## THE BABY BUNNY LOVEY

*Designed for small hands, this comforter toy is the perfect mix of amigurumi and blanket style crochet, creating the perfect gift for someone to treasure!*

A blue sparrow handmade pattern  
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## NOTES FOR THE PATTERN

- Instructions are written in continuous rounds & rows, using US terminology.
- The number of stitches you should have at the end of each round is written in the brackets like so, (20).
- Make sure you pull your stitches tight and always use a stitch marker, or a piece of string, to mark the start of each round.
- Most importantly, have fun whilst crocheting this pattern, and feel free to reach out if you have any issues along the way.

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## WHAT YOU WILL NEED

- Yarn & Colours Must have Cotton: 004 - Birch - light grey (2x 50g ball)
- Scheepjes Catona Cotton: 238 - Powder Pink - pink (less than 10g)
- Scheepjes Catona Cotton: 074 - Mercury - dark grey (less than 5g)
- Black embroidery thread
- A 2.5 mm & 3.00 mm crochet hook
- Safety eyes (8 mm)
- Toy stuffing
- Yarn needle
- Stitch Markers
- Pins
- Scissors

*You can use any yarn of your choice, just adjust your crochet hook according to the yarn.*

***Caution:** If this toy is intended for a baby/small child, embroidered eyes are recommended. If you choose to use safety eyes, be sure to attach them securely. Make sure all yarn ends are thoroughly weaved in. Supervision around children is recommended.*

## CROCHET TERMS USED // ABBREVIATIONS GUIDE (US TERMINOLOGY):

Below are basic explanations of the crochet terms used in this pattern.

- **CHAIN (ch)** With a loop on your hook, yarn over from back to front and pull the loop through
- **STITCH (st)**
- **MAGIC RING (mr)** Wrap yarn over two fingers twice forming an X. Place the hook under the first piece of yarn and then over the second piece of yarn. Pull the outer strand of yarn under the first strand of the X forming a loop. Yarn over once more and draw the yarn through both loops. Work the appropriate number of stitches into the loop by inserting the hook into the main circle space onto the other side, yarning over and pulling through the space in the middle, yarn over the hook and pull through both loops on the hook. Once you have crocheted the number of stitches required, pull the short bit of string to tighten the ring
- **SINGLE CROCHET (sc)** Insert your hook into a stitch, yarn over (I prefer to pull the yarn through with my hook on top of the yarn to create a X effect), pull the yarn through (two loops on the hook), yarn over once more and pull the yarn through both loops
- **DOUBLE CROCHET (dc)** Yarn over the hook before going into a stitch. Once you yarn over, insert your hook into the stitch, yarn over and pull through. You should have 3 loops on your hook. Yarn over and pull through 2 of the loops on your hook. Yarn over again, and pull through the remaining 2 loops.
- **SLIP ST (slst)** Put your hook through the stitch, yarn over, pull through the stitch, and then pull the yarn through the loop on your hook
- **INCREASE (inc / dc inc)** Work 2 single crochets / 2 double crochets into the same stitch
- **INV DECREASE (dec/ dc dec)** Insert your hook under the front loop of the first stitch, and then under the front loop of the second stitch. Yarn over and pull through both front loops. Yarn over and pull through the remaining loops. For a dc dec, yarn over, insert your hook under the front loop of the first stitch, and then under the front loop of the second stitch. Yarn over and pull through 2 of the loops on your hook. Yarn over once more and pull through the remaining 2 loops.
- **BACK LOOP ONLY (BLO)** Work the required stitch in the back loop only instead of both loops
- **FRONT LOOP ONLY (FLO)** Work the required stitch in the front loop only instead of both loops

### Construction:

- > The legs and arms must be made before making the body. Both the arms and legs will be crocheted into the body piece, with no requirement to sew.
- > Ears of the bunny are sewn on.
- > The body will require a 3.00mm hook to be used, all other pieces will require a 2.5mm.

**Skill level:** beginner-intermediate

**Size:** Ronnie baby bunny lovey measures approximately 27 cm // 11 inches lengthwise when made with the above materials.

## INSTRUCTIONS

USE A 2.5MM HOOK UNLESS STATED OTHERWISE

### HEAD

Use light grey

- Rnd 1: begin with a mr of 6 (6)
- Rnd 2: inc in all st (12)
- Rnd 3: (sc, inc in the next st) x6 (18)
- Rnd 4: (2 sc, inc in the next st) x6 (24)
- Rnd 5: (3 sc, inc in the next st) x6 (30)
- Rnd 6: (4 sc, inc in the next st) x6 (36)
- Rnd 7: (5 sc, inc in the next st) x6 (42)
- Rnd 8: (6 sc, inc in the next st) x6 (48)
- Rnd 9: (7 sc, inc in the next st) x6 (54)
- Rnd 10-18: sc in all st (54) 9 rounds
- Rnd 19: (17 sc, inc in the next st) x3 (57)
- Rnd 20: (18 sc, inc in the next st) x3 (60)
- Rnd 21-23: sc in all st (60) 3 rounds
- Rnd 24: (18 sc, dec) x3 (57)
- Rnd 25: (17 sc, dec) x3 (54)
- Rnd 26: (4 sc, dec) x9 (45)
- Rnd 27: (3 sc, dec) x9 (36)

Stuff the head and continue throughout. If you choose to use safety eyes, place them between rounds 18-19 with approximately 10 stitches between them (FIGURE 6). If you want to embroider your eyes, wait until the assembly stage.

- Rnd 28: 2 sc, dec, (4 sc, dec) x5, 2 sc (30)
- Rnd 29: (3 sc, dec) x6 (24)
- Rnd 30: sc, dec, (2 sc, dec) x5, sc (18)
- Rnd 31: working in the BLO, sc in all st (18)
- Rnd 32: (sc, dec) x6 (12)
- Rnd 33: dec x6 (6)

Add any additional stuffing you might need. Fasten off leaving a yarn tail. With your needle and the yarn tail, weave the yarn through the remaining front loops of round 33, and pull tight to close (FIGURES 1-3). Weave in the yarn tail.

### EARS (MAKE 2)

Use light grey

- Rnd 1: begin with a mr of 6 (6)
- Rnd 2: (sc, inc in the next st) x3 (9)
- Rnd 3-4: sc in all st (9) 2 rounds
- Rnd 5: (2 sc, inc in the next st) x3 (12)
- Rnd 6: sc in all st (12)
- Rnd 7: (sc, inc in the next st) x6 (18)
- Rnd 8: sc in all st (18)
- Rnd 9: (2 sc, inc in the next st) x6 (24)
- Rnd 10-17: sc in all st (24) 8 rounds

Flatten your work and sc through both sides of the work to close. The ears are not stuffed. Once the work is closed, fold the work in half, and sc through both sides again. Fasten off leaving a yarn tail for sewing. (FIGURES 4-5)

### CHEEKS (MAKE 2)

Use pink

- Rnd 1: begin with a mr of 6 (6)
  - Rnd 2: inc in all st (12)
- Fasten off leaving a yarn tail for sewing.



### ARMS (MAKE 2)

Use light grey

- Rnd 1: begin with a mr of 6 (6)
- Rnd 2: inc in all st (12)
- Rnd 3: (sc, inc in the next st) x6 (18)
- Rnd 4: sc in all st (18)
- Rnd 5: (sc, dec) x6 (12)
- Rnd 6-21: sc in all st (12) 16 rounds

Fasten off and weave in the yarn tail. Use the invisible way to fasten off\*. Stuff the arms lightly between rounds 1-7 and leave the remaining rounds free of filling.

\*Invisible method: Pull the yarn after completing round 21. With your needle, sew the yarn into the second stitch of round 21 - skipping one stitch. Then, insert the needle back into the middle of the stitch you started with (the last st of round 21). Pull slightly, then weave in the yarn tail. This will close off your work nicely. (FIGURES 7-9)

## LEGS (MAKE 2)

Use light grey

- Rnd 1: begin with a mr of 6 (6)
- Rnd 2: inc in all st (12)
- Rnd 3: (sc, inc in the next st) x6 (18)
- Rnd 4: (2 sc, inc in the next st) x6 (24)
- Rnd 5-11: sc in all st (24) 7 rounds
- Rnd 12: (6 sc, dec) x3 (21)
- Rnd 13: (5 sc, dec) x3 (18)
- Rnd 14: sc in all st (18)
- Rnd 15: (4 sc, dec) x3 (15)
- Rnd 16: (3 sc, dec) x3 (12)
- Rnd 17: 2 sc, (inc in the next st) x3, (dec) x3, sc (12)
- Rnd 18: 2 sc, (sc, inc in the next st) x3, (dec) x2 (13)
- Rnd 19-20: sc in all st (13) 2 rounds
- Rnd 21: 6 sc, dec, 5 sc (12)
- Rnd 22-23: sc in all st (12) 2 rounds
- Rnd 24: (4 sc, dec) x2 (10)

Fasten off and weave in the yarn tail - use the invisible method again (FIGURES 7-9). Stuff the legs between rounds 1-15 and leave the remaining rounds free of filling. Mark the inner curve of the leg on round 15 as we will refer to this point later (FIGURE 10).

## BODY

(MAKE SURE YOU HAVE COMPLETED THE ARMS AND LEGS BEFORE COMMENCING THE BODY)

Use light grey & a **3.00mm** hook

- Rnd 1: leave a long yarn tail at the start of your work as we will need it for sewing the body and the head together. The yarn tail will need to be on the correct side of your work (the side that you will see) so use a needle to thread it to the correct side, (FIGURE 11). Once you have a tail, begin with a mr of 6 (6)
- Rnd 2: inc in all st (12)
- Rnd 3: (sc, inc in the next st) x6 (18)
- Rnd 4: working in the BLO, sc in all st (18)  
*You will now continue to work with double crochets, and any increases will be a double crochet increase, and any decreases will be a double crochet decrease.*
- Rnd 5: 2 dc, inc in the next st, now we will attach the first arm. Hold the arm against the work, (FIGURE 12-13), (you want the arm to be closest to you, and the body work behind the arm), dc through both sides of the arm and into the next st of the body to join. Continue working into both the arm and the body work: dc, inc, dc in the next 2 st. You will now have the first arm completely joined, (FIGURES 14-15). Work the next stitches into the body piece only: inc in the next st, dc in the next 2 st, inc in the next st. Now we will join the second arm. Again, hold the arm against the body work, dc through both sides of the arm and into the next st of the body to join, continue: dc in the next st, inc in the next st, dc in the next 2 st. The second arm should now be joined, (FIGURE 16). Work the last st in the body only: inc (24)

## BODY CONTINUED. . .

- [Shortened version of round 5: (2 dc, inc in the next st) x6 (24)]
- Rnd 6: (3 dc, inc in the next st) x6 (30)
- Rnd 7: (4 dc, inc in the next st) x6 (36)
- Rnd 8: (5 dc, inc in the next st) x6 (42)
- Rnd 9: (6 dc, inc in the next st) x6 (48)
- Rnd 10-12: dc in all st (48) 3 rounds
- Rnd 13: (6 dc, dec) x6 (42)
- Rnd 14: (5 dc, dec) x6 (36)
- Rnd 15: (4 dc, dec) x5, 2 dc, dec. Stop the round here (30)

Flatten your work. You should be at the side of the work (in line with one of the arms), if you are not, dc additional/or less stitches to be at the side, whilst maintaining a stitch count of 30. (FIGURE 17). You will now attach the legs whilst simultaneously closing the work. Hold the first leg against the work, making sure the marked stitch with the curve of the leg is facing inwards towards the inner body, (FIGURE 18). Dc through both sides of the leg and into both sides of the body work. Repeat this 3 more times, so that you have worked 4 dc into both sides of the legs and body work, (FIGURES 19-21). The first leg is now attached. Work 6 dc into both sides of the body work only, (FIGURE 22).

**BODY CONTINUED. . .**

Now bring the second leg against the body work, again, with the marked stitch facing inwards, towards the inner body. Work the next dc through both sides of the leg and both sides of the body work, (FIGURE 23-24). Work the next 3 dc through both the leg and body, (FIGURE 25-26). You will now have attached both legs and closed the body work (FIGURE 27).

*Fasten off and weave in the yarn tail.*


## ASSEMBLY

Weave in all yarn tails as you go

**Ears to the head:** Pin the ears to the head between rounds 5-6 in line with the magic ring of the head, and sew on. (FIGURES 28-31)

**Embroidered eyes (if not using safety eyes):** Using black embroidery thread and a needle, embroider the eyes to the head onto round 18 with approximately 8 stitches between them. (USE FIGURE 37 AS AN EXAMPLE).

**Refer below for an example of the shaping.**



**Nose to the head:** Using dark grey yarn, embroider the nose between the eyes, between rounds 18-19 in a small triangle shape. (FIGURES 32-33)

**Eyebrows to the head:** Using black embroidery thread, sew eyebrows onto round 15, above the safety eyes, and across 2 stitches. If you choose to embroider your eyes, ignore sewing eyebrows. (FIGURES 32-34)

**Cheeks to the head:** Sew your cheeks to the sides of each eye. (FIGURE 34)

**Body to the head:** Using the yarn tail you kept at the start of the magic ring of the body, sew the head to the body. Line up the remaining FLO stitches of the body from round 4, and the FLO stitches of round 31 of the head, in order to join the pieces together (FIGURES 35-36).

...and that's it!

*Suggestion: If you do want to give your bunny a 'tail' you could always sew on a small pom pom to the back of the body!*

## NOTES FOR THE PATTERN

- Instructions are written in rounds & rows, using US terminology.
- Change colours when indicated using the invisible colour change method on the last stitch before the new colour.
- The number of stitches you should have at the end of each round is written in the brackets like so, (20).
- Make sure you pull your stitches tight and always use a stitch marker, or a piece of string, to mark the start of each round.
- Most importantly, have fun whilst crocheting this pattern, and feel free to reach out if you have any issues along the way.

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## WHAT YOU WILL NEED

I have used DMC natura just cotton with the colours:

- 083 · Ble · yellow (1x 50g ball)
- 044 · Agatha · dark grey (1 x 50g ball)
- 087 · Glacier · light blue (1 x 50g ball)
- 079 · Tilleul · light green (less than 25g)

For the honey jar:

- 037 · Canelle · gold (less than 25g)
- 082 · Lobelia · rose (less than 25g)
- 001 · Ibiza · white (less than 25g)
- Black embroidery thread
- A 2.25 mm crochet hook
- Safety eyes (8 mm)
- Toy stuffing
- Yarn needle
- Stitch Markers
- Pins
- Scissors
- Small piece of cardboard

*You can use any yarn of your choice, just adjust your crochet hook according to the yarn.*

**SLIP ST (slst)** Put your hook through the stitch, yarn over, pull through the stitch, and then pull the yarn through the loop on your hook

**INCREASE (inc / dc inc)** Work 2 single crochets / or 2 double crochets into the same stitch

**INV DECREASE (dec)** Insert your hook under the front loop of the first stitch, and then under the front loop of the second stitch. Yarn over and pull through both front loops. Yarn over and pull through the remaining loops

**HALF DOUBLE CROCHET (hdc)** Yarn over the hook before going into a stitch. Once you yarn over, insert your hook into the stitch, yarn over and pull through. You should have 3 loops on your hook. Yarn over and pull through all 3 loops on the hook.

**BACK LOOP ONLY (BLO)** Work the required stitch in the back loop of the stitch and not both loops

**FRONT LOOP ONLY (FLO)** Work the required stitch in the front of the stitch and not both loops

## Construction:

> The legs are made as separate pieces, which are then joined together to form the body.

> All other pieces are sewn on.

**Skill level:** beginner-intermediate

**Size:** Bumble measures 20 cm / 8 inches when made with the above materials.

# Instructions

## HEAD

Use yellow

- Rnd 1: start with a mr of 6 (6)
- Rnd 2: inc in all st (12)
- Rnd 3: (sc, inc in the next st) x6 (18)
- Rnd 4: (2 sc, inc in the next st) x6 (24)
- Rnd 5: (3 sc, inc in the next st) x6 (30)
- Rnd 6: (4 sc, inc in the next st) x6 (36)
- Rnd 7: (5 sc, inc in the next st) x6 (42)
- Rnd 8: (6 sc, inc in the next st) x6 (48)
- Rnd 9: (7 sc, inc in the next st) x6 (54)
- Rnd 10: (8 sc, inc in the next st) x6 (60)
- Rnd 11-17: sc in all st (60) 7 rounds
- Rnd 18: (14 sc, inc in the next st) x4 (64)
- Rnd 19-24: sc in all st (64) 6 rounds
- Rnd 25: (14 sc, dec) x4 (60)
- Rnd 26: 4 sc, dec, (8 sc, dec) x5, 4 sc (54)
- Rnd 27: (7 sc, dec) x6 (48)
- Rnd 28: 3 sc, dec, (6 sc, dec) x5, 3 sc (42)

Insert your safety eyes between rounds 19-20, approximately 12 stitches apart. Using black embroidery thread, sew eyebrows above the eyes across 2 stitches on round 17. Weave in the thread tail once complete. Stuff the head, and continue throughout. **FIGURES 1 & 2**

- Rnd 29: (5 sc, dec) x6 (36)
- Rnd 30: 2 sc, dec, (4 sc, dec) x5, 2 sc (30)
- Rnd 31: (3 sc, dec) x6 (24)

Fasten off and weave in the yarn tail. Add more stuffing if required.

## NOSE

Use dark grey

- Row 1: start with a ch of 4. Working in the second ch from the hook, inc, sc, 3 sc into the last ch, turn your work slightly so you can work on the other side of the ch, 2 sc (8)

Fasten off leaving a yarn tail for sewing.

## ANTENNAE (MAKE 2)

Use dark grey

- Rnd 1: start with a mr of 6 (6)
- Rnd 2: inc in all st (12)
- Rnd 3: sc in all st (12)
- Rnd 4: (sc, inc in the next st) x6 (18)
- Rnd 5-6: sc in all st (18) 2 rounds
- Rnd 7: (sc, dec) x6 (12)
- Rnd 8: sc in all st (12)
- Rnd 9: (2 sc, dec) x3 (9)
- Rnd 10-11: sc in all st (9) 2 rounds

Stuff the antennae. Fasten off leaving a yarn tail for sewing.

## LEGS (MAKE 2)

Use yellow. You will create two legs which are then joined together to form the body.

Leg 1:

- Rnd 1: start with a mr of 6 (6)
- Rnd 2: inc in all st (12)
- Rnd 3: (sc, inc in the next st) x6 (18)
- Rnd 4: (2 sc, inc in the next st) x6 (24)
- Rnd 5: (3 sc, inc in the next st) x6 (30)
- Rnd 6-7: sc in all st (30) 2 rounds
- Rnd 8: (4 sc, dec) x5 (25)
- Rnd 9: sc in all st (25)
- Rnd 10: (3 sc, dec) x5 (20)
- Rnd 11: 4 sc, (dec) x3, 10 sc (17)
- Rnd 12: 4 sc, dec, 11 sc (16)
- Rnd 13: 3 sc, (inc in the next st) x4, 9 sc (20)
- Rnd 14: 3 sc, (sc, inc in the next st) x4, 9 sc (24)
- Rnd 15: sc in all st (24)
- Rnd 16: (3 sc, inc in the next st) x6 (30)
- Rnd 17: (4 sc, inc in the next st) x6 (36)

Stuff the leg. Mark the 14th st of round 17 as we will refer to this stitch later when joining the legs. Fasten off and weave in the yarn tail.

Leg 2:

- Rnd 1-17: as per above. Stuff the leg, but do not fasten off, instead, continue:
- Rnd 18: 12 sc, now, sc into the marked stitch of leg 1 to join them **FIGURES 3 & 4**. Continue working into leg 1 with an additional 35 sc, work the next sc back into leg 2 in the next available stitch (the 13th stitch), then work an additional 24 sc back to where you started. (72)

Your legs should now be joined together, and we will continue to form the body.

**Tip:** Once the body is formed, you may find there are gaps between the legs. Use a scrap piece of yarn in yellow to sew together any gaps formed, and weave in the yarn tail.

## BODY

*Continue with yellow*

**Rnd 19:** (10 sc, dec) x6 (66)

**Rnd 20:** sc in all st (66) *change to dark grey on the last st of the rnd*

**Rnd 21:** (9 sc, dec) x6 (60)

**Rnd 22:** sc in all st (60)

**Rnd 23:** (8 sc, dec) x6 (54)

**Rnd 24:** sc in all st (54)

**Rnd 25:** (7 sc, dec) x6 (48) *change to yellow on the last st of the rnd*

**Rnd 26-28:** sc in all st (48) 3 rounds

**Rnd 29:** (10 sc, dec) x4 (44)

**Rnd 30:** sc in all st (44) *change to dark grey on the last st of the rnd*

**Rnd 31:** sc in all st (44)

**Rnd 32:** (9 sc, dec) x4 (40)

*Stuff the body and continue throughout.*

**Rnd 33:** sc in all st (40)

**Rnd 34:** (8 sc, dec) x4 (36)

**Rnd 35:** sc in all st (36) *change to yellow on the last st of the rnd*

**Rnd 36:** sc in all st (36)

**Rnd 37:** (7 sc, dec) x4 (32)

**Rnd 38:** sc in all st (32)

**Rnd 39:** (6 sc, dec) x4 (28)

**Rnd 40:** (5 sc, dec) x4 (24)

*Fasten off, leaving a yarn tail for sewing. Add any additional stuffing.*

## ARMS (MAKE 2)

*Use yellow*

**Rnd 1:** start with a mr of 6 (6)

**Rnd 2:** inc in all st (12)

**Rnd 3:** (2 sc, inc in the next st) x4 (16)

**Rnd 4-6:** sc in all st (16) 3 rounds

**Rnd 7:** (2 sc, dec) x4 (12)

**Rnd 8-9:** sc in all st (12) 2 rounds

**Rnd 10:** (4 sc, dec) x2 (10)

**Rnd 11-20:** sc in all st (10) 10 rounds

*The arms are not stuffed. Flatten the work and sc through both sides to close. Leave a yarn tail for sewing.*

## WINGS (MAKE 2)

*Use light blue*

**Rnd 1:** start with a mr of 6 (6)

**Rnd 2:** inc in all st (12)

**Rnd 3:** (sc, inc in the next st) x6 (18)

**Rnd 4:** (2 sc, inc in the next st) x6 (24)

**Rnd 5:** (3 sc, inc in the next st) x6 (30)

**Rnd 6-7:** sc in all st (30) 2 rounds

**Rnd 8:** (4 sc, inc in the next st) x6 (36)

**Rnd 9-10:** sc in all st (36) 2 rounds

**Rnd 11:** (5 sc, inc in the next st) x6 (42)

**Rnd 12-14:** sc in all st (42) 3 rounds

**Rnd 15:** (12 sc, dec) x3 (39)

**Rnd 16:** sc in all st (39)

**Rnd 17:** (11 sc, dec) x3 (36)

**Rnd 18:** sc in all st (36)

**Rnd 19:** (10 sc, dec) x3 (33)

**Rnd 20:** (9 sc, dec) x3 (30)

**Rnd 21:** (3 sc, dec) x6 (24)

**Rnd 22:** (2 sc, dec) x6 (18)

**Rnd 23:** (sc, dec) x6 (12)

*The wings are not stuffed. Flatten the work and sc through both sides to close. Leave a long yarn tail. With your needle and yarn tail, pinch the two sides of the closing stitches and sew the two sides together to pinch the wing. Keep the yarn tail for sewing. FIGURES 5 & 6*

## STINGER

*Use dark grey*

**Rnd 1:** start with a mr of 6 (6)

**Rnd 2:** sc in all st (6)

**Rnd 3:** (sc, inc in the next st) x3 (9)

**Rnd 4-5:** sc in all st (9) 2 rounds

*The stinger is not stuffed. Fasten off leaving a yarn tail for sewing.*

## LEAF HEADBAND

*Use light green. Start with a ch of 60. Form a circle with your work and slst to the beginning ch to join. Make sure your chain isn't twisted.*

**Row 1:** (sc, ch 3, sc, ch 4) x30

*Fasten off and weave in the yarn tail.*

# Assembly

Weave in all yarn tails as you go.

**Antennae to the head:** Sew the antennae between rounds 5-6 and 8-9 of the head. They should sit slightly above the magic ring towards the front of the head, and in line with the eyes. **FIGURES 7-10**

**Nose to the head:** Sew the nose across rounds 20-22, between each eye. Using black embroidery thread, sew a line down from the nose to round 24. **FIGURE 11**

**Body to the head:** Sew the open parts of the body and head together. Make sure you are happy with the stuffing before completing. **FIGURES 12 & 13**

**Arms to the body:** Sew the arms to the body between rounds 39-40. The arms should sit slightly behind the antennae when looking at the arms from the side. **FIGURES 14, 15, & 16**

**Wings to the body:** Sew the wings next to each arm, between rounds 39-40. Make sure you only sew the pinched tip of each wing to the body, and leave the rest. **FIGURES 14, 15 & 16**

**Stinger to the body:** Sew the stinger to the back of the body between rounds 21-22 & 23-24. The stinger should sit in the middle of the two legs. **FIGURE 17**

# Bumble's Honey Jar

## JAR

Use gold

**Rnd 1:** start with a mr of 6 (6)

**Rnd 2:** inc in all st (12)

**Rnd 3:** (sc, inc in the next st) x6 (18)

**Rnd 4:** (2 sc, inc in the next st) x6 (24)

**Rnd 5:** (3 sc, inc in the next st) x6 (30)

**Rnd 6:** ch 1, working in the BLO, sc in all st (30)

**Rnd 7:** ignore the ch 1 from the previous round, sc in all st (30)

**Rnd 8-13:** sc in all st (30) 6 rounds

*Cut out a small piece of cardboard and place it inside the jar so it sits on the base of the work. This will help the jar maintain its shape. If you plan on washing this item, I recommend you use plastic or don't add it. Stuff the work and continue throughout. **FIGURE 18***

**Rnd 14:** (8 sc, dec) x3 (27) change to white on the last st of the rnd

**Rnd 15:** (7 sc, dec) x3 (24)

**Rnd 16:** working in the BLO, sc in all st (24)

**Rnd 17:** (2 sc, dec) x6 (18)

**Rnd 18:** (sc, dec) x6 (12)

**Rnd 19:** dec x6 (6)

*Fasten off leaving a small yarn tail. With your needle and yarn tail, weave the yarn through the front loops of the remaining stitches, and pull tight to close. Weave in the yarn tail.*

## JAR FRILLS

Use white

With the base of the jar facing away from you, reattach your white yarn to the last front loop of round 16.

**FIGURE 19.** Once attached, sc in the same stitch where you just joined the yarn, then complete 3 hdc into the next st, sc, slst. Continue this pattern through the front loops: (sc, 3 hdc into the same st, sc, slst) x6 (total times).

*Slst to the beginning sc, fasten off and weave in the yarn tail.*

## DECORATION IDEAS:

Weave rose yarn above the stitches of the frill, and tie together to add some detail **FIGURE 20**. Embroider the word 'honey' onto the jar. **FIGURE 21**

## NOTES FOR THE PATTERN

- Instructions are written in rounds & rows, using US terminology.
- Change colours when indicated using the invisible colour change method on the last stitch before the new colour
- The number of stitches you should have at the end of each round is written in the brackets like so, (20).
- Make sure you pull your stitches tight and always use a stitch marker, or piece of string, to mark the start of each round
- Most importantly, have fun whilst crocheting this pattern, and feel free to reach out if you have any issues along the way.

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## WHAT YOU WILL NEED

I have used DMC Natura Just cotton yarn with the colours:

- 001 - Ibiza - white (1x 50g ball)
- 083 - Ble - yellow (less than 25g)
- 081 - Acanthe - light orange (less than 25g )
- 056 - Azur - dark blue (less than 25g)
- 087 - Glacier - light blue (less than 25g)
- 003 - Sable - light grey (less than 25g)
- 078 - Lin - dark grey (less than 25g)
- 037- Canelle - gold (less than 25g)
- 014 - Natura "Yummy" Ixoxia - salmon (less than 25g)
- Black embroidery thread
- A 2.25 mm crochet hook
- Safety eyes (8 mm)
- Toy stuffing
- Yarn needle
- Stitch Markers
- Pins
- Scissors

*You can use any yarn of your choice, just adjust your crochet hook according to the yarn fibre.*

## CROCHET TERMS USED // ABBREVIATIONS GUIDE (US TERMINOLOGY):

**Below are basic explanations of the crochet terms used in this pattern.**

**CHAIN (ch)** With a loop on your hook, yarn over from back to front and pull the loop through

**STITCH (st)**

**MAGIC RING (mr)** Wrap yarn over two fingers twice forming an X. Place the hook under the first piece of yarn and then over the second piece of yarn. Pull the outer strand of yarn under the first strand of the X forming a loop. Yarn over once more and draw the yarn through both loops. Work the appropriate number of stitches into the loop by inserting the hook into the main circle space onto the other side, yarning over and pulling through the space in the middle, yarn over the hook and pull through both loops on the hook. Once you have crocheted the number of stitches required, pull the short bit of string to tighten the ring

**SINGLE CROCHET (sc)** Insert your hook into a stitch, yarn over (I prefer to pull the yarn through with my hook on top of the yarn to create a X effect), pull the yarn through (two loops on the hook), yarn over once more and pull yarn through both loops

**SLIP ST (slst)** Put your hook through the stitch, yarn over, pull through the stitch, and then pull the yarn through the loop on your hook

**INCREASE (inc/ hdc inc)** Work 2 single crochets / or 2 half double crochets in the same stitch

**INV DECREASE (dec)** Insert your hook under the front loop of the first stitch, and then under the front loop of the second stitch. Yarn over and pull through both front loops. Yarn over and pull through the remaining loops

**HALF DOUBLE CROCHET (hdc)** Yarn over the hook before going into a stitch. Once you yarn over, insert your hook into the stitch, yarn over and pull through. You should have 3 loops on your hook. Yarn over and pull through all 3 loops on the hook.

**DOUBLE CROCHET (dc)** Yarn over the hook before going into a stitch. Once you yarn over, insert your hook into the stitch, yarn over and pull through. You should have 3 loops on your hook. Yarn over and pull through 2 of the loops. Yarn over once more and pull through the remaining 2 loops.

**BACK LOOP ONLY (BLO)** Complete the required stitch in the back loop only of the next stitch instead of both top loops.

**FRONT LOOP ONLY (FLO)** Complete the required stitch in the front loop only of the next stitch instead of both top loops.

## Construction:

- > The head and body are worked in one piece.
- > The toes and legs are made separately, but will be assembled together
- > All other pieces of the seagull are made separate and are sewn on
- > Accessories are not sewn on

**Skill level:** beginner-intermediate

**Size:** Chip measures approximately 19 cm // 7.5 inches, when made with the above materials.

- Rnd 1: start with a mr of 6 (6)
- Rnd 2: inc in all st (12)
- Rnd 3: (sc, inc in the next st) x6 (18)
- Rnd 4: sc, inc in the next st, (2 sc, inc in the next st) x5, sc (24)
- Rnd 5: (3 sc, inc in the next st) x6 (30)
- Rnd 6: 2 sc, inc in the next st, (4 sc, inc in the next st) x5, 2 sc (36)
- Rnd 7: (5 sc, inc in the next st) x6 (42)
- Rnd 8: 3 sc, inc in in the next st, (6 sc, inc in the next st) x5, 3 sc (48)
- Rnd 9: (7 sc, inc in the next st) x6 (54)
- Rnd 10-24: sc in all st (54) 15 rounds
- Rnd 25: (7 sc, dec) x6 (48)
- Rnd 26: 3 sc, dec, (6 sc, dec) x5, 3 sc (42)
- Rnd 27: (5 sc, dec) x6 (36)
- Rnd 28: 6 sc, (2 sc, dec) x6, 6 sc (30)
- Rnd 29: 6 sc, (sc, dec) x6, 6 sc (24)
- Rnd 30-31: sc in all st (24) 2 rounds
- Rnd 32: (3 sc, inc in the next st) x6 (30)
- Rnd 33: 2 sc, inc in the next st, (4 sc, inc in the next st) x6, 2 sc (36)
- Rnd 34: (5 sc, inc in the next st) x6 (42)
- Rnd 35-36: sc in all st (42) 2 rounds
- Rnd 37: 2 sc, ch 11, working in the second ch from the hook, inc, sc 9 back down the ch, slst into the same st where you made the ch from, sc in the next st, inc in the next st, (6 sc, inc in the next st) x5, 3 sc - instead of finishing the round here, we will continue onwards, 2 sc, we will now work on the other side of the ch, sc 9, inc in the last ch (70) (this is the end of the round now, the next st will mark the start of the new round) *(Note: the slst does not count as a stitch)*



## BODY- CONTINUE ONWARDS FROM THE HEAD

- Rnd 38: (inc in the next st) x2, 66 sc, (inc in the next st) x2 (74) *(Note: do not work into the slst from the previous round)*
- Rnd 39: (sc, inc in the next st) x2, 66 sc, (sc, inc in the next st) x2 (78)
- Rnd 40- 49: sc in all st (78) 10 rounds

Place your safety eyes between rounds 16-17, approximately 7 sts apart. **FIGURE 4** Make sure the eyes are placed in the opposite direction to the tail. **FIGURE 3** Using black embroidery thread, sew some eyebrows above the eyes diagonally. Stuff the head, and continue to stuff the body throughout.

- Rnd 50: (11 sc, dec) x6 (72)
- Rnd 51: 5 sc, dec, (10 sc, dec) x5, 5 sc (66)
- Rnd 52: (9 sc, dec) x6 (60)
- Rnd 53: 4 sc, dec, (8 sc, dec) x5, 4 sc (54)
- Rnd 54: (7 sc, dec) x6 (48)
- Rnd 55: 3 sc, dec, (6 sc, dec) x5, 3 sc (42)
- Rnd 56: (5 sc, dec) x6 (36)
- Rnd 57: 2 sc, dec, (4 sc, dec) x5, 2 sc (30) *Make sure you continue to stuff the work*
- Rnd 58: (3 sc, dec) x6 (24)
- Rnd 59: sc, dec, (2 sc, dec) x5, sc (18)
- Rnd 60: (sc, dec) x6 (12)
- Rnd 61: dec x6 (6)

Fasten off leaving a small yarn tail. Using your needle, weave the yarn tail through the remaining front loops and pull tight to close. Weave in the yarn tail.

**WINGS - (MAKE 2)***Begin with dark grey*

- Rnd 1:** start with a mr of 6 (6)  
**Rnd 2:** (sc, inc in the next st) x3 (9)  
**Rnd 3:** (2 sc, inc in the next st) x3 (12)  
**Rnd 4:** sc in all st (12)  
**Rnd 5:** (3 sc, inc in the next st) x3 (15)  
**Rnd 6-7:** sc in all st (15) 2 rounds  
**Rnd 8:** (4 sc, inc in the next st) x3 (18)  
**Rnd 9:** sc, inc in the next st, (2 sc, inc in the next st) x5, sc (24)  
**Rnd 10:** (3 sc, inc in the next st) x6 (30)  
**Rnd 11:** sc in all st (30)  
**Rnd 12:** in the BLO, sc in all st (30) *change to light grey on the last st of the rnd*  
**Rnd 13:** in the BLO, sc in all st (30)  
**Rnd 14:** 2 sc, inc in the next st, (4 sc, inc in the next st) x5, 2 sc (36)  
**Rnd 15-17:** sc in all st (36) 3 rounds  
**Rnd 18:** 2 sc, dec, (4 sc, dec) x5, 2 sc (30)  
**Rnd 19:** (3 sc, dec) x6 (24)  
**Rnd 20:** sc in all st (24)  
**Rnd 21:** sc, dec, (2 sc, dec) x5, sc (18)  
**Rnd 22:** sc in all st (18)  
**Rnd 23:** (sc, dec) x6 (12)  
**Rnd 24:** dec x6 (6)

*Fasten off leaving a tail for sewing. The wings are not stuffed. With your sewing needle, weave the yarn tail through the remaining FLO stitches and pull tight to close. Keep the yarn tail for sewing the wing to the body.*

**To create the wing details:**

With your dark grey yarn, and the top of the wing facing away from you (light grey away from you, dark grey closest to you), reattach the yarn to the first FLO stitch of round 12. Once attached, ch 3 and slst into the next st. Continue, (ch 3, slst in the next st) for the remainder of round 12. Do not continue onto round 13, fasten off and weave in your yarn end. **FIGURES 5 & 6**

With your light grey yarn, and the top of the wing facing away from you, reattach the yarn to the first FLO stitch of round 13. In this same stitch, sc, then continue, hdc in the next st, 2 dc into the next st, hdc in the next st, sc in the next st, slst in the next st. Complete this pattern (sc, hdc, 2x dc in the same st, hdc, sc, slst) for a total of 5 times. Slst to the beginning st and fasten off. Weave in the yarn tail. **FIGURES 7 & 8**

**HAIR FLUFF***Use dark grey*

- Row 1:** Make a ch of 6. Working in the second ch from the hook, slst back down the ch (5) once you are back to the start, ch 6 again, and working in the second ch from the hook, slst back down to where you began the second ch from (5). Once you have done this, slst into the very first ch you started with.

*Fasten off leaving a tail for sewing.*

**BEAK***Use yellow*

- Rnd 1:** start with a mr of 6 (6)  
**Rnd 2:** sc in all st (6)  
**Rnd 3:** (sc, inc in the next st) x3 (9)  
**Rnd 4:** sc in all st (9)  
**Rnd 5:** (2 sc, inc in the next st) x3 (12)  
**Rnd 6:** sc in all st (12)  
**Rnd 7:** (3 sc, inc in the next st) x3 (15)  
**Rnd 8:** sc in all st (15)  
**Rnd 9:** (4 sc, inc in the next st) x3 (18)  
**Rnd 10:** sc in all st (18)

*Fasten off leaving a tail for sewing. Stuff the beak lightly.*

## LEGS & FEET

Use light orange for all parts

### Leg (make 2)

**Rnd 1:** start with a mr of 6 (6)

**Rnd 2:** inc in all st (12)

**Rnd 3:** in the BLO, sc in all st (12)

**Rnd 4-17:** sc in all st (12) 14 rounds

*Fasten off and leave a yarn tail for sewing. Stuff the leg firmly.*

### Toes (make 3)

*\*Each foot consists of 3 toes that are joined together. For the first 2 toes you make, fasten off and weave in the yarn tail. For the 3rd toe, you will not fasten off, instead you will follow the foot instructions.*

**Rnd 1:** start with a mr of 5 (5)

**Rnd 2:** inc in all st (10)

**Rnd 3-4:** sc in all st (10) 2 rounds

*Fasten off and weave in the yarn tail. For the 3rd piece, do not fasten off, instead, continue onto the foot instructions below.*

### Foot

*You will now join the 3 toes together to make the foot.*

**Rnd 1:** With one of the toes still on your hook (the 3rd toe), sc into the first loose toe to join them together, then sc an additional 4 stitches (5 in total) **FIGURE 9** Pick up the second loose toe, and sc into it, to join together. Then sc around the toe with another 9 sc (10 in total). **FIGURE 10** You will then work into the back of the middle toe, with 5 sc, then sc 10 into the first toe you started with (5 + 10 + 5 + 10 = 30)

**Rnd 2:** (4 sc, dec) x5 (25)

**Rnd 3:** (3 sc, dec) x5 (20)

**Rnd 4:** (2 sc, dec) x5 (15)

**Rnd 5:** (sc, dec) x5 (10)

**Rnd 6:** dec x6 (5)

*Fasten off leaving a yarn tail. Weave your needle and yarn tail through the FLO of the remaining stitches, and pull tight to close. **FIGURE 11** The foot is not stuffed. Bring your yarn tail to the side of the work as we will use that yarn tail to sew the leg to the foot.*

Complete the instructions for the toes and feet again to make the second completed foot.

### Assembly of the legs & feet:

Pin the leg to the last several rounds of the foot, with the toes facing away from the leg. Using the yarn tail from the foot, and the remaining FLO sts of the leg (rnd 3), sew the two pieces together. Weave in your yarn tail once complete. **FIGURE 12**

## TAIL FEATHERS (MAKE 2)

Use dark grey

**Row 1:** make a ch of 7. Working in the second ch from the hook, sc 6 (6) ch 1 and turn

**Row 2:** dec, sc 4 (5) ch 1 and turn

**Row 3:** dec, sc 3 (4) ch 1 and turn

**Row 4-5:** sc in all st (4) ch 1 and turn, 2 rounds

**Row 6:** dec, sc 2 (3) ch 1 and turn

**Row 7:** dec, sc (2) ch1 and turn

**Row 8:** sc in all st (2) ch 1 and don't turn the work. Instead, create a border by sc around the edges of your work. It doesn't matter how many sc you work to create your border, so long as it is consistent between each feather.

*Fasten off and leave a yarn tail once complete.*

## SCARF

Use light blue

**Row 1:** start with a chain of 86. Working in the third ch from the hook, hdc into each ch across (84) ch 1 and turn

**Row 2:** hdc into each st (84)

*Fasten off and weave in the yarn tails.*

## HAT

Use dark blue

**Rnd 1:** start with a mr of 6 (6)

**Rnd 2:** inc in all st (12)

**Rnd 3:** (sc, inc in the next st) x6 (18)

**Rnd 4:** sc, inc in the next st, (2 sc, inc in the next st) x5, sc (24)

**Rnd 5:** (3 sc, inc in the next st) x6 (30)

**Rnd 6:** 2 sc, inc in the next st, (4 sc, inc in the next st) x5, 2 sc (36)

**Rnd 7:** (5 sc, inc in the next st) x6 (42)

**Rnd 8:** 3 sc, inc in in the next st, (6 sc, inc in the next st) x5, 3 sc (48)

**Rnd 9:** (7 sc, inc in the next st) x6 (54)

**Rnd 10:** 4 sc, inc in in the next st, (8 sc, inc in the next st) x5, 4 sc (60)

**Rnd 11:** in the FLO, sc in all st (60)

**Rnd 12-14:** sc in all st (60) 3 rounds

**Rnd 15:** (9 sc, inc in the next st) x6 (66)

**Rnd 16:** sc in all st (66)

**Rnd 17:** 5 sc, inc in in the next st, (10 sc, inc in the next st) x5, 5 sc (72)

**Rnd 18-20:** sc in all st (72) 3 rounds

**Rnd 21-22:** in the FLO, sc in all st (72) 2 rounds

**Rnd 23:** sc in all st (72)

**Rnd 24:** (5 sc, inc in the next st) x12 (84)

**Rnd 25:** sc in all st (84)

**Rnd 26:** slst in all sts (84)

*Fasten off and weave in the yarn tail.*

## BAG

Use gold

**Rnd 1:** start with a ch of 11. Working in the second ch from the hook, inc, 8 sc, 4 sc into the last ch, turn you work around so you can work on the other side of the ch, 8 sc, inc in the last ch (24)

**Rnd 2:** (inc in the next st) x2, 8 sc, (inc in the next st) x4, 8 sc, (inc in the next st) x2 (32)

**Rnd 3-10:** sc in all st (32) 8 rounds

**Rnd 11:** (6 sc, dec) x4 (28)

**Rnd 12:** (5 sc, dec) x4 (24)

**Rnd 13:** 2 sc. Stop the round here- you should be at one side of the bag- if not, sc any amount of stitches to get you to the side of the bag. **FIGURE 13**

We will now form the handle of the bag.

Ch 55, then insert your hook into a stitch on the opposite side of the bag to attach the chain, and slst. I had 11 unworked stitches on either side of the bag. Rotate your work round slightly so that you can now sc back down the ch to the other side, and slst back into the starting st where you begun the chain. **FIGURE 14**

*Fasten off and weave in the yarn tail.*

## FRIES (MAKE 4)

Use yellow

**Row 1:** ch 16, working in the third ch from the hook, hdc in the next 10 ch (14)

*Fasten off and weave in the yarn end.* **FIGURE 15**

## FISH

Use salmon

**Rnd 1:** start with a mr of 5 (5)

**Rnd 2:** inc in all st (10)

**Rnd 3-8:** sc in all st (10) 6 rounds

**Rnd 9:** dec in all st (5)

**Rnd 10:** Flatten the sides and work 2 sc through both sides to close the work. The fish is not stuffed. Ch 1 and turn (this ch1 will not count for the next ch instruction).

**Rnd 11:** (Ch 5 and slst in the next st) x2

*Fasten off and weave in the yarn tail.* **FIGURE 15**

# Assembly

**Beak:** Pin the beak between rounds 17-18 & 22-23. The beak should sit between the eyes. Sew it in place. Weave in the yarn tail once complete. **FIGURES 16 & 17**

**Head Fluff:** Pin the fluff just in front of the magic ring facing towards the beak. Sew it in place, and weave in the yarn tail once complete. **FIGURES 16 & 17**

**Legs:** Pin the legs on either side of the closing ring of the body. They should sit between rounds 55-60, and remain in line with each other. Your seagull should be able to stand unaided when positioned correctly. If you need to make the legs more stable, you can add more stuffing, or use pipe cleaners. Weave in your yarn tail once complete. **FIGURES 18-21**

**Wings:** Position the wings on either side of the body, slightly in front of the legs and almost in line with the head fluff. The tip of the light grey part of the wing should be positioned between rounds 40-41 of the body, with the top curve sitting near round 38, and the lowest part of the wing curve at round 51. Only sew a few stitches of the wings' curve and leave the rest (where the dotted lines are in **FIGURE 23**). Make sure that both wings are lined equally - it helps to look down on your seagull from above to see how even they are. Weave in your yarn tail once complete. **FIGURES 22-23**

**Tail Feathers:** Pin each of the tail feathers at the end of the body between rounds 38-39 and in a 'V' shape. The last row of the feather will be sewn to the body, with row 1 facing outwards. Sew them on, ensuring that you only sew a few stitches to the body and leave the rest so they remain loose. Weave in the yarn tail once complete. **FIGURE 24**

**Accessories & Blush:** Using makeup, add some blush to either side of the eyes for extra detail. Add the fries and fish to the bag. Place the bag across the seagull's body, and under one of the wings. Place the hat onto the head, and wrap the scarf around the seagull's neck. **FIGURES 16 & 25**



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## NOTES FOR THE PATTERN

- Instructions are written in rounds & rows, using US terminology.
- The number of stitches you should have at the end of each round is written in the brackets like so, (20).
- Make sure you pull your stitches tight and always use a stitch marker, or a piece of string, to mark the start of each round.
- Most importantly, have fun whilst crocheting this pattern, and feel free to reach out if you have any issues along the way.

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## WHAT YOU WILL NEED

I have used DMC natura just cotton with the colours:

- 044 - Agatha - dark grey (1x 50g ball)
- 082 - Lobelia - light pink (1 x 50g ball)
- 052 - Geranium - dark pink (1 x 50g ball)
- 035 - Nacar- off white (less than 25g)

For the flower:

- 083 - Ble - yellow (less than 25g)
- 079 - Tilleul - light green (less than 25g)
- 001 - Ibiza - white (less than 25g)

- Black embroidery thread
- A 2.25 mm crochet hook
- Safety eyes (8 mm)
- Toy stuffing
- Yarn needle
- Stitch Markers
- Pins
- Scissors

*You can use any yarn of your choice, just adjust your crochet hook according to the yarn.*

## CROCHET TERMS USED // ABBREVIATIONS GUIDE (US TERMINOLOGY):

**Below are basic explanations of the crochet terms used in this pattern.**

**CHAIN (ch)** With a loop on your hook, yarn over from back to front and pull the loop through

**STITCH (st)**

**MAGIC RING (mr)** Wrap yarn over two fingers twice forming an X. Place the hook under the first piece of yarn and then over the second piece of yarn. Pull the outer strand of yarn under the first strand of the X forming a loop. Yarn over once more and draw the yarn through both loops. Work the appropriate number of stitches into the loop by inserting the hook into the main circle space onto the other side, yarning over and pulling through the space in the middle, yarn over the hook and pull through both loops on the hook. Once you have crocheted the number of stitches required, pull the short bit of string to tighten the ring

**SINGLE CROCHET (sc)** Insert your hook into a stitch, yarn over (I prefer to pull the yarn through with my hook on top of the yarn to create a X effect), pull the yarn through (two loops on the hook), yarn over once more and pull the yarn through both loops

**SLIP ST (slst)** Put your hook through the stitch, yarn over, pull through the stitch, and then pull the yarn through the loop on your hook

**INCREASE (inc / dc inc)** Work 2 single crochets / or 2 double crochets into the same stitch

**INV DECREASE (dec)** Insert your hook under the front loop of the first stitch, and then under the front loop of the second stitch. Yarn over and pull through both front loops. Yarn over and pull through the remaining loops

**HALF DOUBLE CROCHET (hdc)** Yarn over the hook before going into a stitch. Once you yarn over, insert your hook into the stitch, yarn over and pull through. You should have 3 loops on your hook. Yarn over and pull through all 3 loops on the hook.

**DOUBLE CROCHET (dc)** Yarn over the hook before going into a stitch. Once you yarn over, insert your hook into the stitch, yarn over and pull through. You should have 3 loops on your hook. Yarn over and pull through 2 of the loops. Yarn over once more and pull through the remaining 2 loops.

**BACK LOOP ONLY (BLO)** Work the required stitch in the back loop of the stitch and not both loops

### Construction:

> The legs are made as separate pieces, which are then joined together to form the body.

> All other pieces are sewn on.

**Skill level:** beginner-intermediate

**Size:** Cleo measures 20 cm / 8 inches when made with the above materials.

## HEAD

Use dark grey

- Rnd 1: start with a mr of 6 (6)
- Rnd 2: inc in all st (12)
- Rnd 3: (sc, inc in the next st) x6 (18)
- Rnd 4: (2 sc, inc in the next st) x6 (24)
- Rnd 5: (3 sc, inc in the next st) x6 (30)
- Rnd 6: (4 sc, inc in the next st) x6 (36)
- Rnd 7: (5 sc, inc in the next st) x6 (42)
- Rnd 8: (6 sc, inc in the next st) x6 (48)
- Rnd 9: (7 sc, inc in the next st) x6 (54)
- Rnd 10: (8 sc, inc in the next st) x6 (60)
- Rnd 11-17: sc in all st (60) 7 rounds
- Rnd 18: (14 sc, inc in the next st) x4 (64)
- Rnd 19-24: sc in all st (64) 6 rounds
- Rnd 25: (14 sc, dec) x4 (60)
- Rnd 26: 4 sc, dec, (8 sc, dec) x5, 4 sc (54)
- Rnd 27: (7 sc, dec) x6 (48)
- Rnd 28: 3 sc, dec, (6 sc, dec) x5, 3 sc (42)

*Insert your safety eyes between rounds 19-20, approximately 12 stitches apart. Using black embroidery thread, sew eyebrows above the eyes across 2 stitches on round 17. Weave in the thread tail once complete. Stuff the head, and continue throughout. FIGURES 1 & 2*

- Rnd 29: (5 sc, dec) x6 (36)
- Rnd 30: 2 sc, dec, (4 sc, dec) x5, 2 sc (30)
- Rnd 31: (3 sc, dec) x6 (24)
- Rnd 32: sc, dec, (2 sc, dec) x5, sc (18)

*Fasten off and weave in the yarn tail. Add more stuffing if required.*

## NOSE

Use light pink

- Row 1: start with a ch of 4. Working in the second ch from the hook, inc, sc, 3 sc into the last ch, turn your work slightly so you can work on the other side of the ch, 2 sc (8)

*Fasten off leaving a yarn tail for sewing.*

## ANTENNAE (MAKE 2)

Use dark grey

- Rnd 1: start with a mr of 6 (6)
- Rnd 2: inc in all st (12)
- Rnd 3: sc in all st (12)
- Rnd 4: (sc, inc in the next st) x6 (18)
- Rnd 5-6: sc in all st (18) 2 rounds
- Rnd 7: (sc, dec) x6 (12)
- Rnd 8: sc in all st (12)
- Rnd 9: (2 sc, dec) x3 (9)
- Rnd 10-11: sc in all st (9) 2 rounds

*Stuff the antennae. Fasten off leaving a yarn tail for sewing.*

## LEGS (MAKE 2)

*Use light pink. You will create two legs which are then joined together to form the body.*

Leg 1:

- Rnd 1: start with a mr of 6 (6)
- Rnd 2: inc in all st (12)
- Rnd 3: (sc, inc in the next st) x6 (18)
- Rnd 4: (2 sc, inc in the next st) x6 (24)
- Rnd 5: (3 sc, inc in the next st) x6 (30)
- Rnd 6-7: sc in all st (30) 2 rounds
- Rnd 8: (4 sc, dec) x5 (25)
- Rnd 9: sc in all st (25)
- Rnd 10: (3 sc, dec) x5 (20)
- Rnd 11: 4 sc, (dec) x3, 10 sc (17)
- Rnd 12: 4 sc, dec, 11 sc (16)
- Rnd 13: 3 sc, (inc in the next st) x4, 9 sc (20)
- Rnd 14: 3 sc, (sc, inc in the next st) x4, 9 sc (24)
- Rnd 15: sc in all st (24)
- Rnd 16: (3 sc, inc in the next st) x6 (30)
- Rnd 17: (4 sc, inc in the next st) x6 (36)

*Stuff the leg. Mark the 14th st of round 17 as we will refer to this stitch later when joining the legs. Fasten off and weave in the yarn tail.*

Leg 2:

- Rnd 1-17: as per above. *Stuff the leg, but do not fasten off, instead, continue:*
- Rnd 18: 12 sc, now, sc into the marked stitch of leg 1 to join them **FIGURES 3 & 4**. Continue working into leg 1 with an additional 35 sc, work the next sc back into leg 2 in the next available stitch (the 13th stitch), then work an additional 24 sc back to where you started. (72)

*Your legs should now be joined together, and we will continue to form the body.*

**Tip:** Once the body is formed, you may find there are gaps between the legs. Use a scrap piece of yarn in light pink to sew together any gaps formed, and weave in the yarn tail.

- Rnd 24: sc in all st (54)
- Rnd 25: (7 sc, dec) x6 (48)
- Rnd 26-28: sc in all st (48) 3 rounds
- Rnd 29: (10 sc, dec) x4 (44)
- Rnd 30-31: sc in all st (44) 2 rounds
- Rnd 32: (9 sc, dec) x4 (40)

Stuff the body and continue throughout.

- Rnd 33: sc in all st (40)
- Rnd 34: (8 sc, dec) x4 (36)
- Rnd 35-36: sc in all st (36) 2 rounds
- Rnd 37: (7 sc, dec) x4 (32)
- Rnd 38: sc in all st (32)
- Rnd 39: (6 sc, dec) x4 (28)
- Rnd 40: (5 sc, dec) x4 (24)

Fasten off, leaving a yarn tail for sewing. Add any additional stuffing.

## ARMS (MAKE 2)

Use dark grey

- Rnd 1: start with a mr of 6 (6)
- Rnd 2: inc in all st (12)
- Rnd 3: (2 sc, inc in the next st) x4 (16)
- Rnd 4-6: sc in all st (16) 3 rounds
- Rnd 7: (2 sc, dec) x4 (12)
- Rnd 8-9: sc in all st (12) 2 rounds
- Rnd 10: (4 sc, dec) x2 (10)
- Rnd 11-18: sc in all st (10) 8 rounds

The arms are not stuffed. Flatten the work and sc through both sides to close. Leave a yarn tail for sewing.

## WINGS (MAKE 2)

Use dark pink

- Rnd 1: start with a mr of 6 (6)
- Rnd 2: inc in all st (12)
- Rnd 3: (sc, inc in the next st) x6 (18)
- Rnd 4: (2 sc, inc in the next st) x6 (24)
- Rnd 5: (3 sc, inc in the next st) x6 (30)
- Rnd 6-7: sc in all st (30) 2 rounds
- Rnd 8: (4 sc, inc in the next st) x6 (36)
- Rnd 9-10: sc in all st (36) 2 rounds
- Rnd 11: (5 sc, inc in the next st) x6 (42)
- Rnd 12-14: sc in all st (42) 3 rounds
- Rnd 15: (12 sc, dec) x3 (39)
- Rnd 16: sc in all st (39)
- Rnd 17: (11 sc, dec) x3 (36)
- Rnd 18: sc in all st (36)
- Rnd 19: (10 sc, dec) x3 (33)
- Rnd 20: (9 sc, dec) x3 (30)
- Rnd 21: (3 sc, dec) x6 (24)
- Rnd 22: (2 sc, dec) x6 (18)
- Rnd 23: (sc, dec) x6 (12)

The wings are not stuffed. Flatten the work and sc through both sides to close. Leave a long yarn tail. With your needle and yarn tail, pinch the two sides of the closing stitches and sew the two sides together to pinch the wing. Keep the yarn tail for sewing. FIGURES 5-7

## WING DOTS (MAKE 12 - 6 FOR EACH WING)

Use a mix of dark grey & light pink

- Rnd 1: start with a mr of 6 (6)

Slst to the beginning sc, and fasten off leaving a yarn tail for sewing. Sew 3 dark grey & 3 light pink dots to one side of the top of each wing. Weave in the yarn tails as you go. FIGURE 8

## HEADBAND

Use off white. Start with a ch of 60. Form a circle with your work and slst to the beginning ch to join. Make sure your chain isn't twisted.

**Row 1:** hdc in each ch (60)

**Row 2:** 25 sc, (5 dc worked into the same st) x10, 25 sc (100)

Fasten off and weave in the yarn tail.

# Assembly

Weave in all yarn tails as you go.

**Antennae to the head:** Sew the antennae between rounds 5-6 and 8-9 of the head. They should sit slightly above the magic ring towards the front of the head, and in line with the eyes. **FIGURES 9-11**

**Nose to the head:** Sew the nose across rounds 20-22, between each eye. Using black embroidery thread, sew a line down from the nose to round 24. **FIGURE 12**

**Body to the head:** Sew the open parts of the body and head together. Make sure you are happy with the stuffing before completing. **FIGURES 13-14**

**Arms to the body:** Sew the arms to the body between rounds 39-40. The arms should sit slightly behind the antennae when looking at the arms from the side. **FIGURES 15-17**

**Wings to the body:** Sew the wings next to each arm, between rounds 39-40. Make sure you only sew the pinched tip of each wing to the body, and leave the rest. The spots side of the wing will be facing towards the back of the body. **FIGURES 18-20**

# Cleo's Flower

## YELLOW CENTRE (MAKE 2)

Use yellow

**Rnd 1:** start with a mr of 6 (6)

**Rnd 2:** inc in all st (12)

**Rnd 3:** (sc, inc in the next st) x6 (18)

*Fasten off and weave in the yarn tail after completing the first yellow piece. Make a second piece as per rounds 1-3, but do not fasten off. Instead:*

**Rnd 4:** Place the two pieces back to back, with the 'right' sides facing outwards (and wrong sides back to back) and sc through both pieces to join: 18 sc (18) **FIGURE 21-22** change to white on the last st of the rnd

## FLOWER PETALS

Continue using white

**Rnd 5:** Working in the BLO, (sc, (3 dc, ch 2, 3 dc all worked in the same st)) x9 **FIGURES 23-24**

*Slst to the first sc, fasten off, and weave in the yarn tail.*

## FLOWER STALK

Use light green

**Rnd 1:** start with a mr of 8 (8)

**Rnd 2-15:** sc in all st (8) 14 rounds

*Fasten off leaving a yarn tail for sewing. The stalk is not stuffed.*

Sew the stalk to the underside of the flower, central, and weave in the yarn tail once complete. **FIGURE 25**

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## NOTES FOR THE PATTERN

- Instructions are written in continuous rounds & rows, using US terminology.
- There are multiple colour changes during the construction of the head. I used the invisible colour change method to change colours. I normally drop the yarn when I don't need to use it, then loosely add it back when it's required again, making sure it's not pulling tight from the previous use of the colour (as this will affect the shape of your work). Use any method of maintaining colours that is easiest for you.
- The number of stitches you should have at the end of each round is written in the brackets like so, (20).
- Make sure you pull your stitches tight and always use a stitch marker, or a piece of string, to mark the start of each round.
- Most importantly, have fun whilst crocheting this pattern, and feel free to reach out if you have any issues along the way.

**HALF DOUBLE CROCHET (hdc)** Yarn over the hook before going into a stitch. Once you yarn over, insert your hook into the stitch, yarn over and pull through. You should have 3 loops on your hook. Yarn over and pull through all 3 loops on the hook

**BACK LOOP ONLY (BLO)** Work the required stitch in the back loop only of the next stitch and not both

**FRONT LOOP ONLY (FLO)** Work the required stitch in the front loop only of the next stitch and not both

### Construction:

> The toes of the penguin are made as 3 individual pieces that will be joined together to form the leg.

> All other pieces of the penguin are made separately and sewn together during assembly.

> The beanie and scarf are removable .

**Skill level:** beginner-intermediate

**Size:** Flipper measures approximately 21 cm / 8 inches lengthwise when made with the indicated materials.

 Rnd 10-12: sc in all st (54) 3 rnds  
 Rnd 13: (17 sc, inc in the next st) x3 (57)  
 Rnd 14: sc in all st (57)  
 Rnd 15: 16 sc, (white) 4 sc, (dark grey) 6 sc, (white) 4 sc, (dark grey) 27 sc (57)  
 Rnd 16: 15 sc, (white) 5 sc, (dark grey) 6 sc, (white) 5 sc, (dark grey) 26 sc (57)  
 Rnd 17: 14 sc, (white) 7 sc, (dark grey) 4 sc, (white) 7 sc, (dark grey) 25 sc (57)  
 Rnd 18: 13 sc, (white) 9 sc, (dark grey) 3 sc, (white) 8 sc, (dark grey) 24 sc (57)  
 Rnd 19: 13 sc, (white) 5 sc, inc in the next st, 3 sc (dark grey) 3 sc, (white) 9 sc, (dark grey) 3 sc, inc in the next st, 18 sc, inc in the next st (60)  
 Rnd 20: 13 sc, (white) 10 sc, (dark grey) 4 sc, (white) 8 sc, (dark grey) 25 sc (60)  
 Rnd 21: 12 sc, (white) 10 sc, (dark grey) 5 sc, (white) 9 sc, (dark grey) 24 sc (60)  
 Rnd 22: 11 sc, (white) 10 sc, (dark grey) 8 sc, (white) 8 sc, (dark grey) 23 sc (60)  
 Rnd 23: 11 sc, (white) 10 sc, (dark grey) 9 sc, (white) 7 sc, (dark grey) 23 sc (60)  
 Rnd 24: 12 sc, (white) 25 sc, (dark grey) 23 sc (60)  
 Rnd 25: 12 sc, (white) 24 sc, (dark grey) 24 sc (60)  
 Rnd 26: 13 sc, (white) 5 sc, dec, 15 sc (dark grey) 3 sc, dec, 18 sc, dec (57)  
 Rnd 27: 14 sc, (white) 3 sc, dec, 14 sc (dark grey) 3 sc, dec, 17 sc, dec (54)  
 Rnd 28: 7 sc, dec, 5 sc, (white) 2 sc, dec, 7 sc, dec, 5 sc (dark grey) 2 sc, dec, (7 sc, dec) x2 (48)

Insert the safety eyes between rnds 19-20 with approximately 11 visible stitches between each eye. Using black embroidery thread, sew eyebrows above the eyes on a diagonal across 3 sts on round 17.

(FIGURE 1). Stuff the head and continue throughout.

### HEAD CONTINUED . . .

Continue with dark grey only

- Rnd 29: 3 sc, dec, (6 sc, dec) x5, 3 sc (42)  
 Rnd 30: (5 sc, dec) x6 (36)  
 Rnd 31: 2 sc, dec, (4 sc, dec) x5, 2 sc (30)  
 Rnd 32: (3 sc, dec) x6 (24)  
 Rnd 33: sc, dec, (2 sc, dec) x5, sc (18)  
 Rnd 34: (sc, dec) x6 (12)  
 Rnd 35: dec x6 (6)

Fasten off leaving a yarn tail. Add any more stuffing you need. With your needle and yarn tail, weave the yarn throughout the remaining front loops of round 35, and pull tight to close. Weave in the yarn tail.

Use orange. Make a ch of 11

Row 1: working in the second ch from the hook, inc, 8 sc, 4 sc into the last ch, spin your work round slightly so you can now work on the other side of the ch, 8 sc, inc (24)

Row 2-5: sc in all st (24) 4 rounds

Fasten off leaving a yarn tail for sewing. The beak will be stuffed during assembly.

### BODY

Use light grey

- Rnd 1: begin with a mr of 6 (6)  
 Rnd 2: inc in all st (12)  
 Rnd 3: (sc, inc in the next st) x6 (18)  
 Rnd 4: (2 sc, inc in the next st) x6 (24)  
 Rnd 5: (3 sc, inc in the next st) x6 (30)  
 Rnd 6: (4 sc, inc in the next st) x6 (36)  
 Rnd 7: (5 sc, inc in the next st) x6 (42)  
 Rnd 8: (6 sc, inc in the next st) x6 (48)  
 Rnd 9: (7 sc, inc in the next st) x6 (54)  
 Rnd 10: (8 sc, inc in the next st) x6 (60)  
 Rnd 11: (9 sc, inc in the next st) x6 (66)  
 Rnd 12-15: sc in all st (66) 4 rounds  
 Rnd 16: (9 sc, dec) x6 (60)  
 Rnd 17-21: sc in all st (60) 5 rounds  
 Rnd 22: (13 sc, dec) x4 (56)  
 Rnd 23-25: sc in all st (56) 3 rounds  
 Rnd 26: (12 sc, dec) x4 (52)

## BODY CONTINUED . . .

- Rnd 27-30: sc in all st (52) 4 rounds  
 Rnd 31: (11 sc, dec) x4 (48)  
 Rnd 32-34: sc in all st (48) 3 rounds  
 Rnd 35: (10 sc, dec) x4 (44)  
 Rnd 36: sc in all st (44)  
 Rnd 37: (9 sc, dec) x4 (40)  
 Rnd 38: sc in all st (40)  
 Rnd 39: (8 sc, dec) x4 (36)  
 Rnd 40: (7 sc, dec) x4 (32)  
 Rnd 41: sc in all st (32)  
 Rnd 42: (6 sc, dec) x4 (28)

Stuff the body. Fasten off leaving a yarn tail for sewing.

## WINGS (MAKE 2)

Use dark grey

- Rnd 1: begin with a mr of 6 (6)  
 Rnd 2: (sc, inc in the next st) x3 (9)  
 Rnd 3: sc in all st (9)  
 Rnd 4: (2 sc, inc in the next st) x3 (12)  
 Rnd 5: sc in all st (12)  
 Rnd 6: (3 sc, inc in the next st) x3 (15)  
 Rnd 7: (4 sc, inc in the next st) x3 (18)  
 Rnd 8: (5 sc, inc in the next st) x3 (21)  
 Rnd 9: (6 sc, inc in the next st) x3 (24)  
 Rnd 10: sc in all st (24)  
 Rnd 11: (3 sc, inc in the next st) x6 (30)  
 Rnd 12: (4 sc, inc in the next st) x6 (36)  
 Rnd 13-17: sc in all st (36) 5 rounds  
 Rnd 18: (4 sc, dec) x6 (30)  
 Rnd 19-20: sc in all st (30) 2 rounds  
 Rnd 21: (3 sc, dec) x6 (24)  
 Rnd 22-25: sc in all st (24) 4 rounds  
 Rnd 26: (2 sc, dec) x6 (18)  
 Rnd 27: sc in all st (18)  
 Rnd 28: (sc, dec) x6 (12)  
 Rnd 29: sc in all st (12)  
 Rnd 30: dec x6 (6)

Fasten off leaving a yarn tail. With your needle and yarn tail, weave the yarn through the front loops of the remaining stitches of rnd 30, and pull tight to close. Keep the yarn tail. The wings are not stuffed.

## TAIL

Use dark grey

- Rnd 1: begin with a mr of 6 (6)  
 Rnd 2: (sc, inc in the next st) x3 (9)  
 Rnd 3: (2 sc, inc in the next st) x3 (12)  
 Rnd 4-5: sc in all st (12) 2 rounds

Flatten the work, and sc through both sides to close. The tail is not stuffed. Fasten off, leaving a yarn tail for sewing.

## FEET / LEGS (MAKE 2)

You will make 3 toes that join together to form the foot/leg.

### Toes - (make 3)

Use orange

Rnd 1: begin with a mr of 6 (6)

Rnd 2: inc in all st (12)

Rnd 3-4: sc in all st (12) 2 rounds

Fasten off and weave in the yarn tail for the first 2 toes. Once you have completed round 4 of the third toe, do not fasten off. Instead we will continue to join the toes together to form the foot.

### Leg

Refer to FIGURES 4-9 as a mock-up guide of how the pieces are joined together to avoid holes in your work.

Rnd 5: insert your hook into the next st of the toe on your hook, pick up the first loose toe and insert your hook into any stitch. Work a sc through both of these stitches to join (FIGURE 2). Now, work an additional sc into the same stitch you just worked into of the newest toe only (FIGURE 3). Mark this sc as the beginning of the round. Work 4 more sc into this toe. Insert your hook into the next sc of the second toe, pick up the remaining loose toe, and insert your hook into any stitch of this remaining third toe, and sc through both stitches to join. Again, work one more sc only into the stitch of the remaining loose toe that you just worked into (again, refer FIGURES 2 & 3). Work 10 more sc into the last toe. Insert your hook into the last st of the third toe, then into the next available st of the middle second toe, and sc through both stitches to join. Work one more sc into the same stitch you just worked into of the middle second toe only. Continue with 4 more sc into the back of the middle toe. Insert your hook into the last st of the middle second toe, and into the next available st of the first toe you started with, and sc through both stitches to join. Work an additional sc into the stitch you just worked into of the first toe only. Work 11 more sc into the toe that you started with, back to the start (36) Your toes should now be joined.

## LEGS CONTINUED . . .

Rnd 6: (4 sc, dec) x6 (30)

Rnd 7: (3 sc, dec) x6 (24)

Rnd 8: (2 sc, dec) x6 (18)

Rnd 9-10: sc in all st (18) 2 rounds

Rnd 11: (sc, dec) x6 (12)

Rnd 12: sc in all st (12) *change to light grey on the last st of the rnd*

Rnd 13: sc in all st (12)

Rnd 14: *working in the BLO*, sc in all st (12)

Rnd 15-18: sc in all st (12) 4 rounds

Rnd 19: 2 sc. Stop the round here

*You should be at the side of the work, if not, either add or undo the necessary sc to be at the side. Stuff the foot lightly, then flatten the work and sc through both sides to close. Leave a yarn tail for sewing.*

## Leg border

With the toes facing away from you, attach your light grey yarn to any FLO stitch of round 14 of the foot. Once attached, hdc into each FLO st -including the st where you joined the yarn.

*Once completed, slst to the first hdc you started with, fasten off and weave in the yarn tail. FIGURES 10 & 11*

## SCARF

*Use light blue. Begin with a ch of 127*

Rnd 1: *working in the third ch from the hook*, hdc in all st (125) ch 2 and turn your work

Rnd 2: *working in the BLO*, hdc in all st (125) ch 2 and turn your work

Rnd 3: *working in the FLO*, hdc in all st (125)  
*Fasten off and weave in the yarn tail.*

## BEANIE

*Use dark blue. Begin with a ch of 20*

Rnd 1: *working in the third ch from the hook*, hdc in all st (18) ch 2 and turn your work

Rnd 2-29: *working in the BLO*, hdc in all st (18) ch 1 and turn your work, (28 rounds)

Rnd 30: *working in the BLO*, hdc in all st (18)

*Fasten off leaving a long yarn tail. With your needle and yarn tail, sew the two ends of your work together to form a band, (FIGURES 12 & 13). Once joined, weave in and out of the top of the band (on one side only) and pull tight to scrunch up, (FIGURE 14). Sew a few stitches at the top of the work to secure, then weave in the yarn tail. Fold you work inside out to hide the side you have just been working on. Create a pompom\* / sew a pompom to the top of the beanie and weave in the yarn tail. (FIGURE 15)*

*\*There are lots of tutorials on how to make a pom pom on the internet or YouTube.*

3. After you have joined the toes, go back into the same st of the second toe, and sc (do not work in the first toe again)







## ASSEMBLY

Weave in all yarn tails as you go

**Beak to the head:** Pin the beak to the head between rounds 20-21 and 23-24, central between the eyes. Sew the beak in place, adding a little stuffing before you finish sewing. **FIGURES 16-18**

**Body to the head:** Pin the body to the back of the head, opposite to the beak, between rounds 15-16 and 22-23 and sew together. You can choose to sew on different rounds if you want the penguin to have a tilted head. **FIGURES 19-21**

**Wings to the body:** Sew the wings to the sides of the body between rounds 39-40. You will only need to sew around the top curve of the wing as the remaining stitches of the wing will remain loose. **FIGURES 22-23**

**Tail to the body:** Sew the tail between rounds 10-11, on the top of the body, and centre between the wings. The tail should sit in line with the beak when looking down at the penguin. **FIGURES 24-25**

**Legs to the body:** Pin the legs to the underside of the body, between rounds 13-14, and sew in place. There should be approximately 8 visible stitches between each leg. **FIGURES 24-26**

**Cheeks to the head:** Using some scrap pink yarn, sew some cheeks to the sides of the eyes between rounds 20-21 across 2 stitches. **FIGURE 27**

*Now add the beanie to the penguins head, and wrap the scarf around his neck!*

BABY BEAR LOVEY

A blue sparrow handmade pattern  
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## NOTES FOR THE PATTERN

- Instructions are written in rounds using US terminology.
- The number of stitches you should have at the end of each round is written in the brackets like so, (20).
- Make sure you pull your stitches tight for the head, ears, snout, arms and legs. You will use a bigger hook for the body piece, and your tension can be looser.
- Always use a stitch marker, or a piece of string, to mark the start of each round.
- Most importantly, have fun whilst crocheting this pattern, and feel free to reach out if you have any issues along the way.

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## WHAT YOU WILL NEED

I have used Scheepjes Catona Cotton yarn with the colours:

- 505 - Linen - beige (1x 50g ball)\*
  - 257 - Antique Mauve - brown (scrap yarn 5g or less)
- Or
- 179 - Topaz - gold (1x 50g ball)\*
  - 254 - Moonrock - brown (scrap yarn 5g or less)

\* If you use a larger hook, or a looser tension, I suggest having a second ball handy in case you need it.

- Black embroidery thread
- A 2.5 mm & 3.00 mm crochet hook
- Toy stuffing
- Yarn/Embroidery needle
- Stitch Markers
- Pins
- Scissors

*You can use any yarn of your choice, just adjust your crochet hook according to the yarn.*

Caution: *If this toy is intended for a baby/small child, embroidered eyes are recommended. If you choose to use safety eyes, be sure to attach them securely. Make sure all yarn ends are thoroughly weaved in. Supervision around children is recommended.*

## CROCHET TERMS USED // ABBREVIATIONS GUIDE (US TERMINOLOGY):

Below are basic explanations of the crochet terms used in this pattern.

- **CHAIN (ch)** With a loop on your hook, yarn over from back to front and pull the loop through
- **STITCH (st)**
- **MAGIC RING (mr)** Wrap yarn over two fingers twice forming an X. Place the hook under the first piece of yarn and then over the second piece of yarn. Pull the outer strand of yarn under the first strand of the X forming a loop. Yarn over once more and draw the yarn through both loops. Work the appropriate number of stitches into the loop by inserting the hook into the main circle space onto the other side, yarning over and pulling through the space in the middle, yarn over the hook and pull through both loops on the hook. Once you have crocheted the number of stitches required, pull the short bit of string to tighten the ring
- **SINGLE CROCHET (sc)** Insert your hook into a stitch, yarn over (I prefer to pull the yarn through with my hook on top of the yarn to create a X effect), pull the yarn through (two loops on the hook), yarn over once more and pull the yarn through both loops
- **DOUBLE CROCHET (dc)** Yarn over the hook before going into a stitch. Once you yarn over, insert your hook into the stitch, yarn over and pull through. You should have 3 loops on your hook. Yarn over and pull through 2 of the loops on your hook. Yarn over again, and pull through the remaining 2 loops.
- **SLIP ST (slst)** Put your hook through the stitch, yarn over, pull through the stitch, and then pull the yarn through the loop on your hook
- **INCREASE (inc / dc inc)** Work 2 single crochets / 2 double crochets into the same stitch
- **INV DECREASE (dec/ dc dec)** Insert your hook under the front loop of the first stitch, and then under the front loop of the second stitch. Yarn over and pull through both front loops. Yarn over and pull through the remaining loops. For a dc dec, yarn over, insert your hook under the front loop of the first stitch, and then under the front loop of the second stitch. Yarn over and pull through 2 of the loops on your hook. Yarn over once more and pull through the remaining 2 loops.
- **BACK LOOP ONLY (BLO)** Work the required stitch in the back loop only instead of both loops
- **FRONT LOOP ONLY (FLO)** Work the required stitch in the front loop only instead of both loops

### Construction:

> The legs and arms must be made before making the body. Both the arms and legs will be crocheted into the body piece, with no requirement to sew.

> Ears and snout of the bear are sewn on.

> The body will require a 3.00mm hook to be used, all other pieces will require a 2.5mm

**Skill level:** beginner-intermediate

**Size:** Harry baby bear lovey measures approximately 21 cm // 8 inches lengthwise when made with the above materials.

## INSTRUCTIONS

USE A 2.5MM HOOK UNLESS STATED OTHERWISE

### HEAD

Use body colour (beige or gold)

- Rnd 1: begin with a mr of 6 (6)  
 Rnd 2: inc in all st (12)  
 Rnd 3: (sc, inc in the next st) x6 (18)  
 Rnd 4: (2 sc, inc in the next st) x6 (24)  
 Rnd 5: (3 sc, inc in the next st) x6 (30)  
 Rnd 6: (4 sc, inc in the next st) x6 (36)  
 Rnd 7: (5 sc, inc in the next st) x6 (42)  
 Rnd 8: (6 sc, inc in the next st) x6 (48)  
 Rnd 9: (7 sc, inc in the next st) x6 (54)  
 Rnd 10-18: sc in all st (54) 9 rounds  
 Rnd 19: (17 sc, inc in the next st) x3 (57)  
 Rnd 20-21: sc in all st (57) 2 rounds  
 Rnd 22: (17 sc, dec) x3 (54)  
 Rnd 23: (7 sc, dec) x6 (48)  
 Rnd 24: 3 sc, dec, (6 sc, dec) x5, 3 sc (42)  
 Rnd 25: (5 sc, dec) x6 (36)  
 Rnd 26: 2 sc, dec, (4 sc, dec) x5, 2 sc (30)  
 Rnd 27: (3 sc, dec) x6 (24)

Stuff the head and continue throughout. If you choose to use safety eyes, I recommend putting them between rounds 15-16.

- Rnd 28: sc, dec, (2 sc, dec) x5, sc (18)  
 Rnd 29: in the BLO, sc in all st (18)  
 Rnd 30: (sc, dec) x6 (12)  
 Rnd 31: dec x6 (6)

Add any additional stuffing you might need. Fasten off leaving a yarn tail. With your needle and the yarn tail, weave the yarn through the remaining front loops of round 31, and pull tight to close (FIGURES 1-3). Weave in the yarn tail.

### EARS (MAKE 2)

Use body colour (beige or gold)

- Rnd 1: begin with a mr of 6 (6)  
 Rnd 2: inc in all st (12)  
 Rnd 3: (sc, inc in the next st) x6 (18)  
 Rnd 4-6: sc in all st (18) 3 rounds

Fasten off leaving a yarn tail for sewing. The ears are not stuffed.

### SNOUT

Use body colour (beige or gold)

- Rnd 1: begin with a mr of 6 (6)  
 Rnd 2: inc in all st (12)  
 Rnd 3: (sc, inc in the next st) x6 (18)  
 Rnd 4: (2 sc, inc in the next st) x6 (24)  
 Rnd 5-6: sc in all st (24) 2 rounds

Fasten off leaving a yarn tail for sewing. The snout will be stuffed during assembly.

### SNOUT CONTINUED. . .

#### Nose - use brown

Sew a nose onto the snout between rounds 3-4. You can choose to sew a small triangular nose, or a long wide strip nose. Use black embroidery thread to create a line straight down from the nose. Weave in all yarn/thread tails (FIGURES 26 & 28).

### ARMS (MAKE 2)

Use body colour (beige or gold)

- Rnd 1: begin with a mr of 6 (6)  
 Rnd 2: inc in all st (12)  
 Rnd 3: (sc, inc in the next st) x6 (18)  
 Rnd 4: sc in all st (18)  
 Rnd 5: (sc, dec) x6 (12)  
 Rnd 6-21: sc in all st (12) 16 rounds

Fasten off and weave in the yarn tail. Use the invisible way to fasten off\*. Stuff the arms lightly between rounds 1-7 and leave the remaining rounds free of filling.

\*Invisible method: Pull the yarn after completing round 21. With your needle, sew the yarn into the second stitch of round 21 - skipping one stitch. Then, insert the needle back into the middle of the stitch you started with (the last st of round 21). Pull slightly, then weave in the yarn tail. This will close off your work nicely. (FIGURES 4-7)

## LEGS (MAKE 2)

Use *body colour (beige or gold)*

- Rnd 1: begin with a mr of 6 (6)  
 Rnd 2: inc in all st (12)  
 Rnd 3: (sc, inc in the next st) x6 (18)  
 Rnd 4: (2 sc, inc in the next st) x6 (24)  
 Rnd 5-6: sc in all st (24) 2 rounds  
 Rnd 7: (2 sc, dec) x6 (18)  
 Rnd 8: sc in all st (18)  
 Rnd 9: 6 sc, (dec) x3, 6 sc (15) - *mark the second dec of this round as we will refer to this point later. (FIGURE 8)*  
 Rnd 10: sc in all st (15)  
 Rnd 11: (sc, dec) x5 (10)  
 Rnd 12-16: sc in all st (10) 5 rounds


*Fasten off and weave in the yarn tail - use the invisible method again. (FIGURES 4-7). Stuff the legs between rounds 1-12 and leave the remaining rounds free of filling.*

## BODY

(MAKE SURE YOU HAVE COMPLETED THE ARMS AND LEGS BEFORE COMMENCING THE BODY)

Use *body colour (beige or gold)* & a **3.00mm** hook

- Rnd 1: leave a long yarn tail at the start of your work as we will need it for sewing the body and the head together. The yarn tail will need to be on the correct side of your work (the side that you will see) so use a needle to thread it to the correct side, (FIGURES 9 & 13). Once you have a tail, begin with a mr of 6 (6)  
 Rnd 2: inc in all st (12)  
 Rnd 3: (sc, inc in the next st) x6 (18)  
 Rnd 4: working in the BLO, sc in all st (18)  
*You will now continue to work with double crochets, and any increases will be a double crochet increase, and any decreases will be a double crochet decrease.*  
 Rnd 5: 2 dc, inc in the next st, now we will attach the first arm. Hold the arm against the work, (FIGURE 11), (you want the arm to be closest to you, and the body work behind the arm), dc through both sides of the arm and into the next st of the body to join. Continue working into both the arm and the body work: dc, inc, dc in the next 2 st. You will now have the first arm completely joined, (FIGURES 10-12). Work the next stitches into the body piece only: inc in the next st, dc in the next 2 st, inc in the next st. Now we will join the second arm. Again, hold the arm against the body work, dc through both sides of the arm and into the next st of the body to join, continue: dc in the next st, inc in the next st, dc in the next 2 st. The second arm should now be joined, (FIGURE 13). Work the last st in the body only: inc (24)  
 [Shortened version of round 5: (2 dc, inc in the next st) x6 (24)]  
 Rnd 6: (3 dc, inc in the next st) x6 (30)  
 Rnd 7: (4 dc, inc in the next st) x6 (36)



## BODY CONTINUED. . .

- Rnd 8: (5 dc, inc in the next st) x6 (42)  
 Rnd 9: (6 dc, inc in the next st) x6 (48)  
 Rnd 10-12: dc in all st (48) 3 rounds  
 Rnd 13: (6 dc, dec) x6 (42)  
 Rnd 14: (5 dc, dec) x6 (36)  
 Rnd 15: (4 dc, dec) x5, 2 dc, dec. Stop the round here (30)

*Flatten your work. You should be at the side of the work (in line with one of the arms), if you are not, dc additional/or less stitches to be at the side, whilst maintaining a stitch count of 30. (FIGURE 14). You will now attach the legs whilst simultaneously closing the work. Hold the first leg against the work, making sure the marked stitch with the curve of the leg is facing inwards towards the inner body, (FIGURE 15). Dc through both sides of the leg and into both sides of the body work. Repeat this 3 more times, so that you have worked 4 dc into both sides of the legs and body work, (FIGURES 16-18). The first leg is now attached. Work 6 dc into both sides of the body work only, (FIGURE 19).*

(Cont) Now bring the second leg against the body work, again, with the marked stitch facing inwards, towards the inner body. Work the next dc through both sides of the leg and both sides of the body work, (FIGURE 20). Work the next 3 dc through both the leg and body, (FIGURE 21). You will now have attached both legs and closed the body work.

*Fasten off and weave in the yarn tail.*

## ASSEMBLY

Weave in all yarn tails as you go

Ears to the head: Pin the ears to the head between rounds 5-6 and 11-12, in line with the magic ring. Sew the ears on, making sure they are slightly curved/ have a pinched look. (FIGURES 22-26)

Snout to the head: Pin the snout to the the head between rounds 16-17 and 23-24. The snout should sit centrally between the ears. Once happy with the positioning, sew the snout on, adding some stuffing to the snout just before you close. (FIGURES 23, 26-28)

Embroidered eyes: Using black embroidery thread and a needle, embroider the eyes to the head, on either side of the snout. My eyes were embroidered onto round 16. (FIGURES 22-23, 25-26). Refer below for the shaping.



Body to the head: Using the yarn tail you kept at the start of the magic ring of the body, sew the head to the body. Line up the remaining FLO stitches of the body from round 4, and the FLO stitches of round 29 of the head, in order to join the pieces together. (FIGURES 29-30).

...and that's it!

Work the appropriate number of stitches into the loop by inserting the hook into the main circle space onto the other side, yarning over and pulling through the space in the middle, yarn over the hook and pull through both loops on the hook. Once you have crocheted the number of stitches required, pull the short bit of string to tighten the ring
- **SINGLE CROCHET (sc)** Insert your hook into a stitch, yarn over (I prefer to pull the yarn through with my hook on top of the yarn to create a X effect), pull the yarn through (two chains on the hook), yarn over once more and pull yarn through both loops
- **SLIP ST (slst)** Put your hook through the stitch, yarn over, pull through the stitch, and then pull the yarn through the loop on your hook
- **INCREASE (inc/ hdc inc)** Work 2 single crochets / or 2 half double crochets in the same stitch
- **INV DECREASE (dec)** Insert your hook under the front loop of the first stitch, and then under the front loop of the second stitch. Yarn over and pull through both front loops. Yarn over and pull through the remaining loops
- **HALF DOUBLE CROCHET (hdc)** Yarn over the hook before going into a stitch. Once you yarn over, insert your hook into the stitch, yarn over and pull through. You should have 3 loops on your hook. Yarn over and pull through all 3 loops on the hook.
- **BACK LOOP ONLY (BLO)** Complete the required stitch in the back loop only of the next stitch instead of both top loops.
- **FRONT LOOP ONLY (FLO)** Complete the required stitch in the front loop only of the next stitch instead of both top loops.

### Construction:

> The head, ears, nose, arms, legs and tail are sewn on

> The cloak is made as a vest, with yarn rejoined to make the sleeves. The hood of the cloak is made separately then joined to the vest.

Rnd 8-13: sc in all st (49) 6 rounds  
Rnd 14: 3 sc, inc in the next st, (6 sc, inc in the next st) x6, 3 sc (56)  
Rnd 15-18: sc in all st (56) 4 rounds  
Rnd 19: (13 sc, inc in the next st) x4 (60)  
Rnd 20-21: sc in all st (60) 2 rounds  
Rnd 22: (13 sc, dec in the next st) x4 (56)  
Rnd 23: (5 sc, dec in the next st) x8 (48)  
Rnd 24: 2 sc, dec in the next st, (4 sc, dec in the next st) x7, 2 sc (40)  
Rnd 25: (3 sc, dec in the next st) x8 (32)  
Rnd 26: sc, dec in the next st (2 sc, dec in the next st) x7, sc (24)

Fasten off, and weave in the yarn tail. Stuff the head. Place the safety eyes between rounds 14-15 with approximately 5 (whole) visible stitches between them. FIGURE 1

Fasten off, and leave a tail for sewing. The ears are not stuffed.

## SNOUT - USING BEIGE / BEAR BODY COLOUR

- Rnd 1: start with a magic ring of 6 (6)  
Rnd 2: inc in all st (12)  
Rnd 3: (sc, inc in the next st) x6 (18)  
Rnd 4: (2 sc, inc in the next st) x6 (24)  
Rnd 5-6: sc in all st (24) 2 rounds

Fasten off, and leave a tail for sewing. The snout will be stuffed when it is sewn onto the face. Using black embroidery thread, sew your nose feature between rounds 4-5 across 4 stitches, going back and forth to create a bold line. Then, in the middle, create a single black line down to the bottom of the magic ring, as if you were forming the letter 'T'. Use the photo as a guide. FIGURE 1

Rnd 14: in the BLO, sc in all st (45) **change to burgundy on the last st of the round**  
Rnd 15: sc in all st (45) **change to light grey on the last st of the round**  
Rnd 16: (13 sc, dec in the next st) x3 (42)  
Rnd 17: sc in all st (42)  
Rnd 18: (12 sc, dec in the next st) x3 (39)  
Rnd 19: sc in all st (39)  
Rnd 20: (11 sc, dec in the next st) x3 (36)  
Rnd 21-22: sc in all st (36) 2 rounds  
Rnd 23: (4 sc, dec in the next st) x6 (30) **change to burgundy on the last st of the round**

### SWEATER DETAILS:

Reattach your light grey yarn to any FLO st of round 14, with the base of the body away from you. Sc in each FLO stitch around the body, and slip st to the beginning sc once completed. Fasten off and weave in the end.

- Rnd 1: start with a magic ring of 6 (6)
- Rnd 2: inc in all st (12)
- Rnd 3: (sc, inc in the next st) x6 (18)
- Rnd 4: sc in all st (18)
- Rnd 5: (sc, dec in the next st) x6 (12)
- Rnd 6: sc in all st (12)
- Rnd 7: sc in all st (12) **change to light grey on the last st of the round**
- Rnd 8: (2 sc, dec in the next st) x3 (9) **change to burgundy on the last st of the round**
- Rnd 9: sc in all st (9) **change to light grey on the last st of the round**
- Rnd 10-18: sc in all st (9) *9 rounds*

Stuff the arms from rounds 1-8 lightly, and leave rows 9 onwards off and leave a tail for sewing. Using your yellow yarn, sew a yellow border your burgandy stitches of round 9, as you've done previously on the body.

- Rnd 1: start with a magic ring of 6 (6)
- Rnd 2: inc in all st (12)
- Rnd 3: (sc, inc in the next st) x6 (18)
- Rnd 4: (2 sc, inc in the next st) x6 (24)
- Rnd 5: (3 sc, inc in the next st) x6 (30)
- Rnd 6-7: sc in all st (30) *2 rounds*
- Rnd 8: (3 sc, dec in the next st) x6 (24)
- Rnd 9: sc in all st (24)
- Rnd 10: 6 sc, (dec in the next st) x6, 6 sc (18)
- Rnd 11-12: sc in all st (18) *2 rounds*
- Rnd 13: 6 sc, (sc, dec in the next st) x3, 3 sc (15)
- Rnd 14-22: sc in all st (15) *9 rounds*
- Rnd 23: (sc, dec in the next st) x 5 (10)

Stuff the bottom part of the legs up until round 12, and leave the rest of the leg. Once you have finished stuffing the leg, you will close the leg shut by flattening both sides and working enough sc to close. You may want to sc additional stitches after round 23 to get your leg in a good position to close. Make sure you close the legs like the below images so that they can be sewn to the sides of the body with the front of the foot dangling in the correct direction. ## TAIL - USING BEIGE / BEAR BODY COLOUR

- Rnd 1: start with a magic ring of 6 (6)
- Rnd 2: (sc, inc in the next st) x3 (9)
- Rnd 3-4: sc in all st (9)

Flatten your work and sc through both sides to close. The tail is not stuffed. Leave a tail for sewing.

## WIZARD ROBE- USING BLACK

Start with a chain of 35. Chain 1 and turn at the end of every round from 1-22

- Rnd 1: skip the first chain from the hook, and sc in the next 34 st (34)
- Rnd 2: sc in all st (34)
- Rnd 3: 6 sc, chain 6, skip 6 sts, 10 sc, chain 6, skip 6 sts, 6 sc (34)
- Rnd 4: sc in all st (34)
- Rnd 5: (inc, sc 6) x4 , inc, sc 5 (39)
- Rnd 6: inc, 38 sc (40)
- Rnd 7: (9 sc, inc) x4 (44)
- Rnd 8: sc in all st
- Rnd 9: (10 sc, inc) x4 (48)
- Rnd 10-18: sc in all st (48) 9 rounds
- Rnd 19: (11 sc, inc ) x4 (52)
- Rnd 20-23: sc in all st (52) 4 rounds

After round 23, do not chain 1 and turn, instead you will begin to neaten the borders of the robe. Continue to crochet along the side of the robe, across the top, and back down the other side to create the border. Make sure however many sc you do on each vertical side matches, and I recommend adding a sc into the corners of the robe. Fasten off and weave in the end once you get back to the start of round 23. ## ROBE SLEEVES

- Rnd 1: Reattach your black yarn to the middle stitch of the skipped stitches of round 3, and sc 14 around the open sleeve (6 making the skipped stitches + 1 on the side of the work + 6 of the chained stitches +1 on the side of the work) (14) FIGURE 12
- Rnd 2: (inc, 6 sc) x2 (16)
- Rnd 3: (7 sc, inc) x2 (18)
- Rnd 4: (8 sc, inc) x2 (20)
- Rnd 5: (4 sc, inc ) x4 (24)
- Rnd 6-12: sc in all st (24) 7 rounds

Fasten off and weave in your yarn end. Complete the same process for the second sleeve.



To add some extra detail to your robe, sew on a crest using your house colours!

Rnd 1: start with a magic ring of 7 (7)

Rnd 2: inc in all st (14)

Rnd 3: (sc, inc) x7 (21)

Rnd 4-5: sc in all st (21) 2 rounds

Rnd 6: (2 sc, inc) x7 (28)

Rnd 7: sc in all st (28)

Rnd 8: (3 sc, inc) x7 (35)

Rnd 9: sc in all st (35)

Rnd 10: (4 sc, inc) x7 (42)

Rnd 11: sc in all st (42)

Rnd 12: (5 sc, inc) x7 (49)

Rnd 13: sc in all st (49)

Rnd 14: (6 sc, inc) x7 (56)

Rnd 15: (7 sc, inc) x7 (63)

Rnd 16: (8 sc, inc) x7 (70)

Rnd 17-18: sc in all st (70) 2 rounds

Rnd 19: (8 sc, dec) x7 (63)

Rnd 20: (7 sc, dec) x7 (56)

Rnd 21-25: sc in all st (56) 5 rounds

Rnd 26: hdc in the next 20 st. Stop here and fasten off, leaving a tail for sewing. (20)

Place the side of the hood with the half double crochets against the top, back side of your robe (sleeves are facing you) and sew the two edges together. You will want to leave an even amount of sc on each side of the robe unworked. (If you have 34 stitches on the top of the robe, you want 7 stitches on either side of the hood unworked, and 20 of the stitches in the middle being sewn to the 20 hdc stitches of the hood). Once the hood has been attached, weave in your yarn end. FIGURES 13-14

### HOUSE COLOURED SCARF- USING YELLOW & BURGUNDY

Chain 1 and turn at the end of every round from 1-104. Alternate your colours every 5 rounds. For instance, rounds 1-5 will be in burgundy, 6-10 will be in yellow, 11-15 in burgundy, 16-20 in yellow, and so forth. I recommend carrying your yarn with you when making the colour changes to avoid weaving in so many yarn ends, however you can use any colour change method you like.

Start with a chain of 5, and begin with burgundy.

Rnd 1: starting in the second chain from the hook, sc in the next 4 st (4)

Rnd 2-105: sc in all st (4)

After round 105, do not chain 1 and turn, instead fasten off and weave in your tail ends.

Optional: Add some tassels to each end of your scarf in both colours. FIGURE 27



## ASSEMBLY

**EARS:** Curve the ears slightly and position them on top of the head, in line with the magic ring between rounds 2-3 & 9-10. Once happy, sew the ears on and weave in your tail end. FIGURES 16-21

**SNOUT:** Sew the snout to the head, under the eyes, between rounds 14-15 & 22-23 keeping it positioned in a slightly oval-like shape. Stuff the snout just before you close it, and weave in your tail end. FIGURES 1, 16 & 18

**EYEBROWS:** Using black embroidery thread, sew some eyebrows on, approximately 3-4 rows above the eyes, and across 2-3 stitches. Shape your eyebrows however you wish, to create the facial expression you desire. FIGURES 1, 16-17

**OPTIONAL- LIGHTNING BOLT SCAR:** If you want your bear to have a scar, using red embroidery thread (or you can split your burgandy yarn to get a thinner fibre) sew on your scar above the bears right eyebrow across 4 rounds. Refer to the photos to help you. FIGURES 16-20



## ASSEMBLY continued

**BODY TO THE HEAD:** Sew the body to the head. Make sure you are happy with the stuffing before closing completely. Weave in your tail end.

**ARMS:** Position the arms to the side of the body between rounds 25-26, directly under the head. You may want to pin them first, and try on the robe to make sure they're in a good position before sewing. Once happy with their position, sew them on. Weave in your tail end.

**LEGS:** Position the legs to the sides of the body, and sew them between rounds 12-13, directly under the sweater and in line with your arms. Weave in your tail end. FIGURES 23-26

**TAIL:** Position the tail between rounds 11-12 of the body, centred at the back of the body. Sew it into place, and weave in your tail end. FIGURE 26

**NOTES FOR THE PATTERN:**

- Instructions are written in rounds, using US terminology.
- Change colours when indicated using the invisible colour change method on the last stitch before the new colour
- The number of stitches you should have at the end of each round is written in the brackets like so, (20).
- Make sure you pull your stitches tight and always use a stitch marker, or piece of string, to mark the start of each round
- Most importantly, have fun whilst crocheting this pattern, and feel free to reach out if you have any issues along the way.

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**WHAT YOU WILL NEED:**

I have used DMC Natura Just cotton yarn with the colours:

- 003 - Sable - light grey
- 039 - Ombre - dark brown
- 083 - Ble - yellow
- 079 - Tilleul - light green
- 081 - Acanthe - light orange
- 006 - Rose Layet - light pink

I have used DMC Happy Chenille yarn for the fluffy white part of the Koala's ear:

- 020 - Snowflake - white

\*Alternatively, you can use white DMC natura cotton yarn (001 - Ibiza - white)

- Black embroidery thread
- A 2.25 mm crochet hook // 3.00 mm for chenille yarn
- Safety eyes (8 mm)
- Toy stuffing
- Yarn needle
- Stitch Markers
- Pins
- Scissors

*You can use any yarn of your choice, just adjust your crochet hook according to the yarn fibre.*

**CROCHET TERMS USED // ABBREVIATIONS GUIDE (US TERMINOLOGY):**

Below are basic explanations of the crochet terms used in this pattern.

- **CHAIN (ch)** With a loop on your hook, yarn over from back to front and pull the loop through
- **STITCH (st)**
- **MAGIC RING (mr)** Wrap yarn over two fingers twice forming an X. Place the hook under the first piece of yarn and then over the second piece of yarn. Pull the outer strand of yarn under the first strand of the X forming a loop. Yarn over once more and draw the yarn through both loops. Work the appropriate number of stitches into the loop by inserting the hook into the main circle space onto the other side, yarning over and pulling through the space in the middle, yarn over the hook and pull through both loops on the hook. Once you have crocheted the number of stitches required, pull the short bit of string to tighten the ring
- **SINGLE CROCHET (sc)** Insert your hook into a stitch, yarn over (I prefer to pull the yarn through with my hook on top of the yarn to create a X effect), pull the yarn through (two chains on the hook), yarn over once more and pull yarn through both loops
- **SLIP ST (slst)** Put your hook through the stitch, yarn over, pull through the stitch, and then pull the yarn through the loop on your hook
- **INCREASE (inc/ hdc inc / tr inc)** Work 2 stitches (sc / hdc/ tr) in the same stitch
- **INV DECREASE (dec)** Insert your hook under the front loop of the first stitch, and then under the front loop of the second stitch. Yarn over and pull through both front loops. Yarn over and pull through the remaining loops
- **HALF DOUBLE CROCHET (hdc)** Yarn over the hook before going into a stitch. Once you yarn over, insert your hook into the stitch, yarn over and pull through. You should have 3 loops on your hook. Yarn over and pull through all 3 loops on the hook.
- **DOUBLE CROCHET (dc)** Yarn over the hook before going into a stitch. Once you yarn over, insert your hook into the stitch, yarn over and pull through. You should have 3 loops on your hook. Yarn over and pull through 2 of the loops. Yarn over once more and pull through the remaining 2 loops.
- **TRIPLE CROCHET (tr)** Yarn over the hook twice before going into a stitch. Insert your hook into the stitch, yarn over and pull through. You should have 4 loops on your hook. Yarn over and pull through 2 of the loops. Yarn over again, and pull through 2 of the loops on the hook. Yarn over once more and pull through the remaining 2 loops.
- **BACK LOOP ONLY (BLO)** Complete the required stitch in the back loop only of the next stitch instead of both top loops.
- **FRONT LOOP ONLY (FLO)** Complete the required stitch in the front loop only of the next stitch instead of both top loops.

**Construction:**

- > All parts of Kiki are made separately and sewn together
- > The joey is made in one piece, once the arms and legs have been made first. Only the ears require sewing.

**Skill level:** beginner-intermediate

**Size:** Kiki measures approximately 16 cm // 6.5 inches, when made with the above materials. Baby Joey measures approximately 7 cm // 3 inches.

- Rnd 24:** (13sc, dec in the next st) x5 (70)
- Rnd 25:** 4 sc, dec in the next st, (8 sc, dec in the next st) x6, 4 sc (63)
- Rnd 26:** (7 sc, dec in the next st) x7 (56)
- Rnd 27:** (5 sc, dec in the next st) x8 (48)
- Rnd 28:** 3 sc, dec in the next st, (6 sc, dec in the next st) x5, 3 sc (42)
- Rnd 29:** (5 sc, dec in the next st) x6 (36)
- Rnd 30:** 2 sc, dec in the next st, (4 sc, dec in the next st) x5, 2 sc (30)
- Rnd 31:** (3 sc, dec in the next st) x6 (24)

Fasten off, and weave in the yarn tail. Place the safety eyes between rounds 14-15 with approximately 8 "whole" visible stitches. Using embroidery thread, sew on two eyebrows, approximately 3 rows above the eyes on a diagonal. Stuff the head. **FIGURE 1**

## NOSE

Use dark brown

- Rnd 1:** start with a mr of 6 (6)
- Rnd 2:** inc in all st (12)
- Rnd 3:** (sc, inc in the next st) x6 (18)
- Rnd 4:** (inc in the next st) x3, 6 sc, (inc in the next st) x3, 6 sc (24)
- Rnd 5-6:** sc in all st (24) *2 rounds*

Fasten off leaving a tail for sewing. The nose will get stuffed during sewing. **FIGURE 1**

## EARS (MAKE 2)

Use light grey

- Rnd 1:** start with a mr of 6 (6)
- Rnd 2:** inc in all st (12)
- Rnd 3:** (sc, inc in the next st) x6 (18)
- Rnd 4:** sc, inc in the next st, (2 sc, inc in the next st) x5, sc (24)
- Rnd 5:** (3 sc, inc in the next st) x6 (30)
- Rnd 6:** 2 sc, inc in the next st, (4 sc, inc in the next st) x5, 2 sc (36)
- Rnd 7:** (5 sc, inc in the next st) x6 (42)
- Rnd 8:** 3 sc, inc in the next st, (6 sc, inc in the next st) x5, 3 sc (48)
- Rnd 9-13:** sc in all st (48) *5 rounds*
- Rnd 14:** (7 sc, inc in the next st) x6 (54)
- Rnd 15:** 4 sc, inc in the next, (8 sc, inc in the next st) x5, 4 sc (60)
- Rnd 16:** sc in all st (60)

Fasten off leaving a tail for sewing. The ears are not stuffed.

## FLUFFY INNER EAR PATCH (MAKE 2)

Use white chenille - 3.00mm hook

*\*Note: due to the nature of working with chenille yarn, the round will begin with the ch 2 method. If you choose to use normal white yarn, you can make a mr of 6 instead*

- Rnd 1:** Make a ch of 2. Working in the first ch, 6 sc (6)
- Rnd 2:** inc in all st (12)
- Rnd 3:** (sc, inc in the next st) x6 (18)
- Rnd 4:** (2 sc, inc in the next st) x6 (24)

Fasten off leaving a tail for sewing. If you are not using a fluffy yarn- you can do an extra round of increases to make it bigger if you would like. ie. **Rnd 5:** (3 sc, inc in the next st) x6 (30)

Assembly:

Sew the fluffy inner white patches to each of the grey ears. The fluffy part is placed in the middle of the ear as it curves, from rounds 2-3 & 14-15. Weave in your yarn tail once complete **FIGURE 2**

**Rnd 5:** (3 sc, inc in the next st) x6 (30)  
**Rnd 6:** 2 sc, inc in the next st, (4 sc, inc in the next st) x5, 2 sc (36)  
**Rnd 7:** (5 sc, inc in the next st) x6 (42)  
**Rnd 8:** 3 sc, inc in the next st, (6 sc, inc in the next st) x5, 3 sc (48)  
**Rnd 9:** (7 sc, inc in the next st) x6 (54)  
**Rnd 10:** 4 sc, inc in the next st, (8 sc, inc in the next st) x5, 4 sc (60)  
**Rnd 11-20:** sc in all st (60) 10 rounds  
**Rnd 21:** (13 sc, dec in the next st) x4 (56)  
**Rnd 22:** sc in all st (56)  
**Rnd 23:** (12 sc, dec in the next st) x4 (52)  
**Rnd 24:** sc in all st (52)  
**Rnd 25:** (11 sc, dec in the next st) x4 (48)  
**Rnd 26:** sc in all st (48)  
**Rnd 27:** (10 sc, dec in the next st) x4 (44)  
**Rnd 28:** sc in all st (44)  
**Rnd 29:** (9 sc, dec in the next st) x4 (40)  
**Rnd 30:** 4 sc, dec in the next st, (8 sc, dec in the next st) x3, 4 sc (36)  
**Rnd 31:** (7 sc, dec in the next st) x4 (32)  
**Rnd 32:** 3 sc, dec in the next st, (6 sc, dec in the next st) x3, 3 sc (28)  
**Rnd 33:** (5 sc, dec in the next st) x4 (24)

Fasten off leaving a tail for sewing. Stuff the body.

## ARMS (MAKE 2)

Begin with dark brown

- Rnd 1:** start with a mr of 6 (6)  
**Rnd 2:** inc in all st (12)  
**Rnd 3:** (sc, inc in the next st) x6 (18)  
**Rnd 4:** (2 sc, inc in the next st) x6 (24)  
**Rnd 5-6:** sc in all st (24) 2 rounds  
**Rnd 7:** (2 sc, dec in the next st) x6 (18)  
**Rnd 8:** (sc, dec in the next st) x6 (12) *change to light grey on the last st of the rnd*

Stuff the arms lightly from rounds 1-18 and leave the remaining rounds empty.

- Rnd 9-24:** sc in all st (12) 16 rounds

Flatten both sides of the arms together and sc though both sides to close shut, leaving a tail for sewing.

## LEGS (MAKE 2)

Begin with dark brown

- Rnd 1:** start with a mr of 6 (6)  
**Rnd 2:** inc in all st (12)  
**Rnd 3:** (sc, inc in the next st) x6 (18)  
**Rnd 4:** (2 sc, inc in the next st) x6 (24)  
**Rnd 5:** (3 sc, inc in the next st) x6 (30)  
**Rnd 6:** (4 sc, inc in the next st) x6 (36)  
**Rnd 7:** (5 sc, inc in the next st) x6 (42)  
**Rnd 8-10:** sc in all st (42) 3 rounds  
**Rnd 11:** (5 sc, dec in the next st) x6 (36)  
**Rnd 12:** sc in all st (36)  
**Rnd 13:** 11 sc, (sc, dec in the next st) x4, 11 sc, dec in the next st (31)  
**Rnd 14:** 10 sc, (dec in the next st) x4, 11 sc, dec in the next st (26) *change to light grey on the last st of the rnd*  
**Rnd 15:** 11 sc, (dec in the next st) x2, 11 sc (24)  
**Rnd 16:** sc in all st (24)  
**Rnd 17:** (4 sc, dec in the next st) x4 (20)  
**Rnd 18:** sc in all st (20)  
**Rnd 19:** (3 sc, dec in the next st) x4 (16)

Stuff the foot, gradually reducing the amount of filling towards the last 5 rounds.

- Rnd 20-30:** sc in all st (16) 11 rounds

Flatten the opening of the leg, and sc through both sides to close. Make sure you close the legs so that they can be positioned on the side of the body in a sitting position, and the decreases you made in rounds 13-15 are facing upwards. Keep a tail for sewing. **FIGURES 3-6**

## Accessories

### SCARF

Use light yellow

**Row 1:** Make a ch of 61. Working in the second ch from the hook, slst, (sc in the next st) x2, (hdc in the next st) x3, (dc in the next st) x3, (tr in the next st) x2, tr inc in the next st, (slst in the next st) x36, tr inc in the next st, (tr in the next st) x2, (dc in the next st) x3, (hdc in the next st) x3, (sc in the next st) x2, slst in the last ch.

Fasten off and weave in your yarn tail. **FIGURE 9**

### FLOWERS

Make 3 in total, one in yellow, one in light pink and one in light orange

**Rnd 1:** start with a mr of 6 (6) slst to the first st

**Rnd 2:** ch 3 and work a dc into the same st you just slst into, repeat this process around (slst in next st, ch 3, dc in the same st) x6 and slst back to the starting petal. You should have 6 petals.

Fasten off and leave a small yarn tail for sewing. **FIGURE 7**

### LEAVES

Make 3 in total using light green

**Row 1:** make a ch of 10, slst in the second ch from the hook, (sc in the next st) x2, (hdc in the next st) x2, (dc in the next st) x2, dc inc in the next st, in the last ch, complete 5 dc into the same st, spinning your work round as you do, so that you can work on the other side of the ch, dc inc in the next st, (dc in the next st) x2, (hdc in the next st) x2, (sc in the next st) x2, slst back to the beginning.

Fasten off and leave a small yarn tail for sewing. **FIGURE 8**

## Assembly

**Ears to the head:** Pin the ears between rounds 5-6 in a curve that extends to rounds 19-20, in line with the magic ring. When your happy with their position, sew them on, and weave in your yarn tail once complete. **FIGURES 12-15**

**Nose to the head:** Pin the nose to the head, centred between the eyes. The nose should sit above the eyes slightly between rounds 12-13 & 21-22 in an oval like shape. Sew the nose on, and stuff it just before you close. Weave in your yarn tail once complete. **FIGURES 11-12**

**Body to the head:** Using the yarn tail from the body, sew the two pieces together, ensuring that just before you close, you add any additional stuffing you may require. Weave in your yarn tail once complete.

**Arms to the body:** Pin the arms to the sides of the body, just under the head, between rounds 32-33. The arms should be in line with the ears. Sew them on, and weave in your yarn tail once complete. **FIGURES 16-17**

**Legs to the body:** Pin the legs to the sides of the body, in line with the arms. You want to sew the legs between rounds 9-10 and 16-17 of the body. Once you have sewn the stitches of the vertical closing of the leg onto these rounds, sew a few stitches horizontally on both the top and bottom of the leg to secure the legs to the body (refer to the dotted lines on figure 20) (otherwise, when the koala is not in a seated position the legs will be loose). Weave in the yarn tail once complete. **FIGURES 17-20**

**Leaves & Flowers:** Pin the leaves to the top of the head, all next to each other, in the space that has formed between the two ears. The leaves will be sewn on just in front of the magic ring. Weave in your yarn tails once the leaves have been sewn on. Now pin each of the flowers onto the top of the head, slightly overlapping on the leaves. Sew them on, and weave in your yarn tail once complete. **FIGURES 10-11**

Add some blush to the sides of the koalas eyes for extra cuteness! Tie the scarf to the Koala's neck.

## Joey Koala

The koala is made all in one piece, except for the ears. You must make the arms and legs before commencing the body/head.

### LEGS (MAKE 2)

Begin with dark brown

**Rnd 1:** start with a mr of 5 (5)

**Rnd 2:** inc in all st (10)

**Rnd 3:** sc in all st (10) *change to light grey on the last st of the rnd*

**Rnd 4-8:** sc in all st (10) 5 rounds

*Stuff the bottom of the legs and leave the grey parts unstuffed. Fasten off and weave in the yarn tail.*

### ARMS (MAKE 2)

Begin with dark brown

**Rnd 1:** start with a mr of 6 (6)

**Rnd 2:** (sc, inc in the next st) x3 (9)

**Rnd 3:** sc in all st (9) *change to light grey on the last st of the rnd*

**Rnd 4-7:** sc in all st (9) 4 rounds

*Stuff the bottom of the arms and leave the grey parts unstuffed. Fasten off and weave in the yarn tail.*

### BODY

Use grey

**Rnd 1:** start with a mr of 6 (6)

**Rnd 2:** inc in all st (12)

**Rnd 3:** (sc, inc in the next st) x6 (18)

**Rnd 4:** (2 sc, inc in the next st) x6 (24)

### BODY CONTINUED

**Rnd 5:** Hold the first leg against the body, and work 5 sc through both sides of the leg as well as the body, sc in the next 7 st of the body, now place the second leg against the body and work the next 5 sc through both sides of the leg as well as the body, sc in the next 7 st (24) **FIGURES 21-23**

**Rnd 6-7:** sc in all st (24) 2 rounds

**Rnd 8:** (2 sc, dec in the next st) x6 (18)

**Rnd 9:** sc in all st (18)

**Rnd 10:** Hold the first arm against the body, and work 4 sc through both sides of the arm as well as the body, sc in the next 5 st of the body, hold the second arm against the body and work 4 sc through both sides of the arm as well as the body, sc in the next 5 st of the body (18) **FIGURE 24**

**Rnd 11:** (sc, dec in the next st) x6 (12)

*Stuff the body. We will now begin to form the head.*

### HEAD

**Rnd 12:** inc in all st (24)

**Rnd 13:** (sc, inc in the next st) x12 (36)

**Rnd 14-15:** sc in all st (36) 2 rounds

**Rnd 16:** (4 sc, dec in the next st) x6 (30)

**Rnd 17:** (3 sc, dec in the next st) x6 (24)

**Rnd 18-20:** sc in all st (24) 3 rounds

*Stuff the head and continue throughout.*

**Rnd 21:** (2 sc, dec in the next st) x6 (18)

**Rnd 22:** (sc, dec in the next st) x6 (12)

**Rnd 23:** dec in all st (6)

*Fasten off, leaving a small yarn tail. Close the opening of the head by weaving your yarn tail through the remaining FLO stitches, and pull tight to close. Weave in the yarn tail.*

## EARS (MAKE 2)

Use grey

**Rnd 1:** work 6 sc into a mr (6)

**Rnd 2:** inc in all st (12)

**Rnd 3-4:** sc in all st (12) 2 rounds

Fasten off, leaving a tail for sewing.

## BABY BLANKET

Use pink

\*Ch 1 and turn at the end of each round between rounds 1-13

**Row 1:** Make a ch of 42. Working in the third ch from the hook, hdc into each ch along. (40)

**Row 2- 14:** hdc into each st (40) 13 rounds

Fasten off and weave in your yarn tail once complete.

## Joey Assembly

**Ears to the Head:** Sew the ears onto the head between rounds 3-4 & 8-9 with a slight curve. The ears should sit just in front of the closing round. Weave in the yarn tail once complete. **FIGURES 25-27**

**Embroider the Eyes:** Using black embroidery thread, sew on eyes between rounds 7-8 with a slight dip down between rounds 8-9. **FIGURES 25 & 27**

**Embroider the Nose:** Using your dark brown yarn, sew a nose between the eyes. It should begin between rounds 8-9 and extend down to between rounds 10-11. Weave in the yarn tail once complete. **FIGURES 25 & 27**

Now wrap your joey into its blanket.

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# Lola & Louie

## THE AUSSIE NATIVE BIRDS

A blue sparrow handmade pattern

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## NOTES FOR THE PATTERN

- Instructions are written in rounds & rows, using US terminology.
- Change colours when indicated using the invisible colour change method on the last stitch before the new colour.
- There are multiple colour changes for Louie the Kookaburra. You can choose any method for maintaining the colours - you can carry the yarn as you go, or cut each strand when the colours change, and tie up. Do what is easiest for you. (Refer to **pages 15-16** for additional help)
- The number of stitches you should have at the end of each round is written in the brackets like so, (20).
- Make sure you pull your stitches tight and always use a stitch marker, or a piece of string, to mark the start of each round.
- Most importantly, have fun whilst crocheting this pattern, and feel free to reach out if you have any issues along the way.

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## WHAT YOU WILL NEED

- Black embroidery thread
- A 2.25 mm crochet hook
- Safety eyes (8 mm)
- Toy stuffing
- Yarn needle
- Stitch Markers
- Pins
- Scissors

For the yarn colours you will need, see [page 3](#) for Lola the Cockatoo & see [page 8](#) for Louie the Kookaburra.

*You can use any yarn of your choice, just adjust your crochet hook according to the yarn.*

## CROCHET TERMS USED // ABBREVIATIONS GUIDE (US TERMINOLOGY):

**Below are basic explanations of the crochet terms used in this pattern.**

- **CHAIN (ch)** With a loop on your hook, yarn over from back to front and pull the loop through
- **STITCH (st)**
- **MAGIC RING (mr)** Wrap yarn over two fingers twice forming an X. Place the hook under the first piece of yarn and then over the second piece of yarn. Pull the outer strand of yarn under the first strand of the X forming a loop. Yarn over once more and draw the yarn through both loops. Work the appropriate number of stitches into the loop by inserting the hook into the main circle space onto the other side, yarning over and pulling through the space in the middle, yarn over the hook and pull through both loops on the hook. Once you have crocheted the number of stitches required, pull the short bit of string to tighten the ring
- **SINGLE CROCHET (sc)** Insert your hook into a stitch, yarn over (I prefer to pull the yarn through with my hook on top of the yarn to create a X effect), pull the yarn through (two loops on the hook), yarn over once more and pull the yarn through both loops.
- **SLIP ST (slst)** Put your hook through the stitch, yarn over, pull through the stitch, and then pull the yarn through the loop on your hook
- **INCREASE (inc / dc inc)** Work 2 single crochets in the same stitch / Work 2 double crochets in the same stitch
- **INV DECREASE (dec)** Insert your hook under the front loop of the first stitch, and then under the front loop of the second stitch. Yarn over and pull through both front loops. Yarn over and pull through the remaining loops
- **HALF DOUBLE CROCHET (hdc)** Yarn over the hook before going into a stitch. Once you yarn over, insert your hook into the stitch, yarn over and pull through. You should have 3 loops on your hook. Yarn over and pull through all 3 loops on the hook.
- **DOUBLE CROCHET (dc)** Yarn over the hook before going into a stitch. Once you yarn over, insert your hook into the stitch, yarn over and pull through. You should have 3 loops on your hook. Yarn over and pull through 2 of the loops. Yarn over once more and pull through the remaining 2 loops.
- **BACK LOOP ONLY (BLO)** Complete the required stitch in the back loop only of the next stitch instead of both top loops.
- **FRONT LOOP ONLY (FLO)** Complete the required stitch in the front loop only of the next stitch instead of both top loops.

### Construction:

- > The head and body are worked in one piece.
- > The toes and legs are made separately, but will be assembled together and then sewn to the body.
- > All other pieces of the birds are made separate and are sewn on.

**Skill level:** Lola the cockatoo is more beginner & intermediate friendly, and Louie the Kookaburra is more intermediate.

**Size:** Approximately 7.5" / 19 cm

- Rnd 1:** start with a mr of 6 (6)
- Rnd 2:** inc in all st (12)
- Rnd 3:** (sc, inc in the next st) x6 (18)

- Rnd 5:** (3 sc, inc in the next st) x6 (30)

- Rnd 8:** 3 sc, inc in the next st, (6 sc, inc in the next st) x5, 3 sc (48)

- Rnd 14:** (17 sc, inc in the next st) x3 (57)

- Rnd 24:** (17 sc, dec) x3 (54)
- Rnd 25:** (7 sc, dec) x6 (48)
- Rnd 26:** 3 sc, dec, (6 sc, dec) x5, 3 sc (42)
- Rnd 27:** (5 sc, dec) x6 (36)
- Rnd 28:** (2 sc, dec) x9 (27)
- Rnd 29:** (sc, dec) x9 (18)

Stuff the head. Embroider eyes onto round 20 of the head. There are roughly 7 sts between each embroidered eye, and each embroidered eye spans across 6 sts. **FIGURE 1**

We will now continue on to form the body.

## BODY

Continue with pink

- Rnd 30:** inc in all st (36)
- Rnd 31:** sc in all st (36)
- Rnd 32:** (5 sc, inc in the next st) x6 (42)
- Rnd 33:** sc in all st (42)
- Rnd 34:** (sc, inc in the next st) x6, 30 sc (48)
- Rnd 35:** (2 sc, inc in the next st) x6, 30 sc (54) *change to cream on the last st of the rnd*
- Rnd 36:** sc in all st (54) *change to orange on the last st of the rnd*
- Rnd 37:** (3 sc, inc in the next st) x6, 30 sc (60)
- Rnd 38-41:** sc in all st (60) 4 rounds
- Rnd 42:** (9 sc, inc in the next st) x6 (66)
- Rnd 43:** (10 sc, inc in the next st) x6 (72)
- Rnd 44-45:** sc in all st (72) 2 rounds
- Rnd 46:** (10 sc, dec) x6 (66)
- Rnd 47:** (4 sc, dec) x11 (55)
- Rnd 48:** sc in all st (55)
- Rnd 49:** (9 sc, dec) x5 (50)
- Rnd 50:** 4 sc, dec, (8 sc, dec) x4, 4 sc (45)

## BODY - CONTINUED

- Rnd 51:** (7 sc, dec) x5 (40)
- Rnd 52:** 3 sc, dec, (6 sc, dec) x4, 3 sc (35)  
*Stuff the body and continue throughout*
- Rnd 53:** (5 sc, dec) x5 (30)
- Rnd 54:** (3 sc, dec) x6 (24)
- Rnd 55:** sc, dec, (2 sc, dec) x5, sc (18)
- Rnd 56:** (sc, dec) x6 (12)
- Rnd 57:** dec 6 times (6)

Fasten off, leaving a yarn tail. With a needle and your yarn tail, weave the yarn through the FLO of the remaining stitches and pull tight to close. Weave in the yarn tail once complete.

## BEAK

Use light grey

- Rnd 1:** start with a mr of 6 (6)
- Rnd 2:** sc in all st (6)
- Rnd 3:** (sc, inc in the next st) x3 (9)
- Rnd 4:** sc in all st (9)
- Rnd 5:** (2 sc, inc in the next st) x3 (12)
- Rnd 6:** sc in all st (12)
- Rnd 7:** (3 sc, inc in the next st) x3 (15)
- Rnd 8:** sc in all st (15)

Fasten off leaving a tail for sewing. Stuff the beak lightly.

## FEATHER PIECES (MAKE 3)

Make 1 in light grey, 1 in orange, and 1 in cream

- Rnd 1:** start with a mr of 6 (6)
- Rnd 2:** inc in all st (12)
- Rnd 3:** (sc, inc in the next st) x6 (18)
- Rnd 4-5:** sc in all st (18) 2 rounds
- Rnd 6:** (sc, dec) x6 (12)
- Rnd 7:** sc in all st (12)

Stuff the work lightly

- Rnd 8:** dec 6 times (6)

Flatten the work and sc through both sides to close. Leave a yarn tail for sewing.

**WINGS (MAKE 2)***Begin with orange*

- Rnd 1:** start with a mr of 6 (6)  
**Rnd 2:** (sc, inc in the next st) x3 (9)  
**Rnd 3:** (2 sc, inc in the next st) x3 (12)  
**Rnd 4:** sc in all st (12)  
**Rnd 5:** (3 sc, inc in the next st) x3 (15)  
**Rnd 6-7:** sc in all st (15) *2 rounds*  
**Rnd 8:** (4 sc, inc in the next st) x3 (18)  
**Rnd 9:** sc, inc in the next st, (2 sc, inc in the next st) x5, sc (24) *change to pink on the last st of the rnd*  
**Rnd 10:** (3 sc, inc in the next st) x6 (30)  
**Rnd 11:** sc in all st (30)  
**Rnd 12:** in the BLO, sc in all st (30) *change to cream on the last st of the rnd*  
**Rnd 13:** in the BLO, sc in all st (30)  
**Rnd 14:** in the BLO, 2 sc, inc in the next st, (4 sc, inc in the next st) x5, 2 sc (36)  
**Rnd 15-18:** sc in all st (36) *4 rounds*  
**Rnd 19:** 2 sc, dec, (4 sc, dec) x5, 2 sc (30)  
**Rnd 20:** sc in all st (30)  
**Rnd 21:** (3 sc, dec) x6 (24)  
**Rnd 22:** sc in all st (24)  
**Rnd 23:** sc, dec, (2 sc, dec) x5, sc (18)  
**Rnd 24:** sc in all st (18)  
**Rnd 25:** (sc, dec) x6 (12)  
**Rnd 26:** dec 6 times (6)

*Fasten off leaving a tail for sewing. The wings are not stuffed. With your sewing needle, weave the yarn tail through the FLO of the remaining stitches and pull tight to close. Keep the yarn tail for sewing the wing to the body. **FIGURE 3***

**Wing details:**

*Position the wing with the orange part (bottom of the wing) closest to you, and the cream part (top of the wing) away from you.*

- ♦ Using pink, reattach the yarn to the front loop of the first stitch of round 12 **FIGURE 2**. Once attached, ch 3 and slst into the next st. Continue, (ch 3, slst in the next st) for the remainder of round 12.
- ♦ When you get to the where you started, you will now work the following pattern 5 times in the front loops of the stitches from round 13: (sc, hdc, dc inc, hdc, sc, slst) x5, when you get to where you started, change the colour to cream.
- ♦ For the last round, in the front loops of the stitches from round 14, repeat this pattern: [sc, (dc, ch 2, dc -all worked in the same stitch), sc] x12. Slst into the first sc once you are back to the start, fasten off, and weave in the yarn tail. **FIGURE 3**

*Use a small amount of yarn in the colours yellow and pink to create some details on the wings. **FIGURES 22-23***



**TAIL**

*Begin with light grey. You will make 3 small pieces, that will be joined together to form the main tail. Fasten off and weave in the yarn tails for the first 2 pieces that you make. Do not fasten off after you have completed the third piece, instead, you will continue to follow the instructions to join all the pieces.*

- Rnd 1:** start with a mr of 6 (6)  
**Rnd 2:** inc in all st (12)  
**Rnd 3-4:** sc in all st (12) *2 rounds*  
*Fasten off and weave in the yarn tail for the first 2 pieces. Do not stuff.*

**Rnd 5:** with the 3rd piece still on your hook, pick up one of the loose pieces and sc into any st to join the pieces **FIGURES 4 & 5**. Mark this st as the beginning of the round. Continue to sc in the next 5 st. Pick up the remaining loose piece, and sc into any st to join **FIGURE 6**. You will now sc in the next 11 sts of this piece, work the next 6 st into the back of the middle piece, then sc into the first piece you started with, and sc in the remaining 11 sts of the first piece. All 3 pieces are now joined. (6 sc + 12 sc + 6 sc + 12 sc = 36)

- Rnd 6-7:** sc in all st (36) *2 rounds*  
**Rnd 8:** 13 sc, dec, 16 sc, dec, 3 sc (34) *change to cream on the last st of the rnd*  
**Rnd 9:** sc in all st (34) *change to pink on the last st of the rnd*  
**Rnd 10:** 14 sc, dec, 15 sc, dec, sc (32) *change to orange on the last st of the rnd*  
**Rnd 11:** 11 sc, (dec) x2, 12 sc, (dec) x2, sc (28)  
**Rnd 12:** sc in all st (28)  
**Rnd 13:** 11 sc, (dec) x2, 9 sc, (dec) x2 (24)  
**Rnd 14-16:** sc in all st (24) *3 rounds*

*You should be at the side of the work. If not, remove or add any sc so that you are at the side. Flatten the work and sc through both sides to close. The tail is not stuffed. Leave a tail for sewing. **FIGURE 7***

## LEGS & FEET

Use light grey for all parts

### Main Leg (make 2)

**Rnd 1:** start with a mr of 5 (5)

**Rnd 2:** inc in all st (10)

**Rnd 3:** in the BLO, sc in all st (10)

**Rnd 4-10:** sc in all st (10) 7 rounds

Fasten off and leave a yarn tail for sewing. Stuff the leg firmly.

### Toes (make 3)

\*Each foot consists of 3 toes that are joined together. For the first 2 toes you make, fasten off and weave in the yarn tail. For the 3rd toe, you will not fasten off, instead you will follow the foot instructions.

**Rnd 1:** start with a mr of 5 (5)

**Rnd 2:** inc in all st (10)

**Rnd 3-4:** sc in all st (10) 2 rounds

Fasten off and weave in the yarn tail. For the 3rd piece, do not fasten off, instead, continue onto the foot instructions below.

### Foot

You will now join the 3 toes together to make the foot.

**Rnd 1:** With one of the toes still on your hook (the 3rd toe), sc into the first loose toe to join them together **FIGURE 9.1**, sc around the toe with another 4 sc (5 in total). Pick up the second loose toe, and sc into it to join together **FIGURE 9.2**. Then sc around the toe with another 9 sc (10 in total). You will then work into the back of the middle toe, with 5 sc, then 10 sc into the back of the toe you started with (5 sc + 10 sc + 5 sc + 10 sc = 30)

**Rnd 2:** (4 sc, dec) x5 (25)

**Rnd 3:** (3 sc, dec) x5 (20)

**Rnd 4:** (2 sc, dec) x5 (15)

**Rnd 5:** (sc, dec) x5 (10)

**Rnd 6:** dec 5 times (5)

Fasten off leaving a yarn tail. Weave your needle and yarn tail through the FLO of the remaining stitches, and pull tight to close. **FIGURE 9.3** The foot is not stuffed. Bring your yarn tail to the side of the work as we will use that yarn tail to sew the leg to the foot.

**Complete the instructions for the toes and feet again to make the second completed foot.**

### Assembly of the legs & feet:

Pin the leg to the last several rounds of the foot, with the toes facing away from the leg. Using the yarn tail from the foot, and the remaining front loops of round 3 of the leg, sew the two pieces together **FIGURE 9.4** Weave in your yarn tail once complete. Remember to keep the leg yarn tail as you will need it for sewing to the body. **FIGURE 8**

## BOW

Use dark pink

Make a ch of 42

**Row 1:** working in the third ch from the hook, hdc in all st (40) ch 1 and turn

**Row 2- 5:** hdc in all st (40) ch 1 and turn. 4 rows

**Row 6:** hdc in all st (40)

Fasten off leaving a yarn tail. Using a needle, sew the two ends of the work together to form a circular band **FIGURE 10**. Flatten the work, and wrap the yarn tail around the centre of the work several times to create the bow shape **FIGURE 11**. Keep the yarn tail as we will use it to sew the bow to the bird.

### Bow strip:

Use dark pink

Make a ch of 16

**Row 1:** working in the second ch from the hook, sc in all st (15) ch 1 and turn

**Row 2:** sc in all st (15) ch 1 and turn

**Row 3:** sc in all st (15)

Fasten off leaving a yarn tail. Wrap the bow strip around the middle of the main bow work and sew the two sides of the strip together. I would also recommend sewing a few stitches of the strip to the main part of the bow to secure it. Weave in the yarn tail once complete. **FIGURE 12**

## FLOWERS

Make 2 in total, one in yellow and one in green

**Rnd 1:** start with a mr of 6, and slst to the first st (6)

**Rnd 2:** ch 3 and work a dc into the same st you just slst into, repeat this process around (slst in the next st, ch 3, dc in the same st) x6 and slst back to the starting petal. You should have 6 petals.

Fasten off and leave a small yarn tail for sewing.

## Assembly

Weave in all yarn tails as you go.

**Beak to the head:** Pin the beak between the embroidered eyes. The beak should sit between rounds 20-21 & 23-24. Sew it in place. **FIGURES 13 & 14**

**Head Feathers to the head:** Pin the grey feather piece between rounds 2-3 of the head, just in front of the magic ring facing towards the beak, and sew it in place. **FIGURE 15** Then place the cream piece in front of the grey piece, between rounds 3-4. Sew it in place. **FIGURE 16** Lastly, add the orange piece behind the grey piece, and sew it in place between rounds 1-2, right in front of the magic ring. **FIGURE 17**

**Legs to the body:** Pin the legs on either side of the closing ring of the body. They should sit between rounds 52-56, and remain in line with each other. Your cockatoo should be able to stand unaided when positioned correctly. If you need to make the legs more stable, you can add more stuffing, or use pipe cleaners. Sew them on. **FIGURES 18-21**

**Wings to the body:** Position the wings on either side of the body, slightly in front of the legs and almost in line with the head feathers. The top part of the wing should be positioned between rounds 32-33 of the body. Only sew a few stitches of the wings curve (where the dotted lines are **FIGURES 22-24**) and leave the rest. Make sure that both wings are lined equally - it helps to look down on your cockatoo from above to see how even they are.

**Tail to the body:** Pin the tail at the back of the body, between rounds 46-47. Sew it in place. You can also embroider extra details to the tail if you want. Tip: if you cannot get your cockatoo to stand, you can always sew the tail lower and it can be used as leverage to help your bird stand. **FIGURE 25-26**

**Flowers to the head:** Pin the flowers next to the head feathers and sew them in place. I opted to have them positioned opposite to the bow. **FIGURE 27**

**Bow to the body:** Pin the bow to the neck of the bird, just in front of one of the wings, and sew it in place.

**Rnd 3:** (cream) (sc, inc in the next st) x2, (beige brown) (sc, inc in the next st) x2, (cream) (sc, inc in the next st) x2 (18)  
**Rnd 4:** (cream) sc, inc in the next st, 2 sc, inc in the next st, 2 sc (beige brown) inc in the next st, 2 sc, inc in the next st, sc, (cream) sc, inc in the next st, 2 sc, inc in the next st, sc (24)  
**Rnd 5:** (cream) (3 sc, inc in the next st) x2, 2 sc, (beige brown) sc, inc in the next st, 3 sc, inc in the next st, (cream) (3 sc, inc in the next st) x2 (30)  
**Rnd 6:** (cream) 2 sc, inc in the next st, (4 sc, inc in the next st) x2, (beige brown) 4 sc, inc in the next st, 2 sc, (cream) 2 sc, inc in the next st, 4 sc, inc in the next st, 2 sc (36)  
**Rnd 7:** (cream) (5 sc, inc in the next st) x2, 5 sc, (beige brown) inc in the next st, 5 sc, inc in the next st, (cream) (5 sc, inc in the next st) x2 (42)  
**Rnd 8:** (cream) 3 sc, inc in the next st, (6 sc, inc in the next st) x2, sc, (beige brown) 5 sc, inc in the next st, 3 sc, (cream) 3 sc, inc in the next st, 6 sc, inc in the next st, 3 sc (48)  
**Rnd 9:** (cream) (7 sc, inc in the next st) x2, 7 sc, (beige brown) inc in the next st, 7 sc, inc in the next st, (cream) (7 sc, inc in the next st) x2 (54)  
**Rnd 10:** (cream) 25 sc, (beige brown) 10 sc, (cream) 19 sc (54)  
**Rnd 11:** (cream) 26 sc, (beige brown) 9 sc, (cream) 19 sc (54)  
**Rnd 12:** (cream) 27 sc, (beige brown) 7 sc, (cream) 20 sc (54)  
**Rnd 13:** (cream) 28 sc, (beige brown) 6 sc, (cream) 22 sc (54)  
**Rnd 14:** (cream) 17 sc, inc in the next st, 11 sc, (beige brown) 5 sc, (cream) sc, inc in the next st, 17 sc, inc in the next st (57)  
**Rnd 15-16:** (cream) 30 sc, (beige brown) 5 sc, (cream) 22 sc (57) 2 rounds  
**Rnd 17:** (cream) 31 sc, (beige brown) 5 sc, (cream) 21 sc (57)  
**Rnd 18:** (cream) 30 sc, (beige brown) 6 sc, (cream) 21 sc (57)  
**Rnd 19:** (cream) 15 sc, (dark brown) 15 sc, (beige brown) 6 sc, (dark brown) 15 sc, (cream) 6 sc (57)  
**Rnd 20-21:** (cream) 14 sc, (dark brown) 16 sc, (beige brown) 6 sc, (dark brown) 16 sc, (cream) 5 sc (57) 2 rounds

## (HEAD CONTINUED)

- Rnd 22:** (cream) 15 sc, (dark brown) 15 sc, (beige brown) 7 sc, (dark brown) 14 sc, (cream) 6 sc (57)  
**Rnd 23:** (cream) 16 sc, (dark brown) 34 sc, (cream) 7 sc (57)

Continue with cream only

- Rnd 24:** (17 sc, dec) x3 (54)  
**Rnd 25:** (7 sc, dec) x6 (48)  
**Rnd 26:** 3 sc, dec, (6 sc, dec) x5, 3 sc (42)  
**Rnd 27:** (5 sc, dec) x6 (36)  
**Rnd 28:** (2 sc, dec) x9 (27)  
**Rnd 29:** (sc, dec) x9 (18)

Stuff the head. Place the safety eyes between rounds 21-22. There should be roughly 10 sts between each eye.

FIGURE 3. We will now continue on to form the body.

## BODY

**Rnd 31:** sc in all st (36)  
**Rnd 32:** (5 sc, inc in the next st) x6 (42)  
**Rnd 33:** sc in all st (42)  
**Rnd 34:** (sc, inc in the next st) x6, 30 sc (48)  
**Rnd 35:** (2 sc, inc in the next st) x6, 30 sc (54)  
**Rnd 36:** sc in all st (54)  
**Rnd 37:** (3 sc, inc in the next st) x6, 30 sc (60)  
**Rnd 38-41:** sc in all st (60) 4 rounds  
**Rnd 42:** (9 sc, inc in the next st) x6 (66)  
**Rnd 43:** (10 sc, inc in the next st) x6 (72)  
**Rnd 44-45:** sc in all st (72) 2 rounds  
**Rnd 46:** (10 sc, dec) x6 (66)  
**Rnd 47:** (4 sc, dec) x11 (55)  
**Rnd 48:** sc in all st (55)  
**Rnd 49:** (9 sc, dec) x5 (50)  
**Rnd 50:** 4 sc, dec, (8 sc, dec) x4, 4 sc (45)  
**Rnd 51:** (7 sc, dec) x5 (40)  
**Rnd 52:** 3 sc, dec, (6 sc, dec) x4, 3 sc (35)  
**Rnd 53:** (5 sc, dec) x5 (30)

Stuff the body and continue throughout

- Rnd 54:** (3 sc, dec) x6 (24)  
**Rnd 55:** sc, dec, (2 sc, dec) x5, sc (18)  
**Rnd 56:** (sc, dec) x6 (12)  
**Rnd 57:** dec 6 times (6)

Fasten off, leaving a yarn tail. With a needle and your yarn tail, weave the yarn through the FLO of the remaining stitches and pull tight to close. Weave in the yarn tail once complete.

## BEAK

Use dark grey

- Rnd 1:** start with a mr of 6 (6)  
**Rnd 2:** (sc, inc in the next st) x3 (9)  
**Rnd 3:** sc in all st (9)  
**Rnd 4:** (2 sc, inc in the next st) x3 (12)  
**Rnd 5-8:** sc in all st (12) 4 rounds  
**Rnd 9:** (3 sc, inc in the next st) x3 (15)

Fasten off, leaving a yarn tail for sewing. Stuff the beak lightly.

### Underside of the beak:

Use pink

- Row 1:** ch 5, working in the second ch from the hook, 4 sc (4) ch 1 and turn
- Row 2:** inc, 3 sc (5) ch 1 and turn
- Row 3:** inc, 4 sc (6) ch 1 and turn
- Row 4:** sc in all st (6) ch 1 and turn
- Row 5:** inc, 5 sc (7) ch 1 and turn
- Row 6:** sc in all st (7) ch 1 and turn
- Row 7:** sc in all st (7)

Fasten off, leaving a yarn tail.

### BEAK ASSEMBLY

Pin the pink flat part to the underside of the beak, and sew it in place. Refer to **FIGURES 1 & 2** as a guide. Weave in the pink yarn tail once complete.

- Rnd 4:** sc in all st (12)
- Rnd 5:** (3 sc, inc in the next st) x3 (15)
- Rnd 6-7:** sc in all st (15) 2 rounds
- Rnd 8:** (4 sc, inc in the next st) x3 (18)
- Rnd 9:** sc, inc in the next st, (2 sc, inc in the next st) x5, sc (24) *change to ombre on the last st of the rnd*
- Rnd 10:** (3 sc, inc in the next st) x6 (30)
- Rnd 11:** sc in all st (30)
- Rnd 12:** in the BLO, sc in all st (30) *change to dark brown on the last st of the rnd*
- Rnd 13:** in the BLO, sc in all st (30)
- Rnd 14:** in the BLO, 2 sc, inc in the next st, (4 sc, inc in the next st) x5, 2 sc (36)
- Rnd 15-18:** sc in all st (36) 4 rounds
- Rnd 19:** 2 sc, dec, (4 sc, dec) x5, 2 sc (30)
- Rnd 20:** sc in all st (30)
- Rnd 21:** (3 sc, dec) x6 (24)
- Rnd 22:** sc in all st (24)
- Rnd 23:** sc, dec, (2 sc, dec) x5, sc (18)
- Rnd 24:** sc in all st (18)
- Rnd 25:** (sc, dec) x6 (12)
- Rnd 26:** dec 6 times (6)

Fasten off leaving a tail for sewing. The wings are not stuffed. With your sewing needle, weave the yarn tail through the FLO of the remaining stitches and pull tight to close. Keep the yarn tail for sewing the wing to the body.

### Wing details:

Position the wing with the dark grey part (bottom of the wing) closest to you, and the dark brown part (top of the wing) away from you.

- ◆ Using ombre, reattach the yarn to the front loop of the first stitch of round 12 **FIGURE 4**. Once attached, ch 3 and slst into the next st. Continue, (ch 3, slst in the next st) for the remainder of round 12.
- ◆ When you get to the where you started, you will now work the following pattern 5 times in the front loops of the stitches of round 13: (sc, hdc, dc inc, hdc, sc, slst) x5, when you get to where you started, change the colour to dark brown.
- ◆ For the last round, in the front loops of the stitches of round 14, repeat this pattern: [sc, (dc, ch 2, dc - all worked in the same st) sc] x 12. Slst into the first sc once you are back to the start, fasten off, and weave in the yarn tail.

Use a small amount of yarn in the colours dark blue, light blue and gold to create some details on the wings.

## TAIL

Begin with dark brown. You will make 3 small pieces, that will get joined together to form the main tail. Fasten off and weave in the yarn tails for the first 2 pieces that you make. Do not fasten off after you have completed the third piece, instead, you will continue to follow the instructions to join all the pieces.

**Rnd 1:** start with a mr of 6 (6)

**Rnd 2:** inc in all st (12)

**Rnd 3-4:** sc in all st (12) 2 rounds

Fasten off and weave in the yarn tail for the first 2 pieces. Do not stuff.

**Rnd 5:** with the 3rd piece still on your hook, pick up one of the loose pieces and sc into any st to join the pieces **FIGURE 7**. Mark this st as the beginning of the round. Continue to sc in the next 5 st. Then, pick up the remaining loose piece, and sc into any st **FIGURE 8**. You will now sc in the next 11 st of this piece. Working into the back of the middle piece, sc in the next 6 st, then sc into the first piece you started with, and sc in the remaining 11 sts of the first piece. All 3 pieces are now joined. (6 sc + 12 sc + 6 sc + 12 sc = 36)

**Rnd 6-7:** sc in all st (36) 2 rounds

**Rnd 8:** 13 sc, dec, 16 sc, dec, 3 sc (34) *change to ombre on the last st of the rnd*

**Rnd 9:** sc in all st (34) *change to dark grey on the last st of the rnd*

**Rnd 10:** 14 sc, dec, 15 sc, dec, sc (32) *change to cream on the last st of the rnd*

**Rnd 11:** 11 sc, (dec) x2, 12 sc, (dec) x2, sc (28)

**Rnd 12:** sc in all st (28)

**Rnd 13:** 11 sc, (dec) x2, 9 sc (dec) x2 (24)

**Rnd 14-16:** sc in all st (24) 2 rounds

You should be at the side of the work. If not, remove or add any sc so that you are at the side. Flatten the work and sc through both sides to close. The tail is not stuffed. Leave a tail for sewing. **FIGURE 9** Using dark blue, light blue and gold yarn, embroider details onto the tail, and weave in any yarn tails.

## LEGS & FEET

Use dark beige for all parts

Legs (make 2)

**Rnd 1:** start with a mr of 5 (5)

**Rnd 2:** inc in all st (10)

**Rnd 3:** in the BLO, sc in all st (10)

**Rnd 4-10:** sc in all st (10) 7 rounds

Fasten off and leave a yarn tail for sewing. Stuff the leg firmly.

Toes (make 3)

\*Each foot consists of 3 toes that are joined together. For the first 2 toes you make, fasten off and weave in the yarn tail. For the 3rd toe, you will not fasten off, instead you will follow the foot instructions.

**Rnd 1:** start with a mr of 5 (5)

**Rnd 2:** inc in all st (10)

**Rnd 3-4:** sc in all st (10) 2 rounds

Fasten off and weave in the yarn tail. For the 3rd piece, do not fasten off, instead, continue onto the foot instructions below.

Foot

You will now join the 3 toes together to make the foot.

**Rnd 1:** with one of the toes still on your hook (the 3rd toe), sc into the first loose toe to join them together **FIGURE 10**, then sc around the toe with another 4 sc (5 in total). Pick up the second loose toe, and sc into it to join together. Then sc around the toe with another 9 sc (10 in total). **FIGURE 11** You will then work into the back of the middle toe, with 5 sc, then 10 sc into the back of the toe you started with (5 sc + 10 sc + 5 sc + 10 sc = 30)

**Rnd 2:** (4 sc, dec) x5 (25)

**Rnd 3:** (3 sc, dec) x5 (20)

**Rnd 4:** (2 sc, dec) x5 (15)

**Rnd 5:** (sc, dec) x5 (10)

**Rnd 6:** dec 5 times (5)

Fasten off leaving a yarn tail. Weave your needle and yarn tail through the FLO of the remaining stitches, and pull tight to close. **FIGURE 12** The foot is not stuffed. Bring your yarn tail to the side of the work as we will use that yarn tail to sew the leg to the foot.

**Complete the instructions for the toes and feet again to make the second completed foot.**

*Assembly of the legs & feet:*

Pin the leg to the last several rounds of the foot, with the toes facing away from the leg. Using the yarn tail from the foot, and the front loops of round 3 of the leg, sew the two pieces together **FIGURE 13** Weave in your yarn tail once complete. Remember to keep the leg yarn tail as you will need it for sewing to the body. **FIGURE 14**

## BAG

Use gold

**Rnd 1:** start with a ch of 11. Working in the second ch from the hook, inc, 8 sc, 4 sc into the last ch, turn you work around so you can work on the other side of the ch, 8 sc, inc in the last ch (24)

**Rnd 2:** (inc in the next st) x2, 8 sc, (inc in the next st) x4, 8 sc, (inc in the next st) x2 (32)

**Rnd 3-10:** sc in all st (32) 8 rounds

**Rnd 11:** (6 sc, dec) x4 (28)

**Rnd 12:** (5 sc, dec) x4 (24)

**Rnd 13:** 2 sc. Stop the round here- you should be at one side of the bag- if not, sc any amount of stitches to get you to the side of the bag.

FIGURE 15

We will now form the handle of the bag:

Ch 55, then insert your hook into a stitch on the opposite side of the bag to attach the chain, and slst. I had 11 unworked stitches on either side of the bag. Rotate your work round slightly so that you can now sc back down the ch to the other side, and slst back into the starting st where you begun the chain. FIGURE 16

*Fasten off and weave in the yarn tail.*

## GUM LEAVES

Use dark green

Make a ch of 23. Working in the second ch from the hook, sc, dc in the next 4 ch, (dc inc) x2, hdc in the next 4 ch, sc in the next 2 ch, slst in the next 2 ch. The first leaf is completed. Now, ch 16. Working in the second ch from the hook, repeat the same pattern: sc, dc in the next 4 ch, (dc inc) x2, hdc in the next 4 ch, sc in the next 2 ch, slst in the next 2 ch. The second leaf is completed. Slst into the next ch along on the starting chain, (next to the first leaf), then slst in all remaining chains. FIGURE 17

*Fasten off. Weave in the yarn tail if you do not wish to sew the leaves anywhere on the kookaburra.*

## GUMNUTS (MAKE 2)

Use gold

**Rnd 1:** start with a mr of 6 (6)

**Rnd 2-3:** sc in all st (6) 2 rounds

*Flatten the work and sc through both sides to close.*

*The gum nut is not stuffed. Using the yarn tail, sew each gum nut to the middle of the gum leaves and weave in the yarn tail. FIGURE 18*

## SCARF

Use light blue

**Row 1:** start with a chain of 86. Working in the third ch from the hook, hdc into each ch across (84) ch 1 and turn

**Row 2:** hdc into each st (84)

*Fasten off and weave in the yarn tail.*

# Assembly

Weave in all yarn tails as you go.

**Beak:** Pin the beak between the eyes. The beak should sit between rounds 20-21 & 23-24. Sew it in place making sure the pink side remains on the bottom. FIGURES 22-25.

**Head Feathers:** Sew the larger piece between rounds 3-4 of the head, just in front of the magic ring facing towards the beak. Place the smaller piece in front of the larger piece, between rounds 4-5 and sew it on. Lastly, using some gold & dark brown yarn, add some details to the beige brown strip on the kookaburra's head. FIGURES 19-21.

**Eyebrows:** Using black thread, embroider some eyebrows 3 rows above the eyes on a diagonal. FIGURE 24

**Legs:** Pin the legs on either side of the closing ring of the body. They should sit between rounds 52-56, and remain in line with each other. Your kookaburra should be able to stand unaided when positioned correctly. If you need to make the legs more stable, you can add more stuffing, or use pipe cleaners. Sew them in place. FIGURES 26-29.

**Wings:** Position the wings on either side of the body, slightly in front of the legs and almost in line with the head fluff. The top part of the wing should be positioned between rounds 31-32 of the body. Only sew a few stitches of the wings curve (where the dotted lines are FIGURES 31-32) and leave the rest. Make sure that both wings are lined equally - it helps to look down on your kookaburra from above to see how even they are.

**Tail:** Pin the tail at the back of the body, between rounds 46-47. Sew it in place. Note: if you cannot get your kookaburra to stand, you can always sew the tail lower and it can be used as leverage to help your bird stand. FIGURE 30

**Bag & Scarf:** Wrap the scarf around the kookaburra's neck, and put on the bag. If you don't want to sew the gum leaves to the kookaburra, place them inside the bag. FIGURE 33

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## QUICK COLOUR CHANGE GUIDE

When changing colours, I recommend that you introduce the new colour on the last st of the round / on the last st before the new colour starts, using the invisible colour change method. This is done by working into the sc like you normally would, but when you have two loops on your hook, instead of yarning over with the colour you have been using to pull through the loops, you would pull the new colour through.



After using the invisible colour change, there are several ways you may like to work your colour changes for Louie. You can use another method than those listed here if you like. Do what works for you, and what you find is easiest. You may also choose a method that works better if you're limited with the amount of yarn you have, as some methods can waste more yarn. Remember: there are a variety of videos and online tutorials you can access if you are still unsure.

### Cut and tie off the yarn

Use the invisible colour change every time you need to introduce a new colour, and simply drop the yarn you don't need to use anymore, cut it, and tie it off. If you choose to do this, make sure you take your time at the end of each round to tie off the yarn you have cut (for safety and for neatness).

### Carry the yarn and work with it

Once you've changed colours, you won't cut the yarn, instead you will continue to keep it, by holding the yarn you don't need behind the single crochets you are working in the new colour. The downside of using this method is that sometimes the other colour can peep through your work, and may even make your work feel, and look bulkier. You can still opt to cut and tie off the yarn when you've finished the main colour changing required for the round you are working on.



The cream yarn remains flush against the work, being held to the inside of the work, whilst using the brown




Make sure when you do your sc in the working colour, that you do them over the colour you are hiding




By keeping the colour, you can see it slightly peek out through the work

### Keep the yarn, don't work with it, but still tie it off when you're done

This is the method I chose to do for Louie. It involves changing the colour, and dropping the yarn you don't need to use. You will only work with the new colour, but you can pick up the other colour again when you need to change colours. To make sure this works correctly, make sure you hold the yarn you're about to introduce against the work, and pull it a little, to keep it 'slack/loose' and to refrain from pulling it tight. (This will be important when you get to the middle of the kookaburra's head where there are larger gaps between colour changes). If you do not give the yarn some 'slack' and the tension is too tight, it will pull on your work and change the shape. At the end of each round, I cut the colour I don't need for a while and tie it off.



See how I kept the dark brown yarn behind the white, and when I needed it again, I pulled it across on the inside of the work and made sure it wasn't too tight?



Example of what to do: give the yarn some slack, so it is loose before working with it. It helps to hold the yarn down with one finger whilst performing the next sc



Example of what **NOT** to do: if you pull the yarn too tightly it will alter the shape of your work, and make it difficult to stuff later

Example only:

I've been using cream, and in this new round, I need to change to dark brown. I have used the invisible colour change method to introduce dark brown **FIGURE 1**. I have dropped the cream yarn and left it. After working some single crochets in dark brown, I now need to complete a few single crochets in beige. I use the invisible colour change method, drop the dark brown and work only using the beige **FIGURE 2**. After a few single crochets, I need to change back to dark brown, so i use the invisible colour change method, I pick up the dark brown that I left earlier. I pull on the dark brown yarn a little to make it loose, then continue to work with the dark brown. I have dropped the beige yarn and I no longer need to use it. I will tie off the beige yarn for this round. I've continued using dark brown, but I now need to switch back to cream for the remainder of the round. I will change colours, but pull on the cream yarn to make it loose before working with it **FIGURE 3**. I no longer need to use dark brown until the next round. I will cut the dark brown yarn and tie it off.

I have dropped the dark brown, changed to beige, worked 4 sc in beige, dropped the beige yarn, and re introduced the dark brown by pulling it across with some loose tension

I now need to use the cream again. I have brought it across from the start where I first dropped it. Before using it, I have pulled on the yarn to make it loose. You'll also see the beige and dark brown yarn dropped

# Pickles

## THE CORNISH PIXIE

Pickles is a daring and adventurous Cornish pixie who is often responsible for messing up craft rooms and tangling yarn. Cornish Pixies are electric blue magical creatures that enjoy causing lots of mischief. These devilish creatures are capable of incredible feats of strength, like lifting people up by their ears and dropping them to the floor.

Useful tip: If your Cornish pixie gets a little out of control, you can use the spell “Immobulus” to safely capture and re-home your pixie. The charm ‘peskipiksi pesternomi’ is rather useless.

## NOTES FOR THE PATTERN

- Instructions are written in rounds & rows, using US terminology.
- The number of stitches you should have at the end of each round is written in the brackets like so, (20).
- Make sure you pull your stitches tight and always use a stitch marker, or a piece of string, to mark the start of each round.
- Most importantly, have fun whilst crocheting this pattern, and feel free to reach out if you have any issues along the way.

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## WHAT YOU WILL NEED

I have used DMC Natura Just Cotton with the colours:

- 026 - Blue Jeans - dark blue (2x 50g)
- 001 - Ibiza - white (25 g)
- 056 - Azur - light blue (less than 25g)
- 006 - Rose Layet - pink (less than 25g)
- Black embroidery thread
- A 2.25 mm crochet hook
- Safety eyes (7 mm)
- Toy stuffing
- Yarn needle
- Stitch Markers
- Pins
- Scissors

*You can use any yarn of your choice, just adjust your crochet hook according to the yarn.*

## CROCHET TERMS USED // ABBREVIATIONS GUIDE (US TERMINOLOGY):

**Below are basic explanations of the crochet terms used in this pattern.**

- **CHAIN (ch)** With a loop on your hook, yarn over from back to front and pull the loop through
- **STITCH (st)**
- **MAGIC RING (mr)** Wrap yarn over two fingers twice forming an X. Place the hook under the first piece of yarn and then over the second piece of yarn. Pull the outer strand of yarn under the first strand of the X forming a loop. Yarn over once more and draw the yarn through both loops. Work the appropriate number of stitches into the loop by inserting the hook into the main circle space onto the other side, yarning over and pulling through the space in the middle, yarn over the hook and pull through both loops on the hook. Once you have crocheted the number of stitches required, pull the short bit of string to tighten the ring
- **SINGLE CROCHET (sc)** Insert your hook into a stitch, yarn over (I prefer to pull the yarn through with my hook on top of the yarn to create a X effect), pull the yarn through (two loops on the hook), yarn over once more and pull the yarn through both loops
- **SLIP ST (slst)** Put your hook through the stitch, yarn over, pull through the stitch, and then pull the yarn through the loop on your hook
- **INCREASE (inc / dc inc)** Work 2 single crochets / or 2 double crochets into the same stitch
- **INV DECREASE (dec)** Insert your hook under the front loop of the first stitch, and then under the front loop of the second stitch. Yarn over and pull through both front loops. Yarn over and pull through the remaining loops

### Construction:

> All pieces of the pixie are made separately and sewn together.

**Skill level:** beginner

**Size:** Pixie measures approximately 24 cm / 9.5 inches (top of ears/antennae to feet) when made with the above materials.

## HEAD

Use dark blue

- Rnd 1: start with a mr of 6 (6)
- Rnd 2: inc in all st (12)
- Rnd 3: (sc, inc in the next st) x6 (18)
- Rnd 4: (2 sc, inc in the next st) x6 (24)
- Rnd 5: (3 sc, inc in the next st) x6 (30)
- Rnd 6: (4 sc, inc in the next st) x6 (36)
- Rnd 7: (5 sc, inc in the next st) x6 (42)
- Rnd 8: (6 sc, inc in the next st) x6 (48)
- Rnd 9: (7 sc, inc in the next st) x6 (54)
- Rnd 10-15: sc in all st (54) 6 rounds
- Rnd 16: (8 sc, inc in the next st) x6 (60)
- Rnd 17-20: sc in all st (60) 4 rounds
- Rnd 21: (14 sc, inc in the next st) x4 (64)
- Rnd 22: sc in all st (64)
- Rnd 23: (14 sc, dec) x4 (60)
- Rnd 24: (8 sc, dec) x6 (54)
- Rnd 25: (4 sc, dec) x9 (45)

**REFER TO FIGURE 1:** Insert the safety eyes between rounds 16-17 with approximately 10 stitches between each eye (8 visible stitches). Using black embroidery thread, sew eyebrows above the eyes across 2-3 stitches. With some light blue yarn, sew back and forth across 3 sts between rounds 17-18 to create the nose. Using black embroidery thread, sew a mouth onto rnd 20, spanning across 13 stitches. Using white yarn, embroider 2 teeth under the mouth on round 21. Stuff the head and continue throughout.

- Rnd 26: (3 sc, dec) x9 (36)
- Rnd 27: (4 sc, dec) x6 (30)
- Rnd 28: (3 sc, dec) x6 (24)
- Rnd 29: (2 sc, dec) x6 (18)

Fasten off and weave in the yarn tail. Add any additional stuffing you require.

## ANTENNAE (MAKE 2)

Use dark blue

- Rnd 1: start with a mr of 6 (6)
- Rnd 2: inc in all st (12)
- Rnd 3: (sc, inc in the next st) x6 (18)
- Rnd 4-5: sc in all st (18) 2 rounds
- Rnd 6: (sc, dec) x6 (12)
- Rnd 7: (2 sc, dec) x3 (9)
- Rnd 8-12: sc in all st (9) 5 rounds

Fasten off, leaving a yarn tail for sewing. Stuff the antennae.

Eyebrows 4 rows above the eyes on a diagonal

Eyes have 10 sts (or 8 visible) between them. Go back and forth with light blue yarn to create the nose

Embroider the mouth like the below diagram. Use white yarn to form the teeth just under the mouth



Use dark blue

- Rnd 1: start with a mr of 6 (6)
- Rnd 2: (2 sc, inc in the next st) x2 (8)
- Rnd 3: sc in all st (8)
- Rnd 4: (3 sc, inc in the next st) x2 (10)
- Rnd 5: sc in all st (10)
- Rnd 6: (sc, inc in the next st) x5 (15)
- Rnd 7: (2 sc, inc in the next st) x5 (20)
- Rnd 8: sc in all st (20)
- Rnd 9: (3 sc, inc in the next st) x5 (25)
- Rnd 10-11: sc in all st (25) 2 rounds
- Rnd 12: (4 sc, inc in the next st) x5 (30)
- Rnd 13-18: sc in all st (30) 6 rounds
- Rnd 19: (4 sc, dec) x5 (25)
- Rnd 20: (3 sc, dec) x5 (20)
- Rnd 21: (2 sc, dec) x5 (15)

Flatten the work, and sc through both sides to close. The ears are not stuffed. Leave a yarn tail for sewing.

## CHEEKS (MAKE 2)

Use pink

- Rnd 1: start with a mr of 5 (5)
- Rnd 2: inc in all st (10)

Slst to the first sc, fasten off leaving a yarn tail for sewing.

## ARMS (MAKE 2)

Use dark blue

- Rnd 1: start with a mr of 6 (6)
- Rnd 2: inc in all st (12)
- Rnd 3-25: sc in all st (12) 23 rounds

Fasten off, leaving a yarn tail for sewing. The arms are not stuffed.

## FINGERS (MAKE 2)

Use dark blue. Make a ch of 5

**Row 1:** working in the second ch from the hook, slst, ch 3, working in the second ch from the hook, work 2 sc back down the ch, slst into the next ch, repeat this twice more: ch 3, 2 sc back down the ch, slst into the next st. **FIGURE 2**

*Fasten off, leaving a yarn tail for sewing. In preparation for assembly, sew the fingers to the base of each arm, on one side, between rounds 1-2. Weave in the yarn tail once complete.*

- Rnd 9:** 6 sc, (dec) x6, 6 sc (18)
- Rnd 10:** sc in all st (18)

*Stuff the legs and continue throughout. You will need to leave the last 3 rounds free of stuffing.*

- Rnd 15: (5 sc, dec) x2 (12)
- Rnd 16: (4 sc, dec) x2 (10)

# Assembly

Weave in all yarn tails as you go.

**Ears to the head:** Fold the ears in half sewing both sides of the ears between rounds 10-11. The ears should sit in line with the magic ring of the head. **FIGURES 5-9**

**Antennae to the head:** Sew the antennae above the ears between rounds 5-6 & 7-8. **FIGURES 5-7 & 9**

**Cheeks to the head:** Sew the cheeks between rounds 19-20 & 22-23 to the side of the head. There should be 3 stitches between the end of the mouth and the cheek. **FIGURE 28**

**Body to the head:** Sew the open part of the body to the head. Be sure to add any additional stuffing before closing. **FIGURE 10**

**Belly patch to the body:** Sew the belly patch to the middle of the body, central to the face. The top of the belly patch should sit between rounds 28-29 and extend downwards to rounds 13-14. **FIGURES 11 & 26**

**Arms to the body:** Sew the arms to the sides of the body between rounds 32-33. They should sit in line with the ears/antennae. **FIGURES 12, 25 & 26**

**Legs to the body:** Sew the legs to the sides of the body between rounds 10-11 & 14-15. You will only sew along the top curve of the leg and nothing else (refer to the dotted lines in **FIGURES 14 & 16**). The legs should sit in line with the arms, and the curve of the feet should be facing away from the body, **FIGURES 13 & 15**.

**Wings to the body:** Begin by sewing the big wing between rounds 30-31 & 23-24 of the body, as close as possible to the arm and on a slight diagonal **FIGURES 17-19 & 20**. Now, add the closing stitches of the smaller wing to the bottom horizontal side of the big wing (**FIGURES 17 & 18**) and sew together **FIGURE 21-23**. Now secure the small wing by sewing to the body **FIGURE 23**. Refer also to: **FIGURES 24 & 25**

**Tail to the body:** Sew the tail between rounds 11-12 & 13-14 of the back of the body, central between the legs. **FIGURE 27**

- Black embroidery thread
- A 2.75 mm crochet hook
- Safety eyes (9 mm)
- Yarn needle, Stitch Markers, Pins, Polyester Fibre Fill, Scissors

You can use any yarn of your choice, just adjust your crochet hook according to the yarn fibre.

**SLIP ST (slst)** Put your hook through the stitch, yarn over, pull through the stitch, and then pull the yarn through the loop on your hook

**INCREASE (inc/ hdc inc)** Work 2 single crochets / or 2 half double crochets in the same stitch

**INV DECREASE (dec)** Insert your hook under the front loop of the first stitch, and then under the front loop of the second stitch. Yarn over and pull through both front loops. Yarn over and pull through the remaining loops

- **HALF DOUBLE CROCHET (hdc)** Yarn over the hook before going into a stitch. Once you yarn over, insert your hook into the stitch, yarn over and pull through. You should have 3 loops on your hook. Yarn over and pull through all 3 loops on the hook.

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## HEAD - BEGIN WITH LIGHT GREY

- Rnd 1: start with a magic ring of 7 (7)  
Rnd 2: inc in all st (14)  
Rnd 3: (sc, inc in the next st) x7 (21)  
Rnd 4: sc, inc in the next st, (2 sc, inc in the next st) x6, sc in the next st (28)  
Rnd 5: (3 sc, inc in the next st) x7 (35)  
Rnd 6: 2 sc, inc in the next st, (4 sc, inc in the next st) x6, 2 sc (42)  
Rnd 7: (5 sc, inc in the next st) x7 (49)  
Rnd 8: 3 sc, inc in the next st, (6 sc, inc in the next st) x6, 3 sc (56)  
Rnd 9-14: sc in all st (56) 6 rounds  
Rnd 15: (7 sc, inc ) x7 (63)  
Rnd 16-19: sc in all st (63) 4 rounds  
Rnd 20: 14sc, inc, (15 sc, inc in the next st) x3 (67)  
Rnd 21-22: sc in all st (67) 2 rounds  
Rnd 23: 14sc, dec, **change to white**, (15 sc, dec in the next st) x2, **change to grey**, 15 sc, dec (63)  
Rnd 24: 7 sc, dec, sc 5, **change to white**, sc 2, dec, (sc 7, dec in the next st) x3, sc 3, **change to grey**, sc 4, dec, sc 7, dec (56)  
Rnd 25: (sc 5, dec in the next st) x2, **change to white**, (sc 5, dec in the next st) x4 , sc, **change to grey**, 4 sc, dec, 5 sc, dec (48)  
Rnd 26: 2 sc, dec, 4 sc, dec, 2 sc, **change to white**, 2 sc, dec, (4 sc, dec in the next st) x5, 2 sc (40)  
Rnd 27: (3 sc, dec in the next st) x8 (32)  
Rnd 28: sc, dec in the next st (2 sc, dec in the next st) x7, sc (24)

Fasten off, and weave in the yarn tail. Stuff the head. Place the safety eyes between rounds 16-17 with approximately 8 visible stitches between them. FIGURE 1



## SNOUT - BEGIN WITH LIGHT GREY

- Rnd 1: start with a magic ring of 6 (6)  
Rnd 2: inc in all st (12)  
Rnd 3: (sc, inc in the next st) x3, **change to white**, (sc, inc in the next st) x3 **change to grey** (18)  
Rnd 4: (2 sc, inc in the next st) x3, **change to white**, (2 sc, inc in the next st) x3 **change to grey** (24)  
Rnd 5: (3 sc, inc in the next st) x3, **change to white**, (3 sc, inc in the next st) x3 **change to grey** (30)  
Rnd 6-8: 15 sc, **change to white**, 15 sc, **change to grey** (30) 3 rounds  
Rnd 7: (4 sc, inc in the next st) x3, **change to white**, (4 sc, inc in the next st) x3 **change to grey** (36)

Fasten off, and leave a tail for sewing (I left a small tail of both colours for sewing, that way you can use white to sew the white part on and vice versa). The snout will be stuffed when it is sewn onto the face. Using black yarn or embroidery thread, sew a nose over the first 4 rounds of the snout, with a line of black going down to round 5 in the opposite direction.

## EARS - USING LIGHT GREY - MAKE 2

- Rnd 1: start with a magic ring of 6 (6)
- Rnd 2: sc in all st (6)
- Rnd 3: (sc, inc in the next st) x3 (9)
- Rnd 4: (2 sc, inc in the next st) x3 (12)
- Rnd 5: (3 sc, inc in the next st) x3 (15)
- Rnd 6: (4 sc, inc in the next st) x3 (18)
- Rnd 7: (5 sc, inc in the next st) x3 (21)
- Rnd 8: sc in all st (21)
- Rnd 9: (2 sc, inc in the next st) x7 (28)
- Rnd 10-16: sc in all st (28) 7 rounds
- Rnd 17: (2 sc, dec in the next st) x7 (21)
- Rnd 18: sc in all st (21)



Flatten your work, and sc through both sides to close the ear. The ears are not stuffed. Once the ears are closed, fasten off, leaving a tail for sewing. Fold the ear into half and sew together both sides. Remember to keep a yarn tail for sewing to the head later. FIGURES 4 & 5

## BODY - BEGIN WITH LIGHT GREY

- Rnd 1: start with a magic ring of 6 (6)
- Rnd 2: inc in all st (12)
- Rnd 3: (sc, inc in the next st) x6 (18)
- Rnd 4: (2 sc, inc in the next st) x6 (24)
- Rnd 5: (3 sc, inc in the next st) x6 (30)
- Rnd 6: (4 sc, inc in the next st) x6 (36)
- Rnd 7: (5 sc, inc in the next st) x6 (42)
- Rnd 8: (6 sc, inc in the next st) x6 (48)
- Rnd 9: (7 sc, inc in the next st) x6 (54)
- Rnd 10-13: sc in all st (54) 4 rounds
- Rnd 14: (7 sc, dec in the next st) x6 (48)
- Rnd 15-16: sc in all st (45) 2 rounds
- Rnd 17: (14 sc, dec in the next st) x3 (45)
- Rnd 18-19: sc in all st (45) 2 rounds
- Rnd 20: (13 sc, dec in the next st) x3 (42)
- Rnd 21: 16 sc, change to white, sc 6, change to grey, sc 20 (42)
- Rnd 22: 15 sc, change to white, sc 8, change to grey, sc 19 (42)
- Rnd 23: 12 sc, dec, change to white, sc 10, change to grey, 2 sc, dec, 12 sc, dec (39)
- Rnd 24: 11 sc, change to white, dec, sc 11, change to grey, dec, sc 11, dec (36)
- Rnd 25: 10 sc, change to white, sc 14, change to grey, sc 12 (36)
- Rnd 26: 9 sc, change to white, sc 16, change to grey, sc 11 (36)
- Rnd 27: 8 sc, change to white, 2 sc, dec, 10 sc, dec, 2 sc, change to grey, sc 8, dec (33)
- Rnd 28: 7 sc, change to white, 2 sc, dec, (9 sc, dec in the next st) x2 (30)
- Rnd 29: sc in all st (30)
- Rnd 30: (3 sc, dec in the next st) x6 (24)

Fasten off leaving a long tail for sewing. Stuff the body.

## ARMS - BEGIN WITH WHITE - MAKE 2

- Rnd 1: start with a magic ring of 6 (6)
- Rnd 2: inc in all st (12)
- Rnd 3: (sc, inc in the next st) x6 (18)
- Rnd 4: (2 sc, inc in the next st) x6 (24)
- Rnd 5-6: sc in all st (24) 2 rounds
- Rnd 7: 10 sc, (dec in the next st) x3, 8 sc (21)

Rnd 8: 11 sc, dec in the next st, 8 sc (20)  
Rnd 9: 10 sc, dec in the next st, 8 sc (19)  
Rnd 10: 10 sc, dec in the next st, 7 sc (18) *change to grey on the last st of the round*  
Rnd 11 : (4 sc, dec in the next st) x3 (15)  
Rnd 12: (3 sc, dec in the next st) x3 (12)  
13-28: sc in all st (12) *16 rounds*

Stuff the arms from rounds 1-8 lightly, and leave rows 9 onwards unstuffed. Fasten off, leaving a tail for sewing.

## LEGS - BEGIN WITH WHITE - MAKE 2

---

Rnd 1: start with a magic ring of 6 (6)  
Rnd 2: inc in all st (12)  
Rnd 3: (sc, inc in the next st) x6 (18)  
Rnd 4: (2 sc, inc in the next st) x6 (24)  
Rnd 5: (3 sc, inc in the next st) x6 (30)  
Rnd 6-7: sc in all st (30) *2 rounds*  
Rnd 8: (3 sc, dec in the next st) x6 (24)  
Rnd 9-10: sc in all st (24) *2 rounds*  
Rnd 11: 6 sc, (dec in the next st) x6, 6 sc (18) *change to grey on the last st of the round*  
Rnd 12-13: sc in all st (18) *2 rounds*  
Rnd 14: 6 sc, (sc, dec in the next st) x3, 3 sc (15)  
Rnd 15-24: sc in all st (15) *10 rounds*

Stuff the bottom part of the legs up until round 13, and leave the rest of the leg. Once you have finished stuffing the leg, you will close the leg shut by flattening both sides and working enough sc to close. You may want to sc additional stitches after round 24 to get your leg in a good position to close. Make sure that you flatten the leg like the below photos so that the legs sit in the correct position and the white part of the leg faces the correct direction.

Rnd 1: start with a magic ring of 6 (6)  
Rnd 2: (sc, inc in the next st) x3 (9)  
Rnd 3: (2 sc, inc in the next st) x3 (12)  
Rnd 4-5: sc in all st (12) *2 rounds*  
Rnd 5: sc in all st (12) *change to light grey on the last st of the round*  
Rnd 6: (3 sc, inc in the next st) x3 (15)  
Rnd 7: (4 sc, inc in the next st) x3 (18)  
Rnd 8: (5 sc, inc in the next st) x3 (21)  
Rnd 9: (6 sc, inc in the next st) x3 (24)  
Rnd 10-11: sc in all st (24) *2 rounds*  
Rnd 12: (6 sc, dec in the next st) x3 (18)  
Rnd 13-14: sc in all st (18) *2 rounds*

- Rnd 15: (5 sc, dec in the next st) x3 (15)
- Rnd 16-17: sc in all st (15) *2 rounds*
- Rnd 18: (4 sc, dec in the next st) x3 (12)
- Rnd 19: (3 sc, dec in the next st) x3 (9)

Stuff the tail. Flatten both sides and sc through both sides to close. Leave a tail for sewing.

## HOOD - USING RED

---

\*\* You may find it easier to complete the assembly of your wolf first before making the hood\*\*

### BEGIN MAKING THE HOOD PART FIRST

- Rnd 1: start with a magic ring of 6 (6)
- Rnd 2: inc in all st (12)
- Rnd 3: (sc, inc in the next st) x6 (18)
- Rnd 4: (2 sc, inc in the next st) x6 (24)
- Rnd 5: (3 sc, inc in the next st) x6 (30)
- Rnd 6: (4 sc, inc in the next st) x6 (36)
- Rnd 7: (5 sc, inc in the next st) x6 (42)
- Rnd 8: (6 sc, inc in the next st) x6 (48)
- Rnd 9: (7 sc, inc in the next st) x6 (54)
- Rnd 10: (8 sc, inc in the next st) x6 (60)
- Rnd 11: (9 sc, inc in the next st) x6 (66)
- Rnd 12: (10 sc, inc in the next st) x6 (72)
- Rnd 13: (11 sc, inc in the next st) x6 (78)
- Rnd 14: (12 sc, inc in the next st) x6 (84)
- Rnd 15: (13 sc, inc in the next st) x6 (90)
- Rnd 16: sc 20, chain 12, skip 8 sts, sc 12\*, chain 12, skip 8 sts, sc 42 (98)
- Rnd 17: sc in all st (98)
- Rnd 18: (13 sc, inc in the next st) x7 (105)
- Rnd 19-22: sc in all st (105) *4 rounds*
- Rnd 23: (13 sc, dec in the next st) x7 (98)
- Rnd 24: (5 sc, dec in the next st) x 14 (84)
- Rnd 25: sc in all st (84)

Fasten off and weave in the end.

\*Note: If you find that there isn't enough space between the chain spaces of the hood and where you have sewn your ears onto the wolf's head, you can adjust the number of sc between them, as it will not affect the rest of the instructions.

### NOW WE WILL MAKE THE CAPE OF THE HOOD

- Make a chain of 19. Ch 1 and turn at the end of rounds 1-6
- Rnd 1: starting in the second chain from the hook, hdc into each chain (18)
  - Rnd 2: (3 hdc, hdc inc in the next st) x6 (24)
  - Rnd 3: (4 hdc, hdc inc in the next st) x6 (30)
  - Rnd 4: (5 hdc, hdc inc in the next st) x6 (36)
  - Rnd 5: (6 hdc, hdc inc in the next st) x6 (42)
  - Rnd 6: (7 hdc, hdc inc in the next st) x6 (48)
  - Rnd 7: (8 hdc, hdc inc in the next st) x6 (54)

We will now form the first tie of the hood: chain 15, and starting in the second chain from the hook, slst back down (14). FIGURE 9

Now, we will sc down the vertical side of the work, to neaten the border. FIGURE 9. Once you have worked down one of the vertical sides, place the open part of your hood against round 1 of the cape. Line up the stitches from both the hood and the cape somewhere in the middle of the hood where you would like them to join. It may be helpful to put the hood onto your toy first and use pins to mark where the cape should sit on the hood. Sc through both the cape, and the hood to join together. FIGURES 10 - 12. Once you have used all the sc of round 1 of the cape, you will sc down the remaining vertical side to neaten the border. FIGURE 13. When you reach the bottom, we will make the last tie for the hood. Ch 15, and starting in the second ch from the hook, slst back down (14), fasten off and weave in the end. FIGURE 14.

## ASSEMBLY

**EARS:** Sew the ears between rounds 6-7 of the head, in line with the magic ring. FIGURES 15, 16-17


**SNOUT:** Sew the snout to the head between rounds 15-16 & 25-26, with the grey part on top. You will want to try and line up the colour changes of the snout with the head as much as you can. Stuff the snout just before you finish closing, and weave in your tail ends. FIGURES 14-15

## ASSEMBLY CONTINUED

**EYEBROWS:** Using black embroidery thread, sew some eyebrows above the eyes, across 2-3 stitches. FIGURES 14-15

**BODY TO THE HEAD:** Sew the body to the head, ensuring you line up the front of the face with the white patch of the body. Make sure you are happy with the stuffing before closing completely. Weave in your tail end.

**ARMS:** Position the arms to the side of the body on a diagonal with the top part of the arm being sewed between rounds 29-30 and the lowest part between rounds 25-26. When flattening your arms to sew on, I pinched them in such a way that the base of the paws curved inwards slightly. You can sew the arms in any position, these instructions are only a guide. Weave in your tail end. FIGURES 18-19 & 21

**LEGS:** Position the legs to the sides of the body, and sew them between rounds 5-6 and 11-12. Your legs should be sitting slightly behind the magic ring, towards where the tail will be. Your arms should be able to sit nicely in between the legs. Weave in your tail end. FIGURES 18-21

**TAIL:** Position the tail between rounds 11-12 of the body, centred at the back of the body. Sew it into place, and weave in your tail end. FIGURE 21

Now decorate your wolf by putting on its hood!

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
