## ABOUT THIS DESIGN

Cozy cardigan, knit from the bottom up in a beautiful woven pattern. The body is worked in one piece until splitting for the armholes. The textured pattern is worked according to the chart. The garment is worked with 3 strands of yarn held together throughout = 1 strand of each quality.

The gauge and measurements listed in the pattern are based on knits that have been washed and dried. It's important to make a gauge swatch using the intended yarn before beginning. Wash the swatch according to the care instructions and allow it to dry completely before counting the number of stitches within 10 x 10 cm. You may need to adjust your needle size up or down to achieve the specified gauge.

## ABBREVIATIONS

**st(s):** stitch(es)

**k:** knit

**p:** purl

**tog:** together

**m:** stitch marker

**WS:** wrong side

## TECHNIQUES

**Slipped Stitch Edge (sl st):** Slip the first st on all rows purlwise with the yarn in front of the st. [Sl pwyif] Knit the last stitch on all rows.

**Selvedge stitches (selv st):** Slip the first stitch knit-wise on all rows. Knit the last stitch on all rows.

**Rib:** Alternating k2 and p2.

**Textured pattern:** Work according to the chart at the end of the pattern. Number of sts: divisible by 8 + 1 st. Repeat the 12 rows of the chart.

On WS rows 2, 4, 8 and 10, work sts as they appear.

On WS rows 6 and 12, purl all sts.

## PATTERN

### Back and fronts

Using 5 mm needles, cast on [152] 168 [184] 192 [216] 224 [240] sts with 1 strand of each quality held together as described and work in rib, dividing the sts as follows: Sl st, \* k2, p2 \* repeat from \* to \*, ending with k2, k1. Work 7 cm = 14 rows with this stitch distribution.

Then work 2 rows in stockinette stitch, increasing 3 sts evenly on R 1 = [155] 171 [187] 195 [219] 227 [243] sts. Change to a 6 mm needle and work in pattern according to the chart as follows:

Work 1 sl st and 12 sts in rib as before = 13 sts (front placket), work 1 st from the beginning of the chart, repeat the 8 sts of the chart and work to the end of the chart, ending with 12 sts in rib and k1 as before = 13 sts for front placket. Continue working evenly until the work measures 42 cm and divide for the front and back at the armholes:

### Right front

13 sts front placket and [32] 36 [40] 42 [48] 50 [54] sts in pattern = [45] 49 [53] 55 [61] 63 [67] sts. Place the remaining sts on hold. On the 1st row, cast on 1 new st (selv st) in the left side of the work = armhole = [46] 50 [54] 56 [62] 64 [68] sts. Continue working evenly until the armhole measures [14] 15 [16] 17 [18] 19 [20] cm.

Place the first 13 + [0] 2 [4] 4 [6] 7 [8] sts on a stitch holder for the collar, then bind off at the neckline every other row for 4,3,2,1 sts = [22] 24 [27] 28 [32] 33 [36] sts for the shoulder.
