DETAILS

The Weekender Crew is born of the wonderful requests I receive from amazing knitters to my inbox. Topping the wishlist has always been an alternate neckline for those who aren't comfortable in a boat neck, followed closely by a DK version, and warm-weather friendly yarn option. But I didn't stop there! I also decided to bring the drop shoulder down the sleeves for an extra polished finish, and of course, I couldn't pass up the chance to add pockets! I hope the Weekender Crew fills another gap in your wardrobe!



SIZES

0 (1, 2, 3)(**4, 5, 6**)(7, 8, 9)



FINISHED CHEST CIRCUMFERENCE

34 (38.5, 41.5, 46)(**50.5, 54, 58**)(61, 66, 70.5)"

86.5 (98, 105.5, 117)(**128.5, 137, 147.5**)(155, 167.5, 179) cm

Intended to be worn with approx. 8 - 12"/20.5 - 30.5 cm positive ease.

Sample shown in size 3 with approx. 12"/30.5 cm positive ease (grey)

and also in size 2 with approx. 7"/18 cm positive ease (green).



YARN

DK Weight - Wool/Cotton Blend or 100% CVM Wool

308 (345, 379, 424)(**465, 497, 559**)(594, 640, 688) g

1016 (1139, 1251, 1399)(**1535, 1640, 1845**)(1960, 2112, 2270) yds

929 (1041, 1143, 1279)(**1403, 1500, 1686**)(1792, 1931, 2075) m

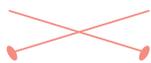


SUGGESTED YARN

Green Sample - Brooklyn Tweed - Dapple 60% Colorado Merino wool/40% Texas Organic Cotton (50 g/165 yds/150 m)

7 (7, 8, 9)(**10, 10, 12**)(12, 13, 14) skeins Seafoam

Grey Sample - 3 ply Handspun yarn, spun from 100% CVM wool



SUGGESTED NEEDLES

Main Fabric: US 6/4 mm - 32-40"/80-100 cm circular and preferred needles for small circumference knitting (Magic Loop or Double Pointed Needles)

Ribbing: US 4/3.5 mm - 32-40"/80-100 cm circular and preferred needles for small circumference knitting. Plus a spare needle for the 3-needle bind off on the shoulders.

(Use the needle size you need to achieve gauge, going down two US sizes for the ribbing.)



NOTIONS

Stitch markers (4), tapestry needle, stitch holders or waste yarn



GAUGE

21 sts & 33 rows = 4"/10 cm

Measured over stockinette stitch in the round using the Main Fabric needle, after blocking.



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NOTES

- This sweater is worked from the bottom up, seamlessly, except for a small seam at the underarms. Starting with a split hem, the body is joined in the round and worked that way until the divide for the sleeves. The remainder is worked flat, and the shoulders are finished with an exposed seam created using the 3 needle bind off.
- To pick your best size, measure your full bust and add your desired ease, then pick the finished chest circumference closest to that number. Choose the amount of ease that best suits your personal style!
- You can easily adjust however much length you would like to the body of the sweater before separating the front and back for the Yoke. Take into account this will change how much yardage is needed.
- The body is reverse stockinette and the sleeves & pockets are stockinette stitch.
- Since most of us prefer to work the knit stitch over the purl stitch, we will be working the body of this sweater inside out. To avoid confusion with RS (right side) & WS (wrong side), we will instead use knit side & purl side, while knitting the yoke of the sweater.
- Sleeve Fabric: In my experience, I have found that most of us knit tighter when working small circumference (IE sleeves) than larger circumference (IE body). Therefore, I HIGHLY recommend checking your sleeve gauge to make sure it is has not tightened up too much, resulting in sleeves that will be too small. If your gauge has tightened, I recommend going up a needle size (or more) to continue in the gauge required for this sweater.

- To resolve a wrapped KNIT stitch on the KNIT Side: With the LHN tilted down, lift the back of the wrap onto the needle, knit the wrap and wrapped stitch together.
- To resolve a wrapped PURL stitch on the PURL Side: Slip wrapped stitch to RHN, insert LHN into wrap, pull it up onto RHN, slip stitch and wrap back to LHN, purl them together.
- A note on my handspun: I used 100% undyed CVM from Winterwind Farm Roubaix Wool. Thanks to the carded prep, the final yarn was nice and light. More of a semi-woolen yarn, even though I used a short-forward draft to spin it. The finished yarn is a 3-ply DK weight, coming in at 11 WPI. For substitutions using ready-to-knit yarn, I recommend seeking out a nice light yarn. Woolen-spun would be lovely.



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— GLOSSARY —

{ } - Repeat

BO - Bind off

BOR - Beginning of round

CO - Cast on

CONT - Continue

DEC/'D - Decrease/d

EST - Established

INC/'D - Increase/d

K - Knit

K1-F/B - Knit into the front loop and then the back loop of the stitch. [1 st inc'd]

K2TOG - Knit 2 stitches together as one. [1 st dec'd]

LHN - Left hand needle

M - Marker

P - Purl

P1-F/B - Purl into the front loop and then the back loop of the stitch. [1 st inc'd]

PM - Place marker

PREV - Previously

REP - Repeat

REM - Remain

RHN - Right hand needle

RM - Remove marker

RND/S - Round/s

RS - Right side

SL - Slip stitch purlwise

SM - Slip marker

ST/S - Stitch/es

SSK - Slip, slip, knit: Slip two stitches, one at a time, as if to knit, insert left needle into these stitches and knit them together thru the back loops. [1 st dec'd]

W&T - Wrap and turn: Knit Row (Purl Row) Slip next stitch to right hand needle, pass yarn from back (front) to front (back), slip stitch back to left hand needle. Turn to work other side, passing yarn to front (back) of work. It is a good practice to give the yarn a little tug to keep your wraps snug.

WS - Wrong side

WYIF - With yarn in front

WYIB - With yarn in back



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— DIRECTIONS —

BOTTOM BACK HEM

With the Ribbing needle, CO 89 (101, 109, 121)(133, 141, 153)(161, 173, 185) sts using the Tubular-cast on method. *Do NOT join in the round.*

Tubular Setup Row 1 (WS): Sl 1 wyif, {k1-tbl, sl 1 wyif} to the end.

Tubular Setup Row 2 (RS): K1, {sl 1 wyif, k1} to the end.

Ribbing Row 1 (WS): Sl 1 wyif, {k1, p1} to the end of the row.

Ribbing Row 2 (RS): Sl 1 wyib, {p1, k1} to the end of the row.

Continue in 1x1 ribbing until Back Hem measures 3"/7.5 cm from the CO edge, ending with Ribbing Row 2. Place sts on hold using waste yarn or a spare needle. Break yarn.

BOTTOM FRONT HEM

Repeat the instructions for the Bottom Back Hem, knitting the ribbing until the hem measures 2"/5 cm from the CO edge, ending with Ribbing Row 2. *Do NOT break yarn.*

JOIN TO WORK IN THE ROUND

With the WS of the Front Hem facing, {p1, k1} to the last st, p1, place a marker for the side seam and join to the Back Hem (also with WS facing), {p1, k1} to the last st, p1, place a BOR marker and join to work in the rnd.

178 (202, 218, 242)(266, 282, 306)(322, 346, 370) total sts

Ribbing Rnd: *{P1, k1} to 1 st before m, p1,* sm and rep from * to * once more. Rep [Ribbing Rnd] until the hem measures 3"/7.5 cm from the Front CO edge.

BODY

Since most of us prefer to work the knit stitch over the purl stitch, we will be working the body of this sweater inside out. Throughout the body of the sweater we will create faux seams at the center front and back by slipping each seam stitch every other row.

Change to Main Fabric needle.

Setup Rnd: K44 (50, 54, 60)(66, 70, 76) (80, 86, 92) sts across the Front Hem, PM for front center seam, sl 1 wyif, knit to m, sm, k44 (50, 54, 60)(66, 70, 76)(80, 86, 92) sts, PM for the back center seam, sl 1 wyif, knit to end of rnd.

Rnd 1: *Knit to m, sm, p1, knit to m, sm; rep from * once more.

Rnd 2: *Knit to m, sm, sl 1 wyif, knit to m, sm; rep from * once more.

Rep [Rnds 1 & 2] until piece measures 13"/33 cm from the back CO edge, ending with Rnd 2.

SEPARATE FOR YOKE

Remove BOR M. Using the Cable Cast On Method (tutorial on pg. 3), CO 7 underarm sts, knit across new sts and Front sts to m, sm, p1, knit to m, rm, using the Backwards Loop Method (tutorial on pg. 3), CO 7 underarm sts, turn. The remaining Back sts may be placed on hold using waste yarn or spare needle to be worked later.

14 sts inc'd; 103 (115, 123, 135)(147, 155, 167)(175, 187, 199) Front Yoke Sts



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— DIRECTIONS —

FRONT YOKE

Row 1 (Purl Side): K1, purl to 1 st before m, sl 1 wyib, sm, purl to the last st, k1.

Row 2 (Knit Side): P1, knit to m, sm, p1, knit to the last st, p1.

Rep [Rows 1 & 2] until piece measures 3.5 (4, 4.5, 5)(**5.5, 6, 7**)(7.5, 8, 8.5) / 9 (10, 11.5, 12.5)(**14, 15, 18**)(19, 20.5, 21.5) cm from the separation of front and back, ending with Row 2.

FRONT NECK BIND OFF

With Purl Side facing, k1, p43 (49, 52, 58)(**64, 68, 73**)(76, 82, 88) sts, k1-f/b, k1, BO 1 by pulling the new st created by the k1-f/b over the st you just knit, BO 13 (13, 15, 15)(**15, 15, 17**)(19, 19, 19) more sts, (removing m as it's encountered), purl to the last st, k1.

45 (51, 54, 60)(**66, 70, 75**)(78, 84, 90) sts rem on either side of the neck BO.

RIGHT FRONT SHOULDER (as worn)

The Right and Left Front Shoulders will be worked separately. The Left Front (as worn) sts may be placed on hold.

Short Row 1 (Knit Side): P1, knit to the last st, sl 1 wyif.

Short Row 2 (Purl Side/Dec): Sl 2 wyib, pass the first st over the top of the second and off the needle, BO 3 (3, 3, 3)(**4, 4, 4**)(4, 4, 4) more sts, purl to the last 3 (4, 4, 5)(**5, 6, 6**)(7, 7, 8) sts, W&T. [4 (4, 4, 4)(**5, 5, 5**)(5, 5, 5) sts dec'd]

Short Row 3: Knit to the last st, sl 1 wyif.

Short Row 4 (DEC): Sl 2 wyib, pass the first st over the top of the second and off the needle, BO 2 (2, 2, 2)(**3, 3, 3**)(3, 3, 3) more sts, purl to 3 (4, 4, 5)(**5, 6, 6**)(7, 7, 8) sts before prev wrapped st, W&T. [3 (3, 3, 3)(**4, 4, 4**)(4, 4, 4) sts dec'd]

Short Row 5: Knit to the last st, sl 1 wyif.

Short Row 6 (DEC): Sl 2 wyib, pass the first st over the top of the second and off the needle, BO 1 (1, 1, 1)(**2, 2, 2**)(2, 2, 2) more st/s, purl to 3 (4, 4, 5)(**5, 6, 6**)(7, 7, 8) sts before prev wrapped st, W&T. [2 (2, 2, 2)(**3, 3, 3**)(3, 3, 3) sts dec'd]

Short Row 7: Knit to the last st, sl 1 wyif.

Short Row 8 (DEC): Sl 2 wyib, pass the first st over the top of the second and off the needle, BO - (-, -, -)(**-, 1, -**)(1, 1, 1) more sts, purl to 3 (4, 4, 5)(**5, 6, 6**)(7, 7, 8) sts before prev wrapped st, W&T. [1 (1, 1, 1)(**1, 2, 1**)(2, 2, 2) st/s dec'd]

SIZES 0, 1 & 4 ONLY

Short Row 9: Knit to the last st, p1.

Short Row 10: K1, purl to 3 (4, -, -)(**5, -, -**)(-, -, -) sts before prev wrapped st, W&T.

SIZES 2, 3, 5, 6, 7, 8 & 9 ONLY

Short Row 9: Knit to the last st, sl 1 wyif.

Short Row 10 (DEC): Sl 2 wyib, pass the first st over the top of the second and off the needle, purl to - (-, 4, 5)(**-, 6, 6**)(7, 7, 8) sts before prev wrapped st, W&T. [1 st dec'd]

ALL SIZES - 35 (41, 43, 49)(**53, 55, 61**)(63, 69, 75) sts rem

ALL SIZES

Short Row 11: Knit to the last st, p1.

Short Row 12: K1, purl to 3 (4, 4, 5)(**5, 6, 6**)(7, 7, 8) sts before prev wrapped st, W&T.

Short Row 13: Knit to the last st, p1.

Rep [Short Rows 12 & 13] 3 more times.



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— DIRECTIONS —

Row 20: K1, purl to the last st, resolving the wrapped sts as they are encountered (slip the wrapped stitch to RHN, insert LHN into wrap, pull it up onto RHN, slip stitch and wrap back to LHN, purl them together), k1.

RIGHT FRONT SHOULDER RIBBING

Change to Ribbing needle.

Ribbing Row 1 (Knit Side): P2, {k1, p1} to the last st, p1.

Ribbing Row 2 (Purl Side): K2, {p1, k1} to the last st, k1.

Rep [Ribbing Rows 1 & 2] 8 more times.
Place sts on hold & break yarn.

LEFT FRONT SHOULDER (as worn)

Return the Left Front sts to the Main Fabric needle and with Purl Side facing, attach yarn at the sleeve opening edge.

Short Row 1 (Purl Side): K1, purl to the last st, sl 1 wyif.

Short Row 2 (Knit Side/Dec): Sl 2 wyib, pass the first st over the top of the second and off the needle, BO 3 (3, 3, 3)(4, 4, 4)(4, 4, 4) more sts, knit to the last 3 (4, 4, 5)(5, 6, 6)(7, 7, 8) sts, W&T. [4 (4, 4, 4)(5, 5, 5)(5, 5, 5) sts dec'd]

Short Row 3: Purl to the last st, sl 1 wyif.

Short Row 4 (DEC): Sl 2 wyib, pass the first st over the top of the second and off the needle, BO 2 (2, 2, 2)(3, 3, 3)(3, 3, 3) more sts, knit to 3 (4, 4, 5)(5, 6, 6)(7, 7, 8) sts before prev wrapped st, W&T. [3 (3, 3, 3)(4, 4, 4)(4, 4, 4) sts dec'd]

Short Row 5: Purl to the last st, sl 1 wyif.

Short Row 6 (DEC): Sl 2 wyib, pass the first st over the top of the second and off the needle, BO 1 (1, 1, 1)(2, 2, 2)(2, 2, 2) more st/s, knit to 3 (4, 4, 5)(5, 6, 6)(7, 7, 8) sts before prev wrapped st, W&T. [2 (2, 2, 2)(3, 3, 3)(3, 3, 3) sts dec'd]

Short Row 7: Purl to the last st, sl 1 wyif.

Short Row 8 (DEC): Sl 2 wyib, pass the first st over the top of the second and off the needle, BO - (-, -, -)(-, 1, -)(1, 1, 1) more sts, knit to 3 (4, 4, 5)(5, 6, 6)(7, 7, 8) sts before prev wrapped st, W&T. [1 (1, 1, 1)(1, 2, 1)(2, 2, 2) st/s dec'd]

SIZES 0, 1 & 4 ONLY

Short Row 9: Purl to the last st, k1.

Short Row 10: P1, knit to 3 (4, -, -)(5, -, -)(-, -, -) sts before prev wrapped st, W&T.

SIZES 2, 3, 5, 6, 7, 8 & 9 ONLY

Short Row 9: Purl to the last st, sl 1 wyif.

Short Row 10 (DEC): Sl 2 wyib, pass the first st over the top of the second and off the needle, knit to - (-, 4, 5)(-, 6, 6)(7, 7, 8) sts before prev wrapped st, W&T. [1 st dec'd]

ALL SIZES - 35 (41, 43, 49)(53, 55, 61)(63, 69, 75) sts rem

ALL SIZES

Short Row 11: Purl to the last st, k1.

Short Row 12: P1, knit to 3 (4, 4, 5)(5, 6, 6)(7, 7, 8) sts before prev wrapped st, W&T.

Short Row 13: Purl to the last st, k1.

Rep [Short Rows 12 & 13] 3 more times.

Row 20: P1, knit to the last st, resolving the wrapped sts as they are encountered (with the LHN tilted down, lift the back of the wrap onto the needle, knit the wrap and wrapped stitch together), p1.



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— DIRECTIONS —

LEFT FRONT SHOULDER RIBBING

Change to Ribbing needle.

Ribbing Row 1 (Purl Side): K2, {p1, k1} to the last st, k1.

Ribbing Row 2 (Knit Side): P2, {k1, p1} to the last st, p1.

Rep [Ribbing Rows 1 & 2] 8 more times.
Place sts on hold & break yarn.

BACK YOKE

Return the Back sts to the Main Fabric needle with the Knit Side facing and attach the yarn to the right sleeve edge. Using the Cable Cast On Method (tutorial on pg. 3), CO 7 underarm sts, knit across new sts and Back sts to m, sm, p1, knit to end, using the Backwards Loop Method (tutorial on pg. 3), CO 7 underarm sts, turn.

14 sts inc'd; 103 (115, 123, 135)(**147, 155, 167**)(175, 187, 199) Back Yoke Sts

Row 1 (Purl Side): K1, purl to 1 st before m, sl 1 wyib, sm, purl to the last st, k1.

Row 2 (Knit Side): P1, knit to m, sm, p1, knit to the last st, p1.

Rep [Rows 1 & 2] until piece measures 3.5 (4, 4.5, 5)(**5.5, 6, 7**)(7.5, 8, 8.5)" / 9 (10, 11.5, 12.5)(**14, 15, 18**)(19, 20.5, 21.5) cm from the separation of front and back, ending with Row 2.

SHOULDER SHAPING

Short Row 1 (Purl Side): K1, purl to 1 st before m, sl 1 wyib, sm, purl to the last 3 (4, 4, 5)(**5, 6, 6**)(7, 7, 8) sts, W&T.

Short Row 2 (Knit Side): Knit to m, sm, p1, knit to the last 3 (4, 4, 5)(**5, 6, 6**)(7, 7, 8) sts, W&T.

Short Row 3: Purl to 1 st before m, sl 1 wyib, sm, purl to 3 (4, 4, 5)(**5, 6, 6**)(7, 7, 8) sts before prev wrapped st, W&T.

Short Row 4: Knit to m, sm, p1, knit to 3 (4, 4, 5)(**5, 6, 6**)(7, 7, 8) sts before prev wrapped st, W&T.

Rep [Short Rows 3 & 4] 7 more times.

Short Row 19: Purl to 1 st before m, sl 1 wyib, sm, purl to the last st, resolving the wrapped sts as they are encountered (slip the wrapped stitch to RHN, insert LHN into wrap, pull it up onto RHN, slip stitch and wrap back to LHN, purl them together), k1.

Row 20: P1, knit to m, rm, p1, knit to the last st, resolving the wrapped sts as they are encountered (with the LHN tilted down, lift the back of the wrap onto the needle, knit the wrap and wrapped stitch together), p1.

BACK SHOULDER RIBBING

Change to Ribbing needle.

Ribbing Row 1 (Purl Side): K2, {p1, k1} to the last st, k1.

Ribbing Row 2 (Knit Side): P2, {k1, p1} to the last st, p1.

Rep [Ribbing Rows 1 & 2] 4 more times.

Place Back Neck Sts on hold: Work in est ribbing pattern for 41 (47, 49, 55)(**59, 61, 67**)(69, 75, 81) sts, break yarn, place 21 (21, 25, 25)(**29, 33, 33**)(37, 37, 37) sts on hold for the back neck, rejoin the working yarn and cont in est ribbing to end of row.



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LEFT BACK SHOULDER (as worn)

The Left and Right Back Shoulders will be worked separately. The Right Back (as worn) sts may be placed on hold.

Row 1 (Knit Side): Work in the est ribbing to the last st, sl 1 wyif.

Row 2 (Purl Side/DEC): Sl 2 wyib, pass the first st over the top of the second and off the needle, BO 2 more sts, cont in est ribbing to end. [3 sts dec'd]

Row 3: Work in the est ribbing to the last st, sl 1 wyif.

Row 4 (DEC): Sl 2 wyib, pass the first st over the top of the second and off the needle, BO 1 more st, cont in est ribbing to end. [2 sts dec'd]

Row 5: Work in the est ribbing to the last st, sl 1 wyif.

Row 6 (DEC): Sl 2 wyib, pass the first st over the top of the second and off the needle, cont in est ribbing to end. [1 st dec'd]

Row 7: P2, {k1, p1} to the last st, p1. Place sts on hold and break yarn.
35 (41, 43, 49)(**53, 55, 61**)(63, 69, 75) sts rem

RIGHT BACK SHOULDER (as worn)

Return the Right Back sts to the Ribbing needle and with Purl Side facing, attach yarn at the sleeve opening edge.

Row 1 (Purl Side): Work in the est ribbing to the last st, sl 1 wyif.

Row 2 (Knit Side/DEC): Sl 2 wyib, pass the first st over the top of the second and off the needle, BO 2 more sts, cont in est ribbing to end. [3 sts dec'd]

Row 3: Work in the est ribbing to the last st, sl 1 wyif.

Row 4 (DEC): Sl 2 wyib, pass the first st over the top of the second and off the needle, BO 1 more st, cont in est ribbing to end. [2 sts dec'd]

Row 5: Work in the est ribbing to the last st, sl 1 wyif.

Row 6 (DEC): Sl 2 wyib, pass the first st over the top of the second and off the needle, cont in est ribbing to end. [1 st dec'd]

Row 7: K2, {p1, k1} to the last st, k1. Place sts on hold and break yarn.
35 (41, 43, 49)(**53, 55, 61**)(63, 69, 75) sts rem

SHOULDER FINISHING

With the sweater Purl Side out (to create an exposed seam), so that the WS (knit side) of front and back are facing each other, and the front of the sweater facing you, BO the first shoulder using the Three Needle Bind Off as follows:

Line up the shoulder sts from the front and the back of the sweater on parallel needles. Using a third needle, insert needle tip knitwise into the first stitch on the front needle and then knitwise into the first stitch on the back needle, and knit them together; *knit the next stitch from each needle together, slip the first stitch over the second; repeat from * until 1 stitch remains. Break yarn and pull it through the remaining live stitch to secure. Repeat for the other shoulder.



THE WEEKENDER CREW

— DIRECTIONS —

SLEEVES - same for both

The sleeves are stockinette stitch (instead of the reverse stockinette stitch of the body).

Using Mattress stitch with Purl Side facing out, seam the 7 sts that were CO to the Front armhole edge to the 7 sts that were CO to the Back armhole edge, which creates the beginning of the sleeve.

Using Main Fabric needle (or going up a size to maintain gauge - see Notes on pg. 3), in preferred method for small circumference knitting, join yarn at the underarm and pick up and knit 58 (62, 68, 74)**(78, 84, 94)**(100, 104, 110) sts around the armhole. Place a BOR marker and join to work in the round.

Knit even for 0.5"/1 cm.

Dec Rnd: K1, k2tog, knit to the last 3 sts, ssk, k1. [2 sts dec'd]

Repeat the Dec Rnd every 1.75 (1.25, 1.25, 1.25)**(1, 0.75, 0.75)**(0.5, 0.5, 0.5)"/4.5 (3, 3, 3)**(2.5, 2, 2)**(1, 1, 1) cm - 7 (9, 9, 10)**(12, 15, 17)**(20, 22, 25) *more times.*

16 (20, 20, 22)**(26, 32, 36)**(42, 46, 52) sts dec'd; 42 (42, 48, 52)**(52, 52, 58)**(58, 58, 58) sts rem.

Work even in stockinette stitch until the sleeve measures 15"/38 cm (or 2"/5 cm less than your desired length) from the edge of where the sleeve connects to the body. *Note: I found the sleeves to grow in noticeable length, even though the body growth was minimal. I had close to 1"/2.5 cm of sleeve length growth. Yours may vary depending on tension and yarn choice.*

CUFF

Change to Ribbing needle.

Ribbing Pattern: {K1, p1} to end of rnd.

Cont in the est ribbing pattern for 2"/5 cm. (If you prefer not to do a Tubular BO, cont the ribbing until it measures 2.25"/5.5 cm, then BO in pattern.)

Tubular BO Setup Rnd 1: {K1, sl 1 wyif} to the end.

Tubular BO Setup Rnd 2: {Sl 1 wyib, p1} to the end.

Sl each st purlwise, slipping the knit sts onto the working needle and the purl sts onto a spare needle, OR reference the Kitchener Stitch on One Needle Tutorial linked in the Notes on pg. 3 to skip this step.

Break yarn, leaving a tail 3 x the length of the sts to be bound off, and BO all sts using the Kitchener stitch.

Repeat for other sleeve.

COLLAR

Return 21 (21, 25, 25)**(29, 33, 33)**(37, 37, 37) held Back Neck sts to the Ribbing needle, join yarn at left edge of live sts & pick up and knit 83 (87, 83, 91)**(87, 87, 91)**(91, 91, 91) sts around the rem neckline, place a BOR M, and join to work in the round with the Back Neck sts.

104 (108, 108, 116)**(116, 120, 124)**(128, 128, 128) sts

Ribbing Pattern: {K1, p1} to end of rnd.

Cont in the est ribbing pattern for 2"/5 cm. (If you prefer not to do a Tubular BO, cont the ribbing until it measures 2.25"/5.5 cm, then BO in pattern.)



THE WEEKENDER CREW

— DIRECTIONS —

Tubular BO Setup Rnd 1: {K1, sl 1 wyif} to the end.

Tubular BO Setup Rnd 2: {Sl 1 wyib, p1} to the end.

Sl each st purlwise, slipping the knit sts onto the working needle and the purl sts onto a spare needle, OR reference the Kitchener Stitch on One Needle Tutorial linked in the Notes on pg. 3 to skip this step.

Break yarn, leaving a tail 3 x the length of the sts to be bound off, and BO all sts using the Kitchener stitch.

POCKETS (same for both)

Using Main Fabric needle and the Twisted German Cast On, CO 29 sts. Like the sleeves, the pockets will be knit with the knit side as the Right Side.

Row 1 (WS): Sl 1 wyif, purl to end.

Row 2 (RS): Sl 1 wyib, knit to end.

Rep [Rows 1 & 2] for 4.5"/11.5 cm, ending with a WS row.

Change to Ribbing Needle.

Ribbing Row 1 (RS): Sl 1 wyib, {k1, p1} to the last 2 sts, k2.

Ribbing Row 2 (WS): Sl 1 wyif, {p1, k1} to the last 2 sts, p2.

Rep [Ribbing Rows 1 & 2] twice more.

Rep [Ribbing Row 1] once more.

Tubular BO Setup Row 1 (WS): Sl 1 wyif, {sl 1 wyif, k1} to the last 2 sts, sl 1 wyif, p1.

Tubular BO Setup Rnd 2 (RS): Sl 1 wyib, {k1, sl 1 wyif} to the end.

Sl each st purlwise, slipping the knit sts onto the working needle and the purl sts onto a spare needle, OR reference the Kitchener Stitch on One Needle Tutorial linked in the Notes on pg. 3 to skip this step.

Break yarn, leaving a tail 3 x the length of the sts to be bound off, and BO all sts using the Kitchener stitch.

Repeat for other pocket.

FINISHING

Weave in ends. Wet block sweater & pockets by letting them soak in lukewarm bath with wool wash for at least 15 minutes. Gently squeeze the excess water from your sweater. Sandwich sweater & pockets between clean towels and step on top to remove as much moisture as possible. Repeat with fresh towels if necessary.

Lay sweater flat to dry using the schematic to help achieve the desired shape and measurements. You may find it useful to pin pockets while drying, so the edges don't curl up.

Sew pockets onto front of sweater. I just eyeballed their placement - centering each pocket between the center seam and the side edge of each front side, about 1"/2.5 cm up from the ribbed hem. You may find this tutorial helpful if you are new to sewing on patch pockets:

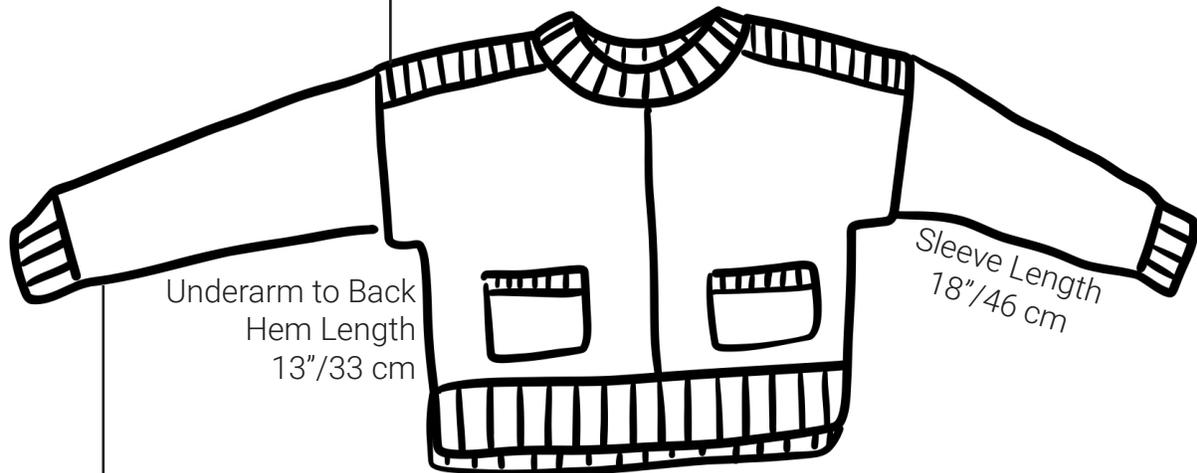
