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## Guldek (Golden Oak) – Crocheted Cardigan

The Guldek cardigan is worked back and forth in one piece, from the top down, with raglan shaping. The ribbed cuffs and sleeves with falling leaf patterning are worked after the body is finished.

**YARN** Järbo 2 tr ull (2-Ply Wool) (100% wool, 328 yd/300 m / 100 g)

### ALTERNATE YARN SUGGESTIONS

Alpacka Solo (100% alpaca, 183 yd/167 m / 50 g)

Elise (60% cotton, 40% acrylic, 184 yd/170 m / 50 g)

Junior (70% acrylic, 30% nylon, 183 yd/168 m / 50 g)

Ístex Kambgarn (100% Merino wool, 163 yd/150 m / 50 g)

**GAUGE** Approx. 20 sts x 14 rows in double crochet = 4 x 4 in / 10 x 10 cm. Adjust hook size to obtain correct gauge if necessary.

**SIZES-WOMEN'S XS (S, M, L, XL, 2XL, 3XL, 4XL)**

**GARMENT'S CHEST** Approx. 34¼ (36, 37½, 39½, 43¾, 48½, 53¼, 58) in / 87 (91, 95.5, 100, 111.5, 123.5, 135.5, 147.5) cm

**GARMENT'S TOTAL LENGTH** Approx. 18¼ (19, 19¾, 20½, 21¼, 22, 22¾, 23¾) in / 46 (48, 50, 52, 54, 56, 58, 60) cm

**GARMENT'S SLEEVE LENGTH** Approx. 18¾ (18¾, 19, 19¼, 19½, 19¾, 20¼, 20¼) in / 47.5 (47.5, 48, 49, 49.5, 50.5, 51.5, 51.5) cm

**YARN COLORS AND AMOUNTS** Approx. 600 (650, 700, 800, 900, 900, 1,000, 1,000) g (color 74117, Golden Charm)

**CROCHET HOOK** U. S. size G-6 / 4 mm

**NOTIONS** tapestry needle; 7 push buttons

### STITCHES AND TECHNIQUES

**Raised (post) dc:** This is a dc crocheted around the dc of previous round. From RS = front post **FPdc:** Yarn over hook, insert hook from front to back on right side of dc, push hook behind stitch and then out to front again on left side of stitch. Yarn over hook and finish dc as usual. On WS = back post **BPdc:** Insert hook from the back, on right side of dc, around dc and to front again on left side to catch yarn. Complete stitch as for a regular dc.

**Increase:** Work 1 regular dc inserting hook down around stitch loops between post dc stitches.

**Decrease:** 2 post dc worked together to make 1 post dc (begin a post dc and bring yarn through first 2 loops on hook; begin next post dc with yarn through first 2 loops, and end with yarn over hook and through loops of both dc tog to make 1 post dc.

**Dtr: double treble post dc** (used on first row of oak leaf). A dtr begins with yarn over hook 3 times.

**NOTE** This pattern uses U. S. crochet terms.

When working cardigan, begin each new row with ch 3 (= 1 dc). Begin the new row with hook into 3rd ch, which the row's last dc was worked into.

### OAK LEAF

**Row 1:** Dtr with hook inserted around post dc 2 rows below.

**Row 2:** 1 FPdc, 2 increases, 1 FPdc inserting hook around previous FPdc.

**Row 3:** 2 FPdc, 2 increases, 2 FPdc.

**Row 4:** 2 FPdc, 1 increase, 1 FPdc, 2 increases, 1 FPdc, 1 increase, 2 FPdc.

**Row 5:** 2 FPdc tog x 2, 1 PFdc, 2 increases, 1 FPdc, 2 FPdc tog x 2.

**Row 6:** 2 BPdc tog, 1 FPdc, 1 increase, 1 FPdc, 2 increases, 1 FPdc, 1 increase, 1 FPdc, 2 BPdc tog.

**Row 7:** 5 FPdc, 1 increase, 5 FPdc (use the 2 outermost BPdc).

**Row 8:** 3 FPdc, 1 increase, 5 FPdc, 1 increase, 3 FPdc.

**Row 9:** 13 FPdc.

**Row 10:** 2 FPdc tog, 9 FPdc, 2 FPdc tog.

**Row 11:** 2 FPdc tog, 7 FPdc, 2 FPdc tog.

**Row 12:** 1 BPdc, 1 FPdc, 1 increase, 5 FPdc, 1 increase, 1 FPdc, 1 BPdc.

**Row 13:** 1 BPdc + 1 FPdc tog, 7 FPdc, 1 FPdc + 1 FBdc tog

**Row 14:** 2 FPdc tog x 2, 1 FPdc, 2 FPdc tog x 2 (make sure that both the first and last FPdc are tog.

**Row 15:** 1 BPdc, 3 FPdc, 1 BPdc.

**Row 16:** 2 BPdc tog, 1 FPdc, 2 BPdc tog.

**Row 17:** 3 BPdc.

**Row 18:** 2 BPdc tog (use nearest post dc outside leaf), 1 BPdc, 2 BPdc tog = back to original stitch count.

## CARDIGAN

CH 106 (106, 106, 106, 120, 132, 145, 157).

**Row 1:** Beginning in 4th ch from hook, work 1 dc in each ch with 4 increases made with chain loops. **Increase** = (1 dc , ch 2, 1 dc) in same ch.

**Sizes XS-L:** Make 1st increase in 13th st with (1 dc , ch 2, 1 dc) in same ch.

**Sizes XL-4XL:** Make 1st increase in 16th (19th, 22nd, 25th) st.

**Sizes XS-L:** Rep increases in 25th, 30th and 25th st after previous increase.

**Sizes XL-4XL:** Rep increases in 25th st then in 36th (42nd, 48th, 54th) st and then in 25th st again as counted from previous increase.

**Rows 2-13 (14, 15, 16, 19, 22, 25, 28):** Turn with ch 3, work 1 dc in each st, continuing to increase as est.

**Rows 14 (15, 16, 17, 20, 23, 26, 29) – 18 (20, 22, 24, 27, 30, 33, 36):** Continue with 1 dc in each st and increases as est, but, between the 1st and 2nd as well as the 3rd and 4th ch loops (sleeves), begin working WS raised dc (BPdc). Alternate between FPdc and BPdc on every other row.

**Rows 19 (21, 23, 25, 28, 31, 34, 37) – 24 (26, 28, 30, 33, 36, 39, 42):** Continue, now beginning an oak leaf centered on each sleeve.

**NOTE** The oak leaf on the following rows is worked with the opposite post dc to the one the row is worked with. When the row is worked with BPdc, the leaf is worked with FPdc and vice versa. After the first ch loop of the row, work 29 (31, 33, 35, 38, 41, 44, 47) BP/FP dc and 1 dtr FP/BP with hook around post dc 2 rows below (Oak Leaf Row 1). Rep on opposite side and continue as est, working oak leaf Rows 2-6 as follows for the next 5 rows.

**Oak Leaf Row 2:** 1 BP/FPdc, 2 increases, 1 BP/FPdc inserting hook into previous BP/FPdc.

**Oak Leaf Row 3:** 2 BP/FPdc, 2 increases, 2 BP/FPdc.

**Oak Leaf Row 4:** 2 BP/FPdc, 1 increase, 1 BP/FPdc, 2 increases, 1 BP/FPdc, 1 increase, 2 BP/FPdc.

**Oak Leaf Row 5:** 2 FP/BPdc tog x 2, 1 FP/BPdc, 2 increases, 1 FP/BPdc, 2 FP/BPdc tog x 2.

**Oak Leaf Row 6:** 2 FP/BPdc tog, 1 BP/FPdc, 1 increase, 1 BP/FPdc, 2 increases, 1 BP/FPdc, 1 increase, 1 BP/FPdc, 2 FP/BPdc tog.

## ARMHOLES

**Row 25 (27, 29, 31, 34, 37, 40, 43):** Work 1 dc in each st up to first ch loop. Work 1 dc around ch loop and then ch 10, attaching ch in next ch loop. Work 1 dc in each st to next ch loop and rep.

**Rows 26 (28, 30, 32, 35, 38, 41, 44) – 50 (52, 55, 58, 61, 64, 66, 69):** Work 1 dc in each rem st – or to desired length.

## RIBBING AT LOWER EDGE

Ch 11 in same st that next row begins with. Beginning in 2nd ch from hook, work 10 sc in back loop only of each ch, joining in edge of last row of dc. Work back and forth with 10 sc into back loops, joining ribbing to lower edge with hook inserted into both st loops, alternating 1 sl st and 2 sl sts for joins. Continue the same way until ribbing covers lower edge of cardigan. Cut yarn and fasten off.

## RIBBING ON FRONT BAND

Begin at upper edge for left band, attach yarn with 1 sl st and ch 9. Beginning in 2nd ch from hook, work 8 sc in ch sts and continue with ribbing as at lower edge: Work back and forth with 8 sc into back loops, joining ribbing to lower edge with hook inserted into both st loops, alternating 1 sl st and 2 sl sts for joins Insert hook both into and between ch loops. Make sure sts are evenly spaced so the band won't not pull in or ruffle. Cut yarn and fasten off. Make opposite front band the same way.

## NECKBAND RIBBING

Begin at top of left front band. Attach yarn with 1 sl st and ch 6. Beginning in 2nd ch from hook, work 5 sc up to first increase. Then, increase with 1 extra ch at bottom of chain and work 6 sc to next increase. Increase with 1 ch st at bottom and work 7 sc to next increase where sts gradually decrease again. At next insertion of hook, work 2 sl sts into 2 sts. Cut yarn and fasten off.

## OUTER EDGE

To stabilize the front bands and neckband, attach yarn with 1 sl st in the outermost st of ribbing, working down left band. Work sc in each st along each front band and around neck. Make sure sts are evenly spaced so edging won't pull in or ruffle. Cut yarn and fasten off.

## SLEEVES WITH OAK LEAVES

The sleeves are worked around in a spiral, with a removeable marker indicating beginning of round. Attach yarn with 1 sl st around a ch loop that begins a post dc (do not count slip sts with dc). Work post dc around all sts, with BPdc as the background and FPdc for the oak leaves. 9 (10, 11, 12, 13, 14, 15, 16) sts are worked before and after the already-begun oak leaf and then two oak leaves are worked, one on each side. For the leaf already begun, continue on Row 7. Work BPdc to end of row and 2BPdc tog at each of the previously worked ch loops (end the first row by working the first and last st tog and placing marker in next post dc).

**Rnd 1:** 24 (25, 26, 27, 29, 31, 33, 35) BPdc, **oak leaf row 1**, 9 (10, 11, 12, 13, 14, 15, 16) BPdc, oak leaf row 7, 9 (10, 11, 12, 13, 14, 15, 16) BPdc, **oak leaf row 1**, 34 (35, 36, 37, 39, 41, 43, 45) BPdc (including decreases and ch loops) = 89 (93, 97, 101, 107, 113, 119, 125) dc.

**Rnd 2:** 23 (24, 25, 26, 28, 29, 30, 32, 34) BPdc, oak leaf row 2, 9 (10, 11, 12, 13, 14, 15, 16) BPdc, oak leaf row 8, 9 (10, 11, 12, 13, 14, 15, 16) BPdc, oak leaf row 2, 34 (35, 36, 37, 39, 41, 43, 45) BPdc.

**Rnd 3:** 23 (24, 25, 26, 28, 29, 30, 32, 34) BPdc, oak leaf row 3, 9 (10, 11, 12, 13, 14, 15, 16) BPdc, oak leaf row 9, 9 (10, 11, 12, 13, 14, 15, 16) BPdc, oak leaf row 3, 22 (23, 24, 25, 27, 29, 31, 33) BPdc, 2 BPdc tog, 8 BPdc, 2 BPdc tog.

**Rnd 4:** 23 (24, 25, 26, 28, 29, 30, 32, 34) BPdc, oak leaf row 4, 9 (10, 11, 12, 13, 14, 15, 16) BPdc, oak leaf row 10, 9 (10, 11, 12, 13, 14, 15, 16) BPdc, oak leaf row 4, 32 (33, 34, 35, 37, 39, 41, 43) BPdc.

**Rnd 5:** 23 (24, 25, 26, 28, 29, 30, 32, 34) BPdc, oak leaf row 5, 9 (10, 11, 12, 13, 14, 15, 16) BPdc, oak leaf row 11, 9 (10, 11, 12, 13, 14, 15, 16) BPdc, oak leaf row 5, 22 (23, 24, 25, 27, 29, 31, 33) BPdc, 2 BPdc tog, 8 BPdc, 6 BPdc tog.

**Rnd 6:** 13 (13, 13, 13, 14, 15, 16, 17) BPdc, **oak leaf row 1**, 9 (10, 11, 12, 13, 14, 15, 16) BPdc, oak leaf row 6, 9 (10, 11, 12, 13, 14, 15, 16) BPdc, oak leaf row 12, 9 (10, 11, 12, 13, 14, 15, 16) BPdc, oak leaf row 6, 9 (10, 11, 12, 13, 14, 15, 16) BPdc, **oak leaf row 1**, 20 (20, 20, 20, 21, 22, 23, 24) BPdc.

**Rnd 7:** 13 (13, 13, 13, 14, 15, 16, 17) BPdc, oak leaf row 2, 9 (10, 11, 12, 13, 14, 15, 16) BPdc, oak leaf row 7, 9 (10, 11, 12, 13, 14, 15, 16) BPdc, oak leaf row 13, 9 (10, 11, 12, 13, 14, 15, 16) BPdc, oak leaf row 7, 9 (10, 11, 12, 13, 14, 15, 16) BPdc, oak leaf row 2, 12 (12, 12, 12, 13, 14, 15, 16) BPdc, 2 BPdc tog, 4 BPdc, 2 BPdc tog.

**Rnd 8:** 13 (13, 13, 13, 14, 15, 16, 17) BPdc, oak leaf row 3, 9 (10, 11, 12, 13, 14, 15, 16) BPdc, oak leaf row 8, 9 (10, 11, 12, 13, 14, 15, 16) BPdc, oak leaf row 14, 9 (10, 11, 12, 13, 14, 15, 16) BPdc, oak leaf row 8, 9 (10, 11, 12, 13, 14, 15, 16) BPdc, oak leaf row 3, 18 (18, 18, 18, 19, 20, 21, 22) BPdc.

**Rnd 10:** 13 (13, 13, 13, 14, 15, 16, 17) BPdc, oak leaf row 5, 9 (10, 11, 12, 13, 14, 15, 16) BPdc, oak leaf row 10, 9 (10, 11, 12, 13, 14, 15, 16) BPdc, oak leaf row 16, 9 (10, 11, 12, 13, 14, 15, 16) BPdc, oak leaf row 10, 9 (10, 11, 12, 13, 14, 15, 16) BPdc, oak leaf row 5, 16 (16, 16, 16, 17, 18, 19, 20) BPdc.

Instead of continuing to next rnd, ch 16 (16, 16, 18, 18, 18, 19, 19) and work ribbing as before, with 2 sl sts in each join if both st loops are between post dc. Cut yarn, leaving long enough end to seam ribbing. Weave in all ends neatly on WS. Make second sleeve the same way.

### FINISHING

Weave in all ends neatly on WS.

Sew on push buttons.



**GAUGE** Approx. 23 sts x 15 rows in post double crochet = 4 x 4 in / 10 x 10 cm. Adjust hook size to obtain correct gauge if necessary.

**SHAWL LENGTH** Approx. 51¼ in / 130 cm

**SHAWL WIDTH** Approx. 15¾ in / 40 cm

**YARN COLORS AND AMOUNTS** Approx. 550 g (color 74149, Tree Hugger)

**NOTIONS** Tapestry needle

### STITCHES AND TECHNIQUES

This shawl is worked back and forth in one piece, with wrong and right side double crochet raised relief (post) stitches. Each turn and new row begins with ch 3 where the next relief stitch begins. Each row ends on top of previous row's ch-3. When the fourth leaf in the middle is worked, an opening is created in the shawl for a practical way to hold one end.

**Cable Crossing:** Two cables run down the whole length of the shawl and cross on every fourth row, beginning on row 2: skip 4 post double crochets, work 4 dtr, one each in the 5th, 6th, 7th, and 8th post dc in that order. Then you go back to the 4 skipped post double crochet sts and work 1 dtr in each, in order.

**Raised (post) dc:** This is a dc crocheted around the dc of previous round. From RS = front post **FPdc:** Yarn over hook, insert hook from front to back on right side of dc, push hook behind stitch and then out to front again on left side of stitch. Yarn over hook and finish dc as usual. On WS = back post **BPdc:** Insert hook from the back, on right side of dc, around dc and to front again on left side to catch yarn. Complete stitch as for a regular dc.

**Increase:** Work 1 regular dc inserting hook down around stitch loops between post dc stitches.

**Decrease:** 2 post dc worked together to make 1 post dc (begin a post dc and bring yarn through first 2 loops on hook; begin next post dc with yarn through first 2 loops, and end with yarn over hook and through loops of both dc tog to make 1 post dc.

**Dtr: double treble post** (used on cable crossings and first row of oak leaf). A dtr begins with yarn over hook 3 times.

**NOTE** This pattern uses U. S. crochet terms.

### OAK LEAF

**Row 1:** Dtr with hook inserted into raised dc 2 rows below.

**Row 2:** 1 FPdc, 2 increases, 1 FPdc inserting hook into previous FPdc.

**Row 3:** 2 BPdc, 2 increases, 2 BPdc.

**Row 4:** 2 FPdc, 1 increase, 1 FPdc, 2 increases, 1 FPdc, 1 increase, 2 FPdc.

**Row 5:** 2 BPdc tog x 2, 1 BPdc, 2 increases, 1 BPdc, 2 BPdc tog x 2.

**Row 6:** 2 BPdc tog, 1 FPdc, 1 increase, 1 FPdc, 2 increases, 1 FPdc, 1 increase, 1 FPdc, 2 BPdc tog.

**Row 7:** 5 BPdc, 2 increases, 5 BPdc (use the 2 outermost BPdc).

**Row 8:** 3 FPdc, 1 increase, 6 FPdc, 1 increase, 3 FPdc.

**Row 9:** 14 BPdc.

**Row 10:** 2 FPdc tog, 10 FPdc, 2 FPdc tog.

**Row 11:** 2 BPdc tog, 8 BPdc, 2 BPdc tog.

**Row 12:** 1 BPdc, 1 FPdc, 1 increase, 6 FPdc, 1 increase, 1 FPdc, 1 BPdc.

**Row 13:** 1 FPdc + 1 BPdc tog, 8 BPdc, 1 BPdc + 1 FPdc tog

**Row 14:** 2 FPdc tog x 2, 2 FPdc, 2 FPdc tog x 2 (make sure that both the first and last FPdc are tog.

**Row 15:** 1 FPdc, 4 BPdc, 1 FPdc.

**Row 16:** 2 BPdc tog, 2 FPdc tog, 2 BPdc tog.

**Row 17:** 1 FPdc, 1 BPdc, 1 FPdc.

**Row 18:** 2 BPdc tog (use nearest post dc outside leaf), 1 BPdc, 2 BPdc tog = back to original stitch count.

**Row 19:** Begin next leaf starting on Row 1.

## SHAWL

Ch 91.

**Row 1:** Beginning in 4th ch from hook, work 1 dc in each ch across = 89 dc.

*Beginning on Row 2, the double crochets are worked as back and front post double crochet. Begin on WS and then continue alternating between front and back post double crochet on every other row as follows:*

**Row 2, begin cables:** Begin every row with ch 3, inserting hook down into next post dc. Work 25 BPdc and then begin first cable: \*Skip 4 post dc, work 4 dtr, working one dtr each in the following 5th, 6th, 7th, and 8th FPdc. Go back to the 4 skipped post dc and work a dtr over each of these FPdc, in order.\* Work 23 BPdc; rep from \* to \*, work 25 BPdc.

**Row 3:** 25 FPdc and then work over cable with 8 BPdc into each of the dtr, work 23 FPdc, 8 BPdc, 25 FPdc.

**Row 4:** 25 BPdc, 8 FPdc, 23 BPdc, 8 FPdc, 25 BPdc.

**Row 5:** \*12 FPdc, begin oak leaf row 1 in 13th st with 1 dtr worked around post dc 2 rows below, 12 FPdc\*, 8 BPdc, 23 FPdc, 8 BPdc; rep \* to \*.

**Row 6:** \*12 BPdc, oak leaf row 2, 12 BPdc\*, **cable crossing**, 23 BPdc, **cable crossing**; rep \* to \*.

**Row 7:** \*12 FPdc, oak leaf row 3, 12 FPdc\*, 8 BPdc, 23 FPdc, 8 BPdc; rep \* to \*.

**Row 8:** \*12 BPdc, oak leaf row 4, 12 BPdc\*, 8 FPdc, 23 BPdc, 8 FPdc; rep \* to \*.

**Row 9:** \*12 FPdc, oak leaf row 5, 12 FPdc\*, 8 BPdc, 23 FPdc, 8 BPdc; rep \* to \*.

**Row 10:** \*12 BPdc, oak leaf row 6, 12 BPdc\*, **cable crossing**, 23 BPdc, **cable crossing**; rep \* to \*.

**Row 11:** \*12 FPdc, oak leaf row 7, 12 FPdc\*, 8 BPdc, 23 FPdc, 8 BPdc; rep \* to \*.

**Row 12:** \*12 BPdc, oak leaf row 8, 12 BPdc\*, 8 FPdc, 23 BPdc, 8 FPdc; rep \* to \*.

**Row 13:** \*12 FPdc, oak leaf row 9, 12 FPdc\*, 8 BPdc, 23 FPdc, 8 BPdc; rep \* to \*.

**Row 14:** \*12 BPdc, oak leaf row 10, 12 BPdc\*, **cable crossing**, 23 BPdc, **cable crossing**; rep \* to \*.

**Row 15:** \*12 FPdc, oak leaf row 11, 12 FPdc\*, 8 BPdc, 23 FPdc, 8 BPdc; rep \* to \*.

**Row 16:** \*12 BPdc, oak leaf row 12, 12 BPdc\*, 8 FPdc, 23 BPdc, 8 FPdc; rep \* to \*.

**Row 17:** \*12 FPdc, oak leaf row 13, 12 FPdc\*, 8 BPdc, 23 FPdc, 8 BPdc; rep \* to \*.

**Row 18:** \*12 BPdc, oak leaf row 14, 12 BPdc\*, **cable crossing**, 23 BPdc, **cable crossing**; rep \* to \*.

**Row 19:** \*12 FPdc, oak leaf row 15, 12 FPdc\*, 8 BPdc, 23 FPdc, 8 BPdc; rep \* to \*.

**Row 20:** \*12 BPdc, oak leaf row 16, 12 BPdc\*, 8 FPdc, 23 BPdc, 8 FPdc; rep \* to \*.

**Row 21:** \*12 FPdc, oak leaf row 17, 12 FPdc\*, 8 BPdc, 23 FPdc, 8 BPdc; rep \* to \*.

**Row 22:** \*12 BPdc, oak leaf row 18, 12 BPdc\*, **cable crossing**, 23 BPdc, **cable crossing**; rep \* to \*.

*Now the first oak leaf sequence is complete and the next one begins with an oak leaf centered between the two cables.*

**Row 23:** 25 FPdc, 8 BPdc, 11 FPdc, begin oak leaf on row 1 in the 12th st, 11 FPdc, 8 BPdc, 25 FPdc.

**Row 24:** 25 BPdc, 8 FPdc, 11 BPdc, oak leaf row 2, 11 BPdc, 8 FPdc, 25 BPdc.

**Row 25:** 25 FPdc, 8 BPdc, 11 FPdc, oak leaf row 3, 11 FPdc, 8 BPdc, 25 FPdc.

**Row 26:** 25 BPdc, **cable crossing**, 11 BPdc, oak leaf row 4, 11 BPdc, **cable crossing**, 25 BPdc.

**Row 27:** 25 FPdc, 8 BPdc, 11 FPdc, oak leaf row 5, 11 FPdc, 8 BPdc, 25 FPdc.

**Row 28:** 25 BPdc, 8 FPdc, 11 BPdc, oak leaf row 6, 11 BPdc, 8 FPdc, 25 BPdc.

**Row 29:** 25 FPdc, 8 BPdc, 11 FPdc, oak leaf row 7, 11 FPdc, 8 BPdc, 25 FPdc.

**Row 30:** 25 BPdc, **cable crossing**, 11 BPdc, oak leaf row 8, 11 BPdc, **cable crossing**, 25 BPdc.

**Row 31:** 25 FPdc, 8 BPdc, 11 FPdc, oak leaf row 9, 11 FPdc, 8 BPdc, 25 FPdc.

**Row 32:** 25 BPdc, 8 FPdc, 11 BPdc, oak leaf row 10, 11 BPdc, 8 FPdc, 25 BPdc.

**Row 33:** 25 FPdc, 8 BPdc, 11 FPdc, oak leaf row 11, 11 FPdc, 8 BPdc, 25 FPdc.

**Row 34:** 25 BPdc, **cable crossing**, 11 BPdc, oak leaf row 12, 11 BPdc, **cable crossing**, 25 BPdc.

**Row 35:** 25 FPdc, 8 BPdc, 11 FPdc, oak leaf row 13, 11 FPdc, 8 BPdc, 25 FPdc.

**Row 36:** 25 BPdc, 8 FPdc, 11 BPdc, oak leaf row 14, 11 BPdc, 8 FPdc, 25 BPdc.

**Row 37:** 25 FPdc, 8 BPdc, 11 FPdc, oak leaf row 15, 11 FPdc, 8 BPdc, 25 FPdc.

**Row 38:** 25 BPdc, **cable crossing**, 11 BPdc, oak leaf row 16, 11 BPdc, **cable crossing**, 25 BPdc.

**Row 39:** 25 FPdc, 8 BPdc, 11 FPdc, oak leaf row 17, 11 FPdc, 8 BPdc, 25 FPdc.

**Row 40:** 25 BPdc, 8 FPdc, 11 BPdc, oak leaf row 18, 11 BPdc, 8 FPdc, 25 BPdc.

Continue as est, alternately working 2 leaves on the sides (Rows 5-22) and one leaf in the center (Rows 23-40), with both cables in between. When the shawl is about 33½ in / 85 cm long and it's time to work the fourth oak leaf in the center: begin working the oak leaf as usual through leaf row 8. On the 9th row, make an opening in the shawl. Work (as for Row 31), 25 FPdc and 8 BPdc, but, work only 5 FPdc and then ch 26, attaching chain in the 7th FPdc after the oak leaf. End the row with 5 FPdc, 8 BPdc, and 25 FBPdc.

On the next row (Row 10 of 4th oak leaf), begin by working (as for Row 32): 25 BPdc, 8 FPdc, but then 5 BPdc and 6 regular dc in next chain sts, 2 dc tog, 10 regular dc, 2 dc tog and 6 regular dc in the 6 rem ch sts; end with 5 BPdc, 8 FPdc, 25 BPdc.

On next row, continue as est with Rows 33-40, beginning with Row 11 of oak leaf on row 33. After completing Row 40, work 3 more oak leaf sequences (for a total of 5 oak centered leaves) until shawl is approx. 51¼ in / 130 cm long. Cut yarn and fasten off.

## Embla – Cardigan with Lace–Pattern Sleeves

A very wearable cardigan, simple and single color to go with almost everything in your wardrobe. The cropped version is shown here but it's easy to lengthen it as the sweater is worked top down. Try on the cardigan as you work and decide how long you want to knit the body. Of course, you'll need more yarn if you choose to lengthen the sweater.

**YARN** Svensk Ull (Swedish Wool) (100% Swedish wool, 197 yd/180 m / 100 g)

### ALTERNATE YARN SUGGESTIONS

Alpe (100% wool, 109 yd/100 m / 50 g)

Raggi (70% superwash wool, 30% polyamide, 165 yd/151 m / 100 g)

Ístex Léttlopi (100% Icelandic wool, 109 yd/100 m / 50 g)

**GAUGE** Approx. 20 sts x 30 rows in stockinette on larger size needles = 4 x 4 in / 10 x 10 cm. Adjust needle sizes to obtain correct gauge if necessary.

**SIZES-WOMEN'S** XS (S, M, L, XL, 2XL, 3XL, 4XL)

### FINISHED MEASUREMENTS

**GARMENT'S CHEST** Approx. 34¼ (36, 38¼, 41¼, 44½, 48½, 52½, 55½) in / 87 (91, 97, 105, 113, 123, 133, 141) cm

**GARMENT'S TOTAL LENGTH** Approx. 17¾ (18½, 19¼, 20½, 21, 21¾, 22½, 23¼) in / 45 (47, 49, 51, 53, 55, 57, 59) cm

### GARMENT CONSTRUCTION

The cardigan needs almost no finishing because it is worked from the top down. The neckband is worked first and then the patterned saddle shoulders. Stitches for the body are picked up from the shoulders. The back is worked first, down to the underarms and then each front is knitted. All three parts are, finally, placed on the same needle and worked back and forth to the ribbing. The sleeves are worked from stitches picked up around the armholes and knitted top down.

The cast-ons and bind-offs for this cardigan are worked with Italian cast-on and bind-off for ribbing. However, you can use regular long-tail cast-on and bind-off methods if you prefer.

### NECKBAND

With smaller size circular and Italian cast-on method, CO 111 (111, 115, 115, 119, 119, 123, 123) sts. Work back and forth in k1, p1 ribbing for 8 (8, 8, 8, 10, 10, 10, 10) rows for Italian cast-on or 9 (9, 9, 9, 11, 11, 11, 11) rows for long-tail cast-on. Continue, working shoulders out from neckband. Place the first 20 (20, 21, 21, 22, 22, 23, 23) sts on a holder = left front.

### LEFT SHOULDER

Begin working charted lace pattern back and forth over the next 13 sts (all sizes): with smaller size needle, work chart repeat 4 times + 4 rows (4 times + 8 rows, 5 times + 2 rows, 5 times + 6 rows, 6 times, 6 times + 4 rows, 6 times + 8 rows, 7 times + 2 rows). On the last row on WS, BO 1 st at beginning of row and k2tog at end of row = 2 sts decreased. Cut yarn and place 11 sts on holder.

Place the next 45 (45, 47, 47, 49, 49, 51, 51) sts on a holder = back.

### RIGHT SHOULDER

Begin working charted lace pattern back and forth over the next 13 sts (all sizes): with smaller size needle, work chart repeat 4 times + 4 rows (4 times + 8 rows, 5 times + 2 rows, 5 times + 6 rows, 6 times, 6 times + 4 rows, 6 times + 8 rows, 7 times + 2 rows). On the last row on WS, BO 1 st at beginning of row and k2tog at end of row = 2 sts decreased. Cut yarn and place 11 sts on holder.

Place the last 20 (20, 21, 21, 22, 22, 23, 23) sts on a holder = right front.

From this point on, the top pieces of back and front are worked separately.

### BACK

Change to larger size circular. Pick up and knit sts along back of shoulders and neckband as follows: Beginning at outer edge of left shoulder, pick up and knit 21 (23, 25, 29, 33, 37, 41, 45) sts (skip every other st along edge), place held 45 (45, 47, 47, 49, 49, 51, 51) sts on smaller size needle and knit them with larger size needle. Finish with: pick up and knit 21 (23, 25, 29, 33, 37, 41, 45) sts along right shoulder (skip every other st along edge) = 87 (91, 97, 105, 115, 123, 133, 141) sts total. Work back and forth in stockinette; the first row is on WS.

**Next Row (RS):** Begin raising the back neck with short rows as follows: Knit until 10 (11, 12, 13, 14, 15, 16, 17) sts rem. Slip next st purlwise wyf.

Turn. Slip 1st to right needle without working it, wrap yarn around base of st, purl until 10 (11, 12, 13, 14, 15, 16, 17) sts rem. Slip next st purlwise wyf.

Turn. Slip 1st to right needle without working it, wrap yarn around base of st, knit until 20 (21, 22, 23, 24, 25, 26, 27) sts rem. Slip next st purlwise wyf.

Turn. Slip 1st to right needle without working it, wrap yarn around base of st, purl until 20 (21, 22, 23, 24, 25, 26, 27) sts rem. Slip next st purlwise wyf.

Turn. Slip 1st to right needle without working it, wrap yarn around base of st, knit until 30 (31, 32, 33, 34, 35, 36, 37) sts rem. Slip next st purlwise wyf.

Turn. Slip 1st to right needle without working it, wrap yarn around base of st, purl until 30 (31, 32, 33, 34, 35, 36, 37) sts rem. Slip next st purlwise wyf. Turn. Slip 1st to right needle without working it, wrap yarn around base of st.

Knit entire row, joining each wrapped st with its wrap. Turn and purl entire row, joining each wrapped st with its wrap. From this point on, work back straight down until it measures 8¼ (8¼, 8¾, 8¾, 9, 9, 9½, 9½) in / 21 (21, 22, 22, 23, 23, 24, 24) cm.

**NOTE** Measure from middle of lace pattern on shoulder and vertically down to edge of back – do not measure in the short-row section. Set back sts aside while you work front.

#### **RIGHT FRONT**

With larger size circular, pick up and knit 21 (23, 25, 29, 33, 37, 41, 45) sts along front of shoulder (skip every other st). Place held 20 (20, 21, 21, 22, 22, 23, 23) sts on smaller size needle and knit with larger size needle = 41 (43, 46, 50, 55, 59, 64, 68) sts. With larger size circular, work back and forth in stockinette until front measures 8¼ (8¼, 8¾, 8¾, 9, 9, 9½, 9½) in / 21 (21, 22, 22, 23, 23, 24, 24) cm as for back.

**NOTE** Measure from middle of lace pattern on shoulder. Set right front aside while you work left front.

#### **LEFT FRONT**

Place held 20 (20, 21, 21, 22, 22, 23, 23) sts on smaller size needle and knit with larger size needle. Pick up and knit 21 (23, 25, 29, 33, 37, 41, 45) sts along front of shoulder (skip every other st) = 41 (43, 46, 50, 55, 59, 64, 68) sts. With larger size circular, work back and forth in stockinette until front measures 8¼ (8¼, 8¾, 8¾, 9, 9, 9½, 9½) in / 21 (21, 22, 22, 23, 23, 24, 24) cm as for back.

**NOTE** Measure from middle of lace pattern on shoulder.

#### **BODY**

Join all the pieces: place back and both fronts on one circular. Work back and forth in stockinette over left front + back + right front = 169 (177, 189, 205, 225, 241, 261, 277) sts total until body measures 7½ (8¼, 8½, 9¼, 9½, 10¼, 10½, 11¼) in / 19 (21, 21.5, 23.5, 24, 26, 26.5, 28.5) cm (or desired length) from joining of pieces. Change to smaller size circular. Work back and forth: K1 (edge st), \*k1, p1\*; rep \* to \* until 2 sts rem, k2 (last st = edge st). Work knit over knit and purl over purl until ribbing measures 2 (2, 2¼, 2¼, 2¾, 2¾, 2½, 2½) in / 5 (5, 5.5, 5.5, 6, 6, 6.5, 6.5) cm. BO with Italian bind-off method. Cut yarn.

#### **SLEEVES**

With larger size needle, pick up and knit sts around armhole as follows: Begin at base of armhole, pick up and knit 1 st in each row, skipping every 3rd row = 26 (27, 28, 29, 30, 31, 32, 33) sts, place the 11 held sts on smaller size needle and knit them with larger size needle, following chart (**NOTE** The 2 outermost sts at each side of the chart are removed), continue and pick up and knit 26 (27, 28, 29, 30, 31, 32, 33) sts, in rows along other side of armhole, skipping every 3rd row = a total of 63 (65, 67, 69, 71, 73, 75, 77) sts.

Pm for beginning of rnd. Work around in stockinette over the picked-up sts and in lace over the 13 sts at center of sleeve.

Pm on each side of lace pattern sts. Continue as est until sleeve measures 4 (4¼, 4¼, 4¾, 4¾, 5¼, 5¼, 5½) in / 10 (11, 11, 12, 12, 13, 13, 14) cm. On next rnd, decrease on underarm as follows: K1, k2tog, work as est until 3 sts rem, sl 1, k1, pssso, k1. Rep the decrease rnd every 12th rnd until sleeve measures 15½ (15¾, 15¾, 16¼, 16¼, 16½, 16½, 17) in / 39 (40, 40, 41, 41, 42, 42, 43) cm (measure from picked-up sts on armhole).

Change to smaller size dpn. Work 1 rnd, decreasing evenly spaced around to 42 (44, 46, 46, 48, 48, 50, 50) sts. Work around in k1, p1 ribbing until ribbing measures 2 (2, 2¼, 2¼, 2¾, 2¾, 2½, 2½) in / 5 (5, 5.5, 5.5, 6, 6, 6.5, 6.5) cm. BO with Italian bind-off method. Cut yarn.

Make the second sleeve the same way.

### LEFT FRONT BAND (without buttonholes)

With smaller size circular, pick up and knit 3 sts for every 4 rows for a total of 85 (91, 97, 103, 109, 115, 121, 127) sts along left front edge. Work 7 rows k1, p1 ribbing. BO with Italian bind-off method.

### RIGHT FRONT BAND (with buttonholes)

With smaller size circular, pick up and knit 3 sts for every 4 rows for a total of 85 (91, 97, 103, 109, 115, 121, 127) sts along left front edge. Work 7 rows k1, p1 ribbing, but, make buttonholes on Row 4 (see below).

**Knitting Tip:** If 2 sts to be joined are in the sequence k1, p1, work the buttonhole as follows: Sl 1, p1, pss0, yo. If 2 sts to be joined are in the sequence p1, k1, work the buttonhole as follows: K2tog, yo.

Work 4 (4, 5, 5, 5, 5, 5) sts in ribbing, \*k2tog, yo, work 13 (14, 15, 16, 14, 15, 16, 17) sts in ribbing\*; rep \* to \* 5 (5, 5, 5, 6, 6, 6) times; end with k2tog, yo, 4 (5, 5, 6, 6, 6, 6) sts ribbing.

BO with Italian bind-off method.

### FINISHING

Weave in all ends neatly on WS. Sew buttons on right front band, matching buttonholes.

Soak cardigan in lukewarm water. Gently squeeze out excess water (roll in towel), pat out to finished measurements, lay flat, and leave until dry.

A ≈ 34¼ (36, 38¼, 41¼, 44½, 48½, 52½, 55½) in / 87 (91, 97, 105, 113, 123, 133, 141) cm

B ≈ 17¾ (18½, 19¼, 20½, 21, 21¾, 22½, 23¼) in / 45 (47, 49, 51, 53, 55, 57, 59) cm

C ≈ 8¼ (8¼, 8¾, 8¾, 9, 9, 9½, 9½) in / 21 (21, 22, 22, 23, 23, 24, 24) cm

D ≈ 9½ (10¼, 10¾, 11½, 11¾, 12¾, 13, 13¾) in / 24 (26, 27, 29, 30, 32, 33, 35) cm

**GAUGE** Approx. 20 sts x 30 rnds in stockinette on larger size needles = 4 x 4 in / 10 x 10 cm. Adjust needle sizes to obtain correct gauge if necessary.

### STITCHES AND TECHNIQUES

The cast-ons and bind-offs for this sweater are worked with Italian cast-on and bind-off for ribbing. However, you can use regular long-tail cast-on and bind-off methods if you prefer.

The sleeves are worked on a long circular needle with the magic loop method.

**Raglan Shaping:** Knit until 1 st before marked st, Slip the next 2 sts as if to knit together, k1, pass the slipped sts over = 2 sts decreased with the center st "on top."

**M1R = make 1 right:** With left needle, lift strand between 2 sts from back to front and knit into front loop = right-leaning increase.

**M1L = make 1 left:** With left needle, lift strand between 2 sts from front to back and knit into back loop = left-leaning increase.

### BODY

With smaller size circular and Italian cast-on method, CO 194 (208, 222, 238, 252, 266, 282, 296) sts. Join, being careful not to twist cast-on row. Pm for beginning of rnd and at side (make sure both sides have the same number of sts). Work around in k1, p1 ribbing until ribbing measures 2¼, (2¼, 2¾, 2¾, 2¾, 2½, 2½, 2½) in / 5.5 (5.5, 6, 6, 6, 6.5, 6.5, 6.5) cm.

Change to larger size circular and stockinette. Work around in stockinette, straight up, until body measures 16¼ (16½, 17, 17¼, 17¾, 18¼, 18½, 19) in / 41 (42, 43, 44, 45, 46, 47, 48) cm. Do not knit the last 6 (6, 6, 6, 7, 7, 7) sts of last rnd.

*Shape underarms:* BO the last 6 (6, 6, 6, 7, 7, 7) sts on previous rnd + the first 6 (6, 6, 6, 7, 7, 7) sts of next rnd = a total of 12 (12, 12, 12, 14, 14, 14) sts bound off for underarm. Knit until 6 (6, 6, 6, 7, 7, 7) sts before side marker, BO the next 12 (12, 12, 12, 14, 14, 14) sts and knit to end of rnd. Do not cut yarn; set body aside while you knit sleeves.

### SLEEVES

With smaller size circular and Italian cast-on method, CO 50 (50, 52, 52, 54, 54, 56, 56) sts. Join and pm for beginning of rnd Work around in k1, p1 ribbing until ribbing measures 2¼, (2¼, 2¾, 2¾, 2¾, 2½, 2½, 2½) in / 5.5 (5.5, 6, 6, 6, 6.5, 6.5, 6.5) cm.

Change to larger size circular and stockinette. Knit 1 rnd, increasing 8 sts (all sizes) evenly spaced around = 58 (58, 60, 60, 62, 62, 64, 64) sts. Begin shaping sleeve: K1, M1L (see Stitches and Techniques above), knit until 1 st rem on rnd, M1R, k1. Increase the same way every 6th (6th, 6th, 6th, 8th, 8th, 8th, 8th) rnd until stitch count is 66 (70, 74, 78, 82, 86, 90, 94) sts. Continue without further increasing until sleeve is 18¼ (18½, 19, 19¼, 19½, 19¾, 20, 20½) in / 46 (47, 48, 49, 49.5, 50.5, 51, 52) cm long. Do not knit the last 6 (6, 6, 6, 7, 7, 7) sts of last rnd.

*Shape underarms:* BO the last 6 (6, 6, 6, 7, 7, 7) sts on previous rnd + the first 6 (6, 6, 6, 7, 7, 7) sts of next rnd = a total of 12 (12, 12, 12, 14, 14, 14) sts bound off for underarm.

Set sleeve aside while you knit second sleeve the same way.

## YOKE

Arrange all the pieces on larger size circular, matching underarms. Begin body where yarn is hanging: right sleeve, back, left sleeve, and front = 278 (300, 322, 346, 360, 382, 406, 428) sts. Knit 1 rnd with k2tog at each intersection of body and sleeve (= raglan seams) = 4 sts decreased on rnd = 274 (296, 318, 342, 356, 378, 402, 424) sts rem. Pm at each raglan seam.

**NOTE** The rnd now begins and ends at right side of front.

Pm at center of front. Knit 2 (2, 3, 3, 4, 4, 5, 5) rnds but do not knit last st on last rnd. On next rnd, begin raglan shaping as follows: Work decreases at each raglan marker (see Stitches and Techniques above). Decrease on every other rnd. On rnd after the 3rd (3rd, 4th, 4th, 5th, 5th) raglan decrease rnd, begin shaping neck as follows: knit across right sleeve, back, left sleeve, and front to neck: BO center 26 (28, 30, 32, 34, 36, 38, 40) sts = 13 (14, 15, 16, 17, 18, 19, 20) sts on each side of center marker. Stop after last st is bound off.

Now the yoke begins at a new point and is worked back and forth in stockinette (= knit on RS and purl on WS).

Continue raglan decreases on every other row at the four marked raglan seams another 21 (22, 22, 23, 24, 22, 23, 24) times or until you've worked a total of 24 (25, 26, 27, 28, 28, 29) raglan decrease rows.

On the third row on RS, begin decreasing at each side of neck as follows: K1, sl 1, k1, pss0, knit with raglan shaping as est until 3 sts rem, k2tog, k1. Decrease the same way at neck edges on every 4th row until all the raglan shaping is complete.

After completing last raglan decrease on front and sleeves, on following 2 rows BO 3 (3, 4, 4, 5, 6, 6) sts at each side and, *at the same time*, work raglan decreases on back. On next 2 rows, BO 6 (6, 7, 7, 8, 8, 9, 9) sts at each side and work raglan decreases on back. Leave sts to rest on needle; cut yarn.

## SHAWL COLLAR

With smaller size circular, pick up and knit sts around neck as follows: make a backwards loop and place on needle (= 1st st of shawl collar). Beginning at right side corner of front neck, pick up and knit 155 (161, 167, 173, 179, 185, 191, 197) sts around neck: pick up approx. 1 st in every row along diagonal edge, 1 st for each bound-off st over one shoulder, knit across held sts of back neck, 1 st for each bound-off st over second shoulder, 1 st in every row along diagonal edge, and last st picked up 1 row under bound-off st at center front, CO 1 more st = 157 (163, 169, 175, 181, 187, 193, 199) sts.

Continue back and forth in k1, p1 ribbing until shawl collar measures 5¼ (5½, 6, 6¼, 6¾, 7, 7½, 8) in / 13 (14, 15, 16, 17, 18, 19, 20) cm from row of pick-up sts. BO with Italian bind-off method.

## FINISHING

Weave in all ends neatly on WS. Seam underarms. Sew down left part of shawl collar along bottom of neckline. Lay right part of collar over left and sew down. Wash sweater carefully by hand or in machine on wool/gentle program. Lay flat until completely dry.



### ALTERNATE YARN SUGGESTION FOR FIN MOHAIR SILKE

**GAUGE** Approx. 19 sts x 28 rows in stockinette with two yarns held together = 4 x 4 in / 10 x 10 cm. Adjust needle sizes to obtain correct gauge if necessary.

### STITCHES AND TECHNIQUES

The cast-on and bind-off for all ribbing is worked with the Italian cast-on and bind-off methods, but you can use long-tail cast-on and a regular bind-off if you prefer.

**Raglan Shaping:** Knit until 1 st before marked stitch. Slip the next 2 stitches as if to knit together, knit 1, pass slipped stitches over = 2 stitches decreased with the middle stitch on top (centered double decrease).

**M1R = make 1 right:** With left needle, lift strand between 2 sts from back to front and knit into front loop = right-leaning increase.

**M1L = make 1 left:** With left needle, lift strand between 2 sts from front to back and knit into back loop = left-leaning increase.

### BODY

With smaller size circular and both yarns held together, using Italian method, CO 160 (170, 182, 196, 210, 226, 244, 262) sts. Work back and forth in k1, p1 ribbing until piece measures 2 (2¼, 2¾, 2¾, 2½, 2½, 2¾, 2¾) in / 5 (5.5, 6, 6, 6.5, 6.5, 7, 7) cm.

Change to larger size circular and stockinette. Work straight up in stockinette until body measures 10¼ (10¾, 11, 11½, 11¾, 12¼, 12¾, 13) in / 26 (27, 28, 29, 30, 31, 32, 33) cm, ending with a RS row. On next, WS, row, shape armholes as follows: P35 (37, 40, 44, 47, 51, 56, 60), BO 8 sts (on all sizes), p74 (80, 86, 92, 100, 108, 116, 126) after bound-off sts, BO 8 sts (on all sizes), p35 (37, 40, 44, 47, 51, 56, 60). Set body aside while you knit sleeves.

### SLEEVES

With smaller size dpn and both yarns held together, using Italian method, CO 42 (44, 44, 46, 46, 48, 48, 50) sts. Divide sts onto dpn and join. Work around in k1, p1 ribbing until piece measures 2 (2¼, 2¾, 2¾, 2½, 2½, 2¾, 2¾) in / 5 (5.5, 6, 6, 6.5, 6.5, 7, 7) cm.

Change to larger size dpn and stockinette. On first rnd increase 10 sts evenly spaced around (all sizes) = 52 (54, 54, 56, 56, 58, 58, 60) sts.

Pm for beginning of rnd. On Rnd 8, begin shaping sleeve as follows: K1, M1L (see Stitches and Techniques above), knit until 1 st rem, M1R, k1.

Increase the same way on every 8th rnd until sleeve has 60 (64, 68, 72, 76, 80, 84, 88) sts. Continue without further shaping until sleeve is 17 (17¼, 17¼, 17¼, 17¾, 17¾, 17¾, 17¾) in / 43 (44, 44, 44, 45, 45, 45, 45) cm long. BO 8 sts (= last 4 sts of rnd + first 4 sts of next rnd), knit to end of rnd.

Set first sleeve aside while you knit second sleeve the same way.

## YOKE

Arrange all pieces on larger size circular: right front, right sleeve, back, left sleeve, and left front = 248 (266, 286, 308, 330, 354, 380, 406) sts. Purl 1 row on WS. On next row (RS): K2tog at each intersection of body and sleeve = 4 sts decreased = 244 (262, 282, 304, 326, 350, 376, 402) sts rem. Pm at each intersection of body and sleeve for raglan seams. Purl 1 row.

On next row (RS), begin shaping yoke (see Stitches and Techniques) and, *at the same time*, begin shaping puff sleeves. Before you begin knitting, read through the next section.

## SHAPING PUFF SLEEVES

Place 4 markers on each sleeve by counting out from each side of sleeve to center of sleeve. Pm on needle after the 10th (11th, 12th, 13th, 14th, 15th, 16th, 17th) st and another after the 20th (22nd, 24th, 26th, 28th, 30th, 32nd, 34th) st. Place another 2 markers, counting out as above from second raglan seam and in to center of sleeve. Before markers on right side of sleeve, increase with right-leaning increase (M1R) and after markers on left side of sleeve, increase with left-leaning increase (M1L) – see Stitches and Techniques.

The puff sleeve increases begin at the same time as the raglan decreases and are repeated first on every 4th row 6 times (all sizes) and then on every other row until the yoke is finished.

## RAGLAN DECREASES

*At the same time* as increasing for puff sleeves, work raglan decreases as follows: Knit until 1 st before raglan seam marker, decrease as explained in Stitches and Techniques. Decrease the same way at all 4 raglan markers. Rep the decrease row on every other row 20 (21, 2, 23, 24, 25, 26, 27) times. After the last raglan decrease on right sleeve (WS), do not work the last 18 (19, 20, 21, 22, 23, 24, 25) sts before last raglan seam on right side.

Now raise back neck with short rows. Slip next st purlwise wyf.

Turn work. Sl 1st st to right needle without working it and wrap yarn around base of st. Knit, increase on sleeves and decrease for raglan seams, work until 18 (19, 20, 21, 22, 23, 24, 25) sts before last raglan seam on left side. Slip next st purlwise wyf.

Turn work. Sl 1st st to right needle without working it and wrap yarn around base of st. Purl, until 18 (19, 20, 21, 22, 23, 24, 25) sts before previous turn on left side. Slip next st purlwise wyf.

Turn work. Sl 1st st to right needle without working it and wrap yarn around base of st. Knit, increase on sleeves and decrease for raglan seams, work until 18 (19, 20, 21, 22, 23, 24, 25) sts before previous turn on left side. Slip next st purlwise wyf.

Turn work. Sl 1st st to right needle without working it and wrap yarn around base of st. Purl, until 18 (19, 20, 21, 22, 23, 24, 25) sts before previous turn on right side. Slip next st purlwise wyf.

Turn work. Sl 1st st to right needle without working it and wrap yarn around base of st. Knit, increase on sleeves and decrease for raglan seams, work until 18 (19, 20, 21, 22, 23, 24, 25) sts before previous turn on left side. Slip next st purlwise wyf.

Turn work. Sl 1st st to right needle without working it and wrap yarn around base of st. Purl all the way to right front edge, joining wrap on each turned st with its st as you come to them: Lift up wrap around st and place it on needle behind st, purl st and wrap tog = 1 st.

## NECKBAND

Change to smaller size circular.

Before you begin knitting, read through the next section as several steps occur at the same time on the first row.

Ribbing: K1 (= edge st), \*k1, p1\*; rep \* to \* and end with k2 (the last st is an edge st).

*At the same time*, join sleeve sts to form puff. Work ribbing to and including first raglan seam. On right sleeve, join sts in groups of 4 in ribbing (tug on each st a bit) up to second raglan seam (the rem sts before second raglan seam are joined if there is more than 1 st). Work st of second raglan seam in ribbing. Continue in ribbing over back to and including third raglan seam. *At the same time*, join the two center sts on back so there will be an uneven number of sts on the back. On the third raglan seam, work same st (knit or purl) as on second raglan seam – make sure that both places match. On the left sleeve, work the first sts as when the right sleeve ended and then join sts 4 and 4 in ribbing. Join each wrap with its st. Work first raglan seam in ribbing and finish row in ribbing, ending with k2. Now work 8 rows in ribbing (all sizes). BO with either Italian or regular bind-off method.

## FINISHING

### Left Front Band:

With smaller size needle, pick up and knit 125 (131,137, 143, 149, 155, 161, 167) sts along left front edge, with approx. 1 st in each row. Work 7 rows in k1, p1 ribbing. BO with either Italian or regular bind-off method.

### Right Front Band:

With smaller size needle, pick up and knit 125 (131,137, 143, 149, 155, 161, 167) sts along right front edge, with approx. 1 st in each row. Work 7 rows in k1, p1 ribbing, **but**, on Row 4, make buttonholes.

**Knitting Tip:** If 2 sts to be joined for a buttonhole are sequenced k1, p1, work buttonhole as follows: Sl 1 knitwise, p1, pssso, yo. If 2 sts to be joined for a buttonhole are sequenced p1, k1, work buttonhole as follows: k2tog, yo.

Work 4 sts in ribbing, \*k2tog, yo, work 17 (18, 19, 20, 21, 22, 23, 24) in ribbing\*; rep \* to \* 6 times, k2tog, yo and end with 5 sts in ribbing.

Seam underarms.

Weave in all ends neatly on WS.

Sew buttons on left front band, matching buttonholes on right band.

Dampen sweater carefully, pat out to finished measurements, and leave flat until completely dry.



### NEEDLES

U. S. size 2.5 / 3 mm: 24 in / 60 mm circular + set of 5 dpn;

U. S. size 6 / 4 mm: 32 in / 80 mm circular + set of 5 dpn

### LEVEL OF DIFFICULTY \*

**Matching Cardigan:** 92707

### STITCHES AND TECHNIQUES

The cast-on and bind-off for all ribbing is worked with the Italian cast-on and bind-off methods, but you can use long-tail cast-on and a regular bind-off if you prefer.

**Raglan Shaping:** Knit until 1 st before marked stitch. Slip the next 2 stitches as if to knit together, knit 1, pass slipped stitch over = 2 stitches decreased with the middle stitch on top (centered double decrease).

### BODY

With smaller size circular and both yarns held together, using Italian method, CO 180 (190, 200, 210, 230, 250, 270, 290) sts. Join, being careful not to twist cast-on row; pm for beginning of rnd and at side. Work around in k1, p1 ribbing until piece measures 2 (2¼, 2¾, 2¾, 2½, 2½, 2¾, 2¾) in / 5 (5.5, 6, 6, 6.5, 6.5, 7, 7) cm.

Change to larger size long circular and stockinette. On first rnd, decrease 18 (20, 20, 20, 20, 22, 24, 24) sts evenly spaced around = 162 (170, 180, 190, 210, 228, 246, 266) sts rem.

Work straight up in stockinette until body measures 10¼ (10¾, 11, 11½, 11¾, 12¼, 12¾, 13) in / 26 (27, 28, 29, 30, 31, 32, 33) cm. Do not work last 4 sts of last rnd.

On next rnd, shape armholes: BO 8 sts at each side as follows: BO the last 4 sts of rnd + first 4 sts of next rnd, BO 4 sts before and 4 sts after side marker, knit to end of rnd. Set body aside while you knit sleeves.

### SLEEVES

With smaller size dpn and both yarns held together, using Italian method, CO 60 (64, 68, 72, 76, 80, 84, 88) sts. Divide sts onto dpn and join. Work around in k1, p1 ribbing until piece measures 2 (2¼, 2¾, 2¾, 2½, 2½, 2¾, 2¾) in / 5 (5.5, 6, 6, 6.5, 6.5, 7, 7) cm.

Change to larger size dpn and stockinette. On first rnd increase 8 sts evenly spaced around (all sizes) = 68 (72, 76, 80, 84, 88, 92, 96) sts. Pm for beginning of rnd. Knit around in stockinette for ¾ (¾, 1¼, 1¼, 1½, 1½, 2, 2) in / 2 (2, 3, 3, 4, 4, 5, 5) cm.

Do not work last 4 sts of last rnd. On next rnd, BO the last 4 sts of previous rnd + first 4 sts of next rnd for underarm

Set first sleeve aside while you knit second sleeve the same way.

## YOKE

Arrange all pieces on larger size circular: left sleeve, front, right sleeve, and back = 266 (282, 300, 318, 346, 372, 398, 426) sts. Knit 1 rnd. On next row (RS): k2tog at each intersection of body and sleeve = 4 sts decreased = 262 (278, 296, 314, 342, 368, 394, 422) sts rem. Pm at each intersection of body and sleeve for raglan seams. The rnd begins 1 st before marker on back at left sleeve. On next rnd, begin shaping yoke (see Stitches and Techniques) at each raglan marker: raglan decrease, knit across left sleeve, raglan decrease, knit across front, raglan decrease, knit across right sleeve, raglan decrease, knit across back. Rep the decrease rnd on every other rnd 20 (21, 22, 23, 25, 27, 29, 31) times = 102 (110, 120, 130, 142, 152, 162, 174) sts rem.

Knit 1 rnd over all sts.

Now raise back neck with short rows. Cut yarn. Slip all sts of back + the first 10 (11, 12, 13, 14, 15, 16, 17) sts of right sleeve to left needle (do not rip out the sts). Begin at outer edge of right sleeve. Work in stockinette, continuing raglan decreases over back and continue over 10 (11, 12, 13, 14, 15, 16, 17) sts of left sleeve. Slip next st purlwise wyf.

Turn work. Sl 1st st to right needle without working it and wrap yarn around base of st. Purl up to 4 (5, 5, 6, 7, 7, 8, 8) sts out on right sleeve. Slip next st purlwise wyf.

Turn work. Sl 1st st to right needle without working it and wrap yarn around base of st. In stockinette, work up to 4 (5, 5, 6, 7, 7, 8, 8) sts out on left sleeve. Slip next st purlwise wyf.

Turn work. Sl 1st st to right needle without working it and wrap yarn around base of st. Purl up to 4 sts before raglan seam on right side (all sizes). Slip next st purlwise wyf.

Turn work. Sl 1st st to right needle without working it and wrap yarn around base of st. Knit to raglan seam on left side.

The short-rows to raise back neck are finished = 94 (102, 112, 122, 134, 144, 154, 166) sts rem.

## NECKBAND

Change to smaller size circular. Knit 1 rnd, decreasing 0 (4, 8, 12, 16, 20, 26, 34) sts evenly spaced around = 94 (98, 104, 110, 118, 124, 128, 132) sts rem. *At the same time*, join each wrap to its st. Continue in k1, p1 ribbing for 7 (7, 8, 8, 9, 9, 10, 10) rnds.

BO with either Italian or regular bind-off method.

## FINISHING

Seam underarms.

Weave in all ends neatly on WS.

Dampen sweater carefully, pat out to finished measurements, and leave flat until completely dry.



Järbo 2 tr ull (2-Ply Wool) (100% wool, 328 yd/300 m / 100 g)

Elise (60% cotton, 40% acrylic, 184 yd/170 m / 50 g)

Junior (70% acrylic, 30% nylon, 183 yd/168 m / 50 g)

Ístex Kambgarn (100% Merino wool, 163 yd/150 m / 50 g)

**GAUGE** Approx. 23 sts x 31 rnds in stockinette on U. S. 4 / 3.5 mm needles = 4 x 4 in / 10 x 10 cm. Adjust needle size to obtain correct gauge if necessary.

### IMPORTANT NOTE

The texture pattern draws the cowl in, but, after a careful wool-washing, the cowl can be gently pulled out and shaped to the given measurements.

### STITCHES AND TECHNIQUES

**Sl 1 wyb:** Slip 1 (or specified number of sts) st with yarn held in back of work. Make sure that you don't pull the working yarn tightly.

#### Texture Pattern

**Rnds 1, 2, and 3:** \*Sl 3 wyb, k3\*; rep \* to \* around.

**Rnds 4, 5, and 6:** Knit.

**Rnd 7:** K1, \*With left needle, catch the 3 horizontal strands behind the 3 slipped sts, knit strands tog with next st, k5\*; rep \* to \* around until 5 sts rem, end: catch the strands behind the 3 slipped sts, knit strands tog with next st, k4.

**Rnd 8:** Knit.

**Rnds 9, 10, and 11:** \* K3, sl 3 wyb, \*; rep \* to \* around.

**Rnds 12, 13, and 14:** Knit.

**Rnd 15:** K4, \*With left needle, catch the 3 horizontal strands behind the 3 slipped sts, knit strands tog with next st, k5\*; rep \* to \* around until 2 sts rem, end: catch the strands behind the 3 slipped sts, knit strands tog with next st, k1.

**Rnd 16:** Knit.

Rep Rnds 1-16.

### COWL

With smaller size circular, CO 300 sts. Join, being careful not to twist cast-on row; pm for beginning of rnd. Knit 5 rnds in stockinette and then purl 1 rnd for foldline. Knit 5 rnds. On next rnd, fold on purl foldline and work each st tog with the corresponding st on cast-on row = 300 sts.

Change to larger size circular. Work around in Texture pattern (see above) until cowl measures approx. 17¾ in / 45 cm; end on Rnd 8.

Change to smaller size circular. Knit 6 rnds, purl 1 rnd (foldline) and knit 5 rnds. BO rather loosely.

### FINISHING

Fold top edge at purl foldline and stitch down on WS. Make sure that stitching is neither too tight nor too loose.

Weave in all ends as neatly and invisibly as possible. Hand-wash cowl gently or wash on wool/gentle program in washing machine. Pat out to given measurements and lay flat to dry.

**Rnds 4, 5, and 6:** Knit.

**Rnd 7:** K1, \*With left needle, catch the 3 horizontal strands behind the 3 slipped sts, knit strands tog with next st, k5\*; rep \* to \* around until 5 sts rem, end: catch the strands behind the 3 slipped sts, knit strands tog with next st, k4.

**Rnd 8:** Knit.

**Rnds 9, 10, and 11:** \* K3, sl 3 wyb\*; rep \* to \* around.

**Rnds 12, 13, and 14:** Knit.

**Rnd 15:** K4, \*With left needle, catch the 3 horizontal strands behind the 3 slipped sts, knit strands tog with next st, k5\*; rep \* to \* around until 2 sts rem, end: catch the strands behind the 3 slipped sts, knit strands tog with next st, k1.

**Rnd 16:** Knit.

Rep Rnds 1-16.

### CAP

With smaller size circular for magic loop, CO 140 (150, 160, 170, 180, 180) sts. Join, being careful not to twist cast-on row; pm for beginning of rnd. Work around in stockinette until turned brim measures 8 (8¼, 8¾, 8¾, 9, 9) in / 20 (21, 22, 22, 23, 23) cm. On next rnd, fold brim double and work each st tog with the corresponding st on cast-on row.

Change to larger size circular. Knit 1 rnd, decreasing 20 (24, 28, 32, 36, 30) sts evenly spaced around = 120 (126, 132, 138, 144, 150) sts rem.

Work around in Texture pattern (see above), repeating the 16 rnds a total of 6 (6, 7, 7, 8, 8) times. On next rnd, decrease by working (k3tog, p3tog) round = 40 (42, 44, 46, 48, 50) sts rem.

Work 1 rnd k1, p1 ribbing, dividing sts onto 4 larger size dpn. Work in k1, p1 ribbing for another 5 (6, 6, 7, 7, 8) rnds. On next rnd, p2tog around = 20 (21, 22, 23, 24, 25) sts rem.

Cut yarn and draw end through rem sts; tighten.

## **FINISHING**

Weave in all ends as neatly and invisibly as possible. Hand-wash cap gently or wash on wool/gentle program in washing machine. Pat out to given measurements and lay flat to dry.

### STITCHES AND TECHNIQUES

The cast-on and bind-off for all ribbing is worked with the Italian cast-on and bind-off methods, but you can use long-tail cast-on and a regular bind-off if you prefer.

**M1R = make 1 right:** With left needle, lift strand between 2 sts from back to front and knit into front loop = right-leaning increase.

**M1L = make 1 left:** With left needle, lift strand between 2 sts from front to back and knit into back loop = left-leaning increase.

**Raglan Shaping:** Knit until 1 st before marked stitch. Slip the next 2 stitches as if to knit together, knit 1, pass slipped stitch over = 2 stitches decreased with the middle stitch on top (centered double decrease).

### SKIRT AND BODY

With smaller size circular and both yarns held together, using long-tail or Italian method, CO 304 (326, 352, 378, 408, 434, 484, 522) sts. Join, being careful not to twist cast-on row; pm for beginning of rnd and at side. Work around in k1, p1 ribbing for 3 (3⅞, 3¼, 3½, 3¾, 4, 4⅞, 4¼) in / 7.5 (8, 8.5, 9, 9.5, 10, 10.5, 11) cm.

Change to larger size circular and stockinette. On first rnd, decrease 99 (111, 121, 131, 139, 149, 159, 171) sts evenly spaced around = 205 (215, 231, 247, 269, 285, 325, 351) sts rem.

Continue straight up in stockinette until skirt measures 20½ (21¼, 22, 22½, 22¾, 23¼, 23¾, 24) in / 52 (54, 56, 57, 58, 59, 60, 61) cm.

Knit 1 rnd, decreasing 41 (43, 47, 51, 57, 61, 71, 77) sts evenly spaced as described below and, *at the same time*, pm for lace pattern (**NOTE** the beginning of rnd will shift): pm, k41 (sts for lace), pm, decrease over rem 164 (174, 190, 206, 228, 244, 284, 310) sts as follows:

**XS:** \*K2tog, k2\*; rep \* to \* over rem sts = 164 sts.

**S:** \*K2tog, k2\*; rep \* to \* until 2 sts rem, k2 = 172 sts.

**M:** \*K2tog, k2\*; rep \* to \* until 2 sts rem, k2 = 184 sts.

**L:** \*K2tog, k2\*; rep \* to \* until 2 sts rem, k2 = 196 sts.

**XL:** \*K2tog, k2\*; rep \* to \* over rem sts = 212 sts.

**2XL:** \*K2tog, k2\*; rep \* to \* over rem sts = 224 sts.

**3XL:** \*K2tog, k2\*; rep \* to \* over rem sts = 254 sts.

**4XL:** \*K2tog, k2\*; rep \* to \* until 2 sts rem, k2 = 274 sts.

Cut yarn.

Slip last-worked 21 (23, 26, 29, 33, 36, 43, 48) sts to left needle (do not rip out sts). Pm = side seam and new beginning of rnd.

K21 (23, 26, 29, 33, 36, 43, 48) to first marker, work lace pattern following chart over next 41 sts (all sizes), k21 (23, 26, 29, 33, 36, 43, 48), pm (= side seam), knit to end of rnd. Continue as est until dress measures 10 (10, 10¼, 10¼, 10½, 10½, 10¾, 10¾) in / 25.5 (25.5, 26, 26, 26.5, 26.5, 27, 27) cm as measured from decrease rnd; do not knit last 4 sts of rnd. On next rnd, BO 8 sts at each side for armholes as follows: BO last 4 sts of rnd + first 4 sts of next rnd, knit until 4 sts before side marker, BO next 8 sts, knit to end of rnd. Set body aside while you knit sleeves.

## SLEEVES

With smaller size dpn and both yarns held together, using long-tail or Italian method, CO 42 (44, 44, 46, 46, 48, 48, 50) sts. Divide sts onto dpn and join. Work around in k1, p1 ribbing for 2 (2¼, 2¾, 2¾, 2½, 2½, 2¾, 2¾) in / 5 (5.5, 6, 6, 6.5, 6.5, 7, 7) cm.

Change to larger size dpn (or long magic loop circular). Work around in stockinette and, on first rnd, increase 10 sts (all sizes) evenly spaced around = 52 (54, 54, 56, 56, 58, 58, 60) sts.

On 6th rnd of stockinette, begin increasing centered on underarm: K1, M1L, knit until 1 st rem, M1R, k1.

Increase the same way on every 6th rnd until there are 68 (72, 76, 80, 84, 88, 92, 96) sts. Continue without further increases until sleeve is 17 (17¼, 17¼, 17¾, 17¾, 17¾, 17¾) in / 43 (44, 44, 44, 45, 45, 45, 45) cm long; do not knit last 4 sts of last rnd.

On next rnd, BO 8 sts for underarm: BO last 4 sts of rnd + first 4 sts of next rnd, knit to end of rnd. Set first sleeve aside while you knit second sleeve the same way.

## YOKE

Arrange all pieces on larger size circular, continuing lace at center front: left sleeve, front, right sleeve, and back = 268 (284, 304, 324, 348, 368, 406, 434) sts.

**Next Rnd:** K2tog at each intersection of body and sleeve = 4 sts decreased = 264 (280, 300, 320, 344, 364, 402, 430) sts rem. Pm at each intersection of body and sleeve for raglan seams. Work 2 (2, 3, 3, 4, 4, 5, 5) rnds, **but**, do not knit last st on last rnd. Rnd now begins here, 1 st before marker at left sleeve.

On next rnd, begin shaping yoke (see Stitches and Techniques) at each raglan marker: raglan decrease, knit across left sleeve, raglan decrease, knit across front, raglan decrease, knit across right sleeve, raglan decrease, knit across back. Rep the decrease rnd on every other rnd 20 (21, 22, 23, 24, 26, 28, 30) times = 104 (112, 124, 136, 152, 156, 178, 190) sts rem.

*At the same time*, when chart has been worked 5 (5, 6, 6, 6, 7, 7, 7) times, move the lace pattern one "step" from raglan seam on front as follows: work in stockinette over the first 10 sts and work lace pattern only over the center 21 sts (all sizes). **NOTE** The chart now shows the lace completely across the width. Continue lace pattern over the center 21 sts. After working last raglan decrease, knit 1 rnd.

## RAISING BACK WITH SHORT ROWS

Cut yarn. Move sts of back and the first 10 (11, 12, 13, 14, 15, 16, 17) sts of right sleeve to left needle (do not rip out sts).

Begin working on right sleeve. Work in stockinette and raglan decreasing on the 2 raglan seams of back, continue to the 10 (11, 12, 13, 14, 15, 16, 17) sts of left sleeve. Slip next st purlwise wyf.

Turn work. Sl 1st st to right needle without working it and wrap yarn around base of st. Purl up to 4 (5, 5, 6, 7, 7, 8, 8) sts out on right sleeve. Slip next st purlwise wyf.

Turn work. Sl 1st st to right needle without working it and wrap yarn around base of st. Knit up to 4 (5, 5, 6, 7, 7, 8, 8) sts out on left sleeve. Slip next st purlwise wyf.

Turn work. Sl 1st st to right needle without working it and wrap yarn around base of st. Purl up to 4 sts before raglan seam on right side (all sizes). Slip next st purlwise wyf.

Turn work. Sl 1st st to right needle without working it and wrap yarn around base of st. Knit to raglan seam on left side.

The short-rows to raise back neck are finished.

## NECKBAND

Change to smaller size circular. Work around in k1, p1 ribbing, and, on first rnd, decrease 0 (2, 6, 8, 20, 16, 30, 34) sts evenly spaced around = 104 (110, 118, 128, 132, 140, 148, 156) sts rem. *At the same time*, join each wrap to its st. Continue in k1, p1 ribbing for a total of 8 (8, 8, 8, 9, 9, 9) rnds.

BO in ribbing with Italian bind-off method.

## FINISHING

Seam underarms.

Weave in all ends neatly on WS.

Dampen sweater carefully, pat out to finished measurements, and leave flat until completely dry.





## Tips & Shortcuts

**To avoid questions:** Before you begin knitting, read through the pattern.

**Stitch count:** Always knit or crochet a gauge swatch as recommended in the pattern. If your stitch count doesn't match the gauge given in the pattern, try again with larger or smaller needles or hook. If your gauge doesn't match that in the pattern, your item will not be the correct size or shape.

**Highlight** the size you will knit or crochet throughout the pattern to make it easier to follow the instructions.

**Charts:** It will be easier to follow a chart if you mark your row with a ruler and magnetic board or sticky note.

**Ease:** The amount of ease included in our garments varies depending on the type and shape of the garment. To determine the right size, we recommend that you first measure your body. Then you can calculate the garment size depending on how much ease you want the garment to have. The schematics for each piece show all the garment measurements.

**Two-color stranded knitting:** When knitting more than 3-4 stitches of the same color, twist the color strands around each other on the wrong side to avoid long strands or "floats" on the back. If the yarns need to be twisted on several rows/rounds, make sure you do not stack the twists in the same place to prevent the yarns from showing through on the right side.

**Yarn alternative:** Please be aware that the gauge (tension), yarn quantity and the shape of the work varies if you use another yarn (even in the same yarn group).

**Tips för hand dyed yarn:** Make sure you have enough yarn to complete your project. The colors may vary from time to time. To get a smooth color mix, you can alternate between two skeins: knit two rows from one and two rows from another skein.
