Pumpkin Duck

Knitting pattern by **Cheryx**



Free
Pattern





Needles

- A pair of 2mm knitting needles
(You can use straight or circular needles)



Materials

- Toy filling (less than 50g)
- Sewing needle
- Scissors
- Sewing pins



Notes

- **Size:** The finished toy is 15 cm tall
- **Work flat:** All pieces are knitted flat
- **Casting on:** I prefer to use the long tail cast on for all pieces.
- **Sewing seams:** Use Mattress Stitch and Whip Stitch to sew the seams.



Yarns

Less than 30g in each colour:

- Susan's Family Alpaca

 Orange 42

- Susan Shetland

 Green 23 White 01 Yellow 06

Yellow and black yarns are used only for the little bee. You can use the same yarn I used or any yarn you have, but ensure it matches the weight so the pieces are the correct size.

Please note:

If you use the same yarn I did – Susan Alpaca – you will need to double the yarn and use 2mm knitting needles.

Alternatively, you can choose other yarn weights that do not require doubling, as long as the needle size is suitable.

Abbreviations

- K** Knit
- P** Purl
- Kfb** *Increase:* Knit front and back
- SSK** *Decrease:* Slip a stitch (as if to knit it) to the right-hand needle, slip a second stitch in the same way, slip both stitches together back to the left-hand needle and knit together through the back loops.
- K2tog** *Decrease:* Knit two stitches together
- P2tog** *Decrease:* Purl two stitches together
- St(s)** Stitch(es)
- St st** *Stockinette Stitch:* Knit all stitches on right side rows, purl all stitches on wrong side rows.
- (...sts)** The number in round brackets at the end of the instruction indicates the number of stitches after working the row.

Knitting Pattern

Pumpkin and Duck Body (Make 1)

Start knitting from the bottom of the pumpkin:

Cast on 10 stitches with orange yarn (Leave a long tail for sewing).

Row 1: K1, KFB x8, K1 (18 sts)

Row 2: P

Row 3: KFB x18 (36 sts)

Row 4: P

Row 5: K1, KFB x 34, K1 (70 sts)

Row 6: (K2, P1) x23, K1 (70 sts)

Row 7: P1, (K1, P2) x23 (70 sts)

Row 8 – Row 37: Repeat **Row 6 – Row 7**

Row 38: P1, (K1, P2tog) x23 (47 sts)

Row 39: K1, (K2tog, K3) x9, K1 (38 sts)

Cut the orange yarn, continue knitting with white yarn.

Row 40: K1, (K2tog, K4) x6, K1 (32 sts)

Row 41: P

Row 42 – Row 47: St st

Row 48: K1, (K2tog, K3) x6, K1 (26 sts)

Row 49 – Row 73: St st

Row 74: K1, (K2tog, K2) x6, K1 (20 sts)

Let's start knitting

Row 75: P

Row 76: K1, (K2tog, K1) x6, K1 (14 sts)

Row 77: P

Row 78: K2tog x7 (7 sts)

Leave a long tail for sewing, cut the yarn, thread the tail through the last stitch and pull tight.

Wings (Make 2)

Cast on 16 stitches with white yarn (Leave a long tail for sewing).

Row 1: K (16 sts)

Row 2: P

Row 3 – Row 8: St st

Row 9: K6, SSK, K2tog, K6 (14 sts)

Row 10: P

Row 11: K5, SSK, K2tog, K5 (12 sts)

Row 12: P

Row 13: K2tog x6 (6 sts)

Leave a long tail for sewing, cut the yarn, thread the tail through the last stitch and pull tight.

Legs (Make 2)

Cast on 16 stitches with yellow yarn (Leave a long tail for sewing).

Row 1: K (16 sts)

Row 2: P

Row 3: K1, SSK, K3, SSK, K2tog, K3, K2tog, K1 (12 sts)

Row 4 – Row 6: St st

Row 7: K1, SSK, K1, SSK, K2tog, K1, K2tog, K1 (8 sts)

Row 8: P

Cut the yellow yarn, continue knitting with white yarn.

Row 9: K

Row 10 – Row 12: St st

Row 13: Cast off

Leave a long tail for sewing, cut the yarn, thread the tail through the last stitch and pull tight.

Pumpkin hat (Make 1)

Cast on 26 stitches with orange yarn (Leave a long tail for sewing).

Row 1: P

Row 2: K1, (K2tog, K2) x6, K1 (20 sts)

Row 3: P1, (P1, P2tog) x6, P1 (14 sts)

Row 4: K1, K2tog x6, K1 (8 sts)

Row 5: P

Cut the orange yarn, continue knitting with green yarn.

Row 6: K

Row 7: (K1, P1) x4 (8 sts)

Row 8: (K1, P1) x4 (8 sts)

Row 9 – Row 14: Repeat **Row 7 – Row 8** three times.

Row 15: (K1, P1) x4 (8 sts)

Row 16: K2tog x4 (4 sts)

Leave a long tail for sewing, cut the yarn, thread the tail through the last stitch and pull tight.




Sewing and Decorating

Mattress Stitch



I usually use the yarn tail from the cast-on or cast-off edge for sewing, but for this project, I used Alpaca yarn, which tends to break quite easily, so I'll use a sewing thread instead.

If you're using a different type of yarn, you can use the yarn tail to sew.

 *Let's start!*

Start sewing along the side seam, from the duck's head down to the bottom of the pumpkin (from A to B) (Fig. 1).

I'll use the Mattress Stitch to sew it up.



When you finish sewing the side edge, thread the yarn tail through the loops of the cast-on stitches at the bottom of the pumpkin. Pull it tight to close the opening (Fig. 2 - Fig. 5).

Poke all the yarn tails inside the pumpkin to hide them (Fig. 6).

Whip Stitch






Sew the wings.

Use the cast-off tail to sew the side edges and the cast-on edge together (from C to D) using Whip Stitch (Fig. 7).

This piece only needs to be sewn, don't add any stuffing.

Use pins to adjust and secure the wings in place. Then use the yarn (or thread) tail to sew them on (Fig. 8 - Fig. 9).



Sew the legs.

Use the tail to sew the cast-off edge and the side edges together with Whip Stitches (Fig. 10).

This piece only needs to be sewn, don't add any stuffing.

Use pins to adjust and position the legs on the pumpkin. Then, use the yarn (or thread) tail to sew them in place (Fig. 11).



Let's decorate the face!

Embroider the eyes

Use black thread or yarn to embroider the two eyes (Fig. 12).



Sew the beak

Fold the duck's beak piece in half and use the yarn tail to sew the cast-off edge with Whip Stitch (Fig. 13).

Sew the beak to the duck's face (Fig. 14).

When you're finished, poke all the yarn tails inside the duck to hide them.



The pumpkin hat

Use Whip Stitch to sew the side edges of the hat. Then, sew the hat onto the duck's head.
