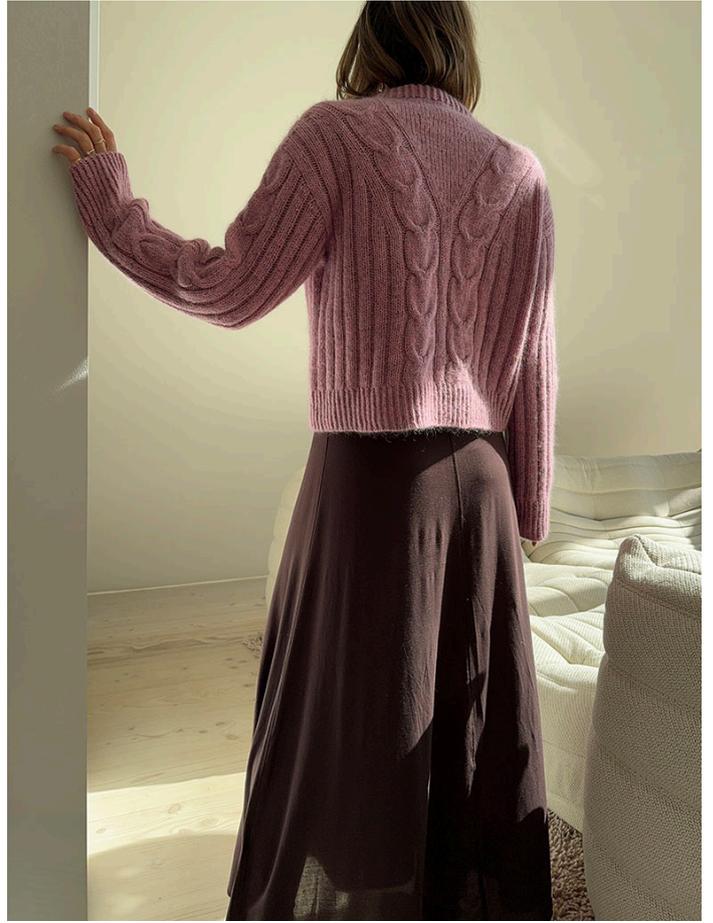


OTHER LOOPS  
TULIP\_LOOP\_SWEATER



**TULIP\_LOOP\_SWEATER** has a loose fit with straight sleeves, detailed with cables and ribbing.

The sweater is worked from top to bottom. First the back piece and the front piece are worked back and forth. Then the two pieces are joined to form the body and are worked in the round. Sleeve stitches are picked up around the armhole and the sleeves are worked in the round as well. To ensure a good fit, short rows are worked at the top of the back piece, shoulders and sleeves. A cable and ribbing pattern are worked on the body and sleeves, and all hems are finished with twisted rib.

### Sizes\_

XS (S) M (L) XL (XXL)

### Measurements\_

Circumference\_ 107 (113) 118 (124) 135 (143) cm.

Length\_ 52 (52) 53 (58) 59 (59) cm, measured from under the neckline on the back piece.

The sweater has a generous positive ease of about 25 cm. You should knit a size where the circumference is about 25 cm bigger than your own chest circumference, depending on how loose you want the sweater to be.

*The pink version shown is size S with a positive ease of 27 cm. This is worked with extra length on the sleeves.*

*The light grey version shown is size M, with a positive ease of 32 cm.*

### Materials\_

1 strand Jensen 50 g / 125 m from Isager **or** 1 strand Heavy Merino 50 g / 125 m from Knitting for Olive **or** 1 strand My Wool 50 g / 125 m from Gepard  
400 (450) 450 (500) 500 (550) g.

*Together with*

1 strand Silk Mohair 25 g / 212 m from Isager **or** 1 strand Kid Seta 25 g / 210 m from Gepard **or** Soft Silk Mohair 25 g / 225 m from Knitting for Olive  
125 (125) 150 (150) 175 (175) g.

### Or\_

2 strands Tvinni 50 g / 255 m from Isager  
400 (450) 450 (500) 500 (550) g.

*Together with*

1 strand Silk Mohair 25 g / 212 m from Isager **or** 1 strand Kid Seta 25 g / 210 m from Gepard **or** Soft Silk Mohair 25 g / 225 m from Knitting for Olive  
125 (125) 150 (150) 175 (175) g.

*The pink version is worked with Isager Tvinni col. 27s together with Kid Seta col. 488.*

*The light grey version is worked with Isager Jensen col. 0s together with Silk Mohair col. 0.*

### Recommended needles\_

4.5 mm circular needles (40 and 80 or 100 cm).

4 mm circular needles (40 and 80 or 100 cm), and possibly DPNs in the same size, unless using Magic Loop technique.

Cable needle.

### Gauge\_

18 sts x 28 rows in rib (k3, p2) on 4.5 mm = 10 x 10 cm after washing and blocking.

### Abbreviations\_

k = knit

p = purl

tbl = through the back loop

tog = together

st(s) = stitch(es)

rnd(s) = round(s)

RS = right side

WS = wrong side

BOR = beginning of the round

sl1pw wyif = slip 1 stitch purl-wise with yarn held in front of the work

sl1pw wyib = slip 1 stitch purl-wise with yarn held behind the work

edge st = edge stitch (worked knit-wise on the right side and purl-wise on the wrong side).

### Cables\_

When the pattern says **cable**, you will need to place 3 sts from the left needle onto a cable needle in front of the work, knit 3 sts from the left needle, knit the 3 sts from the cable needle, place 3 sts from the left needle onto a cable needle behind the work, knit 3 sts from the left needle, and knit the 3 sts from the cable needle.

### Short rows\_

Short rows are worked according to the German Short Rows technique.

When the pattern says **turn**, you will need to turn the work and slip the first stitch. Pull the yarn up over the needle and pull on the yarn end, so that you create a double stitch/stitch with 2 "legs". Hold the yarn tight and continue with working the row as described. When you later come across the double stitch, you will work both "legs" together as one stitch.

### Increases\_

**MIL\_** knit left-leaning increase – insert the left needle from the front under the strand between the stitches and knit it (through the back loop).

**MIR\_** knit right-leaning increase – insert the left needle from the back under the strand between the stitches and knit it (through the front loop).

**MIL-P\_** purl left-leaning increase – insert the left needle from the front under the strand between the stitches and purl it (through the back loop).

**MIR-P\_** purl right-leaning increase – insert the left needle from the back under the strand between the stitches and purl it (through the front loop).

### Decreases\_

**K2tog\_** knit right-leaning decrease – knit 2 stitches together.

**SSK\_** knit left-leaning decrease - SSK improved – slip the first stitch knit-wise, slip the next stitch purl-wise, insert the left needle through the stitches from left to right and knit them together through the back loops.

**P2tog\_** purl right-leaning decrease – purl 2 stitches together.

**P2togtbl\_** purl left-leaning decrease – purl 2 stitches together through the back loops.

### Back\_

The back piece is worked back and forth. Short rows are worked across the upper part to shape the back piece. At the same time, the rib and cable sections are established.

Cast 91 (91) 101 (101) 111 (111) sts onto 4.5 mm needles.

Now establish the rib and cable sections.

Work 1 row from the WS as follows: edge st, \*p3, k2\*, repeat from \*-\* 2 (2) 3 (3) 4 (4) more times, p12, k2, p31, k2, p12, \*k2, p3\*, repeat from \*-\* 2 (2) 3 (3) 4 (4) more times, edge st.

Break the yarn.

Slip the first 30 (30) 35 (35) 40 (40) sts from the left needle to the right needle without knitting them. In the following section, work the sts as they show.

Join new yarn and work 31 sts, **turn**.

**Row 1\_** (WS) work to the st where the new yarn was joined, also work that st, work 5 sts, **turn**.

**Row 2\_** (RS) work to the last turn, work the double st, work 5 sts, **turn**.

**Row 3\_** (WS) work to the last turn, work the double st, work 5 sts, **turn**.

**Row 4\_** (RS) work to the last turn, work the double st, work 5 sts, **turn**.

Repeat **rows 3\_** and **4\_** a total of 3 (3) 4 (4) 5 (5) more times. After the last turn, there are 5 sts left on the needle.

Work the rest of the row.

Now all short rows are made and the piece measures 4.5 (4.5) 5 (5) 5.5 (5.5) cm, measured mid-back.

Now work back and forth for a total of 0 (0) 2 (2) 4 (4) rows.

Now the back piece is worked back and forth while also working cables as well as increases and decreases- this will move the cables and create the 'triangle' detail.

Insert 4 markers as follows: insert markers after 11 (11) 16 (16) 21 (21) sts, 20 sts, 29 sts, 20 sts, and 11 (11) 16 (16) 21 (21) sts before the end of the row. Check that they are placed symmetrically throughout the back piece.

**Row 1\_** (RS) work to marker, **MIR**, slip marker, work to marker, slip marker, **k2tog**, work to 2 sts before marker, **SSK**, slip marker, work to marker, **MIL**, work the rest of the row.

**Rows 2 - 4\_** work the whole row.

**Row 5\_** (RS) work to the marker, **MIR**, slip marker, work to marker, slip marker, **k2tog**, work to 2 sts before marker, **SSK**, slip marker, work to marker, slip marker, **MIL**, work the rest of the row.

**Row 6 - 8\_** work the whole row.

**Row 9\_** (RS) work to marker, **MIR**, slip marker, work 5 sts, **cable**, work to marker, slip marker, **k2tog**, work to 2 sts before marker, **SSK**, slip marker, work 3 sts, **cable**, work to marker, slip marker, **MIL**, work the whole row.

**Rows 10 - 12\_** work the whole row

**Row 13\_** (RS) work to marker, **MIR-P**, slip marker, work to marker, slip marker, **k2tog**, work to 2 sts before marker, **SSK**, slip marker, work to marker, slip marker, **MIL-P**, work the rest of the row

**Rows 14 - 16\_** work the whole row

**Row 17\_** (RS) work as **row 13\_**

**Rows 18 - 20\_** work the whole row

**21 p\_** (RS) work as **row 5\_**

**Rows 22 - 24\_** work the whole row

**Row 25\_** (RS) work as **row 9\_**

**Rows 26 - 28\_** work the whole row

**Row 29\_** (RS) work as **row 5\_**

**30 - 32 p\_** work the whole row

**Row 33\_** (RS) work as **row 13\_**

**Rows 34 - 36\_** work the whole row

**Row 37\_** (RS) work as **row 13\_**

**Rows 38 - 40\_** work the whole row

**Row 41\_** (RS) work as **row 9\_**

**Rows 42 - 44\_** work the whole row

**Row 45\_** (RS) work as **row 5\_**

**Rows 46 - 48\_** work the whole row.

Now increases are made for the armhole as follows:

**Row 1\_** (RS) work 4 sts, **MIL**, work to marker, **MIR**, slip marker, work to marker, slip marker, **k2tog**, work to 2 sts before marker, **SSK**, slip marker, work to marker, slip marker, **MIL**, work to 4 sts before end of row, **MIR**, work 4 sts

**Row 2\_** (WS) work the whole row

**Row 3\_** (RS) work 4 sts, **MIL**, work to 4 sts before end of row, **MIR**, work 4 sts

**Row 4\_** (WS) work the whole row

**Row 5\_** (RS) work 4 sts, **MIL**, work to marker, **MIR-P**, slip marker, work to 1 st before marker, slip st to right needle, remove marker, slip st back to the left needle, **k2tog**, work 1 st, slip st to right needle, remove the next marker, slip st back to the left needle, **SSK**, work to marker, slip marker, **MIL-P**, work to 4 sts before end of row, **MIR**, work 4 sts

**Row 6\_** (WS) work the whole row

**Row 7\_** (RS) work 4 sts, **MIL-P**, work to 4 sts before end of row, **MIR-P**, work 4 sts

**Row 8\_** (WS) work the whole row

**Row 9\_** (RS) work 4 sts **MIL-P**, work to marker, **MIR-P**, slip marker, work 5 sts, **cable**, work 7 sts, **cable**, work to marker, slip marker, **MIL-P**, work to 4 sts before end of row, **MIR-P**, work 4 sts

**Row 10\_** (WS) work the whole row.

You have now worked 4 decreases and 16 increases = 103 (103) 113 (113) 123 (123) sts.

Remove the marker, break the yarn and let the sts rest.

### **Left shoulder\_**

Pick up 31 (31) 36 (36) 41 (41) sts with 4.5 mm needles along the edge of the left shoulder. Sts are picked up from the RS of the neck towards the shoulder. Start picking up sts at the outermost knit-st on the left side of the 'triangle' and pick up **in** all sts along the shoulder edge. To achieve the nicest transition between the front and back piece, sts are picked up in the sts and not between the sts.

Now the rib and cable sections will be established. Work 1 row from the WS as follows: edge st, \*p3, k2\*, repeat from \*-\* 2 (2) 3 (3) 4 (4) more times, p 12, k2, edge st. (Be careful that your knit and purl sts of the back piece lie just outside the shoulder sts). For the following section, work all sts as they show.

Now work short rows back and forth to shape the left shoulder as follows:

**Row 1\_** (RS) work 5 sts, **turn**

**Row 2\_** (WS) work the whole row

**Row 3\_** (RS) work to the last turn, work the double st, work 5 sts, **turn**

**Row 4\_** (WS) work the whole row.

Repeat **rows 3\_** and **4\_** for 3 (3) 4 (4) 5 (5) more times. After the last turn, 5 sts are remaining on the needle.

Now all the short rows have been worked.

Now work back and forth as the sts show for a total of 2 (2) 4 (4) 6 (6) rows.

Now increases are worked to the neck, as follows:

**Row 1\_** (RS) work edge st, **MIL**, work the rest of the row

**Row 2\_** (WS) work the whole row

**Rows 3-6\_** repeat **rows 1\_** and **2\_** 2 times

**Row 7\_** (RS) edge st, **MIL-P**, work 5 sts, **cable**, work the rest of the row

**Row 8\_** (WS) work the whole row

**Row 9\_** (RS) edge st, **MIL-P**, work the rest of the row

**Row 10\_** (WS) work the whole row.

You have now worked 5 increases = 36 (36) 41 (41) 46 (46) sts.

Break the yarn and let the sts rest.

### **Right shoulder\_**

Pick up 31 (31) 36 (36) 41 (41) sts with 4.5 mm needles along the edge of the right shoulder. Sts are picked up from the RS with the short end of the yarn, so the first st can be worked from the RS. Start picking up sts from the outermost edge st on the right shoulder and pick up **in** all sts along the shoulder edge, to and including the first knit-st in the 'triangle'. To achieve the nicest transition between the front and back piece, pick up in the sts and not between the sts.

Now the rib and cable sections are established. Pull the sts to the right needle and work 1 row from the RS as follows: edge st, \*k3, p2\*, repeat from \* to \* for 2 (2) 3 (3) 4 (4) more times, k12, p2, edge st. (Be careful that the knit and purl sts from the back piece lie just outside the shoulder sts). For the following section, work the sts as they show.

Now work short rows back and forth to shape the right shoulder, as follows:

**Row 1\_** (WS) work 5 sts, **turn**

**Row 2\_** (RS) work the whole row

**Row 3\_** (WS) work to the last turn, work the double st, work 5 sts, **turn**

**Row 4\_** (RS) work the whole row

Repeat **rows 3\_** and **4\_** for 3 (3) 4 (4) 5 (5) more times. There are 5 sts remaining after the last turn.

Now all short rows have been worked.

Work back and forth as the sts show for a total of 3 (3) 5 (5) 7 (7) rows.

Now increases are made to the neck, as follows:

**Row 1\_** (RS) work to 2 sts before the end of the row, **MIR**, edge st

**Row 2\_** (WS) work the whole row

**Rows 3-6\_** Repeat **rows 1\_** and **2\_** 2 times

**Row 7\_** (RS) work 16 (16) 21 (21) 26 (26) sts, **cable**, work to 1 st before the end of the row, **MIR-P**, edge st

**Row 8\_** (WS) work all sts

**Row 9\_** (RS) work to 1 st before the end of the row, **MIR-P**, edge st

**Row 10\_** (WS) work the whole row.

You have now worked 5 increases = 36 (36) 41 (41) 46 (46) sts on the needle.

Do not break the yarn.

### **Front\_**

Now join the 2 shoulders for the front piece. Work across the right shoulder, cast on 20 (20) 20 (20) 20 (20) sts with backwards loop cast on in extension of the right shoulder, work across the left shoulder = 92 (92) 102 (102) 112 (112) sts.

Now the rib and cable sections will be established with the new sts. Work 1 WS row as follows:

Work back and forth to the new sts, p2, k2, p12, k2, p2, work the rest of the row.

Now work back and forth a total of 10 (10) 10 (10) 10 (10) rows.

Work 1 row with cables from the RS as follows: Work 16 (16) 21 (21) 26 (26) sts, **cable**, work 12 sts, **cable**, work 12 sts, **cable**, work the rest of the row.

Now work back and forth a total of 15 (15) 15 (15) 15 (15) rows.

Work 1 row with cables, as described above.

Now work back and forth a total of 7 (7) 7 (7) 7 (7) rows.

Now increases will be made for the armhole.

**Row 1\_** (RS) work 4 sts, **MIL**, work to 4 sts before the end of the row, **MIR**, work 4 sts.

**Row 2\_** (WS) work the whole row

**Row 3\_** (RS) work as **row 1\_**

**Row 4\_** (WS) work the whole row

**Row 5\_** (RS) work as **row 1\_**

**Row 6\_** (WS) work the whole row

**Row 7\_** (RS) work 4 sts, **MIL-P**, work to 4 sts before the end of the row, **MIR-P**, work 4 sts

**Row 8\_** (WS) work the whole row

**Row 9\_** (RS) work as **row 7\_**, at the same time make cables across the 3 panels with cables

**Row 10\_** (WS) work the whole row

You have now worked 10 increases = 102 (102) 112 (112) 122 (122) sts on the needle.

Do not break the yarn.

### **Body\_**

Now the front and back pieces are joined as follows: Work across the front piece, cast on 0 (5) 0 (5) 5 (10) sts with backwards loop method in extension of the front piece, work across the back piece, cast on 0 (4) 0 (4) 4 (4) sts with backwards loop method in extension of the back piece, insert marker for the BOR, cast on 0 (1) 0 (1) 1 (6) sts with backwards loop method = 205 (215) 225 (235) 255 (265) sts.

Now work 13 rnds. The edge st and the new sts are worked into the rib pattern (k3, p2).

Work 1 rnd with cables across the cable sections.

Continue in the rnd and work cables on every **16th rnd**.

Work until you have 6 (6) 6 (7) 7 (7) cables mid-front, then work 8 rnds. The piece should measure now approx. 45 (45) 46 (51) 52 (52) cm, measured mid-back.

Change to 4 mm needles and work 7 cm in twisted rib (k1tbl, p1). On the first rnd, the first 2 sts are worked as k2togtbl, to get an even number of sts for the rnd.

Work 2 rnds in double knitting as follows:

**Rnd 1\_** Work \* k1tbl, sl1pw wyif \* repeat from \* to \* the whole rnd.

**Rnd 2\_** Work \* sl1pw wyib, p1 \* , repeat from \* to \* the whole rnd.

Bind off with Italian bind off.

### **Neckline\_**

The neckline is worked in the rnd on 4 mm (40 cm) circular needles.

Pick 98 (98) 104 (104) 112 (112) sts up along the neckline. Start picking up sts on the left side of the neck on the RS. Sts are picked up in all sts around the neck.

Work 9 rnds in twisted rib (k1tbl, p1).

Work 2 rnds in double knitting as follows:

**Rnd 1\_** Work \* k1, sl1pw wyif \* repeat from \* to \* the whole rnd.

**Rnd 2\_** Work \* sl1pw wyib, p1 \*, repeat from \* to \* the whole rnd.

Work 8 rnds in twisted rib (k1tbl, p1).

Now the ribbing edge is folded down and knit to the inside while also binding sts off. Be careful to not twist the ribbing and bind off loosely so that the neckline does not become too tight.

\*Pick 1 st up from the edge where the sts were picked up and place it onto the left needle and knit the new st together with the first st on the needle, k1, pull the other st on the right needle over the just-knitted st \*. Repeat from \* to \* the whole rnd.

### **Sleeve\_**

With 4.5 mm (40 cm) circular needles, pick sts up from the RS along the armhole. Insert 1 marker at the top of the armhole. Start picking sts up at the bottom of the armhole by picking up **in** the 2 (3) 2 (3) 3 (2) rib sts at the bottom of the armhole, then pick up 41 (43) 41 (43) 48 (46) sts along the edge to the marker at the top of the armhole, and then 41 (43) 41 (43) 48 (46) sts along the edge to the bottom of the armhole = 84 (89) 84 (89) 99 (94) sts.

**Sizes\_** XS (-) M (-) - (XXL) Insert 1 marker on each side of the 2 purl sts at the bottom of the armhole. The marker to the right is the BOR marker.

Work 1 rnd and establish the rib and cable pattern as follows:

\*p2, k3\* repeat from \* to \* until 8 sts before the marker at the top of the armhole, p2, k12 (cable section), work \*p2, k3\*, repeat from \* to \* until the BOR.

**Sizes\_** - (S) - (L) XL (-) Insert 1 marker on each side of the 3 knit sts at the bottom of the armhole. The marker to the right is the BOR.

Work 1 rnd and establish the rib and cable sections as follows:

\*k3, p2\*, repeat from \* to \* until 6 sts before the marker at the top of the armhole, k12 (cable section) p2, work \*k3, p2\*, repeat from \* to \* until BOR.

**All sizes\_** Break the yarn.

Now work short rows back and forth over the upper part of the sleeve to create more height for the sleeve cap. In the following section, work the sts as they show.

Slip sts 6 sts before the marker at the top, from the left needle to the right needle, without working them. Join new yarn and work as follows:

**Row 1\_** (RS) work 12 sts, **turn**

**Row 2\_** (WS) work to, and including, where new yarn was joined, work 5 sts, **turn**

**Row 3\_** (RS) work to the last turn, work the double st, work 5 sts, **turn**

**Row 4\_** (WS) work to the last turn, work the double st, work 5 sts, **turn**.

Repeat **rows 3\_** and **4\_** for 3 (3) 3 (3) 4 (4) more times.

Work to the BOR. You have now worked short rows across the sleeve. Remove the marker at the top of the sleeve.

Now decreases are worked on the inside and cables are worked on the outside of the sleeve.

The first decrease of the rnd is worked **knit-wise** if the other st after the marker is a knit-st, and **purl-wise** if the other st after the marker is a purl-st.

The second decreasing rnd is worked **knit-wise**, if the second last st before the BOR marker is a knit-st, and **purl-wise** if the second last st before the BOR marker is a purl-st.

The rnd with **knit-wise decreases** are worked as follows: work to the marker, slip marker, **k2tog**, work to 2 sts before BOR marker, **SSK**.

The rnd with the **purl-wise decreases** are worked as follows: work to the marker, slip marker, **p2tog**, work to 2 sts before BOR marker, **p2totgtbl**.

Work 3 rnds as the sts show.

Work 1 rnd with decreases as described above, as well as work cables in the cable section.

Afterwards, work decreases **every 4th rnd** 9 (9) 4 (4) 9 (9) times, and work cables in the cable section **every 16th rnd**. You have worked 20 (20) 10 (10) 20 (20) decreases = 64 (69) 74 (79) 79 (74) sts.

Continue in the rnd until you have 6 (6) 6 (6) 5 (5) cables for the sleeve, then work 8 rnds. The sleeve now measures approx. 37 (37) 37 (37) 32 (32) cm, measured from the outside of the sleeve.

*If you want extra sleeve length, continue up to, and including, the next cable, followed by 8 rnds.*

Change to 4 mm needles and work 9 cm in twisted rib (k1tbl, p1). On the first rnd for size - (S) - (L) XL (XXL) work the first 2 sts together tbl, to get an even number of sts.

Work 2 rnds in double knitting as follows:

**Rnd 1\_** Work \* k1tbl, sl1pw wyif \*, repeat from \* to \* the whole rnd.

**Rnd 2\_** Work \* sl1pw wyib, p1 \*, repeat from \* to \* the whole rnd.

Bind off with Italian bind off.

### **Assembly\_**

Weave in all ends.

Wash and block the sweater.
