



TRAVELER'S CARDIGAN

OZETTA

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The Traveler's Cardigan is worked from the top down and is closed in the front with buttons. It features back shaping and dropped shoulders for a relaxed fit. The sleeves are designed to be loose and finished with a balloon cuff. The button band is worked simultaneously with the body which means less finishing work. A classic design meant for everyday wear.

Sizes - XS (S) M (L) XL (2XL) 3XL (4XL) 5XL

Finished Bust Circumference - 35 (39) 42 (47) 51 (55) 57 (61) 65" [89 (99) 107 (119) 130 (140) 145 (155) 165 cm]

Length - 21 (21½) 21½ (21½) 22 (26) 26 (26¼) 26¼" [53 (54.5) 54.5 (54.5) 56 (66) 66 (66.5) 66.5 cm] (as measured from mid back)

Gauge - 15 sts and 24 rows = 4 x 4" [10 x 10 cm] in stockinette st, both flat and in the round on larger needles, blocked

Needle Size -

6 mm (US Size 10) 16" and 32-40", or the required needles to obtain gauge (main needles - used for body and sleeves)

5 mm (US Size 8) double-pointed needles, or two sizes down from main needles (used for button band)

5 mm (US Size 8) 16" and 32-40", or two sizes down from main needles (used for hem, collar, and cuffs)

Yarn - Aran Weight -

539 (609) 742 (886) 984 (1123) 1239 (1351) 1484 yds

493 (557) 678 (810) 900 (1027) 1133 (1235) 1357 m

300 (300) 300 (400) 400 (500) 500 (600) 600 g

Suggested Yarn - Wooldreamers Manchelopsis (100% wool, 100 g = 253 yds) in colorway Blue, 3 (3) 3 (4) 4 (5) 5 (6) 6 plates

Note: Manchelopsis comes double-stranded in one plate. They are knit as presented in order to achieve aran weight. If using other unspun yarn, you will need to double the strands and consider this when figuring the amount of plates needed*

Buttons - 5 (5) 5 (5) 5 (6) 6 (6) 6 measuring ¾" or 20 mm (mother of pearl buttons were used for sample). *Note: Refer to the Page 2 for important notes about the button band and buttonholes*

Notions - 7 stitch markers (5 should be removable), scrap yarn or extra cables, tapestry needle, row counter, thread or spare yarn for attaching buttons

Techniques - Knitting flat, knitting in the round, long tail cast-on, knitted cast-on*, backwards loop cast-on*, increasing, decreasing, German Short Rows*, holding stitches, picking up stitches, buttonholes, sewn tubular bind off*, wet blocking

All measurements and yardage are approximations and are rounded.



Notes on the Traveler's Cardigan

Abbreviations

approx. - Approximately	P - Purl
BOR - Beginning of round	PM - Place marker
CO - Cast on	RS - Right side
ds - Double stitch	SI - Slip (all slip sts will be slipped purlwise)
K - Knit	SM - Slip marker
K2tog - Knit 2 together	st(s) - Stitch(es)
M1L - Make 1 left	WS - Wrong side
M1R - Make 1 right	wyif - With yarn in front

The right front is the right side of chest. The left front is the left side of chest.

Choosing Size

The Traveler's Cardigan has around 5" [13 cm] of positive ease built into the pattern. Sizes XS (S) M (L) XL (2XL) 3XL (4XL) 5XL correspond to a bust circumference of 30 (34) 37 (42) 46 (50) 52 (56) 60" [76 (86) 94 (107) 117 (127) 132 (142) 152 cm] (the final size of garment will be an additional 5" [13 cm]). This means that if you measure a 34" [86 cm] bust you will make size (S) with a finished bust circumference of 39" [99 cm]. This cardigan is meant to be cropped. If you would prefer a longer garment, you will require more yardage than is listed on Page 1. Refer to Page 11 for additional details on final measurements.

Increases

Increases are worked so that they lean to the right (M1R) or to the left (M1L). Work the increases as follows:

M1R - insert the left hand needle under the bar formed by the stitch you just knit and the stitch you're about to knit from back to front and K normally (into the front of the stitch).

M1L - insert the left hand needle under the bar formed by the stitch you just knit and the stitch you're about to knit from front to back and K through the back loop.

German Short Rows (video support on Page 10)

ds/make ds - Double stitch

With yarn in front, SI the first st. Pull working yarn over top of right needle from front to back, rotating the stitch so that the two legs of stitch stretch over the top of the needle and look like two stitches.

Button Band and Buttonholes

The body of the cardigan will be worked on larger needles while the button band will be worked on smaller dpn needles. There are a total of 5 (5) 5 (5) 5 (6) 6 (6) 6 buttonholes in the cardigan. First, you will create 3 (3) 3 (3) 3 (4) 4 (4) 4 buttonholes in the body of the cardigan. Next, you will create buttonhole 4 (4) 4 (4) 4 (5) 5 (5) 5 in the hem. Last, you will create buttonhole 5 (5) 5 (5) 5 (6) 6 (6) 6 in the collar. Your button band should measure approx. 1¼" [3 cm] wide. *Tip:* I recommend casting on 9 sts on dpns and work the buttonband sts for a few rows. Measure width. If gauge with the dpns is not achieved, you may need to go down another needle size.

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Back

You will shape the back of cardigan by using German Short Rows. You will work flat in stockinette st.

Loosely CO 65 (73) 79 (87) 95 (103) 107 (113) 121 sts on US 10 (6 mm)/32-40" circular needles using the long tail cast on method. Break yarn.

Starting at the end from which you just broke the yarn, slip the first 22 (26) 29 (32) 36 (40) 41 (44) 48 sts from the left needle to the right needle. You will not knit these sts for the first row, but you will instead knit them gradually in subsequent rows while utilizing German Short Rows to create a curved back foundation for your cardigan.

Join with new yarn and P21 (21) 21 (23) 23 (23) 25 (25) 25 sts until 22 (26) 29 (32) 36 (40) 41 (44) 48 sts remain, turn, make ds.

Next Row (RS) - K until 20 (24) 27 (30) 34 (38) 39 (42) 46 sts remain. Turn. Make ds.

Following Row (WS) - P until 20 (24) 27 (30) 34 (38) 39 (42) 46 sts remain, resolving ds from previous row when you come to it. Turn. Make ds.

You will continue working German Short Rows, each time turning 2 sts after last turn. Meaning, work to your last ds, resolve the ds by knitting (RS) or purling (WS) the ds as one st, work another 2 sts, and turn as follows:

Row 1 (RS) - K to the ds, resolve by knitting ds, K2, turn, make ds.

Row 2 (WS) - P to the ds, resolve by purling ds, P2, turn, make ds.

Tip: If you're having trouble keeping track of your ds, mark its place with a removable stitch marker.

Repeat Rows 1 and 2, 9 (11) 12 (14) 16 (18) 18 (20) 22 **more** times. At the last turn there will be 2 (2) 3 (2) 2 (2) 3 (2) 2 unworked sts remaining after the ds on both the left and right side of your work. The next row will be a RS row.


The back now measures approx. 3¾ (4¼) 4¾ (5¼) 6 (6¾) 6¾ (7¼) 8" [9 (11) 12 (14) 15 (17) 17 (19) 20 cm], as measured from center back cast-on edge.

You will continue working back and forth in stockinette st across all back sts, resolving the final two ds as you work, for 30 (30) 32 (32) 32 (38) 44 (46) 44 more rows, until back measures approx. 8¾ (9¼) 10 (10¾) 11¼ (13) 14 (15) 15¼" [22 (24) 25 (27) 29 (33) 36 (38) 39 cm], as measured from center back cast-on edge. End by working a WS row.

You are now at RS. Break yarn and let sts rest on cable or scrap yarn.

Right Front

With RS of back piece facing and CO sts on top, pick up and knit 22 (26) 29 (32) 36 (40) 41 (44) 48 sts beginning from right slanted edge. *Note:* To maintain the stockinette and create a seamless look, you will pick up and K in between the sts (i.e., you will pick up sts from in between the Λ s).



Work back and forth as follows:

Row 1 (WS) - P across.

Row 2 (RS) - K across.

Repeat Rows 1 and 2, 2 (2) 2 (2) 3 (3) 3 (3) 3 **more** times, for a total of 6 (6) 6 (6) 8 (8) 8 (8) 8 rows, then work **one more** repeat of Row 1 **only**. Right front measures approx. 1¼ (1¼) 1¼ (1¼) 1¾ (1¾) 1¾ (1¾) 1¾" [3 (3) 3 (3) 4 (4) 4 (4) 4 cm] as measured from the picked-up sts. You are now at RS.

Tip: It may be easiest to measure the front from the WS, as the seam from which you picked up sts is visible from that side.

Now work increases to shape the neck edge as follows:

Row 1 (RS) - K across until 3 sts remain, M1R, K3. (1 st increased).

Row 2 (WS) - P across.

Row 3 (RS) - K across.

Row 4 (WS) - P across.

Repeat Rows 1-4, 5 **more** times, for a total of 24 rows. Right front measures approx. 5¼ (5¼) 5¼ (5¼) 5¾ (5¾) 5¾ (5¾) 5¾" [13 (13) 13 (13) 14.5 (14.5) 14.5 (14.5) 14.5 cm]. 28 (32) 35 (38) 42 (46) 47 (50) 54 sts.

Right Front Button Band (video support on Page 10 for backwards loop CO and knitted CO)

You will now work the cardigan on two different needle sizes at the same time. The body of the cardigan will be worked on the larger needles while the button band will be worked on the smaller dpn needles. You will work as follows:

Set-Up Row 1 (RS) - K across right front, with US 8 (5 mm) dpns and with same yarn CO 9 sts in extension of your right front sts using the backwards loop cast-on method. 37 (41) 44 (47) 51 (55) 56 (59) 63 sts.

Set-Up Row 2 (WS) - With dpn SI 2 wyif, *K1, P1* repeat *-* until 1 st remains on dpn, K1, with larger needles P across right front.

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Row 1 (RS) - K across right front, with dpn *P1, K1* repeat *-* until 3 sts remain, P1, K2.

Row 2 (WS) - With dpn SI 2 wyif, *K1, P1* repeat *-* until 1 st remains on dpn, K1, with larger needles P across right front.

Repeat Rows 1 and 2, 8 **more** times, for a total of 18 rows. You are now at RS.

You will now add a buttonhole to the band over the next two rows as follows:

Buttonhole Row 1 (RS) - K across right front, with dpn P1, K1, P1, cast off 2 sts (K st 4, P st 5, cast off st 4, K st 6, cast off st 5), P1, K2.

Buttonhole Row 2 (WS) - With dpn SI 2 wyif, K1, P1, CO 2 sts using the knitted cast-on method, K1, P1, K1, with larger needles P across right front.

Next, work in the established pattern as follows:

Row 1 (RS) - K across right front, with dpn *P1, K1* repeat *-* until 3 sts remain, P1, K2.

Row 2 (WS) - With dpn SI 2 wyif, *K1, P1* repeat *-* until 1 st remains on dpn, K1, with larger needles P across right front.

Repeat Rows 1 and 2, 2 (3) 5 (7) 8 (11) 11 (11) 11 **more** time(s), for a total of 6 (8) 12 (16) 18 (24) 24 (24) 24 rows.


Sizes XS (S) M (L) XL Only. Break yarn and let sts rest on cable or scrap yarn. Proceed to Left Front instructions.

Sizes (2X) 3X (4X) 5X Only. Repeat Buttonhole Rows 1 and 2 on Rows 25 and 26. You now have 2 buttonholes.

Repeat Rows 1 and 2, (2) 5 (7) 8 more times, for a total of (4) 10 (14) 16 rows. Break yarn and let sts rest on cable or scrap yarn. Proceed to Left Front instructions.

Left Front

With RS of back piece facing and CO sts on top, pick up and knit 22 (26) 29 (32) 36 (40) 41 (44) 48 sts, beginning 21 (21) 21 (23) 23 (23) 25 (25) 25 sts from the closest stitch picked up for the Right Front. *Note:* To maintain the stockinette and create a seamless look, you will pick up and K in between the sts (i.e., you will pick up sts from in between the Λs).



Work back and forth as follows:

Row 1 (WS) - P across.

Row 2 (RS) - K across.

Repeat Rows 1 and 2, 2 (2) 2 (2) 3 (3) 3 (3) 3 **more** times, for a total of 6 (6) 6 (6) 8 (8) 8 (8) 8 rows, then work **one more** repeat of Row 1 **only**. Left front measures approx. 1¼ (1¼) 1¼ (1¼) 1¾ (1¾) 1¾ (1¾) 1¾" [3 (3) 3 (3) 4 (4) 4 (4) 4 cm] as measured from the picked-up sts. You are now at RS.

Tip: It may be easiest to measure the front from the WS, as the seam from which you picked up sts is visible from that side.

Now work increases to shape the neck edge as follows:

Row 1 (RS) - K3, M1L, K across. (1 st increased).

Row 2 (WS) - P across.

Row 3 (RS) - K across.

Row 4 (WS) - P across.

Repeat Rows 1-4, 5 **more** times, for a total of 24 rows. Left front measures approx. 5¼ (5¼) 5¼ (5¼) 5¾ (5¾) 5¾ (5¾) 5¾" [13 (13) 13 (13) 14.5 (14.5) 14.5 (14.5) 14.5 cm]. 28 (32) 35 (38) 42 (46) 47 (50) 54 sts. Break yarn.

Left Front Button Band

You will now work the cardigan on two different needle sizes at the same time. The body of the cardigan will be worked on the larger needles while the button band will be worked on the smaller dpn needles. You will now work as follows:

Set-up Row 1 (RS) - With new yarn and US 8 (5 mm) dpns CO 9 sts using the backwards loop cast-on method. With larger needles and with same yarn, join button band to left front by knitting into first st of left front, K across. 37 (41) 44 (47) 51 (55) 56 (59) 63 sts.

Set-up Row 2 (WS) - P across left front, with dpn *K1, P1* repeat *-* until 3 sts remains, K1, Sl 2 wyif.

Row 1 (RS) - With dpn K2, *P1, K1* repeat *-* until 1 st remains on dpn, P1, with larger needles K across left front.

Row 2 (WS) - P across left front, with dpn *K1, P1* repeat *-* until 3 sts remains, K1, Sl 2 wyif.

Repeat Rows 1 and 2, 12 (13) 15 (17) 18 (24) 27 (29) 30 **more** times, for a total of 28 (30) 34 (38) 40 (52) 58 (62) 64 rows until left front measures approx. 10 (10¼) 11 (11¾) 12¼ (14¼) 15¼ (16) 16¼" [25 (26) 28 (30) 31 (36) 39 (41) 41 cm]. You are now at RS.

Tip: Place a removable st marker to indicate where your button will later be sewn on opposite the buttonhole side every 25th/26th row.

Body

Join the fronts to back and form the armholes as follows:

With dpn K2, *P1, K1* repeat *-* until 1 st remains on dpn, P1, with larger needles K across left front 28 (32) 35 (38) 42 (46) 47 (50) 54 sts, CO 1 (0) 0 (2) 2 (1) 2 (3) 3 st(s) using the knitted cast-on method, place back sts on needles and K across 65 (73) 79 (87) 95 (103) 107 (113) 121 sts, CO 1 (0) 0 (2) 2 (1) 2 (3) 3 st(s) using the knitted cast-on method, place right front sts on needles and K across 28 (32) 35 (38) 42 (46) 47 (50) 54 sts, with dpn *P1, K1* repeat *-* until 3 sts remain, P1, K2. 141 (155) 167 (185) 201 (215) 223 (237) 253 sts.

Next, work back and forth in the established pattern as follows:

Row 1 (WS) - With dpn SI 2 wyif, *K1, P1* repeat *-* until 1 st remains on dpn, K1, with larger needles P across body, with dpn *K1, P1* repeat *-* until 3 sts remain, K1, SI 2 wyif.

Row 2 (RS) - With dpn K2, *P1, K1* repeat *-* until 1 st remains on dpn, P1, with larger needles K across body, with dpn *P1, K1* repeat *-* until 3 sts remain, P1, K2.

Repeat Rows 1 and 2, 7 (6) 4 (2) 1 (8) 5 (3) 2 **more** time(s), for a total of 16 (14) 10 (6) 4 (18) 12 (8) 6 rows, then work **one more** repeat of Row 1 **only**. You are now at RS.

You will now add a buttonhole to the ribbed band over the next two rows as follows:

Buttonhole Row 1 (RS) - With dpn K2, *P1, K1* repeat *-* until 1 st remains on dpn, P1, with larger needles K across body, with dpn P1, K1, P1, cast off 2 sts (K st 4, P st 5, cast off st 4, K st 6, cast off st 5), P1, K2.

Buttonhole Row 2 (WS) - With dpn SI 2 wyif, K1, P1, CO 2 sts using the knitted cast-on method, K1, P1, K1, with larger needles P across body, with dpn *K1, P1* repeat *-* until 3 sts remain, K1, SI 2 wyif.

Tip: Continue to place removable stitch markers to indicate where your button will later be sewn on opposite the buttonhole side.

Continue by working back and forth in established pattern as follows:

Row 1 (RS) - With dpn K2, *P1, K1* repeat *-* until 1 st remains on dpn, P1, with larger needles K across body, with dpn *P1, K1* repeat *-* until 3 sts remain, P1, K2.

Row 2 (WS) - With dpn SI 2 wyif, *K1, P1* repeat *-* until 1 st remains on dpn, K1, with larger needles P across body, with dpn *K1, P1* repeat *-* until 3 sts remain, K1, SI 2 wyif.

Repeat Rows 1 and 2, 11 **more** times, for a total of 24 rows, or 4" [10 cm], then repeat the buttonhole as described above on Rows 25 and 26. You now have 3 (3) 3 (3) 3 (4) 4 (4) 4 buttonholes.

Next, work Rows 1 and 2 over an additional 20 rows, or 3¼" [8 cm]. End by working a WS row.

Hem (video support on Page 10 for sewn tubular cast-off)

With US 8 (5 mm)/32-40" circular needles work the hem as follows:

Row 1 (RS) - K2, *P1, K1* repeat *-* until 1 st remains on dpn, P1, PM, *K1, P1* repeat *-* until 1 st remains before button band, K1, PM, *P1, K1* repeat until 3 sts remain, P1, K2.

Row 2 (WS) - Sl 2 wyif, *K1, P1* repeat *-* until 1 st before marker, K1, SM, *P1, K1* until 1 st before marker, P1, SM, *K1, P1* repeat *-* until 3 sts remain, K1, Sl 2 wyif.

Repeat Rows 1 and 2, 1 **more** time, for a total of 4 rows, or ½" [1 cm], then repeat the buttonhole as described above for Rows 5 and 6 while maintaining the established ribbing pattern over the width of the hem. You now have 4 (4) 4 (4) 4 (5) 5 (5) 5 buttonholes. You may now remove both stitch markers on the following row.

Continue working back and forth in established pattern by working Rows 1 and 2, 2 times, for a total of 4 rows, or for ½" [1 cm]. Your last row worked should be a WS row.

If using tubular cast-off method, work the set-up rows as follows:

Tubular cast-off Row 1 (RS) - *Sl 1 wyif, K1* repeat *-* until 1 st remains, Sl 1 wyif.

Tubular cast-off Row 2 (WS) - *K1, Sl 1 wyif* repeat *-* until 1 st remains, K1.

Cast-off by using the tubular cast-off method or your favorite cast-off technique. *Note:* If using the sewn tubular cast-off method, the first two sts and last two sts of the hem should be treated as one st to correctly maintain the ribbing pattern.

Sleeves (same for both)

The sleeves are worked in the round with US 10 (6 mm)/16" circular needles. Beginning at the bottom of the armhole opening in the middle of the cast-on underarm sts, attach yarn and pick up and knit 56 (56) 60 (64) 68 (76) 84 (88) 88 sts. You will pick up approx. 2 sts every 3 rows or until sts are spread evenly. Place st marker at underarm to mark BOR. Work in the round in stockinette st until sleeve measures approx. 15" [38 cm] from the picked-up edge.

Next work the decrease round as follows:

Decrease round - *K2tog* repeat *-* until end of round. 28 (28) 30 (32) 34 (38) 42 (44) 44 sts.

At this point, you may move on to knitting the sleeve cuff or you may continue working in stockinette until your sleeve measures 1½" [4 cm] less than your desired final length. *Note:* Adding additional length will require more yardage.

Sleeve Cuffs (same for both) (video support on Page 10 for sewn tubular cast-off)

With US 8 (5 mm) dpns or magic loop method, finish your sleeve by working the cuff as follows:

K1, P1 repeat *-* for 9 rounds or until cuff measures approx. 1½" [4 cm].

If using tubular cast-off method, work the set-up rounds as follows:

Tubular cast-off Round 1 - *K1, Sl 1 wyif* repeat *-*.

Tubular cast-off Round 2 - *Sl 1 wyib, P1* repeat *-*.

Cast-off all sts using the sewn tubular cast-off method or your favorite cast-off technique.

Collar

Note: When picking up sts along the top of the button band on the right and left sides, pick up into each of the 9 corresponding sts so that the collar and button band will transition smoothly.

With US 8 (5 mm)/16" circular needles and with RS facing, pick up 9 sts along top of right side of button band, 19 (19) 19 (19) 19 (19) 20 (20) 20 sts up the right neckline, 21 (21) 21 (23) 23 (23) 25 (25) 25 sts along the back (one in each initial cast on stitch), 19 (19) 19 (19) 19 (19) 20 (20) 20 sts down the left neckline, and 9 sts along top of left side of button band. 77 (77) 77 (79) 79 (79) 83 (83) 83 sts.

Note: The stitch counts for the collar are suggestions. You may choose to pick up less stitches for a closely fitting collar or more stitches for a loosely fitting collar. Just be sure you have picked up an odd number of stitches before moving forward so that you are able to correctly maintain the pattern in the following rows.

Row 1 (WS) - Sl 2 wyif, *K1, P1* repeat *-* until 3 sts remain, K1, Sl 2 wyif.

Row 2 (RS) - K2, *P1, K1* repeat *-* until 3 sts remain, P1, K2.

Row 3 (WS) - Repeat Row 1.

Buttonhole Row 1 (RS) - K2, P1, K1, cast off 2 sts (P st 5, K st 6, cast off st 5, P st 7, cast off st 6), *K1, P1* repeat *-* until 3 sts remain, P1, K2.

Buttonhole Row 2 (WS) - Sl 2 wyif, *K1, P1* repeat *-* until 4 sts remain, CO 2 sts using the knitted cast-on method, P1, K1, Sl 2 wyif.

Repeat Rows 2 and 3, 2 more times, for a total of 4 rows. You are now at RS.

If using tubular cast-off method, work the set-up rows as follows:

Tubular cast-off Row 1 (RS) - *Sl 1 wyif, K1* repeat *-* until 1 st remains, Sl 1 wyif.

Tubular cast-off Row 2 (WS) - *K1, Sl 1 wyif* repeat *-* until 1 st remains, K1.

Cast-off by using the tubular cast-off method or your favorite cast-off technique. *Note:* If using the sewn tubular cast-off method, the first two sts and last two sts of the collar should be treated as one st to correctly maintain the ribbing pattern.

Finishing

Sew buttons onto cardigan where you placed markers on the opposite side from the buttonholes. Weave in all loose ends. Block #TravelersCardigan to measurements. Wear forever (especially on your travels).


