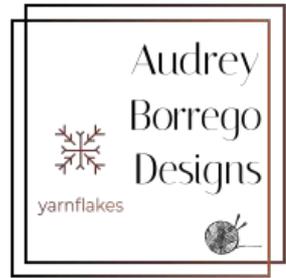


Urraca



Notes

Urraca is a comfortable sweater blending the structure of set in shoulders and a henley neck with ease and very voluminous sleeves. Worked from the top down with small cable details and a double knitted collar, it's a simple project for an oversized cocoon style garment. The pattern includes video tutorials for the henley buttonbands and collar.

Yarn :

You will need :

955 (**1060** / 1180 / **1250** / 1325), **1450** (1580 / **1690** / 1780 / **1850**) meters
1045 (**1160** / 1290 / **1370** / 1450), **1585** (1730 / **1850** / 1950 / **2025**) yards
of DK weight yarn.

The sample is knit with Katia Merino 100% (102 m – 112 yds / 50 g) in 501.

Needles :

Main Fabric : 4 mm (US 6) circular needles with appropriate length to knit in the round and magic loop or DPNs.

Ribbing : 3.5 mm (US 4) circular needles with appropriate length to knit in the round and magic loop or DPNs.

or size required to get gauge

Gauge :

20 sts x 30 rows / rnds per 10 cm – 4" with main needles in stockinette after blocking

Note that a different row gauge will affect the upper body shaping.

Notions :

Stitch markers, locking stitch markers, tapestry needle and scissors

Scrap yarn to place sts on hold

Cable needle (optional)

4 buttons (sample size 18 mm – ¾")

Row counter recommended

Techniques used :

Top down set-in sleeves sweater

Upper body worked flat

Shoulders shaped with German short rows

Round neck shaping with simple increases

Henley neck

Low and loose armholes, shaped with simple increases

Straight Body worked in the round

Sleeve caps worked with Wrap & Turn short rows

Voluminous sleeves tapered with simple decreases

3/1 ribbed Hem, Cuffs & Henley buttonbands

Decorative 1/2 cables along the henley and on top of the hem

Double knitted collar

Picking up sts


German Twisted, Backwards Loop and Knitted Cast on

Basic and Italian Bind-off

Optional German short rows bust darts (based on cup size)

Pattern includes written instructions

Sizes : 1 (2 / 3 / 4 / 5), 6 (7 / 8 / 9 / 10) All measurements are those of the finished sweater.
 Choose a size with 5 to 15 cm – 2 to 6" positive ease at bust.
 Shown in size 3 on a 95 cm – 37 1/2" bust and a 35 cm – 13 3/4" upper arm.

Abbreviations :

- CO : cast-on
- st(s) : stitch(es) / rnd(s) : round(s)
- BOR : beginning of round
- RS : right side / WS : wrong side
- m : marker / pm : place marker / sm : slip marker / rm : remove marker
- inc : increase / dec : decrease
- k : knit stitch / p : purl stitch
- sl1wyif : slip the st purlwise with yarn in front
- m1L : make 1 left, lift the bar between the stitches onto the left needle from front to back, knit through the back loop (1 inc)
- m1R : make 1 right, lift the bar between the stitches onto the left needle from back to front, knit through the front loop (1 inc)
- 1/2 RC : 1 over 2 Right Cross, slip the next 2 sts onto a cable needle and hold in back, k1, then k2 from cable needle
- 1/2 LC : 1 over 2 Left Cross, slip the next st onto a cable needle and hold in front, k2, then k1 from cable needle
- k2tog : knit the next 2 sts together (1 dec)
- p2tog : purl the next 2 sts together (1 dec)
- ssk : slip the next 2 sts knitwise separately then knit them together through their back loop (1 dec)
- yo : yarn over (1 inc)
- DS : double stitch for German short rows (counts as only 1 st)
- w&t : wrap and turn short row, bring yarn to front, slip the next st purlwise, bring yarn to back, slip the st back to the left needle and turn work
- *-* : repeat instructions between asterisks

Notes :

Left and Right parts refer to the sweater when worn.

Back Right Shoulder

With larger needles, CO 13 (**14** / 14 / **15** / 16), **17** (18 / **19** / 20 / **21**) sts using the [German Twisted Cast-on](#).

set-up row (WS) : purl

Shoulder shaping :

You will work a few short rows to create a soft slope on the shoulders.

Here is a [helpful tutorial](#) on how to make Double Stitches.

(German short-rows tutorial by Very Pink Knits)

short row 1 (RS) : knit to last 2 sts, turn

short row 2 (WS) : DS, purl to end

short row 3 : knit to 3 (**3** / 3 / **4** / 4), **5** (5 / **6** / 6 / 7) sts before DS, turn

Work short rows 2-3 a total of 2 times, then work short row 2 once more.

next row (RS) : knit to end, closing the short rows by knitting the DS normally as one st

Neck shaping :

You will work a few increases on the neck edge to shape the back neck curve.

row 1 (WS) : purl

row 2 (RS) : k2, m1L, k1, m1L, knit to end (2 inc)

Work rows 1-2 a total of 3 times, then row 1 once more.

19 (**20** / 20 / **21** / 22), **23** (24 / **25** / 26 / **27**) sts

Cut yarn and place sts on hold.

Back Left Shoulder

With larger needles, CO 13 (**14** / 14 / **15** / 16), **17** (18 / **19** / 20 / **21**) sts using the [German Twisted Cast-on](#).

set-up row (WS) : purl

set-up row 2 (RS) : knit

Shoulder shaping :

short row 1 (WS) : purl to last 2 sts, turn

short row 2 (RS) : DS, knit to end

short row 3 : purl to 3 (**3** / 3 / **4** / 4), **5** (5 / **6** / 6 / 7) sts before DS, turn

Work short rows 2-3 a total of 2 times, then work short row 2 once more.

next row (WS) : purl to end, closing the short rows by purling the DS normally as one st

Neck shaping :

row 1 (RS) : knit to last 3 sts, m1R, k1, m1R, k2 (2 inc)

row 2 (WS) : purl

Work rows 1-2 a total of 3 times.

19 (**20** / 20 / **21** / 22), **23** (24 / **25** / 26 / **27**) sts

Joining Back Shoulders

You will join the two back shoulders, casting on new sts in between for the back neck using a [backwards loop cast-on](#).

(Backwards Loop Cast-on tutorial by Very Pink Knits)

next row (RS) : knit to end of Back Left Shoulder sts, CO 25 (**27** / 29 / **29** / 29), **29** (31 / **33** / 35 / **37**) sts.

Place Back Right Shoulder sts back on the left needle with RS facing, joining them to the new sts and knit to end.

63 (**67** / 69 / **71** / 73), **75** (79 / **83** / 87 / **89**) back sts

Upper Back

back row 1 (WS) : purl

back row 2 (RS) : knit

Work back rows 1-2 until the upper back measures 11 (**10** / 11 / **11.5** / 11.5), **10.5** (9.5 / **10** / 10 / **10.5**) cm – 4 ¹/₄ (**4** / 4 ¹/₄ / 4 ¹/₂ / 4 ¹/₂), **4** (3 ³/₄ / **4** / 4 / **4**)" from shoulder cast-on, measuring along the armhole edge and ending after a WS row.

Attach two markers here on each edge st to easily spot the beginning of the armhole shaping to match it later on the front and during sleeve cap shaping.

Back Armhole Shaping :

You will increase sts on both sides of the upper back to shape the armhole curve.

row 1 (RS) : k2, m1L, knit to last 2 sts, m1R, k2 (2 inc)

row 2 (WS) : purl

row 3 : knit

row 4 : purl

Work rows 1 to 4 a total of 7 (9 / 9 / 7 / 5), 5 (3 / 3 / 2 / 2) times.

77 (85 / 87 / 85 / 83), 85 (85 / 89 / 90 / 95) back sts

Sizes 1 to 3: You have completed the armhole shaping. Cut yarn, place sts on hold and move on to Front Left Shoulder section.

Sizes 4 to 10 ONLY :

row 5 (RS) : k2, m1L, knit to last 2 sts, m1R, k2 (2 inc)

row 6 (WS) : purl

Work rows 5-6 a total of - (- / - / 5 / 10), 12 (17 / 18 / 20 / 21) times.

- (- / - / 95 / 103), 109 (119 / 125 / 129 / 135) back sts

Cut yarn and place sts on hold.

ALL SIZES RESUME

Front Left Shoulder

With larger needles and RS facing pick up and knit 13 (14 / 14 / 15 / 16), 17 (18 / 19 / 20 / 21) sts from the Back Left Shoulder cast-on edge.

set-up row (WS) : purl

Shoulder shaping :

short row 1 (RS) : knit to last 2 sts, turn

short row 2 (WS) : DS, purl to end

short row 3 : knit to 3 (3 / 3 / 4 / 4), 5 (5 / 6 / 6 / 7) sts before DS, turn

Work short rows 2-3 a total of 2 times, then work short row 2 once more.

next row (RS) : knit to end, closing the short rows by knitting the DS normally as one st

Neck shaping :

You will first shape a rounded neckline for the collar with increases on the neck edge.

row 1 (WS) : purl

row 2 (RS) : knit

row 3 : purl

row 4 : k2, m1L, knit to end (1 inc)

Work rows 1 to 4 a total of 3 times.

16 (17 / 17 / 18 / 19), 20 (21 / 22 / 23 / 24) sts

row 5 (WS) : purl

row 6 (RS) : k2, m1L, knit to end (1 inc)

Work rows 5-6 a total of 2 (3 / 3 / 3 / 3), 3 (3 / 4 / 4 / 4) times.

18 (20 / 20 / 21 / 22), 23 (24 / 26 / 27 / 28) sts

row 7 (WS) : purl

row 8 (RS) : k2, m1L, k1, m1L, knit to end (2 inc)

Work rows 7-8 a total of 1 (1 / 2 / 2 / 2), 2 (2 / 2 / 2 / 2) times.

20 (22 / 24 / 25 / 26), 27 (28 / 30 / 31 / 32) sts

You will finish the neckline by casting on extra sts at the edge.

To cast-on sts at the edges of the rows you can use the [knitted cast-on](#). Remember to do it knitwise or purlwise according to the side you're on.

(Knitted Cast-on Tutorial by Very Pink Knits)

row 9 (WS) : purl

row 10 (RS) : CO 5 (5 / 5 / 6 / 6), 7 (8 / 10 / 11 / 12) sts knitwise, knit to end
25 (27 / 29 / 31 / 32), 34 (36 / 40 / 42 / 44) sts

Front Left Henley

You will now work straight to the henley depth, with a cable along the neck edge, and incorporate the armhole shaping on the sides.

set-up row (WS) : purl to last 6 sts, pm, p3, pm, p3

You will work a small cable in between the markers just placed.

row 1 (RS) : k3, sm, 1/2 RC, sm, knit to end

row 2 (WS) : purl to m, sm, p3, sm, p3

Work rows 1-2 until the Front Left Shoulder's length matches the Upper Back's before armhole shaping, using the marker placed on the armhole edge as a guide, 11 (10 / 11 / 11.5 / 11.5), 10.5 (9.5 / 10 / 10 / 10.5) cm – 4 1/4 (4 / 4 1/4 / 4 1/2 / 4 1/2), 4 (3 3/4 / 4 / 4 / 4)" from shoulder cast-on, ending after a WS row.

Note that sizes 8 to 10 should already be close or exactly at that measurement.

Count the number of rows worked to replicate them on the other front.

Attach a marker on the armhole edge st.

Front Left Armhole Shaping Part 1 :

You will start the armhole shaping on the Front Left until desired henley depth.

row 1 (RS) : k3, sm, 1/2 RC, sm, knit to last 2 sts, m1R, k2 (1 inc)

row 2 (WS) : purl to m, sm, p3, sm, p3

row 3 : k3, sm, 1/2 RC, sm, knit to end

row 4 : purl to m, sm, p3, sm, p3

Work rows 1 to 4 a total of 5 (6 / 6 / 6 / 5), 5 (3 / 3 / 2 / 2) times.

30 (33 / 35 / 37 / 37), 39 (39 / 43 / 44 / 46) sts

Sizes 1 to 4 : You have completed part 1 of the armhole shaping. Cut yarn, place sts on hold and move on to Front Right Shoulder section.

Sizes 5 to 10 ONLY :

row 5 (RS) : k3, sm, 1/2 RC, sm, knit to last 2 sts, m1R, k2 (1 inc)

row 6 (WS) : purl to m, sm, p3, sm, p3

Work rows 5-6 a total of - (- / - / - / 2), 4 (8 / 9 / 11 / 11) times.

- (- / - / - / 39), 43 (47 / 52 / 55 / 57) sts

Cut yarn and place sts on hold.

ALL SIZES RESUME

Front Right Shoulder

With larger needles and RS facing pick up and knit 13 (14 / 14 / 15 / 16), 17 (18 / 19 / 20 / 21) sts from the Back Right Shoulder cast-on edge.

set-up row (WS) : purl

set-up row 2 (RS) : knit

Shoulder shaping :

short row 1 (WS) : purl to last 2 sts, turn

short row 2 (RS) : DS, knit to end

short row 3 : purl to 3 (3 / 3 / 4 / 4), 5 (5 / 6 / 6 / 7) sts before DS, turn

Work short rows 2-3 a total of 2 times, then work short row 2 once more.

next row (WS) : purl to end, closing the short rows by purling the DS normally as one st

next row (RS) : knit

Neck shaping :

row 1 (WS) : purl

row 2 (RS) : knit to last 2 sts, m1R, k2 (1 inc)

row 3 : purl

row 4 : knit

Work rows 1 to 4 a total of 2 times.

15 (16 / 16 / 17 / 18), 19 (20 / 21 / 22 / 23) sts

row 5 (WS) : purl
row 6 (RS) : knit to last 2 sts, m1R, k2 (1 inc)

Work rows 5-6 a total of 3 (4 / 4 / 4 / 4), 4 (4 / 5 / 5 / 5) times.
18 (20 / 20 / 21 / 22), 23 (24 / 26 / 27 / 28) sts

row 7 (WS) : purl
row 8 (RS) : knit to last 3 sts, m1R, k1, m1R, k2 (2 inc)

Work rows 7-8 a total of 1 (1 / 2 / 2 / 2), 2 (2 / 2 / 2 / 2) times, then row 7 once more.
20 (22 / 24 / 25 / 26), 27 (28 / 30 / 31 / 32) sts

row 9 (RS) : knit
row 10 (WS) : CO 5 (5 / 5 / 6 / 6), 7 (8 / 10 / 11 / 12) sts using the [knitted cast-on](#) purlwise, p3, pm, p3, pm, purl to end
25 (27 / 29 / 31 / 32), 34 (36 / 40 / 42 / 44) sts

Front Right Henley

row 1 (RS) : knit to m, sm, 1/2 LC, sm, k3
row 2 (WS) : p3, sm, p3 sm, purl to end

Work rows 1-2 like you did for the Front Left Henley before armhole shaping, ending after a WS row.

Attach a marker on the armhole edge st.

Front Right Armhole Shaping Part 1 :

row 1 (RS) : k2, m1L, knit to m, sm, 1/2 LC, sm, k3 (1 inc)
row 2 (WS) : p3, sm, p3, sm, purl to end
row 3 : knit to m, sm, 1/2 LC, sm, k3
row 4 : p3, sm, p3, sm, purl to end

Work rows 1 to 4 a total of 5 (6 / 6 / 6 / 5), 5 (3 / 3 / 2 / 2) times.
30 (33 / 35 / 37 / 37), 39 (39 / 43 / 44 / 46) sts

Sizes 1 to 4 : You have completed part 1 of the armhole shaping, move on to Joining Fronts section.

Sizes 5 to 10 ONLY :

row 5 (RS) : k2, m1L, knit to m, sm, 1/2 LC, sm, k3 (1 inc)
row 6 (WS) : p3, sm, p3, sm, purl to end

Work rows 5-6 a total of - (- / - / - / 2), 4 (8 / 9 / 11 / 11) times.
- (- / - / - / 39), 43 (47 / 52 / 55 / 57) sts

ALL SIZES RESUME

Joining Fronts

You will join the two front shoulders, casting on new sts in between for the bottom of the henley using a [backwards loop cast-on](#) and work one last cable before removing the markers.

next row (RS) : k2, m1L, knit to m, rm, 1/2 LC, rm knit to end of Front Right Shoulder sts, CO 13 sts
Place Front Left Shoulder sts back on the left needle with RS facing, joining them to the new sts and knit to m, rm, 1/2 RC, rm, knit to last 2 sts, m1R, k2

75 (81 / 85 / 89 / 93), 101 (109 / 119 / 125 / 129) front sts

next row (WS) : purl

Upper Front

You will continue in stockinette and resume the armhole shaping on both sides of the upper front.

Front Armhole Shaping Part 2 :

Sizes 1 to 3 ONLY :

row 1 (RS) : knit

row 2 (WS) : purl

row 3 : k2, m1L, knit to last 2 sts, m1R, k2 (2 inc)

row 4 : purl

Work rows 1 to 4 a total of 1 (2 / 2 / - / -), ... times, then rows 1-2 once more.

77 (85 / 89 / - / -), ...front sts

Sizes 1 to 3 : You have completed the armhole shaping. Move on to Joining Body section.

Size 4 ONLY :

Work 2 rows in stockinette with no inc.

Sizes 4 to 10 ONLY :

row 5 (RS) : k2, m1L, knit to last 2 sts, m1R, k2 (2 inc)

row 6 (WS) : purl

Work rows 5-6 a total of - (- / - / 5 / 7), 7 (8 / 8 / 9) times.

- (- / - / 99 / 107), 115 (125 / 135 / 141 / 147) front sts

ALL SIZES RESUME

Joining Body

You will join the front and the back, casting on new sts for each underarm using a [backwards loop cast-on](#).

next row (RS) : knit to end of Upper Front sts, **pm** for side, CO 8 (10 / 17 / 18 / 20), 23 (23 / 25 / 30 / 34) sts

Place Upper Back sts back on the left needle with RS facing, joining them to the new sts and knit to end.

CO 8 (10 / 17 / 18 / 20), 23 (23 / 25 / 30 / 34), join to work in the rnd and **pm** for BOR.

170 (190 / 210 / 230 / 250), 270 (290 / 310 / 330 / 350) body sts

Body

Bust darts

If you wear a cup size greater than B or your full bust measurement is more than 8 cm – 3 ¼" larger than your upper chest measurement, consider adding bust darts on the body. See instructions on page 13.

Work in stockinette, knitting every rnd, until the body measures about 20 cm – 7 ¾" from the underarm or 12 cm – 4 ¾" less than desired length.

Hem :

You will adjust the stitch count to prepare for the ribbing.

Switch to smaller needles.

Odd numbered Sizes ONLY :

set-up rnd : k2tog, knit to side m, rm, k2tog, knit to end (2 dec)

168 (- / 208 / - / 248), - (288 / - / 328 / -) body sts

Even numbered Sizes ONLY :

set-up rnd : m1L, knit to side m, rm, m1L, knit to end (2 inc)

- (192 / - / 232 / -), 272 (- / 312 / - / 352) body sts

You will first work 2 cables on every other knitted section of the ribbing, then work a normal 3/1 ribbing.

hem rnd 1 : *k3, p1* to end

hem rnd 2 : *k3, p1, 1/2 LC, p1* to end

Work hem rnds 1-2 a total of 2 times, then work only hem rnd 1 until the hem measures 12 cm – 4 ¾" or desired length.

Loosely bind-off all sts in pattern.

Sleeves

You will pick up sts around the armholes with a smaller needle for a neater transition.

Sizes 3, 6, 7 and 8 : as your underarm cast-on is an odd number of sts, you will start 1 st to the left of the center st.

Using smaller needles, RS facing, starting at the center of the underarm cast-on, pick up and knit

2 (**3** / 6 / 7 / 8), **9** (9 / **10** / 13 / **15**) sts from the underarm cast-on,

12 (**14** / 14 / **15** / 15), **15** (19 / **20** / 20 / **21**) sts up to the first armhole shaping marker,

26 (**28** / 30 / **31** / 32), **32** (28 / **29** / 29 / **30**) sts up to the shoulder join,

26 (**28** / 30 / **31** / 32), **32** (28 / **29** / 29 / **30**) sts down to the second armhole shaping marker,

12 (**14** / 14 / **15** / 15), **15** (19 / **20** / 20 / **21**) sts down to the underarm,

2 (**3** / 7 / 7 / 8), **10** (10 / **11** / 13 / **15**) sts from the rest of the underarm cast-on.

Join to work in the round and **pm** for BOR.
80 (**90** / 101 / **106** / 110), **113** (113 / **119** / 124 / **132**) sts

Sleeve Cap Shaping :

You will work short rows to shape the sleeve cap using [wrap & turn short rows](#). You will be working along the armhole shaping lines, using the markers attached on the edge sts previously as starting points. You will not need to pick up the wrap when closing the short rows as they sit on the shoulder line.

(Knitting Help : Wrap & Turn by Very Pink Knits)

Switch to larger needles.

short row 1 (RS) : knit to the second armhole shaping marker, w&t

short row 2 (WS) : purl to the first armhole shaping marker, w&t

short row 3 : knit to last wrapped st, knit wrapped st without picking up its wrap, w&t

short row 4 : purl to last wrapped st, purl wrapped st without picking up its wrap, w&t

Work short rows 3-4 until you reach the last 2 (**3** / 6 / 7 / 8), **9** (9 / **10** / 13 / **15**) sts on the WS row. You have worked short rows along the armhole shaping, stopping just at the underarm sts corner.

Sizes 1, 2, 4, 5, 9 and 10 ONLY :
next row (RS) : knit to BOR

Sizes 3, 6, 7 and 8 ONLY :

next row (RS) : knit to 3 sts before BOR, ssk, k1 (1 dec)

- (- / 100 / - / -), **112** (112 / **118** / - / -) sts

ALL SIZES RESUME

You will now resume working in the round.

Work in stockinette, knitting every rnd, until the sleeve measures 2 cm – ¾" from the underarm.

dec rnd : k1, k2tog, knit to last 3 sts, ssk, k1 (2 dec)

Continue as established, working the dec rnd every 6 (**4** / 4 / **4** / 3), **3** (3 / **3** / 3 / **3**) rounds,

13 (**16** / 17 / **20** / 24), **25** (25 / **25** / 25 / **25**) more times.

52 (**56** / 64 / **64** / 60), **60** (60 / **66** / 72 / **80**) sts

Continue in stockinette without decreases until the sleeve measures about 34 cm- 13 ½" from the underarm or 6 cm – 2 ¼" less than desired sleeve length.

Cuff :

Switch to smaller needles.

Sizes 1, 2, 5, 6 and 7 ONLY :

set-up rnd : knit

Sizes 3, 4, 8, 9 and 10 ONLY :

set-up rnd : *k- (- / 6 / **6** / -), - (- / **31** / 7 / **3**), k2tog* to end

- (- / 56 / **56** / -), - (- / **64** / 64 / **64**) sts

ALL SIZES RESUME

cuff rnd : *k3, p1* to end

Work the cuff rnd until the cuff measures 6 cm- 2 1/4" or desired length.
Loosely bind-off all sts in pattern.

Repeat for second sleeve.

Note : if you do not want the collar gap on top of the buttonbands, work the collar first. Then, when picking up for the buttonbands, go up along the collar edges as well.

Henley Buttonbands

You will pick up sts along the henley vertical and bottom edges to work a ribbed buttonband on both sides.

Left Buttonband :

With smaller needles, RS facing and starting at the top of the left henley, where you casted on sts on the neckline, pick up and knit 2 out of 3 sts along the vertical edge until you reach the bottom of the henley.

Then, look at the WS of the work to pick up and knit 13 sts from the purl bumps below the sts you casted on at the bottom of the henley.

You will now work the buttonband back and forth on those 13 sts, attaching it to the front edge as you go using the picked up sts.

henley row 1 (WS) : sl1wyif, k1, (p3, k1) x 2, p2, p2tog (using last buttonband st and 1 picked up st), turn

henley row 2 (RS) : k3, (p1, k3) x 2, sl1wyif, k1

Work henley rows 1-2 until you have decreased the last picked up st at the top of the left henley, ending with a WS row.

Loosely bind-off all sts in pattern.

Right Buttonband :

To pick up sts on this side, you will use a very long tail, leaving the working yarn at the beginning of the process to start working there later.

With smaller needles, RS facing and starting to the right of the henley bottom, using the tail of your yarn, pick up and knit 13 sts from the sts you casted on at the bottom of the henley. Make sure you don't catch the left buttonband and that you pick sts on top of it.

Then, pick up and knit 2 out of 3 sts along the vertical edge until the top of the right henley.

Place 4 markers evenly on the sts picked up along the vertical edge where you would like to place buttons.

Slide the sts to go back to the beginning of your pick up where you left the working yarn.

henley row 1 (RS) : sl1wyif, k1, (k3, p1) x 2, k2, k2tog (using last buttonband st and 1 picked up st), turn

henley row 2 (WS) : p3, (k1, p3) x 2, sl1wyif, k1

Work henley rows 1-2 until you reach a button marker, ending after a RS row.

You will create buttonholes by binding off sts and casting them back on the following row using a [backwards loop cast-on](#).

buttonhole row 1 (WS) : p3, k1, p1, bind-off 2 sts, p3, sl1wyif, k1

buttonhole row 2 (RS) : sl1wyif, k4, p1, CO 2 sts, k1, p1, k2, k2tog (using last buttonband st and 1 picked up st), turn

Resume working henley rows 1-2, repeating the buttonhole process when you reach a button marker, until you have decreased the last picked up st at the top of the right henley, ending with a RS row.

Loosely bind-off all sts in pattern.

Collar

You will pick up sts around the neckline, excluding the henley buttonbands, to work a double knitting collar.

With smaller needles, RS facing and starting at the right neckline edge, just after the right buttonband :

Pick up and knit 1 st from the buttonband bind-off (the leftest st).

Then pick up and knit 2 out of 3 sts around the neckline until the left neckline edge, just before the left buttonband.

Pick up and knit 1 st from the buttonband bind-off (the rightest st).

set-up row (WS) : *p1, yo* to 1 st before end, p1

collar row 1 (RS) : *k1, sl1wyif* to 1 st before end, k1

collar row 2 (WS) : *sl1wyif, k1* to 1 st before end, sl1wyif

Work collar rows 1-2 until the collar measures 3 cm – 1 ¼" or desired length, ending after a WS row.

Cut yarn, leaving a tail about 3 times the width of your collar, then bind-off the sts using an [Italian bind-off](#).

(How to do an Italian cast-off tutorial by Garnstudio Drops Design)

Finishing

Weave in all ends and gently block the sweater.

Sew buttons on the left henley buttonband in front of the buttonholes.

Bust darts instructions :

Work the body until it measures about 2 cm – ¾" from the underarm, or until you reach the fullest part of your bust.

CUP C AND D ONLY

Full bust measurement at least 8 cm – 3 ¼" more than upper chest measurement.

short row 1 (RS) : knit to 1 st before side m, turn

short row 2 (WS) : DS, purl to 1 st before BOR, turn

short row 3 : DS, knit to 3 (4 / 4 / 5 / 5), 6 (6 / 7 / 7 / 8) sts before last DS, turn

short row 4 : DS, purl to 3 (4 / 4 / 5 / 5), 6 (6 / 7 / 7 / 8) sts before last DS, turn

Work short rows 3-4 a total of 3 times.

short row 9 (RS) : DS, knit to end, closing the short-rows by knitting the DS normally as one st

CUP E AND F ONLY

Full bust measurement at least 12 cm – 4 ¾" more than upper chest measurement.

short row 1 (RS) : knit to 1 st before side m, turn

short row 2 (WS) : DS, purl to 1 st before BOR, turn

short row 3 : DS, knit to 2 (3 / 3 / 4 / 4), 5 (5 / 6 / 6 / 7) sts before last DS, turn

short row 4 : DS, purl to 2 (3 / 3 / 4 / 4), 5 (5 / 6 / 6 / 7) sts before last DS, turn

Work short-rows 3-4 a total of 4 times.

short row 11 (RS) : DS, knit to end, closing the short-rows by knitting the DS normally as one st

CUP G AND H ONLY

Full bust measurement at least 16 cm – 6 ¼" more than upper chest measurement.

short row 1 (RS) : knit to 1 st before side m, turn

short row 2 (WS) : DS, purl to 1 st before BOR, turn

short row 3 : DS, knit to 2 (2 / 2 / 3 / 3), 4 (4 / 5 / 5 / 6) sts before last DS, turn

Short row 4 : DS, purl to 2 (2 / 2 / 3 / 3), 4 (4 / 5 / 5 / 6) sts before last DS, turn

Work short-rows 3-4 a total of 5 times.

short row 13 (RS) : DS, knit to end, closing the short-rows by knitting the DS normally as one st

ALL CUPS RESUME

When knitting the next rnd, close the remaining short rows by knitting the DS normally.

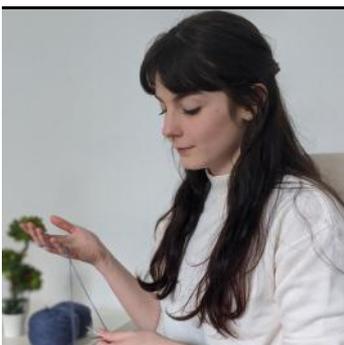
Continue with the body per main instructions.
