







SIZES

Finished bust measurements
84.5, 91 (98, 106.5, 113.5) [120, 125, 133.5] 140 cm



RECOMMENDED EASE

between 2 & 10 cm of positive ease




GAUGE

18 sts x 26 r = 10 cm in stockinette stitch in the round
in 4.5mm/US 7 needles
(or another size depending on your gauge)

YARNS

Worsted weight:

CP : about 670, 750 (800, 840, 880) [940, 1050, 1150] 1250 meters
CC1 : 50, 50 (50, 60, 60) [60, 70, 70] 70 meters
CC2 : 20, 25 (25, 30, 30) [40, 40, 40] 40 meters
CC3 : 10, 15 (15, 20, 20) [25, 25, 25] 30 meters



Sample version:

Lettlópi , Istex Lópi
Knit with 5cm of positive ease.

Colorways: Ash Heather (0056), Lapis Blue Heather (1403), Mimosa (1703), White (0051).

NEEDLES

Recommended needles (or another size to get the gauge):
4.5mm/US 7 for body and sleeves
4mm/US 6 for ribbing

NOTIONS

3 stitch markers
Scrap yarn
Tapestry needle



Steam Valley (Lady) is a winter sweater with a very pretty colourwork yoke. The motif begins just after the neckline, and goes down to the armholes. The bottom of the sleeves also has part of the pattern.

The construction is **top-down**: the neckline is cast-on, with a rolled effect, then the yoke is knit with a colourwork motif. The sleeves are put on hold to knit the body. Once the body is done, they are then knitted one by one.

The pattern can be knitted with a main colour and one, two or even three contrasting colours.

A child version of this pattern is also available under the name "**Steam Valley (Little)**", from size 2 to 12 yo and it will be perfect to make matching outfits if you wanted!

ABBREVIATIONS & TECHNIQUES

st(s): stitche(s)

r: row/round

RS: right side

WS: wrong side

CO: cast-on

BO: bind-off

k: knit

p: purl

M: stitch marker

pM: place marker

sM: slip marker

rM: remove marker

BOR: beginning of the row

Increases

- **M1L**: pick up the bar between the stitch you knit and the one you're about to knit, bringing the needle from front to back. Then knit into the back of the stitch.

- **M1R**: pick up the bar between the last stitch you knit and the one you're about to knit, bringing the needle from the back to the front. Then knit into the front of this stitch.

Decreases

- **k2tog**: knit 2 together

- **SSK**: slip slip knit

2x2 ribbing in the round: *k2, p2; repeat from * to the end of the round.

German short rows (GSR): you can follow this

Chart

- **MP**: main colour

- **CC1**: contrasting colour 1

- **CC2**: contrasting colour 2

- **CC3**: contrasting colour 3

- **No stitch** until increases are made

- **M**: increase

Neckline

With the smaller needles and the MC, CO 72, 76 (80, 84, 88) [92, 96, 96] 96sts by using the long-tail cast-on method. Join in the round being careful not to twist the stitches, and put a marker for the beginning of the round (BOR).

Knit 2 rounds of stockinette stitch.

Change for the larger needles.

- (All sizes)

Set-up round 1

Knit 1 round of stockinette while increasing 8sts equally on this round (see page 3).

You now have 80, 84 (88, 92, 96) [100, 104, 104] 104sts on your needles.

Knit 2 rounds of stockinette stitch.

- (Sizes -, - (-, -, -)[- , -, 133.5] 140 cm only)

Set-up round 2

- Size 133.5 cm: *k26, M1L; repeat from * to the end of the round.

- Size 140 cm: *k13, M1L; repeat from * to the end of the round.

You now have -, - (-, -, -)[- , -, 108] 112sts on your needles. Knit 2 rounds of stockinette stitch.

- (All sizes)


Set-up round 3

*k2, M1L; repeat from * to the end of the round.

You now have 120, 126 (132, 138, 144) [150, 156, 162] 168sts on your needles.

Follow the chart for the next 36 rounds. Repeat the 12sts from the chart along the round: you have 20, 21 (22, 23, 24) [25, 26, 27] 28 repeats of the motif.

Once you've done the chart, you now have



240, 252 (264, 276, 288) [300, 313, 324] 336sts on your needles.

Knit 1 round of stockinette and place two stitch markers which will be used for the german short rows, as follows: k120, 126 (132, 138, 144) [150, 156, 162] 168, pM1, k71, 76 (80, 85, 89) [94, 97, 104] 109, pM2, k to the end of the round.

German short rows

- 1) k to 6sts after the M1, turn work and work a German Short Row (see page 3)
- 2) p to 6sts after the M2, turn work and work a German Short Row (see page 3)
- 3) k to 8sts before the last GSR, turn work and work a German Short Row
- 4) p to 8sts before the last GSR, turn work and work a German Short Row
- 5) k to 8sts before the last GSR, turn work and work a German Short Row
- 6) p to 8sts before the last GSR, turn work and work a German Short Row
- 7) k to BOR
- 8) k one more round, picking up double sts and knitting them together as one stitch and remove M1 and M2.

Work even in st st until yoke measures 18.5, 18.5 (19, 19.5, 20.5) [21, 22 23] 23.5 cm long from bottom edge of rolled neckline to the front underarm.

Separate body and sleeves

K71, 76 (80, 85, 89) [94, 97, 104] 109 for the back, put on hold 49, 50 (52, 53, 55) [56, 59, 58] 59sts for the sleeve, CO3, 3 (4, 5, 6) [7, 7, 8] 8sts and pM for new BOR, CO2, 3 (4, 6, 7) [7, 8, 8] 9sts, k71, 76 (80, 85, 89) [94, 97, 104] 109 for the front, put on hold 49, 50 (52, 53, 55) [56, 59, 58] 59sts for the sleeve, CO5, 6 (8, 11, 13) [14, 15, 16] 17sts. Remove the old BOR marker. Knit to the new BOR.

Body

You now have 152, 164 (176, 192, 204) [216, 224, 240] 252sts on your needles for the body. K75, 82 (88, 97, 103) [108, 113, 120] 127sts and pM3, k to the end of the round.

German short rows

- 1) k to 6sts after the BOR, turn work and work a German Short Row (see page 3)
- 2) p to 6sts after the M3, turn work and work a German Short Row (see page 3)
- 3) k to 8sts before the last GSR, turn work and work a German Short Row
- 4) p to 8sts before the last GSR, turn work and work a German Short Row
- 5) k to 8sts before the last GSR, turn work and work a German Short Row
- 6) p to 8sts before the last GSR, turn work and work a German Short Row
- 7) k to BOR
- 8) k one more round, picking up double sts and knitting them together as one stitch and remove M3.

Knit the body in stockinette until you reach 34, 35 (35, 36, 37) [38, 38, 38] 39 cm from the underarm, or 4cm less than desired length.

Change for the smaller needles and knit 3cm of 2x2 ribbing. Knit 4 rounds of stockinette. BO your sts.

Sleeves

You are now going to put back the sts from each sleeve on your needles.

- (Sizes 84.5, 91 (98, 106.5, 113.5) [-, -, -] - cm):

place the 49, 50 (52, 53, 55) [-, -, -] - sts from the sleeve back on your needles.

Starting in the middle of the underarm, pM for BOR, pick-up and knit 2, 3 (4, 5, 6) [-, -, -] - sts, k49, 50 (52, 53, 55) [-, -, -] - sts for the sleeve,



pick-up and knit 3, 3 (4, 6, 7) [-, -, -] - sts.

- (Sizes -, - (-, -, -) [120, 125, 133.5] 140 cm):

place the -, - (-, -, -)[56, 59, 58] 59sts of the sleeve back on your needles.

Starting in the middle of the underarm, pM for BOR, pick-up and k -, - (-, -, -)[7, 7, 8] 8sts, pick up and knit 2 sts in the corner between the CO and the sleeve, k -, - (-, -, -)[56, 59, 58] 59sts from the sleeve, pick up and knit 2 sts in the corner (in the gap between the sleeve sts and armhole sts), pick-up and k -, - (-, -, -) [7, 8, 8] 9sts.

You now have 54, 56 (60, 64, 68) [72, 76, 78] 80sts on your needles.

Knit in stockinette stitch until sleeve measures 3cm from the underarm.

Decrease row : k1, k2tog, k to the last 3sts, ssk, k1 (= 2 decreases).

Repeat this decrease round 8, 9 (8, 9, 11) [11, 13, 11] 12 **more times** every 4, 4 (4, 4, 3) [3, 2.5, 3] 2.5cm.

You now have 36, 36 (42, 44, 44) [48, 48, 54] 54sts on your needles.


Knit until sleeve measures 36.5cm from the underarm.

Starting next row, follow the chart for the next 6 rows.

- (Sizes 84.5, 91 (-, 106.5, 113.5) [120, 125, -] - cm): knit 2 rows of stockinette stitch.

- (Sizes -, - (98 , -, -) [- , -, 133.5] 140 cm): knit 1 row of stockinette stitch and make 2 decreases on this row.

You now have -, - (40, -, -) [- , -, 52] 52sts on your needles. Knit 1 more row of stockinette stitch.



Change for smaller needles and knit 3cm of 2x2 ribbing. Knit 4 rows of stockinette.


Bind-off your stitches loosely. Do the same for the second sleeve.

Finishes

Weave in the ends and block your project to reveal the colourwork and put your jumper to the final measurements.
