## Pomona - Brioche pullover

Pomona is a fitted pullover knitted from the bottom up in two-color brioche knitting. The body is worked first and then the sleeves. The pieces are then arranged together and the yoke is worked in one piece. The yoke is worked in brioche with increases and decreases at the same time as the neck is shaped. The inspiration comes from pretty hanging plants and flowers, including chain-of-hearts vine.

**YARN** CYCA #2 (sport), 2 tr ull (2-Ply Wool) (100% wool, 328 yd/300 m / 100 g)

### ALTERNATE YARN SUGGESTIONS

CYCA #2 (sport), Alpaca Solo (100% alpaca, 183 yd/167 m / 50 g)

CYCA #2 (sport), Elise (60% cotton, 40% acrylic, 184 yd/170 m / 50 g)

CYCA #1 (fingering), Junior (70% acrylic, 30% nylon, 183 yd/168 m / 50 g)

CYCA #2 (sport), Ístex Kambgarn (100% Merino wool, 163 yd/150 m / 50 g)

**GAUGE** Approx. 19 sts x 46 rnds in brioche pattern on U. S. 4 / 3.5 mm needles = 4 x 4 in / 10 x 10 cm. **NOTE** When the stitch count per row is measured in brioche, every stitch counts as 2 rows. Adjust needle sizes to obtain correct gauge if necessary.

**SIZES - WOMEN'S** XS (S, M, L, XL, 2XL, 3XL, 4XL)

**POSITIVE EASE** Approx. 2-5¼ in / 5-13 cm

### FINISHED MEASUREMENTS

**GARMENT MEASUREMENTS—CHEST** Approx. 36½ (37½, 40¼, 44¼, 47¾, 53¼, 56¾, 61¾) in / 92.5 (95, 102, 112.5, 121, 135, 144, 157) cm

**TOTAL LENGTH** Approx. 21¼ (21¾, 22, 22¾, 23¾, 24½, 25¼, 26) in / 54 (55, 56, 58, 60, 62, 64, 66) cm as measured down center back

**SLEEVE LENGTH** Approx. 17¾ (17¾, 17¾, 17¾, 17¾, 17¾, 17¾, 17¾) in / 45 (45, 45, 45, 45, 45, 45, 45) cm

### YARN COLORS AND AMOUNTS

**Color 1:** Approx. 230 (240, 255, 295, 335, 380, 420, 450 g (color 74102, Natural White)

**Color 2:** Approx. 200 (210, 215, 245, 275, 330, 360, 390) g (color 74148, Organic Garden)

**NEEDLES** U. S. size 4 / 3.5 mm: 32-60 in / 80-150 cm (depending on size) and U. S. 6 / 4 mm: 16-24 in / 40-60 cm (for neckband)

**NOTIONS** Cable needle, stitch markers

**LEVEL OF DIFFICULTY** \*\*\*

### STITCHES AND TECHNIQUES

**Markers:** **Pm:** Place marker; **Sl m:** Slip marker from left to right needle. **NOTE** Always slip markers as you come to them

**Brk (brioche knit):** Knit the stitch that was slipped in the previous row together with its yarnover.

**Brp (brioche purl):** Purl the stitch that was slipped in the previous row together with its yarnover.

**Sl1yo:** With yarn held in *front* of work, slip 1 st purlwise to right needle and take yarn to back of work. You have now slipped 1 st and, at the same time, made a yarnover to pair with the slipped st = yarn over the slipped st on right needle.

**Sl1k2togpssso:** Slip 1 st (1 knit together with its yarnover) knitwise with yarn held in back of work; knit 2 sts together (1 purl and 1 knit st with its yarnover); pass the slipped st (with yarnover) over = 2 sts decreased = left-leaning decrease.

**Brk4tog** (brioche knit 4 sts together; worked with 5 sts): Slip 2 sts knitwise, one at a time, place next (knit) st on a cable needle and hold it in front of work; k1, pass one of the slipped sts over; move st on right needle to left needle and pass next st over it; move st to right needle and pass the second slipped st over; move st on cable needle to left needle; move 1 st from right to left needle and pass st previously on cable needle over it. Move st back to right needle.

**Inc 3-in-1 (Increase 3-in-1):** Work 3 sts into 1 st as follows: brk but leave st on left needle, yo, brk in same st and slip off left needle. When you come to these new sts on the following row, work into brioche structure = 2 sts increased

**Inc 4-in-1 (Increase 4-in-1):** This increase is worked over 2 rows.

**Row 1 with the dominant color:** Wrap yarn 3 times around needle to make 3 yarnovers.

**Row 2 with second color:** Work 4 sts into the 3 yarnovers: [Slip 1 purlwise + yarnover, p1] 2 times. Work as follows: With yarn in front of work, slip the first yarnover as if to purl and then make a yarnover so that you make yet another one (this will be a slipped st

with yarnover) and now you have 2 yarnovers remaining on left needle. Bring yarn to front of work and purl 1 in next yarnover, but do not slip it off.

With yarn in front of work, slip the yarnover as if to purl and make a yarnover so you have made yet another yarnover (this will be a slipped st with yarnover. Now you have 1 yarnover left. Bring yarn to front of work and purl 1 in yarnover. Where there were 3 yarnovers, now you have 4 sts: 1 slipped st + yarnover, 1 purl, 1 slipped st + yarnover, 1 purl = 3 sts increased.

On the next row, continue in brioche as the sts show but make sure to slow down when you come to the increases. At first, it can be difficult to see how the sts should be worked.

## BODY

With smaller size circular and the color you want as the dominant color on the right side of the sweater: CO 176 (180, 194, 214, 230, 256, 274, 298) sts. Join, being careful not to twist cast-on row; pm for beginning of rnd. Work around in k1, p1 ribbing for 2 in / 5 cm.

Now set-up for two-color brioche:

Color 1 (the color you used for the ribbing): \*K1, sl1yo\*; rep \* to \* around. Let yarn hang in front of work. Now add in color 2. Let the yarn hang on back of work and work as follows: \*Sl1yo, brp\*; rep \* to \* around. Let yarn hang in back of work.

From now on, rep the following 2 rnds:

**Rnd 1 (color 1):** \*Brk, sl1yo \*; rep \* to \* around. Let yarn hang in front of work.

**Rnd 2 (color 2):** \*Sl1yo, brp\*; rep \* to \* around. Let yarn hang in back of work.

Rep these 2 rnds until the body measures (including ribbing) 14¼ (14 3/8, 14½, 14 3/8, 14½, 15 3/8, 15½, 16¼) in / 36 (36.5, 37, 36.5, 37, 39, 39.5, 41) cm.

### With color 1, bind off for underarms as follows:

Work 40 (40, 44, 48, 52, 60, 64, 70) sts as est, BO 9 sts, work 79 (81, 89, 99, 107, 119, 129, 141) sts, BO 9 sts, work 39 (41, 43, 49, 53, 59, 63, 69) sts = 158 (162, 176, 196, 212, 238, 256, 280) sts rem. (The st before and after the underarm is a slipped st + yo).

Set aside body while you knit the sleeves. Do not cut yarn because you begin the yoke here.

## SLEEVES

With smaller size dpn and the color you want as the dominant color on the right side of the sweater: CO 36 (38, 40, 40, 42, 44, 44, 46) sts. Divide sts onto dpn and join; pm for beginning of rnd. Work around in p1, k1 ribbing for 2 in / 5 cm. **NOTE** It is important to begin with a purl st.

### Now set-up for two-color brioche:

Color 1 (the color you used for the ribbing): \*Sl1yo, k1\*; rep \* to \* around. Let yarn hang in back of work.

Now add in color 2. Let yarn hang on back of work and work as follows: \*Brp, sl1yo\*; rep \* to \* around. Let yarn hang in front of work.

Rep these 2 rnds until ¾ in / 2 cm above ribbing.

### Next Rnd with color 1 (a rnd with brioche knit): Increase for the first time as follows:

Sl1yo, inc 3-in-1, \*sl1yo, brk\*; rep \* to \* around until 1 st rem, inc 3-in-1.

Increase the same way (always on a round with brioche knit and color 1) a total of 5 (4, 4, 6, 8, 11, 11, 12) times with about 3½ (4¾, 4¾, 2¾, 2, 1¼, 1¼, 1½) in / 9 (12, 12, 7, 5, 3.5, 3.5, 4) cm between increase rnds = 56 (54, 56, 64, 74, 88, 88, 94) sts.

On the next rnd with color 1 (a rnd of brioche knit), bind off for underarms as follows:

BO 5 sts, work as est until 4 sts rem, BO 4 sts = 47 (45, 47, 55, 65, 79, 79, 85) sts rem. The rnd begins and ends with a brioche knit.

Set sleeve aside and knit second sleeve the same way.

## YOKE

With color 2, first work left side of back up to the armhole. Then knit sts of one sleeve onto the same needle. Continue over the front to the opposite armhole and knit second sleeve. Next, work the right part of back to beginning of rnd =252 (252, 270, 306, 342, 396, 414, 450) sts total.

**NOTE** The first st after the armhole will have the wrong color but will be worked in a brioche purl as usual.

Work 13 (15, 15, 13, 15, 15, 21, 21) brioche rnds.

Next Rnd (brioche knit with color 1), work in pattern as follows:

**Rnd 1:** \*Inc 4-in-1 (= 3 yarnovers), [brk, sl1yo] 3 times, brk4tog, [sl1yo, brk] 3 times, sl1yo\*; rep \* to \* a total of 14 (14, 15, 17, 19, 22, 23, 25) times.

**Rnds 2-8:** Work around in brioche. Don't forget to finish the 4-in-1 increases (3 yarnovers become 4 sts) when you work Rnd 2. Begin and end with color 2.

**Rnd 9:** \*Brk4tog, [sl1yo, brk] 3 times, sl1yo, inc 4-in-1 (= 3 yarnovers), [brk, sl1yo] 3 times\*; rep \* to \* a total of 14 (14, 15, 17, 19, 22, 23, 25) times.

**Rnds 10-16:** Work around in brioche. Don't forget to finish the 4-in-1 increases (3 yarnovers become 4 sts) when you work Rnd 10. Begin and end with color 2.

Rep Rnds 1-16 a total of 2 (2, 2, 3, 3, 3, 3, 3) times. After that, work Rnds 1-8. Now begin decreasing.

Continue as follows:

**Rnd 1:** \*Brk4tog, [sl1yo, brk] 3 times, sl1yo, inc 4-in-1 (= 3 yarnovers). Brk4tog, sl1yo\*; rep \* to \* a total of 14 (14, 15, 17, 19, 22, 23, 25) times = 182 (182, 195, 221, 247, 286, 299, 325) sts rem.

**Rnd 2:** \* [Sl1yo, brp] 4 times, [sl1yo, brp] 2 times in the 3 yarnovers, sl1yo, brp\*; rep \* to \* 14 (14, 15, 17, 19, 22, 23, 25) times = 196 (196, 210, 238, 266, 308, 322, 350) sts rem.

**Rnd 3:** \*Brk, sl1yo\*; rep \* to \* around.

**Rnd 4:** \*Sl1yo, brp\*; rep \* to \* around.

**Rnd 5:** Work as for Rnd 3.

**Rnd 6:** Work as for Rnd 4.

**Rnd 7:** Work as for Rnd 3.

**Rnd 8:** Work as for Rnd 4.

**Rnd 9:**

**Sizes XS, S, M:** \*Inc 4-in-1 (= 3 yarnovers), [brk, sl1yo] 3 times, brk4tog, sl1yo, brk, sl1yo\*; rep \* to \* 14 (14, 15) times = 182 (182, 195) sts.

**All other sizes:** \*Inc 4-in-1 (= 3 yarnovers), brk, sl1yo, sl1k2togpssso, sl1yo, brk4tog, sl1yo, brk, sl1yo\*; rep \* to \* 17 (19, 22, 23, 25) times = 187 (209, 242, 253, 275) sts.

**Rnd 10:**

**Sizes XS, S, M:** \*[Sl1yo, brp] 2 times in yarnover, \*[sl1yo, brp] 5 times\*; rep \* to \* around.

**All other sizes:** \*[Sl1yo, brp] 2 times in yarnover, \*[sl1yo, brp] 4 times\*; rep \* to \* around.

**Rnd 11:** Work as for Rnd 3.

**Rnd 12:** Work as for Rnd 4.

**Rnd 13:** Work as for Rnd 3.

**Rnd 14:** Work as for Rnd 4.

**Rnd 15:** Work as for Rnd 3.

**Rnd 16:** Work as for Rnd 4.

**Rnd 17:**

**Sizes XS, S, M:** \*Brk4tog, [sl1yo, brk] 4 times, sl1yo\*; rep \* to \* 14 (14, 15) times = 140 (140, 150) sts.

**All other sizes:** \*Brk4tog, [sl1yo, brk] 3 times, sl1yo\*; rep \* to \* 17 (19, 22, 23, 25) times = 136 (152, 176, 184, 200) sts.

**Rnd 18:** Work as for Rnd 4.

**Rnd 19:** Work as for Rnd 3.

**Rnd 20:** Work as for Rnd 4.

**Rnd 21:** Work as for Rnd 3.

**Rnd 22:** Work as for Rnd 4.

**Rnd 23:** Work as for Rnd 3.

**Rnd 24:** Work as for Rnd 4.

**Rnd 25:** Work as for Rnd 3.

**Rnd 26:** Work as for Rnd 4

**Rnd 27:**

**Sizes XS, S, M:** \*[Brk, sl1yo] 2 times, brk4tog, sl1yo\*; rep \* to \* 14 (14, 15) times = 84 (84, 90) sts.

**All other sizes:** Brk, sl1yo, brk4tog, sl1yo\*; rep \* to \* 17 (19, 22, 23, 25) times = 68 (76, 88, 92, 100) sts.

**Rnd 28:** Work as for Rnd 4.

**Rnd 29:** Work as for Rnd 3.

**Rnd 30:** Work as for Rnd 4.

**Rnd 31:**

**Sizes XS, S, L:** Continue to NECKBAND below.

**All other sizes:** Work as for Rnd 3.

**Rnd 32:** Work as for Rnd 4.

**Rnd 33:** Work as for Rnd 3.

**Rnd 34:** Work as for Rnd 4.

**Rnd 35:**

**Sizes M and XL:** Continue to NECKBAND below.

**Other sizes:** Work as for Rnd 3.

**Rnd 36:** Work as for Rnd 4.

**Rnd 37:**

**Sizes 2XL and 3XL:** Continue to NECKBAND below.

**Size 4XL:** Work as for Rnd 3.

**Rnd 38:** Work as for Rnd 4.

**Rnd 39:** Continue to NECKBAND below.

## NECKBAND

You should now have 84 (84, 90, 68, 76, 88, 92, 100) sts rem.

Change to larger size circular and knit 1 rnd with color 1.

**Next Rnd:** Knit, decreasing 16 (16, 22, 0, 0, 16, 17, 20) sts evenly spaced around = 68 (68, 68, 68, 72, 72, 75, 80) sts rem.

Continue around in stockinette for a total of 10 rnds.

Fold band and sew sts directly from needle to WS so that the folded neckband will stay elastic.

## FINISHING

Seam underarms and weave in all ends neatly on WS. Wash following instructions on ball band and lay sweater flat to dry. If you want a deeper neckline, you can pull it about an inch/a couple of centimeters higher on back neck while sweater is still wet.

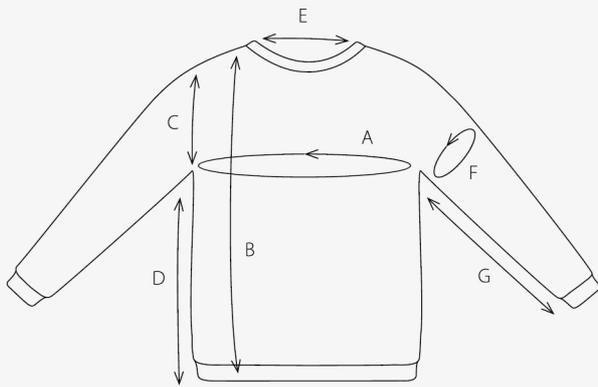
C 7 (7¼, 7½, 8½, 9, 9, 9½, 9¾) in / 18 (18.5, 19, 21.5, 23, 23, 24.5, 25) cm

D 14¼ (14 3/8, 14½, 14 3/8, 14½, 15¼, 15½, 16¼) in / 36 (36.5, 37, 36.5, 37, 39, 39.5, 41) cm

E 14¼ (14¼, 14¼, 14¼, 15, 15, 15½, 16½) in / 36 (36, 36, 36, 38, 38, 39.5, 42) cm

F 11½ (11¼, 11½, 13½, 15, 18¼, 18¼, 19½) in / 29.5 (28.5, 29.5, 34, 39, 46.5, 46.5, 49.5) cm

G 17¾ (17¾, 17¾, 17¾, 17¾, 17¾, 17¾, 17¾) in / 45 (45, 45, 45, 45, 45, 45, 45) cm

## Tips & Shortcuts

**To avoid questions:** Before you begin knitting, read through the pattern.

**Stitch count:** Always knit or crochet a gauge swatch as recommended in the pattern. If your stitch count doesn't match the gauge given in the pattern, try again with larger or smaller needles or hook. If your gauge doesn't match that in the pattern, your item will not be the correct size or shape.

**Highlight** the size you will knit or crochet throughout the pattern to make it easier to follow the instructions.

**Charts:** It will be easier to follow a chart if you mark your row with a ruler and magnetic board or sticky note.

**Ease:** The amount of ease included in our garments varies depending on the type and shape of the garment. To determine the right size, we recommend that you first measure your body. Then you can calculate the garment size depending on how much ease you want the garment to have. The schematics for each piece show all the garment measurements.

**Two-color stranded knitting:** When knitting more than 3-4 stitches of the same color, twist the color strands around each other on the wrong side to avoid long strands or "floats" on the back. If the yarns need to be twisted on several rows/rounds, make sure you do not stack the twists in the same place to prevent the yarns from showing through on the right side.

**Yarn alternative:** Please be aware that the gauge (tension), yarn quantity and the shape of the work varies if you use another yarn (even in the same yarn group).

**Tips för hand dyed yarn:** Make sure you have enough yarn to complete your project. The colors may vary from time to time. To get a smooth color mix, you can alternate between two skeins: knit two rows from one and two rows from another skein.
