

REBELLIOUS SCARF

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INTRODUCTION

“Rebellious” scarf because comes out in quite rebellious time of my life. I’ve just been fired because of an Instagram post.

Rebellious scarf is a simple unisex scarf, with long asymmetric ends and defined ribbing texture. The scarf is worked flat from one end to another, starting with 2x2 ribbing and increases on one end, transitioning into seed stitch in the middle section and finishing with more ribbing and decreases on the other end.

YARN

ca. 255 g or 2.5 skeins of 100% wool from Donegal Wool Spinning Company with 200 m (218 yds) in 100 g, shown in colour 3750 Grey.

Or any other worsted/light aran weight yarn to match the gauge.

NEEDLES AND NOTIONS

- A pair of 5.0 mm (US 8) circular needles with 40 cm (16 in) cable;
- a 4 mm (G-6) crochet hook or a tapestry needle to weave in the ends and bind off;
- row counter and a cable needle (optional):


GAUGE

20 sts and 20 rows in 10 cm (4 in) measured over seed stitch (*k1, p1* in R1, *k1, p1* in R2) after blocking on 5.0 mm (US 8) needles.

Adjust the needle size if necessary to obtain the correct gauge.

FINISHED MEASUREMENTS

The pattern is written for one size with the finished measurements of 230 cm (90.5 in) in length and 32 cm (12.5 in) in width across the middle section after blocking.



FINISHED MEASUREMENTS

To adjust the length, please add or subtract rows in Section 3; to adjust the width – add or subtract the number of increases in Section 1.

Refer to the schematic above for better visualization.

ABBREVIATIONS AND TECHNIQUES

2-1RPC – slip 1 sts onto CN and hold in back, k2, then p1 from CN;

BOR/EOR – beginning/end of the row (R);

CN – cable needle;

kX (kall) – knit X sts (knit all sts to EOR);

k2tog – knit 2 sts together as if they were one (right leaning 1 st decrease);

LH – left hand (needle);

m1Lp – make 1 left purl – insert LH needle, from front to back, under strand of yarn that runs between next st on LH needle and last st on RH needle; purl this st through back loop (1 st increase);

m1Lk – make 1 left knit – insert LH needle, from front to back, under strand of yarn that runs between next st on LH needle and last st on RH needle; knit this st through back loop (1 st increase);

pX (pall) – purl X sts (purl all sts to EOR);

rep – repeat;

RH – right hand (needle);

RS – right side of the work;

seed stitch pattern – RS: k1, p1; WS: k1, p1;

sl – slip 1 st purlwise with yarn behind;

st(s) – stitch(es);

(x) x5 – repeat (x) 5 times;

WS – wrong side of the work.

SECTION 1

This section makes the pointy end of the scarf and is worked with 2x2 ribbing. It is further shaped by increases on the right side.

Using a long tail cast on or any other method of your choice, cast on 6 sts. Follow the chart on Page 4 and further instructions to establish the pattern.

R1 (RS): sl1, kall till the EOR. (6)

R2 (WS): sl1, pall till the EOR. (6)

R3 (RS): sl1, k2, m1Lp, k2, p1. (7)

R4 (WS): sl1, p2, k1, p3. (7)

R5 (RS): sl1, k2, m1Lp, p1, k2, p1. (8)

R6 (WS): sl1, p2, k2, p3. (8)

R7 (RS): sl1, k2, m1Lk, p2, k2, p1. (9)

R8 (WS): sl1, p2, k2, p4. (9)

R9 (RS): sl1, k2, m1Lk, k1, p2, k2, p1. (10)

R10 (WS): sl1, p2, k2, p5. (10)

Continue by following the chart and the established pattern till you reach **R94** and have a total of 52 sts.

SECTION 2

This section is a transition between ribbing and seed stitch. You will gradually change to seed stitch as you work through it. Follow the chart on Page 5 and/or further written instructions to establish the pattern.

R95 (RS): sl1, k2, *p2, k2; rep from* till 3 sts to EOR, 2-1RPC.

R96 (WS): sl1, work all the sts as they appear till 3 sts to EOR, p3.

R97 (RS): sl1, k2, *p2, k2; rep from* till 5 sts to EOR, p1, 2-1RPC, p1.

SECTION 2 (CONTINUED)

R98 (WS): sl1, p3, k1, *p2, k2;
rep from* till 3 sts to EOR, p3.

R99 (RS): sl1, k2, *p2, k2; rep from*
till 5 sts to EOR, 2-1RPC, p2.

R100 (WS): sl1, p1, k1, p2, *p2, k2;
rep from* till 3 sts to EOR, p3.

R101 (RS): sl1, k2, *p2, k2;
rep from* till 7 sts to EOR, k1, 2-1RPC, k1, p2.

R102 (WS): sl1, p1, k1, p2, *p2, k2;
rep from* till 3 sts to EOR, p3.

R103 (RS): sl1, k2, *p2, k2;
rep from* till 7 sts to EOR, 2-1RPC, p1, k1, p2.

R104 (WS): sl1, p1, k1, p1, k1, *p2, k2;
rep from* till 3 sts to EOR, p3.

Continue following the chart and the established pattern till you completely switch to seed stitch in R194.

SECTION 3

Work this section with seed stitch for a total of 48 rows or approx. 30 cm (11.75 in) and in **R243** start with Section 4.

Add more rows if you necessary to adjust the length.

SECTION 4

This section is a transition between the seed stitch and 2x2 ribbing. It mirrors section 2. Follow the chart on Page 5 and/or further written instructions to establish the pattern.

R243 (RS): sl1, *p1, k1*,
rep from *till 3 sts to EOR, 2-1RPC.

R244 (WS): sl1, p3, *k1, p1;
rep from* till the EOR.

R245 (RS): sl1, *p1, k1,
rep from* till 4 sts to EOR, 2-1RPC, p1.

R246 (WS): sl1, p3, *k1, p1;
rep from* till the EOR.

R247 (RS): sl1, *p1, k1,
rep from* till 5 sts to EOR, 2-1RPC, k1, p1.

R248 (WS): sl1, p5, *k1, p1;
rep from* till the EOR.

R249 (RS): sl1, *p1, k1,
rep from* till 6 sts to EOR, 2-1RPC, k2, p1.

R250 (WS): sl1, p2, k1, p2, *k1, p1;
rep from* till the EOR.

R251 (RS): sl1, *p1, k1,
rep from* till 7 sts to EOR, 2-1RPC, p1, k2, p1.

R252 (WS): sl1, p2, k2, p3, *k1, p1;
rep from* till the EOR.

Continue following the chart and the established pattern till you completely switch to 2x2 ribbing in R342.

SECTION 5

This section makes the other pointy end of the scarf, worked with 2x2 ribbing it is shaped by decreases on the left side. Follow the chart on Page 5 and/or further written instructions to establish the pattern.

R343 (RS): sl1, k2, *p2, k2;
rep from* till 5 sts to EOR, p1, k2tog, k1, p1. (51)

R344 (WS): sl1, p2, k1, *p2, k2*,
rep from *till there is 3 sts to EOR, p3.

R345 (RS): sl1, k2, *p2, k2;
rep from* till 4 sts to EOR, k2tog, k1, p1. (50)

R346 (WS): sl1, p2, *p2, k2;
rep from* till 3 sts to EOR, p3.

R347 (RS): sl1, k2, *p2, k2;
rep from* till 5 sts to EOR, k1, k2tog, k1, p1. (49)

R348 (WS): sl1, p1, *p2, k2;
rep from* till 3 sts to EOR, p3.

R349 (RS): sl1, *k2, p2;
rep from* till 4 sts to EOR, k2tog, k1, p1. (48)

R350 (WS): sl1, *p2, k2;
rep from* till 3 sts to EOR, p3.

Continue following the chart and further decreasing till in **R436** you have only 6 sts. Bind off and weave in the ends using a crochet hook or a tapestry needle.

BLOCKING

Soak the scarf in a lukewarm water. Depending on the yarn choice you might also use a gentle washing machine cycle.

BLOCKING (CONTINUED)

Gently squeeze your garment and then roll in a towel to remove most of the water. If using a washing machine, do not tumble dry.

Good blocking is essential for shaping the scarf. Make sure you stretch it generously and align all the edges. Pin out to measurements or desired size/shape and leave flat to dry.

Please follow the charts from the bottom up.

Rows, worked on the RS (odd numbers), read from right to left; rows on the WS (even numbers) – from left to right.

For Sections 2, 4 and 5 only the end of the row is shown on the charts. Please check with the written instructions for the BOR or follow the previously established pattern.
