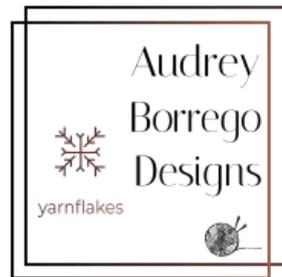


Telesto



Notes

Telesto is a top down garment featuring lace saddle drop shoulders that can be knitted as a summer tee or a full sweater with sleeves. With instructions for an A-line or a straight body with optional bust darts, it is a versatile design with a low V-neck for a flowy silhouette. The pattern provides Charted and written instructions for the lace, as well as a video tutorials for the small bobbles and mock cables. Worked only on the RS with intuitive repeats, it's a fun detail in an otherwise relaxing knit.

Yarn : You will need

Tee :

540 (**580** / 620 / **670** / 725), (**780** / 845 / **905** / 980), (**1060** / 1135 / **1215**) meters
590 (**635** / 680 / **732** / 795), (**855** / 925 / **990** / 1075), (**1160** / 1245 / **1330**) yards

Sweater :

875 (**950** / 1000 / **1075** / 1175), (**1250** / 1360 / **1475** / 1550), (**1680** / 1750 / **1875**) meters
960 (**1040** / 1095 / **1175** / 1285), (**1370** / 1490 / **1615** / 1695), (**1840** / 1915 / **2050**) yards

of fingering or sport weight yarn.

A-line body : add about 30%.

Tee sample is knit with Lana Grossa Linea Pura Solo Lino (120 m – 131 yds / 50 g) in 52.

Sweater sample is knit with Madelaine et Filibert Memoh Sock (400 m – 437 yds / 100 g) in Alicante.

Use a very drapery yarn for the tee version to make sure the shoulders drop properly.

Needles :

Main Fabric : 3.5 mm (US 4) circular needles with appropriate length to knit in the round and magic loop or DPNs.

Ribbing : 3 mm (US 2.5) circular needles with appropriate length to knit in the round and magic loop or DPNs.

or sizes required to get gauge

Gauge :

25 sts x 34 rows / rnds per 10 cm – 4" with larger needles in stockinette after blocking

Note that a different row gauge will affect the upper body fit.

Notions :

Stitch markers including 1 locking, tapestry needle and scissors

Scrap yarn to place sts on hold

Row counter recommended

Techniques used :

Top down saddle drop shoulder garment

German twisted and backwards loop cast-on

Picking up sts

Lace with eyelets, simple decreases, twisted sts

Mock cables and bobbles (video tutorials provided)

Make One Increases

Low V neck shaping

Garter and slipped st armhole edging

A-line shaped or straight body worked in the round

Optional German short-rows bust darts (based on Cup size)

Twisted ribbing hem & V neck band with central double decreases

Purlwise Bind-Off

Pattern includes charted and written instructions

Sizes :

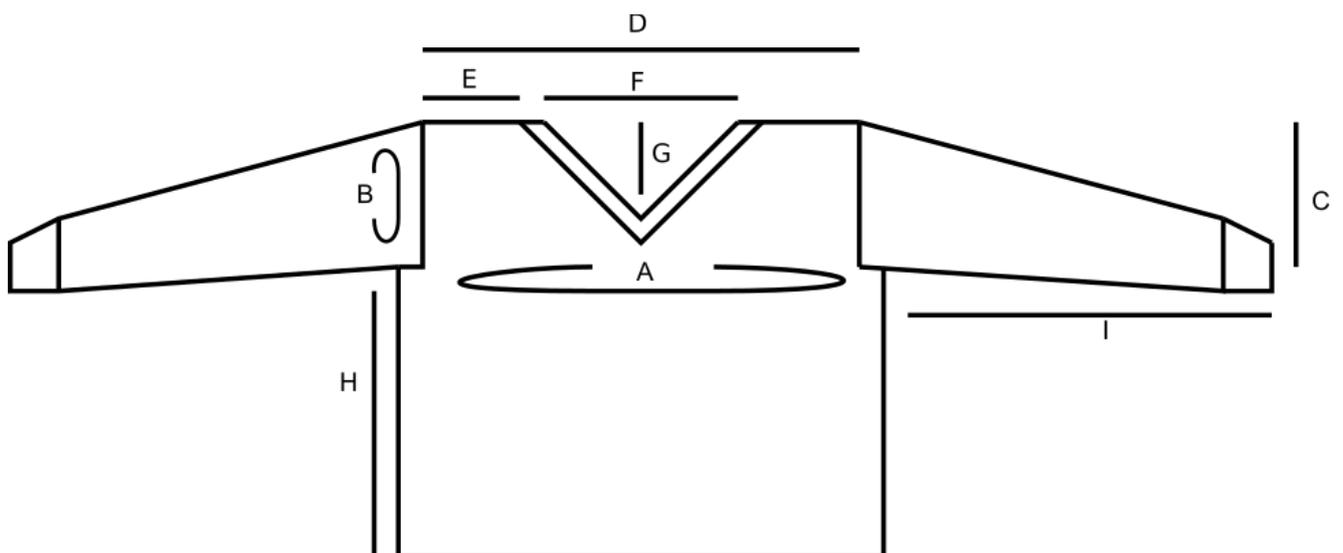
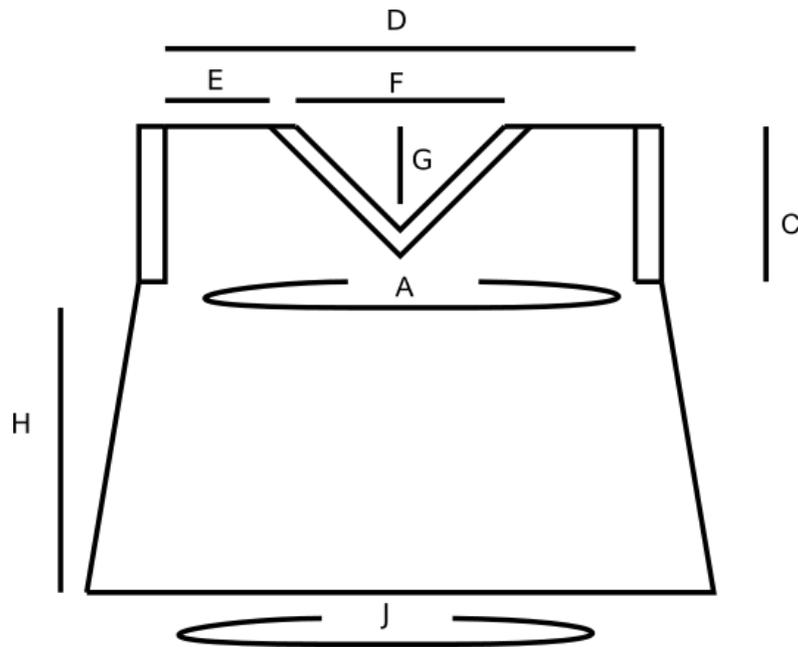
1 (2 / 3 / 4 / 5), (6 / 7 / 8 / 9), (10 / 11 / 12)

All measurements are those of the finished garment.

Choose a size with 0 to 10 cm – 0 to 4" positive ease at bust.

For an A-line body, less ease or none at all is recommended. More ease will suit the Straight body option best.

Shown in size 3 (Tee) and size 4 (Sweater) on a 90 cm – 35 1/2" bust.

Abbreviations :

- CO : cast-on / st(s) : stitch(es) / rnd(s) : round(s)
- m : marker / pm : place marker / sm : slip marker / rm : remove marker
- BOR : beginning of round
- RS : right side / WS : wrong side
- inc : increase / dec : decrease
- k : knit stitch / p : purl stitch
- sl wyib : slip the st purlwise with yarn in back
- m1L : make 1 left, lift the bar between the stitches onto the left needle from front to back, knit through the back loop (1 inc)
- m1R : make 1 right, lift the bar between the stitches onto the left needle from back to front, knit through the front loop (1 inc)
- ktbl : knit the st through its back loop
- ptbl : purl the st through its back loop
- k2tog : knit the next 2 sts together (1 dec)
- p2tog : purl the next 2 sts together (1 dec)
- ssk : slip the next 2 sts knitwise separately then knit them together through their back loop (1 dec)
- s2kp : s2kp : slip the next 2 sts together knitwise, k1 then pass slipped sts over (2 dec)
- yo : yarn over
- pssok yok (see tutorial below) : pass the 3rd st of the left needle over the first 2, k1, yo, k1
- MB (see tutorial below) : [(k1, yo) x3, k1] into next st, yo pass all the 7 bobble strands over ; pick up the thread on the WS below the bobble, knit it together with the last st on the right needle
- DS : double stitch for German short rows (counts as only 1 st)
- *-* : repeat instructions between asterisks

Notes :

Left and Right parts refer to the garment when worn.

Reading the Chart

When knitting in the round, always read the Chart from right to left.

When knitting flat, read the Chart back and forth : RS rows from right to left and WS rows from left to right.

You will find the Chart on page 12 and written instructions on pages 13-14.

Saddle Shoulders

You will create two rectangular pieces in the lace panel for the saddle shoulders.

With larger needles, CO 35 sts using the [German Twisted Cast-on](#).

(German Twisted Cast-on tutorial by Very Pink Knits)

set-up row (WS) : purl

Work the Chart until the piece measures 14 (14 / 16 / 16 / 18), (18 / 20 / 20 / 22), (22 / 24 / 24) cm – 5 1/2 (5 1/2 / 6 1/4 / 6 1/4 / 7), (7 / 7 3/4 / 7 3/4 / 8 3/4), (8 3/4 / 9 1/2 / 9 1/2)" from cast-on, ending with a WS row.

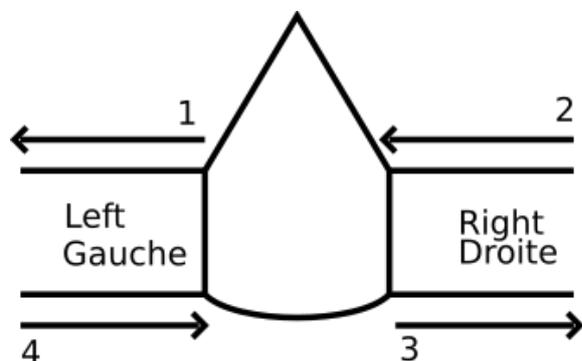
Note : Note down on which row of the Chart you stopped to replicate on the second shoulder and continue the pattern if you plan to make full sleeves.

Cut yarn and put sts on hold.

Repeat for second saddle shoulder.

To help you work the upper body, you can identify the saddle shoulders by placing a locking stitch marker on one of them : it will become the left one.

The saddle pieces cast-on edges will be on the neckline, whereas the live sts will be on the armholes.



Left Front

You will pick up sts along one of the longer sides of the saddle shoulders to work the fronts and create a V neck with simple increases. On the armhole edge, you will work a fine garter and slipped stitch border.

With larger needles, RS facing and starting at the cast-on edge, pick up and knit 30 (32 / 35 / 40 / 43), (46 / 52 / 54 / 55), (58 / 60 / 60) sts along the side of the left (marked) saddle shoulder, until the live held sts.

set-up row (WS) : (p1, k2) x 2, pm, purl to end

Note : if your row gauge is significantly different from the pattern's, you may need to adjust here by adding or removing rows.

You will need to work the neck shaping over 12 (13 / 15 / 15 / 16), (17 / 17 / 18 / 19), (20 / 21 / 21) cm – 4 3/4 (5 / 6 / 6 / 6 1/4), (6 3/4 / 6 3/4 / 7 / 7 1/2), (7 3/4 / 8 1/4 / 8 1/4)".

If your row gauge is denser, add rows by spacing out the inc rows over this length.

If your row gauge is looser, remove rows by increasing faster (adding a second inc on some inc rows) over this length.

Remember to replicate your changes on the right front later.

front row 1 (RS) : k2, m1L, knit to m, sm, k2, sl1wyib, k3 (1 inc)

front row 2 (WS) : (p1, k2) x 2, sm, purl to end

Work front rows 1-2 a total of 21 (23 / 26 / 26 / 28), (30 / 30 / 32 / 34), (36 / 38 / 38) times.

51 (55 / 61 / 66 / 71), (76 / 82 / 86 / 89), (94 / 98 / 98) sts

Cut yarn and put sts on hold.

Right Front

With larger needles, RS facing and starting at the live sts edge, pick up and knit 30 (**32 / 35 / 40 / 43**), (**46 / 52 / 54 / 55**), (**58 / 60 / 60**) sts along the side of the right (unmarked) saddle shoulder, until the cast-on edge.

set-up row (WS) : purl to last 6 sts, pm, (k2, p1) x 2

front row 1 (RS) : k3, sl1wyib, k2, sm, knit to last 2 sts, m1R, k2 (*1 inc*)

front row 2 (WS) : purl to m, sm, (k2, p1) x 2

Work front rows 1-2 a total of 21 (**23 / 26 / 26 / 28**), (**30 / 30 / 32 / 34**), (**36 / 38 / 38**) times.

51 (**55 / 61 / 66 / 71**), (**76 / 82 / 86 / 89**), (**94 / 98 / 98**) sts

Cut yarn and put sts on hold.

Right Back Shoulder

You will now pick up sts along the other long sides of the saddle shoulders to work the back shoulders.

With larger needles, RS facing and starting at the cast-on edge, pick up and knit 30 (**32 / 35 / 40 / 43**), (**46 / 52 / 54 / 55**), (**58 / 60 / 60**) sts along the other side of the right (unmarked) saddle shoulder.

set-up row (WS) : (p1, k2) x 2, pm, purl to end

shoulder row 1 (RS) : k2, m1L, k1, m1L, knit to m, sm, k2, sl1wyib, k3 (*2 inc*)

shoulder row 2 (WS) : (p1, k2) x 2, sm, purl to end

Work shoulder rows 1-2 a total of 4 (**4 / 4 / 4 / 4**), (**4 / 5 / 5 / 5**), (**5 / 5 / 6**) times.

38 (**40 / 43 / 48 / 51**), (**54 / 62 / 64 / 65**), (**68 / 70 / 72**) sts

Cut yarn and put sts on hold.

Left Back Shoulder

With larger needles, RS facing and starting at the live sts edge, pick up and knit 30 (**32 / 35 / 40 / 43**), (**46 / 52 / 54 / 55**), (**58 / 60 / 60**) sts along the other side of the left (marked) saddle shoulder.

set-up row (WS) : purl to last 6 sts, pm, (k2, p1) x 2

shoulder row 1 (RS) : k3, sl1wyib, k2, sm, knit to last 3 sts, m1R, k1, m1R, k2 (*2 inc*)

shoulder row 2 (WS) : purl to m, sm, (k2, p1) x 2

Work shoulder rows 1-2 a total of 4 (**4 / 4 / 4 / 4**), (**4 / 5 / 5 / 5**), (**5 / 5 / 6**) times.

38 (**40 / 43 / 48 / 51**), (**54 / 62 / 64 / 65**), (**68 / 70 / 72**) sts

Joining Back Shoulders

You will join the back shoulders by casting on new sts at the center back neck using a [backwards loop cast-on](#).

(Backwards Loop Cast-on tutorial by Very Pink Knits)

next row (RS) : k3, sl1wyib, k2, sm, knit to end of left back shoulder sts, CO 19 (**23 / 27 / 23 / 27**), (**29 / 21 / 25 / 28**), (**27 / 31 / 31**) sts

Place the right back shoulder sts back on the left needle with RS facing, joining them to the new sts and work them as follows :
knit to m, sm, k2, sl1wyib, k3

95 (**103 / 113 / 119 / 129**), (**137 / 145 / 153 / 157**), (**163 / 171 / 175**) sts

Back

back row 1 (WS) : (p1, k2) x 2, sm, purl to m, sm, (k2, p1) x 2

back row 2 (RS) : k3, sl1wyib, k2, sm, knit to m, sm, k2, sl1wyib, k3

Work back rows 1-2 until the back length matches the fronts' from the picked up sts, ending with a WS row.

Joining Back and Fronts

You will join the Fronts and the Back to work the Body in the round, casting-on new sts at the underarms and on the center front with the [backwards loop cast-on](#).

The previous armhole borders will now be worked in stockinette (knitted every rnd). You will keep all the markers in place to use them in the body shaping later.

next row (RS) : knit to end of back sts, CO 1 (2 / 1 / 1 / 1), (1 / 1 / 2 / 7), (9 / 10 / 16) sts

Place the right front sts back on the needles with RS facing, joining them to the new sts and knit to end.

CO 1 st, place the left front sts back on the needles with RS facing, joining them to the new st and knit to end.

CO 1 (2 / 1 / 1 / 1), (1 / 1 / 2 / 7), (9 / 10 / 16) sts.

Join to work in the rnd and knit to the next marker on the back : this is now the BOR.

200 (218 / 238 / 254 / 274), (292 / 312 / 330 / 350), (370 / 388 / 404) sts

Body

A line version :

Note : Most knitters find no need for the bust darts when doing an A-line body. If you would still prefer to add them, check the instructions in the Straight Version.

Work in stockinette, knitting every rnd, until the body measures about 2 cm – ¾" from the underarm.

body inc rnd : (knit to m, sm, m1L, knit to m, m1R, sm) x 2 (4 inc)

Continue in stockinette, repeating the body inc rnd every 2 cm – ¾" 16 more times or

until the body measures about 34 cm – 13 ½" from the underarm or 2 cm – ¾" less than desired length.

268 (286 / 306 / 322 / 342), (360 / 380 / 398 / 418), (438 / 456 / 472) sts

Note : if you are adding length, keep increasing until the end for a continuous A-line shaping. You may change the increase rnds spacing to your preference for a more or less pronounced shape.

Straight version :

Bust darts :

If you wear a cup size greater than B or your full bust measurement is more than 8 cm – 3 ¼" larger than your upper chest measurement, consider adding bust darts on the body. See instructions on page 11.

Work in stockinette, knitting every rnd, until the body measures about 31 cm – 12 ¼" from the underarm or 5 cm – 2" less than desired body length.

Hem

Switch to smaller needles.

hem rnd : *k1tbl, p1* to end

Work hem rnd until the hem measures 2 cm – ¾" (A-line), 5 cm – 2" (straight) or desired length.

Loosely bind-off all sts purlwise.

Sleeves

Tee edgings :

You will pick up sts around the armhole, place the saddle sts back on your needles and bind-off.

With smaller needles, RS facing and starting to the right of the underarm cast-on, pick up and knit 1 (2 / 1 / 1 / 1), (1 / 1 / 2 / 7), (9 / 10 / 16) sts from the underarm cast-on, and 2 out of 3 sts along the armhole up to the saddle shoulder.

Then place the 35 saddle sts back on the left needle and knit them.

Resume picking up and knitting 2 out of 3 sts along the rest of the armhole.

Join to work in the rnd and PM for BOR.
Loosely bind-off all sts purlwise.

Sweater full sleeves :

You will pick up sts around the armhole, place the saddle sts back on your needles and work the sleeve in the round. Resume working the Chart on the saddle sts where you stopped.

With larger needles, RS facing and starting to the right of the underarm cast-on, pick up and knit 1 (2 / 1 / 1 / 1), (1 / 1 / 2 / 7), (9 / 10 / 16) sts from the underarm cast-on, 23 (25 / 29 / 29 / 33), (35 / 35 / 39 / 41), (45 / 47 / 47) sts along the armhole up to the saddle shoulder,

pm, then place the 35 saddle sts back on the left needle and work them following the next row of Chart,

pm, then pick up and knit 23 (25 / 29 / 29 / 33), (35 / 35 / 39 / 41), (45 / 47 / 47) sts along the rest of the armhole.

82 (87 / 94 / 94 / 102), (106 / 106 / 115 / 124), (134 / 139 / 145) sts

Join to work in the rnd and PM for BOR.

SIZES 2, 8, 11 and 12 ONLY :

next rnd : k1, k2tog, knit to m, sm, Chart to m, sm, knit to end (1 dec)

- (86 / - / - / -), (- / - / 114 / -), (- / 138 / 144) sts

ALL SIZES RESUME

sleeve rnd : knit to m, sm, Chart to m, sm, knit to end

Work the sleeve rnd until the sleeve measures 3 (3 / 5 / 5 / 3), (3 / 3 / 5 / 5), (3 / 3 / 3) cm – 1 1/4 (1 1/4 / 2 / 2 / 1 1/4), (1 1/4 / 1 1/4 / 2 / 2), (1 1/4 / 1 1/4 / 1 1/4)" from the underarm.

You will start working decreases on either side of the lace panel.

dec rnd : knit to 2 sts before m, ssk, sm, Chart to m, sm, k2tog, knit to end (2 dec)

Continue as established, repeating the dec rnd every

2 (2 / 1.5 / 1.5 / 1.5), (1.5 / 1.5 / 1 / 1), (1 / 1 / 1) cm

3/4 (3/4 / 1/2 / 1/2 / 1/2), (1/2 / 1/2 / 1/2 / 1/2), (1/2 / 1/2 / 1/2)"

17 (17 / 21 / 20 / 22), (23 / 23 / 26 / 30), (34 / 34 / 35) more times.

46 (50 / 50 / 52 / 56), (58 / 58 / 60 / 62), (64 / 68 / 72) sts

Work the sleeve rnd until the sleeve measures about 40 cm – 15 3/4" from the underarm or 7 cm – 2 3/4" less than desired length, ending with an even rnd of the Chart.

Cuff :

Switch to smaller needles.

You will work decreases around and within the lace panel to align the twisted ribbing to the cuff.

Sizes 1, 3, 7 and 8 ONLY :

set-up rnd : *p1, k1tbl* to m, rm, (p1, k1tbl) x 5, p2tog, (k1tbl, p1) x 5, k1tbl, p2tog, (k1tbl, p1) x 5, rm, *k1tbl, p1* to 1 st before end, k1tbl (2 dec)

44 (- / 48 / - / -), (- / 56 / 58 / -), (- / - / -) sts

Size 2 ONLY :

set-up rnd : *k1tbl, p1* to 1 st before m, k1tbl, rm, (p1, k1tbl) x 5, p2tog, (k1tbl, p1) x 5, k1tbl, p2tog, (k1tbl, p1) x 5, rm, *k1tbl, p1* to 3 sts before end, k1tbl, p2tog (3 dec)
47 sts

Sizes 4, 5, 9, 10 and 11 ONLY :

set-up rnd : *k1tbl, p1* to 1 st before m, k1tbl, rm, (p1, k1tbl) x 5, p2tog, (k1tbl, p1) x 5, k1tbl, p2tog, (k1tbl, p1) x 5, rm, *k1tbl, p1* to end (2 dec)
- (- / - / 50 / 54), (- / - / - / 60), (62 / 66 / -) sts

Size 6 ONLY :

set-up rnd : *p1, k1tbl* to m, rm, (p1, k1tbl) x 5, p2tog, (k1tbl, p1) x 5, k1tbl, p2tog, (k1tbl, p1) x 5, rm, *k1tbl, p1* to 4 sts before end, k1tbl, p2tog, k1tbl (3 dec)
55 sts

ALL SIZES RESUME

cuff rnd : work as established (purling the purl sts and ktbl the twisted sts) to end

Work the cuff rnd until the cuff measures 7 cm – 2 ¾" or desired length.
Loosely bind-off all sts purlwise.

V-neck band

With smaller needles, RS facing and starting at the back of the right saddle shoulder, pick up and knit

24 (26 / 28 / 26 / 28), (28 / 26 / 28 / 28), (30 / 30 / 34) sts from the back,

33 sts from the left saddle shoulder,

28 (30 / 34 / 36 / 38), (40 / 42 / 42 / 46), (48 / 50 / 50) sts along the left front,

pick up and knit 1 st from the neck cast-on at the center of the V neck, **PM**,

29 (31 / 35 / 37 / 39), (41 / 43 / 43 / 47), (49 / 51 / 51) sts along the right front,

and 33 sts from the right saddle shoulder,

Join to work in the rnd and PM for BOR.

148 (154 / 164 / 166 / 172), (176 / 178 / 180 / 188), (194 / 198 / 202) sts

You will work in twisted ribbing and make a central double decrease in the center of the V every other rnd.

rnd 1 : *p1, k1tbl* to 2 sts before m, p1, k1, sm, *p1, k1tbl* to end

rnd 2 : *p1, k1tbl* to 2 sts before m, s2kp removing m and replacing it after the dec, k1tbl, *p1, k1tbl* to end (2 dec)

rnd 3 : work as established to 1 st before m, k1, sm, work as established to end

rnd 4 : work as established to 2 sts before m, s2kp removing m and replacing it after the dec, work as established to end (2 dec)

Work rnds 3-4, maintaining the twisted ribbing as established until the neck band measures 2 cm – ¾" (tee), 5 cm – 2" (sweater) or desired length, ending with a rnd 4.

Loosely bind-off all sts purlwise.

Finishing

Weave in all ends and gently block the garment.

Bust darts instructions :

Work the body until it measures about 2 cm – ¾" from the underarm.

CUP C AND D ONLY

Full bust measurement at least 8 cm – 3 ¼" more than upper chest measurement.

short row 1 (RS) : knit to second to last m (left underarm on the front), k6, turn

short row 2 (WS) : DS, purl to m (right underarm on the front), p6, turn

short row 3 : DS, knit to 3 (4 / 4 / 4 / 5), (5 / 6 / 6 / 6), (7 / 7 / 7) sts before last DS, turn

short row 4 : DS, purl to 3 (4 / 4 / 4 / 5), (5 / 6 / 6 / 6), (7 / 7 / 7) sts before last DS, turn

Work short rows 3-4 a total of 3 times.

short row 9 (RS) : DS, knit to end, closing the short-rows by knitting the DS normally as one st

CUP E AND F ONLY

Full bust measurement at least 12 cm – 4 ¾" more than upper chest measurement.

short row 1 (RS) : knit to second to last m (left underarm on the front), k6, turn

short row 2 (WS) : DS, purl to m (right underarm on the front), p6, turn

short row 3 : DS, knit to 2 (3 / 3 / 3 / 3), (4 / 4 / 5 / 5), (6 / 6 / 6) sts before last DS, turn

short row 4 : DS, purl to 2 (3 / 3 / 3 / 3), (4 / 4 / 5 / 5), (6 / 6 / 6) sts before last DS, turn

Work short-rows 3-4 a total of 4 times.

short row 11 (RS) : DS, knit to end, closing the short-rows by knitting the DS normally as one st

CUP G AND H ONLY

Full bust measurement at least 16 cm – 6 ¼" more than upper chest measurement.

short row 1 (RS) : knit to second to last m (left underarm on the front), k6, turn

short row 2 (WS) : DS, purl to m (right underarm on the front), p6, turn

short row 3 : DS, knit to 2 (2 / 3 / 3 / 3), (3 / 4 / 4 / 4), (5 / 5 / 5) sts before last DS, turn

Short row 4 : DS, purl to 2 (2 / 3 / 3 / 3), (3 / 4 / 4 / 4), (5 / 5 / 5) sts before last DS, turn

Work short-rows 3-4 a total of 5 times.

short row 13 (RS) : DS, knit to end, closing the short-rows by knitting the DS normally as one st

ALL CUPS RESUME

When knitting the next rnd, close the remaining short rows by knitting the DS normally.

Continue with the body per main instructions.

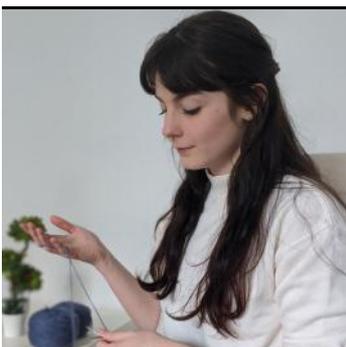
