SCALLOPED SCARF



## Scalloped Scarf

A scarf in garter stitch with a scalloped edge. The fine lace edging is knitted along the way and there is no assembly.

Scalloped Scarf can be knitted in exactly the yarn and size you want, as you are guided during the pattern on how to adjust the measurements. You can choose to knit in one of the suggested materials or simply use them as inspiration and to estimate yarn consumption in your yarn.

Please note that the specified yarn amounts are indicative and it is recommended to weigh your knit along the way as described, to ensure you have enough yarn.

It is knitted from tip to tip. Stitches are cast on and increases are made to form the tip at one end. You can choose to work according to the chart or description. When the tip is shaped, continue according to chart or description with lace pattern on both edges, while increasing in the garter stitch middle piece. When the scarf has reached the full width, continue to the desired length, before decreasing towards the other end.

### Abbreviations:

k - knit

p - purl

sts - stitches

ktbl - knit through back loop

yo - yarn over

k2tog - knit two together

ktblyo - knit through back loop of the yarn over from previous round

SSK - "Slip, Slip, Knit", slip 2sts, one at a time. Transfer both back to the left needle. Knit them together through the back loop.

k3tog - Slip two stitches together knitwise, knit next sts, lift the two slipped sts over the knitted sts.

### Suggestion #1

#### Measurement:

Length: 100cm

Width: 12cm

#### Gauge:

28 stitches at 10cm in garter stitch when washed

#### Suggested needles:

3mm

#### Materials:

- 25g Tibet, Cewec (190m/25g)

### Suggestion #2

#### Measurement:

Length: 115cm

Width: 14cm

#### Gauge:

22 stitches at 10cm in garter stitch when washed

#### Suggested needles:

4mm

#### Materials:

- 50g Cashmere Premium, Lang Yarns (115m/25g)

### Suggestion #3

#### Measurement:

Length: 160cm

Width: 20cm

#### Gauge:

16 stitches at 10cm in garter stitch when washed

#### Suggested needles:


6mm

#### Materials:

- 150g Alpaca 3, Isager (125m/50g)
- 150g Puno, Gepard (110m/50g)

**Pattern**

Cast on 3sts with long tail cast-on. You can choose to work the tip according to the chart or the following description.



- Knit
- Purl - knit on the wrong side
- Yarn over
- ptbl - ktbl on the wrong side

**Description of the first tip**

k3

**2.(w):**  
k3

k, yo, k, yo, k

**4.(w):**  
k, ktblyo, k, ktblyo, k

**5.(r):**  
k2, yo, k, yo, k2

**6.(w):**  
k2, ktblyo, k, ktblyo, k2

**7.(r):**  
k7

**8.(w):**  
k7

**9.(r):**  
k2, yo, k3, yo, k2

**10.(w):**  
k2, ktblyo, k3, ktblyo, k2

**11.(r):**  
k9

**12.(w):**  
k9

**13.(r):**  
k2, yo, k5, yo, k2

**14.(w):**  
k2, ktblyo, k5, ktblyo, k2

**15.(r):**  
k11

**16.(w):**  
k5, place a marker, k, place a marker, k5


There are now 11sts on the needle and you have placed a marker on each side of the center stitch.

The 5sts on each side of the markers will form the starting point of the lace edges. Again you can choose to work according to the chart on next page or the following description.

**Tip**


If you are changing to a new ball of yarn along the way, it is best done at the lace edge, for weaving in the ends discretely.

## Left edge



- Knit
- Purl - knit on the wrong side
- Yarn over
- Increase / Decrease made on this row

## Right edge



- Right leaning decrease - k2tog
- Left leaning decrease - SSK
- ptbl - ktbl on the wrong side

### Lace edges and increases

Work lace edges on both sides of the markers, while increasing two stitches on every 12th row. The increases are made inside the markers with twisted yarn overs. First time on row 7.

- symbolises the markers

#### 1.(r):

k2, yo, k3,  
• knit all sts •  
k3, yo, k2

#### 2.(w):

Knit all sts

#### 3.(r):

k2, yo, k2tog, yo, k2,  
• knit all sts •  
k2, yo, SSK, yo, k2

#### 4.(w):

Knit all sts

#### 5.(r):

k2, yo, k2tog, yo, k2tog, yo, k,  
• knit all sts •  
k, yo, SSK, yo, SSK, yo, k2

#### 6.(w):

Knit all sts

#### 7.(r):

k, SSK, yo, SSK, yo, SSK, k,  
• yo, knit all sts, yo •  
k, k2tog, yo, k2tog, yo, k2tog, k

#### 8.(w):

k7,  
• ktblyo, k until the yo, ktblyo •  
k7

#### 9.(r):

k, SSK, yo, SSK, k2,  
• knit all sts •  
k2, k2tog, yo, k2tog, k

#### 10.(w):

Knit all sts

#### 11.(r):

k, SSK, k3,  
• knit all sts •  
k3, k2tog, k

#### 12.(w):

Knit all sts

There are now again 5sts on each side of the markers and you have increased two stitches inside the markers.

Repeat row 1.-12. until the desired width is reached.

The length of the knitted work will vary, depending on your choice of yarn and gauge. Measure the work.

### Tip

If you have a specific amount of yarn for the project, you can weigh the piece you have just knitted. That way you will know how much yarn you need to have left before you begin decreasing for the other end.

Continue working a straight piece, still working the edges as before, but without increasing inside the markers. The length of the middle piece is calculated like this:

Desired final length minus 2 x the length of you knitted piece.

### Example

Your desired length is 100cm.  
You measure the work to be 30cm.  
The calculation is:

$$100 - (2 \times 30) = 40$$

And you must knit a middle piece of 40cm before you begin decreasing.

### Middle piece

**1.-6.:**  
Work as before

**7.(r):**  
k, SSK, yo, SSK, yo, SSK, k,  
• knit all sts •  
k, k2tog, yo, k2tog, yo, k2tog, k

**8.(w):**  
Knit all sts

**9.-12.:**  
Work as before



### Decreasing

When the middle piece has reached the right length, decreases are made towards the other tip. Continue the 12 row pattern repeat, while decreasing on row 7.

**1.-6.:**  
Work as before

**7.(r):**  
k, SSK, yo, SSK, yo, SSK, k,  
• k2tog, k until 2sts before the marker, SSK •  
k, k2tog, yo, k2tog, yo, k2tog, k

**8.(w):**  
Knit all sts

**9.-12.:**  
Work as before

Repeat row 1.-12. until there are 13sts on the needle (3sts between the markers).

Work the last pattern repeat:

**1.-6.:**  
Work as before

**7.(r):**  
k, SSK, yo, SSK, yo, SSK, k,  
• k3tog •  
k, k2tog, yo, k2tog, yo, k2tog, k

**8.(w):**  
Knit all sts

**9.-12.:**  
Work as before

There are now 11sts on the needle. Remove the markers. Work the last tip, following the chart or description on page 6.
