PATTERN NOTES

Rozeta is a relaxed-fitting pullover that beautifully combines comfort with captivating design details. This charming sweater features a beautiful lace insert, creatively positioned on one side, delicate eyelet neckline and beautifully finished cuffs and hem.

To start, you'll first knit a lace doily and then continue with the sweater itself. The sweater is seamlessly worked from the top down, beginning with short rows that shape the neckline, followed by raglan increases that lead to the perfect yoke depth. Once you reach this point, sleeve stitches are placed on hold while you work the body down to the hem, first in rounds and then flat attaching the doily as you go. Afterward, the sleeve stitches are picked up to knit in rounds down to the cuffs.

All intricate details are clearly explained in the pattern and supported by helpful video tutorials.

SIZES

1 (2, 3, [4, 5, 6], 7, 8, 9)

Finished measurements:

37.75 (40.5, 44, [48.5, 52.75, 56.5], 60, 62.75, 67)" {94.5 (101, 110, [121, 132, 141], 150, 156.5, 167.5) cm} bust circumference.

Sweater is meant to be worn with up to 6" {15 cm} of positive ease.

Shown in size 2 with 5" {12.5 cm} of positive ease in the bust.

GAUGE

18 sts and 25 rows = 4" {10 cm} in stockinette stitch on larger needles, after blocking.

SUGGESTED YARN

Dye Dye Done Silky Lena (55% Linen, 54% Silk): 100g/ 492 yards {450 meters} HELD DOUBLE

Yardage requirements:

approx. 1400 (1510, 1620, [1730, 1860, 1990], 2120, 2250, 2380) yards {1280 (1380, 1480, [1580, 1700, 1820], 1940, 2060, 2180) meters} of fingering weight yarn HELD DOUBLE.

When working with an equivalent yarn held single (such as DK or light worsted weight), you will need approx. 765 (865, 920, [975, 1030, 1080], 1115, 1180, 1260) yards {700 (790, 840, [890, 940, 990], 1020, 1080, 1150) meters}

Sample is knit in colorway "Natural".

NEEDLES

US 5 – 3.75 mm 24" {60 cm} & 32" {80 cm} circular needles (or longer for magic loop)

US 6 – 4 mm 24" {60 cm} & 32" {80 cm} circular needles (or longer for magic loop)

US 6 – 4 mm – a set of 5 double pointed needles (DPNs)

or in sizes to obtain gauge

US G-5 – 3.75mm crochet hook

NOTIONS

stitch markers, locking stitch markers in three colors, stitch holders or scrap yarn, tapestry needle



HOW TO CHOOSE YOUR SIZE (1 or 2)

1. MEASURE YOUR FAVORITE SWEATER:

Take a garment that you already own and like the fit of, and measure it from armpit to armpit. Choose the size with a finished measurement “A” that most closely matches the width of your favorite sweater.

2. MEASURE YOURSELF:

Measure your bust circumference and add desired ease. Choose the size with a bust circumference of the finished sweater that most closely matches your number.

On a knit row: Knit to the stitch specified in the pattern and turn work to the purl side. With yarn in front, slip the first stitch to the right-hand needle as if to purl, then bring yarn over the top of the needle to the back of the work and pull tight. This will distort the stitch and makes it look like a doubled stitch (DS). Bring yarn to front between the needles and begin purling keeping a tighter tension for a few first sts.

On a purl row: Purl to the stitch specified in the pattern and turn work to the knit side. Bring yarn to the front between the needles. Slip the first stitch to the right-hand needle as if to purl, then bring yarn over the top of the needle to the back of the work and pull tight. This will distort the stitch and makes it look like a doubled stitch (DS). Begin knitting keeping a tighter tension for a few first sts.

Picking up doubled stitches: Work each doubled stitch like a single stitch: knit through both legs of the DS on a knit row (as a knit 2 together) and purl through both legs of the DS on a purl row (as a purl 2 together).

ABBREVIATIONS

approx. = approximately;

BOR = beginning of a Rnd;

dec'd = decrease/ed;

DS = double stitch (see *German Short Rows*);

inc'd = increase/ed;

k = knit;

k2tog = knit 2 stitches together;

M1L = from the front, lift the horizontal strand between stitches with the left needle and knit through the back loop;

M1R = from the back, lift the horizontal strand between stitches with the left needle and knit through the front loop;

M1Rp = from the back, lift the horizontal strand between stitches with the left needle and purl through the front loop;

p = purl;

p2tog = purl 2 sts together;

pm = place marker;

rep = repeat;

rm = remove marker;

Rnd/s = round/s;

RS = right side;

sl1-k2tog-ssso = slip one stitch knitwise, then knit 2 stitches together and pass the slipped stitch over;

sl1 wyif = with the working yarn in front, insert the right needle into the next stitch as if to purl and transfer the stitch from the left needle to the right;

DOILY CHART




Chart is read from the bottom to the top, from right to left.



INSTRUCTIONS

Doily

Using bigger needles and Disappearing Loop Cast-On Method (see page 3), cast on 8 sts. Divide sts evenly onto 4 DPNs (2 sts per needle) or use Magic Loop Method.

Place marker for BOR and knit 1 rnd.

See also Doily Chart on page 4.

Rnd 1: *Yo, k1*; work *_* to end. {8 sts inc'd; 16 sts}

Rnds 2, 4, 6, 8, 10, and 12: Knit.

Rnd 3: *K1, yo, k1*; work *_* to end. {8 sts inc'd; 24 sts}

Rnd 5: *K1, [yo, k1] twice*; work *_* to end. {16 sts inc'd; 40 sts}

Rnd 7: *Yo, k5*; work *_* to end. {8 sts inc'd; 48 sts}

Rnd 9: *Yo, k1, yo, ssk, k1, k2tog*; work *_* to end.

Rnd 11: *Yo, k3, yo, sl1-k2tog-ssso*; work *_* to end.

Rnd 13: *Yo 3 times, k1, yo twice, sl1-k2tog-ssso, [yo twice, k1] twice*; work *_* to end. {56 sts inc'd; 104 sts}

Rnd 14: *K1, p1, k1, [k2, p1] 3 times, k1*; work *_* to end.

Rnds 15 – 16: Knit.

Rnd 17: *Yo, k13*; work *_* to end. {8 sts inc'd; 112 sts}

Rnds 18, 20, 22, 24, 26, 28, and 30: Knit.

Rnd 19: *Yo, k1, yo, ssk, k9, k2tog*; work *_* to end.

Rnd 21: *Yo, k3, yo, ssk, k7, k2tog*; work *_* to end.

Rnd 23: *Yo, k5, yo, ssk, k5, k2tog*; work *_* to end.

Rnd 25: *Yo, k1, yo, k4, [k1, yo] twice, ssk, k3, k2tog*; work *_* to end. {16 sts inc'd; 128 sts}

Rnd 27: *Yo, k3, yo, ssk, k1, k2tog*; work *_* to end.

Rnd 29: *Yo, k1, yo, sl1-k2tog-ssso*; work *_* to end.

Scallop Bind off: K2tog, yo, k2tog, turn work; p1, (k1 [p1, k1] twice) in next st, p1, turn work, bind off 6 sts {1 st remains on right-hand needle}, * k2tog, yo, k2tog, turn work; p1, (k1 [p1, k1] twice) in next st, p1, sl 1 wyif, turn work, bind off 7 sts {1 st remains on right-hand needle}; rep. from * to end.

Fasten off remaining st. You should have 32 scallops as shown below. Weave in all ends and block.




Upper Body

Using smaller needles and Long Tail Cast-On Method (see page 3), cast on 86 (90, 90, [94, 98, 102], 106, 106, 110) sts. Place marker for BOR and join to work in rnd being careful not to twist sts.

Knit 2 rnds.

Next Rnd – eyelets: *Yo, k2tog*; work * _ * to end.

Change to bigger needle and knit 2 rnds placing raglan markers as follows: k31 (31, 31, [31, 33, 35], 37, 37, 39) – back, **pm**, k8 (10, 10, [12, 12, 12], 12, 12, 12) – right sleeve, **pm**, k39 (39, 39, [39, 41, 43], 45, 45, 47) – front, **pm**, k8 (10, 10, [12, 12, 12], 12, 12, 12) – left sleeve, **sm BOR**.



SHORT ROW SHAPING

Note: Please review German Short Rows on page 3. Make sure to work each doubled stitch (DS) like a single stitch: knit through both legs of the DS as a knit 2 together or purl through both legs of the DS as a purl 2 together.

Short Rows 1 – back inc

(RS): K1, M1L, k to 1 st before m, M1R, k1, **sm**, k3 (4, 5, [5, 5, 5], 5, 5, 5), turn; **(WS):** Make DS, *p to m, **sm***; work * _ * twice, p3 (4, 5, [5, 5, 5], 5, 5, 5), turn. (2 sts inc'd)

Short Rows 2 – back and sleeve inc

(RS): Make DS, k to 1 st before m, M1R, k1, **sm**, k1, M1L, k to 1 st before next m, M1R, k1, **sm**, k1, M1L, k to DS, knit DS, k3 (4, 5, [5, 5, 5], 5, 5, 5), turn; **(WS):** Make DS, p to DS (slipping m when you get to them), purl DS, p3 (4, 5, [5, 5, 5], 5, 5, 5), turn. (4 sts inc'd)

Short Rows 3 – back inc

(RS): Make DS, k to m, **sm**, k1, M1L, k to 1 st before next m, M1R, k1, **sm**, k to DS, knit DS, k to m, **sm**, k2, turn; **(WS):** Make DS, p to DS (slipping m when you get to them), purl DS, p to m, **sm**, p2, turn. (2 sts inc'd)

Short Rows 4 – back and sleeve inc

(RS): Make DS, k to m, ***sm**, k1, M1L, k to 1 st before next m, M1R, k1*; work * _ * 3 times, **sm**, k to DS, knit DS, k1, turn; **(WS):** Make DS, p to DS (slipping m when you get to them), purl DS, p1, turn. (6 sts inc'd)

Short Rows 5 – back and front inc

(RS): Make DS, *k to 1 st before m, M1R, k1, **sm**, k to m, **sm**, k1, M1L*; work * _ * twice, k to DS, knit DS, k1, turn; **(WS):** Make DS, p to DS (slipping m when you get to them), purl DS, p1, turn. (4 sts inc'd)

Short Rows 6 – back, sleeve and front inc

(RS): Make DS, *k to 1 st before m, M1R, k1, **sm**, k1, M1L*; work * _ * 4 times, k to DS, knit DS, k1, turn; **(WS):** Make DS, p to DS (slipping m when you get to them), purl DS, p1, turn. (8 sts inc'd)

Short Rows 7 – back and front inc

Rep. Short Rows 5. (4 sts inc'd)

Short Rows 8 – back, sleeve and front inc

Rep. Short Rows 6. (8 sts inc'd)

Short Rows 9 – back and front inc

(RS): Make DS, *k to 1 st before m, M1R, k1, **sm**, k to m, **sm**, k1, M1L*; work * _ * twice, k to DS, knit DS, k2, turn; **(WS):** Make DS, p to DS (slipping m when you get to them), purl DS, p2, turn. (4 sts inc'd)

Short Rows 10 – back, sleeve and front inc

(RS): Make DS, *k to 1 st before m, M1R, k1, **sm**, k1, M1L*; work * _ * 4 times, k to DS, knit DS, k2, turn; **(WS):** Make DS, p to DS (slipping m when you get to them), purl DS, p2, turn. (8 sts inc'd)

Short Rows 11 – back and front inc

(RS): Make DS, *k to 1 st before m, M1R, k1, **sm**, k to m, **sm**, k1, M1L*; work * _ * twice, k to DS, knit DS, k3, turn; **(WS):** Make DS, p to DS (slipping m when you get to them), purl DS, p3, turn. (4 sts inc'd)


Next Row (RS) – back, sleeve and front inc:

Do not make DS, yo, *k to 1 st before m, M1R, k1, **sm**, k1, M1L*; work * _ * 4 times, k to 1 st before yo, knit next st together with yo, **pm (this will be new BOR)**. (8 sts inc'd)

Next Rnd: K to end slipping m when you get to them.

[148 (152, 152, [156, 160, 164], 168, 168, 172) sts; 55 (55, 55, [55, 57, 59], 61, 61, 61) sts for back, 55 (55,

55, [55, 57, 59], 61, 61, 61) sts for front, and 19 (21, 21, [23, 23, 23], 23, 23, 23) sts for each sleeve]



RAGLAN SHAPING – PART I

Rnd 1 – back, sleeves and front inc: *K to 1 st before m, M1R, k1, sm, k1, M1L*; work * _ * 4 times, k to end, sm (BOR). [8 sts inc'd]

Rnd 2: K to end slipping m when you get to them.

Rep. last two rnds 11 (13, 15, [17, 19, 21], 21, 23, 23) more times. [244 (264, 280, [300, 320, 340], 344, 360, 364) sts; 79 (83, 87, [91, 97, 103], 105, 109, 111) sts for back, 79 (83, 87, [91, 97, 103], 105, 109, 111) sts for front, and 43 (49, 53, [59, 63, 67], 67, 71, 71) sts for each sleeve]

RAGLAN SHAPING – PART II

Rnd 1 – back, sleeves and front inc: *K to 1 st before m, M1R, k1, sm, k1, M1L*; work * _ * 4 times, k to end, sm (BOR). [8 sts inc'd]

Rnd 2: K to end slipping m when you get to them.

Rnd 3 – sleeve inc: *K to m, sm, k1, M1L, k to 1 st before next m, M1R, k1, sm*; work * _ * twice, k to end, sm (BOR). [4 sts inc'd]

Rnd 4: K to end slipping m when you get to them.

Rep. last 4 rnds 1 (1, 2, [2, 2, 1], 0, 0, 0) more time/s. [268 (288, 316, [336, 356, 364], 356, 372, 376) sts; 83 (87, 93, [97, 103, 107], 107, 111, 113) sts for back, 83 (87, 93, [97, 103, 107], 107, 111, 113) sts for front, and 51 (57, 65, [71, 75, 75], 71, 75, 75) sts for each sleeve]

RAGLAN SHAPING – PART III – sizes (-, -, [4, 5, 6], 7, 8, 9) only

Rnd 1 – back and front inc: *K to 1 st before m, M1R, k1, sm, k to next m, sm, k1, M1L*; work * _ * twice, k to end, sm (BOR). [4 sts inc'd]


Rnd 2: K to end slipping m when you get to them.

Rep. last two rnds - (-, -, [1, 2, 3], 5, 5, 7) more time/s. [- (-, -, [344, 368, 380], 380, 396, 408) sts; - (-, -, [101, 109, 115], 119, 123, 129) sts for back, - (-, -, [101, 109, 115], 119, 123, 129) sts for front, and - (-, -, [71, 75, 75], 71, 75, 75) sts for each sleeve]

SEPARATING BODY AND SLEEVES

Next Rnd: Rm, k to next m, rm, place sts to next m on holder (sleeve sts), cast on 1 (2, 3, [4, 5, 6], 8, 9, 11) st/s for underarm, pm (this will be new BOR), cast on additional 1 (2, 3, [4, 5, 6], 8, 9, 11) st/s for underarm, rm, k to next m, rm, place sts to next m on holder (sleeve sts), cast on 2 (4, 6, [8, 10, 12], 16, 18, 22) sts for underarm, rm, k to BOR, sm.

[170 (182, 198, [218, 238, 254], 270, 282, 302) sts]



Lower Body

STOCKINETTE SECTION

Continue in stockinette st (knit all rnds) until body measures approx. 2.5" {6 cm} from underarm or approx. 10.5" {27 cm} before desired length.

Important note:

At this stage, it is crucial to determine the desired length of your sweater. Once the doily is attached, any alterations to shorten or lengthen it will no longer be possible.

How to calculate the total length of the Rozeta Sweater?


Total Length = Length of the Upper Body + Length of Stockinette Section + Length of Doily - approx. 0.75" {2cm} (the part of the doily that extends beyond the main body of the sweater).

To ensure a perfect fit, specify precisely how long you want your sweater to be. You can place the doily on an existing sweater to visualize where you'd like to start integrating it. If adjustments are needed, you can achieve this by adding or removing rows from the stockinette stitch section.

ATTACH DOILY

Rnd 1: K to last 12 sts, set aside temporarily.

Take the doily and place locking stitch markers between every 4 scallops as demonstrated below.



The scallops located between two purple markers will be the top section of the doily, the scallops between the purple and green markers and then, between green and yellow markers will be side sections, and the scallops between the yellow markers will be the bottom section.

Turn the doily to the WS and place it on top of the sweater with the RS of both pieces facing each other and the top (purple) markers on the upper edge. The first purple marker should be positioned next to the right-hand needle, as shown below.



Attach top section

In this section you will attach the upper part of the doily (between two purple markers) to the main body of the sweater.

Beginning right next to the first purple marker, insert your right-hand needle into the eyelet between the scallops, knit the first st on your left-hand needle, and pull it through the eyelet.

*Knit the next st on your left-hand needle, then pass the second st on your right-hand needle over the st you just worked. [1 st bound off]


Insert your right-hand needle through the hole below the scallop. Knit the st on your left-hand needle, and pull it through the hole. Then pass the second st on your right-hand needle over the st just worked. [1 st bound off]

Knit the next st on your left-hand needle, and pass the second st on your right-hand needle over it. [1 st bound off]

Now, insert the right-hand needle into the eyelet between the scallops, knit the st on your left-hand needle, pull it through the eyelet, and pass the second st on your right-hand needle over the st you just worked. [1 st bound off]*

Work *_* 4 times, removing the side marker when you get to it. You should end right next to the second purple marker. Now, knit the next st on your left-hand needle and pass the second st on your right-hand needle over the st you just worked. [total of 17 sts bound off]

Slip the last st from the right-hand needle back to the left-hand needle. Turn the doily to the RS and pull up the scallops to position them above the bound-off sts as shown below.

Attach side section I

In this section you will attach side parts of the doily (between purple and green markers) to the main body of the sweater. See also pics on page 10.

Continue working flat beginning next to purple marker.

Row 1 (RS): Sl1 wyib, k to end.

Row 2 (WS): Sl1 wyif, p to end.

Row 3: (RS) Sl1 wyib, k to end, turn. **(WS)** Sl1wyif, p1, turn. **(RS)** Keeping the yarn in the back, place the scallop onto the left-hand needle from front to back and position it behind the sts on the needle; then, using the working yarn ssk the sts on the left-hand needle and turn piece to WS. [1 st dec'd]

Row 4: (WS) Sl1 wyif, p to end, turn. **(RS)** Sl1wyib, k1, turn. **(WS)** Keeping the yarn in the front, place the scallop onto the left-hand needle from back to front and position it in front of the sts on the needle; then, using the working yarn, p2tog the sts on left-hand needle and turn to RS. [1 st dec'd]

Row 5 (RS): Sl1 wyib, k to last 2 sts, ssk. (1 st dec'd)

Row 6 (WS): Sl1 wyif, p to last 2 sts, p2tog. [1 st dec'd]

Row 7: Sl1 wyib, k to end.

Row 8: Sl1 wyif, p to end.

Work Rows 3 – 8 four times. [total of 16 sts dec'd]

Attach side section II

In this section you will attach side parts of the doily (between green and yellow markers) to the main body of the sweater. See also pics on page 10.

Row 1: (RS) Sl1 wyib, k to end, turn. **(WS)** Sl1wyif, p1, turn. **(RS)** Keeping the yarn in the back, place the scallop onto the left-hand needle from front to back and position it behind the sts on the needle; now, using the working yarn knit the 2 sts on the left-hand needle and turn piece to WS.

Row 2: (WS) Sl1 wyif, p to end, turn. **(RS)** Sl1wyib

k1, turn. **(WS)** Keeping the yarn in the front, place the scallop onto the left-hand needle from back to front and position it in front of the sts on the needle; now, using the working yarn, purl the 2 sts on left-hand needle and turn to RS.

Row 3 (RS): Sl1 wyib, k to end.

Row 4 (WS): Sl1 wyif, p to end.

Row 5: Rep. Row 3.

Row 6: Rep. Row 4.

Work Rows 1 – 6 four times.

Attach bottom section

In this section you will attach the lower parts of the doily (below yellow markers) to the main body of the sweater. See also pics on page 10.

Row 1: (RS) Sl1 wyib, k to end, turn. **(WS)** Sl1wyif, p1, turn. **(RS)** Keeping the yarn in the back, place the scallop onto the left-hand needle from front to back and position it behind the sts on the needle (as in the section above); now, using working yarn knit 2 sts on the left-hand needle and turn piece to WS.

Row 2: (WS) Sl1 wyif, p2, M1Rp, p to end, turn. **(RS)** Sl1wyib, k1, turn. **(WS)** Keeping the yarn in the front, place the scallop onto the left-hand needle from back to front and position it in front of the sts on the needle (as in the section above); now purl 2 sts on left-hand needle and turn to RS. [1 st inc'd]

Row 3 (RS): Sl1 wyib, k2, M1R, k to end. [1 st inc'd]

Row 4 (WS): Sl1 wyif, p1, M1Rp, p to end. [1 st inc'd]

Row 5: Sl1 wyib, k1, M1R, k to end. [1 st inc'd]

Row 6: Sl1 wyif, p to end.

Work Rows 1 – 6 twice, then Rows 1 – 4 once more. [total of 11 sts inc'd]

Next Row (RS): Sl1 wyib, k1, M1R, k to end, now insert your right-hand needle from front to back into the eyelet between the scallops, wrap the yarn around the needle, and pull it through the eyelet, creating a stitch. [2 sts inc'd]

Next Row (WS): Sl1 wyif, p to end, now insert your right-hand needle from back to front into

the eyelet between the scallops, wrap the yarn around the needle, and pull it through the eyelet, creating a stitch. [1 st inc'd]

HEM

Bind off all sts but do not break the yarn; do not pull the end through.

Take up the crochet hook and insert it knitwise through the loop, grasp the working yarn and pull it through the first loop to make a new loop on the hook.

First chain

Remove the crochet hook from the working loop and turn the piece, so that the bind-off edge is located at the bottom.

Insert the crochet hook, from front to back first through the eyelet between the scallops, then through the loop. Pull the loop through the eyelet.

Keeping the crochet hook in the loop, insert it – from front to back – through the knit stitch one row above the bind-off row, grasp the working yarn, and pull it through to make a new loop on the hook. Draw this new loop through the existing loop on the hook.

Continue in the same manner, creating a slip stitch line along the bottom edge of the sweater, until you reach the other side of the doily.

Now, insert the crochet hook from front to back through the eyelet between scallops, grasp the working yarn with the hook, and pull it through the eyelet to make a new loop on the hook. Then draw this new loop through the remaining loop on the hook.

Second chain

Remove the crochet hook from the working loop and turn the piece, so that the bind-off edge is located at the top.

Insert the crochet hook, from back to front first through the eyelet between the scallops, then through the loop. Pull the loop through the eyelet to the back of work.

Remove the crochet hook from the working loop again keeping the loop in the back.

Now, insert the crochet hook from front to back through the gap between the scallop and the main body and then through the loop. Pull the loop through to the front.

Keeping the crochet hook in the loop, insert it – from front to back – through the knit stitch one row below the first chain, grasp the working yarn with the hook, and pull it through to make a new loop on the hook. Draw it through the remaining loop on the hook.

Continue in the same manner, creating a second chain along the previous one, until you get to the other side of the doily.

Now, insert the crochet hook from front to back through the eyelet between the scallops, grasp the working yarn with the hook and pull it through the eyelet to make a new loop on the

hook. Draw it through the remaining loop on the hook.

Break the working yarn and pull it through the loop to fasten off.

Note: Dye Dye Done Silky Lena used in a sample is a blend of silk and linen and blocks very well. If you decide to knit with a different yarn and want to avoid the edge from rolling up, you can add two additional chains following the instructions provided above.

Sleeves (make two)

Slip held sleeve sts onto larger needle and attach yarn at the center of the underarm cast on sts.

With RS facing, pick up and k first 1 (2, 3, [4, 5, 6], 8, 9, 11) st/s from cast on sts at underarm section, k sleeve sts then pick up and k remaining 1 (2, 3, [4, 5, 6], 8, 9, 11) st/s from cast on sts at underarm section, **pm (this will be BOR)**. Join to knit in Rnd. [53 (61, 71, [79, 85, 87], 87, 93, 97) sts]

Note: To avoid holes in the underarm, you may pick up one or two extra stitches at each end of the underarm section and decrease them in the next Rnd.

Short sleeve option

Work in st st for next 1" {2.5 cm}.

Next Rnd – sleeve shaping rnd: K1, ssk, k to last 3 sts, k2tog, k1. (2 sts dec'd)

Rep. sleeve shaping rnd 1 more time after 6 rnds. [total of 4 sts dec'd; 49 (57, 67, [75, 81, 83], 83, 89, 93) sts]

Next Rnd – eyelets: K1, *yo, k2tog*; work *_ * to end.

Work even until Sleeve measures approx. 3" {7.5 cm} from underarm, or to desired length. Continue with instructions for Cuff.

Long sleeve option

Work in st st for next 2" {5 cm}.

Next Rnd – sleeve shaping rnd: K1, ssk, k to last 3 sts, k2tog, k1. (2 sts dec'd)

Rep. sleeve shaping rnd every 18 (12, 8, [6, 5, 5], 5, 4, 4) rnds 3 (6, 11, [14, 17, 17], 17, 19, 20) more times. [total of 8 (14, 24, [30, 36, 36], 36, 40, 42) sts dec'd; 45 (47, 47, [49, 49, 51], 51, 53, 55) sts]

Work even until Sleeve measures approx. 19" {48 cm} from underarm, or to desired length. Continue with instructions for Cuff.

CUFF

Bind off all sts and break the working yarn, leaving a tail about 8 times the circumference of the cuff.

Do not pull the working yarn through; instead, place the loop onto the crochet hook.

Insert the crochet hook from front to back through the first bound-off stitch, grasp the working yarn with the hook, and pull it through the stitch and through the loop on the hook at once.

Pull the tail through.

Now, insert the crochet hook from back to front through the second bound-off stitch, and pull the tail through to the back of work.

First chain

Insert the crochet hook from front to back through the knit stitch one row below the bind-off edge, wrap the working yarn around the hook, and pull it through to make a new loop on the hook.

Now, insert the crochet hook into the next knit stitch one row below the bind-off edge, grasp the working yarn with the hook, pull it through to create another loop on the hook, and draw it through the remaining loop on the hook.

Continue in this manner, creating a chain around the cuff, until you reach the end.

Now, insert the crochet hook from back to front through the first loop of the chain, and pull the tail through to the back.

Second chain

Repeat instructions for the first chain while working one row below the previously made chain.

Finishing

Weave in all ends and block sweater. Enjoy your new sweater ☺
