

Designed with 15-25 cm / 6-10 inches of positive ease. The model in the picture has a chest circumference of 85 cm / 33.5 inches and is wearing a size 3.

PATTERN INFORMATION

The Thekla Polo is worked from the top-down in reverse stockinette stitch with narrow stripes in two colors. The collar and yoke are worked back and forth using short rows and raglan increases. The body and sleeves are worked in the round in stockinette stitch so that the knit side faces outward. Color changes are made on the right side to avoid visible joins. Finally, the work is turned inside out so that the purl side with the neat stripes is visible, and button bands are added along the front panels.

PATTERN

COLLAR

CO 89 (89) 92 (92) 95 (97) 101 (101) 104 sts using the tubular cast on and a piece of scrap yarn on needles 2.5 mm. This method for tubular cast-on will create a very neat and even edge. Knit one row and break the scrap yarn. Change to color A and work 4 rows:

1. row: Knit across.

2. row: sl1wyif, purl until 1 st remains, k1.

3. row: sl1wyif, knit across.

4. row: k1, *count down 3 rows in your work, and pick up the first purl 'bump' in color A with the left-hand needle, it is located just below the last row with waste yarn, and knit it, p1*, repeat from * to * until 2 sts remain, finish with k1 in the purl 'bump' 3 rows down, k1 = 177 (177) 183 (183) 189 (193) 201 (201) 207 sts.

Work back and forth in rib stitch with two selvage sts in each side as follows:

1. row: sl2wyif, [k1, p1] until 3 sts remain, k1, sl2wyif.

2. row: k2, [p1, k1] until 3 sts remain, p1, k2.

Repeat rows 1-2 while on the next row dividing your work with 4 stitch markers as follows:

36 (36) 38 (38) 38 (40) 40 (40) 40 sts (front panel), PM,

18 (18) 18 (18) 20 (20) 24 (24) 26 sts (sleeve), PM,

69 (69) 71 (71) 73 (73) 73 (73) 75 sts (back panel), PM,

18 (18) 18 (18) 20 (20) 24 (24) 26 sts (sleeve), PM,

36 (36) 38 (38) 38 (40) 40 (40) 40 sts (front panel).

Continue like this until your work measures 1.5 cm / 0.5 inches, end with a row 1. The waste yarn can be removed after working a few rows of rib stitch, or later if preferred.

Shape the front edges of the collar by decreasing in each of the next rows as follows:

Row 1: k2, p1, k1, p1, ssk, work in rib as sts appear until 7 sts remain, k2tog, p1, k1, p1, k2. 2 sts decreased.

Row 2: sl2wyif, work as sts appear, end with sl2wyif.

Row 3: k2, work as sts appear, end with k2.

Rows 4-6: Work as 2.-3. row.

Repeat rows 1-6 a total of 4 times = 169 (169) 175 (175) 181 (185) 193 (193) 199 sts.

Continue back and forth in rib stitch with 2 selvedge sts in each side, without further decreases, until the collar measures 7 cm / 2.75 inches, ending with a row that begins and ends with sl2wyif.

Short rows

You will now raise the collar at the back using short rows. Work back and forth in rib stitch with short rows as follows:

Short row 1: k2, work rib as sts appear until the last st before the 4th marker on the row, turn.

Short row 2: Turning-st, work rib as sts appear until the last st before the 4th marker on the row, turn.

Short row 3: Turning-st, work rib as sts appear until 2 sts before the last turning-st, turn.

Short row 4: Turning-st, work rib as sts appear until 2 sts before the last turning-st, turn.

Short rows 5-10: Work as short rows 3-4.

Short row 11: Turning-st, work rib as sts appear until 2 sts remain, k2.

Short row 12: sl2wyif, work rib as sts appear, end with sl2wyif.

You have now worked 10 short rows in total, 5 on each side between the markers for the sleeves.

Double knitted edge

At the transition between the collar and the body, you will work a firm edge in double knitting to give some structure to the neckline. Work back and forth as follows:

Row 1: k2, [sl1wyif, k1] until 3 sts remain, sl1wyif, k2.

Row 2: sl2wyif, [k1, sl1wyif] until 3 sts remain, k1, sl2wyif.

Repeat rows 1–2 a total of 4 times.

Change to 3.5 mm needles and bind off the edge on the next row, decreasing as sts are worked together knitwise or purlwise as follows:

sl1wyif, k1, p2tog, [k2tog] 9 (9) 10 (9) 9 (10) 10 (9) 9 times, [M1R, k2tog] 2 (2) 2 (3) 3 (3) 3 (4) 4 times, [p2tog] 3 times = 19 (19) 20 (21) 21 (22) 22 (23) 23 sts (front panel), SM,

[k2tog] 8 (8) 8 (8) 8 (8) 8 (10) 10 times, [M1R, k2tog] 1 (1) 1 (1) 2 (2) 2 (2) 2 times = 10 (10) 10 (10) 12 (12) 14 (14) 16 sts (sleeve), SM,

[p2tog] 3 times, [k2tog, M1R] 2 (2) 3 (4) 3 (4) 4 (5) 5 times, [k2tog] 12 (12) 12 (11) 12 (11) 11 (10) 11 times, k1, [ssk] 12 (12) 12 (11) 12 (11) 11 (10) 11 times, [M1R, ssk] 2 (2) 2 (3) 3 (4) 4 (5) 4 times, [ssp] 3 times = 39 (39) 41 (43) 43 (45) 45 (47) 47 sts (back panel), SM,

[ssk] 8 (8) 8 (8) 8 (8) 8 (10) 10 times, [M1R, ssk] 1 (1) 1 (1) 2 (2) 2 (2) 2 times = 10 (10) 10 (10) 12 (12) 14 (14) 16 sts (sleeve), SM,

[ssp] 3 times, [ssk, M1R] 2 (2) 2 (3) 3 (3) 3 (4) 4 times, [ssk] 10 (10) 11 (10) 10 (11) 11 (10) 10 times, sl1wyif, k1 = 19 (19) 20 (21) 21 (22) 22 (23) 23 sts (front panel).

You will now have a total of 97 (97) 101 (105) 109 (113) 117 (121) 125 sts on your needles.

YOKE

Break the yarn and turn your work, so both yarn ends hang on the right-hand side of your work. You will now work short rows again to shape the neckline curve at the front. At the same time, work raglan increases on every 2nd row and stripes, alternating between 2 rows with color A and 2 rows with color B. The color change is placed in the middle of a row at one raglan seam, with the change color happening at the back of the work, that is, on the knit side of the fabric. Raglan increases and color changes are described row by row below.

Slip 29 (29) 30 (31) 33 (34) 36 (37) 39 sts from left to right needle, join color B and work short rows and stripes as follows:

Short row 1: SM, k3, purl to 3 sts before next marker, k3, SM, purl to next marker, SM, k3, p2, turn.

Short row 2 (increase row): Turning-st, k1, M1R, p3, SM, M1L, knit to next marker, M1R, SM, p3, M1L, knit to 3 sts before next marker, M1R, k3, SM, pick up the yarn tail in color B and knit it tbl, knit to next marker, M1R, SM, p3, M1L, k2, turn. 8 sts increased.

Short row 3: Turning-st, purl to 3 sts before marker, k3, SM, purl to next marker, YO, SM, change color, k3, purl to 3 sts before next marker, k3, SM, purl to next marker, SM, k3, purl 2 sts past the last turning point, turn.

Short row 4 (increase row): Turning-st, knit to 3 sts before next marker, M1R, p3, SM, M1L, knit to next marker, M1R, SM, p3, M1L, knit to 3 sts before next marker, M1R, k3, SM, knit YO tbl, knit to next marker, M1R, SM, p3, M1L, knit to 2 sts past the last turning point, turn. 8 sts increased.

Repeat short rows 3–4 a total of 4 (4) 4 (4) 4 (5) 5 (5) 5 times.

Next row: Turning-st, purl to 3 sts before marker, k3, SM, purl to next marker, YO, SM, change color, k3, purl to 3 sts before next marker, k3, SM, purl to next marker, SM, k3, purl until 3 sts remain, k1, sl1wyif, k1.

You have now made 10 (10) 10 (10) 10 (12) 12 (12) 12 turns in total, 5 (5) 5 (5) 5 (6) 6 (6) 6 on each side of the front panels. A total of 5 (5) 5 (5) 5 (6) 6 (6) 6 rows with increases have been worked, and the stitch distribution is now 24 (24) 25 (26) 26 (28) 28 (29) 29 sts on each front panel, 20 (20) 20 (20) 22 (24) 26 (26) 28 sts on each sleeve, plus one YO at the color change on one sleeve, and 49 (49) 51 (53) 53 (57) 57 (59) 59 sts on the back panel = a total of 137 (137) 141 (145) 149 (161) 165 (169) 173 sts.

Continue back and forth in reverse stockinette stitch and stripes across all sts with increases on every 2nd row, in stripes with 3 selvedge sts in each side as follows:

Row 1: sl1wyif, k1, sl1wyif, knit to 3 sts before next marker, M1R, p3, SM, M1L, knit to next marker, M1R, SM, p3, M1L, knit to 3 sts before next marker, M1R, p3, SM, knit YO tbl, knit to next marker, M1R, SM, p3, M1L, knit to 2 sts remain, sl1wyif, k1. 8 sts increased.

Row 2: sl1wyif, k1, sl1wyif, purl to 3 sts before marker, k3, SM, purl to next marker, YO, SM, change color, k3, purl to 3 sts before next marker, k3, SM, purl to next marker, SM, k3, purl to 3 sts remain, k1, sl1wyif, k1.

Repeat rows 1–2 a total of 15 (16) 16 (18) 19 (21) 26 (33) 37 times. End with row 1.

The stitch distribution is now 39 (40) 41 (44) 45 (49) 54 (62) 66 sts on each front panel, 50 (52) 52 (56) 60 (66) 78 (92) 102 sts on each sleeve, and 79 (81) 83 (89) 91 (99) 109 (125) 133 sts on the back panel = a total of 257 (265) 269 (289) 301 (329) 373 (433) 469 sts.

Sizes - (2) 3 (4) 5 (6) 7 (8) - Only

Continue working increases on every 2nd row on the front and back panels, while now increasing only on every 4th row on the sleeves as follows:

Row 1: sl1wyif, k1, sl1wyif, purl to 3 sts before marker, k3, SM, purl to next marker, SM, change color, k3, purl to 3 sts before next marker, k3, SM, purl to next marker, SM, k3, purl to 3 sts remain, k1, sl1wyif, k1.

Row 2: sl1wyif, k1, sl1wyif, knit to 3 sts before next marker, M1R, p3, SM, knit to next marker, SM, p3, M1L, knit to 3 sts before next marker, M1R, p3, SM, knit to next marker, SM, p3, M1L, knit to 2 sts remain, sl1wyif, k1. 4 sts increased.

Row 3: sl1wyif, k1, sl1wyif, purl to 3 sts before marker, k3, SM, purl to next marker, YO, SM, change color, k3, purl to 3 sts before next marker, k3, SM, purl to next marker, SM, k3, purl until 3 sts remain, k1, sl1wyif, k1.

Row 4: sl1wyif, k1, sl1wyif, knit to 3 sts before next marker, M1R, p3, SM, M1L, knit to next marker, M1R, SM, p3, M1L, knit to 3 sts before next marker, M1R, p3, SM, knit YO tbl, knit to next marker, M1R, SM, p3, M1L, knit until 2 sts remain, sl1wyif, k1. 8 sts increased.

Repeat rows 1–4 a total of – (3) 6 (10) 12 (9) 5 (1) – times.

The stitch distribution is – (46) 53 (64) 69 (67) 64 (64) – sts on each front panel, – (58) 64 (76) 84 (84) 88 (94) – sts on each sleeve, and – (93) 107 (129) 139 (135) 129 (129) – sts on the back panel = a total of – (301) 341 (409) 445 (437) 433 (445) – sts.

Sizes 1 (2) 3 (4) - (-) - (-) - only

Continue increasing every 4th row on the sleeves and on the front and back panels as follows:

Row 1: sl1wyif, k1, sl1wyif, purl to 3 sts before next marker, k3, SM, purl to next marker, SM, change color, k3, purl to 3 sts before next marker, k3, SM, purl to next marker, SM, k3, purl until 3 sts remain, k1, sl1wyif, k1.

Row 2: sl1wyif, k1, sl1wyif, knit to 3 sts before next marker, p3, SM, knit to next marker, SM, p3, knit to 3 sts before next marker, p3, SM, knit to next marker, SM, p3, knit until 2 sts remain, sl1wyif, k1.

Row 3: sl1wyif, k1, sl1wyif, purl to 3 sts before next marker, k3, SM, purl to next marker, YO, SM, change color, k3, purl to 3 sts before next marker, k3, SM, purl to next marker, SM, k3, purl to 3 sts remain, k1, sl1wyif, k1.

Row 4: sl1wyif, k1, sl1wyif, knit to 3 sts before next marker, M1R, p3, SM, M1L, knit to next marker, M1R, SM, p3, M1L, knit to 3 sts before next marker, M1R, p3, SM, knit YO tbl, knit to next marker, M1R, SM, p3, M1L, knit to 2 sts remain, sl1wyif, k1. 8 sts increased.

Repeat rows 1–4 a total of 10 (8) 6 (2) – (–) – (–) – times.

The stitch distribution is 49 (54) 59 (66) – (–) – (–) – sts on each front panel, 70 (74) 76 (80) – (–) – (–) – sts on each sleeve, and 99 (109) 119 (133) – (–) – (–) – sts on the back panel = a total of 337 (365) 389 (425) – (–) – (–) – sts.

Sizes – (–) – (–) – (6) 7 (8) 9 Only

Continue increasing every 4th row on the sleeves and on every row on the front and back panels as follows:

Row 1: sl1wyif, k1, sl1wyif, purl to 3 sts before marker, M1LP, k3, SM, purl to next marker, SM, change color, k3, M1RP, purl to 3 sts before next marker, M1LP, k3, SM, purl to next marker, SM, k3, M1RP, purl until 3 sts remain, k1, sl1wyif, k1. 4 sts increased.

Row 2: sl1wyif, k1, sl1wyif, knit to 3 sts before next marker, M1R, p3, SM, knit to next marker, SM, p3, M1L, knit to 3 sts before next marker, M1R, p3, SM, knit to next marker, SM, p3, M1L, knit until 2 sts remain, sl1wyif, k1. 4 sts increased.

Row 3: sl1wyif, k1, sl1wyif, purl to 3 sts before marker, M1LP, k3, SM, purl to next marker, YO, SM, change color, k3, M1RP, purl to 3 sts before next marker, M1LP, k3, SM, purl to next marker, SM, k3, M1RP, purl until 3 sts remain, k1, sl1wyif, k1. 4 sts increased.

Row 4: sl1wyif, k1, sl1wyif, knit to 3 sts before next marker, M1R, p3, SM, M1L, knit to next marker, M1R, SM, p3, M1L, knit to 3 sts before next marker, M1R, p3, SM, knit YO tbl, knit to next marker, M1R, SM, p3, M1L, knit until 2 sts remain, sl1wyif, k1. 8 sts increased.

Repeat rows 1–4 a total of – (–) – (–) – (2) 4 (5) 6 times.

Note: The slant of the increases will intentionally not appear symmetrical when viewed from the same side of the work.

The stitch distribution is – (–) – (–) – (75) 80 (84) 90 sts on each front panel, – (–) – (–) – (88) 96 (104) 114 sts on each sleeve, and – (–) – (–) – (151) 161 (169) 181 sts on the back panel = a total of – (–) – (–) – (477) 513 (545) 589 sts.

All Sizes

The stitch distribution for all sizes is now 49 (54) 59 (66) 69 (75) 80 (84) 90 sts on each front panel, 70 (74) 76 (80) 84 (88) 96 (104) 114 sts on each sleeve, and 99 (109) 119 (133) 139 (151) 161 (169) 181 sts on the back panel = a total of 337 (365) 389 (425) 445 (477) 513 (545) 589 sts.

BODY

Knit to the color change as follows:

sl1wyif, k1, sl1wyif, purl to 3 sts before marker, k3, SM, purl to next marker, remove marker, turn work.

Place the sleeve sts on hold and knit in the round to join the body sts as follows:

Change color and cast on 13 (15) 17 (19) 21 (23) 23 (25) 25 sts on the right-hand needle using the backwards loop method in continuation of the back panel sts, PM before the middle of the new sts — your round begins here. Place the next 70 (74) 76 (80) 84 (88) 96 (104) 114 sts on hold on a piece of scrap yarn or stitch holder, remove marker, knit to 4 sts before the front panel, k2tog, p2tog, cast on 5 sts using the backwards loop method, [p2tog] 2 times, knit to next marker, remove marker, CO 13 (15) 17 (19) 21 (23) 23 (25) 25 sts using the backwards loop method, place 70 (74) 76 (80) 84 (88) 96 (104) 114 sts on hold on a piece of scrap yarn or stitch holder, remove marker, knit over the back panel sts and to the marker at the beginning of the round = 224 (248) 272 (304) 320 (348) 368 (388) 412 sts.

Work stockinette stitch and stripes in the round, continuing to change color on the knit side of your work, which is now the right side. Work even until your work measures 52 (53) 54 (55) 56 (58) 60 (62) 64 cm / 20.5 (21) 21.25 (21.75) 22 (22.75) 23.5 (23.75) 25.25 inches from the top of the shoulder, or to the desired length minus 5 cm / 2 inches. End with a full stripe in color A.

Ribbed hem

Change to 3 mm needles and color B and work in the round in rib stitch [k2, p2] and stripes, alternating between 3 rounds with color B and 3 rounds with color A. Continue until a total of 7 stripes have been worked. Bind off on the next round in rib stitch or using the tubular bind-off with color B.

SLEEVES

Turn your work with the knit side facing out and place the held sts from one sleeve onto 3.5 mm double-pointed needle. Pick up and knit sts and continue in stripes as follows:

Begin in the middle of the newly cast-on sts at the armhole and pick up and knit 7 (8) 9 (10) 11 (12) 12 (13) 13 sts, knit across 35 (37) 38 (40) 42 (44) 48 (52) 57 sleeve sts, PM, knit the remaining sleeve sts, pick up and knit an additional 7 (8) 9 (10) 11 (12) 12 (13) 13 sts to the middle of the sleeve opening, PM = 84 (90) 94 (100) 106 (112) 120 (130) 140 sts.

Work stockinette stitch and stripes in the round, continuing to change color on the knit side of your work, which is now the right side. At the same time, decrease every 13th (11th) 10th (9th) 8th (7th) 6th (5th) 4th round as follows:

SM, k1, k2tog, knit across - past the marker in the middle of the sleeve - to 3 sts before the last marker, ssk, k1.

Work these decreases a total of 10 (12) 13 (15) 17 (19) 22 (26) 30 times = 64 (66) 68 (70) 72 (74) 76 (78) 80 sts. At the same time, work according to the chart when the sleeve measures

15 (15) 15 (15) 15 (14) 14 (14) 14 cm, ending with a full stripe in color B. Follow the chart for the chosen size and the instructions for either the right or left sleeve.

Note: Turn your work with the purl side facing out and try it on if needed to make sure you are working the correct sleeve.

Right sleeve

Work according to the chart for the right sleeve as follows:

SM, work as described above to the next marker, SM, work 26 (26) 26 (26) 26 (30) 30 (30) 30 sts following the chart, knit the rest of the round.

Left sleeve

Work according to the chart for the left sleeve as follows:

SM, work as described above to 26 (26) 26 (26) 26 (30) 30 (30) 30 sts before the next marker, work according to the chart, SM, knit the rest of the round.

Continue even in stripes following the chart and then until all decreases have been worked. Work until the underside of the sleeve measures 39 cm / 15.5 inches, or to the desired length minus 5 cm / 2 inches. End with a stripe in color A, on the last round decrease 4 (6) 4 (6) 4 (6) 4 (6) 4 (6) 4 sts evenly = 60 (60) 64 (64) 68 (68) 72 (72) 72 sts.

Ribbed cuffs

Change to 3 mm double-pointed needles and color B and work in the round in rib stitch [k2, p2] and stripes, alternating between 3 rounds with color B and 3 rounds with color A. Continue until a total of 7 stripes have been worked. Bind off on the next round in rib stitch or using the tubular bind-off with color B.

BUTTON BANDS

Pick up and knit stitches for the button bands in the middle of the 3 selvage sts—the one lying at the edge along the front edges—from the right side using 2.5 mm needles and color A. Note: Turn your work with the purl side facing out and try it on if needed to make sure you pick up from the correct front edge.

Left button band

With the right side facing out, start at the bottom of the front edge and pick up stitches through both legs of the middle of the 3 selvage sts—the one lying at the outer edge:

Pick up and knit 1 stitch for each selvage stitch = 34 (38) 40 (42) 42 (42) 44 (44) 48 sts.

Work back and forth in rib stitch with 2 selvage sts at each end, adjusting the stitch count as follows:

Row 1: k2, [YO, k1, p1, k1, YO, k1] until 4 (4) 2 (4) 4 (4) 2 (2) 2 sts remain, [p1, k1] 2 (2) 1 (2) 2 (2) 1 (1) 1 time(s), cast on 1 st with the backwards loop method = 49 (55) 59 (61) 61 (61) 65 (65) 71 sts. Knit YO tbl on the next row.

Row 2: sl2wyif, [k1, p1] until 3 sts remain, k1, sl2wyif.

Row 3: k2, [p1, k1] until 3 sts remain, p1, k2.

Rows 4–9: Work as rows 2–3.

Row 10: p2tog, [k1, p1] until 3 sts remain, k1, p2tog.

Bind off using the tubular bind-off.

Right button band

With the right side facing out, start at the top of the front edge and pick up stitches through both legs of the middle of the 3 selvage sts—the one lying at the outer edge:

Pick up and knit 1 stitch for each selvage stitch and cast on 1 additional st with the backwards loop method = 35 (39) 41 (43) 43 (43) 45 (45) 49 sts.

Work back and forth in rib stitch with 2 selvage sts at each end and buttonholes as follows:

Row 1: k2, [YO, k1, p1, k1, YO, k1] until 5 (5) 3 (5) 5 (5) 3 (3) 3 sts remain, [p1, k1] 2 (2) 1 (2) 2 (2) 1 (1) 1 time(s), k1 = 49 (55) 59 (61) 61 (61) 65 (65) 71 sts. Knit YO tbl on the next row.

Row 2: sl2wyif, [k1, p1] until 3 sts remain, k1, sl2wyif.

Row 3: k2, [p1, k1] until 3 sts remain, p1, k2.

Row 4: Work as row 2.

Row 5: k2, work 4 (10) 8 (4) 4 (4) 8 (8) 6 sts in rib as sts appear, [YO, k2tog, 10 (10) 12 (10) 10 (10) 10 (10) 12 sts in rib] 3 (3) 3 (3) 4 (4) 4 (4) 4 times, YO, k2tog, 3 sts in rib, k2.

Rows 6–9: Work as rows 2–3.

Row 10: p2tog, [k1, p1] until 3 sts remain, k1, p2tog.

Bind off using the tubular bind-off.

FINISHING

Sew the bottom of the button bands to the bottom band opening using invisible stitches and sew the buttons onto the left button band with color A. Weave in all ends. Wash the sweater according to the instructions on the yarn label and block it to the specified measurements.


