VIENNA SET



Sizes:	Mittens: Small (large) Scarf: One size
Measurements:	Mittens: 15 x 33 (17 x 33) cm [6 x 13 (6¾ x 13) inches] measured flat without the thumb Scarf: 18 x 170 cm [7 x 67 inches] measured flat
Gauge:	25 sts x 35 rows = 10 x 10 cm [4 x 4 inches] in stockinette stitch on 3.5 mm [US4] needles, or the required needle size to obtain gauge
Needles:	Mittens: 3.5 mm [US4] double-pointed needles or a 3.5 mm [US4] / 80 cm [32 inches] circular needle if using the <i>Magic Loop</i> technique Scarf: 3.5 mm [US4] / 40 cm [16 inches] circular needles
Materials:	Cashmere by Mondial (25 g = 115 m [126 yds]) or Cashmere Classic by Cardiff Cashmere (25 g = 112 m [120 yds]) or Cashmere 6/28 by Pascuali (25 g = 112 m [122 yds]) or Cashmere Premium by Lang Yarns (25 g = 115 m [126 yds]) For the mittens approx. 34 (36) g Cashmere Classic by Cardiff are needed For the scarf approx. 175 g are needed (both mittens and scarf are knitted in color 511)

PATTERN

The Vienna Set consists of long mittens worked in stockinette stitch and a scarf worked in stockinette stitch in the round. Both the mittens and the scarf have rolling edges. The mittens are worked from the wrist to the fingers, and are worked on double-pointed needles or on a long circular needle using the *Magic Loop* technique. The scarf is worked in the round on a circular needle, so the right side of the stockinette stitch is facing out on both sides (it is constructed as a hollow tube).

About decreases and increases

Decreases and increases are worked so they either slant to the right (k2tog and M1R) or to the left (skp and M1L). They are worked as follows:

K2tog: Knit 2 stitches together.

Skp: Slip 1 stitch knit-wise, k1, pass the slipped stitch over the knitted stitch.

M1R: Insert the left needle under the strand that runs between two stitches from back to front, then knit this strand.

M1L: Insert the left needle under the strand that runs between two stitches from front to back, then knit this strand through the back loop (twisted).

MITTENS

Cast on 38 (42) sts loosely with your preferred method on 3.5 mm [US4] double-pointed needles or on a 3.5 mm [US4] / 80 cm [32 inches] circular needle if you are using the *Magic Loop* technique.

Join in the round making sure that the cast-on edge is not twisted and place a marker for the beginning of the round. The beginning of the round is on the side where the little finger is.

Work 14 cm [5½ inches] in the round in stockinette stitch.

Place a marker after 19 (21) sts to mark where the increases for the thumb will be worked.

Now work increases for the thumb as follows:

Round 1: Knit to 1 stitch before marker, **M1R**, k1, slip marker, k1, **M1L**, knit to end of round.

Rounds 2, 3, and 4: Knit across.

Work Rounds 1-4 a total of 6 times. There are now a total of 50 (54) sts on the needles.

Place the thumb sts on a stitch holder to rest, while the rest of the mitten is finished.

Do so as follows from the beginning of the round:

Knit 18 (20) sts, place the next 14 sts on a stitch holder, cast on 2 sts in extension of the sts on the needle using the backward loop method, knit 18 (20) sts. There are now a total of 38 (42) sts on the needles.

Work 8 (8.5) cm [$3\frac{1}{4}$ ($3\frac{1}{2}$) inches] in the round in stockinette stitch, measured from where the thumb sts were placed on a stitch holder (or to the desired length – try the mitten on along the way to determine the optimal length; the decrease section at the top will measure approx. 2.5 cm [1 inch]).

Now work decreases for the top of the mitten. Place a marker after 19 (21) sts, so there is now a marker on each side of the mitten. Work as follows from the beginning of the round:

Round 1: K1, **skp**, knit to 3 sts before marker, **k2tog**, k1, slip marker, k1, **skp**, knit to 3 sts before beginning of round marker, **k2tog**, k1. (4 sts have been decreased)

Round 2: Knit across.

Work Rounds 1 and 2 a total of 5 times. There are now a total of 18 (22) sts on the needles.

Slip the remaining sts onto two double-pointed needles, dividing them at the two markers. Sew the two sets of stitches together using Kitchener stitch and weave in the ends discreetly on the WS.

Thumb

Place the resting sts back onto 3.5 mm [US4] double-pointed needles or on a 3.5 mm [US4] / 80 cm [32 inches] circular needle if you are using the *Magic Loop* technique.

Pick up and knit 2 sts in the 2 backward loop sts. There are now a total of 16 sts on the needles.

Work in the round in stockinette stitch until the thumb measures 4 (4.5) cm [$1\frac{1}{2}$ ($1\frac{3}{4}$) inches] (or to the desired length – try the mitten on to determine the optimal length for the thumb). Work decreases as follows:

Next round: * K2tog *, repeat from * to * to end of round. There are now a total of 8 sts on the needles.

Cut the working yarn and pull the end through the remaining 8 sts.

Work the second mitten the same way as the first.

SCARF

The scarf is worked in the round in stockinette stitch.

Cast on 90 sts on a 3.5 mm [US4] / 40 cm [16 inches] circular needle with your preferred method.

Join in the round making sure that the cast-on edge is not twisted and place a marker for the beginning of the round.

Work in the round in stockinette stitch until the work measures 170 cm [67 inches] or to the desired length.

Bind off all sts loosely.

Weave in all ends discreetly on the WS.

Abbreviations

k	knit
k2tog	decrease; knit two stitches together (right-leaning)
M1L	make one left, left-leaning increase; insert the left needle under the strand between the stitches from front to back, then knit this strand through the back loop (twisted)
M1R	make one right, right-leaning increase; insert the left needle under the strand between the stitches from back to front, then knit this strand
p	purl
RS	right side of your work
skp	decrease; slip 1 stitch knit-wise, k1, pass the slipped stitch over the knitted stitch (left-leaning)
st(s)	stitch(es)
WS	wrong side of your work
