BEGINNER PATTERN

SIZES

XS (S, M, L, XL) (2XL, 3XL, 4XL, 5XL) to fit bust measurement of:
 28-30 (32-34, 36-38, 40-42, 44-46) (48-50, 52-54, 56-58, 60-62)
 inches.
 71-76 (81-86, 91.5-96.5, 101.5-106.5, 111.5-117) (122-127, 132-137, 142-147,
 152-157) cm.

SUGGESTED YARN

Samples are made in size XS.

Long Sleeve

Laughing Hens Purely Merino DK, (100% Superwash Fine Merino
 Wool, 50g, 115 metres / 125 yards).

If you are using this yarn, you will need 9 (10, 11, 11, 12) (12, 14, 15, 16)
 balls in the Main Colour (MC), and 2 (3, 4, 4, 5) (5, 7, 8, 9) balls of the
 contrasting colour.

or

DK weight yarn in the Main Colour.
 926 (1055, 1157, 1254, 1365) (1373, 1540, 1635, 1792) metres.
 1013 (1154, 1265, 1371, 1493) (1502, 1684, 1788, 1960) yards.

Short Sleeve

Laughing Hens Simply Cotton DK, (100% Cotton, 50g, 109 metres /
 119 yards).

If you are using this yarn, you will need 5 (6, 7, 7, 8) (8, 9, 9, 10) balls
 in the Main Colour (MC), and 1 (1, 1, 1, 1) (1, 1, 1, 1) balls of each of the
 contrasting colour.

or

DK weight yarn in the Main Colour.
 467 (600, 654, 706, 782) (836, 890, 961, 1037) metres.
 511 (656, 715, 772, 855) (914, 973, 1051, 1134) yards.

*Note that the yardage given accommodates for working the
 measurements given. If you add length or change your colour
 stripe, you may need more yardage.*

SUGGESTED NEEDLES

- 4 mm [US 6] circular needles 32/40 inches / 80/100 cm, or size to obtain gauge.
- 3.5mm [US 4] circular needles 16, 32/40 inch / 40, 80/100 cm for the 1x1 ribbing.

NOTIONS

- Yarn needle to weave in ends.
- Stitch markers.
- Scrap yarn to place stitches on hold.
- Scissors or cutters to cut yarn.

GAUGE

21 sts and 28 rows = 4 inches / 10 cm in stockinette stitch on 4 mm [US 6] needles, blocked.

24 sts and 34 rows = 4 inches / 10 cm in 1x1 rib on 3.5 mm [US 4] needles, blocked.

If you have more stitches on 4 inches / 10 cm than stated, use a larger needle size; if you have fewer stitches, use a smaller needle size.

READING THIS PATTERN

Sizes are separated by parentheses, so you can interpret them as size XS (size S, size M, size L, size XL) (size 2XL, size 3XL, size 4XL, size 5XL). For example when you see "CO 2 (3, 4, 5, 6) (7, 8, 9, 10) sts" this means that size XS should cast on 2 stitches, size S should cast on 3 stitches, size M should cast on 4 stitches, and so on.

I suggest going through and highlighting your size at before beginning each section to keep track of your progress.

Note that the cuff circumference is outlined on the sleeve page for each style.

Size Guide

The Reliable Raglan is intended to be worn with a positive ease of approximately 3.5 - 6 inches / 8.75 - 15 cm at the bust, with the positive ease already built into the garment (see finished garment measurements above). Note the measurements above are the lengths worked unblocked. To accommodate for stretch, refer to your gauge swatch.

The sizes are based on a bust circumference of approximately:

XS (S, M, L, XL) (2XL, 3XL, 4XL, 5XL) to fit bust measurement of:

28-30 (32-34, 36-38, 40-42, 44-46) (48-50, 52-54, 56-58, 60-62) inches.

71-76, 81-86, 91.5-96.5, 101.5-106.5, 111.5-117) (122-127, 132-137, 142-147, 152-157) cm.

Choosing your size

Measure yourself around your bust before beginning to ensure that you choose the right size.

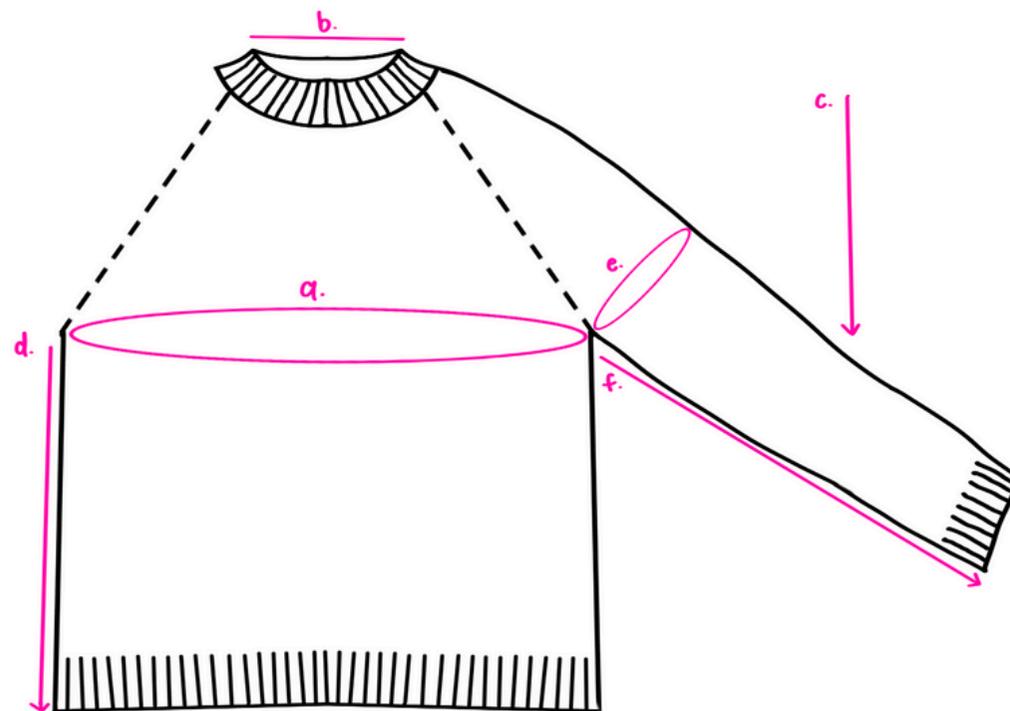
For example: Your bust circumference is 32 inches and your preferred ease is 6 inches,

$32 + 6 = 38$ inches [80 cm + 15 cm = 95 cm] i.e. you can work:

Size XS for 2 inches [5 cm] of positive ease,

Size S for 6 inches [10 cm] of positive ease.

You can work more or less positive ease depending on your preferences.

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CC: contrasting colour

CO: cast on

k: knit

MC: main colour

p: purl

pm: place marker

slpwyif: slip the next st purlwise with the working yarn in the front.

SM: slip marker

st(s): stitch(es)

RHN: right hand needle.

RS: right side

WS: wrong side

YO: yarn over

* _ *: repeat from * to *

Stockinette Stitch

RS: knit all stitches

WS: purl all stitches.

Increases

MIL: With your left needle, pick up the bar from front to back and knit through the back loop.

MIR: With your left needle, pick up the bar from back to front and knit through the front loop.

MILP: With your left needle, pick up the bar from front to back and purl through the back loop.

MIRP: With your left needle, pick up the bar from back to front and purl through the front loop.

Decreases

k2tog: knit the next 2 stitches together through the front loop.

ssk: slip slip knit; slip the first stitch knitwise, slip the next stitch purlwise, knit both stitches together through the back loop.

German Short Rows:

Step 1. Work to the point where you need to turn.

Step 2. Turn your work, then slip the next stitch purlwise with working yarn in front.

Step 3. Bring yarn over to the back and pull your working yarn firmly up and over the right needle. This is referred to as 'pull' in the pattern.

Step 4. The stitch pulled should appear as a 'double stitch' (it will have 2 'legs').

- If the next working row is a purl, bring the yarn to the front between the needles.
- If the next working row is a knit, keep yarn at the back after the pull.

Step 5. Continue working the row as directed.

When you encounter a 'double stitch' on the next row, work the both legs of the double stitch together normally as one stitch.

Knitted CO:

1. Place your Right Hand Needle needle in the first stitch knit wise.
2. Wrap the working yarn around the Right Hand Needle as if to knit.
3. Work a stitch but keep it on the Right Hand Needle.
4. Bring the Left Hand Needle up and place the stitch on the Left Hand Needle.
5. Remove the Right Hand Needle from the stitch.
6. Repeat from 1-5.

NOTES

Stripe Pattern

Stripes are worked by changing colours every round over 15 rounds (8 of the CC and 7 of the MC), and then 8 rounds of the colourblock in the MC. A tip to work jogless 1 round stripes, after knitting the first round with a new colour, lift the stitch below the first stitch of the next round onto the left needle. Knit it together with the first stitch of the next round and then change colours and continue with the next round. Keep an eye on your tension at the colour changes.

When finishing, you may notice tension issues along the seamline on the RS of your work. Use your 4mm needle to pull the sts and adjust the tension. Do this before blocking and again after blocking as required.

Construction

The Reliable Raglan is worked seamlessly from the top down and in the round. You'll begin at the collar before working the yoke, which includes optional German short rows to shape the neckline and raglan increases to form the shoulders. Once the yoke is complete, the stitches are divided at the armholes, and the body is joined to work in the round. The sleeves are then picked up and worked down to the cuffs, allowing you to easily adjust the length as desired.



PATTERN (begin here)

Collar

Using 3.5mm [US 4] circular needles, CO 96 (100, 108, 112, 116) (120, 120, 124, 128) sts using a long tail CO, tubular CO, or any stretchy CO you prefer.

Long tail cast-on is one I use for the majority of my knits and is beginner friendly. I suggest checking out this video for a tutorial from Sheep & Stitch for on working it:

Tubular cast-on is perfect for 1x1 ribbing and creates a seamless look. This can be more tricky for beginners, but Andrea Mowry's video explains how to work it, along with how to work the first round: <https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=RbEIPt1bCg8>

Work in 1x1 rib for 1.5 inches / 4 cm, **or** desired length.

Switch to 4mm [US 6] circular needles, and place markers for this first round. This will mark your raglans to begin shaping. You will need 8 extra markers.

Round 1 - Marker Round (RS):

Step 1: k16 (17, 18, 19, 20) (20, 20, 21, 22) sts, **PM**, k1, **PM**, (back right half when wearing),

Step 2: k14 (14, 16, 16, 16) (18, 18, 18, 18) sts, **PM**, k1, **PM**, (right sleeve),

Step 3: k 32 (34, 36, 38, 40) (40, 40, 42, 44) sts, **PM**, k1, **PM**, (front),

Step 4: k14 (14, 16, 16, 16) (18, 18, 18, 18) sts, **PM**, k1, **PM**, (left sleeve),

Step 5: k16 (17, 18, 19, 20) (20, 20, 21, 22) sts, you are now at your BOR marker. (back left half when wearing).

German short rows

Begin working your short row shaping, while **at the same time**, beginning increases along your raglans as follows:

Round 2:

Step 1 (RS): *k to the next marker, **MIR, SM, k1, SM, MIL***, repeat between *-* once more, k2, turn. **(4 sts increased)**

Step 2 (WS): sl1pwyif, pull, p to your BOR marker, **slip BOR marker**, *p to the next marker, **MILP, SM, p1, SM, MIRP***, repeat between *-* once more, p2, turn. **(4 sts increased)**

Step 3 (RS): sl1pwyif, pull, k to the BOR marker, **slip BOR marker**, *k to the next marker, **MIR, SM, k1, SM, MIL***, repeat between *-* once more, k 2 sts after the last worked short row, turn. **(4 sts increased)**

Step 4 (WS): sl1pwyif, pull, p to your BOR marker, **slip BOR marker**, *p to the next marker, **MILP, SM, p1, SM, MIRP***, repeat between *-* once more, p 2 sts after the last worked short row, turn. **(4 sts increased)**

Repeat Step 3 and Step 4 a *further* 3 repeats (all sizes), ending on **Step 4 (WS)**.

After working your final step, work **Step 5 on the RS** and complete one round as follows:

Step 5 (RS): sl1pwyif, pull, k to the BOR marker.

136 (140, 148, 152, 156) (160, 160, 164, 168) sts total.

Stitch Distribution:

Front and Back sts: 42 (44, 46, 48, 50) (50, 50, 52, 54) sts total.
Left and Front Sleeve sts: 24 (24, 26, 26, 26) (28, 28, 28, 28) sts total.

Continue Yoke

Now your short rows have been worked, continue increasing your raglans. For the first round after your short rows, you will knit any remaining double sts as normal. As you work this section, switch to a longer cable to accommodate your new sts. The first stripe block is worked 10 rows after your MC.

Round 3: *k to your next marker, **MIR, SM, k1, SM, MIL***, repeat between *-* for a further 3 repeats, k to the end of round. **(2 sts increased)**

Round 4: k to the end of the round.

Repeat **Round 3** and **Round 4** for a total of 21 (25, 28, 32, 33) (35, 36, 40, 42), repeats (*one repeat = Round 3 + Round 4*). End after working **Round 4**.

There are now **304 (340, 372, 408, 420) (440, 448, 484, 504) sts** on the needle.

Stitch Distribution

Front and Back: 84 (94, 102, 112, 116) (120, 122, 132, 138) sts.
Sleeve: 66 (74, 82, 90, 92) (98, 100, 108, 112) sts.

Sizes XS (S, M, -, -), continue on to the 'Continue Yoke' section below.

Size L, continue on to **JOINING BODY** section on the next page.

Sizes - (-, -, -, XL) (2XL, 3XL, 4XL, 5XL), continue on to the 'Increases - (body only)' section on the opposite page.

Continue Yoke

Sizes XS (S, M, -, -)

Continue to work without any further increases as follows:

Round 5: k to the end of the round.

Repeat **Round 5** for a total of 16 (8, 4, -, -) rounds.

From here try on and see if the armholes suit your preferred length. If not, continue working further rounds until it is your preferred length. The length graded here should match measurement c. in the schematic. You can measure this from the mid back neck beginning at where the collar ends and the stockinette stitch begins.

Increases (body only).

Sizes - (-, -, -, XL) (2XL, 3XL, 4XL, 5XL)

Continue **increases** on your raglans for the body sts. This means you will increase every round on the **body sts only** as follows:

Round 5: *k to your next marker, **MIR, SM**, k1, **SM**, k to the next marker, **SM**, k1, **SM, MIL***, repeat between *-* for one more repeat, k to the end of round. **(4 sts increased)**

Repeat Round 5 for a total of - (-, -, -, 3) (6, 7, 7, 9) repeats. (one repeat = Round 5)

There are now - (-, -, -, **432**) (**464, 476, 512, 540**) **sts total.**

Stitch Distribution

Front and Back: - (-, -, -, 122) (132, 136, 146, 156) sts.

Sleeve: - (-, -, -, 92) (98, 100, 108, 112) sts.

JOINING BODY

Now separate the sleeve sts from the body sts, and we will join to work in the round. If you are working the stripe pattern, take note of where you are in your pattern. The raglans will be incorporated into body sts as follows:

Step 1: k 42 (47, 51, 56, 61) (66, 68, 73, 78) sts to the next marker, remove marker, k the raglan st, remove marker,

Step 2: Place the next 66 (74, 82, 90, 92) (98, 100, 108, 112) sts on hold using scrap yarn or a knitting barber (right sleeve when wearing),

Step 3: cast on 4 (4, 6, 6, 8) (8, 14, 14, 14) new sts for the right underarm using the knitted cast on,

Step 4: remove marker, k1, remove marker, k the next 84 (94, 102, 112, 122) (132, 136, 146, 156) sts (front sts), remove marker, k1, remove marker (2 raglan and front sts)

Step 5: Place the next 66 (74, 82, 90, 92) (98, 100, 108, 112) sts on hold (left sleeve when wearing),

Step 6: cast on 4 (4, 6, 6, 8) (8, 14, 14, 14) new sts for the left underarm using the knitted cast on,

Step 7: remove marker, k1, remove marker, k 42 (47, 51, 56, 61) (66, 68, 73, 78) sts to the BOR marker.

There are now **180 (200, 220, 240, 264) (284, 304, 324, 344) sts** on the needle.

Tip: To get the full body measurement, measure from below the collar to the end of the hem, add measurement c. Armhole length and d. Body length in the schematic.

Now all sts are joined, we will work in stockinette st in the round. This means you will knit every round until the length is approximately:

7 (7, 7, 7, 6) (6, 6, 6, 6) inches,
17.5 (17.5, 17.5, 15) (15, 15, 15, 15) cm, measuring from the underarm.

Alternatively, you can try on until you reach 2 inches / 5 cm before your desired length to accommodate for the hem.

Hem

Switch to 3.5mm circular needles and work 1x1 rib for 2 inches / 5 cm or your desired length.

Bind off using a stretchy bind-off. I suggest either Jeny's surprisingly stretchy bind-off or a tubular bind-off (I prefer the tubular bind-off for the neatest edge).

You can work your sleeves in 4 different ways, balloon, short, wide and tapered. For the plus sizes, I recommend the tapered sleeve due to the size difference between the upper arm and wrist. Check the circumference for each sleeve type to see what suits you best.

Transfer your 66 (74, 82, 90, 92) (98, 100, 108, 112) sts onto your 4mm [US 6], 40 cm circular needles, or a longer circular if you are using the magic loop method.

Pick up and knit 4 (4, 6, 6, 8) (8, 14, 14, 14) sts from your underarm CO, place a stitch marker at the centre of your underarm sts (e.g. if you cast on 4 new sts, place a marker after the 2nd new st). This will be your BOR marker and will sit at the mid underarm.

There are now **70 (78, 88, 96, 100) (106, 114, 122, 126) sts total.**

Balloon Sleeve

Optional, for sizes 3XL, 4XL and 5XL, you can work a few decreases to taper the sleeve slightly. Decrease a total of 4, 8, 8 sts evenly down the sleeve on every 36th, 15th, 14th round.

Work in stockinette stitch in the round until you reach 14 (14, 13.5, 12.75, 12) (11, 10.5, 9, 8) inches / 35 (35, 33.75, 31.75, 30) (27.50, 26.25, 22.5, 20), measuring from the underarm.

Before working the cuff, decrease sts in the round. You may have to switch to a smaller circular needle or work the magic loop method.

Decrease Round: K1, *k2tog* until you have 1 sts remaining, k1.

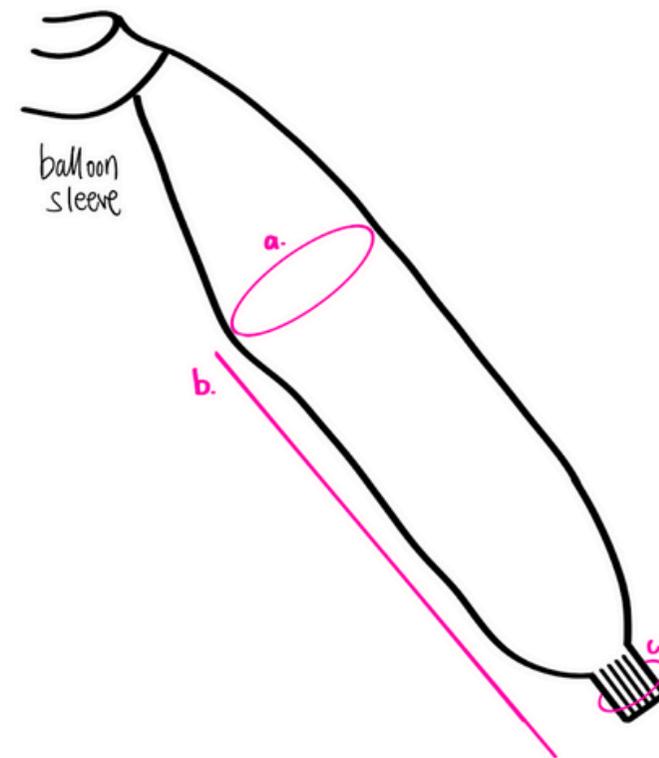
Note for **sizes M, L and XL only**, work one extra decrease in the next round at any spot to make your sts even.

There are now **36 (40, 44, 48, 50) (54, 56, 58, 60) sts total**.

Cuff

Switch to your 3.5 mm [US 4] needles, and work in 1x1 rib (k1, p1) for a total of 2 inches / 5 cm.

Bind off using a stretchy bind off. I suggest either Jeny's surprisingly stretchy bind-off or a tubular bind-off (I prefer the tubular bind-off for the neatest edge).

Short Sleeve

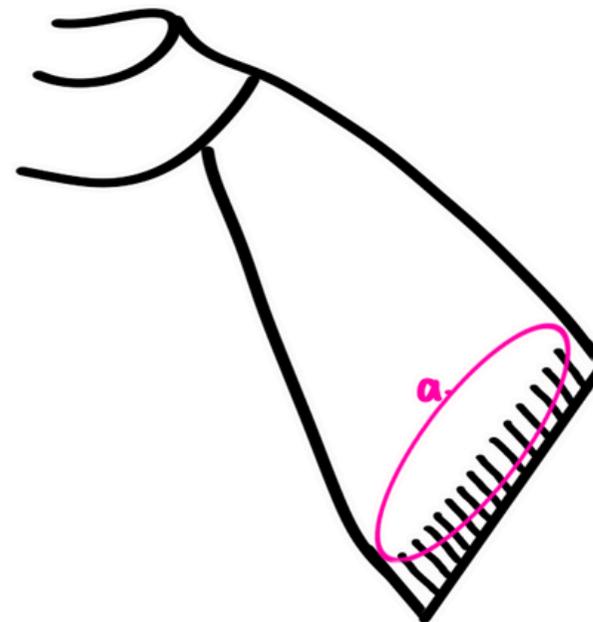
For the short sleeve version, only a few rounds are needed after separating for the sleeves. The sleeve naturally sits at a good length from the raglan increases, so you can move straight into the 1x1 rib cuff when ready.

Optional: Work in stockinette stitch in the round for 2-4 rounds.

Cuff

Switch to your 3.5 mm [US 4] needles, and work in 1x1 rib (k1, p1) for a total of 2 inches / 5 cm.

Bind off using a stretchy bind off. I suggest either Jeny's surprisingly stretchy bind-off or a tubular bind-off (I prefer the tubular bind-off for the neatest edge).



Short Sleeve Finished Measurements

Tapered

Work in stockinette stitch in the round until the sleeve measures 14 (14, 13.5, 12.75, 12) (11, 10.5, 9, 8) inches, measuring from the underarm, while at the same time working decreases every 8th (6th, 5th, 4th, 4th) (3rd, 3rd, 2nd, 2nd) round a total of 12 (14, 19, 22, 23) (25, 27, 30, 31) times. This means work decreases on the selected round for your size.

Work Decrease Round as follows: k1, k2tog, k to the last 3 sts of the round, ssk, k1. (2 sts decreased)

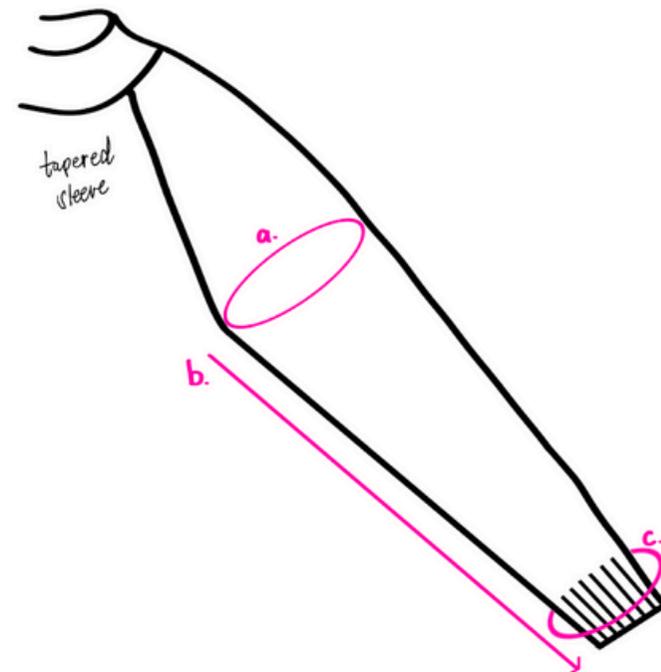
There are now **46 (50, 50, 52, 54) (56, 60, 62, 64) sts total.**

Cuff

Work in 1x1 rib (k1, p1) for a total of 2 inches / 5 cm.

Switch to your 3.5 mm [US 4] needles, and work in 1x1 rib (k1, p1) for a total of 2 inches / 5 cm.

Bind off using a stretchy bind off. I suggest either Jeny's surprisingly stretchy bind off or a tubular bind off (I prefer the tubular bind off for the neatest edge).

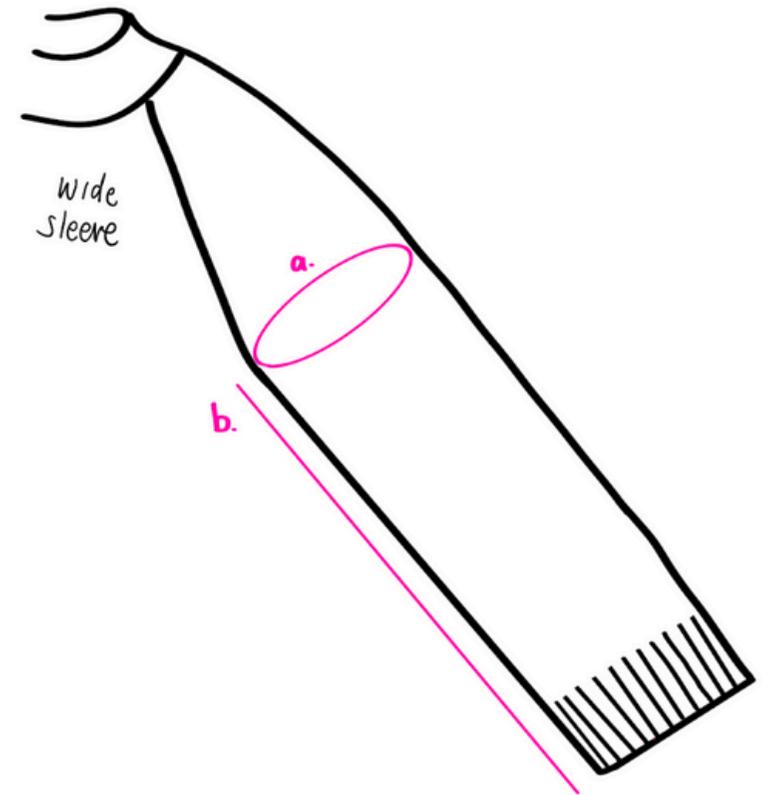
Wide Sleeve

Work in stockinette stitch in the round until the sleeve measures 14 (14, 13.5, 12.75, 12) (11, 10.5, 9, 8) inches, measuring from the underarm.

Cuff

Switch to your 3.5 mm [US 4] needles, and work in 1x1 rib (k1, p1) for a total of 2 inches / 5 cm.

Bind off using a stretchy bind off. I suggest either Jeny's surprisingly stretchy bind-off or a tubular bind-off (I prefer the tubular bind-off for the neatest edge).

Finishing

Weave in any loose ends, wash and block according to the instructions on your ball/skein.

If you worked the stripe pattern, see Notes on finishing.
