Someone says crafters create something that looks like they do. Something that is inspired with their own vision and soul. And here we are - goofy buddies. What can be more symbolic, right?

Now I would like you to share with me the experience in creating something from the bottom of the heart. It's time to create your own little wizard Ronald, he will bring only magic vibes and memories to you.



materials and tools

- yarn for the head and the body in the **beige** color YarnArt Jeans #07/Gazzal Jeans #1121,
- yarn for the hair in the **orange** color Alize Cotton Gold #89/Gazzal Baby Cotton #3465/Gazzal organic #438,
- yarn for the shirt and the socks in the **white** color YarnArt Jeans #01/Gazzal Jeans #1101,
- yarn for the boots in the **light brown** color Alize Cotton Gold #152 and in the **brown** color YarnArt Jeans #70,
- yarn for the pants in the melange **dark gray** color YarnArt Jeans #28/Alize Cotton Gold #182,
- yarn for the sweater and the scarf in the **mustard** color Gazzal Jeans #1125/YarnArt Jeans #84/Alize Cotton Gold #02 and in the **burgundy** color Gazzal Jeans #1139/YarnArt Jeans #66/Alize Cotton Gold #57,
- yarn for the hat in the melange **light brown** color Alize Cotton Gold #688 and in the **milk** YarnArt Jeans #03/ Gazzal Jeans #1120,
- yarn for the v-neck sweater in the melange **gray** color Alize Cotton Gold #21,
- yarn for the flying car in the **gray** color Gazzal Jeans #1110/YarnArt Jeans #46/Alize Cotton Gold #200, in the **milk** YarnArt Jeans #03/ Gazzal Jeans #1120, in the **yellow** color YarnArt Jeans #88 and in the **blue** color YarnArt Jeans #81,
- crochet hook - Clover 2 mm (0 or B) **OR** 1.75 mm (4) any type you prefer,
- knitting needles 2 mm,
- buttons 4 mm dia - 4 pcs, 5 mm dia - 7 pcs, 15 mm dia - 4 pcs,
- wires for the skeleton 2 mm dia,
- safety eyes 6 mm size - 2 pcs.
- a tapestry needle for attaching the pieces,
- carton or any other polymer material for the bottom of the flying car,
- strong invisible glue (if you will glue the carton details),
- adhesive roll bandage,
- some pins,
- markers,
- fiberfill,
- happy vibes.



thread thickness:

YarnArt Jeans - 160m/50g
Gazzal Jeans - 170m/50g
Cotton Gold - 330m/100g

If you have one ball of the yarn every color that will be enough.



These materials are only a list of my recommendations to help you create the toy like mine. You can use any type/size of the yarn and the hook, but you must understand it will affect the toy's final look.

about glue and wire

I have used strong invisible glue and two kinds of the wire:

1. Thin enough for some tiny accessories - it's a florist wire 0.45-0.95 mm dia.
2. Cuprum wire 2-2.5mm dia for doll's skeleton.

But on this doll I have use cuprum wire 2 mm only.

You don't have to use a glue (for the flying car) or a wire.

Your doll can be made without them. But please pay attention, that if you don't use a wire - your doll will not be able to bend its arms and neck.





factors to define how much yarn you need

1. The first and the most obvious factor is a **crochet hook size**. If you use the yarn mentioned in the materials list and a crochet hook size other than recommended one, it will affect the amount of yarn necessary for your project. If you choose a larger crochet hook, then you will need more yarn and if you go for a smaller crochet hook - then you will need less yarn than it is specified in the materials list.
2. The second factor – **your typical tension** when crocheting. The gauge and tension is going to make a difference with the amount of used yarn because you get more or less space between stitches. The tighter your stitches are, the less yarn you need.
3. The third and very important condition – **your stitches shape**: V-shape, X-shape/semi-X. The stitch shape depends on what crochet technique you use – yarn over or yarn under the hook.

*If you wrap the thread, placing the hook underneath the yarn strand (Yarn Under - circular movement of the hook from the right to the left) – this makes **V-shaped stitch**, if you put the hook over the yarn strand (Yarn Over - circular movement from the right to the left) – this makes **X-shaped stitches**, and if you make yarn under then yarn over, this technique gives us **semi-X stitches**. You will need much more yarn for the fabric made in Yarn Over technique compared with the amount needed for Yarn Under technique.*

Why did I specify the yarn density in the materials list? If you don't have the same brand that I recommend, you should use the yarn weight as substitution with any risk of miscalculation for the toy and clothes sizes.

instructions



st = stitch

MR = magic ring

ch/tch = chain/turning chain

sl st = slip stitch

sc = single crochet

hdc = half double crochet

dc = double crochet

tr = treble crochet

CL = cluster stitch (4 dc joined at the top)

dec = decrease (with the same type of stitches which we use in rnd)

inc = increase (with the same type of stitches which we use in rnd)

BLO = crochet into back loops only

FLO = crochet into front loops only

shift stitch - extra regular stitch

k = knit

p = purl

yo = yarn over

The number in brackets at the end of every round means a total number of stitches in the round,

(...) * n – means that you should repeat the combination of stitches n times.

In this pattern we use US terminology.

Choose the correct hook size which is appropriate for the yarn you are going to use. Your choice can be different from mine, but please pay attention to the fact, that the size of the toy and the clothes will be different when you use other yarn and another hook size.

Use a stitch marker for your convenience and rounds counting.

The toy is crocheted in **semi-X stitches**. Shift stitches are calculated precisely for this technique. If you crochet the stitches with Yarn Overs, then You will need to determine the symmetry of the pieces and the number of shift stitches and their location by yourself.

Stuff all the pieces as you go, tight (unless otherwise stated), gradually adding small portions of stuffing and forming necessary shapes of pieces.

About yarn change. I recommend to change color in the last stitch of a round, before you start the round with a new color. Work this last stitch with thread of a new color in the following way: pull up a loop with the yarn you're working with and then finish with yarn of new color.

About decreases. I make invisible decreases - work in FLO, but it's easier to make classic decreases in some stitches - in both loops.

The doll is 27 cm/10.6 inches tall in case of using the materials listed and crocheting in **semi-X stitch**.

how to make an invisible edge

Here I want to show you how I end the crocheting in the rounds by making invisible edge.

1. Insert the needle in stitch 2 stitches before your last one. Pull it out.
2. Insert the needle between front and back loops of the stitch before your last one. Pull it out.
3. Make sure the thread is tight enough. That is all, fasten off.



Part 1.
the doll



arms

Starting with **beige** yarn #07. Make two pcs.

1. 6 sc in MR (6)
2. (sc, inc)*3 (9)
3. 9 sc (9)
4. (2 sc, inc)*3 (12)
- 5-6. 12 sc (12), 2 rnds
7. **for the 1st arm:** CL, 11 sc (12)
for the 2nd arm: 6 sc, CL, 5 sc (12)
8. **for the 1st arm:** dec, 10 sc (11)
for the 2nd arm: 6 sc, dec, 4 sc (11)
9. **for the 1st arm:** inc, 10 sc (12)
for the 2nd arm: 6 sc, inc, 4 sc (12),
change the yarn to **white** color #1101 and
cut the beige one.
10. 12 sc (12)
11. **BLO:** 12 sc (12)
- 12-34. 12 sc (12), 23 rnds, cut the thread
and fasten off. Do not stuff.



legs

Start with the yarn of **light brown** color #152.

1. Make a chain of **9** stitches, from the 2nd stitch from the hook: inc, 6 sc, 3 sc in the 1 stitch, on the other side of the chain - 7 sc (18)
2. 2 inc, 6 sc, 3 inc, 6 sc, inc (24)
3. (sc, inc)*2, 6 sc, (sc, inc)*3, 7 sc, inc (30), make 2 shift stitches
4. 10 sc, (2 sc, inc)*3, 11 sc (33)

Draw an outline around the contour of the foot on carton (or any other polymer material). If you will wash the toy in the future, don't use the carton because it will be damaged during the washing. Cut out two boot insoles. Put it into the foot later.

5. **BLO**: 33 sc (33), fasten off and cut the thread.

Attach the yarn of **brown** color #70 to the **front loop** of the 4th rnd (pic. 6) the way back side of the work will be faced down and go on:

- 6-8. 33 sc (33), 3 rnds, insert the insole
9. 10 sc, (2 sc, dec)*3, 11 sc (30)
10. 8 sc, (sc, dec)*4, 10 sc (26)
11. 8 sc, 4 dec, 10 sc (22), change the yarn to **white** #1101 and leave a free tail of **brown** thread outside of the foot (pic.12).




12. BLO: 4 sc, 6 dec, 6 sc (16)

13-16. 16 sc (16), 4 rnds, change the yarn to beige #07 and leave a free tail of white thread outside of the foot (pic. 12).

17. BLO: 16 sc (16), insert the wire, bended like on pic 9-11.

Take two pieces of a wire about 40 cm length each of them. Curve one end of each piece in the loop like on the pic. 9 and wrap it with the adhesive roll bandage (pic. 10). Also curve the wrapped end at an angle of 90 degrees (pic. 11).



Before continue to crochet the leg we need to make the cuffs.

CUFFS on the boots:

Make 22 sl st into the **front** loops of 10th rnd using a free tail of brown thread, that we left outside in 10th rnd.

CUFFS on the socks:

Make 16 sl st into the **front** loops of 15th rnd using a free tail of white thread, that we left outside in 15th rnd.



Continue to crochet the leg.

18-40. 16 sc (16), 23 rnds

Make the second one.

Now it's time to put the marker on each leg and crochet extra stitches for the 40th round (pic. 19-20).

The quantity of extra stitches in round 40 of the legs depends on your own yarn tension and can be different.

Leave a long enough tail of the thread when you will finish with the 1st leg in case you will change your mind about its quantity, and **DON'T CUT THE THREAD** on the 2nd leg.



How to make a right quantity of stitches?

Put the legs on the desk and fold their upper parts (pic. 19-20). The stitches which are placed in the middle of the inner fold are the stitches you should connect with the chain in 40th rnd. Mark them. Now crochet the necessary amount of stitches from the end of 40th round till the marker pin (it will be still round 40). I have 8 extra sc on the 1st leg and 1 extra sc on the 2nd one.

If you want to make the doll a bit pigeon-toed, so you have to crochet a little bit more stitches on the 1st leg, and little bit less on the 2nd one, rather if you will placed them straight.



body

Continue to work, make a chain of 10 stitches and 1 sc into the markeded stitch on the 1st leg (pic 22).

We've attached two legs to each other. Now you can check if you like how it looks or change its position by increasing or reducing extra stitches in rnd 40.

41. 17 sc along the 1st leg (last st in the markeded stitch), 10 sc along the ch, 17 sc along the 2nd leg (last st in the markeded stitch), 10 sc along the ch (54), put the marker. Now here will be the start of the round.

On this round 41, we are working 42 stitches (16+10+16) but we will be adding 2 extra ones as we will work twice on these 2 spots (pic. 23) in the joined bridge of the doll.

42-52. 54 sc (54), 11 rnds.

Make 11 shift stitches (till the middle of the left side of the body) and change the yarn to dark gray #182.



53. 54 sc (54), leave the dark gray thread outside and change the yarn to **white** #1101

Next we need to twist the wire to make our following work more comfortable (pic.25-27).

54-55. **BLO**: 54 sc (54), 2 rnds

56-58. 54 sc (54), 3 rnds

59. (7 sc, dec)*6 (48)

60-65. 48 sc (48), 6 rnds

66. (6 sc, dec)*6 (42)

67-71. 42 sc (42), 5 rnds

72. (5 sc, dec)*6 (36)


73-74. 36 sc (36), 2 rnds

Before rnd 75 you can need to make some shift stitches, depending on your own yarn tension.

But first mark 12 stitches in the middle of the front side of the body and 12 stitches in the middle of the back side. There also must be 6 stitches between each of 12 stitches for the arms (pic 28).

As you can see on the picture 28 my marker of the rounds was placed exactly where it needed to be, so I didn't make any shift stitches (till the pointed marker, where starts 6 st of the 1st arm), but maybe you will need them.

So please, pay your attention on that part. Only you can decide how many shift st will you need or maybe you will crochet less stitches in the end of rnd 74.



75. Look at the picture 29. You must place the arms in these 6 stitches on the side of the body and crochet through the body and half part of the arm according to this combination:


36 sc (36)


It means (depending on where your marker of rnd is) you have to crochet 6 stitches through the 1st arm and the body, 12 st along the back part of the body, 6 sc through the 2nd arm and the body and another 12 stitches along the front part of the body.

76. In this rnd you finish attaching the arms by the way of crocheting along lefted 6 stitches on each of it: 36 sc (36), crochet like on previous round: 6 stitches through the remaining stitches of the 1st arm and the body, 12 st along the back part of the body, 6 sc through the remaining stitches of the 2nd arm and the body and another 12 stitches along the front part of the body.

77-79. 36 sc (36), 3 rnds

Now we need to insert the wire in the arms. Look at how to do that on the pics on the next page.





Cut the piece of the wire a little bit longer than the length of the opened arms including loops on the ends of the wire. Wrap the loops on its ends with the adhesive plaster. Wrap this wire around the skeleton in the middle and insert both ends of the wire into the arms.

Fill the arms tight after inserting the wire.

Twist free ends of the wire in the neck between each other, bend free ends of the wire and wrap it with the roll bandage (pic. 37). It will be a support for the neck.

80. (4 sc, dec)*6 (30), make about 10 shift st (till the middle of the back of the neck) and change the yarn to **beige #07**

81. BLO: (3 sc, dec)*6 (24)

82. (sc, dec)*8 (16)

83-85. 16 sc (16), 3 rnds, leave a long tail for sewing.



pants

With the yarn of dark gray color #182.

Attach the thread, that we have left outside to the front loop of the 52 rnd, holding the body upside down and go on:

1. (8 sc, inc)*6 (60)
2. **BLO**: 60 sc (60)
3. 60 sc (60)
4. **BLO**: (9 sc, inc)*6 (66)
- 5-16. 66 sc (66), 12 rnds

Next we need to put two markers, dividing top part of the pants on two separate parts. Each part includes 33 stitches and the markers must be placed strictly in the middle of the front and back sides (pic.39, 40).

Continue to crochet till the front marker about 16 stitches (depending on your own yarn tension), make a chain of 7 st and sc into the st with the back marker. This marker will be our start of the rounds. You can remove 1st one now.

Now we will crochet the 1st trouser leg:



1.40 sc (including 7 sc along the chain) (40)
2-30. 40 sc (40), 29 rnds, make an invisible edge and fasten off.

For the 2nd trouser leg attach the thread in the start or in the end of the chain we've made from 7 st and repeat the rnds from the 1st till the 30th like for the 1st leg, make an invisible edge and fasten off.

Don't forget to hide a thread's tail after you will attach it for the 2nd leg. I recommend to do that somewhere between rounds 3 and 4.

If you like the contrast lines on the pants, like I do, you can embroider the belt line and the fly with the thread of light gray color.

I embroidered rnds 1st and 3rd of the top part of the pants, where we crocheted BLO for the imitation of the belt.

For the embroider the fly I've use thin contrast thread to mark how it should looks like.

On the next page you can see how I did that.





I've made the contour of the fly, using the pins and embroidered it with small stitches according to this shape.

It can be not really straight, because of the shifting the stitches, but I think it looks a quite ok.

On this step is the best time to decide will you crochet parts of the shirt, that are looking out of the sweater.

The reason of this doubts can be how Ronald looks without the sweater.

Finished shirt brings him kind a goofy look. So go back to the 10th page of the pattern and take a look on him. If you like his look, let's continue, if you find it not very nice, skip next part and go to the part with the assembling.



shirt


Mark 3 points (stitches) using pins: the middle of the belt on the front side, and two points with 14 st appart from the 1st pin (pic. 48-50).

Next we will crochet in turning rows. It means you start each row from the 2nd stitch from the hook (except 1st one, where we've attach the thread) and after every end of the row you need to make one turning ch and turn the work if isn't mentioned other. Don't forget about that.

Attach the thread of **white** color #1101 to the **front** loop of the rnd 53 in the middle point (1st markeded stitch - pic.51) and go on:



1-6. 54 sc, ch (54), 6 rnds, don't cut the thread.



Continue to crochet. **Do not make** a chain after the end of the row if isn't mentioned.

FIRST PART (RIGHT ONE)

7. 14 sc (14) you have to reach one of our marker
8. from the 2nd st from the hook: 13 sc, ch (13)
9. 11 sc, dec (12)
10. from the 2nd st from the hook: 11 sc, ch (11)
11. 9 sc, dec (10)
12. from the 2nd st from the hook: 9 sc (9), fasten off.

SECOND PART (LEFT ONE)

Attach the thread to the first st of the 6th row on opposite side:

7. 14 sc (14) you have to reach last of our marker
8. from the 2nd st from the hook: 13 sc, ch (13)
9. 11 sc, dec (12)
10. from the 2nd st from the hook: 11 sc, ch (11)
11. 9 sc, dec (10)
12. from the 2nd st from the hook: 9 sc, ch (9)
13. 7 sc, dec (8)
14. from the 2nd st from the hook: 7 sc (7), fasten off.


BACK SIDE

Attach the thread to the 1st of non crocheted stitches on the back (pic. 54):

7. 26 sc (26)
8. from the 2nd st from the hook: 23 sc, dec (24)
9. from the 2nd st from the hook: 21 sc, dec (22)
10. from the 2nd st from the hook: 19 sc, dec (20)
11. from the 2nd st from the hook: 17 sc, dec (18)
12. from the 2nd st from the hook: 15 sc, dec (16)
13. from the 2nd st from the hook: 13 sc, dec (14), don't cut the thread.

Go on around the edge of all pieces, till you will turn back to this point again (pic. 55-57) and fasten off.





COLLAR

Choose one stitch in the middle of the 78th rnd and mark it.

Attach the thread of **white** color #1101 to the stitch next with the marked one and crochet in turning rows:

1. 29 sc , ch (29)
2. (5 sc, inc)*2, 4 sc, inc, (5 sc, inc)*2, 2 ch (34)
3. **BLO**: 4 dc, 26 dhc, 4 dc, 2 ch, sl st, fasten off.



head

With the yarn of **beige** color #07.

1. 6 sc in MR (6)
2. 6 inc (12)
3. (sc, inc)*6 (18)
4. (2 sc, inc)*6 (24)
5. (3 sc, inc)*6 (30)
6. (4 sc, inc)*6 (36)
7. (5 sc, inc)*6 (42)
8. (6 sc, inc)*6 (48)
9. (7 sc, inc)*6 (54)
10. (8 sc, inc)*6 (60)
11. (9 sc, inc)*6 (66)
12. (10 sc, inc)*6 (72)
- 13-25. 72 sc (72), 13 rnds

Insert the eyes (now or when you will finish the process) between **18-19 rnds** with a distance of **11** stitches apart. I recommend you to insert the eyes when the head will be finished.

26. 5 sc, dec, (10 sc, dec)*5, 5 sc (66)
27. (9 sc, dec)*6 (60)
28. 4 sc, dec (8 sc, dec)*5, 4 sc (54)
29. (7 sc, dec)*6 (48)
30. 3 sc, dec, (6 sc, dec)*5, 3 sc (42)
31. (5 sc, dec)*6 (36)
32. 2 sc, dec, (4 sc, dec)*5, 2 sc (30)
33. (3 sc, dec)*6 (24)
34. sc, dec, (2 sc, dec)*5, sc (18)
35. (7 sc, dec)*2 (16), fasten off.

Fill the head with the fiber tight, and if you haven't inserted the eyes, use pins for the best positions for the eyes.

Pull the fiberfill out of the head, wide the holes for the eyes with a hook, insert and close the back of the eyes. I recommend that you melt the back of the safety eyes.





I use a household lighter. But be careful on this step, your crocheted piece could get damaged, stained or even burnt when doing so. Press the melted part of the back side of the eye with a lighter or a knife to secure it.

Then fill the head with fiber again. The head must be filled tight enough.

ears

With the yarn of **beige** color #07. Make two.

8 sc in MR, leave a long tail for sewing.



hair

With the yarn of **orange** color #89.

1. 6 sc in MR (6)
2. 6 inc (12)
3. (sc, inc)*6 (18)
4. (2 sc, inc)*6 (24)
5. (3 sc, inc)*6 (30)
6. (4 sc, inc)*6 (36)
7. (5 sc, inc)*6 (42)
8. (6 sc, inc)*6 (48)
9. (7 sc, inc)*6 (54)
10. (8 sc, inc)*6 (60)
11. (9 sc, inc)*6 (66)
12. (10 sc, inc)*6 (72)
- 13-17. 72 sc (72), 5 rnds

Making strands of the hair next:

18.

- 13 ch, from the 2nd st from the hook: sl st, 8 sc, 3 hdc, sc into each of the next 2 stitches along the foundation;
- 10 ch, from the 2nd st from the hook: sl st, 5 sc, 3 hdc, sc into each of the next 2 stitches along the foundation;
- (11 ch, from the 2nd st from the hook: sl st, 6 sc, 3 hdc, sc into each of the next 2 stitches along the foundation)*6;
- (8 ch, from the 2nd st from the hook: sl st, 3 sc, 3 hdc, sc into each of the next 2 stitches along the foundation)*3;
- (5 ch, from the 2nd st from the hook: sl st, 3 sc, sc into each of the next 2 stitches along the foundation)*13;
- (8 ch, from the 2nd st from the hook: sl st, 3 sc, 3 hdc, sc into each of the next 2 stitches along the foundation)*3;
- (11 ch, from the 2nd st from the hook: sl st, 6 sc, 3 hdc, sc into each of the next 2 stitches along the foundation)*8.



Don't cut the thread too short, leave a very long tail (about 50 cm) for sewing.

Next we need to do - it's two sticking out strands of the hair.

Make a chain of 7 stitches, from the 2nd stitch from the hook: 6 sl st, 6 ch, from the 2nd stitch from the hook: 3 sl st and sl st in the 1st stitch of the 1st chain, leave a long tail for sewing.



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assembling

1. Embroider the nose.

Mark with the pins about 6 stitches. Make 2-3 lengthwise stitches from one pin to the other. Wrap these stitches with the thread using transverse stitches. To be sure the nose will not wobble make a couple of stitches through the head too.

Please pay attention to the thread tension. If it will not be strong enough the nose will be wobble and will not look nice.




2. Embroider the eyebrows.

Mark with the pins places for the eyebrows (pic. 74): 2 stitches above the eye in the top and 1 stitch in the bottom of the eyebrow and with 4 stitches wide. Embroider it with the **brown** thread.

3. Sewing the ears.

Pin the ears on position you like (pic.76-77) and sew them with little strong stitches.





4. Depth of the eyes.

Some of you use the same thread for contraction as for the toy, but this thread isn't strong enough. I recommend to use nylon thread of the same color for sculpting the eyes.

You can make the face sculpting if you want (pic. 78): insert a needle between stitches in the bottom of the neck in **point 1** and pull it out in the right lower corner of the right eye (for us) in **point 2**, then, making a small stitch, insert a needle into the left corner of the same eye in **point 3** and pull it out in **point 4**. Make a small stitch again, insert a needle into **point 5**, pulling it out in **point 6**, between stitches to the left from **point 1** is 1 stitch.

Pull both thread tails until you have the correct position of the eyes and make 2-3 strong knots. If it's necessary, pull the thread tails again and make one more knot. Cut the thread and hide the tails of the thread inside the head.

You can also make white part of the eyes with a couple of stitches after sculpting (pic. 80).

5. Sew the hair.

Pin the hair to the head and make sure the place of hair is ok for you, sew it with little invisible stitches.

Please pay attention, if the toy is played a lot, you should sew the hair really carefully and strong, if it is supposed to be kind of an interior toy, you can



I sew two hair together on front part of the hair. And each hair separate on the back (pic. 83-85).



sew it like I did - a couple stitches in every hair part.
I prefer a little bit casual look, when the hair is in a little mess. Don't forget to sew the straited hair on the top too.



6. Cuffs on the arms.

Attach the thread of **white** color to the **front** loop of the 10th rnds of the arms, where we crochet BLO and make one rnd with sl st.

Fasten off.

7. Sewing the buttons.

Take four buttons, pin them symmetrical on the front side of the body (pic. 87) and sew it with the white thread strong enough.

8. Sewing the head.

Put the head on the neck and pin the head to it (pic. 88-91). Make sure the head is placed strict.

I like the technique of the crafter [@littlefish.crocheterie](#). It's really neat and an invisible technique of attaching the pieces together.

Pay your attention, that the wire must be in the head deep enough. Stuff the neck tight during the sewing.





Pay attention, If you want the head to be in the middle without any shifting, work in the stitch to the stitch technique. Don't forget to stuff the head and the neck while sewing and move the pins to help the process of attaching it.



This is how the head looks after sewing. Very neat.

Now our doll is complete.
It's time to make his outfit.



Part 2.
the clothes



hat

Starting with the yarn of **light-brown** color #688.

1. 6 sc in MR (6)
2. 6 inc (12)
3. (sc, inc)*6 (18)
4. (2 sc, inc)*6 (24)
5. (3 sc, inc)*6 (30)
6. (4 sc, inc)*6 (36)
7. (5 sc, inc)*6 (42)
8. (6 sc, inc)*6 (48)
9. (7 sc, inc)*6 (54)
10. (8 sc, inc)*6 (60)
11. (9 sc, inc)*6 (66)
12. (10 sc, inc)*6 (72)
13. (11 sc, inc)*6 (78)
- 14-15. 78 sc (78), 2 rnds, change the thread to **milk** color #1120
16. 78 sc (78), change the thread to **light brown** color #688
- 17-21. 78 sc (78), 5 rnds, change the thread to **milk** color #1120
22. 78 sc (78), change the thread to **light brown** color #688
- 23-24. 78 sc (78), 2 rnds, don't cut the thread if you can find one more free tail of it, if you don't - cut it and fasten off.

Wear the hat on your Ron's head and mark 12 stitches for each "ear" of the hat.

According to my position of Ron's ears I did count 12 stitches from the marker of the last rnd of the hat and attach the thread of light brown yarn. Next we will crochet in turning rows:

- 1-2. 12 sc, ch (12)
3. from the 3rd st from the hook: 9 sc, dec, ch (10)
4. from the 3rd st from the hook: 7 sc, dec, ch (8)



5. 8 sc, ch (8)
6. from the 3rd st from the hook: 5 sc, dec, ch (6)
7. from the 3rd st from the hook: 3 sc, dec, ch (4)
8. from the 3rd st from the hook: sc, dec (2), fasten off.

Make the 2nd "ear" according to your markers and crochet along the edge with the thread you have left after 2nd rnd of the hat or attach the new one. Make an invisible edge in the end.

It's time to make the threads now. Take the **milk** yarn and fold it in twice. Attach it to the rnd 8 of the "ear" and make a chain of 11 st (pic. 98). Make the knot on the end, fasten off. Repeat with the 2nd "ear".

If you like more authentic mood as I do, you need to make the embroidery along the edge of the hat (pic. 97) and between the milk stripes on it.

As you may see on the pic. 100 the weave between milk rnds wasn't perfect on the back side, but I still find it nice.





sweater (hook)

With a yarn of **burgundy** color #1139.

We will crochet in turning rows. Make a **ch** after the end of the **each** turning **row**. Start with a chain of **41** ch.

1. From the 2nd st from the hook: 40 sc (40)
2. 6 sc, 3 sc into 1 st, 6 sc, 3 sc into 1 st, 12 sc, 3 sc into 1 st, 6 sc, 3 sc into 1 st, 6 sc (48)
3. 48 sc (48)
4. 7 sc, 3 sc into 1 st, 8 sc, 3 sc into 1 st, 14 sc, 3 sc into 1 st, 8 sc, 3 sc into 1 st, 7 sc (56)
5. 56 sc (56)
6. 8 sc, 3 sc into 1 st, 10 sc, 3 sc into 1 st, 16 sc, 3 sc into 1 st, 10 sc, 3 sc into 1 st, 8 sc (64)
7. 64 sc (64)
8. 9 sc, 3 sc into 1 st, 12 sc, 3 sc into 1 st, 18 sc, 3 sc into 1 st, 12 sc, 3 sc into 1 st, 9 sc (72)
9. 11 sc, 9 ch, skip 15 stitches, 20 sc, 9 ch, skip 15 stitches, 11 sc (60)
- 10-17. 60 sc (60), 8 rnds
18. (11 sc, inc)*4, 12 sc (64)
- 19-21. 64 sc (64), 3 rnds
22. (12 sc, inc)*4, 12 sc (68)
- 23-29. 68 sc (68), 7 rnds
30. **BLO**: 68 sc (68), don't cut the thread, crochet around along the edge with sc.



We need to crochet along the edge of the sweater (except sleeves) with sc and made the sleeves.

Attach the thread of **burgundy** color to the place for the sleeve (the left lower corner, pic. 106) and make 26 sc: 15 sc along the upward part of the sleeve, 1 sc on the side part, 9 sc along the bottom part of the sleeve, and 1 sc on the other side part (26).

Continue to crochet:

2-17. 26 sc (26)

18. (2 sc, dec)*6, 2 sc (20)

19. BLO: 20 sc (20), fasten off and make the 2nd sleeve.



Next we make the eyelet for the buttons. I have made three. Below you can watch the video how to do that.



The video is in Russian, but you can understand what to do without the words.

Also you need to embroider the "R" on the sweater. I'm not really good in that (I've really tried, two times), so you can count only on yourself.



sweater (needles)

With a yarn of **burgundy** color #1139.

Knit in turning rows, it means that the first stitch is always slipped, the last stitch is always purled. Also I use twisted yo, you can find a lot of videos on youtube, how to do that.

Here and in the further instructions the edge stitches are taken into a total number of stitches. It means that if the pattern says k3 in the beginning of the row, you need to slip one edge st and knit 2 stitches. The same thing is with the stitches in the end of the row.

Cast on 40sts.

1. p all stitches (40)
2. k6, yo, k, yo, k6, yo, k, yo, k12, yo, k, yo, k6, yo, k, yo, k6 (48)
3. p all stitches (48)
4. k7, yo, k, yo, k8, yo, k, yo, k14, yo, k, yo, k8, yo, k, yo, k7 (56)
5. p all stitches (56)
6. k8, yo, k, yo, k10, yo, k, yo, k16, yo, k, yo, k10, yo, k, yo, k8 (64)
7. p all stitches (64)
8. k9, yo, k, yo, k12, yo, k, yo, k18, yo, k, yo, k12, yo, k, yo, k9 (72)
9. p11, cast on 9 sts, slip 15 st of the sleeve onto extra knitting needle or onto a thread, p20, cast on 9 sts, slip 15 st of the sleeve, p11 (60)

In the next rnds alternate knit and purl rnds.



10-28. 60 stitches (60), 19 rnds, don't cut the thread.

Bind off the stitches from the back side, fasten off, secure the thread if you want to sew three buttons or you can crochet through the both part of the sweater with sc till the middle and sew only one button on the top of the back, as I did.

If there are any moments a bit challenging for you when knitting, perhaps the video about my way of knitting would be useful for you. My knitting style is far from perfect, but it works for me.



Now return to the sleeves.

Slip the stitches of the sleeve from extra needle or from the thread and put them on working needle. Divide the quantity of stitches equally to each needle. Also we need to attach the thread and pick up several stitches at the underarm area (I've use crochet hook for it). Its quantity can be different, the main thing is - there must be no holes. Now knit in the "magic loop" technique.

No matter how many stitches you have on the needles, knit them all in the 1st rnd:

- 1.k all stitches
2. make so many dec, till the quantity of the stitches will be 26 (26)
- 3-22. k 26 (26), 20 rnds
23. (k2, dec)*6, k2 (20), bind off the stitches from the back side, fasten off, secure the thread.

Make the 2nd sleeve the same way.




All is left - embroidering of the "R".


I've used the stitch into stitch technique. Looks not perfect but it works for me.

Below you can see how it makes.

For the horizontal stitches:



For the vertical stitches:



v-neck sweater

Start with a yarn of **gray** color #21.

We will crochet in turning rows from the bottom to the top. Make a **ch** after the end of **each** turning **row**. Start with a chain of **69** ch.

1. From the 2nd st from the hook: 68 sc (68)
2. **FLO**: 68 sc (68), change color to **burgundy** #1139
3. **BLO**: 68 sc (68), change color to **mustard** #84
4. **FLO**: 68 sc (68), change color to **gray** #21
5. **BLO**: 68 sc (68)
- 6-8. 68 sc (68), 3 rnds
9. (12 sc, dec)*4, 12 sc (64)
- 10-12. 64 sc (64), 3 rnds
13. (11 sc, dec)*4, 12 sc (60)
- 14-19. 60 sc (60), 6 rnds
20. 11 sc, dec, (10 sc, dec)*3, 11 sc (56)
- 21-23. 56 sc (56), 3 rnds

Next we need to divide the work in 5 parts and put 4 markers: 1st one on the 11th st, 2nd after 6 st, 3rd after 20 st, 4th after 6 more st. So you will have 5 lines: 10 st, 8 st, 20 st, 8 st and 10 st.

Take to attention that 8 st - must be at underarm area.

24. 10 sc, 15 ch, skip 8 stitches, 20 sc, 15 ch, skip 8 stitches, 10 sc (60)



From here we will crochet only one part of the sweater (start from the right top corner), let's call it the right part:

- 25. 34 sc (10+15 along the ch + 9) (34)
- 26. from the 3rd st from the hook: 6 sc, dec from 3 st, 13 sc, dec from 3 st, 8 sc (29)
- 27. 27 sc, dec (28)
- 28. from the 3rd st from the hook: 4 sc, dec from 3 st, 10 sc, dec from 3 st, 7 sc (23)
- 29. 21 sc, dec (22)
- 30. from the 3rd st from the hook: 2 sc, dec from 3 st, 7 sc, dec from 3 st, 6 sc (17)
- 31. 15 sc, dec (16)
- 32. from the 3rd st from the hook: dec from 3 st, 4 sc, dec from 3 st, 4 sc (11), fasten off.



Time to make the 2nd left part. Attach the thread in 2 stitches apart from the stitch where we end rnd 25 of the 1st part:

- 25. 34 sc (9 + 15 along the ch + 10) (34)
- 26. 8 sc, dec from 3 st, 13 sc, dec from 3 st, 5 sc, dec (29)
- 27. from the 3rd st from the hook: 28 sc (28)
- 28. 7 sc, dec from 3 st, 10 sc, dec from 3 st, 3 sc, dec (23)
- 29. from the 3rd st from the hook: 21 sc (21)
- 30. 6 sc, dec from 3 st, 7 sc, dec from 3 st, sc, dec (17)
- 31. from the 3rd st from the hook: 15 sc (15)
- 32. 5 sc, dec from 3 st, 4 sc, dec from 3 st (11), fasten off.

It's time to fasten off all the threads if you didn't that before.

Attach the thread of **gray** color on the right top corner and crochet along the top edge of the sweater.

When you will end the row on the opposite corner change the yarn to **burgundy** color #1139 and be prepared to crochet in turning rows again.

Next we will make the v-neck: crochet along the top edge of the sweater and make decrease in the middle of the "V", change the yarn to **mustard** color #84 in the end of the row.



Crochet the row and also make decrease but from 3 st in the middle of the "V", change the yarn to **gray** color #21 in the end of the row.

Make one row **FLO** with sc in the every stitch and one last row with dec from 3 st in the middle of the "V", don't cut the thread. Continue to crochet along the edge around of the sweater (except the sleeves area).

I did 3 sc in the corners for more nicer look, fasten off. Next we need to crochet the sleeves.

Attach the thread of **gray** color to the place for the sleeve (left lower corner, pic. 133) and make 25 sc: 15 sc along the upward part of the sleeve, 1 sc on the side part, 8 sc along the bottom part of the sleeve, and 1 sc on the other side part (25).

When I crocheted the sleeves I didn't realise that I made the wrong order of the stripe's color, below you will see the right one.

Continue to crochet:

2-15. 25 sc (25), 14 rnds, change color to **mustard** #84

16. BLO: 25 sc (25), change color to **burgundy** #1139

17. 25 sc (25), change color to **gray** #21

18. BLO: (3 sc, dec)*5 (20)

19. BLO: 20 sc (20), fasten off and make the 2nd sleeve.



For finishing the sweater you need to sew on buttons (I sew three) and make the eyelet for them.



scarf

With the yarn of **mustard** #1125 and **burgundy** #1139 colors.

There is two ways to make the scarf - the hook and the needles, I prefer the knitted look, so I've made only one version, but the algorithm is absolutely the same.

The scarf is being made in turning rows. It means if you crochet it - you start each row from the 2nd stitch from the hook and after every end of a row you need to make one turning stitch and turn the work. Don't forget about that.

Make a chain of 10 st, start from the 2nd stitch from the hook (or cast 9sts if you work with the needles):

1-6. 9 sc, ch (9), 6 rnds, change the color to **mustard** #84

7-12. 9 sc, ch (9), 6 rnds, change the color to **burgundy** #1139

Repeat rnds 1-12, till you reach the length you like.

Now we need to make a fluffy edge. Cut the identical pieces of the mustard and burgundy threads, each about 10 cm length. Insert the pieces into stitches of every edge of the scarf, like you can see on pic. 141-142. To make it more fluffy you can comb the threads with the hair comb.



Part 3.

the accessories



flying car

Start with the yarn of **blue** color #81.

The BODY

Make a chain of 11 st, start from the 2nd stitch from the hook:

1. 9 sc, 3 sc in 1 st, 9 sc, 3 sc in 1 st (last sc must be in the 1st st) (24)
2. 9 sc, 3 sc in 1 st, sc, 3 sc in 1 st, 9 sc, 3 sc in 1 st, sc, 3 sc in 1 st (32)
3. 10 sc, 3 sc in 1 st, 3 sc, 3 sc in 1 st, 11 sc, 3 sc in 1 st, 3 sc, 3 sc in 1 st, sc (40)

Draw an outline around the *contour of the part on carton (or any other polymer material)*. If you will wash the toy in the future, don't use the carton because it will be damaged during the washing. Cut out two. Put it into the body later.

4. **BLO**: 40 sc (40)
- 5-24. 40 sc (40), 20 rnds, Insert the 1st insole.
25. **BLO**: 40 sc (40), make some shift stitches if you need.

The start of the round must be placed exactly the same like in rnd 3.

26. dec from 3 st, 11 sc, dec from 3 st, 3 sc, dec from 3 st, 11 sc, dec from 3 st, 3 sc (32), Insert the 2nd insole.
27. dec from 3 st, 9 sc, dec from 3 st, sc, dec from 3 st, 9 sc, dec from 3 st, sc (24), sew off the hole **FLO**.



After you will close the hole and stuff the body of the flying car, it can be too wide, more like pillow, then the body of the car, as mine was (pic. 148,149).

I decided to make some sculpting, like you see on pic. 150-152 in 5 random points. But you don't have to do that.



TOP OF THE CAR

Start with the yarn of **milk** color #1120.
Make a chain of 7 st, start from the 2nd stitch from the hook:

1. 5 sc, 3 sc in 1 st, 5 sc, 3 sc in 1 st (last sc must be in the 1st st) (16)
2. 5 sc, 3 sc in 1 st, sc, 3 sc in 1 st, 5 sc, 3 sc in 1 st, sc, 3 sc in 1 st (24)
3. 6 sc, 3 sc in 1 st, 3 sc, 3 sc in 1 st, 7 sc, 3 sc in 1 st, 3 sc, 3 sc in 1 st, sc (32)
4. 7 sc, 3 sc in 1 st, 5 sc, 3 sc in 1 st, 9 sc, 3 sc in 1 st, 5 sc, 3 sc in 1 st (leave 2 sc uncrocheted, they will be included in the next rnd) (40), change the thread to **gray** color #1110.

Draw an outline around the contour of the part on carton (or any other polymer material).

5. **BLO**: 40 sc (40)
- 6-8. 40 sc (40), 3 rnds, insert the insole.

Pin the top of the car to the body and sew it on. I have worked with **front** loops only during the sewing.

The top must be placed a little bit closer to the back side of the car.



Next we need to make stripes on the edges of the top to the car (pic. 136).

Attach the thread of **milk** color to the one of the top corners and make a chain of 6-7 st, depends of the high of your top part, fasten off. Make the same with other three corners.

RADIATOR GRILLE

With the yarn of **gray** color.

Make a chain of **11** st, start from the 2nd stitch from the hook: sl st, 2 sc, hdc, 2 dc, hdc, 2 sc, sl st, leave a long tail for sewing and sew it on the front side of the car.

LIGHTS

With the yarn of **yellow** #88 and **red** #64 colors, make two of each color.

8 sc in MR (8), leave a long tail for sewing.

Sew all 4 lights to the car, as you can see on pic. 159-160.

Also I've made the covers for the front lights (pic. 166):

Make a chain of **7** st, start from the 2nd stitch from the hook: 6 sc, leave a long tail for sewing and sew it on.




WHEELS

Start with the yarn of **gray** color #1110 and prepare the buttons 15mm dia. You can not use the buttons, then you will need to stuff the wheels. Make four.

1. 6 sc in MR (6)
2. 6 inc (12), change to **dark gray** color #128
3. **BLO**: (sc, inc)*6 (18)
4. **BLO**: 18 sc (18), insert the button
5. **BLO**: (sc, dec)*6 (12), close the hole, fasten off.

Make 3 more.



It's time to sew on the wheels. On pic. 166-167 you can see the needle which is marked the place for the front of them.

I've used the thread for attaching the wheels: make a couple of stitches through the body of the car and each wheel (through the holes of the button) and back.

Also if you like to, you can make the strap from chains and sew the button on the bottom of the car (pic. 168-170).



Now your little red-haired wizard Ronald is ready for the real magic and any adventure. Be sure you will enjoy it.

Let him bring you joy and happiness!
