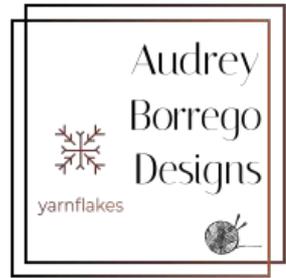


# Primerose



## Notes

A fun textured beret inspired by the contrast in geometric lines and blurring of wool. It features a small braid detail around the brim and a twisted stitch motif, which adds character to the classic accessory.

*Use the hashtag #primeroseberet to share your project.*

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**Yarn :**

You will need 260 (300) meters – 285 (330) yds of fingering weight yarn

Sample used John Arbon Textiles Knit by Numbers 4ply (400 m – 437 yds / 100 g) in 115 KBN.

**Needles :**

*Main needles* : 3.5 mm (US 4) circular needles with appropriate length to knit in the round or magic loop or DPNS.

*Brim* : 2.5 mm (US 1.5) circular needles with appropriate length to knit in the round.  
or sizes required to get gauge

**Gauge :**

26 sts x 42 rnds per 10 cm – 4" with main needles in stitch pattern after blocking.

**Sizes :**

1 (2)

48 (53) cm – 18 <sup>3</sup>/<sub>4</sub> (20 <sup>3</sup>/<sub>4</sub>)" brim circumference

27 cm – 10 <sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub>" diameter

Choose a brim circumference with up to 7 cm – 2 <sup>3</sup>/<sub>4</sub>" negative ease.

**Notions :**

Stitch markers, scissors and tapestry needle

Row counter recommended

**Techniques used :**

Beret worked in the round, brim to top

Lateral Vikkel Braid (video tutorial included)

Texture pattern using RT and LT

Pattern provides written instructions only

## Abbreviations :

- CO : cast-on
- BOR : beginning of round
- st(s) : stitch(es) / rnd(s) : round(s)
- m : marker / PM : place marker / SM : slip marker
- inc : increase / dec : decrease
- k : knit stitch / p : purl stitch
- ktbl : knit the st through its back loop
- m1L : make 1 left, lift the bar between the stitches onto the left needle from front to back, knit through the back loop (1 inc)
- RT (see tutorial below) : right twist, k2tog without dropping the sts off the needle, then knit into the first stitch again
- LT (see tutorial below) : left twist, without dropping the sts off the needle ktbl the second st on the left needle, then k2tog through the back loop the first and second sts of the left needle
- k2tog : knit the next 2 sts together (1 dec)
- ssk : slip the next 2 sts separately knitwise and knit them together through their back loop (1 dec)
- work patt as est : work pattern as established
- rep : repeat
- \*\_\* : repeat instructions between asterisks

## Brim

With smaller needles and using the [German Twisted Cast-on](#), CO 120 (132) sts.

*(German Twisted Cast-on tutorial by Very Pink Knits)*

PM for BOR and join to work in the rnd, being careful not to twist sts.

**ribbing rnd** : \*k2, p2\* to end

Work the ribbing rnd until the brim measures 2.5 cm – 1" from cast-on edge.

## Vikkel Braid :

Using the [cable cast on](#), CO 1 st.  
*(Cable Cast-on tutorial by Very Pink Knits)*

Work the Vikkel Braid as follows :

- ktbl the second st on the left needle without dropping it off the needle,
- knit the first st,
- drop both sts off the left needle,
- slip last worked st from the right needle back to the left needle.

Repeat those 4 steps to end.

Join the Vikkel Braid in the round, grafting the last and first st together as follows :

Break yarn and thread it through a tapestry needle. Drop last worked st off left needle. Pull tapestry needle and yarn through the st, under both legs of the first horizontal st of the Vikkel Braid, then back into the st. Leave the end of yarn to be woven in later.

Rejoin yarn.

## Hat

Size 1 ONLY :

**inc rnd** : k6, \*k2, m1L, k1, m1L\* to last 6 sts, knit to end

Size 2 ONLY :

**inc rnd** : k6, \*k2, m1L\* to last 6 sts, knit to end

*192 (192) sts*

Switch to larger needles.

**rnd 1** : \*LT, k2\* to end

**rnd 2** : \*P2, RT\* to end

Work rnds 1-2 a total of 30 times (60 rnds).

## Crown

**rnd 1** : (LT, k2) x 3, ssk, PM, k2, PM, k2tog, \*(k2, LT) x 6, k2, ssk, PM, k2, PM, k2tog\* to last 14 sts, (k2, LT) x 3, k2

*180 sts*

As you continue to shape the crown, you will decrease around the markers you just placed.

Maintain the stitch pattern as established, continuing the vertical lines of twists.

**rnd 2**: (work patt as est to 1 st before m, p1, SM, RT, SM, p1) x 6, work patt as est to end

**rnd 3**: (work patt as est to 3 sts before m, k1, ssk, SM, k2, SM, k2tog, k1) x 6, work patt as est to end

*168 sts*

**rnd 4**: (work patt as est to m, SM, RT, SM) x 6, work patt as est to end

**rnd 5**: (work patt as est to 2 sts before m, ssk, SM, k2, SM, k2tog) x 6, work patt as est to end

*156 sts*

**rnd 6**: (work patt as est to 1 st before m, k1, SM, RT, SM, k1) x 6, work patt as est to end

**rnds 7 to 9**: rep rnds 3 to 5

*132 sts*

**rnds 10 to 14**: rep rnds 2 to 6

*108 sts*

**rnds 15 to 17:** rep rnds 3 to 5

*84 sts*

**rnds 18 to 22:** rep rnds 2 to 6

*60 sts*

**rnds 23 to 25:** rep rnds 3 to 5

*36 sts*

Remove BOR marker. Purl the next st on the left needle. The following marker is your new BOR.

**rnd 26:** \*RT, SM, p1, work patt as est to 1 st before m, p1, SM \* to end

**rnd 27:** \*k2, SM, k2tog, ssk, SM\* to end

*24 sts*

**rnd 28:** \*RT, remove marker, k1, p1, remove marker \* to end

**rnd 29:** \*k2, k2tog\* to end

*18 sts*

**rnd 30:** \*k2tog, k1\*

*12 sts*

## **Finishing**

Cut yarn and thread onto a tapestry needle. Draw through remaining sts and pull the top of the beret closed.

Weave in ends.

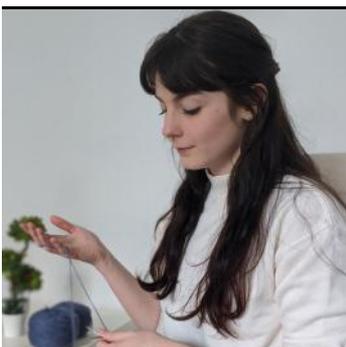
Block to measurements, using a disc shape plate. Take care not to stretch out the brim.
