



These are the yarn amounts I used for my brioche border. The yarn amounts also represent the Garter Stitch border option if you want to knit simple horizontal Garter Stitch Stripes instead of the Brioche option. Yarn amounts may vary depending on your gauge and yarn type, so add 1 or 2g extra to be safe for each color.

Feel free to customize the colors in your border. Add extra colors or include a Mohair Dare. You can hold a matching strand of lace weight mohair silk together with any color or substitute one of the colors with 2 strands of mohair held together for an extra fluffy stripe. Mohair looks fabulous as the background brioche colors.

Color D is used as the background brioche color in Brioche 1.
Color C is used as the background brioche color in Brioche 2.
Color B is used as the background brioche color in Brioche 3.

Stop early and skip ahead to the I-cord Bind Off after completing any Brioche or Garter Stitch section.

I-cord BO	6g Color A 6g Color B	12g Total
Brioche 3	17g Color C 17g Color B	
Solid Stripe 2	8g Color A	
Brioche 2	17g Color D 17g Color C	
Solid Stripe 1	8g Color B	
Brioche 1	16g Color A 16g Color D	

We began with the soundwave scallops and short row crescendos and took an angular journey toward the the piano key modular blocks and rhythmic slip stitches. Each section was like a new song. The final brioche or garter stitch border became the grand finale tying it all together. I love how the melodic shapes and colorful motifs overlap when you drape the shawl around your neck or toss it over your shoulder. The final shape reminds me of a sweeping musical phrase filled with a symphony of stitches. Have fun styling your Mystery MusiKAL Shawl!
