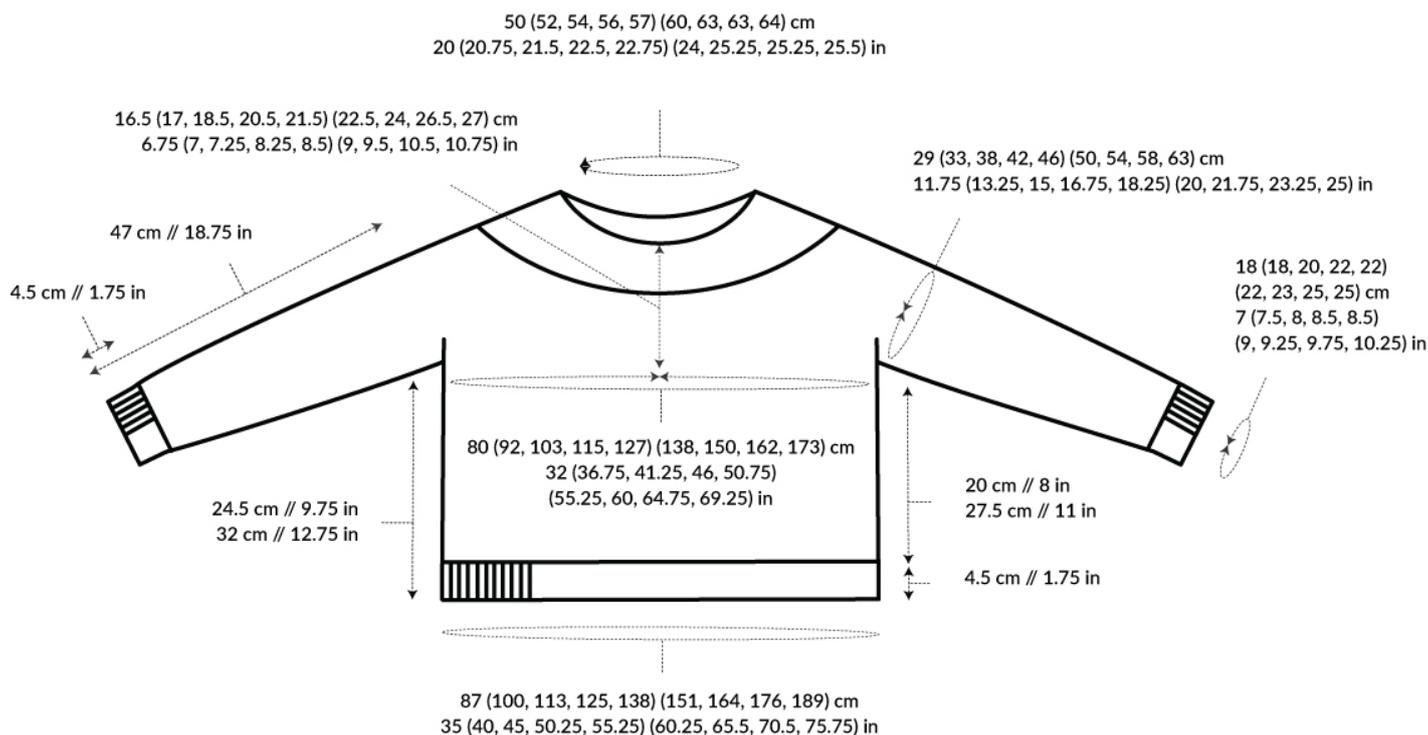
The sample is shown in size 2 on a 160 cm (5.3 ft) tall model with ca. 84-66-94 cm (33-26-39 in) body measurements.

For more of the finished garment measurements, please refer to the schematic on page 2.

YARN

MC: ca. 170 (190, 215, 250, 275) (305, 325, 375, 400) g or 2 (2, 3, 3, 3) (4, 4, 4, 4) skeins of Darnie from Studio Donegal, 100% merino wool, 2 ply with 410 m (448 yds) in 100 g, shown in colourway 8812 Oatmeal;

or ca. 697 (779, 882, 1025, 1128) (1251, 1333, 1538, 1640) m // 763 (852, 964, 1121, 1233) (1368, 1458, 1682, 1794) yds of any other fingering/sport weight yarn with a matching gauge.



**Middle of the front length neck to bottom of the hem
cropped version:**

41 (42, 43, 45, 46) (47, 48, 51, 51) cm
16.5 (16.5, 17, 18, 18.25) (18.75, 19.25, 20.25, 20.5) in
full length: +7 cm (2.75 in)

**Middle of the back length neck to bottom of the hem
cropped version:**

45 (46, 47, 49, 51) (52, 53, 56, 57) cm
18 (18.25, 18.75, 19.75, 20.25) (20.75, 21.25, 22.5, 22.5) in
full length: +7 cm (2.75 in)

YARN (CONTINUED)

CC: ca. 58 (65, 75, 90, 100) (110, 120, 140, 150) g
or 1 (1, 1, 1, 1) (2, 2, 2, 2) skeins of the same yarn,
(here I'm using a sister yarn Kilcarra Soft
Donegal Tweed Singles from Donegal Yarns
from a cone, in colourway 5585 Sunset);

or ca. 238 (267, 308, 369, 410) (451, 492,
574, 615) m // 260 (292, 336, 404, 449) (493,
538, 628, 673) yds of any other fingering/
sport weight yarn with a matching gauge.

The yardage for bpth MC and CC is calculated for
a cropped version and already includes 10% extra.

**Add 10-20% more for the full or extended
beyond that length of the pullover (see
measurements above).**

NEEDLES AND NOTIONS

- 3.0 mm (US 2.5) and 3.5 mm (US 4);
- spare cables, spare circular needles or scrap
yarn to keep sts on hold;
- a few stitch markers;
- a tapestry needle to weave in the ends.

GAUGE

- 24 sts & 28 rnds in 10 cm (4 in) on
3.5 mm (US 4) needles measured over stockinette
stitch worked in the round after blocking;
- 24 sts & 24 rnds in 10 cm (4 in) on
3.5 mm (US 4) needles measured over
colourwork pattern of the yoke and body
worked in the round after blocking;

ADDITIONAL GAUGES

- 25 sts & 36 rnds in 10 cm (4 in) on 3.0 mm (US 2.5) needles measured over stockinette st;
- 22 sts & 35 rnds in 10 cm (4 in) on 3.5 mm (US 4) needles measured over 1x1 ribbing;
- 26 sts & 35 rnds in 10 cm (4 in) on 3.0 mm (US 2.5) needles measured over 1x1 ribbing.

Adjust the needle sizes if necessary to obtain the correct gauge.

CONSTRUCTION AND NOTES

The neck starts from a long-tail cast-on, followed by the stockinette st section with increases for the yoke. For a more narrow neck opening, cast on using an even smaller needle. To avoid raw neckline edge an alternative ribbing option is provided.

The short row shaping of the neckline is worked before the colourwork of the yoke. From the beginning of the colourwork section, the yoke is shaped with gradual increases. The number of pattern repeats in the yoke depends on the size. Also note, I intentionally charted the flower in the second pattern repeat smaller than on my sample.

The yoke is split for body and sleeves in Rnds 35, 44 and 53, depending on the size. The body is worked by continuing the colourwork as previously established on the yoke. The colourwork of the underarm sections is charted for each size separately, which adds additional uniqueness to each of the sizes. It can also be replaced with simple “dots” pattern (k1, k1cc) if you like it better that way.

To adjust the length of the body, add more pattern repeats at the bottom. The body transitions into hem via a little string of dots. The hem is worked in 1x1 ribbing on the same needle as the body for a more relaxed, less fitted look. Switch to a smaller needle if necessary.

The colourwork pattern of the yoke continues down the sleeve by 2 pattern repeats. The sleeves are on the wider side, they start wide around the upper arm and are gradually shaped with decreases towards the cuffs. For a more fitted version, consider decreasing a number of sts right after the colourwork section.

The cuffs are worked in simple 1x1 ribbing on a smaller size needle. I recommend using tubular bind-off, but feel free to replace it with your favorite technique.

ABBREVIATIONS AND TECHNIQUES

BOR/EOR – beginning/end of the round;

ca. – circa – approximately;

colourwork –

- if not specified otherwise, work with the MC;
- always keep MC on top of CC on the WS;
- catch the floats on the WS every 3-4 sts;

kX – knit X sts with MC;

kXcc – knit X sts with CC;

kall – knit all to EOR with MC;

kallcc – knit all to EOR with CC;

k2tog – knit 2 sts together as if they were one;

LH/RH – left/right hand (needle);

LLI – [left lifted increase](#) – lift the left leg of the stitch 2 rows below the stitch on RH needle onto LH needle and knit it through the back loop (left leaning 1 st increase);

MC/CC – main/contrasting colour (mc/cc);

MOF – middle of the front (marker);

R/Rnd/SR – row/round/short row;

rep – repeat;

RS/WS – right/wrong side of the work;

st(s) – stitch(es);

ssk – slip the next 2 sts, one by one, knitwise, insert the tip of the LH needle, from left to right, into the fronts of those 2 sts and knit them together;

w&t – [wrap and turn](#) –

- at the end of the short row before a knit st (RS), with the yarn at the back, slip next st purlwise to the RH needle, bring the yarn to the front, return the last st off the RH needle to the LH needle and turn your work, bring the yarn in front and start working the following row according to the previously established pattern;
- at the end of the short row before a purl st (WS), keep the yarn in the front, slip the next st purlwise to the RH needle, turn your work, bring the yarn to the front, move the first st to the RH needle, bring the yarn to the back and start working the following row according to the previously established pattern;
- pick up wraps in the next full rnds [as shown](#);
- the short rows could also be worked as [German short rows](#) or [Japanese short rows](#).

NECK

Using a long-tail cast-on (or any other non-stretchy cast-on method) with 3.0 mm (US 2.5) needles and MC cast on a total of 100 (104, 108, 112, 114) (120, 126, 126, 128) sts. Join to work in the round and place the BOR marker. To further adjust neck circumference, cast on using a smaller needle size.

Rnds 1 and 2 (2 rnds): kall.

Rnd 3: *k2, LLI; rep from * to EOR.

You will have a total of 150 (156, 162, 168, 171) (180, 189, 189, 192) sts.

Rnd 4: k75 (78, 81, 84, 86) (90, 95, 95, 96), place MOF, k to EOR.

Alternatively, if you prefer to avoid the raw neckline, start the neck as follows:

Rnds 1 and 2 (2 rnds): k1, p1.

Rnd 3: kall.

Rnd 4: *k2, LLI; rep from * to EOR.

You will have a total of 150 (156, 162, 168, 171) (180, 189, 189, 192) sts.

Rnd 5: k75 (78, 81, 84, 86) (90, 95, 95, 96), place MOF, k to EOR.

SHAPING THE NECK WITH SHORT ROWS

Depending on the size, there will be a total of 15 (15, 15, 17, 17) (17, 19, 19, 19) short rows.

SR1 (RS): from the BOR in the middle of the back, k till 12 sts to (before) MOF, w&t.

SR2 (WS): p to BOR, p till 12 sts to (before) MOF, w&t.

SR3 (RS): k till 6 sts to previous wrap, w&t.

SR4 (WS): p till 6 sts to previous wrap, w&t.

Your short rows will become shorter and shorter.

SR5, SR7, SR9, SR11, SR13 (RS): rep like in SR3.

SR6, SR8, SR10, SR12, SR14 (WS): rep like in SR4.

- **Sizes 1, 2, 3:** move to SR15(RS);
- **Sizes 4, 5, 6:** rep SR3-4 one (1) more time;
- **Sizes 7, 8, 9:** rep SR3-4 two (2) more times.

Add more short rows if necessary.

SR15 (15, 15, 17, 17) (17, 19, 19, 19) (RS): k to BOR and move to the next section.

YOKE

Rnd 1: kall

and **at the same time** remove MOF marker and pick up short row wraps and knit them together with their corresponding sts.

Rnd 2: kall.

Rnd 3: *k6 (6, 3, 3, 3) (3, 3, 3, 2), LLI; rep from * to EOR.

You will have a total of

175 (182, 216, 224, 228) (240, 252, 252, 288) sts.

SIZES 1 (2, 3, 4) ONLY

Rnds 4, 5 (2 rnds): kall.

Rnd 6: *k25 (7, 12, 7), LLI; rep from * to EOR.

You will have a total of 182 (208, 234, 256) sts.

- **SIZE 1:** move to the next rnd;
- **SIZE 2:** work in stockinette for 2 (two) more rnds and then move to the next rnd;
- **SIZE 3:** work in stockinette for 6 (six) more rnds and then move to the next rnd;
- **SIZE 4:** move to the next rnd.

Pick up CC yarn.

Next rnd: *k1, k1cc; rep from * to EOR.

- **SIZES 1 (2, 3):** work in stockinette for 2 (two) more rnds;
- **SIZE 4:** work in stockinette for 2 (two) more rnds and in the second rnd increase evenly a total of 4 sts as follows — *k64, LLI; rep from * to EOR (260 sts).

Switch to 3.5 (US 4) mm needles and follow the yoke pattern chart on page 9 and/or further written instructions.

SIZE 5 ONLY

Rnds 4, 5, 6, 7 (4 rnds): kall.

Rnd 8: *k4, LLI; rep from * to EOR (285 sts).

Work in stockinette for 2 (two) more rnds and in the second rnd increase 1 (one) st (286 sts).

Pick up CC yarn.

Rnd 11: *k1, k1cc; rep from * to EOR.

Rnds 12 and 13 (2 rnds): kall.

Switch to 3.5 (US 4) mm needles and follow the yoke pattern chart on page 9 and/or further written instructions.

YOKE

SIZES 6 (7, 8, 9) ONLY

Rnds 4, 5, 6, 7 (4 rnds): kall.

Rnd 8: *k4 (6, 4, 4), LLI; rep from * to EOR.

You will have a total of 300 (294, 315, 360) sts.

Rnds 9, 10, 11 (3 rnds): kall.

Rnd 12: *k25 (7, 7, 12), LLI; rep from * to EOR.

You will have a total of 312 (336, 360, 390) sts.

- **SIZE 6:** work in stockinette for 2 (two) more rnds and move to the next rnd;
- **SIZE 7:** work in stockinette for 4 (four) more rnds and move to the next rnd;
- **SIZE 8:** work in stockinette for 4 (four) more rnds and move to the next rnd;
- **SIZE 9:** work in stockinette for 4 (four) more rnds and move to the next rnd.

Pick up CC yarn.

Next rnd: *k1, k1cc; rep from * to EOR.

- **SIZES 6 (9):** work in stockinette for 2 (two) more rnds;
- **SIZE 7 (8):** work in stockinette for 2 (two) more rnds and in the second rnd increase evenly a total of 2 (4) sts (338 (364) sts).

Switch to 3.5 (US 4) mm needles and follow the yoke pattern chart on page 9 and/or further written instructions.

YOKE (CONTINUED)

ALL SIZES

Rnd 1: *k2, k10cc, k1; rep from * to EOR.

Rnd 2: *k6, k2cc, k5; rep from * to EOR.

Rnd 3: *k6, k1cc, k6; rep from * to EOR.

Rnd 4: *k5, k4cc, k1, k2cc, k1; rep from * to EOR.

Rnd 5: *k4, k2cc, k1, k5cc, k1; rep from * to EOR.

Rnd 6: *k3, k3cc, k2, k1cc, k1, k1cc, k2, LLI;
rep from * to EOR.

You will have a total of

196 (224, 252, 280, 308) (336, 364, 392, 420) sts.

Rnd 7: *k2, k4cc, k1, k6cc, k1; rep from * to EOR.

Rnd 8: *k2, k2cc, k1, k1cc, k1,
k2cc, k1, k3cc, k1; rep from * to EOR.

Rnd 9: *k5, k1cc, k4, k2cc, k2; rep from * to EOR.

Rnd 10: *k5, k2cc, k7, LLI; rep from * to EOR.

You will have a total of

210 (240, 270, 300, 330) (360, 390, 420, 450) sts.

Rnd 11: *k1, k2cc, k1, k4cc, k7; rep from * to EOR.

Rnd 12: unravel and slip 1 st from the RH needle, returning it back to LH needle, move BOR to this point (1 st to the right), then
*k2, k5cc, k1, k2cc, k5; rep from * to EOR.

Rnd 13: *k3, k1cc, k1, k1cc, k2, k4cc, k3;
rep from * to EOR.

Rnd 14: *k1, k6cc, k1, k5cc, k2; rep from * to EOR.

Rnd 15: *k1, k3cc, k1, k2cc, k1,
k1cc, k1, k4cc, k1, LLI; rep from * to EOR.
You will have a total of
224 (256, 288, 320, 352) (384, 416, 448, 480) sts.

Rnd 16: *k2, k2cc, k4, k1cc, k2, k3cc, k2;
rep from * to EOR.

Rnd 17: *k8, k1cc, k7; rep from * to EOR.

Rnd 18: *k7, k1cc, k8, rep from * to EOR.

Rnd 19: *k5, k5cc, k2, k2cc, k2;
rep from * to EOR.

Rnd 20: *k3, k4cc, k1, k3cc, k1, k3cc, k1, LLI;
rep from * to EOR.
You will have a total of
238 (272, 306, 340, 374) (408, 442, 476, 510) sts.

Rnd 21: *k2, k5cc, k2, k6cc, k2; rep from * to EOR.

Rnd 22: *k1, k4cc, k1, k1cc, k3, k1cc, k1, k1cc, k4;
rep from * to EOR.

Rnd 23: *k4cc, k2, k1cc, k1, k7cc, k2;
rep from * to EOR.

Rnd 24: *k3cc, k3, k1cc, k1, k3cc, k1, k3cc, k2;
rep from * to EOR.

Rnd 25: *k6, k1cc, k2, k2cc, k1, k2cc, k3;
rep from * to EOR.

Rnd 26: *k7, k1cc, k9, LLI; rep from * to EOR.
You will have a total of
252 (288, 324, 360, 396) (432, 468, 504, 540) sts.

Rnd 27: *k5, k5cc, k8; rep from * to EOR.

Rnd 28: unravel and slip 1 st from the RH needle, returning it back to LH needle, move BOR to this point (1 st to the right), then
*k1, k2cc, k2, k3cc, k1, k4cc, k5; rep from * to EOR.

Rnd 29: *k3cc, k1, k3cc, k2, k5cc, k4;
rep from * to EOR.

Rnd 30: *k6cc, k3, k1cc, k1, k4cc, k3, LLI;
rep from * to EOR.

YOKE (CONTINUED)

You will have a total of
266 (304, 342, 380, 418) (456, 494, 532, 570) sts.

Rnd 31: *k2, k1cc, k1, k1cc, k4, k1cc, k2, k4cc, k3;
rep from * to EOR.

Rnd 32: *k7cc, k2, k1cc, k3, k4cc, k2;
rep from * to EOR.

Rnd 33: *k3cc, k1, k3cc, k2, k1cc, k4, k3cc, k2;
rep from * to EOR.

Rnd 34: *k1, k2cc, k1, k2cc, k3, k1cc, k9, LLI;
rep from * to EOR.

You will have a total of
280 (320, 360, 400, 440) (480, 520, 560, 600) sts.

SIZES 1 (2, 3)

move to the next section.

ALL OTHER SIZES

continue following the yoke pattern chart and/
or further written instructions.

Rnd 35: *k8, k1cc, k11; rep from * to EOR.

Rnd 36: *k6, k5cc, k9; rep from * to EOR.

Rnd 37: *k4, k4cc, k1, k3cc, k2, k2cc, k4;
rep from * to EOR.

Rnd 38: *k3, k5cc, k2, k3cc, k1, k3cc, k3;
rep from * to EOR.

Rnd 39: *k2, k4cc, k1, k1cc, k3, k6cc, k3;
rep from * to EOR.

Rnd 40: *k1, k4cc, k2, k1cc, k4, k1cc, k1, k1cc, k5;
rep from * to EOR.

Rnd 41: *k4cc, k3, k1cc, k2, k7cc, k3;
rep from * to EOR.

Rnd 42: *k3cc, k4, k1cc, k2, k3cc, k1, k3cc, k3;
rep from * to EOR.

Rnd 43: *k7, k1cc, k3, k2cc, k1, k2cc, k4;
rep from * to EOR.

SIZES 4 (5, 6, 7)

move to the next section.

SIZES 8 (9)

continue following the yoke pattern chart and/
or further written instructions.

Rnd 44: *k8, k1cc, k11; rep from * to EOR.

Rnd 45: *k6, k5cc, k9; rep from * to EOR.

Rnd 46: *k1, k2cc, k2, k3cc, k1, k4cc, k7;
rep from * to EOR.

Rnd 47: *k3cc, k1, k3cc, k2, k5cc, k6;
rep from * to EOR.

Rnd 48: *k6cc, k3, k1cc, k1, k4cc, k5;
rep from * to EOR.

Rnd 49: *k2, k1cc, k1, k1cc, k4, k1cc, k2, k4cc, k4;
rep from * to EOR.

Rnd 50: *k7cc, k2, k1cc, k3, k4cc, k3;
rep from * to EOR.

Rnd 51: *k3cc, k1, k3cc, k2, k1cc, k4, k3cc, k3;
rep from * to EOR.

Rnd 52: *k1, k2cc, k1, k2cc, k3, k1cc, k10;
rep from * to EOR.

SEPARATING BODY AND SLEEVES

Next rnd:

**starting from BOR in the middle of the back,
work according to the previously established
colourwork pattern on the yoke**

(Rnds 35, 44, 53 of the yoke pattern chart: *k8,
k1cc, k11* and Rnd1 of the Underarms/Body
pattern charts):

- work 41 (47, 53, 59, 65) (71, 77, 83, 89) sts of the back,
- break CC yarn,
- temporarily bind off or place on hold the next 57 (65, 73, 81, 89) (97, 105, 113, 121) sts for the right sleeve,
- cast on extra 13 (15, 17, 19, 21) (23, 25, 27, 29) sts for the underarm with MC;
- pick up CC yarn and work the next 83 (95, 107, 119, 131) (143, 155, 167, 179) sts of the front according to the previously established colourwork pattern,
- break CC yarn,
- temporarily bind off or place on hold the next 57 (65, 73, 81, 89) (97, 105, 113, 121) sts for the left sleeve,
- cast on extra 13 (15, 17, 19, 21) (23, 25, 27, 29) sts for the underarm with MC,
- pick up CC yarn and work 42 (48, 54, 60, 66) (72, 78, 84, 90) sts of the back to EOR.

You will have a total of
192 (220, 248, 276, 304) (332, 360, 388, 416) sts
for the body.

BODY

Follow the previously established 20-st colourwork pattern on the body (like in Rnds 36-53 of the yoke pattern chart) and introduce the pattern on the underarms starting from **Rnd 2** of the Underarms/Body pattern chart provided for your size. Charts begin on page 10. If necessary, place stitch markers to define the underarm sections.

Work a total of 5 (five) flowers (9-rnd pattern repeats) for a cropped length version and 7 (seven) or more for a full or extended body length, given that the hem will add another 4.5 cm (1.75 in). Watch out, the last pattern repeat transitions into hem.

HEM

Rnd 1: kall.

Rnd 2: *k1, k1cc; rep from * to EOR.

Break CC yarn.

Rnd 3: kall.

Next rnd: with the same or smaller needle, *p1, k1; rep from * to EOR.

Repeat for at least 15 rnds.

Add more rnds if necessary to adjust the length. Bind off with tapestry needle using a [tubular bind-off](#) or any other method of your choice and weave in the end.

SLEEVES

Return to the sts left on hold for the sleeves and follow these instructions twice to make two identical sleeves. I would recommend working the colourwork sections separately on both sleeves and then using [a magic loop technique](#) to work both simultaneously.

Rnd 1: starting in the middle of the underarm,

- pick up and k7 (8, 9, 10, 11) (12, 13, 14, 15) sts of the underarm with MC,
- to avoid a hole catch the float between sts of the underarm and sleeve [as shown in this demo](#) or use any other method (note, we do not pick up an extra st here — if you do, please decrease it in the following rnd),
- pick up CC yarn and work 57 (65, 73, 81, 89) (97, 105, 113, 121) sts of the sleeve according to **Rnds 35, 44, 53 of the yoke pattern chart: *k8, k1cc, k11***,

- to avoid a hole catch the float between sts of the underarm and sleeve,
- break CC yarn,
- with MC pick up and k the remaining 6 (7, 8, 9, 10) (11, 12, 13, 14) sts of the underarm.

You will have a total of 70 (80, 90, 100, 110) (120, 130, 140, 150) sts. Join to work in the round and place a BOR marker.

From **Rnd 2** introduce the pattern on the underarms according to the Underarms/Sleeves pattern chart provided for your size (or by simply working the “dots” pattern *k1, k1cc*) and continue following the previously established 20-st colourwork pattern on the sleeve (like in Rnds 36-53 of the yoke pattern chart).

Work a total of 2 (two) flowers (9-rnd pattern repeats) finishing with in slightly modified **Rnd 18** (see Underarms/Sleeves pattern chart provided for your size) .

Next rnd: kall.

Next rnd: *k1, k1cc; rep from * to EOR.

Break CC yarn.

Then, decrease by 2 sts on the inner side of the sleeve in every 8th (6th, 5th, 5th, 4th) (4th, 3rd, 3rd, 3rd) rnd as described:

— work in stockinette a total of 7 (5, 4, 4, 3) (3, 2, 2, 2) rnds.

Next rnd: k2, ssk, k till 3 sts to EOR, **k2tog**, k1.

Repeat a total of

12 (16, 19, 19, 24) (24, 32, 32, 32) times for a total of 96 (96, 95, 95, 96) (96, 96, 96, 96) rnds until you have 46 (48, 52, 62, 62) (72, 66, 76, 86) sts left.

SIZES 1 (2, 3)

move to the cuff section.

ALL OTHER SIZES

Work 1 extra rnd in stockinette st and at the same time decrease X sts by k2tog after every Y sts until all decreases are made:

- **SIZES 4, 5:** 6 sts after every 8 sts until 56 (56) sts left;
- **SIZE 6:** 14 sts after every 3 sts until 58 sts left;
- **SIZE 7:** 6 sts after every 9 sts until 60 sts left;
- **SIZE 8:** 12 sts after every 4 sts until 64 sts left;
- **SIZE 9:** 20 sts after every 2 sts until 66 sts left.

Move to the cuff section.

CUFF

Switch to 3.0 mm (US 2.5) needles and work all sts in 1x1 ribbing (k1, p1).

Repeat for at least 15 rnds.

Add more rnds if necessary to adjust the length. Bind off with tapestry needle using a [tubular bind-off](#) or any other method of your choice and weave in the end.

BLOCKING

Weave in the remaining ends. Soak the garment in lukewarm water. Gently squeeze to remove most of the water and then roll in a towel to dry. Pin out to measurements or desired size/shape and leave flat to dry.
