I wanted the perfect cropped hoodie to throw on with leggings for when I am traveling and this textured sweater was just the ticket! After knitting one, I knew I would also love it in a crew neck, so I included directions for both so that no matter your personal taste - you can travel in style!



SIZES

1 (2, 3, 4, 5)(6, 7, 8, 9)



FINISHED CHEST CIRCUMFERENCE

38 (42, 46, 50, 54)(58, 62, 66, 70)"

96.5 (106.5, 117, 127, 137)(147.5, 157.5, 167.5, 178) cm

Intended to be worn with approx. 6-10"/15-25.5 cm positive ease.

Sample shown in size 3 with approx. 10"/25.5 cm positive ease on a 5'5"/165 cm tall woman.



YARN

Sport Weight Wool

Hoodie: 462 (512, 535, 599, 641)(694, 764, 790, 856) g/1701 (1894, 1978, 2214, 2369)(2568, 2825, 2921, 3165) yds/1561 (1732, 1809, 2025, 2166)(2348, 2583, 2671, 2895) m

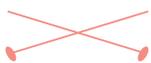
Crew: 364 (414, 437, 500, 525)(578, 648, 674, 740) g/1181 (1345, 1419, 1625, 1704)(1878, 2104, 2189, 2403) yds/1080 (1230, 1298, 1486, 1558)(1718, 1924, 2002, 2198) m



SUGGESTED YARN

Hoodie: The Farmer's Daughter Fibers Recollect: 100% Rambouillet Sport Weight Yarn (50 g/185 yds/170 m) - 10 (11, 11, 12, 13)(14, 16, 16, 18) skeins in Pretty Shield (red)

Crew Neck: Ritual Dyes Sprite: 60% Merino/40% Corriedale Sport Weight Yarn (100 g/325 yds/297 m) - 4 (5, 5, 5, 6)(6, 7, 7, 8 skeins Obsidian (black)



SUGGESTED NEEDLES

Main Fabric: US 5/3.75 mm - 32-40"/80-100 cm circular (2 sets for 3 Needle BO) and preferred needles for small circumference knitting (such as Magic Loop or DPNs)

Hood Hem: US 4/3.5 mm - 32"/80 cm circular

Ribbing: US 3/3.25 mm - 32-40"/80-100 cm circular and preferred needles for small circumference knitting for cuffs & collar.

(Use the needle size you need to achieve gauge, going down two US sizes for the ribbing.)



NOTIONS

Stitch markers (2 fixed, 3 locking), cable needle (optional), row counter (recommended), tapestry needle, spare needle, stitch holders or waste yarn to hold stitches



GAUGE

21.5 sts & 39 rnds = 4"/10 cm

Measured over stitch pattern (pg. 4) in the round using the Main Fabric needle, after blocking.



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NOTES

- To pick your size, measure around your full chest, then add or subtract your desired ease to that number. Pick the size closest to that from the *FINISHED CHEST CIRCUMFERENCE* on page 2 - DETAILS.
- If you are between sizes, my testers found they would prefer sizing ? for this pattern.
- This sweater is worked from the bottom up, seamlessly, except for the underarms. The body is worked in the round until the divide for the yoke. The remainder is worked flat, and the shoulders are finished with an exposed seam using the 3 needle bind off.
- The stitch pattern for this sweater grows in length after blocking by about 15 -18%. You can adjust the length of the body & sleeves of the sweater by multiplying your intended length by 0.83, and knitting to that length (minus hems and cuffs.) For example, if you would prefer the body of the sweater to be 12"/30.5 cm for a less cropped fit, multiply that by 0.83 which equals approx. 10"/25.5 cm. Separate for the Yoke section once your sweater measures approx. 10"/25.5 cm from the cast on edge. Taking into account this will affect the amount of yardage used, and you will want to purchase extra yarn if you want to lengthen any part of the sweater. One last note to consider if you are thinking of adding length to the body - this sweatshirt style sweater has roomier sleeves, which are created by a deeper yoke, which in turn, adds length to the overall body of the sweater. Refer to the schematic when planning any modifications you might like to make. If you sub in a different yarn, it may grow more or less than the recommended yarn.
- Sleeve Fabric: In my experience, and thanks to feedback from my test knitters, I have found that most of us knit tighter when working small circumference (IE sleeves) than larger circumference (IE body). Therefore, I HIGHLY recommend checking your sleeve gauge to make sure it is has not tightened up too much, resulting in sleeves that will be too small. If your gauge has tightened, I recommend going up a needle size (or more) to continue in the gauge required for this sweater.

GLOSSARY

{ } - Repeat

1/1 LPC - Left purl cross: sl st to a CN and hold to front, p1; k1 from CN.

1/1 RPC - Right purl cross: sl st to a CN and hold to back, k1; p1 from CN.

BO - Bind off

BOR - Beginning of round

CO - Cast on

CONT - Continue

DEC/D - Decrease/d

DPNs - Double pointed needles

DS - Double Stitch: move yarn to front between needles, slip stitch from the LHN, pull yarn up and over the top of the needle to the back so that the legs of the lower stitch are pulled up onto the needle - creating the appearance of 2 strands of yarn for the stitch instead of just one. (If purling, return the yarn to the front between the 2 needle tips.)

EST - Established

K - Knit

K1-F/B - Knit into the front loop and then the back loop of the stitch. [1 st inc'd]

K2TOG - Knit 2 sts together as one. [1 st dec'd]

LHN - Left hand needle

M - Marker

P - Purl

P2TOG - Purl 2 sts together as one. [1 st dec'd]

PM - Place marker

REM - Remain

REP - Repeat

RHN - Right hand needle

RM - Remove marker

RND/S - Round/s

RS - Right side

SL - Slip stitch purlwise

SM - Slip marker

ST/S - Stitch/es

SSK - Slip, slip, knit: Slip two sts, one at a time, as if to knit, insert LHN into these sts and knit them together thru the back loops. [1 st dec'd]

SSP - Slip, slip, purl; Slip two sts, one at a time, as if to knit, insert LHN into these sts and purl them together thru the back loops. [1 st dec'd]

TBL - Thru the back loop

WS - Wrong side

WYIF - With yarn in front

WYIB - With yarn in back

YO - Yarnover

STITCH PATTERN FOR SWATCHING

This stitch pattern can be worked over any number of stitches. I recommend casting on enough for a large swatch, preferably 6x6"/15x15 cm, and working the swatch in the round to get an accurate gauge.

Rnds 1-3: Knit.

Rnds 4-5: Purl.

Cont. repeating these 5 rnds until your swatch is your desired length. When you are finished with your swatch, I recommend measuring it, then wet blocking it in the same way you will wet block your sweater, and then measuring the swatch again. This stitch pattern grows significantly post blocking.

DIRECTIONS

HEM

With the Ribbing needle, CO 204 (224, 248, 268, 288)(312, 332, 352, 376) sts using the Long Tail Tubular Cast On method. Do not join to work in the rnd.

If you prefer to sub in a different CO method, skip the Tubular setup rows, join to work in the rnd and go straight to the Ribbing Rnd.

Tubular Setup Row 1 (RS): {K1-tbl, sl1 wyif} to end.

Tubular Setup Row 2 (WS): {K1, sl1 wyif} to end.

Tubular Setup Row 3 (rearranging sts): Join to work in the rnd, placing a BORM, *k1, 1/1 RPC, p1; rep from * to end of rnd.

Ribbing Rnd: *K2, p2; rep from * to end of rnd.

Rep [Ribbing Rnd] until hem measures 2"/5 cm from the CO edge.

BODY

Change to Main Fabric needle.

Setup Rnd: K102 (112, 124, 134, 144)(156, 166, 176, 188), pm, knit to end.

Rnds 2 & 3: Knit.

Rnds 4 & 5: *Sl2 wyib, purl to m, sm; rep from * once more.

Pattern Repeat

Rnds 1-3: Knit.

Rnds 4 & 5: *Sl2 wyib, purl to m, sm; rep from * once more.

Rep [Rnds 1-5] of the Pattern Repeat until the body measures 7"/18 cm from the CO edge, ending with Rnd 5.

See Notes on pg. 3 about adding length to the body of this sweater.

FRONT YOKE

You will now divide the sweater for the front and back on each side, between the 2 slipped side seam stitches.

Remove BORM, k1 (this st will remain with the Back sts), using the Cable Cast On method, CO 10 underarm sts, knit across the CO sts and the front sts to the other marker, rm, k1, using the Backwards Loop Cast On method, CO 10 underarm sts. Turn. *The remaining 102 (112, 124, 134, 144)(156, 166, 176, 188) sts can be put on hold using a spare needle or waste yarn for the Back.*

122 (132, 144, 154, 164)(176, 186, 196, 208) Front sts on needle

Row 1 (WS): Purl.

Row 2 (RS): Knit.

Row 3: Knit.

Row 4: Purl.

Row 5: Purl.

Row 6: Knit.

Row 7: Purl.

Row 8: Purl.

Row 9: Knit.

Row 10: Knit.

Rep [Rows 1-10] 4 (5, 5, 6, 6)(7, 8, 8, 9) more times.

Rep [Row 1] once more.

If you need to add or remove length from the yoke, you must do so in 10 row increments to stay in pattern for the yoke shaping. If you do work more or less repeats, make sure to do the same for the Back Yoke.

FRONT NECK SHAPING

It is helpful to place markers to ensure you bind off the correct sts for the front neck - place the first marker 53 (58, 64, 69, 71)(77, 82, 87, 93) sts in from the edge, and the second marker 16 (16, 16, 16, 22)(22, 22, 22, 22) sts after that. The sts between the 2 markers are what we will BO for the front neck.

With RS facing, k52 (57, 63, 68, 70)(76, 81, 86, 92) sts to 1 st before the first M, k1-f/b, RM, k1, BO 1 by pulling the new st created by the k1-f/b over the st you just knit, BO 15 (15, 15, 15, 21)(21, 21, 21, 21) sts, RM, BO 1 more st, knit to end.

53 (58, 64, 69, 71)(77, 82, 87, 93) sts rem on either side of the neck sts that were bound off.

RIGHT FRONT NECK SHAPING (AS WORN)

The Right and Left Front Shoulders will be worked separately. Place the Left Front (as worn) sts on hold using a spare needle or waste yarn.

Row 1 (WS): Knit to the last st, sl1 wyif.

Row 2 (RS/DEC): Sl2 wyib, pass the first st over the top of the second and off the needle, BO 3 sts purlwise, purl to end. [4 sts dec'd]

Row 3: Purl to the last st, sl1 wyif.

Row 4 (DEC): Sl2 wyib, pass the first st over the top of the second and off the needle, BO 2 sts knitwise, knit to end. [3 sts dec'd]

Row 5: Purl to the last st, sl1 wyif.

Row 6 (DEC): Sl2 wyib, pass the first st over the top of the second and off the needle, BO 1 st purlwise, purl to end. [2 sts dec'd]

Row 7: Knit to the last st, sl1 wyif.

Row 8 (DEC): Sl2 wyib, pass the first st over the top of the second and off the needle, knit to end. [1 sts dec'd]

Row 9: Purl to the last st, sl1 wyif.

Row 10 (DEC): Sl2 wyib, pass the first st over the top of the second and off the needle, knit to end. [1 sts dec'd]

Row 11: Knit to the last st, sl1 wyif.

Row 12 (DEC): Sl2 wyib, pass the first st over the top of the second and off the needle, purl to end. [1 sts dec'd; 41 (46, 52, 57, 59)(65, 70, 75, 81) sts rem for Right Front Shoulder]

Row 13: Purl.

Row 14: Knit.

Row 15: Purl.

SHORT ROW SHAPING

You will use the German Short Row method to shape the shoulder slope. You can find a video tutorial for this method in the Notes on pg. 3.

Short Row 1 (RS): Purl to the last 4 (3, 6, 5, 6)(5, 7, 6, 5) sts, turn.

Short Row 2 (WS): DS, knit to end.

Short Row 3: Knit to 3 (4, 4, 5, 5)(6, 6, 7, 8) sts before the double stitch, turn.

Short Row 4: DS, purl to end.

Short Row 5: Knit to 3 (4, 4, 5, 5)(6, 6, 7, 8) sts before the double stitch, turn.

Short Row 6: DS, knit to end.

Short Row 7: Purl to 3 (4, 4, 5, 5)(6, 6, 7, 8) sts before the double stitch, turn.

Short Row 8: DS, purl to end.

Short Row 9: Knit to 3 (4, 4, 5, 5)(6, 6, 7, 8) sts before the double stitch, turn.

Short Row 10: DS, purl to end.

Short Row 11: Purl to 3 (4, 4, 5, 5)(6, 6, 7, 8) sts before the double stitch, turn.

Rep [Short Rows 2-8] once more.

— DIRECTIONS —

Row 19 (RS): Knit to the end of the row, working each double stitch as a k2tog. Break yarn. These sts can be placed on a hold using a spare needle or waste yarn while working the Left Front & Back.

LEFT FRONT NECK SHAPING (AS WORN)

Return the Left Front sts to the Main Fabric needle. With WS facing, attach yarn at the neck edge.

Row 1 (WS): Knit.

Row 2 (RS): Purl to last st, sl1 wyib.

Row 3 (DEC): Sl2 wyif, pass the first st over the top of the second and off the needle, BO 3 sts purlwise, purl to end. [4 sts dec'd]

Row 4: Knit to last st, sl1 wyib.

Row 5 (DEC): Sl2 wyif, pass the first st over the top of the second and off the needle, BO 2 sts purlwise, purl to end. [3 sts dec'd]

Row 6: Purl to last st, sl1 wyib.

Row 7 (DEC): Sl2 wyif, pass the first st over the top of the second and off the needle, BO 1 st knitwise, knit to end. [2 sts dec'd]

Row 8: Knit to last st, sl1 wyib.

Row 9 (DEC): Sl2 wyif, pass the first st over the top of the second and off the needle, purl to end. [1 st dec'd]

Row 10: Knit to last st, sl1 wyib.

Row 11 (DEC): Sl2 wyif, pass the first st over the top of the second and off the needle, knit to end. [1 st dec'd]

Row 12: Purl to last st, sl1 wyib.

Row 13 (DEC): Sl2 wyif, pass the first st over the top of the second and off the needle, purl to end. [1 sts dec'd; 41 (46, 52, 57, 59)(65, 70, 75, 81) sts remain for Left Front Shoulder]

Row 14: Knit.

SHORT ROW SHAPING

Short Row 1 (WS): Purl to the last 4 (3, 6, 5, 6)(5, 7, 6, 5) sts, turn.

Short Row 2 (RS): DS, purl to end.

Short Row 3: Knit to 3 (4, 4, 5, 5)(6, 6, 7, 8) sts before the double stitch, turn.

Short Row 4: DS, knit to end.

Short Row 5: Purl to 3 (4, 4, 5, 5)(6, 6, 7, 8) sts before the double stitch, turn.

Short Row 6: DS, knit to end.

Short Row 7: Knit to 3 (4, 4, 5, 5)(6, 6, 7, 8) sts before the double stitch, turn.

Short Row 8: DS, purl to end.

Short Row 9: Purl to 3 (4, 4, 5, 5)(6, 6, 7, 8) sts before the double stitch, turn.

Short Row 10: DS, knit to end.

Short Row 11: Purl to 3 (4, 4, 5, 5)(6, 6, 7, 8) sts before the double stitch, turn.

Rep [Short Rows 2-8] once more.

Row 19 (WS): Purl to the end of the row, working each double stitch as a p2tog.

Row 20 (RS): Knit. Break yarn. These sts can be placed on hold using a spare needle or waste yarn while working the Back.

BACK YOKE

Return 102 (112, 124, 134, 144)(156, 166, 176, 188) Back sts to Main Fabric needle.

With RS facing, join yarn and using the Cable Cast On method, CO 10 underarm sts, knit across the CO sts and back sts, using the Backwards Loop method, CO 10 underarm sts.

122 (132, 144, 154, 164)(176, 186, 196, 208) Back sts on needle

Row 1 (WS): Purl.

Row 2 (RS): Knit.

Row 3: Knit.

Row 4: Purl.

Row 5: Purl.

Row 6: Knit.

Row 7: Purl.

Row 8: Purl.

Row 9: Knit.

Row 10: Knit.

Rep [Rows 1-10] 5 (6, 6, 7, 7)(8, 9, 9, 10)
more times.

Rep [Rows 1-6] once more.

SHORT ROW SHAPING

Short Row 1 (WS): Purl to the last 4 (3, 6, 5, 6)(5, 7, 6, 5) sts, turn.

Short Row 2 (RS): DS, purl to the last 4 (3, 6, 5, 6)(5, 7, 6, 5) sts, turn.

Short Row 3: DS, knit to 3 (4, 4, 5, 5)(6, 6, 7, 8) sts before the double stitch, turn.

Short Row 4: DS, knit to 3 (4, 4, 5, 5)(6, 6, 7, 8) sts before the double stitch, turn.

Short Row 5: DS, purl to 3 (4, 4, 5, 5)(6, 6, 7, 8) sts before the double stitch, turn.

Short Row 6: DS, knit to 3 (4, 4, 5, 5)(6, 6, 7, 8) sts before the double stitch, turn.

Short Row 7: DS, knit to 3 (4, 4, 5, 5)(6, 6, 7, 8) sts before the double stitch, turn.

Short Row 8: DS, purl to 3 (4, 4, 5, 5)(6, 6, 7, 8) sts before the double stitch, turn.

Short Row 9: DS, purl to 3 (4, 4, 5, 5)(6, 6, 7, 8) sts before the double stitch, turn.

Short Row 10: DS, knit to 3 (4, 4, 5, 5)(6, 6, 7, 8) sts before the double stitch, turn.

Short Row 11: DS, purl to 3 (4, 4, 5, 5)(6, 6, 7, 8) sts before the double stitch, turn.

Short Row 12: DS, purl to 3 (4, 4, 5, 5)(6, 6, 7, 8) sts before the double stitch, turn.

Rep [Short Rows 3-8] once more.

Row 19 (WS): DS, purl to the end of the row, working each double stitch as a p2tog.

Row 20 (RS): Knit to the end of the row, working each double stitch as a k2tog. Break yarn.

BIND OFF SHOULDERS & BACK NECK

Return Front shoulder sts to a spare Main Fabric needle. With RS of the back of the sweater facing (and the WS sandwiched together to create an exposed seam), beginning at the Right Shoulder (as worn), join yarn and BO 41 (46, 52, 57, 59)(65, 70, 75, 81) shoulder sts using the 3-Needle Bind Off method as follows: Line up the shoulder sts from the front and the back of the sweater on parallel needles. Using a third needle, insert needle tip knitwise into the first stitch on the front needle and then knitwise into the first stitch on the back needle, and knit them together; *knit the next stitch from each needle together, pass the first stitch over the second; rep from * until all shoulder sts have been bound off. BO 40 (40, 40, 40, 46)(46, 46, 46, 46) Back Neck sts, then return to the 3-Needle Bind Off method for the rem 41 (46, 52, 57, 59)(65, 70, 75, 81) Left Shoulder sts. Break yarn and pull tail thru the final loop to secure.

— DIRECTIONS —

SLEEVES (same for both)

Using Mattress stitch with RS facing, seam the 10 sts that were CO to the Front armhole edge to the 10 sts that were CO to the Back armhole edge, which creates the beginning of the sleeve.

Using Main Fabric needle (or going up a size to maintain gauge - see Notes on pg. 3) in your preferred method for small circumference knitting, join yarn at the underarm seam and pick up and knit 76 (86, 86, 96, 96)(108, 118, 118, 128) sts around the sleeve opening. Place a BOR M and join to work in the rnd.

Knit 2 rnds.

Purl 2 rnds

Dec Rnd: K1, k2tog, knit to the last 3 sts, ssk, k1. [2 sts dec'd]

Knit the sleeve until it measures approx. 13.5"/34 cm from the underarm, using the same Pattern Repeat used for the body (knitting 3 rnds, then purling 2 rnds), working a Dec Rnd on one of the knit rnds every 1.25 (0.75, 0.75, 0.75, 0.75)(0.5, 0.5, 0.5, 0.5)"/3 (2, 2, 2, 2)(1, 1, 1, 1) cm - 9 (14, 14, 15, 15)(21, 20, 20, 25) *more* times. End the sleeve with 3 knit rnds.
56 (56, 56, 64, 64)(64, 76, 76, 76) sts rem.

CUFF

Change to Ribbing needle.

Ribbing Pattern: {K2, p2} to end of rnd. Cont in the est ribbing pattern for 1.75"/4.5 cm. (If you prefer not to do a Tubular BO, cont the ribbing until it measures 2"/5 cm, then BO in pattern.)

Rearranging Sts for BO: *K1, 1/1 LPC, p1; rep from * to end of rnd.

Tubular BO Rnd 1: {K1, sl1 wyif} to end of rnd.

Tubular BO Rnd 2: {Sl1 wyib, p1} to end of rnd.

Sl each st purlwise, slipping the knit sts onto the working needle and the purl sts onto a spare needle, OR reference the Kitchener Stitch on One Needle Tutorial linked in the Notes on pg. 3 to skip this step.

Break yarn, leaving a tail 3 x the length of the sts to be bound off, and BO all sts using the Kitchener stitch.

Repeat for the other sleeve.

CREW NECK COLLAR

These instructions are to finish your sweatshirt as a Crew Neck. To finish your sweatshirt off with the Hoodie option, skip this section and go to HOODIE.

Using the Ribbing needle, join yarn at the right edge of the Back Neck and pick up and knit 104 (104, 108, 108, 112)(112, 112, 116, 116) sts around the neck. *You can pick up more or fewer sts, as long as your final stitch count is divisible by 4.*

Ribbing Rnd: *K2, p2; rep from * to end of rnd.

Rep [Ribbing Rnd] until collar measures 1.5"/4 cm from the CO edge.

If you prefer not to use the Tubular Bind Off, cont the ribbing until it measures 1.75"/4.5 cm and then bind off in pattern.

Rearranging Sts for BO: *K1, 1/1 LPC, p1; rep from * to end of rnd.

Tubular BO Rnd 1: {K1, sl1 wyif} to end of rnd.

Tubular BO Rnd 2: {Sl1 wyib, p1} to end of rnd.

Sl each st purlwise, slipping the knit sts onto the working needle and the purl sts onto a spare needle, OR reference the Kitchener Stitch on One Needle Tutorial linked in the Notes on pg. 3 to skip this step.

Break yarn, leaving a tail 3 x the length of the sts to be bound off, and BO all sts using the Kitchener stitch.

HOODIE

I-Cord Drawstring

I chose to use a contrasting color from my stash to add a fun pop of color to my hoodie, but you can also just use more of your hoodie yarn. As long as it is Sport weight yarn - you are good to go!

Using the Ribbing Needle, CO 3 sts, slide sts down to the other end of the needle. *K3, slide sts down to the other end; rep from * until the I-cord measures approx. 43 (43, 43, 43, 46)(46, 46, 46, 46)"/109 (109, 109, 109, 117)(117, 117, 117, 117) cm. K1, k2tog, pass the first st over the second, break yarn and pull the tail thru the remaining loop. Weave in ends by pulling the tails up thru the ends of the I-cord and snipping off the excess.

Hood

Mark the center of the front neck with a locking stitch marker, then measure just under 1"/2.5 cm to each side of this, approx. 5 sts on each side, placing two more locking stitch markers.

Beginning at the marker that is furthest to the Right (as worn), using Main Fabric needle, join yarn and pick up and knit 98 (98, 98, 98, 110)(110, 110, 110, 110) sts around the neck to the other side marker.



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— DIRECTIONS —

Row 1 (WS): Knit.

Row 2 (RS): Purl.

Row 3: Purl.

Row 4: Knit.

Row 5: Purl.

Row 6: Purl.

Row 7: Knit.

Row 8: Knit.

Row 9: Purl.

Row 10: Knit.

Rep [Rows 1-10] 4 more times.

Rep [Rows 1-4] once more.

Short Row Shaping - Section One

Setup Row (WS): P31 (31, 31, 31, 36)(36, 36, 36, 36), PM, p36 (36, 36, 36, 38)(38, 38, 38, 38), PM, p31 (31, 31, 31, 36)(36, 36, 36, 36).

Short Row 1 (RS): Purl to 1 st before end of row, turn.

Short Row 2 (WS): DS, knit to 1 st before end of row, turn.

Short Row 3: DS, knit up to the previous double stitch, turn.

Short Row 4: DS, purl up to the previous double stitch, turn.

Short Row 5: DS, knit up to the previous double stitch, turn.

Short Row 6: DS, knit up to the previous double stitch, turn.

Short Row 7: DS, purl up to the previous double stitch, turn.

Short Row 8: DS, purl up to the previous double stitch, turn.

Short Row 9: DS, knit up to the previous double stitch, turn.

Short Row 10: DS, purl up to the previous double stitch, turn.

Short Row 11: DS, purl up to the previous double stitch, turn.

Short Row 12: DS, knit up to the previous double stitch, turn.

Rep [Short Rows 3-12] 4 (4, 4, 4, 5)(5, 5, 5, 5) *more* times.

Rep [Short Rows 3 - 10] once more.

Transition Row 1 (RS): DS, purl to end of row working each double stitch as a p2tog.

Transition Row 2 (WS): Knit to end of row working each double stitch as a k2tog.

Short Row Shaping - Section Two

Short Row 1 (RS): Purl to first m, sm, knit to second m, sm, k1, turn.

Short Row 2 (WS): DS, sm, purl to other m, sm, p1, turn.

Short Row 3: DS, knit to previous double stitch, work it as a k2tog, k1, turn.

Short Row 4: DS, knit to previous double stitch, work it as a k2tog, k1, turn.

Short Row 5: DS, purl to previous double stitch, work it as a p2tog, p1, turn.

Short Row 6: DS, purl to previous double stitch, work it as a p2tog, p1, turn.

Short Row 7: DS, knit to previous double stitch, work it as a k2tog, k1, turn.

Short Row 8: DS, purl to previous double stitch, work it as a p2tog, p1, turn.

Short Row 9: DS, purl to previous double stitch, work it as a p2tog, p1, turn.

Short Row 10: DS, knit to previous double stitch, work it as a k2tog, k1, turn.

Short Row 11: DS, knit to previous double stitch, work it as a k2tog, k1, turn.

Short Row 12: DS, purl to previous double stitch, work it as a p2tog, p1, turn.

Short Row 13: DS, knit to previous double stitch, work it as a k2tog, k1, turn.

Rep [Short Rows 4-13] 4 (4, 4, 4, 5)(5, 5, 5, 5) *more times.*

Rep [Short Rows 4-10] once more.

Transition Row 1 (RS): DS, knit to previous double stitch, work it as a k2tog, k1, pick up and knit 33 sts down to the CO edge of the hood, using the Backwards Loop Method, CO 1 selvedge st. [34 sts added; 132 (132, 132, 132, 144)(144, 144, 144, 144) sts on needle]

Transition Row 2 (WS): Purl to previous double stitch, work it as a p2tog, p1, pick up and purl 33 sts down to the CO edge of the hood, using the Backwards Loop Method, CO 1 selvedge st. [34 sts added; 166 (166, 166, 166, 178)(178, 178, 178, 178) sts on needle]

Row 3: Knit. (*The stitch markers used for the short rows are no longer necessary and may be removed.*)

Row 4: Sl1 wyif, knit to the last st, p1.

Row 5: Sl1 wyib, purl the last st, k1.

Drawstring Encasement

Change to Hood Hem Needle.

Row 1 (WS): Sl1 wyif, purl to end.

Row 2 (RS): Sl1 wyib, knit to end.

Rep [Rows 1 & 2] once more.

Eyelet Row for Drawstring (WS): Sl1 wyif, p4, yo, ssp, purl to the last 7 sts, ssp, yo, purl to the end.

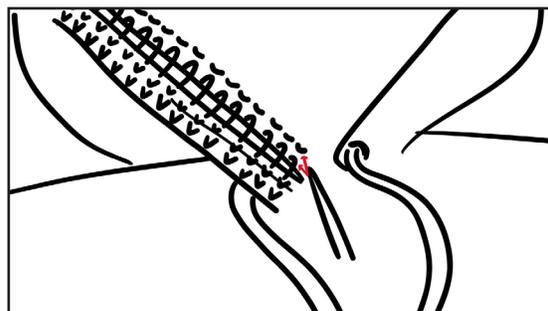
Row 6 (RS): Sl1 wyib, knit to end.

Rep [Rows 1 & 2] 4 *more times.*

Rep [Row 1] once more.

Closing Encasement

You can find a video tutorial for this technique in the Notes on pg. 3.



Feed the I-cord drawstring thru the eyelets on either end of the hood, so that the drawstring is on the purl side of the encasement.

Fold the encasement in half and in towards the hood, so that only the knit side shows, and drawstring is inside the fold.

Beginning at the lower right side, as worn, insert the RHN into the first st on the LHN and then thru the purl bump of the WS of that first row of the encasement and k2tog.

Rep with the second st, and then pass the first st over the 2nd to bind 1 st off. Cont in this manner until all stitches for the hood have been bound off and the encasement is completely closed.

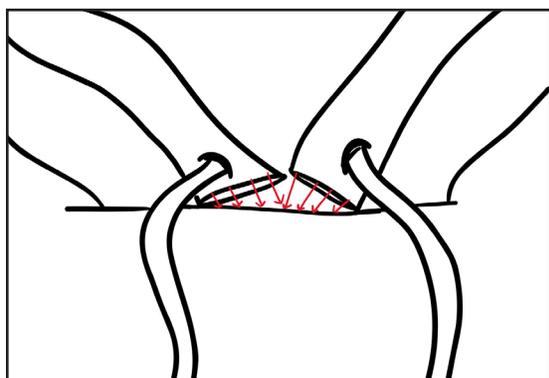
Finish the I-cord drawstring, by tying a knot in each end so that they can't be pulled thru the eyelets in the hood.

To close the bottom of each encasement, attach yarn and using the mattress stitch, seam it to the gap you left at the front collar when picking up stitches for the hood, using 1/2 the gap for each encasement.



FINISHING

Weave in ends.

Wet block sweater by letting it soak in lukewarm bath with wool wash for at least 15 minutes. Gently squeeze the excess water from your sweater.

Sandwich sweater between clean towels and step on top to remove as much moisture as possible. Repeat with fresh towels if necessary.

Lay sweater flat to dry using the schematic to help achieve the desired shape and measurements. Trim yarn tails and wear!
