

SIZE

Glove size 7 1/2

MATERIALS

A - REGIA PREMIUM Silk, 100 g ball

Col. 00080 (rose red) 1 ball

B - REGIA PREMIUM Merino Yak, 100 g ball

Col. 07504 (gold meliert) 1 ball

2 sets Double Pointed Needles 2.0 – 3.0 mm (US size 1 – 4)

1 cable needle

stitch holder

1 tapestry needle for weaving in ends

GAUGE

Using needle size 2.0 – 3.0 mm in stockinette stitch:

30 st and 42 rounds = 10 x 10 cm.

Width 25 st of the cable pattern: approx. 5,5 cm.

THE BASICS

Ribbed pattern:

alternate k3, p1.

Stockinette stitch:

in rounds: knit all st.

Cable pattern:

Work 25 st according to the chart.

Work Rd 1 – 4 5x and R 5 – 21 once = 37 Rd.

INSTRUCTIONS

See table and overview of division of the stitches for the fingers of right glove on page 4.

Right glove: cast on Needle 1 and 2 each 14 st, on Needle 3 16 st and on Needle 4 16 st = 60 st.

For the cuff work the st of Needle 1 and 2 and the first 4 st of Needle 3 in ribbed pattern, beginning with 1 purled st, work the last 12 st of Needle 3 and the first 13 st of Needle 4 in cable pattern and knit the remaining 3 st of Needle 4 (= ribbed pattern).

When the cuff measures 9 cm work the hand in stockinette stitch, in the 1st Rd work as follows at the st in cable pattern: 2x k2tog on Needle 3 and 2x k2tog on Needle 4 = 14 st on each Needle, totally 56 st.

For the Thumb gusset, in the 5th Rd from the cuff increase 1 st (lift the thread between the needles and knit into the back loop) before and after the 3rd st of Needle 1.

Repeat 3x in every 3rd Rd and 4x in every other Rd before and after the increased st (lift the thread between the needles and knit into the back loop) = 17 st for the Thumb gusset, totally 72 st. Work 2 Rd across all st, then slip the 17 st of the Thumb gusset on a stitch holder.

Cast on 7 new st for the forchette of the thumb and work the 62 st of the hand. In the next 2nd Rd work a decrease at the forchette over the first 2 st (slip 1 st knitwise, k1, pass slipped stitch over), then k3 and work the last 2 st of the forchette as k2tog. In the next 2nd Rd work a decrease at the forchette over the first 2 st (slip 1 st knitwise, k1, pass slipped stitch over), then k3 and work the last 2 st of the forchette as k2tog. In the next 2nd Rd work a decrease over the 3 remaining forchette stitches (= slip 1 st knitwise, k2tog, pass slipped st over). We now have the original number of st (= 56 st) on the needles.

Continue working approx. 9,5 cm for the hand. Work a forchette of 4 st between the fingers. Divide the st of a finger over 3 Double Pointed Needles.

Little Finger: do not cut the yarn, you will need it! With a new thread work the last 7 st of Needle 2 and the first 7 st of Needle 3 and 4 additional st of the forchette = 18 st in stockinette stitch. When the finger measures approx. 6 cm work the tip of the finger as follows: repeat k2tog until 6 st are left. Cut the yarn. Draw the yarn through the remaining st and pull snugly. Weave in the yarn.

With the thread of the remaining 42 st of the hand work 2 rounds in stockinette stitch until the beginning of the Ring Finger, pick up 4 st at the forchette = 46 st.

Ring Finger: work the 4 st of the forchette, 6 st of the back of the hand and 6 st of the inner hand and inbetween 4 additional st of the forchette = totally 20 st in stockinette stitch. When the finger measures approx. 7 cm work the tip as for the Little Finger.**Middle Finger:** work the 4 st of the forchette, 6 st of the back of the hand and 6 st of the inner hand and 4 additional st of the forchette = totally 20 st in stockinette stitch. When the finger measures approx. 7,5 cm work the tip as for the Little Finger.**Index Finger:** work the 4 st of the forchette and the remaining 18 st of the back of the hand = totally 22 st in stockinette stitch. When the finger measures approx. 7 cm work the tip as for the Little Finger.

Thumb: work the 17 st of the thumb gusset and work increases 1 st before the forchette, pick up 1 st at each st of the forchette, 1 st after the forchette (lift the thread between the needles and knit into the back loop) = 26 st and divide the st over 3 needles. Work in stockinette stitch. In the 1st round knit both st before and after the forchette together through the back. Work the remaining 24 st approx. 6,5 cm in stockinette stitch. Then work the tip of the finger as follows: in every round k2tog at the end of each Needle, until 6 st are left. Cut the yarn. Draw the yarn through the remaining st and pull snugly. Weave in the yarn.

Left glove: work in reverse. Cast on 16 st on Needle 1 and 2, 14 st on Needle 3 and 4. For the cuff, knit the first 3 st of Needle 1, work the 13 remaining st of Needle 1 and the first 12 st of Needle 2 in cable pattern, work the remaining 4 st of Needle 2 and the 28 st of Needle 3 and 4 in ribbed pattern, beginning with k3 s and end with p1. Start the Thumb gusset at the last 3 st of Needle 4.

ABBREVIATIONS

- k = knit
- p = purl
- R = row(st)
- Rd = round(st)
- RS = right side
- st = stitch(es)
- tog = together
- WS = wrong side


KEY

- = k1

= slip 4 st onto a cable needle in back of the work, k3, then work the st of the cable needle: p1 and k3

= slip 3 st onto a cable needle in front of the work, k3 and p1, then knit the st of the cable needle

FINGER GLOVES GUIDE




GENERAL NOTES

Our detailed workshop explains exactly how to knit finger gloves, see also our photos. In addition, you will find all the information you need for finger gloves in different sizes in our table and the overview for dividing the stitches. These measurements are average values, your own measurements are decisive. We have knitted the finger gloves for the workshop with REGIA PREMIUM Merino Yak in the colours beige, gold, raspberry and midnight blue in rounds on Double Pointed Needles. Double Pointed Needles with a length of 10 cm or 15 cm are particularly suitable for knitting thumbs and fingers.

Size table for finger gloves with REGIA PREMIUM Silk, Merino Yak, Cashmere and all other REGIA 4-fädig-yarns applies to a tension of 30 st and 42 rounds = 10 x 10 cm.

DETERMINING THE SIZE



To determine the size you need, measure out the circumference of your hand above the thumb (but without thumb) and the length of the hand from the base of the hand to the end of your Middle Finger. Compare your measurements with those in our table and select the size that is closest to your measurements.

Cuff

All gloves generally start with the cuff (our example: in beige). Divide the stitches evenly spaced on the 4 Double Pointed Needles or according to the instructions. The round transition is marked by the beginning thread.

The height of the cuff should be about 6 cm long, but can be 4-5 cm long for children. The cuff is usually worked in ribbed pattern: alternate k1, p1 or alternate k2, p2. Of course you can also make up the cuff in any other pattern of your choosing.

Hand

After the cuff work the hand in stockinette stitch or in another pattern. For the right glove work the stitches of the inner hand over the stitches on Needles 1 and 2, the back of the hand across Needles 3 and 4; for the left hand work the inner hand over the stitches on Needles 3 and 4, and the back of the hand over the stitches on Needles 1 and 2. For the thumb you need to create a thumb gusset.

Thumb gusset

On the right glove increase 1 st before and after the 3rd st on Needle 1 in the 3rd round: lift the thread between the needles and knit into the back loop. Then increase 1 stitch on every 3rd round before 1st increased stitch and after 2nd previously increased stitch on Needle 1. Then work 2 rounds.

For the left glove start the gusset after the 3rd st from end of Needle 4 and then work increases at each side of this stitch. Then leave all stitches of the gusset on a stitch holder and cast on stitches between the thumb and hand to close the gap, working a forchette.

Forchette

Depending on the size, cast on stitches anew over those on the stitch holder, see table. Then end the round.

If more than 3 st were cast on for the forchette, work on the 2nd following round a decrease over the first 2 stitches (= slip 1 st knitwise, k1, pass slipped stitch over) and work the last 2 st of the forchette as k2tog. Repeat until there are 3 st left for the forchette. In the next following round work a decrease over the 3 remaining forchette stitches (= slip 2 st together knitwise, k1, pass slipped st over). We now have the original number of stitches back on the needle.

For the hand work from cuff to the start of the Little Finger, or to the height given in the table. The arrangement of the stitches for the fingers are given in the appropriate diagrams. Stitches are cast on or picked up between the fingers for the forchettes.

For the **tip of the finger and thumb** in every round work at the end of each Needle k2tog until 4-6 st remain. Cut yarn, pull remaining stitches together and darn away thread.

RIGHT GLOVE

Little Finger

Using additional needles pick up stitches from Needles 2 and 3 as shown in the diagram on the arrangement of stitches. Allow the thread to hang, and with a new ball cast on the number of stitches required for the forchette and take to those of the Little Finger. Arrange all stitches evenly across 3 Double Pointed Needles and continue in pattern until about 0.5 cm from end of finger or until you have reached the size given in the table. Then work the fingertip as for the thumb. Continue with the old thread over the remaining stitches. With an extra needle pick up 1 stitch into each forchette stitch. Then work another 4 rounds over all stitches to start of ring Finger (our example: in midnight blue).

Ring Finger

For the forchette between the Ring and Middle Finger cast on the stitches required, pick up the given number of

stitches, work 1 stitch into each forchette stitch between the Ring and Little Finger and pick up the given number of stitches. Arrange all stitches evenly across 3 Double Pointed Needles and work to about 0.5 cm from end of finger, or until you have reached the end of the finger, then work the fingertip.

Middle Finger

For the forchette between the Middle and Index Finger cast on the stitches required, pick up the given number of stitches, work 1 stitch into each forchette stitch between the Middle and Ring Finger and pick up the given number of stitches.

Arrange all stitches evenly across 3 Double Pointed Needles and work to about 0.5 cm from end of finger, or until you have reached the end of the finger, then work the fingertip.

Index Finger

To the remaining stitches pick up 1 stitch for each forchette stitch between the Index and Middle Finger and arrange all stitches evenly across 3 Double Pointed Needles. Work to about 0.5 cm from end of finger, or until you have reached the end of your finger, then work the fingertip.

Thumb

To the gusset stitches on the stitch holder make 1 stitch before the gusset (= lift the thread between the needles and knit into the back loop), work 1 stitch into each gusset stitch and make 1 stitch after the gusset (= lift the thread between the needles and knit into the back loop), then arrange all stitches evenly across 3 Double Pointed Needles. In the 1st round knit the two stitches before the gusset together through the back, and knit the two stitches after the gusset together. About 0.5-1 cm before the end of the Thumb, or when you reach the height given in the Table, then work the tip.

LEFT GLOVE

Work in reverse.



Cuff, hand, gusset and beginning of the Little Finger.



Hand and Little Finger.



For the forchette of the Ring Finger pick up the given number of stitches between the Ring and Middle Finger and between the Ring and Little Finger. Arrange all stitches evenly across 3 Double Pointed Needles.



Little Finger with the stitches of the forchette.



Work the Middle Finger, Index Finger and Thumb according to the table and the overview for dividing the stitches.



When the Little Finger is finished work a few rounds before starting the Ring Finger.



Detail Thumb Gusset.



Tip from our expert: you can work for all fingers the forchette stitches as described at the thumb: make 1 stitch before the forchette (= lift the thread between the needles and knit into the back loop), work 1 stitch into each forchette stitch and make 1 stitch after the forchette (= lift the thread between the needles and knit into the back loop). In the next round knit both stitches before the forchette together through the back loop, knit the both stitches after the forchette together. This allows you to create perfect transitions between the fingers.
