

TRICK OR FEET SOCKS



BACKWOODS KNITS



MATERIALS:

50-90 grams fingering weight yarn
(Main Color)

5-10 grams of each CC per chart.

See page 5 for color guide

Size US1.5 (2.5mm) 9" circular
needles, DPN's, or long circular
needles for magic loop

2 stitch markers

Tapestry needle

CAUCE:

32 st over 4" (10cm) stockinette
stitch, knit in the round & blocked
using US1(2.25mm) needles

SIZES:

Baby (5", 12.75cm)

Kid (6", 15.25cm)

Teen/ Adult S (7", 17.75cm)

M (8"/20.25cm)

L (9"/ 22.75 cm)

XL (10"/ 25.5 cm)

XX- Large (11", 28cm)

ABBREVIATIONS:

MC- main color

CC- contrast color

BOR- beginning of round

R- round/row

st- stitch

m- marker

Rep- repeat

k- knit

p- purl

pm- place marker

k2tog- knit 2 together

ssk- slip slip knit

HOW TO FIND YOUR SIZE:

Baby (Kid, Teen/Adult Small, Medium, Large, X-Large, XX-Large)

NOTE ON COLOR DOMINANCE:

When knitting colorwork, you will always want to keep your CC to the LEFT of your MC so ensure your color work has clear and crisp edges.

NOTE ON HEEL PLACEMENT:

This sock is knit from the cuff to the toe with a true afterthought heel cut in at the end. To ensure you get a sock that fits, you will need to measure the total length of the foot of your sock and subtract 1.25" (1.5", 1.75", 2", 2.25", 2.5", 2.75") to accommodate the heel. If you are concerned about fit you can always cut your heel in before you get to the toe so you are able to try your sock on. To do this, knit the leg of the sock to your desired length. Knit at least 2" past that point. Follow the afterthought heel instructions. Then you will continue on with your foot and knit your toe.

NOTES:

Use the measurements below from the Craft Yarn Council of America to calculate the length of the foot of your sock:

Women's Shoe Sizes

4-6.5: 8-9" (20-23 cm)

7-9.5: 9.25-10" (23-25.5 cm)

10-12.5: 10.25-11" (26-28 cm)

Men's Shoe Sizes

6-8.5: 9.25-10" (23-25.5 cm)

9-11.5: 10.25-11" (26-28 cm)

12-14: 11.25-12" (28.5-30.5 cm)



MIX AND MATCH

MOTIFS FROM TRICK OR FEET SOCKS AND FALLELUJAH
SOCKS ARE COMPLETELY INTERCHANGEABLE

COMBINE THESE TWO PATTERNS TO CREATE YOUR VERY
OWN UNIQUE SOCK DESIGNS !!

INSTRUCTIONS

CUFF

Cast on 40 (48, 56, 64, 72, 80, 88) sts

Rounds 1-12: *(k3, p1); rep from * around

LEG/FOOT

Setup: Knit 1 round even

Begin working chosen charts.

Work 3 rounds of MC in between each chart.

TOE

Place a second marker at 20 (24, 28, 32, 36, 40, 44) sts

Round 1: k1, ssk, k1 across to 3 st before m, k2tog, k1, sm, k1, ssk, k to 3 st before BOR m, k2tog, k

Round 2: knit even

Continue to work Round 1 and Round 2 until 12 (16, 20, 24, 28, 32, 36) stitches remain. Break yarn leaving a long tail.

Graft toe together using Kitchener stitch.

AFTERTHOUGHT HEEL

Your heel is going to be worked on the rounds between your motifs. Lay your sock flat and locate the beginning of your rounds. This is simple to do by either following your toe seam up or by locating your “jog” between your first and last motif.

You will have 3 rounds of MC between your motifs. Begin picking up the stitches of the first round by lifting the RIGHT leg onto a DPN. Pick up 20 (24, 28, 32, 36, 40, 44) sts.

Now you will pick up sts of the third round of your MC strip. Starting in the same column as your first set of sts, pick up 20 (24, 28, 32, 36, 40, 44) sts by lifting the RIGHT leg onto a DPN.

AFTERTHOUGHT HEEL CONTINUED

Now that you have picked up your heel stitches from the first and third rounds of MC, grab a pair of scissors and snip the second or middle round of MC that is left between your DPNS. Make this cut as close to center as you can but don't worry if it's not exact!

Working from the middle out, pull the stitches out from the cut you just made. I find it easiest to do this by lifting the legs of the sts with a dpn until they are unraveled.

DO NOT UNRAVEL TO THE END!!

We will be leaving the last 2 sts on each side still intact. This is a great trick to avoid holes and gaps in the corners of your afterthought heels.

Join MC at BOR, pm (it doesn't matter which side you choose as the beginning)

Knit across first 40 (48, 56, 64, 72, 80, 88) sts, pm.

Knit across last 40 (48, 56, 64, 72, 80, 88) sts.

Knit 1 more round even.

NOTE: If you know you like a deeper heel, knit 3-5 more rounds even before beginning decrease rounds.

Now you will begin working your decreases. Your heel will be worked in the exact same way as you worked the toe!

Round 1: k1, ssk, k1 across to 3 st before m, k2tog, k1, sm, k1, ssk, k to 3 st before BOR m, k2tog, k

Round 2: knit even

Continue to work Round 1 and Round 2 until 12 (16, 20, 24, 28, 32, 36) stitches remain. Break yarn leaving a long tail.

Graft heel together using Kitchener stitch.

HOW TO CUT IN AFTERTHOUGHT HEEL



Orient your sock so the cuff is up and toe is down. Find the 3 rows of MC in between the 2 motifs where you want your heel to be placed. You can determine where your BOR or halfway point in by locating the column of MC sts in between each motif. You will be picking up the top and bottom rows only and you will be picking up HALF of your total number of sts on each needle. If you have trouble grabbing your sts, you may find it easier to size down to size US1 or US0 needles.



Pick up the RIGHT LEG ONLY of each st across, beginning at the right side and working left. I like to pick up the bottom row first so it is easier to see the sts when I pick up the top round.

Repeat for the top row of sts.




Lift the leg of one st from the middle row that was not picked up and cut it. Using a spare needle begin to pick apart the cut st from the live sts on your needle.

DO NOT UNRAVEL TO THE END!!


Leave the last 2 sts on each side still intact. This is a great trick to avoid holes and gaps in the corners of your afterthought heels.


Note: Charts are read from bottom to top and right to left!




