Details & Knitting Chart Symbols

Difficulty

Beginner Intermediate

Needles & Notions

3.75 mm Double point needle, tapestry needle, stitch marker, Two 50cm strings

Gauge

10 x 10 cm = 21 stitches and 36 rows (Washing and blocking is recommended before measuring)

Yarn

Biches et Buches Le Petit Lambswool - Hold 2 strand 26g 130 m

Knitting Chart Symbols

These knitting chart symbols resemble the knitted shapes. You can knit from the charts by understanding what these symbols represent.

[When working flat, keep in mind to work the chart in reverse for even rows on the wrong side.]


 knit [WS : purl]	 purl [WS : knit]	 yo (yarn over)
 k2tog (knit 2 together) [WS : p2tog. purl 2 together]	 Right Leaning Double Decrease (ssk)	 M1L (make 1 left)
 ssk (slip slip knit) [WS : ssp. slip slip purl]	 Left Leaning Double Decrease (sk2p)	 M1R (make 1 right)
 LC = left cross (left twist)	 sl (slip stitch)	 bind off

Instruction

The pattern is knitted from the bottom up, meaning from the center to the edge, in the round, counterclockwise.
Work in the round with 5 double pointed needles until you reach the drawstring hem. Then work the front and the back separately in flat.

Bottom

1. Cast on 4 stitches on one needle.
2. Place the stitches on 4 needles, one stitch on each needle.
Set the needles making two of them face each other.
Now you can see a square in the center.



The first stitch is no.1 and the last stitch is no.4.
With a new (the 5th actually) needle, knit from no.1 to no.4.
This is the first row.

Work in the round, clockwise.

Work increases on every round until you have 13 stitches on each needle (52 stitches in total).

When you have odd number of stitches on each needle :
make one stitch at the left-hand end.

When you have even number of stitches on each needle :
make one stitch in the middle.

Then knit as below.

Knit 1 round without increase. (13 stitches / 52 stitches)

Work increase at the left-hand end, with odd number of stitches. (14 stitches / 56 stitches)

Knit 1 round without increase. (14stitches / 56stitches)

Work increase in the middle, with even number of stitches. (15 stitches / 60 stitches)

Knit 1 round without increase. (15 stitches / 60 stitches)

Work increase at the left-hand end, with odd number of stitches. (16 stitches / 64 stitches)

Knit 1 round without increase. (16 stitches /64 stitches)

Work increase in the middle, with even number of stitches. (17 stitches / 68 stitches)

Tail

Make a 5 stitch bobble at the point marked on the chart, adding 4 extra strands of mohair to the working yarn.

After finishing the bobble, leave the mohair and continue to work the round only with the working yarn.

Knit 3 more rounds.

Nose

At the point marked on the chart, leave the working yarn and make a 3 stitch bobble with a new strand of yarn (different color).

Continue to finish the round with main color then knit 10 more rounds.

Upper Part

Knit until you have 8 stitches to the end of the round and place a marker which is new beginning of the round marker.


Count the stitches from the marker to the 34th stitches then place another

marker to divide the stitches in half, back and front.

Divide the front part (with the nose) into 5 sections placing markers as below:

7 stitches / marker / 6 stitches (ear) / marker / 7 stitches (middle of the face) / marker / 6 stitches (ear) / marker / 8 stitches

Now work row 38 : knit 41 stitches / repeat [knit, yarn over] 6 times, knit 7 stitches, repeat [yarn over, knit] 6 times / knit 8 stitches.



On the next round (row 39), knit 41 stitches then separate 6 knit stitches from the yarn overs so that you can leave the knit stitches to rest on a scrap yarn and knit the yarn overs into the back legs.

(see the images above, leaving 6 stitches for ear to rest on a scrap yarn)

Knit 7 stitches between the ears. Then move the knit stitches to a scrap yarn and knit the yarn overs into the back, in the same way you did with the other ear.

Working to the end of the round, remove the markers except

the ones in the beginning and in the middle.

Knit 3 rounds. On the third round work until you have 1 stitch left to the beginning of the round marker. Rearrange the last and the first stitch of the round then knit the 2 crossed stitches.

Work the next round until you have 1 stitch to the center marker. Rearrange the stitches before and after the marker. Knit one of the two crossed stitches and flip the project to work the wrong side.

Work 10 more rows in flat.

Cut the working yarn 3~4 times longer than the edge and do not bind off.

Join a new strand of yarn to the other half of the project (34 stitches) to work 12 rows of stockinette stitches in flat.

Cut the working yarn 3~4 times longer than the edge with the stitches still staying on the needle.

Insert a lifeline through row 43 (where the stitches were rearranged), marking the line to sew the stitches.

Turn the project inside out.

With the wrong side facing you, fold the inside hem which worked in flat then sew the stitches on the needle one by one to the stitches on the lifeline.

Work the other hem in the same way.

Ears

Place the resting stitches on the scrap yarn onto a needle and begin from the right-hand side.

Purl one stitch and pick up one stitch from the back (yarn over on the main body) to knit into the back leg. Repeat 4 more times then knit remaining 1 stitch. (11 stitches)

Flip the project to work row 1 of the chart.

Follow the chart to work the ear, slipping every first stitch of each row.

Work the last row and bind off at the same time.

Finishing

Embroider the eyes and the mouth with the same yarn you worked the nose with.



Weave in all ends.

Thread 2 pieces of cord or knitted i-cord with 50 cm of length through the drawstring hems, one by one from the opposite ends. Tie the ends of the cords together on each side.

Rabbit pattern

When working flat, keep in mind to work the chart in reverse for even rows on the wrong side.



- ▶ = begin with a new strand of yarn

- = embroider the eye



Bear pattern

Knit intarsia colorwork in the round for color change on the face.
