

# Knitting for Olive



## Waffle Cardigan

**Sizes:** XS (S, M, L, XL, 2XL, 3XL, 4XL)

**Finished measurements:** Length from shoulder to edge: approx. 52 (54, 56, 58, 62, 66, 68, 70) cm [20½ (21¼, 22, 22¾, 24½, 26, 26¾, 27½ )]"; circumference at bust: approx. 95 (104, 114, 123, 132, 140, 149, 158) cm [(37¼ (41, 45, 48½, 52, 55, 58½ , 62¼)]" to fit following circumference of body: aprox. 76-85 (86-94, 95-104, 105-113, 114-122, 123-130, 131-139, 140-148) cm [30-33½ (33¾-37, 37½-41, 41¼-44½ , 44¾-48, 48½ -51¼, 51½ -54¾, 55-58¼)]"; sleeve length from underarm to cuff: approx. 45 (47, 46, 44, 42, 42, 42, 42) cm [17¼ (17½, 18, 17½, 17¼, 17¼, 17¼, 17¼)]"

**Yarn:** 3 strands together of Knitting for Olive Soft Silk Mohair (70% mohair, 30% silk; 225 m [246 yd] per 25 gr [0.88 oz]) lace yarn; 10 (11, 12, 12, 13, 15, 17, 19) balls

Sample is in size M, in Knitting for Olive Soft Silk Mohair, Mushroom Rose colorway

**Needles:** 4 mm / US6 and 5.5mm / US9 80 cm [32"] circular needles and double-pointed needles, in size to obtain gauge *and* a spare 4 mm / US6 80 cm [32"] circular needle

**Gauge:** 15.5 sts and 23 rows = 10 cm [4"] in Waffle stitch repeat after blocking (see Yoke Chart A, B or C) with 5.5 mm / US9 needle and 3 strands together

**Notions:** Stitch holders or waste yarn, stitch markers, tapestry needle, length of waste yarn for Provisional cast-on method, 6 buttons in 16 mm [¾"] diameter

### Constructions notes:

Our Waffle Cardigan, the sister pattern of our Waffle Sweater, is knit in pure silk mohair, soft and light, and features an easy-to-make allover eyelet ribbing design that is neatly finished at the hems with ribbed neckline and edges. The all-around relaxed ease at the body and sleeves enhances the cardigan's airy texture.

The Waffle cardigan is worked from the top down with 3 strands of our Soft Silk Mohair held together. You begin with the seamless double neckband, then work some short-row shaping to raise the back neckline. The buttonbands are worked at the same time as the fronts, and the raglan construction adds an element of design to the lace pattern. The length of the body and sleeves can be easily adjusted.

Waffle Cardigan stitch patterns are charted only.

The Waffle Cardigan is designed with a positive ease, meaning that the circumference of the cardigan is supposed to be bigger than the circumference of your body. When choosing which size to knit you can choose to use "circumference of body" as a reference. For example if your chest circumference is 98 cm [38½"], you should choose size M in order to obtain the positive ease intended for this design.

### Waffle chart notes:

The Waffle Yoke Charts (Chart A, B and C) show the interplay between the Waffle stitch pattern repeat ("Waffle stitch repeat" in charts) and the raglan shaping. The Waffle stitch pattern is easily memorized, and is repeated a different number of times depending on cardigan section and size. As stitches increase, you incrementally work additional repeats throughout the yoke as required.

Please note that buttonbands aren't charted.

When working back and forth, read odd-numbered RS rows from right to left, and even-numbered WS rows from left to right. When working in the round, read charts from right to left.

## **Cast on**

*Note: The seamless double Neckband is constructed in one step by using "Judy's magic cast-on" method. The "Provisional cast-on with waste yarn", requiring several steps, can be used as an alternative cast-on method*

### **Judy's magic cast-on**

*See Special Techniques*

With two 4 mm / US6 needles and 3 strands of Soft Silk Mohair held together, cast on 97 sts on each needle using the "Judy's magic cast-on" technique = 194 sts

Round 1: Using the Magic Loop method, k97 (outside of neckband), pm, k97 tbl (inside of neckband), pm for BOR

*Continue to Ribbed Neckband*

### **Provisional cast-on with waste yarn**

*See Special Techniques*

With 4 mm / US6 needle and 3 strands of Soft Silk Mohair held together, cast on 97 sts using "Provisional cast-on with waste yarn"

Set up: K to end of row (outside of neckband), pm, slide spare 4 mm / US6 needle alongside waste yarn, and pick up 97 live sts. Remove provisional waste yarn. With your primary needle, and using the Magic Loop method, k these 97 sts tbl (inside of neckband), pm for BOR = 194 sts

Remove spare needle

## **Ribbed Neckband**

*Note: Work neckband stitches in the round using Magic Loop method as established*

Round 1: \*(k1, p1) to 1 st before marker, k1, sm; repeat from \* one more time

Repeat Round 1 two more times

Buttonhole Round: (k1, p1) to 5 sts before marker, sl1k, k1, pssso, yo (= buttonhole), k1, p1, k1, sm, k1, p1, k1, yo (= buttonhole), k2tog, (p1, k1), to BOR marker

Work 3 rounds in rib pattern as established (purl yarnovers in first round)

Next round: Work in rib pattern as established to 1 st before BOR marker, slip last st to front of work (outside of neckband)

### **Finish neckband**

With spare 4 mm / US6 needle, and holding the working needles parallel in your left hand, with outside of neckband sts facing, work sts together as follows:

K1, remove BOR marker, k1, purl next st on front needle together with first st on back needle, \*k next st on front needle together with next st on back needle, p next st on front needle together with next st on back needle; repeat from \* to last st on front and back needles, k last st on front needle, remove marker, k last st on back needle = 99 sts

## **Yoke**

*Note: Work throughout 7-stitch buttonband and 8-stitch buttonhole band at beginning and end of each row as follows:*

*On RS: Sl1p wyib, (k1, p1) 3 times, (7 buttonband sts) work in pattern to last 8 sts, (k1, p1) three times, sl1p wyib, p1 (8 buttonhole band sts)*

*On WS: Sl1p wyib, (p1, k1) 3 times, p1 (8 buttonhole band sts), work in pattern to last 7 sts, (k1, p1) twice, k1, sl1p wyif, p1 (7 buttonband sts)*

Change to 5.5 mm / US9 needle

Set-up Row (WS): Sl1p wyib, (p1, k1) 3 times, p1 (8 buttonhole band sts), pm, \*k2, p1, k2, p1; repeat from \* 1 more time, pm, repeat from \* 3 times, pm, repeat from \* 4 times, pm, repeat from \* 3 times, pm, repeat from \* 2 times, pm, (k1, p1) twice, k1, sl1p wyif, p1 (7 buttonband sts)

### Short Rows and Raglan shaping

*Note: Work double stitches as 1 stitch (see Special techniques)*

Short Row 1 (inc row) (RS): Work 7 sts for buttonband as established, sm, \*k1, p2, yo, k1, p2; repeat from \* 1 more time, M1R, sm, k1, M1L, p2, yo, k1, p2; repeat from \* 2 times, M1R, sm, k1, M1L, p2, yo, k1, p2; repeat from \* 3 times, M1R, sm, k1, M1L, p2, yo, k1, p2; repeat from \* 2 times, M1L, sm, k1, M1L, p1, tw [20 sts increased]

Short Row 2 (WS): Ds, p2, sm, p1, \*work sts as they appear (knit the knits, and purl the purls and yarnovers) to 2 sts before next marker, p2, sm, p1; repeat from \* 2 more times, k1, tw

Short Row 3 (RS): Ds, k1, M1R, sm, k1, M1L, \*k1, p2, k2tog, yo, p2; repeat from \* 2 more times, k1, M1Rp, sm, k1, M1L; repeat from \* 4 times, k1, M1Rp, sm, k1, M1L; repeat from \* 3 times, k1, M1Rp, sm, k1, M1L, k1, p ds, p1, tw [8 sts increased]

Short Row 4 (WS): Ds, k1, p1, k1, p1, sm, \*k1, p1, work sts as they appear (knit the knits, and purl the purls and yarnovers) to 3 sts before next marker, p1, k1, p1, sm; repeat from \* 2 more times, k1, p1, k ds, k1, tw

Row 5 (RS): Ds, p1, k1, p1, M1R, sm, k1, M1L, p1, \*k1, p2, yo, sl1k, k1, pssso, p2; repeat from \* 2 more times, k1, p1, M1R, sm, k1, M1L, p1; repeat from \* 4 times, k1, p1, M1R, sm, k1, M1L, p1; repeat from \* 3 times, k1, p1, M1R, sm, k1, M1L, p1; \*k1, p1, p ds, yo, k1, p2, k1, p2, yo, k1, p2, sm, work 8 sts for buttonhole band as established [10 sts increased] = 137 sts

Next Row (WS): Work 8 sts for buttonhole band as established, sm, work sts as they appear to last marker, sm, work 7 sts for buttonband as established

### Waffle Yoke Charts (be sure to read the Waffle chart notes before continuing)

*Note: Work throughout a buttonhole row on the RS every 18 (18, 20, 20, 22, 24, 26, 26) rows from the first buttonhole in neckband, as follows:*

*Buttonhole Row (RS): Work in pattern to last 6 sts, sl1k, k1, pssso, yo (= buttonhole), work sts as they appear to end of row*

Set-up Row (RS): Work 7 sts for buttonband as established, sm, work Row 1 of Chart A to next marker, sm, \*work Row 1 of Chart B to next marker, sm; repeat from \* 2 more times, work Row 1 of Chart C to marker, sm, work 8 sts for buttonhole band as established [8 sts increased] = 145 sts

Maintaining button and buttonhole bands throughout, and working buttonholes as established, beginning with Row 2, and ending with Row 28, work Waffle Yoke Charts A-B-C as set [104 sts increased] = 249 sts

### Sizes 2XL, 3XL and 4XL only

Maintaining button and buttonhole bands throughout, and working buttonholes as established, beginning with Row 1, and ending with Row 28, work Waffle Yoke Charts A-B-C as set [- (-, -, -, -, 112, 112, 112) sts increased] = - (-, -, -, -, 361, 361, 361) sts

### All sizes

Maintaining button and buttonhole bands throughout, and working buttonholes as established, beginning with Row 1 and ending with Row 3 (7, 11, 17, 23, 1, 7, 13), work Waffle Yoke Charts A-B-C as set [16 (32, 48, 72, 96, 8, 32, 58) sts increased] = 265 (281, 297, 321, 345, 369, 393, 417) sts

### **Divide body and sleeves**

Divide Row: \*Work sts as they appear to marker (knit the knits, purl the purls and yarnovers), place next 59 (63, 67, 73, 79, 85, 91, 97) sleeve sts on waste yarn or stitch holder, CO 4 (7, 10, 11, 12, 13, 14, 15) underarm sts; repeat from \* 1 more time, work sts as they appear to end of row = 155 (169, 183, 197, 211, 225, 239, 253) sts

### **Body**

Maintaining button and buttonhole bands throughout, and working buttonholes as established, beginning with Row 1 and ending with Row 2 or 4, work Chart D (D, D, E, D, E, D, E) until body measures 45 (47, 49, 51, 55, 59, 61, 63) cm [17¾ (18½, 19½, 20, 21¼, 23¼, 24, 24¾)]" from shoulder – or desired length  
Next Row (dec row) (RS): Work in pattern as established to end of row and **AT THE SAME TIME** skip and do not work the yarnovers in pattern [20 (22, 24, 26, 28, 30, 32, 34) sts decreased] = 135 (147, 159, 171, 183, 195, 207, 219) sts

### **Ribbed Edge**

Change to 4 mm / US6 needle

Row 1 (WS): Work 8 sts for buttonhole band, sm, (k1, p1) to marker, sm, work 7 sts for button band  
Maintaining button and buttonhole bands throughout, work sts as they appear for 8 more rows, ending with a WS row

Buttonhole Row (RS): Work 7 sts for buttonband, work sts as they appear to last 6 sts, sl1k, k1, psso, yo (= buttonhole), work sts as they appear to end of row

Maintaining button and buttonhole bands throughout, work sts as they appear (knit the knits and yarnover, purl the purls) for 6 more rows, ending with a WS row

Next row (RS): Sl2k, return 2 slipped sts to left needle, p2tog tbl, work sts as they appear to last 2 sts, p2tog

Bind off using Italian bind-off

### **Sleeves**

Transfer 59 (63, 67, 73, 79, 85, 91, 97) sleeve sts from waste yarn onto 5.5 mm / US9 double-pointed needles Distribute sts evenly across needles

Set-up Round: Beginning with Round 4 and stitch 3, (1, 6, 3, 7, 4, 1, 5) work Chart D (D, D, E, D, E, D, E) across sleeve sts, and pick up and knit 4 (7, 6, 8, 10, 12, 14, 16) underarm sts from CO edge. Join for working in the round, and place BOR marker = 63 (70, 73, 81, 89, 97, 105, 113) sts

**Size M, L, XL, 2XL, 3XL and 4XL only:**

Next Round (dec round): Work in pattern as established to last - (-, 6, 8, 10, 12, 14, 16) sts, k2tog to end of round [ - (-, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8) sts decreased] = - (-, 70, 77, 84, 91, 98, 105) sts

**All sizes:**

Work in pattern as established until sleeve measures 38 (39, 40, 39, 38, 36, 36, 36) cm [15 (15¼, 15¾, 15¾, 15, 14¼, 14¼, 14¼)]" or desired length, ending with Round 2 or 4 of Chart D (D, D, E, D, E, D, E)

### **Cuffs**

Change to 4 mm / US6 double-pointed needles

**Size XS only:**

Dec Round: P1, k2tog, p2tog, \*k1, p2tog, k2tog, p2tog; repeat from \* to last 2 sts, k1, remove BOR marker, work last st and first st of next round as k2tog, and place marker for new BOR [27 sts decreased] = 36 sts

**Size S only:**

Dec Round: \*K1, p2tog, k2tog, p2tog; repeat from \* to end of round [30 sts decreased] = 40 sts

**Size M only:**

Dec Round: P2tog, \*K1, p2tog, k2tog, p2tog; repeat from \* to last 5 sts, k1, p2tog, k2tog [30 sts decreased] = 40 sts

**Size L only:**

Dec Round: P1, k2tog, p2tog, \*k1, p2tog, k2tog, p2tog; repeat from \* to last 2 sts, k1, remove BOR marker, work last st and first st of next round as k2tog, and place marker for new BOR [33 sts decreased] = 44 sts

Size XL only:

Dec Round: P1, \*k1, p2tog, k2tog, p2tog; repeat from \* to last st, remove BOR marker, work last st and first st of next round as k2tog, and place marker for new BOR [36 sts decreased] = 48 sts

Size 2XL only:

Dec Round: \*K2tog, p2tog, k1, p2tog; repeat from \* to end of round [39 sts decreased] = 52 sts

Size 3XL only:

Dec Round: \*K1, p2tog, k2tog, p2tog; repeat from \* to end of round [42 sts decreased] = 56 sts

Size 4XL only:

Dec Round: K1, p2tog, \*k1, p2tog, k2tog, p2tog; repeat from \* to 4 sts left, k1, p2tog and knit last st tog with first st on next round [45 sts decreased] = 60 sts

All sizes:

Next round: (K1, p1) in rib pattern as established to end of round

Repeat last round until cuff measures 6 cm [2¼"]

Bind off loosely in rib pattern

Work second sleeve the same

**Finishing**

Weave in all loose ends. Sew buttons to buttonband opposite to buttonholes

Block

## **Abbreviations**

Approx. – approximately

BOR – beginning of round

K – knit

P – purl

Dec – decrease

Inc – increase

Ds – double stitch (for German short-row technique)

Yo – yarn over

K2tog – knit 2 stitches together [1 stitch decreased]

M1L – make 1 new left twist stitch on the knit side: insert right needle, from back to front, under the bar running between first stitch on left needle and last stitch on right needles, pick up bar and knit this stitch into the back loop [1 stitch increased]

M1R – make 1 new right twist stitch on the knit side: insert right needle, from front to back, under the bar running between first stitch on left needle and last stitch on right needle, pick up bar in twisted position and knit this stitch [1 stitch increased]

M1Lp – make 1 new left purl twist st on the wrong side: insert right needle, from front to back, under the bar running between first st on left needle and last stitch on right needle, pick up bar in twisted position and purl this stitch [1 stitch increased]

M1Rp – make 1 new right purl twist stitch on the wrong side: insert right needle, from back to front, under the bar running between first st on left needle and last stitch on right needle, pick up bar and purl this stitch through the back loop [1 stitch increased]

Pm – place marker

P2tog – purl 2 stitches together [1 stitch decreased]

Pssso – pass slipped stitch(es) over

Rm – remove marker

RS – right side

WS – wrong side

Sm – slip marker

Sl1k – slip 1 stitch knitwise

Sl2k – slip 2 stitches together knitwise

St/sts – stitch/stitches

St st – stockinette stitch

Tbl – through the back loop


Tw – turn work (for German short-row technique)

Wyib – with yarn in back


Wyif – with yarn in front


### Yoke Chart A - Left front




### Yoke Chart B - Sleeves and back




## Yoke Chart C - Right front
