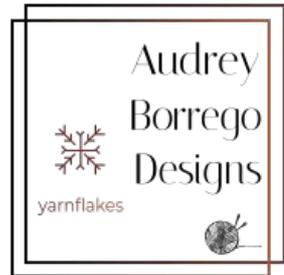


# Pivoine



## Notes

Pivoine is a simple drop shoulder cardigan with a V neck and lace details down the sleeves and along the hem. With a full tutorial on how to work the double knitted buttonband and an easy to memorize mock eyelet pattern, it's a relaxing, easy to wear knit.

## **Yarn :**

You will need :

1080 (**1200** / 1350 / **1470** / 1550), **1680** (1780 / **1900** / 2080 / **2250**) meters  
1185 (**1315** / 1480 / **1610** / 1695), **1840** (1950 / **2080** / 2275 / **2460**) yards  
of fingering to sport weight yarn.

The sample is knit with Hobbii Friends Extra Fine Merino (165 m – 180 yds / 50 g) in 47 Pink.

## **Needles :**

*Main Fabric* : 3.25 mm (US 3) circular needles with appropriate length to knit in the round and magic loop or DPNs.

*Ribbing* : 2.75 mm (US 2) circular needles with appropriate length to knit in the round and magic loop or DPNs.

or size required to get gauge

## **Gauge :**

25 sts x 40 rows per 10 cm – 4" with main needles in stockinette after blocking

## **Notions :**

Stitch markers, tapestry needle and scissors

Scrap yarn to place sts on hold

4 buttons (sample size 32 mm – 1 ¼")

Row counter recommended

## **Techniques used :**

Top down drop shoulder cardigan

Shoulders shaped with German Short Rows

V neck with simple increases

Straight Body

Loose sleeves worked in the round shaped with simple decreases and gathered at the cuffs

Mock Eyelet lace band above the hem and along the sleeves

Double knitting buttonband (video tutorial included)

Picking up sts

1/1 ribbed hem and cuffs

Optional German short-rows bust darts (based on Cup size)

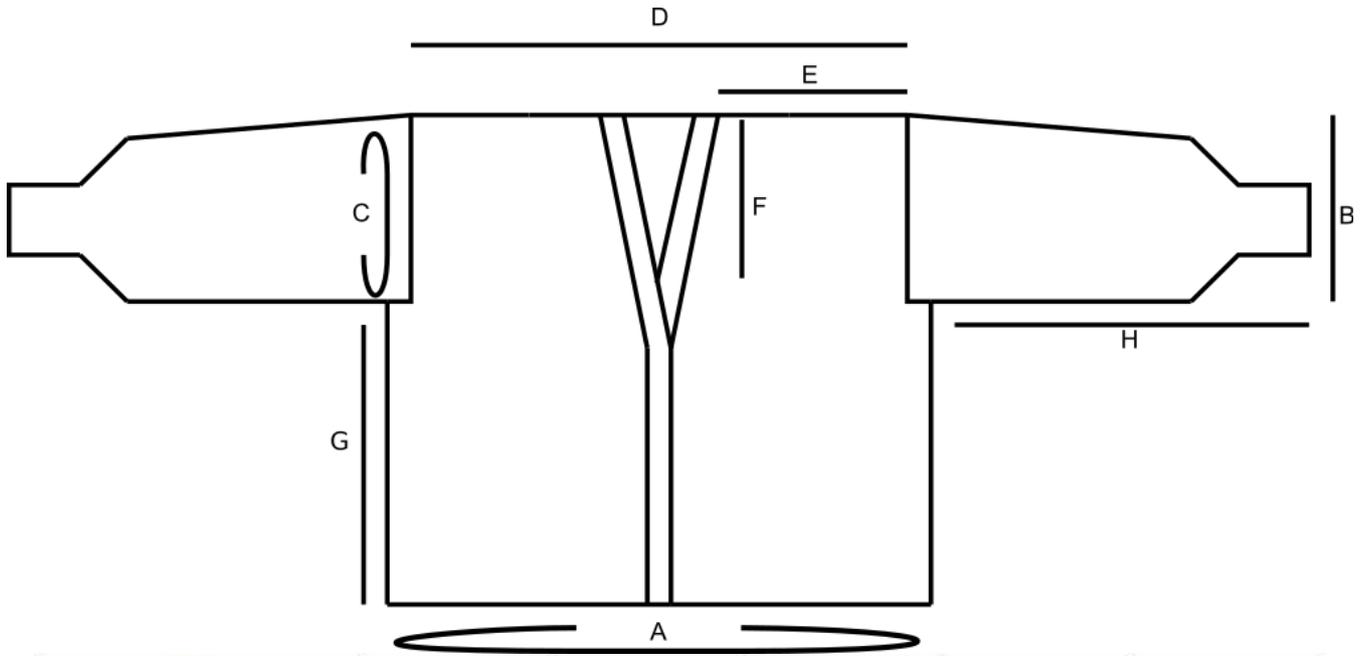
Pattern includes charted and written instructions

## **Sizes :** 1 (2 / 3 / 4 / 5), 6 (7 / 8 / 9 / 10)

All measurements are those of the finished cardigan. Bust Circ includes a 4 cm – 1 ½" buttonband.

Choose a size with 15 to 25 cm – 6 to 9 ¾" positive ease at bust.

Shown in size 3 on a 92 cm – 36 ¼" bust and a 35 cm – 13 ¾" upper arm.

## Abbreviations :

- CO : cast-on / st(s) : stitch(es) / rnd(s) : round(s)
- BOR : beginning of round / RS : right side / WS : wrong side
- m : marker / pm : place marker / sm : slip marker
- inc : increase / dec : decrease
- k : knit stitch / p : purl stitch
- ktbl : knit the st through its back loop
- sl1wyif : slip the st purlwise with yarn in front
- m1L : make 1 left, lift the bar between the stitches onto the left needle from front to back, knit through the back loop (1 inc)
- m1R : make 1 right, lift the bar between the stitches onto the left needle from back to front, knit through the front loop (1 inc)
- k2tog : knit the next 2 sts together (1 dec)
- p2tog : purl the next 2 sts together (1 dec)
- ssk : slip the next 2 sts knitwise separately then knit them together through their back loop (1 dec)
- yo : yarn over (1 inc)
- pssso kyok (see tutorial below) : pass the 3<sup>rd</sup> st of the left needle over the first 2, k1, yo, k1
- DS : double stitch for German short rows (counts as only 1 st)
- \*-\* : repeat instructions between asterisks

## Notes :

Left and Right parts refer to the cardigan when worn.

## Reading the Chart

When knitting in the round, always read the Chart from right to left.

When knitting flat, read the Chart back and forth : RS rows from right to left and WS rows from left to right.

*You will be casting on and working each front separately, shaping the shoulders with short rows then increasing at the neckline edge to shape the V-neck.*

### **Left Front**

With larger needles, CO 39 (**42** / 46 / **46** / 50), **52** (54 / **59** / 63 / **68**) sts using the [German Twisted Cast-on](#).

*(German Twisted Cast-on tutorial by Very Pink Knits)*

**row 1 (WS)** : purl

**row 2 (RS)** : knit

Work rows 1-2 a total of 2 times then row 1 once more (5 total stockinette rows).

### **Shoulder shaping :**

If you have never knit German short rows, here is a [helpful tutorial](#) on how to make Double Stitches.

*(German short-rows tutorial by Very Pink Knits)*

**short row 1 (RS)** : knit to last 3 sts, turn

**short row 2 (WS)** : DS, purl to end

**short row 3** : knit to 5 (**5** / 6 / 7 / 7), 7 (8 / **8** / 9 / **10**) sts before last DS, turn

Work short rows 2-3 a total of 5 times, then work row 2 once more.

**next row (RS)** : knit to end, closing the short rows by knitting the DS normally as one st

### **V-neck shaping :**

*You will be increasing along the neckline edge. Should your row gauge be looser than the pattern's, you may want to adjust and increase more rapidly to maintain the desired armhole depth (see measurements page 3). Make sure to note your modifications to replicate them on the right front.*

Sizes 1 to 3 ONLY :

**row 1 (WS)** : purl

**row 2 (RS)** : k2, m1L, knit to end (*1 inc*)

**row 3** : purl

**row 4** : knit

**rows 5 and 6** : repeat rows 3-4

Work rows 1 to 6 a total of 9 (**11** / 13...) times.

*48 (53 / 59...) front sts*

Sizes 1 and 2 ONLY :

Work 8 (**6** / ...) more rows in stockinette.

Sizes 4 to 10 ONLY :

**rows 1 and 3 (WS)** : purl

**row 2 (RS)** : k2, m1L, knit to end (*1 inc*)

**row 4** : knit

Work rows 1 to 4 a total of - (- / - / **20** / 21), **22** (23 / **23** / 24 / **24**) times.

- (- / - / **66** / 71), **74** (77 / **82** / 87 / **92**)  
*front sts*

### **ALL SIZES RESUME**

The piece should measure about 17 (**19.5** / 21 / **21.5** / 22.5), **23.5** (24.5 / **24.5** / 25.5 / **25.5**) cm – 6 <sup>3</sup>/<sub>4</sub> (7 <sup>3</sup>/<sub>4</sub> / 8 <sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub> / **8 1**/<sub>2</sub> / 8 <sup>3</sup>/<sub>4</sub>), **9 1**/<sub>4</sub> (9 <sup>3</sup>/<sub>4</sub> / **9 3**/<sub>4</sub> / 10 / **10**)" from cast-on, measuring along the armhole edge.

*Should your row gauge be denser than the pattern's, work straight in stockinette to reach the desired armhole depth.*

Cut yarn and place sts on hold.

### **Right Front**

With larger needles, CO 39 (**42** / 46 / **46** / 50), **52** (54 / **59** / 63 / **68**) sts using the [German Twisted Cast-on](#).

**row 1 (WS)** : purl

**row 2 (RS)** : knit

Work rows 1-2 a total of 2 times (4 total stockinette rows).

### **Shoulder shaping :**

**short row 1 (WS) :** purl to last 3 sts, turn

**short row 2 (RS) :** DS, knit to end

**short row 3 :** purl to 5 (5 / 6 / 7 / 7), 7 (8 / 8 / 9 / 10) sts before last DS, turn

Work short rows 2-3 a total of 5 times, then work row 2 once more.

**next row (WS) :** purl to end, closing the short rows by purling the DS normally as one st

**next row (RS) :** knit

### **V-neck shaping :**

Sizes 1 to 3 ONLY :

**row 1 (WS) :** purl

**row 2 (RS) :** knit to last 2 sts, m1R, k2 (1 inc)

**row 3 :** purl

**row 4 :** knit

**rows 5 and 6 :** repeat rows 3-4

Work rows 1 to 6 a total of 9 (11 / 13...) times.

48 (53 / 59...) front sts

Sizes 1 and 2 ONLY :

Work 8 (6 / ...) more rows in stockinette.

Sizes 4 to 10 ONLY :

**rows 1 and 3 (WS) :** purl

**row 2 (RS) :** knit to last 2 sts, m1R, k2 (1 inc)

**row 4 :** knit

Work rows 1 to 4 a total of - (- / - / 20 / 21), 22 (23 / 23 / 24 / 24) times.

- (- / - / 66 / 71), 74 (77 / 82 / 87 / 92) front sts

ALL SIZES RESUME

After the last inc row, attach a marker on the neck edge to more easily spot the end of the V neck. Cut yarn and place sts on hold.

*You will pick up sts from each front cast-on edge to work the back shoulders separately, shaping them with short rows.*

### **Back Right Shoulder**

With larger needles and RS facing, starting at the neck edge, pick up and knit 39 (42 / 46 / 46 / 50), 52 (54 / 59 / 63 / 68) sts from the Right Front (piece with the marker) cast-on edge.

**row 1 (WS) :** purl

**row 2 (RS) :** knit

Work rows 1-2 a total of 2 times then row 1 once more (5 total stockinette rows).

### **Shoulder shaping :**

**short row 1 (RS) :** knit to last 3 sts, turn

**short row 2 (WS) :** DS, purl to end

**short row 3 :** knit to 5 (5 / 6 / 7 / 7), 7 (8 / 8 / 9 / 10) sts before last DS, turn

Work short rows 2-3 a total of 5 times, then work row 2 once more.

**next row (RS) :** knit to end, closing the short rows by knitting the DS normally as one st

Cut yarn and place sts on hold.

### **Back Left Shoulder**

With larger needles and RS facing, starting at the armhole edge, pick up and knit 39 (42 / 46 / 46 / 50), 52 (54 / 59 / 63 / 68) sts from the Left Front (piece without the marker) cast-on edge.

**row 1 (WS) :** purl

**row 2 (RS) :** knit

Work rows 1-2 a total of 2 times (4 total stockinette rows).

### Shoulder shaping :

**short row 1 (WS) :** purl to last 3 sts, turn

**short row 2 (RS) :** DS, knit to end

**short row 3 :** purl to 5 (**5** / 6 / 7 / 7), 7 (8 / **8** / 9 / **10**) sts before last DS, turn

Work short rows 2-3 a total of 5 times, then work row 2 once more.

**next row (WS) :** purl to end, closing the short rows by purling the DS normally as one st

### Joining Back Shoulders

*You will be joining the two back shoulders to work the rest of the upper back in one piece, casting on sts for the back neck.*

**set-up row (RS) :** knit to end of Back Left Shoulder sts, CO 18 (**22** / 26 / **28** / 28), **30** (30 / **30** / 32 / **32**) sts on the right needle using the [backwards loop cast-on](#).

*(Backwards Loop Cast-on tutorial by Very Pink Knits)*

Place the Back Right Shoulder sts back on the left needle with RS facing, joining them to the new sts and knit to end

96 (**106** / 118 / **120** / 128), **134** (138 / **148** / 158 / **168**) back sts

### Back

**back row 1 (WS) :** purl

**back row 2 (RS) :** knit

Work back rows 1-2 until the back length matches the front's, ending after a WS row.

### Joining the body

*You will join the back and fronts pieces to work the body in one piece, casting on sts for each underarm.*

**set-up row 1 (RS) :** knit to end of Back sts, CO 14 (**15** / 18 / **24** / 28), **34** (42 / **46** / 48 / **52**) sts on the right needle using the [backwards loop cast-on](#).

Place the Right Front sts back on the left needle with RS facing, joining them to the new sts and knit to end

*On the following row you will be placing sts WS facing to join the left front.*

**set-up row 2 (WS) :** purl to end of Back sts, CO 14 (**15** / 18 / **24** / 28), **34** (42 / **46** / 48 / **52**) sts on the right needle using the [backwards loop cast-on](#).

Place the Left Front sts back on the left needle with WS facing, joining them to the new sts and purl to end

220 (**242** / 272 / **300** / 326), **350** (376 / **404** / 428 / **456**) body sts

### Body

#### Bust darts

*If you wear a cup size greater than B or your full bust measurement is more than 8 cm – 3 ¼" larger than your upper chest measurement, consider adding bust darts on the body. See instructions on page 11.*

**body row 1 (RS) :** knit

**body row 2 (WS) :** purl

Work body rows 1-2 until the body measures about 28 cm – 11" from the underarm or 8 cm – 3 ¼" less than desired length. End with a WS row.

*Note : per pattern, the lace band will measure about 3 cm – 1" and the ribbed hem about 5 cm – 2".*

*You can adjust all lengths to your preference here.*

## Lace band :

**set-up row 1 (RS) :** k3 (2 / 8 / 6 / 2), 8 (2 / 5 / 1 / 5), \*k2tog, k29 (46 / 22 / 40 / 34), 36 (32 / 55 / 59 / 39)\* to end

213 (237 / 261 / 293 / 317), 341 (365 / 397 / 421 / 445) body sts

**set-up row 2 (WS) :** p2, \*k1, p7\* to last 3 sts, k1, p2

*You will be working the lace pattern across the body, keeping 2 stockinette edge sts at the beginning and end of the row. Notice that you will also work a single purl st after the repeats (sts marked in red or in between \*-\*) for symmetry.*

*Use the purl sts as a guide to help you keep track of the pattern.*

Work the Body Chart twice completely (8 rows), or until desired lace length, then work Body Chart rows 1-2 once more

## Hem :

Switch to smaller needles.

**hem row 1 (RS) :** k1, \*k1, p1\* to last 2 sts, k2

**hem row 2 (WS) :** p2, \*k1, p1\* to last st, p1

Work hem rows 1-2 until the hem measures about 5 cm – 2" or desired length, ending with a WS row.

Loosely bind-off sts in pattern until you have only 1 st left on your right needle. Do not cut yarn.

## Neckband

*Still using the smaller needles, you will pick up sts all along the fronts and on the back neck, then cast on sts at the bottom edge of the left front to create the neckband.*

*Note : If you're a rather tight knitter, you may replace the 2 out of 3 sts pick up ratio with 3 out of 4 sts in the following instructions to avoid distorting the cardigan fabric with a too tight neckband.*

*You will work it back and forth in double knitting, attaching it to the cardigan's edges as you go using the picked up sts. To do this, you will work a decrease at the end of every WS row, decreasing your last neckband st with one picked up st.*

With the last st from the hem bind-off still on your right needle, pick up and knit 2 out 3 sts along the right front. As you pick up on this side, place 4 markers evenly between the hem and the V neck point (marker placed after the increases) where you would like to place buttons. Make sure that your lowest button marker is at least 10 sts away from the bottom hem.

Then pick up and knit every st along the back neck cast-on.

Finally, pick up and knit 2 out of 3 sts along the left front.

When you've reached the bottom of the left front, turn work and CO 25 sts after the last picked up st using the [cable cast-on](#).

*(Cable Cast-on tutorial by Very Pink Knits)*

**neckband row 1 (WS) :** (sl1wyif, k1) x 12, p2tog (using last neckband st and 1 picked up st), turn

**neckband row 2 (RS) :** (k1, sl1wyif) x 12, k1

Work neckband rows 1-2 until you reach your first button marker on the right front, ending with a WS row.

*You split the buttonband in half and work each side separately for the buttonholes. If you plan on sewing smaller buttons, you may work less rows.*

**buttonhole row 1 (RS) :** (k1, sl1wyif) x 6, turn

**buttonhole row 2 (WS) :** (k1, sl1wyif) x 5, k1, p2tog, turn

**buttonhole rows 3 to 8 :** repeat rows 1-2

**buttonhole row 9 (RS) :** (k1, sl1wyif) x 6, cut yarn and rejoin it on the remaining buttonband sts (after the gap), (k1, sl1wyif) x 6, k1

**buttonhole row 10 (WS) :** (sl1wyif, k1) x 6, sl1wyif, turn

**buttonhole row 11 (RS) :** (k1, sl1wyif) x 6, k1

**buttonhole rows 12 to 17 :** repeat rows 10-11

**buttonhole row 18 (WS) :** (sl1wyif, k1) x 12, p2tog (using last neckband st and 1 picked up st), turn

Resume working neckband rows 1-2 and repeat the buttonhole process for each button marker.

When you have decreased the last picked up st at the bottom of the right front, bind-off the neckband sts as follows :

**bind-off row (RS) :** ssk x 2, pass the resulting first st over the second st to bind it off, \*ssk, pass st over\* to 1 st before end, k1, pass st over

Cut yarn and thread it through the last resulting st to fasten it off.

## Sleeves

With larger needles, RS facing and starting at the center of the underarm sts, pick up and knit

7 (**8** / 9 / **12** / 14), **17** (21 / **23** / 24 / **26**) sts from the underarm cast-on,

38 (**44** / 50 / **52** / 56), **60** (64 / **64** / 68 / **68**) sts along the armhole up to the shoulder seam,

1 st from the shoulder seam,

38 (**45** / 50 / **52** / 56), **60** (64 / **64** / 68 / **68**) sts after the shoulder seam along the rest of the armhole,

and 7 (7 / 9 / **12** / 14), **17** (21 / **23** / 24 / **26**) sts from the rest of the underarm cast-on.

Join to work in the rnd and PM for BOR.

91 (**105** / 119 / **129** / 141), **155** (171 / **175** / 185 / **189**) sts

*You will place markers around the 15 (**15** / 19 / **19** / 19), **19** (23 / **23** / 23 / **23**) sts at the top of the sleeve (around the shoulder seam).*

**set-up rnd :** k38 (**45** / 50 / **55** / 61), **68** (74 / **76** / 81 / **83**), pm, kitbl, p1, k11 (**11** / 15 / **15** / 15), **15** (19 / **19** / 19 / **19**), p1, kitbl, pm, knit to end

*Note on adjusting sleeve fit : if you would like less ease on your upper arm, you may start the decreases immediately and reduce the space between each decrease rnd.*

**sleeve rnd :** knit to m, sm, Sleeve Chart to m, sm, knit to end

Work the sleeve rnd until the sleeve measures about 5 (**2** / 5 / **3** / 2), **6** (10 / **10** / 10 / **10**) cm – 2 (<sup>3</sup>/<sub>4</sub> / 2 / **1** <sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub> / <sup>3</sup>/<sub>4</sub>), **2** <sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub> (4 / **4** / 4 / **4**)" from the underarm.

**dec rnd :** knit to 2 sts before m, ssk, sm, Sleeve Chart to m, sm, k2tog, knit to end (2 dec)

Continue as established, repeating the dec rnd every

3 (2 / 3 / **2.5** / 2), **1.5** (1 / 1 / 1 / 1) cm

1 ¼ (¾ / 1 ¼ / 1 / ¾), ½ (½ / ½ / ½ / ½)"

10 (**17** / 10 / **13** / 17), **20** (26 / **26** / 27 / **27**) more times.

69 (**69** / 97 / **101** / 105), **113** (117 / **121** / 129 / **133**) sts

Continue as established until the sleeve measures about 39 cm – 15 ¼" from the underarm or 7 cm – 2 ¾" less than desired length, ending after an even rnd of the Sleeve Chart.

Remove lace markers on the following rnd.

Sizes 1 and 2 ONLY :

**dec rnd** : k3, \*k2tog, k1\* to end

47 (**47**...) sts

Sizes 3 to 10 ONLY :

**dec rnd** : k1, \*k2tog\* to end

- (- / 49 / **51** / 53), **57** (59 / **61** / 65 / **67**) sts

ALL SIZES RESUME

**Cuff** :

Switch to smaller needles.

**set-up rnd** : k2tog, p1, \*k1, p1\* to end (1 dec)

46 (**46** / 48 / **50** / 52), **56** (58 / **60** / 64 / **66**) sts

**cuff rnd** : \*k1, p1\* to end

Work the cuff rnd until the cuff measures about 7 cm – 2 ¾" or desired length.

Loosely bind-off all sts in pattern.

Repeat for second sleeve.

## Finishing

Weave in all ends and block the cardigan.

### Buttons :

Sew the buttons on the left side of the buttonband in front of the button holes.

## **Bust darts instructions :**

Work the body until it measures 2 cm – ¾" from the underarm or until you reach the fullest part of your bust.

### **CUP C AND D ONLY**

Full bust measurement at least 8 cm – 3 ¼" more than upper chest measurement.

#### **Left Front :**

**short row 1 (RS) :** k50 (56 / 63 / 73 / 79), **80** (87 / 94 / 100 / 107), turn

**short row 2 (WS) :** DS, purl to end

**short row 3 :** knit to 4 (4 / 5 / 5 / 6), 7 (7 / 8 / 8 / 8) sts before last DS, turn

Work short rows 2-3 a total of 3 times, then short row 2 once more.

**next row (RS) :** knit to end, closing the short-rows by knitting the DS normally as one st

#### **Right Front :**

**short row 1 (WS) :** p50 (56 / 63 / 73 / 79), **80** (87 / 94 / 100 / 107), turn

**short row 2 (RS) :** DS, knit to end

**short row 3 :** purl to 4 (4 / 5 / 5 / 6), 7 (7 / 8 / 8 / 8) sts before last DS, turn

Work short rows 2-3 a total of 3 times, then short row 2 once more.

**next row (WS) :** purl to end, closing the short-rows by purling the DS normally as one st

### **CUP E AND F ONLY**

Full bust measurement at least 12 cm – 4 ¾" more than upper chest measurement.

#### **Left Front :**

**short row 1 (RS) :** k50 (56 / 63 / 73 / 79), **80** (87 / 94 / 100 / 107), turn

**short row 2 (WS) :** DS, purl to end

**short row 3 :** knit to 3 (3 / 4 / 4 / 5), 5 (6 / 6 / 7 / 7) sts before last DS, turn

Work short rows 2-3 a total of 4 times, then short row 2 once more.

**next row (RS) :** knit to end, closing the short-rows by knitting the DS normally as one st

#### **Right Front :**

**short row 1 (WS) :** p50 (56 / 63 / 73 / 79), **80** (87 / 94 / 100 / 107), turn

**short row 2 (RS) :** DS, knit to end

**short row 3 :** purl to 3 (3 / 4 / 4 / 5), 5 (6 / 6 / 7 / 7) sts before last DS, turn

Work short rows 2-3 a total of 4 times, then short row 2 once more.

**next row (WS) :** purl to end, closing the short-rows by purling the DS normally as one st

### **CUP G AND H ONLY**

Full bust measurement at least 16 cm – 6 ¼" more than upper chest measurement.

#### **Left Front :**

**short row 1 (RS) :** k50 (56 / 63 / 73 / 79), **80** (87 / 94 / 100 / 107), turn

**short row 2 (WS) :** DS, purl to end

**short row 3 :** knit to 3 (3 / 3 / 3 / 4), 4 (5 / 5 / 6 / 6) sts before last DS, turn

Work short rows 2-3 a total of 5 times, then short row 2 once more.

**next row (RS) :** knit to end, closing the short-rows by knitting the DS normally as one st

#### **Right Front :**

**short row 1 (WS) :** p50 (56 / 63 / 73 / 79), **80** (87 / 94 / 100 / 107), turn

**short row 2 (RS) :** DS, knit to end

**short row 3 :** purl to 3 (3 / 3 / 3 / 4), 4 (5 / 5 / 6 / 6) sts before last DS, turn

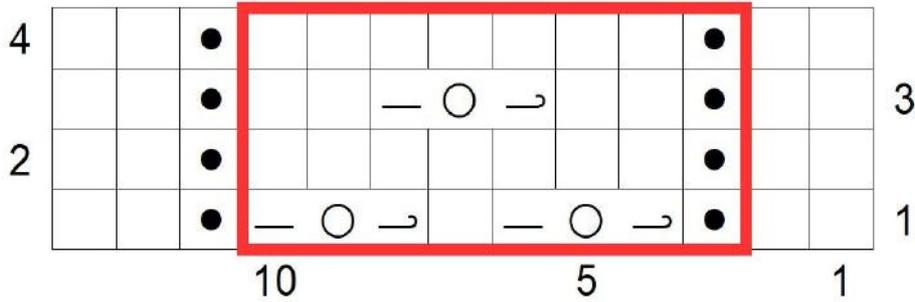
Work short rows 2-3 a total of 5 times, then short row 2 once more.

**next row (WS) :** purl to end, closing the short-rows by purling the DS normally as one st

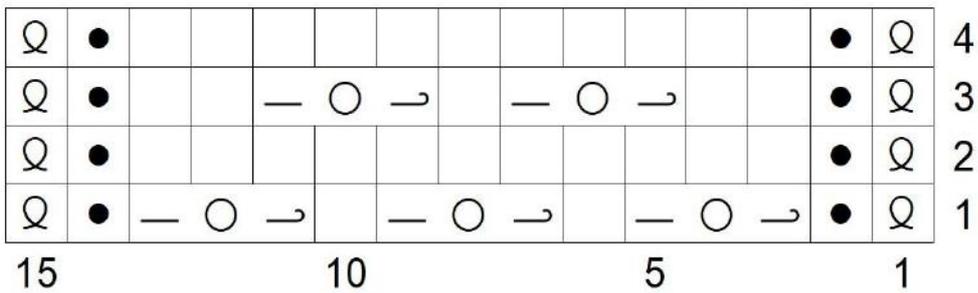

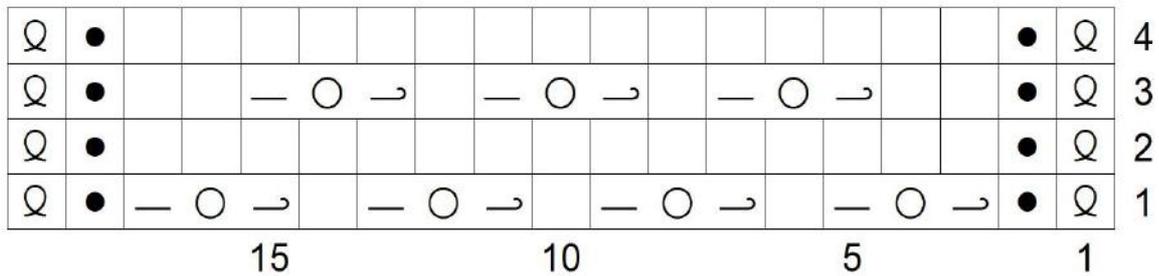

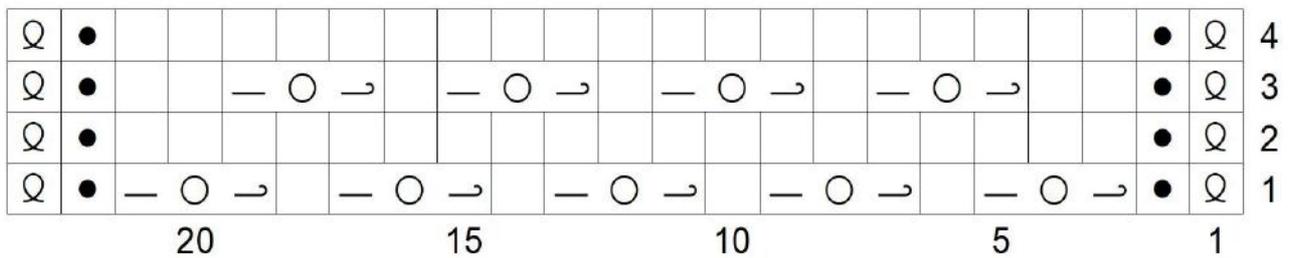

### BODY CHART

**row 1 (RS) :** k2, \*p1, pssso kyok, k1, pssso kyok\* to last 3 sts, p1, k2

**row 2 (WS) :** p2, k1, \*p7, k1\* to last 2 sts, p2

**row 3 :** k2, \*p1, k2, pssso kyok, k2\* to last 3 sts, p1, k2

**row 4 :** p2, k1, \*p7, k1\* to last 2 sts, p2

### SLEEVE CHART

#### Sizes 1 and 2 :

**rnd 1 :** k1tbl, p1, (pssso kyok, k1) x 2, pssso kyok, p1, k1tbl

**rnd 2 :** k1tbl, p1, k11, p1, k1tbl

**rnd 3 :** k1tbl, p1, k2, pssso kyok, k1, pssso kyok, k2, p1, k1tbl

**rnd 4 :** k1tbl, p1, k11, p1, k1tbl

#### Sizes 3 to 7 :

**rnd 1 :** k1tbl, p1, (pssso kyok, k1) x 3, pssso kyok, p1, k1tbl

**rnd 2 :** k1tbl, p1, k15, p1, k1tbl

**rnd 3 :** k1tbl, p1, k2, (pssso kyok, k1) x 2, pssso kyok, k2, p1, k1tbl

**rnd 4 :** k1tbl, p1, k15, p1, k1tbl

#### Sizes 8 to 10 :

**rnd 1 :** k1tbl, p1, (pssso kyok, k1) x 4, pssso kyok, p1, k1tbl

**rnd 2 :** k1tbl, p1, k19, p1, k1tbl

**rnd 3 :** k1tbl, p1, k2, (pssso kyok, k1) x 3, pssso kyok, k2, p1, k1tbl

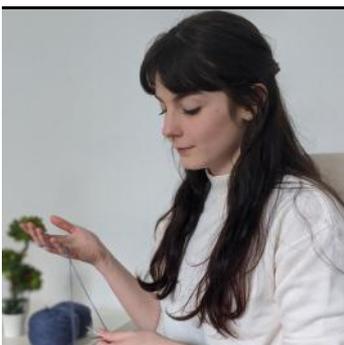
**rnd 4 :** k1tbl, p1, k19, p1, k1tbl
