

SECTION 2

Each Squiggle features colors A, B, or D. You can use colors A, B, or D in any order that you like. For example ADBADBADB or DBADBADBA or BADBADBAD. Color C is used for a 2-row eyelet stripe after the Squiggle short rows. Color C is a fun opportunity for a Mohair Dare. Hold 1 strand of lace weight mohair silk together with Color C OR substitute color C with a one strand of mohair for a fluffy eyelet stripe. These eyelet stripes would look fabulous with a new 5th color pop of Mohair. Get creative with this wavy section and have fun customizing your colors!



Section 2 continues with the 161 sts from Section 1. Color C is the thin eyelet stripe framing all of the short row Squiggles. Color C is fabulous Mohair Dare opportunity. Hold 1 strand of lace weight mohair silk together with color C for a fluffy marled stripe. If you have a brand new 5th color pop in mohair, you can substitute color C with this new mohair color pop for fluffy eyelet stripes. Colors A, B & D are used for the short row Squiggles. There are 9 total Squiggles, 3 Squiggles of each color (A, B & D).
