## ABBREVIATIONS:

<b>MR</b> – Magic ring	<b>Ch</b> – chain	<b>inc</b> – increase
<b>ch</b> – chain		<b>dec</b> – decrease

## MATERIALS:

Yarn **Gazzal baby cotton** (165 m/50 g)  
3433 black, 3454 dark orange, 3434 beige

But you can take any yarn and color you like. And my advice: never save on yarn and, if you want to get a beautiful stylish toy, do not pick up cheap acrylic. All your efforts will be in vain, since acrylic can destroy all efforts.

### We also need:

- Hooks size 1.75.
- DPNs (Double-Pointed Needles) or knitting needles on the line 2
- Some pink yarn for the muzzle
- Filler (holofiber, it is better to buy a good one)



- Bead eyes
- Buttons for dress
- Fabric and sewing accessories (scissors, threads, pins and a chopstick to twist the part).

It seems to be all.

## HEAD:

Start working with the **dark orange** yarn:

1. 6 sc in MR (6)
  2. inc x 6 (12)
  3. [ 1 sc, inc ] x 6 (18)
  4. 1 sc, inc, [ 2 sc, inc ] x 5, 1 sc (24)
  5. [ 3 sc, inc ] x 6 (30)
  6. 2 sc, inc, [ 4 sc, inc ] x 5, 2 sc (36)
  7. [ 5 sc, inc ] x 6 (42)
  8. 3 sc, inc, [ 6 sc, inc ] x 5, 3 sc (48)
  - 9-18 (10). 48 sc (48)
  19. 3 sc, dec, [ 6 sc, dec ] x 5, 3 sc (42)
  - 20-24 (5). 42 sc (42)
  25. [ 5 sc, dec ] x 6 (36)
  26. [ 4 sc, dec ] x 6 (30)
  27. [ 3 sc, dec ] x 6 (24)
- Stuff the body as you go.
28. [ 2 sc, dec ] x 6 (18)
  29. [ 1 sc, dec ] x 6 (12)

Stuff the head. Close the remaining stitch.

Cut the yarn leaving a long rest (30-40 cm) to pull off the hole and to tighten.

Insert the thread into a long needle. Stick the needle into the magic ring and pull it out from the opposite side of the head. Pull up the thread. This will be the first tightening. Make 5 more of these, at equal distances. You should get 6 equal segments, like a pumpkin.



## PUMPKIN TAIL:

Start working with the **beige** yarn:

1. Cast on 16 ch (16)
2. Start from 2nd loop from hook, BACK LOOP ONLY (BLO):  
15 slst
3. BLO: 1 ch, 7 slst, 4 sc, 4 hdc, turn
4. BLO: 1 ch, 15 slst, turn
5. BLO: 1 ch, 7 slst, 4 sc, 4 hdc, turn
6. BLO: 1 ch, 15 slst, turn
7. BLO: 1 ch, 7 slst, 4 sc, 4 hdc, turn
8. BLO: 1 ch, 15 slst, turn
9. BLO: 1 ch, 7 slst, 4 sc, 4 hdc, turn
10. BLO: 1 ch, 15 slst

Close the remaining stitch.

Cut the yarn. Sew the detail carefully with a blind seam.

Sew the tail onto the pumpkin. You can give the tail any shape. Hide the ends of the threads.

It remains to sew on beaded eyes, embroider the cheeks with pink yarn. Sew on eyes in about 14 row.





## ARMS (make 2):

1. 6 sc in MR (6)

2. [ 1 sc, inc ] x 3 (9)

3-26 (24). 9 sc (9)

Don't suff. Fold, go through the pairs of stitches on both layers at once: 4 sc. Cut the yarn leaving a long rest.

## BODY:

1. 6 sc in MR (6)

2. inc x 6 (12)

3. [ 1 sc, inc ] x 6 (18)

4. 1 sc, inc, [ 2 sc, inc ] x 5, 1 sc (24)

5. [ 3 sc, inc ] x 6 (30)

6. 2 sc, inc, [ 4 sc, inc ] x 5, 2 sc (36)

7. [ 5 sc, inc ] x 6 (42)

8. 3 sc, inc, [ 6 sc, inc ] x 5, 3 sc (48)

9-20 (13). 48 sc (48)

21. [ 6 sc, dec ] x 6 (42)

22-23 (2). 42 sc (42)

**24.** [ 19 sc, dec ] x 2 (40)

The decreases are on the sides of a body.

**25-26 (2).** 40 sc (40)

**27.** [ 18 sc, dec ] x 2 (38)

**28.** 38 sc (38)

**29.** [ 17 sc, dec ] x 2 (36)

**30.** 36 sc (36)

Stuff the body as you go.

**31.** [ 4 sc, dec ] x 6 (30)

**32.** 30 sc (30)

**33.** [ 3 sc, dec ] x 6 (24)

**34.** 24 sc (24)

In this row, we attach the handles on the sides at a distance of 8 sc from each other.

But you can also sew them on later.

**32.** 1 sc, dec, [ 2 sc, dec ] x 5, 1 sc (18)

**33.** 18 sc (18)

Cut the yarn leaving a long rest and pull the end through the last stitch completely. Stuff the body

## LEGS (make 2):

**1.** 6 sc in MR (6)

**2.** inc x 6 (12)

**3-8 (6).** 12 sc (12)

start to crochet the heel

**9.** 6 sc, turn, 1 ch

**10.** 6 sc, turn, 1 ch



**11.** (in the same stitch) 4 sc, dec, turn

**12.** (in the same stitch) 3 sc, dec, turn

**13.** . crochet 3 stitches together, turn the leg so that the heel is on top and continue to crochet in a spiral



**14.** 3 sc (1st side), 3 stitches together (1st ankle), 4 sc (front), 3 stitches together (2nd ankle), 3 sc (2nd side), dec (back) (12)

**15-28 (14).** 12 sc (12)

Stuff as you go.

Now you are must be at the middle of the back

**29.** 5 sc, popcorn stitch, 6 sc (13)  
one stitch is added with popcorn

**30.** 5 sc, dec, 6 sc (12)

**31-44 (14).** 12 sc (12)

**45.** 2 sc, dec, 4 sc, dec (the decreases are on the sides of a leg)

Suff the detail. Fold, go through the pairs of stitches on both layers at once: 4 sc. Cut the yarn leaving a long rest. Sew on the legs, stepping back a couple of rows to the sides of the center.



## DRESS (black and grey colors):

The look will not be complete without clothes.

I put my doll in a knitted dress.

### ABBREVIATIONS:

K knit, P purl, INC increase(ing), YO Yarn over,

REM remain(ing), REP repeat, SL slip, ST(S) stitch(es),

TOG together.

### T-shirt is knitted of white yarn.

One more thing. Twist the yarn when you knit the yo. So that there are no holes (above the yo)

Cast on 36 sts (already taking into account the edge ones).

1. (wrong side) Purl

2. Purl

CHANGE COLOR

3. **SLST**, P5, [YO, P1, YO], P5, [YO, P1, YO], P10, [YO, P1, YO], P5, [YO, P1, YO], P5, **P1**

4. Knit

5. **SLST**, P6, [YO, P1, YO], P7, [YO, P1, YO], P12, [YO, P1, YO], P7, [YO, P1, YO], P6, **P1**

6. Knit

CHANGE COLOR

7. **SLST**, P7, [YO, P1, YO], P9, [YO, P1, YO], P14, [YO, P1, YO], P9, [YO, P1, YO], P7, **P1**

8. Knit

CHANGE COLOR

9. **SLST**, P8, [YO, P1, YO], P11, [YO, P1, YO], P16, [YO, P1, YO], P11, [YO, P1, YO], P8, **P1**

10. Knit

11. Purl

12. **SLST**, K10, move 13sts to the extra knitting needle, K20, move 13sts to the extra knitting needle, K10, **P1**

CHANGE COLOR

13. Purl

14. **SLST**, K10, YO, K20, YO, K10, **P1**

CHANGE COLOR

Continue to knit in a round on DPNs (Double-Pointed Needles) or as you like.



**15.** K11, [YO, K1, YO], K20, [YO, K1, YO], K11

**16.** Knit

**17.** K12, [YO, K1, YO], K22, [YO, K1, YO], K12

**18.** Knit

CHANGE COLOR

**19.** K13, [YO, K1, YO], K24, [YO, K1, YO], K13

**20.** [K4, YO, K1, YO] repeat to the end of the row

CHANGE COLOR

**21-24 (4).** Knit

CHANGE COLOR

**25-26 (2).** Knit

CHANGE COLOR

**27-30 (4).** Knit

**31-32 (2).** Knit

**33-36 (4).** Knit

**37-38 (2).** Knit

**29-42 (4).** Knit

**43-44 (2).** Knit

**45-48 (4).** Knit

**49-50 (2).** Knit

**51-54 (4).** Knit

**55-56 (2).** Knit

**57-60 (4).** Knit

**61-62 (2).** Knit

Bind off.

## SLEEVES:

Take the **black** yarn and continue to knit 13 sts:

**1.** Knit

**2.** Purl

**3.** Knit

**4.** Purl

**5.** Knit

**6.** Purl

**1.** Knit

**2.** Purl

**3.** Knit

**4.** Purl

**5.** Knit

**6.** Purl

**7.** Knit

**8.** Purl

**18.** Purl

**19.** Knit

**20.** Purl

**21.** Knit

**22.** Purl

**23.** Knit

**24.** Purl

Bind off,

cut the yarn.

Sew the detail

carefully with

a blind seam.
