



TULIPAN MARKET BAG

Design: Sidsel Sangild

Bring home tulips and apples in this beautiful market bag.

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Yarn: 4 skeins of Pimabomuld from Camarose (100 % cotton), 200 m/50 g (219 yds/1.76 ounces). Colour 3232.

Recommended hook: 2,5 mm

Gauge: You do not have to make a separate gauge swatch. Measure gauge after the 7th round as instructed.

Finished measurements: 40 cm wide at widest point (and very stretchy), 30 cm tall.

Special abbreviations:

F (FPdc) - front post double crochet. See step by step instructions on last page.

2Ftog over 2 F - 2 F together (decrease) made over 2 F. Yarn over, start a F around next st, but stop before the last 'yarn over, pull through', skip next st, start a F around next F, and stop at the same step. 3 loops remain on the hook. Yarn over, and pull through all 3 loops.

The pattern uses US terms.

PATTERN

Ch 28

Round 1: 3 dc in the 3rd ch from the hook, 1 dc in each of the next 24 ch, 6 dc in last ch, continue on the other side of the foundation chain: 1 dc in each of the next 24 ch, 3 dc in last ch, 1 sl st in the first dc (the skipped chs from the beginning do not count as a st) (now there are 60 dc).

Round 2: Ch 2 (does not count as a st), 2 F around each of the first 3 dc, 1 F around each of the next 24 dc, 2 F around each of the next 6 dc, 1 F around each

of the next 24 dc, 2 F around each of the last 3 dc, 1 sl st in the first F (72 F).

Round 3: Ch 2 (does not count as a st), *2F around next st, 1F around next st*, repeat from * to * 2 times more, 1 F around each of the next 24 sts, repeat from * to * 6 times, 1 F around each of the next 24 sts, repeat from * to * 3 times, 1 sl st in first F (now there are 84 F).

Round 4: Ch 2 (does not count as a st), *1F around each of the next 2 sts, 2F around next st*, repeat from * to * 2 times more, 1F around each of the next 24 sts, repeat from * to * 6 times, 1F around each of the next 24 sts, repeat from * to * 3 times, 1 sl st in first F (now there are 96 F).

Round 5: Ch 2 (does not count as a st), *2F around next st, 1F around each of the next 3 sts*, repeat from * to * 2 times more, 1F around each of the next 24 sts, repeat from * to * 6 times, 1F around each of the next 24 sts, repeat from * to * 3 times, 1 sl st in first F (now there are 108 F).


Round 6: Ch 2 (does not count as a st), *1F around each of the next 4 sts, 2F around next st*, repeat from * to * 2 times more, 1F around each of the next 24 sts, repeat from * to * 6 times, 1F around each of the next 24 sts, repeat from * to * 3 times, 1 sl st in first F (now there are 120 F).

Note that there are only 10 increases made in round 7 - not 12 as in previous rounds.

Round 7: Ch 2 (does not count as a st), *2F around next st, 1F around each of

the next 5 sts*, repeat from * to * 2 times more, 1F around each of the next 30 sts, repeat from * to * 5 times, 1F around each of the next 30 sts, repeat from * to * 2 times, 1 sl st in first F (now there are 130 F).

The bottom of the bag is now complete. Check that it measures approximately 20 cm (8 in) in length. If it is longer, your bag will be bigger. If it is shorter your bag will be smaller. Change to a smaller/larger hook if your gauge does not match.



- o ch - chain
- sl st - slip stitch
- ⌋ F - front post double crochet
- ⌋ 2Ftog over 2F - 2 F together over 2F

From this point on I write e.g. "6F", when I mean "1F around each of the next 6 F" - to make the pattern easier to read.

Each round begins with 2 ch and ends with 1 sl st in the first F. The instructions between * and * are repeated to the end of the round.

Round 8: *10F, ch 1*, (now there are 130 F + 13 ch spaces).

Round 9: *2F, ch 1, 8F, ch 1*.

(now there are 130 F + 26 ch spaces).

Round 10: *2F, ch 2, 8F, ch 1*.

Round 11: *2F, ch 2, 8F, ch 2*.

Round 12: *2F, ch 2, 4F, ch 1, 4F, ch 2*.

Round 13: *1F, ch 1, 1F, ch 2, 4F, ch 1, 4F, ch 2*.

Round 14: *1F, ch 1, 1F, ch 2, 2F around next st, 3F, ch 1, 3F, 2F around next st, ch 2*.

Round 15: *1F, ch 1, 1F, ch 2, 5F, ch 1, 5F, ch 2*.

The chart shows rounds 7-27. The repeated stitches on each round are shown in black. The beginning and end of the round is shown in blue.

Round 16: *1F, ch 3, 1F, ch 2, 4F, 2Ftog over the next 2 F (skip ch), 4F, ch 2*.

Round 17: *1F, ch 5, 1F, ch 2, 3 F, 2Ftog over the next 2 F (skip 2Ftog from previous round), 3F, ch 2*.

Round 18: *2F around next st, ch 5, 2F around next st, ch 2, 2 F, 2Ftog over the next 2 F (skip 2Ftog from previous round), 2F, ch 2*.

Round 19: *2F around next st, 1F, ch 5, 1F, 2F around next st, ch 2, 1F, 2Ftog over the next 2 F (skip 2Ftog from previous round), 1F, ch 2*.

Round 20: *2F around next st, 2F, ch 3, 2F, 2F around next st, ch 2, 1F, ch 1, skip 2Ftog, 1F, ch 2*.

Round 21: *2F around next st, 3F, ch 1, 3F, 2F around next st, ch 2, 1F, ch 1, 1F, ch 2*.

Round 22: *5F, ch 1, 5F, ch 2, 1F, ch 1, 1F, ch 2*.

Round 23: *4F, 2Ftog over the next 2 F (skip ch), 4F, ch 2, 1F, ch 3, 1F, ch 2*.

Round 24: *3F, 2Ftog over the next 2 F (skip 2Ftog from previous round), 3F, ch 2, 1F, ch 5, 1F, ch 2*.

Round 25: *2F, 2Ftog over the next 2 F (skip 2Ftog from previous round), 2F, ch 2, 2F around next st, ch 5, 2F around next st, ch 2*.

Round 26: *1F, 2Ftog over the next 2 F (skip 2Ftog from previous round), 1F, ch 2, 2F around next st, 1F, ch 5, 1F, 2F around next st, ch 2*.

Round 27: *1F, ch 1, skip 2Ftog, 1F, ch 2, 2F around next st, 2F, ch 3, 2F, 2F around next st, ch 2*.

Repeat rounds 14-27 once.

Repeat rounds 14-22 once.

Last rounds

Round 1: *5F, skip ch, 5F, ch 2, 1F, skip ch, 1F, ch 2*.

Round 2: * 10F, ch 2, 2F, ch 2*.

Round 3: * 10F, ch 1, 2F, ch 1*.

Round 4: *1F around each F*.

Round 5: *2Ftog over the next 2 sts, 1F around each of the next 10 m*.

Round 6: 1F around each F.

Round 7: *1F around each of the next 9 m, 2Ftog over the next 2 sts*.

Round 8: 1F around each F.

Repeat round 8 once.

Now there are 130 sts.

Fasten off.

Straps

Place stitch markers in stitch no. 11, 55, 75 and 120.

Join yarn in stich no. 55, ch 130, make 1 sc in stitch no. 11, continue making sc into the stitches between no. 11 and 55 and into each ch. Continue making sc in a spiral 3 rounds more.

Join yarn in stitch no. 120, ch 130, make 1 sc in stitch no. 75, continue making sc into the stitches between no. 75 and 120 and into each ch of the chain. Continue making sc in a spiral 3 rounds more.

Join yarn in one of the unworked stitches between the straps. Make 1 sc in each st along the edge and 1 sc in the back of each ch of the strap. Continue making sc in a spiral 3 rounds more.

Fasten off and weave in ends.

Wash the bag and let it dry flat.

front post double crochet

* front post double crochet (F) makes beautiful vertical lines in the work.



Pull at the sides so you can see the post of each stitch. Post stitches are made around the post of the stitch and not into the loops at the top.



Yarn over, and insert the hook from the front under the post of next stitch.



Yarn over, and pull yarn through. Now you have 3 loops on the hook. Yarn over, and pull yarn through 2 loops, yarn over, and pull yarn through 2 loops. The first F is done.



The FPdc forms vertical columns on the right side of the fabric.


