

VOLOSHKA PULLOVER

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INTRODUCTION

Voloshka or Cornflower in Ukrainian is inspired by this beautiful meadow flower.

These flowers are frequently used in traditional Ukrainian embroidery, especially in the farmland regions. Cornflowers are often found in the fields of wheat and cereal crops, where they look like beautiful blue eyes in the sea of yellow. This design takes me back home.

This round-yoke pullover is knit top-down in the round and comes with the two charted versions of the yoke colourwork: with a light (MC) and dark (CC, as shown on the pictures) background.

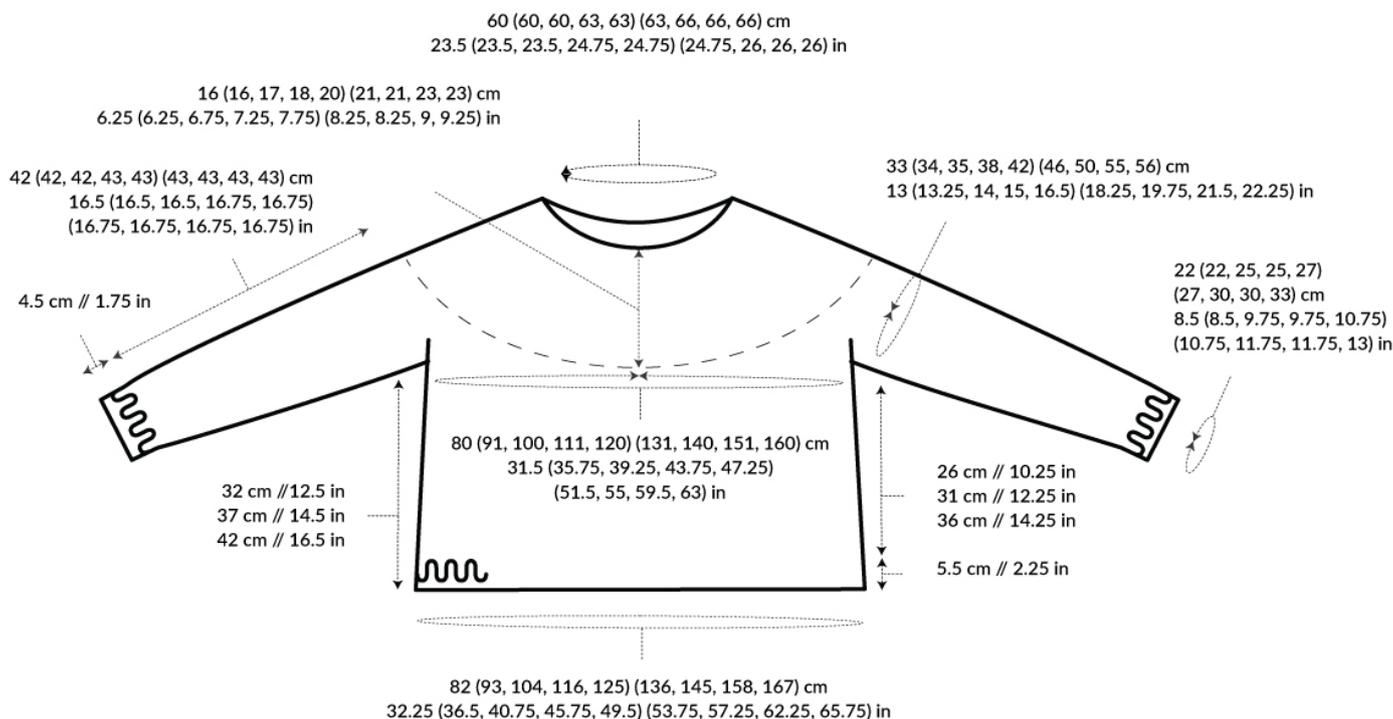
SIZES

The pattern is written for nine sizes 1 (2, 3, 4, 5) (6, 7, 8, 9) with a finished bust circumference of ca. 80 (91, 100, 111, 120) (131, 140, 151, 160) cm // 31.5 (35.75, 39.25, 43.75, 47.25) (51.5, 55, 59.5, 63) in incl. 6 cm (2.25 in) of the recommended positive ease.

There are three body length options provided in the pattern. The sample is shown in length option 1 and size 2 on a 160 cm (5.3 ft) tall model with ca. 84–66–94 cm (33–26–39 in) body measurements.

For more of the finished garment measurements, please refer to the schematic on page 2.

Note that the front/back to hem length measurements are provided for the body length option 1.



Middle of the front length neck to bottom of the hem:

48 (48, 49, 50, 51) (52, 53, 55, 55) cm
19 (19, 19.5, 19.75, 20.25) (20.5, 21, 21.5, 21.75) in

Middle of the back length neck to bottom of the hem:

52 (52, 54, 55, 56) (57, 59, 60, 61) cm
20.75 (20.75, 21, 21.75, 22.25) (22.5, 23, 23.75, 24) in

YARN

MC:

ca. 215 (230, 245, 270, 295) (315, 340, 370, 385) g
or 5 (5, 5, 6, 6) (7, 7, 8, 8) skeins of Baby Yak Lace
yarn from Myak fibers **held double**, 100% baby yak
with approx. 350 m (380 yds) per 50 g skein, shown in
colourway Mustard;

or ca. 753 (805, 858, 945, 1033) (1103, 1190,
1295, 1348) m // 823 (881, 938, 1034, 1130)
(1206, 1302, 1417, 1474) yds of any other DK/light
worsted weight yarn with a matching gauge.

You might need to have a bit extra MC yarn if you
opt for the light (MC) colourwork background.

Also note that the yardage is calculated for the
body length option 1 (32 cm // 12.5 in).

CC:

ca. 45 (45, 50, 55, 60) (65, 70, 75, 75) g or
1 (1, 1, 2, 2) (2, 2, 2, 2) skeins of the same yarn
held double, shown in colourway Chocolate;

or ca. 158 (158, 175, 193, 210) (228, 245,
263, 263) m // 172 (172, 191, 211, 230) (249,
268, 287, 287) yds of any other DK/light
worsted weight yarn with a matching gauge.

The yardage is calculated for a version with dark
(CC) colourwork background, so you might need
less CC if you opt for the light (MC) one.

NEEDLES AND NOTIONS

- 2.5 mm (US 1-2) or 3.0 mm (US 2.5) for the neck and 3.5 mm (US 4) circular needles as a main needle (choose the appropriate cable length yourself);
- spare cables, spare circular needles or scrap yarn to keep sts on hold;
- a few stitch markers;
- a tapestry needle or a crochet hook to weave in the ends.

GAUGE

22 sts & 32 rnds in 10 cm (4 in) on 3.5 mm (US 4) needles measured over stockinette stitch worked in the round after blocking;

22 sts & 30 rnds in 10 cm (4 in) on 3.5 mm (US 4) needles measured over colourwork pattern of the yoke worked in the round after blocking.

Adjust the needle sizes if necessary to obtain the correct gauge.

CONSTRUCTION AND NOTES

The neck starts from a long-tail cast-on and a short garter stitch section, which accommodates the necessary increases, followed by a short section of ribbing with colourwork.

The neck is on the wider side. For a more narrow neck opening, either use a smaller 2.5 mm (US 1-2) needle or adjust the number of cast-on sts and increase the necessary sts in Rnd 2.

The colourwork pattern of the yoke is charted in two versions: with a light (MC) and dark (CC) background, so see what you like best. The written instructions follow the dark (CC) background version as shown on the pictures.

After the separation of the yoke for body and sleeves, the body is slightly A-line shaped with increases on the sides towards the hem. There is also a slight difference in the number of sts on the front and back to accommodate the bust. If you want, you can split the sts evenly.

Three (3) body length options are provided for your reference, but feel free to stop whenever you have enough length. The hem is decorated with another section of the colourwork as well as ribbing and finished with a purl bind-off.

If your hem tends to curl, consider adding a few rnds of simple (MC or CC) or corrugated (both colours) 1x1 ribbing.

The sleeves are gradually shaped with decreases towards the cuffs. If you think there's too much positive ease in the sleeve, switch to a smaller needle. The cuffs are finished with a variation of the same ribbing as the hem.

ABBREVIATIONS AND TECHNIQUES

BOR/EOR – beginning/end of the round;

ca. – circa – approximately;

colourwork –

- if not specified otherwise, work with the MC;
- watch out for the directions as to which colour to keep on top;
- catch the floats on the WS every 3-4 sts by twisting MC and CC on the WS;

kx/px – knit/purl x sts with MC;

kxcc/pxcc – knit/purl x sts with CC;

kall – knit all to EOR with MC;

kallcc – knit all to EOR with CC;

k2tog – knit 2 sts together as if they were one (right leaning 1 st decrease);

LH/RH – left/right hand (needle);

LLI – [left lifted increase](#) – lift the left leg of the stitch 2 rows below the stitch on RH needle onto LH needle and knit it through the back loop (left leaning 1 st increase);

m1L – make 1 left knit – insert LH needle, from front to back, under strand of yarn that runs between next st on LH needle and last st on RH needle; knit this st through back loop (1 st increase);

m1Lp – make 1 left purl – insert LH needle, from front to back, under strand of yarn that runs between next st on LH needle and last st on RH needle; purl this st through back loop (1 st increase);

m1R – make 1 right knit – insert LH needle, from back to front, under strand of yarn that runs between next st on LH needle and last st on RH needle; knit this st as usual (1 st increase);

MC/CC – main/contrasting colour (mc/cc);

MOF – middle of the front (marker);

pall – purl all to EOR with MC;

pallcc – purl all to EOR with CC;

ABBREVIATIONS AND TECHNIQUES

R/Rnd/SR – row/round/short row;

rep – repeat;

RS/WS – right/wrong side of the work;

sl1yb – slip 1 st purlwise with yarn behind;

sl1yf – slip 1 st purlwise with yarn in front;

st(s) – stitch(es);

ssk – slip the next 2 sts, one by one, knitwise, insert the tip of the left needle, from left to right, into the fronts of those 2 sts and knit them together (left leaning 1 st decrease);

w&t – [wrap and turn](#) –

- at the end of the short row before a knit st (RS), with the yarn at the back, slip next st purlwise to the RH needle, bring the yarn to the front, return the last st off the RH needle to the LH needle and turn your work, bring the yarn in front and start working the following row according to the previously established pattern;
- at the end of the short row before a purl st (WS), keep the yarn in the front, slip the next st purlwise to the RH needle, turn your work, bring the yarn to the front, move the first st to the RH needle, bring the yarn to the back and start working the following row according to the previously established pattern;
- pick up wraps in the next full rnds [as shown](#);
- the short rows could also be worked as [German short rows](#) or [Japanese short rows](#).

NECK: GARTER EDGE

With MC, using a long-tail cast-on (or any other non-stretchy cast-on method) with 3.0 mm (US 2.5) needles (or 2.5 mm (US 1-2) needles for a smaller neck circumference if necessary) cast on a total of 120 (120, 120, 126, 126) (126, 132, 132, 132) sts (multiples of 6 sts). Join to work in the round and place the BOR marker.

Rnd 1: kall.

Rnd 2: increase as indicated:

- **SIZE 1:** pall;
- **SIZE 2:** pall;
- **SIZE 3:** increase a total of 12 sts: p10, m1Lp;
- **SIZE 4:** increase a total of 18 sts: p7, m1Lp;
- **SIZE 5:** increase a total of 18 sts: p7, m1Lp;

Rnd 2: increase as indicated:

- **SIZE 6:** increase a total of 21 sts: p6, m1Lp;
- **SIZE 7:** increase a total of 33 sts: p4, m1Lp;
- **SIZE 8:** increase a total of 33 sts: p4, m1Lp;
- **SIZE 9:** increase a total of 33 sts: p4, m1Lp.

You will have a total of 120 (120, 132, 144, 144) (147, 165, 165, 165) sts.

Rnd 3: kall.

SIZES 1 (2, 3, 4, -) (-, -, -, -) ONLY

move to the next section Neck: ribbing.

SIZES - (-, -, -, 5) (6, 7, 8, 9) ONLY

Rnd 4: increase as indicated:

- **SIZE 5:** increase a total of 12 sts: p12, m1Lp;
- **SIZE 6:** increase a total of 21 sts: p7, m1Lp;
- **SIZE 7:** increase a total of 15 sts: p11, m1Lp;
- **SIZE 8:** increase a total of 11 sts: p15, m1Lp;
- **SIZE 9:** increase a total of 33 sts: p5, m1Lp.

You will have a total of - (-, -, -, 156) (168, 180, 176, 198) sts.

Rnd 5: kall.

Rnd 6: pall.

Rnd 7: kall.

SIZES - (-, -, -, 5) (6, 7, -, -) ONLY

move to the next section Neck: ribbing.

SIZES - (-, -, -, -) (-, -, 8, 9) ONLY

Rnd 8: increase as indicated:

- **SIZE 8:** increase a total of 16 sts: p11, m1Lp;
- **SIZE 9:** increase a total of 6 sts: p33, m1Lp.

You will have a total of - (-, -, -, -) (-, -, 192, 204) sts.

Rnd 9: kall.

NECK: RIBBING

Pick up 3.5 (US 4) mm needles and CC yarn.

Rnd 1: *k1, p2cc; rep from * to EOR.

Rnd 2: *sl1yb, k2cc; rep from * to EOR.

Break CC yarn.

Rnd 3: *k1, sl2yf; rep from * to EOR.

Rnd 4: *k1, p2; rep from * to EOR.

YOKE

Rnd 1: *k1, LLI, k2; rep from * to EOR.

You will have a total of 160 (160, 176, 192, 208) (224, 240, 256, 272) sts.

Rnd 2 – Rnd 4 (3 rnds): kall.

SHAPING THE BACK OF THE

YOKE WITH SHORT ROWS

Depending on the size, there will be a total of 15 (15, 15, 17, 17) (17, 19, 19, 19) short rows.

SR1 (RS): from the BOR in the middle of the back, k40 (40, 44, 48, 52) (56, 60, 64, 68), w&t.

SR2 (WS): p to BOR, p40 (40, 44, 48, 52) (56, 60, 64, 68), w&t.

SR3 (RS): k till 5 sts to (before) previous wrap, w&t.

SR4 (WS): p till 5 sts to (before) previous wrap, w&t.

Your short rows will become shorter and shorter.

SR5, SR7, SR9, SR11, SR13 (RS): rep like in SR3.

SR6, SR8, SR10, SR12, SR14 (WS): rep like in SR4.

Sizes 1, 2, 3 – move to SR15(RS);

Sizes 4, 5, 6 – rep SR3-4 one (1) more time;

Sizes 7, 8, 9 – rep SR3-4 two (2) more times.

SR15 (15, 15, 17, 17) (17, 19, 19, 19) (RS):

k to BOR and move to the next section.

YOKE (CONTINUED)

Rnd 1: kall and **at the same time** pick up short row wraps and work them together with their corresponding sts.

Rnd 2: kall.

Follow the yoke pattern charts provided on pages 9 and 10 or further written instructions for the dark (CC) background version (as shown on the pictures).

Rnd 3: *k8, LLI; rep from * to EOR.

You will have a total of 180 (180, 198, 216, 234) (252, 270, 288, 306) sts.

Rnd 4 – Rnd 6 (3 rnds): kall.

Pick up CC yarn.

In the next section keep MC on top of CC on the WS.

Rnd 7: *k1cc, k1, k1cc, k1, k1cc, k1, k1cc, k2, LLI; rep from * to EOR.

You will have a total of 200 (200, 220, 240, 260) (280, 300, 320, 340) sts.

Rnd 8: *k1, k2cc, k1, k2cc, k4; rep from * to EOR.

Rnd 9: *k3cc, k1, k3cc, k3; rep from * to EOR.

Rnd 10: *k3, k1cc, k6; rep from * to EOR.

Rnd 11: *k3cc, k1, k1cc, k1, k1cc, k3, LLI; rep from * to EOR.

You will have a total of 220 (220, 242, 264, 286) (308, 330, 352, 374) sts.

Rnd 12: *k1, k2cc, k2, k2cc, k1, k1cc, k2; rep from * to EOR.

Rnd 13: *k2, k1cc, k1, k3cc, k1, k2cc, k1; rep from * to EOR.

Rnd 14: *k7, k4cc; rep from * to EOR.

Rnd 15: *k1cc, k5, k1cc, k4; rep from * to EOR.

Rnd 16: *k1, k5cc, k4, LLI, k1; rep from * to EOR.

You will have a total of 240 (240, 264, 288, 312) (336, 360, 384, 408) sts.

Rnd 17: *k3, k2cc, k7; rep from * to EOR.

Rnd 18: *k4, k1cc, k7; rep from * to EOR.

Rnd 19 – Rnd 21 (3 rnds): kall.

TRANSITION INTO THE SECOND

COLOURWORK SECTION

Rnd 22: *k1, p2cc; rep from * to EOR.

Rnd 23: *sl1yb, k2cc; rep from * to EOR.

Rnd 24: *k1, p2; rep from * to EOR.

Rnd 25: *sl1yb, k2cc; rep from * to EOR.

Rnd 26 – Rnd 27 (2 rnds): kallcc.

Rnd 28: *k12cc, LLIcc; rep from * to EOR.

You will have a total of 260 (260, 286, 312, 338) (364, 390, 416, 442) sts.

In the next section keep CC on top of MC on the WS.

Rnd 29: *k4cc, k1, k8cc; rep from * to EOR.

Rnd 30: *k3cc, k2, k8cc; rep from * to EOR.

Rnd 31: *k1cc, k6, k6cc; rep from * to EOR.

Rnd 32: *k1, k6cc, k1, k5cc; rep from * to EOR.

Rnd 33: *k3cc, k1, k4cc, k5; rep from * to EOR.

YOKE (CONTINUED)

Rnd 34: *k1cc, k1, k1cc, k1, k1cc, k3, k2cc, k2, k1cc; rep from * to EOR.

Rnd 35: *k2cc, k2, k2cc, k2, k2cc, k1, k2cc, LLcc; rep from * to EOR.

In SIZE 1 ONLY skip all the increases in Rnd 35 and from here on you will have 1 cc st less at the end of the each charted pattern repeat!

You will have a total of 260 (280, 308, 336, 364) (392, 420, 448, 476) sts.

Rnd 36: *k4, k1cc, k1, k1cc, k1, k6cc; rep from * to EOR.

Rnd 37: *k4cc, k1, k9cc; rep from * to EOR.

Rnd 38: *k4, k1cc, k4, k5cc; rep from * to EOR.

Rnd 39: *k2cc, k2, k1cc, k2, k7cc; rep from * to EOR.

Rnd 40: *k1cc, k1, k1cc, k1, k1cc, k1, k1cc, k1, k6cc; rep from * to EOR.

Rnd 41: *k3cc, k1, k1cc, k1, k8cc; rep from * to EOR.

Rnd 42 – Rnd 44 (3 rnds): kallcc.

SIZES 1 (2) ONLY

Break CC yarn and move to the next section.

SIZES - (-, 3, 4, 5) (6, 7, 8, 9) ONLY

Break CC yarn and with MC work in stockinette st a total of - (-, 4, 7, 9) (12, 13, 17, 18) more rnds.

Alternatively for SIZES 3-9 ONLY, do not break the CC yarn and introduce a transition section of ribbing as charted in Rnd 14 – Rnd 17 (4 rnds) of the hem pattern chart on page 11.

Add more rnds if necessary to adjust the depth of the yoke, break CC yarn and move to the next section.

SEPARATING BODY AND SLEEVES

Rnd 1: with MC and 3.5 mm (US 4) needles starting from BOR at the middle of the back,

- k36 (41, 46, 51, 55) (59, 63, 67, 72) sts of the back,

- temporarily bind off or place on hold the next 56 (56, 60, 64, 70) (76, 82, 88, 92) sts for the right sleeve,
- cast on extra 14 (16, 16, 18, 20) (24, 26, 30, 30) sts for the underarm;
- place a removable marker to mark the middle of the underarm;
- k76 (86, 96, 106, 114) (122, 130, 138, 148) sts of the front,
- temporarily bind off or place on hold the next 56 (56, 60, 64, 70) (76, 82, 88, 92) sts for the left sleeve,
- cast on extra 14 (16, 16, 18, 20) (24, 26, 30, 30) sts for the underarm,
- place a removable marker to mark the middle of the underarm;
- k36 (41, 46, 51, 55) (59, 63, 67, 72) sts of the back to EOR.

You will have a total of 176 (200, 220, 244, 264) (288, 308, 332, 352) sts for the body.

BODY

Rnd 1 – Rnd 6: kall.

Rnd 7: increase to shape the body (+4 sts)

– *k till 1 st to the underarm marker, m1R, k1, slip marker, k1, m1L; rep from * for the second underarm and k to EOR. You will have a total of 180 (204, 224, 248, 268) (292, 312, 336, 356) sts.

Increase as described above in every 7th rnd:

- **SIZE 1:** no more increases;
- **SIZE 2:** no more increases;
- **SIZE 3:** one (1) more time (+4 sts);
- **SIZE 4:** one (1) more time (+4 sts);
- **SIZE 5:** two (2) more times (+8 sts);
- **SIZE 6:** two (2) more times (+8 sts);
- **SIZE 7:** three (3) more times (+12 sts);
- **SIZE 8:** three (3) more times (+12 sts);
- **SIZE 9:** four (4) more times (+16 sts).

You will have a total of 180 (204, 228, 252, 276) (300, 324, 348, 372) sts for the colourwork pattern of the hem (multiples of 12 sts).

BODY (CONTINUED)

Then, work in stockinette stitch until desired length or until the body measures ca. 26 (31, 36) cm // 10.25 (12.25, 14.25) in from the underarms, given that the hem will add another 5.5 cm (2.25 in).

HEM

Follow the hem pattern chart provided on page 11 and/or further written instructions.

Keep the MC on top of CC on the WS.

Rnd 1: *k3, k1cc, k1, k1cc, k6;
rep from * to EOR.

Rnd 2: *k1, k1cc, k1, k1cc, k1, k1cc,
k1, k1cc, k4; rep from * to EOR.

Rnd 3: *k2, k2cc, k1, k2cc, k5; rep from * to EOR.

Rnd 4: *k4cc, k1, k4cc, k3; rep from * to EOR.

Rnd 5: *k4, k1cc, k5, k1cc, k1;
rep from * to EOR.

Rnd 6: *k2, k2cc, k1, k2cc, k2, k3cc;
rep from * to EOR.

Rnd 7: *k1cc, k1, k2cc, k1, k2cc, k1,
k1cc, k1, k1cc, k1; rep from * to EOR.

Rnd 8: *k2cc, k5, k2cc, k1, k1cc, k1;
rep from * to EOR.

Rnd 9: *k1cc, k1, k2cc, k1, k2cc, k1,
k1cc, k1, k1cc, k1; rep from * to EOR.

Rnd 10 – Rnd 12 (3 rnds): *k1cc, k1;
rep from * to EOR.

Rnd 13: kallcc.

Rnd 14: *k1cc, p3; rep from * to EOR.

Rnd 15: *sl1yb, k3; rep from * to EOR.

Rnd 16: *k1cc, p3cc; rep from * to EOR.

Rnd 17: *sl1yb, k3; rep from * to EOR.

If your hem tends to curl at this point, add a few rnds of simple or corrugated ribbing.

Otherwise, break MC yarn.

Rnd 18: kallcc.

Bind off with CC using a purl bind-off or any other method of your choice, break the yarn and weave in the end.

SLEEVES

Return to the sts left on hold for the sleeves and follow these instructions twice to make two identical sleeves or use [a magic loop technique](#) to work both sleeves simultaneously.

Rnd 1:

with MC and 3.5 mm (US 4) needles starting in the middle of the underarm,

- pick up and k7 (8, 8, 9, 10) (12, 13, 15, 15) sts of the underarm,
- pick up and k1 extra st to avoid a hole,
- k56 (56, 60, 64, 70) (76, 82, 88, 92) sts of the sleeve,
- pick up and k1 extra st to avoid a hole,
- pick up and k the remaining k7 (8, 8, 9, 10) (12, 13, 15, 15) sts of the underarm.

You will have a total of 72 (74, 78, 84, 92) (102, 110, 120, 124) sts. Join to work in the round and place a BOR marker.

Work in stockinette st a total of 2 (4, 2, 1, 8) (10, 4, 1, 6) rnds before starting with the shaping.

Then, decrease by 2 sts on the inner side of the sleeve in every 11th (10th, 11th, 9th, 8th) (6th, 6th, 5th, 5th) rnd as described:

– k1, **k2tog**, k till 3 to EOR, **ssk**, k1.

Work the decreases a total of **12 (13, 12, 15, 16, 21, 22, 27, 26) times** finishing in Rnd 134 (134, 134, 136, 136) (136, 136, 136, 136) with a total of **48 (48, 54, 54, 60) (60, 66, 66, 72) sts** for the cuffs.

In case of any modifications, the number of sts for the cuffs has to be divisible by 3 (i.e. multiples of 3 sts).

Add more rnds if necessary to adjust the length of the sleeve given that the cuff will add another 4.5 cm (1.75 in) and move to the next section.

CUFFS

Work with 3.5 mm (US 4) needles or if cuffs seem too loose, switch to a smaller needle size.

Keep MC on top of CC.

Follow the cuff pattern chart provided and/or further written instructions.

CUFFS (CONTINUED)

Pick up CC yarn.

Rnd 1: *k1, p2cc; rep from * to EOR.

Rnd 2: *sl1yb, k2cc; rep from * to EOR.

Rnd 3: *k1, p2; rep from * to EOR.

Rnd 4: *sl1yb, k2cc; rep from * to EOR.

Rnd 5: kall.

Repeat **Rnds 1-5** two (2) more times finishing with Rnd 15.

Break CC yarn.

Bind off using purl bind-off or any other method of your choice with MC, break the yarn and weave in the end.

BLOCKING

Weave in the remaining ends. Soak the garment in lukewarm water. Gently squeeze to remove most of the water and then roll in a towel to dry. Pin out to measurements or desired size/shape and leave flat to dry.

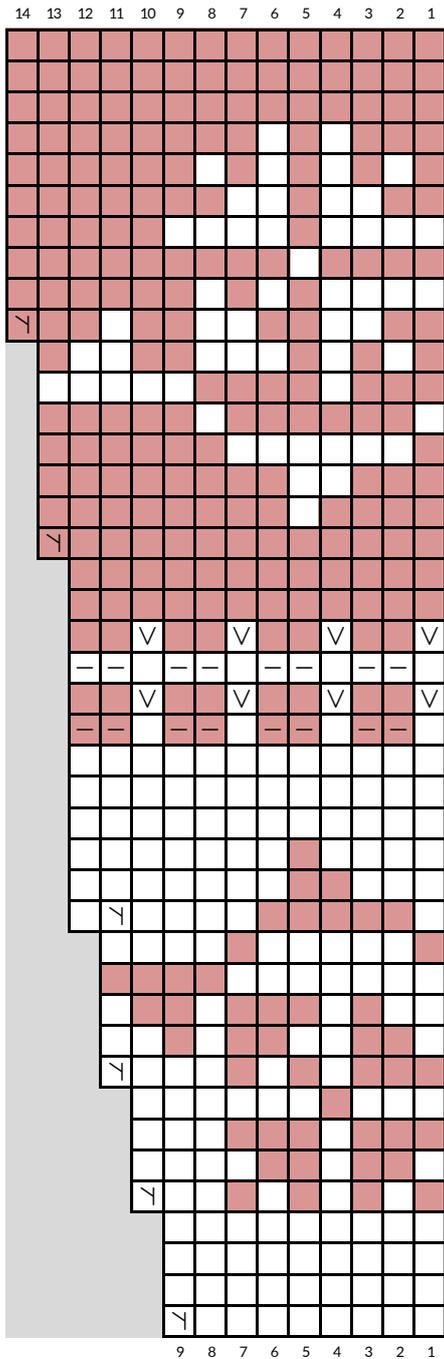

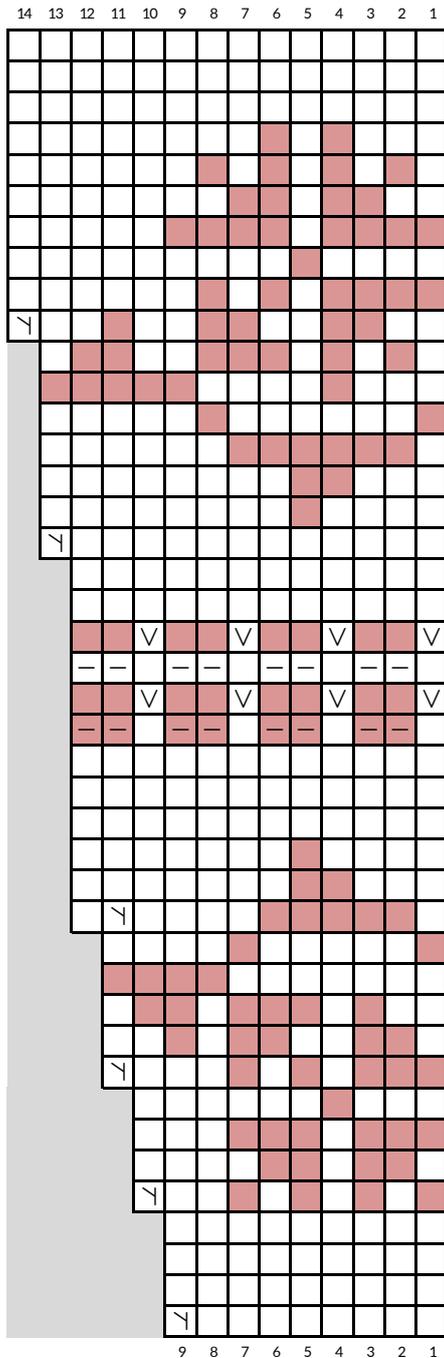

YOKE PATTERN CHART (LIGHT VERSION)

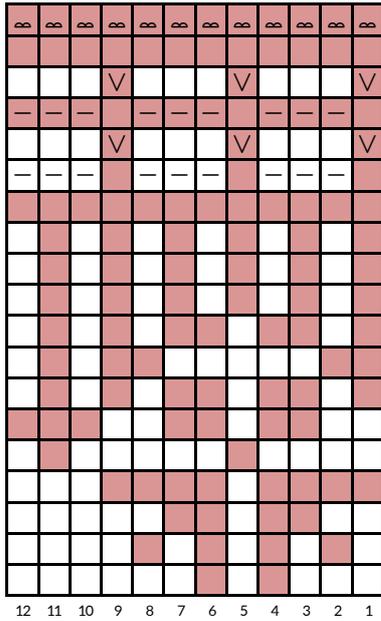

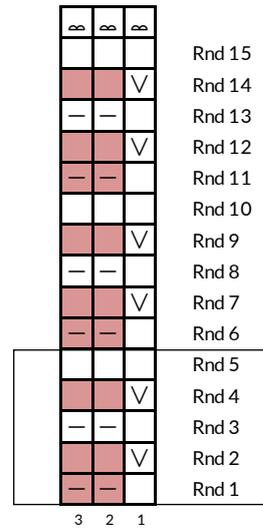
HEM PATTERN CHART
