DETAILS

I played around with the shape and style of this scarf for almost a whole year! I am so happy with where it landed, and I hope you love it, too. Knit sideways with lots of texture and a splash of color, it is effortless to wear as the perfect final layer before heading out!



SIZES

One Size



FINISHED MEASUREMENTS

Wingspan - 104"/264 cm
Center Depth - 20"/51 cm



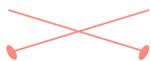
YARN

A - Fingering Weight Wool 150 g/825 yds/753 m
B - Fingering Weight Wool 50 g/275 yds/251 m
C - Sport Weight Wool 39 g/156 yds/143 m



SUGGESTED YARN

A - Brooklyn Tweed Loft 100% Targhee-Columbia Wool (Woolen spun) 50 g/275 yds/251 m - 3 skeins Cast Iron (dark grey)
B - Brooklyn Tweed Loft 100% Targhee-Columbia Wool (Woolen spun) 50 g/275 yds/251 m - 1 skein Fossil (off-white)
C - Spincycle Yarns Dyed in the Wool 100% American SW Wool (Worsted spun) 50 g/200 yds/183 yds - 1 skein Castaway (blue and orange multi-color)



SUGGESTED NEEDLES

US 4/3.5 mm - 32"/80 cm circular recommended
(Use the needle size you need to achieve gauge.)



NOTIONS

Tapestry needle, row counter (optional)



GAUGE

24 sts & 36 rows = 4"/10 cm
Measured over stitch pattern (pg. 4), after blocking.



THRU LINES

NOTES

- This scarf is knit sideways, increasing up to the widest part of the triangle and then decreasing back down.
- The entirety of the scarf is encased in an I-cord edge.
- Want to adjust the sizing? Simply continue the “Increasing Pattern Repeat” until the scarf measures half of your ideal length, ending with Row 16 of the pattern repeat, then cont with the pattern as written, working the “Decreasing Pattern Repeat” section until you reduce back down to 13 sts. Easy peasy! Just note that this will affect how much yarn you need.

- The edges of the scarf will curl in while knitting, but I found they lay quite nice after blocking the scarf.

- I am a firm believer that a little blocking will make all of your knits look better! Soak your scarf in lukewarm water with your favorite wool wash for 15 minutes. Squeeze out the excess moisture with a towel and lay flat to dry in the desired shape!



THRU LINES

— GLOSSARY —

{ } - Repeat

CO - Cast on

DEC/'D - Decrease/d

INC/'D - Increase/d

K - Knit

K2TOG - Knit 2 sts together. [1 st dec'd]

LHN - Left hand needle

P - Purl

REM - Remaining

REP - Repeat

RHN - Right hand needle

RLI - Insert the RHN into the right leg of the stitch below the current stitch on the LHN, raise it up and place it on the LHN and knit it, now knit the original st on the LHN. [1 st inc'd]

RS - Right side

SL - Slip stitch purlwise (unless indicated to do so knitwise)

ST/S - Stitch/es

WS - Wrong side

WYIB - With yarn held to the back

WYIF - With yarn held to the front

Stitch Pattern for Swatching

Using A and the Long Tail Cast On method, CO a multiple of 4 sts +3 (IE 35 sts).

Row 1 (RS): Using A, knit.

Row 2 (WS): Using A, purl.

Row 3: Join/Using B, k3, {sl1 wyib, k3} to end.

Row 4: Using B, p3, {sl1 wyif, p3} to end.

Row 5: Join/Using C, k1, {sl1 wyib, k3} to the last 2 sts, sl1 wyib, k1.

Row 6: Using C, k1, {sl1 wyif, k3} to the last 2 sts, sl1 wyif, k1.

Row 7: Using B, k3, {sl1 wyib, k3} to end.

Row 8: Using B, p3, {sl1 wyif, p3} to end.

Row 9: Using A, k1, {sl1 wyib, k3} to the last 2 sts, sl1 wyib, k1.

Row 10: Using A, p1, {sl1 wyif, p3} to the last 2 sts, sl1 wyif, p1.

Rep [Rows 1-10] until swatches is desired size. I recommend swatches to be at least 5"/12.5 cm in height to get an accurate gauge measurement. Bind off, wet block and wait until dry to measure.

_____ DIRECTIONS _____

SETUP

Using A and the Long Tail Cast On method, CO 7 sts.

Setup Row (WS): K3, p1, sl3 wyif.

Row 1 (RS/INC): K3, RLI, sl3 wyif. [1 st inc'd]

Row 2: K3, p2, sl3 wyif.

Row 3: Knit to the last 3 sts, sl3 wyif.

Row 4: K3, purl to the last 3 sts, sl3 wyif.

Row 5 (INC): Knit to the last 4 sts, RLI, sl3 wyif. [1 st inc'd]

Row 6: K3, purl to the last 3 sts, sl3 wyif.

Row 7: Knit to the last 3 sts, sl3 wyif.

Row 8: K3, purl to the last 3 sts, sl3 wyif.

Rep [Rows 5-8] 2 more times. [2 sts inc'd]

Row 17 (INC): Knit to the last 4 sts, RLI, sl3 wyif. [1 st inc'd]

Rows 18 & 19: K3, {p1, k1} to the last 3 sts, sl3 wyif.

Row 20: K3, purl to the last 3 sts, sl3 wyif.

Row 21 (INC): Knit to the last 4 sts, RLI, sl3 wyif. [1 st inc'd]

Row 22: K3, purl to the last 3 sts, sl3 wyif. Drop A.

Row 23: Join B, k6, sl1 wyib, k3, sl3 wyif.

Row 24: K3, p3, sl1 wyif, p3, sl3 wyif. Drop B.

Row 25 (INC): Join C, k4, sl1 wyib, k3, sl1 wyib, RLI, sl3 wyif. [1 st inc'd]

Row 26: K5, sl1 wyif, k3, sl1 wyif, k1, sl3 wyif. Drop C.

Row 27: Using B, k6, sl1 wyib, k3, sl1 wyib, sl3 wyif.

Row 28: K3, {sl1 wyif, p3} twice, sl3 wyif. Drop B.

Row 29 (INC): Using A, k4, sl1 wyib, k3, sl1 wyib, k1, RLI, sl3 wyif. [1 st inc'd]

Row 30: K3, {p3, sl1 wyif} twice, p1, sl3 wyif.

[8 sts inc'd; 15 sts on needle]

INCREASING PATTERN REPEAT

Row 1 (RS): Using A, knit to the last 3 sts, sl3 wyif.

Row 2 (WS): K3, purl to the last 3 sts, sl3 wyif.

Row 3 (INC): Knit to the last 4 sts, RLI, sl3 wyif. [1 st inc'd]

Rows 4 & 5: K3, {p1, k1} to the last 3 sts, sl3 wyif.

Row 6: K3, purl to the last 3 sts, sl3 wyif.

Row 7 (INC): Knit to the last 4 sts, RLI, sl3 wyif. [1 st inc'd]

Row 8: K3, purl to the last 3 sts, sl3 wyif. Drop A.

Row 9: Using B, k6, {sl1 wyib, k3} to the last 3 sts, sl3 wyif.

Row 10: K3, p3, {sl1 wyif, p3} to the last 3 sts, sl3 wyif. Drop B.

Row 11 (INC): Using C, k4, {sl1 wyib, k3} to the last 5 sts, sl1 wyib, RLI, sl3 wyif. [1 st inc'd]

Row 12: K5, {sl1 wyif, k3} to the last 5 sts, sl1 wyif, k1, sl3 wyif. Drop C.

Row 13: Using B, k6, {sl1 wyib, k3} to the last 4 sts, sl1 wyib, sl3 wyif.

Row 14: K3, {sl1 wyif, p3} to the last 3 sts, sl3 wyif. Drop B.

Row 15 (INC): Using A, k4, {sl1 wyib, k3} to the last 6 sts, sl1 wyib, k1, RLI, sl3 wyif

Row 16: K3, {p3, sl1 wyif} to the last 4 sts, p1, sl3 wyif.

[4 sts inc'd; 19 sts on needle]

Rep [Rows 1-16] 25 more times. [4 sts inc'd per repeat; 119 sts on needle]

TURNING POINT

Rep [Rows 1-14] once more. [3 sts inc'd; 122 sts on needle]

Row 15 (RS/DEC): Using A, k4, {sl1 wyib, k3} to the last 6 sts, sl1 wyib, k2tog, sl3 wyif. [1 st dec'd; 121 sts on needle]



THRU LINES

_____ DIRECTIONS _____

Row 16 (WS): K3, p1, {sl1 wyif, p3} to the last 5 sts, sl1 wyif, p1, sl3 wyif.

DECREASING PATTERN REPEAT

Row 1 (RS): Using A, knit to the last 3 sts, sl3 wyif.

Row 2 (WS): K3, purl to the last 3 sts, sl3 wyif.

Row 3 (DEC): Knit to the last 5 sts, k2tog, sl3 wyif. [1 st dec'd]

Rows 4 & 5: K3, {p1, k1} to the last 3 sts, sl3 wyif.

Row 6: K3, purl to the last 3 sts, sl3 wyif.

Row 7 (DEC): Knit to the last 5 sts, k2tog, sl3 wyif. [1 st dec'd]

Row 8: K3, purl to the last 3 sts, sl3 wyif. Drop A.

Row 9: Using B, k6, {sl1 wyib, k3} to the last 5 sts, sl1 wyib, k1, sl3 wyif.

Row 10: K3, p1, {sl1 wyif, p3} to the last 3 sts, sl3 wyif. Drop B.

Row 11 (DEC): Using C, k4, {sl1 wyib, k3} to the last 7 sts, sl1 wyib, k1, k2tog, sl3 wyif. [1 st dec'd]

Row 12: K5, {sl1 wyif, k3} to the last 5 sts, sl1 wyif, k1, sl3 wyif. Drop C.

Row 13: Using B, k6, {sl1 wyib, k3} to the last 4 sts, sl1 wyib, sl3 wyif.

Row 14: K3, {sl1 wyif, p3} to the last 3 sts, sl3 wyif. Drop B.

Row 15 (DEC): Using A, k4, {sl1 wyib, k3} to the last 6 sts, sl1 wyib, k2tog, sl3 wyif. [1 st dec'd]

Row 16: K3, p1, {sl1 wyif, p3} to the last 5 sts, sl1 wyif, p1, sl3 wyif.

[4 sts dec'd; 117 sts on needle]

Rep [Rows 1-16] 26 more times. Break B & C. [4 sts dec'd per repeat; 13 sts on needle]

FINISHING ROWS

Row 1 (RS): Using A, knit to the last 3 sts, sl3 wyif.

Row 2 (WS): K3, purl to the last 3 sts, sl3 wyif.

Row 3 (DEC): Knit to the last 5 sts, k2tog, sl3 wyif. [1 st dec'd]

Rows 4 & 5: K3, {p1, k1} to the last 3 sts, sl3 wyif.

Row 6: K3, purl to the last 3 sts, sl3 wyif.

Row 7 (DEC): Knit to the last 5 sts, k2tog, sl3 wyif. [1 st dec'd]

Row 8: K3, purl to the last 3 sts, sl3 wyif.

Row 9: Knit to the last 3 sts, sl3 wyif.

Row 10: K3, purl to the last 3 sts, sl3 wyif.

Rep [Rows 7-10] 1 more time. [1 st dec'd]

Row 15 (DEC): Knit to the last 5 sts, k2tog, sl3 wyif. [1 st dec'd]

Row 16: K3, purl to the last 3 sts, sl3 wyif.

Row 17 (DEC): Knit to the last 5 sts, k2tog, sl3 wyif. [1 st dec'd]

Row 18: K3, purl to the last 3 sts, sl3 wyif.

Row 19 (DEC): Knit to the last 5 sts, k2tog, sl3 wyif. [1 st dec'd]

Row 20: K3, p1, sl3 wyif.

Row 21 (DEC): K2, k2tog, leave the rem 3 sts unworked on the LHN. [1 st dec'd; 6 sts rem (3 on each needle)]

FINISHING

Rearrange the 3 sts remaining on the LHN by pinching at their base and sliding the needle out, then reinserting the needle from the other side, so they are now in reverse order. You now have 3 sts from each I-cord edge facing each other so that the purl sts are tucked in towards each other, and the knit sts remain on the outside. Cut yarn, leaving a 10"/25.5 cm tail. Using Kitchener Stitch, graft the remaining 6 sts together. You can find a video tutorial to help with this method here:

Weave in your ends.

Wet block your scarf by soaking it in lukewarm water with your favorite wool wash for 15 minutes. Squeeze out the excess moisture with a towel and lay flat to dry using pins if desired to help flatten the edges. Trim ends and wear!



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
