Main working stitch is single crochet in the spiral.

Crochet the stem wrong side out.


Work decreases on the stem through back loops only.

Crochet the cap face side out.

- 6 rnd — dec, 6 sc, inc, 5 sc (14)
- 7 rnd — 14 sc (14)
- 8 rnd — dec, 6 sc, inc, 5 sc (14)
- 9 rnd — 14 sc (14)
- 10 rnd — dec, 6 sc, inc, 5 sc (14)
- 11 rnd — 14 sc (14)
- 12 rnd — dec, 6 sc, inc, 5 sc (14)
- 13-16 rnd — 14 sc (14) (pic. 2)
- 17 rnd — (inc, 6 sc) x 2 (16)

Turn work wrong side towards yourself. Work the following round in spike stitch (SPsc) into the stitches of round 16.


- 28 rnd — (1 SPsc, 1 sc, 1 SPsc into the same stitch, 1 sc) x 14 (56) (pic. 4-7, diagram).

Cut yarn and fasten off.

Stuff the stem (pic. 8).

 - 10 rnd — (6 sc, inc) x 6 (48)
 - 11 rnd — (7 sc, inc) x 6 (54)
 - 12 rnd — (26 sc, inc) x 2 (56)


CONNECT THE CAP AND THE STEM

- 13 rnd — sl st, 2 ch, (3 dc into the one stitch) x 55, sl st (pic. 10-14)

Cut yarn, fasten off and hide tails inside the finished cap.

Insert thread into a needle. Pull the thread through the center of the cap to the bottom of the stem. Tighten the thread to fix the cap. Fasten off the thread and hide tail inside the stem (pic. 15-18).

Dilute the acrylic varnish with a small amount of water. Impregnate the edges of the cap with this solution. The form of waves. You can also impregnate the lamellae on the stem. Let the varnish dry (pic. 19-21).

7 rnd — (5 sc, inc) x 6 (42) (pic. 1)

8-13 rnd — 6 rounds 42 sc across (42) (pic. 2)

Use 2 strands off-white + beige (pic. 3)

14 -15 rnd — 42 sc (42)

16 rnd — (19 sc, dec) x 2 (40)

17 rnd — 40 sc (40)

18 rnd — (18 sc, dec) x 2 (38)

19-20 rnd — 38 sc (38)

21 rnd — (17 sc, dec) x 2 (36) (pic. 4)

22-25 rnd — 4 rounds 36 sc across (36)

26 rnd — (16 sc, dec) x 2 (34)

27-29 rnd — 3 rounds 34 sc across (34)

Add some stuffing

37 rnd — (3 sc, dec) x 6 (24)

Stuff and cinch the hole closed (pic. 6).

Hide the yarn tail inside the stem.




- 1 rnd — 6 sc into MR (6)
- 2 rnd — 6 inc (12)
- 3 rnd — (1 sc, inc) x 6 (18)
- 4 rnd — (2 sc, inc) x 6 (24)
- 5 rnd — (3 sc, inc) x 6 (30)
- 6 rnd — (4 sc, inc) x 6 (36)
- 7 rnd — (5 sc, inc) x 6 (42)
- 8 rnd — (6 sc, inc) x 6 (48)
- 9 rnd — (7 sc, inc) x 6 (54)
- 10 rnd — (8 sc, inc) x 6 (60)
- 11 rnd — (9 sc, inc) x 6 (66)
- 12 rnd — (10 sc, inc) x 6 (72)
- 13 rnd — (11 sc, inc) x 6 (78)
- 14 rnd — (12 sc, inc) x 6 (84)
- 15 rnd — (13 sc, inc) x 6 (90) (pic. 13)
- 16 -19 rnd — 90 sc (90) (pic. 14)

ATTACH THE BOTTOM CAP PART TO THE UPPER ONE

20 rnd — single crochet through both pieces (bottom and top). When there are about 10 stitches left unworked, stuff the piece (pic. 15-18). Arrange the stuffing in the cap so, that most of the stuffing is located around the sides. Leave a dent in the center to insert the stem. Finish the round (90) (pic. 19).

Snip off 1 strand.

Go on working using 1 strand.

This is necessary so that the cap wraps inside a little.

21 rnd — (8 sc, dec) x 9 (81) (pic. 20).

Finish your work with a sl st. Cut yarn and fasten off, hide the yarn tail inside the cap.

Insert the stem (pic. 21).

MATERIALS

- YARN
100% mercerized cotton
DMC Pearl Cotton 8 (10g/80m)
 - white or light beige
 - grey
 - dark orange
- Crochet hook 1.5 mm
- Stuffing

7-15 rnds — 9 rounds
32 sc across (32)

16 rnd — (14 sc, dec) x 2 (30)

17-37 rnds — 21 rounds
30 sc across (30) (pic. 2)

38 rnd — (3 sc, dec) x 6 (24)

Stuff the stem (pic. 3).

39 rnd — (2 sc, dec) x 6 (18)

40 rnd — (1 sc, dec) x 6 (12)

41 rnd — 6 dec (6)



18 rnd — single crochet through both pieces (bottom and top). When there are about 10 stitches left unworked, stuff the piece (pic. 12-13). Arrange the stuffing in the cap so, that most of the stuffing is located around the sides. Leave a dent in the center to insert the stem.

Finish the round with a sl st.

Cut yarn and fasten off, hide the yarn tail inside the cap (pic. 14-15).

Insert the stem (pic. 16-17).

Crochet wrong side out.

Use 2 strands white + grey

1 rnd — 6 sc into MR (6)

2 rnd — 6 inc (12)

3 rnd — (1 sc, inc) x 6 (18)

4 rnd — (2 sc, inc) x 6 (24)

5 rnd — (5 sc, inc) x 4 (28)

6-10 rnd — 5 rounds 28 sc across (28)
(pic. 20)

11 rnd — (12 sc, dec) x 2 (26)

12-13 rnd — 26 sc (26)

14 rnd — (11 sc, dec) x 2 (24)

15-22 rnd — 8 rounds 24 sc across (24)
(pic. 21)

Cut yarn and stuff the piece (pic. 22).



CAP

Use 2 strands in dark orange

1 rnd — 6 sc into MR (6)

2 rnd — 6 inc (12)

3 rnd — (1 sc, inc) x 6 (18)

4 rnd — (2 sc, inc) x 6 (24)

5 rnd — (3 sc, inc) x 6 (30)

6 rnd — (4 sc, inc) x 6 (36) (pic. 23)

7-9 rnd — 36 sc (36) (pic. 24)

10 rnd — (4 sc, dec) x 6 (30)

11 rnd — (3 sc, dec) x 6 (24) (pic. 25)

ATTACH THE CAP TO THE STEM

12 rnd — single crochet through both the stem and the cap pieces. Once you have several stitches left unworked, stuff the piece (pic. 26-27).

Finish the round (24) (pic. 28).

13 rnd — 24 sc (24) (pic. 29).

Cut yarn and fasten off, weave in.

- Crochet hook 1.5 mm

- **Stuffing**

SKILL LEVEL: Intermediate

CROCHETING INSTRUCTIONS

The main stitch used is single crochet in the spiral. Crochet the stem wrong side out. Work decreases on the stem through back loops only. Crochet the cap face side out through back loops only.

You can make milkcaps, russulas, tricholoma mushrooms following this pattern. Just use appropriate colors and yarn textures for that.

3 rnd — (1 sc, inc) x 6 (18)

4 rnd — (2 sc, inc) x 6 (24) (pic. 1)

5 - 20 rnd — 24 sc (24) (pic. 2)

21 rnd — (3 sc, inc) x 6 (30)

22 rnd — (4 sc, inc) x 6 (36)

23 rnd — (5 sc, inc) x 6 (42)

24 rnd — (6 sc, inc) x 6 (48)

25 rnd — (7 sc, inc) x 6 (54)

26 rnd — (8 sc, inc) x 6 (60)

27 rnd — (9 sc, inc) x 6 (66)

28 rnd — (10 sc, inc) x 6 (72)



Cut yarn and fasten off (pic. 3).

Go on working with white **YarnArt VIOLET** yarn

29 rnd — work spike stitches into the stitches of round 20: (3 SPsc into each st of round 20) x 24, sl st (pic. 4-10).

Cut yarn and fasten off.

Stuff the stem (pic. 11).

Single crochet in the spiral through back loops only.

Work 6 increases in each round.

- 5 rnd — (3 sc, inc) x 6 (30)

- 8 rnd — (6 sc, inc) x 6 (48)
- 9 rnd — (7 sc, inc) x 6 (54)
- 10 rnd — (8 sc, inc) x 6 (60)

ASSEMBLY

13 rnd — work through both the cap and the stem pieces.

Insert your hook into the back loop of the cap and into both loops of the stem — 72 sc (72) (pic. 13-15)

14 rnd — through back loops only (6 sc, dec) x 9 (63) (pic. 16)



15 rnd — through back loops only (5 sc, dec) x 9 (54) (pic. 17)

Cut yarn and fasten off.

Work the next round with **Alize Softy** yarn

16 rnd — (1 sc, skip 1 st) x 26 (26) (pic. 18-19)

Cut yarn and fasten off. Make sculpting through the center of the cap down to the stem. Fasten off and hide the yarn tail inside the stem (pic. 20-23).



5-18 rnd — 14 rounds 18 sc across (pic. 4)
(You can increase the number of rounds then the stem will be longer)

19 rnd — (2 sc, inc) x 6 (24)

20 rnd — (3 sc, inc) x 6 (30)

21 rnd — (4 sc, inc) x 6 (36)

22 rnd — (5 sc, inc) x 6 (42)

23 rnd — (6 sc, inc) x 6 (48)






dec — decrease

(work two stitches together);

SPsc — spike single crochet (placed one or more rounds below the working round)

x n — repeat n times.

CROCHET INSTRUCTIONS

Work with 2 strands held together.

Main working stitch is single crochet in the spiral.

Crochet the stem wrong side out.

Work decreases on the stem through back loops only.

Crochet the cap face side out.

STEM

Use 2 strands held together **white+beige**

1 rnd — 6 sc into mr (6)

2 rnd — 6 inc (12)

3 rnd — (1 sc, inc) x 6 (18)

4 rnd — (2 sc, inc) x 6 (24)

5 rnd — (3 sc, inc) x 6 (30)

6 rnd — (4 sc, inc) x 6 (36)

7-8 rnd — 36 sc (36) (pic. 1)

9 rnd — through back loops only -
2 t ch, 1 dc into the same stitch,
34 inc in dc, 2 ch (pic. 2-4)

10 rnd — 36 sc through front loops
of round 8 (36) (pic. 5-6)

11 rnd — (4 sc, dec) x 6 (30)

12 rnd — 30 sc (30) (pic. 7)

13 rnd — through back loops only -
2 t ch, 1 dc into the same stitch,
28 inc in dc, 1 dc, 2 ch (pic. 8)

14 rnd — 30 sc through front loops
of round 12 (30) (pic. 9-10)

15 - 17 rnd — 30 sc (30) (pic. 11)

18 rnd — through back loops only -
(1 sc, 1 hdc, 4 inc dc, 1 hdc) x 3, 1 sc.
Work the remaining 8 sc through
both loops (42) (pic. 12-14)

19 rnd — 22 sc through front loops only,
8 sc through both loops

20 rnd — (3 sc, dec) x 6 (24)

21 rnd — 24 sc (24)

22 rnd — (2 sc, dec) x 6 (18) (pic. 15)

Stuff slightly (pic. 16).


23-24 rnd — 18 sc (18)

Cut beige yarn and join white strand (pic. 17).

Use 2 strands held together **white + white**.

25 - 38 rnd — 18 sc (18)

Add some stuffing (pic. 18).



39 rnd — through back loops only —
 1 t ch, 1 dc, 1 tr into the same stitch,
 1 tr, 1 dtr into the same stitch, 1 ttr,
 (2 ttr into one stitch, 1 ttr) x 7,
 2 dtr into one stitch, 2 tr into one stitch,
 3 ch (pic. 19-21)

40 rnd — 18 sc through front loops
 of round 38 (18) (pic. 22- 23)

41-48 rnd — 18 sc (18) (pic. 24)

49 rnd — (1 sc, inc) x 9 (27)

50 rnd — (2 sc, inc) x 9 (36) (pic. 25)

51 rnd — (5 sc, inc) x 6 (42)

52 rnd — (6 sc, inc) x 6 (48)

53 rnd — (7 sc, inc) x 6 (54)

54 rnd — (8 sc, inc) x 6 (60)

55 rnd — (9 sc, inc) x 6 (66)

56 rnd — (10 sc, inc) x 6 (72)

57 rnd — (11 sc, inc) x 6 (78)

58 rnd — (12 sc, inc) x 6 (84)

59 rnd — (13 sc, inc) x 6 (90) (pic. 26)


Turn work wrong side towards yourself.

Work the following round in spike stitch
 (SPsc) into the stitches of round 48.

60 rnd — (1 SPsc, 1 sc, 1 SPsc into the

Cut yarn and fasten off.

Stuff the stem (pic. 33).

 - 6 rnd — (4 sc, inc) x 6 (36)
 - 7 rnd — (5 sc, inc) x 6 (42)
 - 8 rnd — (6 sc, inc) x 6 (48)
- (pic. 34)

red + red

- 9 rnd — (7 sc, inc) x 6 (54)
- 10 rnd — (8 sc, inc) x 6 (60)
- 11 rnd — (9 sc, inc) x 6 (66)
- 12 rnd — (10 sc, inc) x 6 (72)
- 13 rnd — (11 sc, inc) x 6 (78)
- 14 rnd — (12 sc, inc) x 6 (84)
- 15 rnd — (13 sc, inc) x 6 (90)
- 16 rnd — 90 sc (90) (pic. 35)

red + orange

- 17 rnd — 90 sc (pic. 36)

Connect the cap and the stem.

- 18 rnd — 90 sc (90) (pic. 37-38)


Prior to working all the stitches of the current round stuff the piece.

Finish the round (pic. 39-40)

Use **2 orange** strands held together

- 19 rnd — (8 sc, dec) x 9 (81)

Cut yarn, fasten off and hide tails inside the finished cap (pic. 41-42).





SCALES

Insert white thread into a needle.
Embroider white scales in Rococo stitch
(also known as Queen stitch).

ROCOCO STITCH EMBROIDERY

To get a Rococo spiral wind the thread around the end of the needle coming out of the fabric 10-15 times (the more wraps, the better the spiral looks). Then pull the needle through the spiral and enter the stitch base. The shape of the spiral depends on the point you enter: the closer the first point to the second one, the more curved is the spiral. The needle should be thin and long. If it does not go through the wraps, you need to twist it in your fingers - this will loosen the wraps, and the needle will pass easily.



Two types of fly agaric



↑
YarnArt Iris (20g/138m)
2 strands
Hook 1,5 mm

↑
Pehorka Openwork (50g/280m) 1 strand
***Alize Softy** 1 strand
Hook 1 mm

* Use 1 strand of Alize Softy for annulus and scales. Use 1 mm hook.

Crochet round each annulus in sc using **Alize Softy** (you can work sc skipping 1 st, for the yarn is quite thick).

Embroider the scales with Alize Softy as well.
Sew on beads in the end.
