## 92801 Stjärnfall – pullover

The Stjärnfall (Shooting Star) pullover was inspired by the traditional lice sweaters (lusekofter). These lice sweaters often have a very simple motif on the body but more detailed patterns on the shoulders and chest. This version combines the lice with other well-known motifs such as eight-petal roses and “spruce twigs,” with a gradual shift from the lice to the detailed patterning on the shoulders. The pullover has a modified raglan shaping with most of the decreases on the sleeves, so that the shoulders are shaped similarly to the characteristic and traditional set-in sleeves.

**YARN** Järbo 2 tr Ull (2-Ply Wool) (100% wool, 328 yd/300 m / 100 g)

### ALTERNATE YARN SUGGESTIONS

Alpacka Solo (100% alpaca, 183 yd/167 m / 50 g)

Elise (60% cotton, 40% acrylic, 184 yd/170 m / 50 g)

Junior (70% premium acrylic, 30% polyamide, 183 yd/168 m / 50 g)

**GAUGE** Approx. 21 sts x 30 rnds in stockinette on U. S. 4 / 3.5 mm needles = 4 x 4 in / 10 x 10 cm. Adjust needle size to obtain correct gauge if necessary.

**SIZES** XS (S, M, L, XL, 2XL, 3XL, 4XL)

**SIZES-EU** 42 (44-46, 48-50, 52-54, 56-58, 60-62, 64-66, 68-70)

**GARMENT CHEST** Approx. 33 (34¾-36¼, 37¾-39½, 41-42½, 44-45¾, 47¼-49¾, 50½-52, 53½-55¼) in / 84 (88-92, 96-100, 104-108, 112-116, 120-126, 128-132, 136-140) cm

**GARMENT LENGTH** Approx. 22½ (24, 24½, 26, 26½, 28¼, 29¼, 30¼) in / 57 (61, 62, 66, 67, 72, 74, 77) cm

**GARMENT SLEEVE LENGTH** Approx. 18½ (19¼, 19¼, 19¼, 20, 20, 20½, 20½) in / 47 (49, 50, 50, 51, 51, 52, 52) cm

### YARN AMOUNTS AND COLORS

**Color 1:** Approx. 300 (400, 500, 500, 600, 600, 700, 700) g (color 74102, Natural White)

**Color 2:** Approx. 100 (100, 100, 200, 200, 200, 200, 200) g (color 74108, Ash)

**NEEDLES** U. S. sizes 2.5 and 4 / 3 and 3.5 mm: circulars 32 in / 80 cm for body and 48 in / 120 cm for yoke + sets of 5 dpn

**NOTIONS** Tapestry needle, stitch markers

**LEVEL OF DIFFICULTY** \*\*\*

**Matching Mittens:** 92802

### STITCHES AND TECHNIQUES

**Charts:** Always read the chart from right to left, beginning at lower right corner.

### BODY

With smaller size circular and color 1, CO 162 (174, 194, 210, 226, 246, 262, 278) sts. Join, being careful not to twist cast-on row; pm for beginning of rnd. Work 20 rnds in k1tbl, p1 ribbing.

Change to larger size circular and knit 1 rnd, increasing 14 sts evenly spaced around = 176 (188, 208, 224, 240, 260, 276, 292) sts.

Divide body for front and back with a purl st st each side: P1, k87 (93, 103, 111, 119, 129, 137, 145) = front, p1, k87 (93, 103, 111, 119, 129, 137, 145) = back.

Continue, following chart.

**NOTE** Work the stitches and rows inside the red frame and repeat them until you reach the shoulders. Begin on st no. 5 (2, 13, 9, 5, 16, 12, 8) on the chart. St no. 16 should be at the center front and center back. Work in stockinette following chart as est until body measures 15¾ (15¾, 16¼, 16½, 16½, 17¼,

17¼, 18¼) in / 40 (40, 41, 42, 42, 44, 44, 46) cm from cast-on row. With a purl stitch in each side as before. Make sure you end on chart row 4.

**Shape Armholes:** Centered on each side, place on holders 15 (15, 17, 17, 19, 21, 21, 23) sts = purl st + 7 (7, 8, 8, 9, 10, 10, 11) sts on each side of purl st. A total of 146 (158, 174, 190, 202, 218, 234, 246) sts rem for body before the yoke. Set body aside while you knit the sleeves.

### SLEEVES

With smaller size dpn and color 1, CO 40 (42, 48, 52, 56, 60, 64, 68) sts. Divide sts onto dpn and join; pm for beginning of rnd. Work 20 rnds in k1tbl, p1 ribbing.

Change to larger size dpn and knit 1 rnd, increasing 6 sts evenly spaced around = 46 (48, 54, 58, 62, 66, 70, 74) sts. Always purl the last st of rnd for center of underarm.

Now work following chart.

**NOTE** Work the stitches and rows inside the red frame and repeat them until you reach the shoulders. Begin on st no. 2 (1, 14, 12, 10, 8, 6, 4) on the chart. St no. 8 should be at the center of sleeve. Shape sleeve by increasing on each side of center purl st on underarm on every 7<sup>th</sup> rnd until there are 72 (76, 84, 90, 98, 104, 110, 118) sts. Work the sleeves until the length is 18½ (19¼, 19¾, 19¾, 20, 20, 20½, 20½) in / 47 (49, 50, 50, 51, 51, 52, 52) cm.

Make sure you end on chart row 4 as on body.

**Shape Underarm:** Centered on underarm purl st, place on holders 15 (15, 17, 17, 19, 21, 21, 23) sts = purl st + 7 (7, 8, 8, 9, 10, 10, 11) sts on each side of purl st. A total of 57 (61, 67, 73, 79, 83, 89, 95) sts rem for sleeve before the yoke.

Set sleeve aside while you knit second sleeve the same way.

### JOINING FOR YOKE

Now arrange all the body and sleeve pieces on long, larger size circular. All the pieces should be on chart row 4 before joining. Begin with right side of front and knit to armhole, pm, knit first sleeve. Pm and knit back, pm and knit second sleeve as for first = a total of 260 (280, 308, 336, 360, 384, 412, 436) sts.

Work 9 (11, 13, 16, 17, 22, 22, 21) rnds without decreasing and, *at the same time*, after 1 (13, 13, 22, 25, 34, 40, 43) rnds, begin knitting from chart row 6 (= shoulder pattern).

**NOTE** The pattern is not continuous around but breaks at the decrease markers between the pieces.

After completing the rnds without decreases, begin raglan shaping but only on sleeve sts, with no decreasing on body. Decrease on every other rnd 21 (23, 25, 28, 29, 31, 34, 36) times.

Decrease symmetrically in towards center of sleeve as follow: Knit to marker for sleeve, slip marker to right needle, k2tog tbl. Knit until 2 sts before next marker, k2tog.

Decrease a total of 42 (46, 50, 56, 58, 62, 68, 70) sts so the stitch count on each sleeve is reduced from 57 (61, 67, 73, 79, 83, 89, 95) sts to 15 (15, 17, 17, 21, 21, 21, 25) sts after decrease rnds and 73 (79, 87, 95, 101, 109, 117, 123) sts rem each for front and back.

### SHOULDERS

After completing charted rows for sleeves and front/back, knit 1 rnd with color 2, *at the same time*, binding off the 15 (15, 17, 17, 21, 21, 21, 25) sts of each sleeve (= number of sts between markers for sleeve).

Now continue, shaping neck on front and back separately and finishing by joining shoulders and then joining the bound-off sleeve sts to sides of front and back. Work back and forth in stockinette, knitting on right side and purling on wrong side.

### **Front**

Work front over 73 (79, 87, 95, 101, 109, 117, 123) sts. Work back and forth on front while you, *at the same time*, set aside sts for neck. Work right and left sides of front separately after 3 (2, 1, 0, 1, 1, 1, 1) rows stockinette.

Set aside 19 (19, 21, 23, 25, 27, 29, 31) sts for neck at center front as follows: K27 (30, 33, 36, 38, 41, 44, 46), BO or place on holder 19 (19, 21, 23, 25, 27, 29, 31) sts, and k27 (30, 33, 36, 38, 41, 44, 46).

On next 6 (6, 8, 8, 8, 8, 10, 10) rows, on each side of neck, BO or set aside 8,6,2 (8,6,3; 8,6,3,1; 8,6,2,2; 8,6,4,3; 8,6,4,3; 8,4,6,4,2,1; 8,6,4,2,2;) sts to round neck.

After neck shaping, 11 (13, 15, 18, 17, 20, 23, 24) sts rem on each side of front. Place rem sts on a holder.

### **Back**

Work back over 73 (79, 87, 95, 101, 109, 117, 123) sts.

With larger size circular, work back and forth in stockinette for 6 (9, 8, 9, 10, 12, 10, 12) rows.

BO or place rem sts on a holder.

### **Join Shoulders**

Begin on either the right or left shoulder. Join by knitting or stitching the 11 (13, 15, 18, 17, 20, 23, 24) sts of one side of front with corresponding sts of back. Place 51 (47, 57, 59, 65, 69, 71, 75) center back sts on a holder for neck. Join by knitting or stitching the 11 (16, 15, 18, 18, 20, 23, 24) sts of other side of front with corresponding sts of back. Finish by sewing the bound-off sts of sleeve top to the now flat edge between front and back on each side.

### **NECKBAND**

There should now be 102 (106, 114, 118, 134, 138, 142, 150) sts for the neck. Adjust the stitch count to 98 (102, 108, 114, 130, 134, 138, 146) by picking up sts between the rows where you set aside sts for the front neck. This way, you'll avoid holes between the neck and shoulders. With color 2 and smaller size circular, work around in p1, k1tbl for 6 in / 15 cm or desired length.

### **FINISHING**

Seam underarms, with Kitchener st. Weave in all ends neatly on WS. Wash sweater carefully and lay flat to dry.

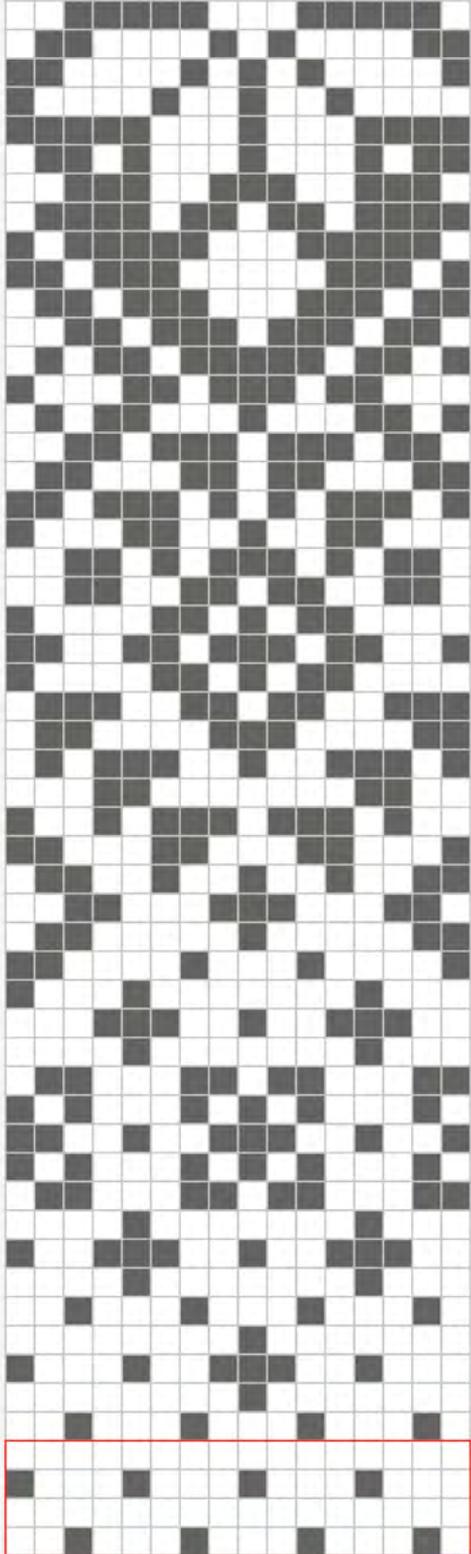

A ≈ chest - 33 (35½, 38½, 41¾, 45, 48½, 51¼, 54¼) in / 84 (90, 98, 106, 114, 123, 130, 138) cm

B ≈ sweater length - 22½ (24, 24½, 26, 26½, 28¾, 29¾, 30¾) in / 57 (61, 62, 66, 67, 72, 74, 77) cm

C ≈ sleeve length - 18½ (19¼, 19¾, 19¾, 20, 20, 20½, 20½) in / 47 (49, 50, 50, 51, 51, 52, 52) cm

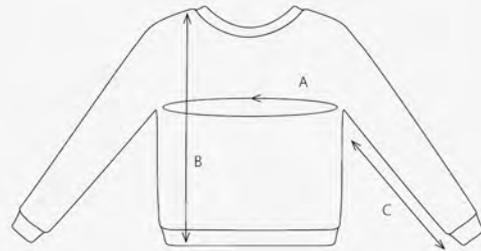

## 92802 Stjärnfall – mittens

These mittens have a pattern rich in details taken both from traditional lice sweaters (lusekofter) and traditional Norwegian Selbu mittens. Their name, Stjärnfall, means shooting star. The front of the mitten is adorned with eight-petal roses and “spruce twigs,” while the palm also has an eight-petal rose placed within a simple lice pattern to match the sweater in the collection.

**YARN** Järbo 2 tr Ull (2-Ply Wool) (100% wool, 328 yd/300 m / 100 g)

### ALTERNATE YARN SUGGESTIONS

Alpacka Solo (100% alpaca, 183 yd/167 m / 50 g)

Elise (60% cotton, 40% acrylic, 184 yd/170 m / 50 g)

Junior (70% premium acrylic, 30% polyamide, 183 yd/168 m / 50 g)

**GAUGE** Approx. 21 sts x 30 rnds in stockinette on U. S. 4 / 3.5 mm needles = 4 x 4 in / 10 x 10 cm. Adjust needle size to obtain correct gauge if necessary.

**SIZES** Women’s (Men’s)

**MITTEN LENGTH** Approx. 9¾ in / 25 cm (folded cuff) and 12¼ in / 31 cm (unfolded cuff)

**MITTEN WIDTH** Approx. 4 (5½) in / 10 (14) cm

**MITTEN LENGTH** Approx. 8¾ (10¾) in / 22 (27) cm

**THUMB LENGTH** Approx. 2¼ (2½) in / 5.5 (6.5) cm

**THUMB WIDTH** Approx. 1¾ (1¾) in / 3.5 (4.5) cm

**CUFF LENGTH** Approx. 2¾ (3¼) in / 7 (8) cm

### YARN AMOUNTS AND COLORS

**Color 1:** Approx. 100 (100) g (color 74102, Natural White / 74102, Natural White)

**Color 2:** Approx. 100 (100) g (color 74108, Ash / 74113, Dijon Mustard)

**NEEDLES** U. S. sizes 1.5 and 4 / 2.5 and 3.5 mm: sets of 5 dpn

**NOTIONS** Length of smooth, contrast color waste yarn

**LEVEL OF DIFFICULTY** \*\*

### STITCHES AND TECHNIQUES

**M1R = make 1 right:** With left needle, lift strand between 2 stitches from back to front and knit into back loop = left-leaning increase.

**M1L = make 1 left:** With left needle, lift strand between 2 stitches from front to back and knit into back loop = left-leaning increase.

### CAST ON

With smaller size dpn and color 1, CO 44 (46) sts. Divide sts onto 4 dpn and join; pm for beginning of rnd. Work around in k2tbl, p2 (k1tbl, p1) ribbing for 2¾ (¾) in / (7 (1) cm).

After completing ribbing, change to larger size dpn. Knit 1 rnd with color 1, increasing 1 (2) sts to 45 (48) sts. Now work following chart A (B).

**NOTE** Chart B has a cuff section, framed by red. After working the sts within the frame (= cuff), increase evenly spaced around to 50 sts and continue following chart.

Chart A does not have a cuff section, but begins directly on the mitten hand. Increase for the thumb gusset as shown on the chart for both sizes. Increases are worked as right-/left-leaning.

For both sizes, work following the chart, increasing for the thumb gusset as shown on chart. At the red horizontal line on the chart, knit the thumb’s 11 (13) sts with smooth, contrast-color waste yarn. Slip

thumb sts back to left needle and work in pattern. You will later remove the waste yarn so you can knit the thumb. These sts do not count as part of the round. If you don't want to use waste yarn, you can simply place the thumb sts on a holder.

Continue, following chart and decreasing at side of thumb: decrease with k2tog tbl as shown on chart. Shape top of mitten as shown on chart.

The chart shows mirrored decreases so the decreases lean in towards the center of the mitten front/back. Decrease to the right = k2tog and to the left = sl 1, k1tbl, pssso.

### **THUMB**

Insert 1 larger size dpn through sts below waste yarn and another dpn through sts above waste yarn. Carefully remove waste yarn. Or, divide held sts onto dpn and, with color 1, pick up and knit the same number of sts across top of thumbhole = 22 (26) sts.

Work thumb following chart C (D). Note that there are 2 extra sts on the first rnd on both charts on the "back" of the thumb. This is because you will pick up and knit a st at each side between the front and back of the thumb to avoid holes at the sides. The extra sts will be decreased at once or on the next rnd so 22 (26) sts rem.

Continue thumb, following chart C (D). Shape tip of thumb as for top of mitten.

### **SECOND MITTEN**

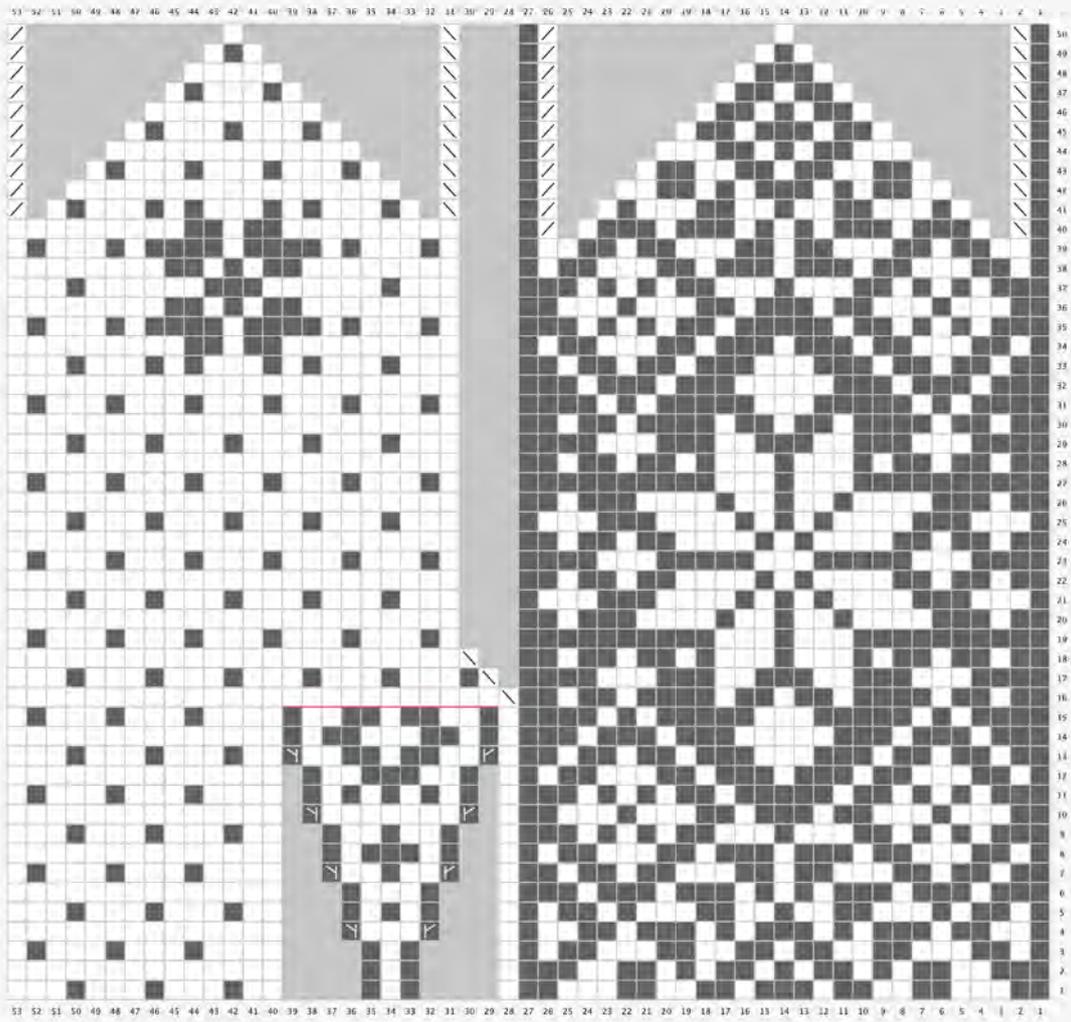
Work as for first mitten reversing pattern and thumb placement to correspond.

### **FINISHING**

Weave in all ends neatly on WS.

Wash mittens and lay flat to dry.

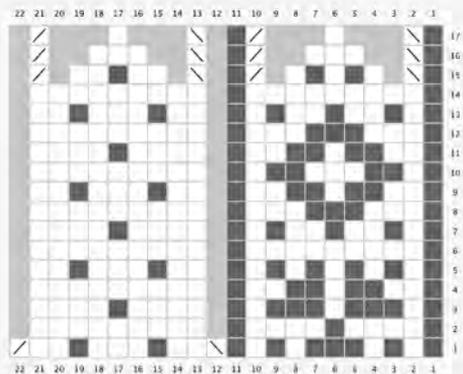

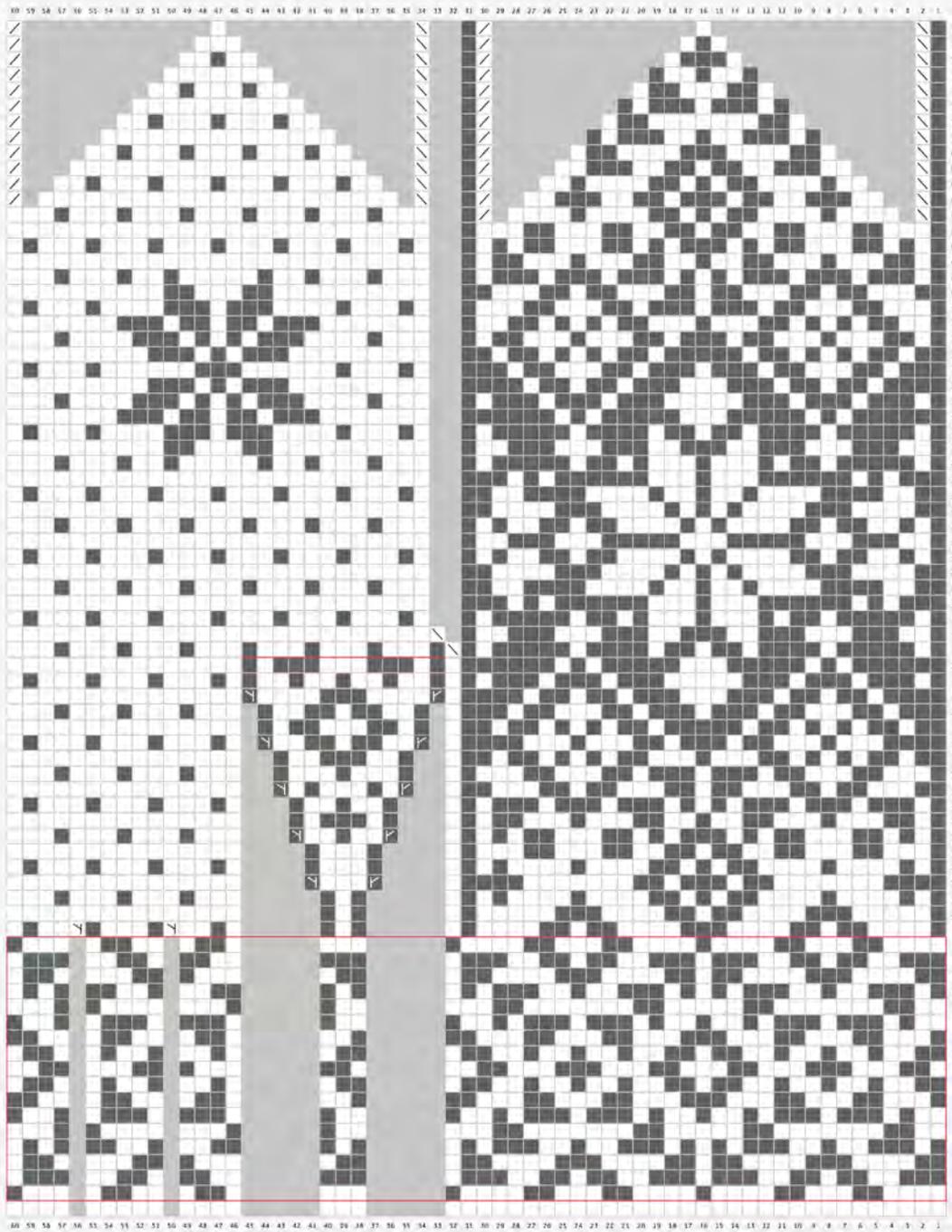
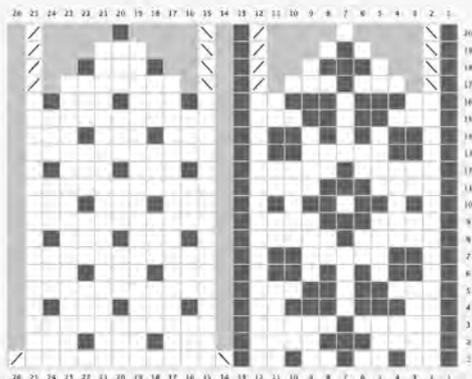

## 92799 Norrsken – cap

Many Finnish knitting patterns have, over time, drawn their inspiration from nature in the north. The pattern on this cap is reminiscent of the northern lights (aurora borealis) dancing over the sky, “norrskén” in Swedish. The short floats make this cap an excellent project for anyone who is inexperienced with knitting two-color stranded patterns.

**YARN** Alpaca Solo (100% alpaca, 183 yd/167 m / 50 g)

### ALTERNATE YARN SUGGESTIONS

Järbo 2 tr Ull (2-Ply Wool) (100% wool, 328 yd/300 m / 100 g)

Elise (60% cotton, 40% acrylic, 184 yd/170 m / 50 g)

Junior (70% premium acrylic, 30% polyamide, 183 yd/168 m / 50 g)

**GAUGE** Approx. 28 sts in stranded colorwork pattern on larger size needles = 4 in / 10 cm. Adjust needle size to obtain correct gauge if necessary.

**SIZES WOMEN'S** 1 (2)

**CAP LENGTH** 8¾ in / 22.5 cm (with brim folded), 12¾ in / 32 cm (brim unfolded)

**CAP WIDTH** 8¾ (9) in / 22 (23) cm

### YARN AMOUNTS AND COLORS

**Color 1:** Approx. 50 (50) g (color 29101, Eggshell White)

**Color 2:** Approx. 50 (50) g (color 29104, Coconut Brown)

**Color 3:** Approx. 50 (50) g (color 29124, Ocher Brown)

**NEEDLES** U. S. sizes 2.5 and 4 / 3 and 3.5 mm: sets of 5 dpn or short circular

**NOTIONS** Stitch markers

**LEVEL OF DIFFICULTY** \*\*

### STITCHES AND TECHNIQUES

#### Ribbing

**Row 1:** (K1, p1) to end of round.

On following rounds, work knit over knit and purl over purl.

#### Stockinette in the Round

Knit all stitches on all rounds.

#### Stranded Colorwork Pattern

Work following chart and text instructions.

#### CAP

With color 3 and smaller size dpn, CO 116 (120) sts. Divide sts onto dpn and join to work in the round. Pm for beginning of rnd. Work around in ribbing for 6 in / 15.5 cm.

Change to larger size dpn and color 1. Knit 1 rnd, increasing 8 sts evenly spaced around = 124 (128) sts. Knit 1 more rnd with color 1.

Now work following charted pattern, beginning with row 1.

Rep the 4-st rep a total of 31 (32) times around.

Work chart rows 2-31.

Cut contrast colors 2 and 3 and knit 1 rnd with color 1 and, *at the same time*, place markers: \*K15 (16), pm, k16 (16), pm\*. Rep \* to \* 3 more times.

### **Crown Shaping**

If working on a circular, change to dpn when sts no longer fit around circular.

Shape top of cap as follows:

\*Knit until 2 sts before marker, k2tog\*; rep \* to \* around.

Decrease the same way on every rnd until 12 (16) sts rem.

Cut yarn. Draw end through rem sts; tighten.

### **FINISHING**

Weave in all ends neatly on WS.

Soak cap in lukewarm water. Gently squeeze out excess water and then roll in a towel to absorb more water. Pat out cap to finished measurements and leave flat to dry.

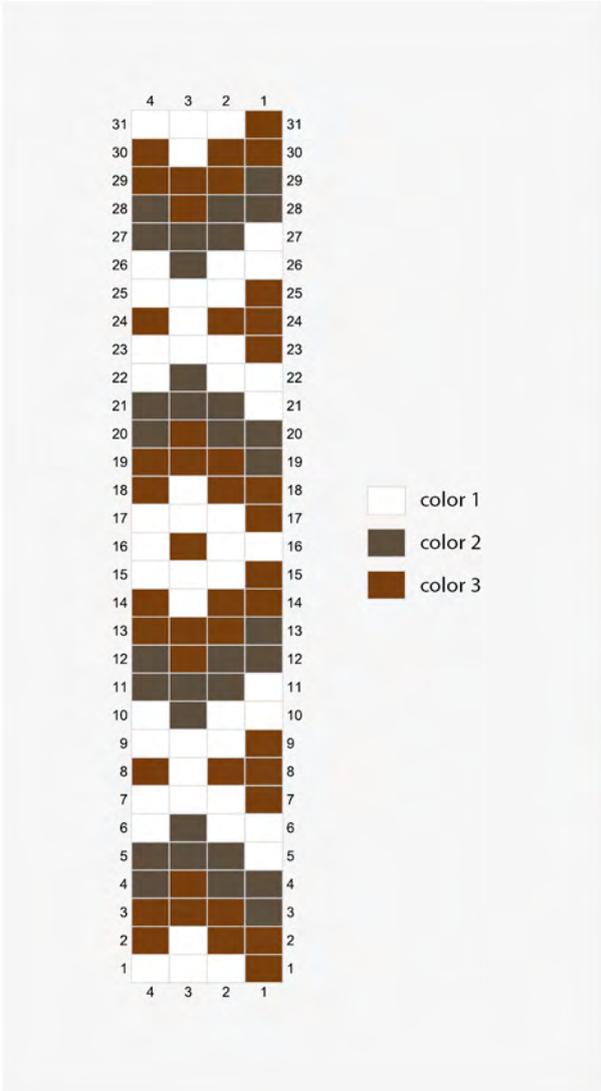
Make a pompom 2½ in / 6.5 cm in diameter. Sew securely to top of cap.

### **MEASUREMENTS**

A ≈ 17¼ (18¼) in / 44 (46) cm

B ≈ 8¾ in / 22.5 cm (with brim folded), 12¾ in / 32 cm (brim unfolded)

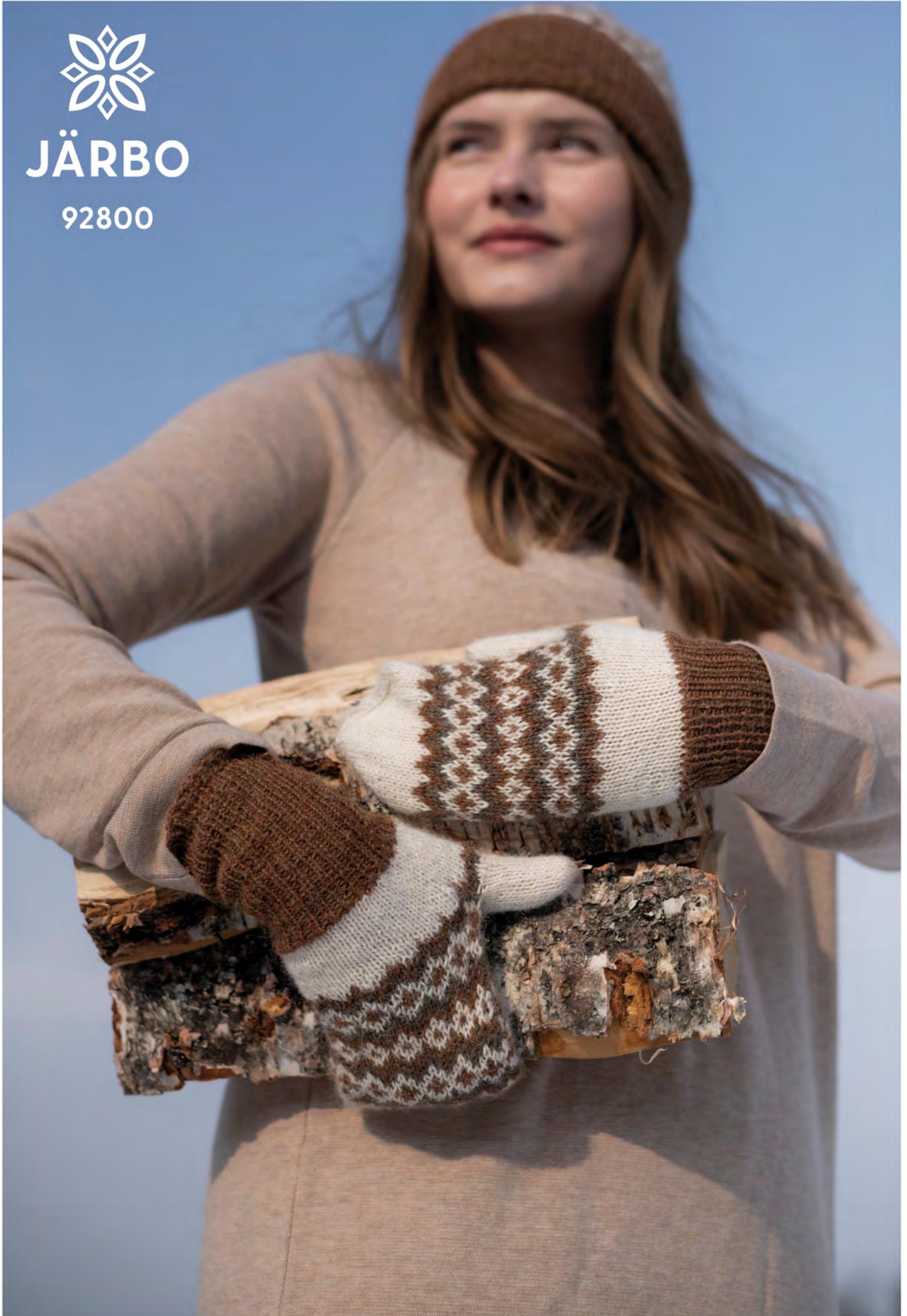
C ≈ 5¼ in / 13 cm

## 92800 Norrsken – mittens

Many Finnish knitting patterns have, over time, drawn their inspiration from nature in the north. The pattern on this cap is reminiscent of the northern lights (aurora borealis), “norrsken” in Swedish, dancing over the sky. The short floats make that these Norrsken mittens an excellent project for anyone who is inexperienced with knitting stranded colorwork patterns.

**YARN** Alpaca Solo (100% alpaca, 183 yd/167 m / 50 g)

### ALTERNATE YARN SUGGESTIONS

Järbo 2 tr Ull (2-Ply Wool) (100% wool, 328 yd/300 m / 100 g)

Elise (60% cotton, 40% acrylic, 184 yd/170 m / 50 g)

Junior (70% premium acrylic, 30% polyamide, 183 yd/168 m / 50 g)

**GAUGE** Approx. 28 sts in stranded colorwork pattern on larger size needles = 4 in / 10 cm. Adjust needle size to obtain correct gauge if necessary.

**SIZES WOMEN'S** 1 (2)

**MITTEN LENGTH** Approx. 9¾ in / 25 cm (with cuff folded), 12¼ in / 31 cm (cuff unfolded)

**MITTEN WIDTH** Approx. 3½ (4) in / 9 (10.5) cm

### YARN AMOUNTS AND COLORS

**Color 1:** Approx. 50 (50) g (color 29101, Eggshell White)

**Color 2:** Approx. 50 (50) g (color 29104, Coconut Brown)

**Color 3:** Approx. 50 (50) g (color 29124, Ocher Brown)

**NEEDLES** U. S. sizes 1.5 and 2. / 2.5 and 3 mm: sets of 5 dpn

**NOTIONS** smooth contrast color waste yarn

**LEVEL OF DIFFICULTY** \*\*

### STITCHES AND TECHNIQUES

#### Ribbing

**Row 1:** (K1, p1) to end of round.

On following rounds, work knit over knit and purl over purl.

#### Stockinette in the Round

Knit all stitches on all rounds.

#### Stranded Colorwork Pattern

Work following chart and text instructions.

#### LEFT MITTEN

With color 3 and smaller size dpn, CO 48 (52) sts. Divide sts onto 4 dpn [= 12 (13) sts per needle] and join to work in the round. Pm for beginning of rnd (between needles I and IV).

Work around in ribbing for 4¼ in / 11 cm.

Change to larger size dpn and color 1. Knit 1 rnd, increasing 4 sts evenly spaced around = 52 (56) sts.

With color 1, work around in stockinette for 1¼ in / 3.5 cm.

Now work following charted pattern, beginning with row 1.

Rep the 4-st rep a total of 13 (14) times around.

Work chart rows 2-6.

On chart row 7, set aside sts for thumb: K12 (13) from beginning of rnd, with waste yarn, k9 (10), slip the waste yarn sts back to left needle and work those sts and rem sts of rnd in pattern.

Work chart rows 8-31.

Cut contrast colors 2 and 3 and continue only with color 1.  
Work around for  $\frac{3}{4}$  in / 2 cm and then begin top shaping.

### **Top Shaping:**

At beginning of needles I and III: Sl 1, k1, pssso.

At end of needles II and IV: K2tog.

Decrease the same way on every rnd until 8 sts rem.

Cut yarn. Draw end through rem sts; tighten.

### **RIGHT MITTEN**

Work as for left mitten, reversing shaping to correspond – begin thumb 3 sts from beginning of needle 1.

### **THUMB**

Insert 1 dpn into sts below waste yarn and another dpn into sts above waste yarn. Carefully remove waste yarn. With color 1, knit 1<sup>st</sup> rnd, picking up and knitting 1 st at each side of thumbhole = 20 (22) sts total. Divide sts onto 3 dpn.

Continue around in stockinette and color 1 until thumb is 2 in / 5 cm long or length to middle of thumbnail.

**Shape thumb tip:** K2tog at end of each needle until 4 sts rem.

K1, slip rem 3 sts over knitted st, from left to right.

Cut yarn. Draw end through rem st; tighten.

### **FINISHING**

Weave in all ends neatly on WS.

Soak mittens in lukewarm water. Gently squeeze out excess water and then roll in a towel to absorb more water. Pat out mittens to finished measurements and leave flat to dry.

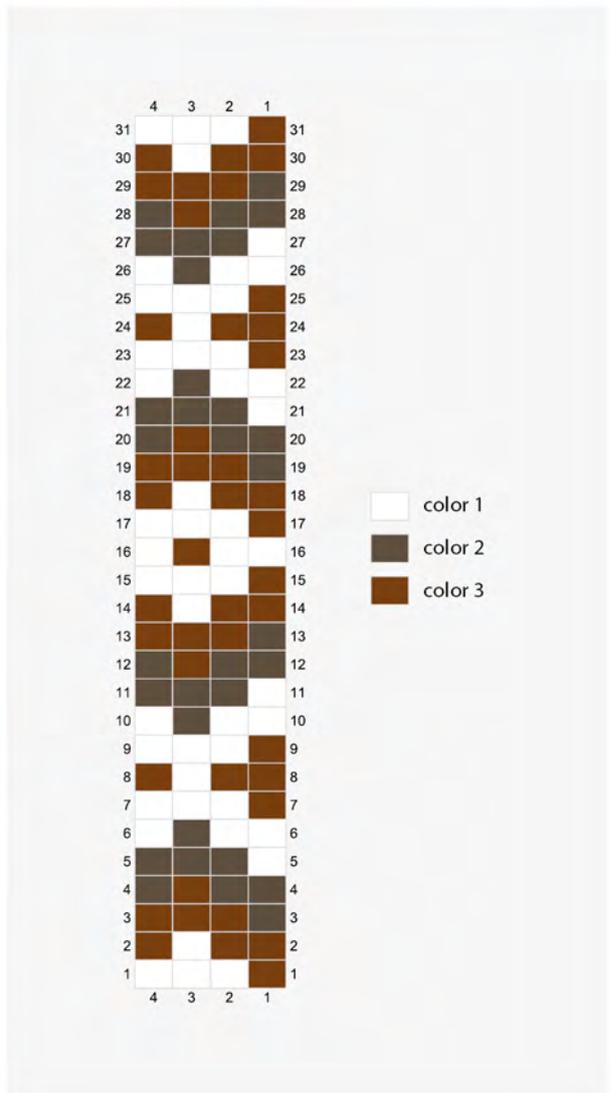

A  $\approx$  9 $\frac{3}{4}$  in / 25 cm (with cuff folded), 12 $\frac{1}{4}$  in / 31 cm (cuff unfolded)

B  $\approx$  7 (8 $\frac{1}{4}$ ) in / 18 (21) cm

C  $\approx$  5 $\frac{1}{4}$  in / 13 cm

D  $\approx$  2 $\frac{1}{4}$  in / 5.5 cm

## 92803 Nordanvind – ragg socks

Pattern-knitted ragg socks that are extra strong and warm! The Nordanvind (North Wind) socks will keep your feet ever-so-warm on winter evenings, and, thanks to the special heel structure, they will fit your feet well. These socks are knitted toe-up.

**YARN** Raggi (70% superwash wool, 30% polyamide, 165 yd/150 m / 100 g)

**GAUGE** approx. 18 sts x 23 rnds in stockinette with larger size needles = 4 x 4 in / 10 x 10 cm.

Adjust needle size to obtain correct gauge if necessary.

**SOCK CIRCUMFERENCE** Approx. 7½ (7½, 8¼, 8¼, 9, 9) in / 19 (19, 21, 21, 23, 23) cm

**SOCK FOOT LENGTH** Approx. 8½ (9, 9½, 10, 10¾, 11) in / 21.5 (23, 24.5, 25.5, 27, 28) cm

### YARN AMOUNTS AND COLORS

**Color 1:** Approx. 100 (100, 100, 150, 150, 150) g (color 15119, Grey)

**Color 2:** Approx. 50 g for all sizes (color 1500, Natural White)

**NEEDLES** U. S. sizes 4 and 6 / 3.5 and 4 mm: sets of 5 dpn

**NOTIONS** 4 stitch markers

**LEVEL OF DIFFICULTY** \*\*

### STITCHES AND TECHNIQUES

**M1L = make 1 left:** With left needle, lift strand between 2 sts from front to back and knit into back loop = left-leaning increase.

**M1R = make 1 right:** With left needle, lift strand between 2 sts from back to front and knit into front loop = right-leaning increase.

### Short Rows

For short rows, you turn before you finish an entire row or round – so, you are working only part of a row/round. To avoid holes when turning, you wrap the yarn around the next stitch as you turn.

### Wrapped stitch

**On RS:** With yarn in front of work, slip next stitch to right needle. Take yarn to back of work and move stitch back to left needle. Turn. The yarn now lies wrapped around the stitch.

**On WS:** With yarn in back of work, slip next stitch to right needle. Take yarn to front of work and move stitch back to left needle. Turn. The yarn now lies wrapped around the stitch.

**W&t:** Wrap and turn.

**Working wrapped st:** When it's time to work a wrapped stitch, join the stitch and its wrap – knit together on RS and purl together on WS.

### Judy's Magic Cast-On

Use two needles.

Hold the needles parallel in your right hand so the tips point to the left. Hold the yarn as for long-tail cast-on, with yarn end over your thumb and ball yarn over your index finger. Lay yarn over nearest needle.

\*Move yarn from thumb up between the needle tips and lay it over the back needle. Lay yarn from index finger over nearest needle and down between needles\*. Repeat \* to \* until you've cast on the desired number of stitches.

### TOE

With larger size dpn and color 1, using Judy's Magic cast-on method, CO 14 (14, 18, 18, 22, 22) sts evenly over 2 needles.

**Rnd 1:** Knit around (dividing sts onto 4 dpn on first rnd).

**Rnd 2:** Needle 1: K1, M1L, knit until 1 st rem on needle 2, M1R, k1. Needle 3: K1, M1L, knit until 1 st rem on needle 4, M1R, k1.

Rep Rnds 1-2 until you've increased to a total of 38 (38, 42, 42, 46, 46) sts.

Sts 1-19 (1-19, 1-21, 1-21, 1-23, 1-23) = top/instep.

Sts 20-38 (20-38, 22-42, 22-42, 24-46, 24-26) = bottom/sole.

## FOOT

Knit 2 rnds.

Now work in pattern following chart for chosen size (**NOTE** The chart is repeated 2 times on every rnd).

Continue until foot measures 4¾ (5¼, 5¾, 6, 6¾, 7) in / 12 (13.5, 14.5, 15.5, 17, 18) cm.

End with chart row 1.

## GUSSET

**Rnd 1 (instep):** Continue as est following charted pattern.

**Rnd 1 (sole):** K1, M1L, work in est pattern until 1 st rem, M1R, k1.

**Rnd 2:** Work in pattern as est. Always work new sts of heel gusset with color 1.

Rep Rnds 1–2 until there 31 (31, 33, 33, 35, 35) sts on sole.

The foot pattern is now finished.

Knit 1 rnd with color 1 and then knit instep sts.

Now it's time to knit the heel.

## HEEL

The heel is worked with color 1, back and forth in short rows with wrapped sts. Work only with the sole/back sts.

Place 4 markers as follows:

Marker 1 after the 6<sup>th</sup> (6<sup>th</sup>, 6<sup>th</sup>, 6<sup>th</sup>, 6<sup>th</sup>) st.

Marker 2 after the 11<sup>th</sup> (11<sup>th</sup>, 11<sup>th</sup>, 11<sup>th</sup>, 12<sup>th</sup>, 12<sup>th</sup>) st.

Marker 3 after the 20<sup>th</sup> (20<sup>th</sup>, 22<sup>nd</sup>, 22<sup>nd</sup>, 23<sup>rd</sup>, 23<sup>rd</sup>) st.

Marker 4 after the 25<sup>th</sup> (25<sup>th</sup>, 27<sup>th</sup>, 27<sup>th</sup>, 29<sup>th</sup>, 29<sup>th</sup>) st.

Between markers 1 and 4 are the center 18 (18, 20, 20, 22, 22) sts for the heel flap.

Between markers 2 and 3 are the center 9 (9, 11, 11, 11, 11) sts for the center back of heel turn.

**Row 1 (RS):** Knit until 1 st rem before marker 4; w&t.

**Row 2 (WS):** Purl until 1 st before marker 1, w&t.

**Row 3 (RS):** Knit until 1 st before previous wrapped st, w&t.

**Row 4 (WS):** Purl until 1 st before previous wrapped st, w&t.

Rep Rows 3-4 until all the sts outside markers 2 and 3 have been wrapped. The center 9 (9, 11, 11, 11, 11) sts inside markers 2 and 3 should not be wrapped.

**Next Row (RS):** K9 (9, 11, 11, 11, 11). Knit all wrapped sts up to marker 4; turn.

**Next Row (WS):** Sl 1 purlwise, purl up to wrapped st (after marker 2). Purl all wrapped sts up to marker 1.

## HEEL FLAP

At the same time as you work the straight heel flap, join the gusset sts to sides of flap.

**Row 1 (RS):** Turn and sl 1 st, tightening yarn. Knit until 1 st rem before marker 4, k2tog tbl.

**Row 2 (AS):** Turn and sl 1 purlwise, tightening yarn. Purl until 1 st rem before marker 1, p2tog; remove markers.

**Row 3 (RS):** Turn and sl 1, tightening yarn, knit to slipped st. K2tog tbl with the slipped st and next heel gusset st (= 1 st before and 1 st after gap at turn).

**Row 4 (AS):** Turn and p1, tightening yarn, purl to slipped st. P2tog with slipped st and next gusset st (= 1 st before and 1 st after gap at turn).

Rep Rows 3–4 until all the gusset sts have been eliminated (after join on RS). Work to end of row.

**Next Row:** Knit sts of instep. Sole: k2tog, k18 (18, 20, 20, 22, 22).

You should now once again have the original number of sts and the heel is finished!

## LEG

Use dpn U. S. 4 / 3.5 mm.

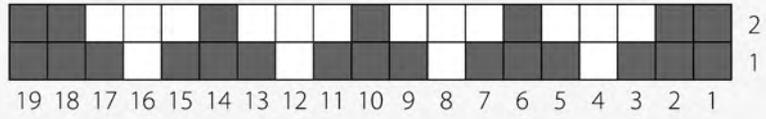

Work around in k1, p1 ribbing for 4 in / 10 cm.

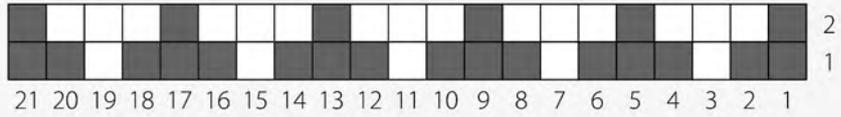

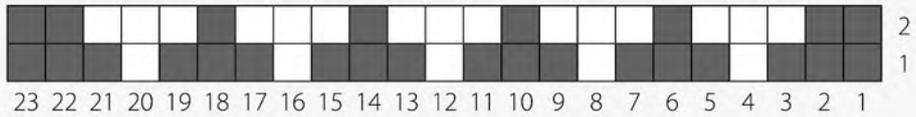

## 92798 Våg – socks

The pretty cable patterns on the Våg (Wave) socks remind me of the billowing water surface when it rains. The socks are worked from the top down. Two different cable patterns adorn the front of each sock.

**YARN** Junior Raggi (75% superwash wool, 25% nylon, 219 yd/200 m / 50 g)

### ALTERNATE YARN SUGGESTIONS

Bambu Raggi (50% wool, 25% nylon, 25% bamboo, 437 yd / 400 m / 100 g)

**GAUGE** Approx. 26 sts in stockinette = 4 in / 10 cm. Width of 29 sts in cable pattern = 2¾ in / 7 cm.

Adjust needle size to obtain correct gauge if necessary.

**SIZES WOMEN'S** Shoe size U. S. 7½-8 / Euro 38

**SOCK LENGTH** 9½ in / 24.5 cm

**SOCK WIDTH** 3¾ in / 9.5 cm

### YARN AMOUNTS AND COLORS

100 g (color 68425, Barley)

**NEEDLES** U. S. size 1.5 / 2.5 mm: set of 5 dpn; cable needle

**LEVEL OF DIFFICULTY** \*\*

### STITCHES AND TECHNIQUES

#### Ribbing

**Rnd 1:** (K1, p1) to end of row.

On following rnd, work knit over knit and purl over purl.

#### Stockinette in the Round

Knit all stitches on all rounds.

#### Cable Pattern

Work following chart and text instructions.

#### LEG

CO 60 sts. Divided sts onto 4 dpn (= 15 sts per needle) and join to work in the round. The beginning of rnd is between needles I and IV.

Work around in ribbing for 1½ in / 4 cm.

Knit 1 rnd, increasing 1 st at beginning of needle II.

Now work in charted cable pattern, beginning on chart row 1 as follows:

K16, work 29 sts of cable pattern following chart, knit to end of rnd.

Continue with stockinette on sides and chart rows 2-8.

Rep rows 1-8.

After you've worked rows 1-8 a total of four times, begin heel flap.

#### HEEL FLAP

The heel flap is worked over stitches on needles I and IV. Begin by working over sts of needles I to IV on the following rnd. Turn work.

Work reinforced heel flap stitch:

**Row 1 (WS):** Sl 1 purlwise with yarn in front (wyf) and purl to end of needle I; turn.

**Row 2 (RS):** \*Sl 1 purlwise with yarn in back (wfb), k1\*; rep \* to \*, ending with k1.  
Rep Rows 1-2 a total of 16 times (= 32 rows).  
End with a WS row.

Continue the reinforced heel pattern as you shape the heel turn:

Work from right edge of heel flap until 11 sts rem on row. Sl 1, k1 pssso; turn.  
Sl 1, p8, p2tog; turn.  
Sl 1, knit until 10 sts rem, sl 1, k1, pssso.

Continue the same way, decreasing the number of side sts throughout, with 10 sts rem in center.  
When all side sts have been worked, divide heel sts onto 2 dpn = 5 sts on each needle. K5 so yarn is between needles IV and I.

With RS facing, with needle I, pick up and knit 17 sts along the left edge of heel flap.  
Work across instep as est. With needle IV, pick up and knit 17 sts along right edge of heel flap = 75 sts on needles.  
K23, work 29 sts in cable pattern, knit to end of rnd.

### **Gussets**

Continue cable pattern on instep and stockinette on sides.  
**Gusset shaping:** Knit until 2 sts rem on needle I, k2tog. At beginning of needle IV, sl 1, k1, pssso.  
Decrease the same way on every other rnd until 61 sts rem.

### **Foot**

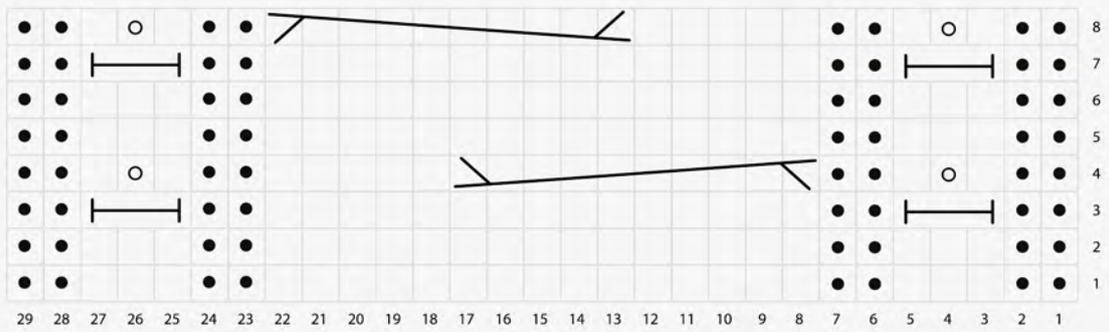
Continue in cable pattern and stockinette as est.  
After repeating chart rows 1-8 of cable pattern a total of 11 times, work rows 1-4 and then begin toe shaping.

### **Toe Shaping**

At end of needles I and III: K2tog, k1.  
At beginning of needles II and IV: K1, sl 1, k1, pssso.  
Decrease the same way on every other rnd until 33 sts rem.  
Decrease on every rnd until 9 sts rem.  
Cut yarn and draw end through rem sts; tighten.  
Weave in all ends neatly on WS.  
Make second sock the same way.

### **MEASUREMENTS**

A ≈ 9½ in / 24.5 cm  
B ≈ 7 in / 18 cm  
C ≈ 8 in / 20 cm  
D ≈ 7 in / 18 cm

## 92797 Sylvi – vest

The Sylvi vest is a timeless cornerstone in your wardrobe – it suits everyone. It is worked back and forth in three pieces on two different sizes of circular needle. The front pieces feature a simple cable pattern. After the shoulder and side seams are sewn together, the armholes are edged with ribbing and the front is edged with ribbing all the way from the lower right to lower left edge, with buttonholes on the right side of the band.

**YARN** Järbo 2 tr Ull (2-Ply Wool) (100% wool, 328 yd/300 m / 100 g)

### ALTERNATE YARN SUGGESTIONS

Alpacka Solo (100% alpaca, 183 yd/167 m / 50 g)

Elise (60% cotton, 40% acrylic, 184 yd/170 m / 50 g)

Junior (70% premium acrylic, 30% polyamide, 183 yd/168 m / 50 g)

**GAUGE** Approx. 21 sts x 32 rows in stockinette on U. S. 4 / 3.5 mm needles = 4 x 4 in / 10 x 10 cm.

Approx. 28 sts x 33 rows in cable pattern on U. S. 4 / 3.5 mm needles = 4 x 4 in / 10 x 10 cm. Adjust needle size to obtain correct gauge if necessary.

**SIZES WOMEN'S** XS (S, M, L, XL, 2XL, 3XL, 4XL)

**GARMENT CHEST** Approx. 32¼ (36¼, 40¼, 44, 48, 52, 56, 59¾) in / 82 (92, 102, 112, 122, 132, 142, 152) cm

**GARMENT LENGTH** Approx. 20 (21, 21¾, 22½, 23¼, 24, 24¾, 25½) in / 51 (53, 55, 57, 59, 61, 63, 65) cm

### YARN AMOUNTS AND COLORS

Approx. 300 (300, 300, 300, 300, 400, 400, 400) g (color 74110, Sandy)

**NEEDLES** U. S. sizes 3 and 4 / 3.25 and 3.5 mm: circulars 24 or 32 in / 60 or 80 cm

**NOTIONS** Stitch markers, cable needle, 4 buttons, ¾ in / 1,5 cm in diameter

**LEVEL OF DIFFICULTY** \*\*

### STITCHES AND TECHNIQUES

#### Ribbing

**Row 1:** (K1, p1) to end of row.

On following rows, work knit over knit and purl over purl.

#### Stockinette Back and Forth

Knit all stitches on right side and purl on wrong side.

#### Cable Pattern

Work following chart and text instructions.

### BACK

With smaller size circular, CO 89 (99, 109, 119, 131, 141, 151, 161) sts. Work back and forth in ribbing for ¾ in / 8.5 cm.

Change to larger size circular and work back and forth in stockinette until back measures 12¼ (12¾, 13, 13½, 13¾, 14¼, 14½, 15) in / 31 (32, 33, 34, 35, 36, 37, 38) cm. At each side of back, BO 4 (5, 6, 7, 9, 11, 13, 15) sts for armhole.

Continue shaping armholes as follows:

**Decrease Row 1 (RS):** K1, sl 1, k1, pssso, knit until 3 sts rem, k2tog, k1.

**Decrease Row 2 (WS):** P1, p2tog, purl until 3 sts rem, p2tog tbl, p1.

Rep these 2 decrease rows on every row another 2 (2, 4, 4, 6, 6, 8, 6) times and then decrease on every other row 0 (2, 2, 4, 4, 4, 4, 4) times = 73 (77, 81, 85, 89, 95, 97, 107) sts rem.

When armhole depth is 7 (7½, 8, 8¼, 8¾, 9, 9½, 9¾) in / 18 (19, 20, 21, 22, 23, 24, 25) cm, BO the center 31 (31, 31, 31, 31, 33, 31, 35) sts for back neck and then work each side separately.

On every other row, at neck edge, BO 2 sts 2 times.

When armhole depth is 8 (8¼, 8¾, 9, 9½, 9¾, 10¼, 10¾) in / 20 (21, 22, 23, 24, 25, 26, 27) cm, BO 17 (19, 21, 23, 25, 27, 29, 32) sts for shoulder.

Work other shoulder to correspond.

### LEFT FRONT

With smaller size circular, CO 53 (59, 71, 77, 83, 89, 95, 101) sts. Work back and forth in ribbing for ¾ in / 8.5 cm.

Change to larger size circular and work cable pattern following chart I.

Begin on chart row 6 on WS: K3, work 6-st repeat following chart I 9 (10, 12, 13, 14, 15, 16, 17) times, *at the same time*, increasing 7 sts evenly spaced across = [60 (66, 78, 84, 90, 96, 102, 108) sts], k3.

Rep chart I rows 1-6 until left front measures 10¼ (10¾, 11, 11½, 11¾, 12¼, 12¾, 13) in / 26 (27, 28, 29, 30, 31, 32, 33) cm.

Now shape V-neck as follows:

On every 4<sup>th</sup> row, decrease 1 st at neck edge 23 (23, 23, 26, 26, 28, 28, 30) times, as follows: work in pattern as est until 3 sts rem, k2tog, k1 = 37 (43, 55, 58, 64, 68, 74, 78) sts.

When front measures 12¼ (12¾, 13, 13½, 13¾, 14¼, 14½, 15) in / 31 (32, 33, 34, 35, 36, 37, 38) cm, shape armhole at right side:

BO 4 (5, 7, 7, 9, 9, 9, 9) sts. = 33 (38, 48, 51, 55, 59, 65, 69) sts.

Continue shaping armhole as follows:

**Decrease Row 1 (RS):** K1, sl 1, k1, pss0.

**Decrease Row 2 (WS):** Work as est until 3 sts rem, p2tog tbl, k1.

Rep these 2 decrease rows on every row another 4 (6, 10, 14, 14, 16, 16, 20) times = 27 (30, 36, 35, 39, 41, 47, 47) sts and then decrease on every other row 3 (5, 7, 4, 7, 8, 12, 10) times = 24 (25, 29, 31, 32, 33, 35, 37) sts.

When armhole depth is 8 (8¼, 8¾, 9, 9½, 9¾, 10¼, 10¾) in / 20 (21, 22, 23, 24, 25, 26, 27) cm, BO 24 (25, 29, 31, 32, 33, 35, 37) sts for shoulder.

### RIGHT FRONT

With smaller size circular, CO 53 (59, 71, 77, 83, 89, 95, 101) sts. Work back and forth in ribbing for ¾ in / 8.5 cm.

Change to larger size circular and work cable pattern following chart II.

Begin on chart row 6 on WS: K3, work 6-st repeat following chart II 9 (10, 12, 13, 14, 15, 16, 17) times, *at the same time*, increasing 7 sts evenly spaced across = [60 (66, 78, 84, 90, 96, 102, 108) sts], k3.

Rep chart II rows 1-6 until right front measures 10¼ (10¾, 11, 11½, 11¾, 12¼, 12¾, 13) in / 26 (27, 28, 29, 30, 31, 32, 33) cm.

Now shape V-neck as follows:

On every 4<sup>th</sup> row, decrease 1 st at neck edge 23 (23, 23, 26, 26, 28, 28, 30) times, as follows: on RS row: K1, sl 1, k1, pssso, work in pattern as est to end of row.

When front measures 12¼ (12¾, 13, 13½, 13¾, 14¼, 14½, 15) in / 31 (32, 33, 34, 35, 36, 37, 38) cm, shape armhole at left side:

BO 4 (5, 7, 7, 9, 9, 9, 9) sts.

Continue shaping armhole as follows:

**Decrease Row 1 (RS):** Work as est until 3 sts rem, p2tog . k1.

**Decrease Row 2 (WS):** P1, sl 1, k1, pssso.

Rep these 2 decrease rows on every row another 4 (6, 10, 14, 14, 16, 16, 20) times and then decrease on every other row 3 (5, 7, 4, 7, 8, 12, 10) times.

When armhole depth is 8 (8¼, 8¾, 9, 9½, 9¾, 10¼, 10¾) in / 20 (21, 22, 23, 24, 25, 26, 27) cm, BO 24 (25, 29, 31, 32, 33, 35, 37) sts for shoulder.

## **FINISHING**

Soak the three pieces in lukewarm water. Gently squeeze out excess water and then roll in a towel to absorb more water. Pat out to finished measurements on flat surface and leave until dry.

Seam shoulders and sides.

### **Armhole Edgings**

With smaller size circular, pick up and knit 92 (96, 100, 104, 108, 112, 116, 120) sts around armhole. Join to work in the round and work in ribbing for ¾ in / 1 cm. BO in ribbing.

Work second armhole edging the same way.

### **Neck/Front Band**

With RS facing and smaller size circular, beginning at lower edge of front, pick up and knit sts along right front, back neck, and left front. Pick up and knit 22 sts per 4 in / 10 cm. The stitch count should be a multiple of 2 + 1 sts.

Begin ribbing on WS: (P1, k1) until 1 st rem, end p1.

When band is ¾ in / 1 cm wide, make buttonholes. Buttonhole: (Yo, 2tog – knit or purl depending on ribbing). Place lowest buttonhole ¾ in / 1 cm from edge, top one just below base of V-neck, and remaining 2 buttonholes evenly spaced in between.

When ribbing is 1 in / 2.5 cm wide, BO in ribbing.

Weave in all ends neatly on WS.

Sew on buttons.

## 92796 Silvertärna – pullover

The Silvertärna (Arctic Tern) pullover was inspired by old Finnish knitting motifs. It is knitted in the round, from the bottom up. The body is divided at the front yoke for a placket and each side is worked separately, back and forth. The sleeve stitches are picked up and knitted along the armhole and knitted around from the top down. The sweater's width makes it a good fit for both women and men.

**YARN** Svensk Ull (Swedish Wool) (100% Swedish wool, 197 yd/180 m / 100 g)

### ALTERNATE YARN SUGGESTIONS

Alpe (100% wool, 109 yd/100 m / 50 g)

Raggi (70% superwash wool, 30% polyamide, 165 yd/151 m / 100 g)

Soft Cotton (100% cotton, 87 yd/80 m / 50 g)

**GAUGE** Approx. 17 sts x 25 rnds in stockinette on U. S. 7 / 4.5 mm needles = 4 x 4 in / 10 x 10 cm. Adjust needle size to obtain correct gauge if necessary.

### STITCHES AND TECHNIQUES

**German Short Rows: Double st (DS):** The double stitch or German short rows is a turning method that does not leave holes at each turn. Work to st where work will be turned. Sl 1 purlwise wyf, firmly pull yarn backwards over right needle so you flip st and have 2 stitch legs or a double stitch (DS) on the needle; work rem sts on needle.

After working the specified number of short rows, you will join the double sts one at a time. Work to 1<sup>st</sup> DS, knit or purl it in pattern, catching both legs of DS to make 1 st.

It will help you keep track of the double sts if you place a marker at each so you can count them and minimize the danger of missing one as you continue knitting.

### Ribbing

**Row 1:** (K1, p1) to end of row.

On following rows, work knit over knit and purl over purl.

### Stockinette in the Round

Knit all rounds.

### Stockinette Back and Forth

Knit all stitches on right side and purl on wrong side.

## **Pattern Knitting**

Work following chart and text instructions.

### **BODY**

The body is knitted up to the underarms in the round on a circular needle.

With color 1 and smaller size circular, CO 170 (190, 210, 230, 250, 270, 290, 300) sts. Join, being careful not to twist cast-on row; pm for beginning of rnd.

Work around in ribbing for 2 in / 5 cm.

Change to larger size circular and knit 3 (4, 4, 5, 5, 5, 6, 6) rnds in stockinette. Pm after 85 (95, 105, 115, 125, 135, 145, 150) sts for side "seam."

Begin pattern from chart row 1 and square 4 on chart. Work the 10-st repeat 17 (19, 21, 23, 25, 27, 29, 30) times around.

Work chart rows 2-19.

Work 7 (8, 8, 9, 9, 10, 10, 11) rnds stockinette with color 1.

Work chart rows 1-19.

Work 7 (8, 8, 9, 9, 10, 10, 11) rnds stockinette with color 1.

Work chart rows 1-19 once more.

Work 0 (0, 0, 1, 1, 2, 2, 2) rnds stockinette with color 1 after finishing pattern panel.

Divide body for front and back at markers.

Place front sts on a holder.

### **BACK**

Continue with color 1.

Work back and forth on sts of back until it measures 7 (7½, 8, 8¼, 8¾, 9, 9½, 9¾) in / 18 (19, 20, 21, 22, 23, 24, 25) cm from underarm.

BO the center 35 (35, 35, 37, 37, 37, 39, 40) sts for neck.

Continue on one shoulder: at neck edge, on every other row, BO 2 sts 3 times and work German short rows to shape shoulder.

Work until 16 (20, 22, 26, 28, 32, 34, 36) sts rem at armhole; turn with DS and work to end of row; turn.

Work 8 (10, 11, 13, 14, 16, 17, 18) sts past DS on next row; turn with DS and work to end of row; turn.

Work to end of row.

Place rem sts on a holder.

Work the other shoulder the same way, reversing shaping to correspond.

### **FRONT**

Work 4 rows back and forth.

On next RS row, BO the center 5 (5, 5, 5, 5, 5, 5, 6) sts for neck placket.

Begin on right side of front.

Work back and forth in stockinette until front measures 5½ (6, 6¼, 6¾, 7, 7½, 8, 8¼) in / 14 (15, 16, 17, 18, 19, 20, 21) cm from underarm. BO 5 (5, 5, 6, 6, 6, 7, 6) sts for neck. On every other row, at neck edge, BO 3 sts 2 times, 2 sts once, and 1 st 2 times.

Shape shoulder with German short rows as for back when front measures 7 (7½, 8, 8¼, 8¾, 9, 9½, 9¾) in / 18 (19, 20, 21, 22, 23, 24, 25) cm from underarm. Place rem sts on a holder.

Work the other side of front the same way, reversing shaping to correspond.  
Join front to back shoulders with Kitchener st.

### **SLEEVES**

With larger size short circular or dpn and color 1, beginning at underarm, pick up and knit 56 (60, 64, 68, 72, 76, 80, 84) sts around armhole. Pm for beginning of rnd.

Knit around for  $\frac{3}{8}$  in / 1 cm and then begin shaping sleeve as follows:

K1, sl 1, k1, pss0, knit until 3 sts rem, k2tog, k1.

Decrease the same way every  $1\frac{1}{2}$  ( $1\frac{1}{4}$ , 1, 1, 1, 1, 1, 1) in / 3.5 (3, 2.5, 2.5, 2.5, 2.5, 2.5, 2.5) cm a total of 9 (11, 12, 13, 14, 15, 16, 17) times = 38 (38, 40, 42, 44, 46, 48, 50) sts rem.

Continue in stockinette until sleeve is  $13\frac{1}{2}$  ( $13\frac{3}{4}$ ,  $14\frac{1}{4}$ ,  $14\frac{1}{2}$ , 15,  $15\frac{1}{2}$ ,  $15\frac{3}{4}$ ,  $16\frac{1}{4}$ ) in / 34 (35, 36, 37, 38, 39, 40, 41) cm long.

Change to smaller size dpn and work around in ribbing for 2 in / 5 cm.

BO in ribbing.

Make the second sleeve the same way.

### **FINISHING**

With color 1 and smaller size circular, pick up and knit 83 (85, 87, 89, 91, 93, 95, 97) sts around neck.

Work back and forth in ribbing for  $1\frac{1}{4}$  in / 3 cm. BO in ribbing.

With color 1 and smaller size circular, pick up and knit 28 (30, 32, 34, 36, 38, 40, 42) sts beginning at top of left neckband so you can work button band.

Work back and forth in ribbing for  $1\frac{1}{4}$  in / 3 cm. BO in ribbing.

Mark placement of buttons, using, for example, stitch markers. Place lowest button  $\frac{3}{4}$  in / 2 cm from lower edge, the top one  $\frac{5}{8}$  in / 1.5 cm down from top edge and the third button centered in between.

With color 1 and smaller size circular, pick up and knit 28 (30, 32, 34, 36, 38, 40, 42) sts beginning on lower right corner of placket so you can work buttonhole band.

Work back and forth in ribbing for  $\frac{5}{8}$  in / 1.5 cm. Now work buttonholes aligned as for buttons: k2tog, yo.

Continue in ribbing until band measures  $1\frac{1}{4}$  in / 3 cm.

BO in ribbing.

Sew down lower edges of placket on front, with buttonhole band overlapping button band (see photo).

Weave in all ends neatly on WS.

Soak sweater in lukewarm water. Gently squeeze out excess water (do not wring) and then roll in towel to absorb more water. Pat out sweater to finished measurements and leave flat to dry.

Sew on buttons.

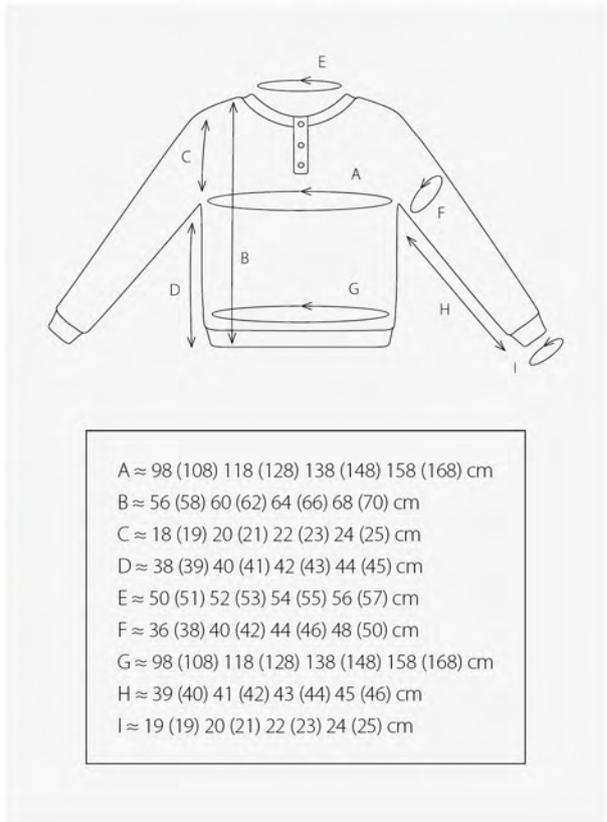
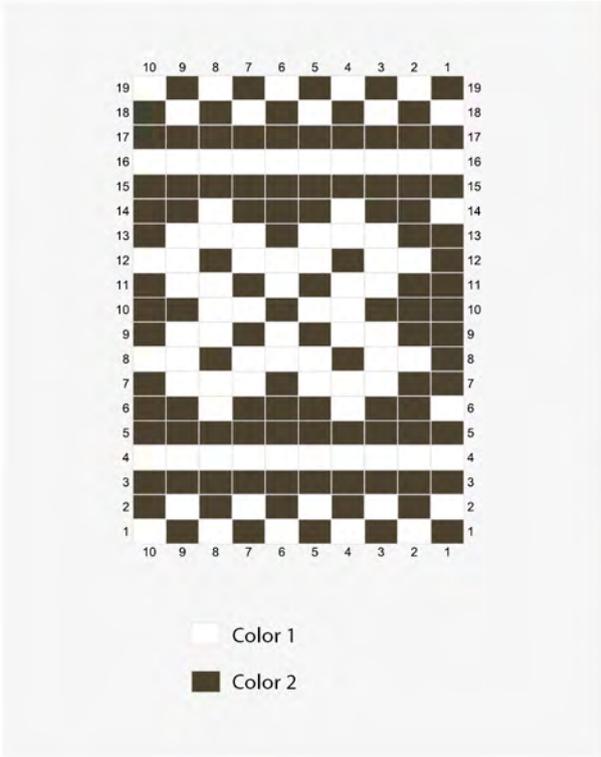

## 92795 Lövfäll – socks

Lövfäll (Falling Leaves) are good, warm wool socks with a pattern inspired by autumn's leaf-covered hills. These socks are especially nice for wearing inside the house or in hiking boots. They fit closely to your feet but are roomy enough to wear over thin socks if you want. The socks are knitted from a ribbed cuff, down the leg, and to the foot and toe.

**YARN** Järbo 2 tr Ull (2-Ply Wool) (100% wool, 328 yd/300 m / 100 g)

### ALTERNATE YARN SUGGESTIONS

Alpacka Solo (100% alpaca, 183 yd/167 m / 50 g)

Elise (60% cotton, 40% acrylic, 184 yd/170 m / 50 g)

Junior (70% premium acrylic, 30% polyamide, 183 yd/168 m / 50 g)

**GAUGE** Approx. 22 sts x 31 rnds in stranded colorwork pattern on U. S. 4 / 3.5 mm needles = 4 x 4 in / 10 x 10 cm. Adjust needle size to obtain correct gauge if necessary.

### STITCHES AND TECHNIQUES

The two sizes, WOMEN'S AND MEN'S have different widths, and, therefore, different stitch counts to begin with. The rounds begin at center back of the leg and at center of foot. The heel flap and sole are worked with a checkerboard pattern that is not charted but is explained in the pattern instructions.

**Right-leaning decrease:** Knit 2 stitches together (k2tog).

**Left-leaning decrease:** Slip 1 knitwise, knit 1, pass slipped st over (sl 1, k1, pss0).

### RIBBING

With smaller size dpn and color 1, CO 48 (60) sts. Divide sts over 4 dpn and join.

The round begins at center back of leg.

Work around in k1, p1 ribbing for ¾ in / 2 cm.

### LEG

Change to larger size dpn and work around in pattern following chart.

Work repeat until leg is desired length, for example 6 in / 15 cm. The pattern is worked from right to left and repeated all down the leg. The heel flap and sole are worked with one pattern, as explained under "Heel Flap." Knit in pattern to desired leg length.

### **Set up Heel Flap**

**Women's:** Arrange sts so the first 10 and last 11 sts (from needles 1 and 4) are on one needle. These sts will become the heel. Move rem sts from needles 1 and 4 to needles 2 and 3. The center 27 sts (needles 2 and 3) will rest until the heel is finished. Cut yarn and begin heel flap on RS.

**Men's:** Arrange sts so the first 13 and last 14 sts (from needles 1 and 4) are on one needle. These sts will become the heel. Move rem sts from needles 1 and 4 to needles 2 and 3. The center 33 sts (needles 2 and 3) will rest until the heel is finished. Cut yarn and begin heel flap on RS.

### **HEEL FLAP**

The heel flap is worked with colors 1 and 2, back and forth, in a checkerboard pattern:

Later, the edge sts of the sole will always be worked with color 2 (see "Foot" below).

**Row 1 (RS):** Knit across, alternating colors 1 and 2, and, *at the same time*, increase 2 sts evenly spaced across = 23 (29) sts.

**Row 2 (WS):** Sl 1 purlwise, purl to end of row (purl color 1 over color 2 and color 2 over color 1).

**Row 3 (RS):** Knit across, alternating colors 1 and 2).

**Row 4 (WS):** Work as Row 2.

Repeat Rows 3-4 until you've worked a total of 19 (21) rows. End with a RS row.

### **HEEL TURN**

Continue in same pattern as for heel flap.

### **Women's:**

**Row 1 (WS):** Sl 1 purlwise, p12, p2tog, p1; turn.

**Row 2 (RS):** Sl 1 knitwise, k4, k2tog, k1; turn.

**Row 3 (WS):** Sl 1 purlwise, purl until 1 st before gap, p2tog, p1; turn.

**Row 4 (RS):** Sl 1 knitwise, knit until 1 st before gap, k2tog, k1; turn.

Repeat Rows 3-4 until all the side sts have been eliminated.

### **Men's:**

**Row 1 (WS):** Sl 1 purlwise, p16, p2tog, p1; turn.

**Row 2 (RS):** Sl 1 knitwise, k6, k2tog, k1; turn.

**Row 3 (WS):** Sl 1 purlwise, purl until 1 st before gap, p2tog, p1; turn.

**Row 4 (RS):** Sl 1 knitwise, knit until 1 st before gap, k2tog, k1; turn.

Repeat Rows 3-4 until all the side sts have been eliminated.

Now 13 (17) st rem. Divide these sts onto 2 needles (needles 1 and 4).

### **FOOT**

Begin rnd at center of sole. Pick up and knit approx. 9 (11) sts along first side of heel flap (pick up alternating colors as in pattern). Pick up and knit through both stitch loops of the slipped sts. With color 1, pick up and knit one st between heel flap and instep = edge st.

Place all the new sts on needle 1.

Now work instep pattern (make sure pattern aligns with pattern on leg).

With color 2, pick up and knit one st between instep and heel flap = edge st.

Pick up and knit approx. 9 (11) sts along heel flap and place sts on needle 4. There should now be approx. 33 (41) sts divided on needles 1 and 4 = sole of foot.

On the first rnd, knit the picked-up sts through back loops to avoid holes.

On sole of foot, continue in same pattern as for heel flap, but, always work the edge sts (first and last sts) with color 1.

On instep, continue in pattern (make sure it aligns with leg pattern), but, always work the edge sts (first and last sts) with color 2.

Continue in pattern, and, *at the same time*, on every other rnd, decrease 1 st at the end of needle 1 and beginning of needle 4 (on each side of sole but not decreasing with edge sts) until 52 (64) sts rem divided on the 4 dpn. There will be 2 more sts on the instep – these are edge sts.

Work charted pattern, repeating it until you've worked 2½ (2¾) in / 6 (7) cm or desired length before beginning toe (see measurements table below).

When sock is 2½ (2¾) in / 6 (7) cm or desired length before toe, begin toe shaping – the edge sts follow up the toe and are not decreased. Decrease as follows:

At end of needle 1 (sole): right-leaning decrease

At beginning of needle 2 (instep): left-leaning decrease

At end of needle 3 (instep): right-leaning decrease

At beginning of needle 4 (sole): left-leaning decrease

Decrease on every rnd until 6 sts rem.

Cut yarn and draw end through rem sts; tighten.

Make second sock the same way.

## **FINISHING**

Weave in all ends neatly on WS.

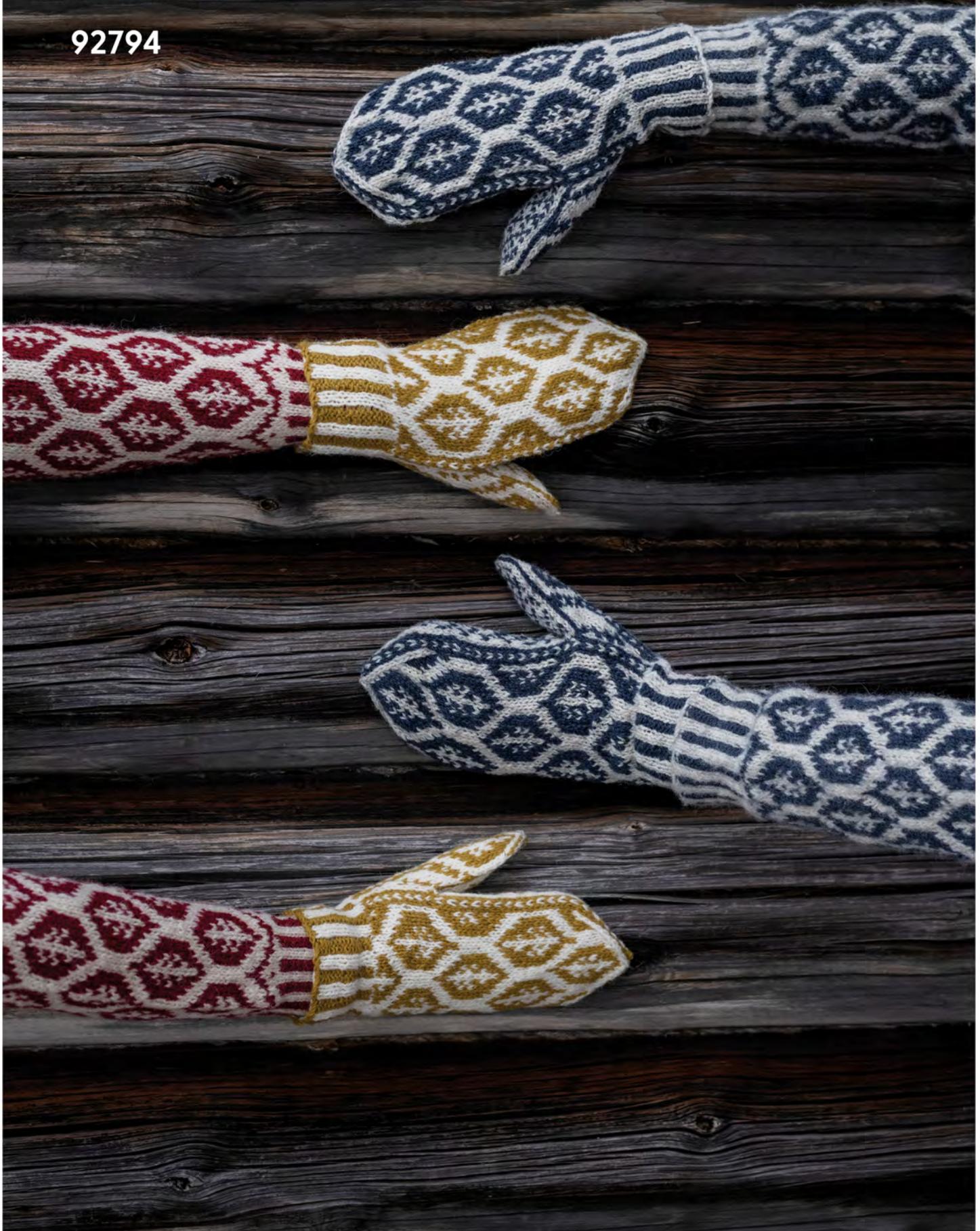
Dampen socks, preferably with water from a spray bottle. Gently squeeze and then roll in towel to release excess water. Lay out socks to finished measurements on a dry surface and leave until completely dry.

## 92794 Lövfäll – stranded colorwork mittens

Lövfäll (Falling Leaves) are good, warm mittens with a pattern inspired by autumn's leaf-covered hills. These mittens will be great for wearing when you are out in windy and inclement weather. The mittens are worked from the ribbed cuff up to the fingertips. The increases and decreases for the thumb gusset are explained in the text and shown on the chart. The thumb is worked afterwards by picking up and knitting stitches and knit following the chart.

**YARN** Järbo 2 tr Ull (2-Ply Wool) (100% wool, 328 yd/300 m / 100 g)

Alpacka Solo (100% alpaca, 183 yd/167 m / 50 g)

Elise (60% cotton, 40% acrylic, 184 yd/170 m / 50 g)

**GAUGE** Approx. 22 sts x 31 rnds in stranded colorwork pattern on U. S. 4 / 3.5 mm needles = 4 x 4 in / 10 x 10 cm. Adjust needle size to obtain correct gauge if necessary.

**MITTEN CIRCUMFERENCE AROUND HAND** Approx. 8¾ (9½, 10) in / 22 (24, 25.5) cm

### MITTEN

With smaller size dpn and color 2 (CC), CO 44 (48, 52) sts. Divide sts onto 4 dpn and join.

Work around in k2 with MC, p2 with CC ribbing for 2 (2, 2½) in / 5 (5, 6) cm.

Change to larger size dpn. Work following chart for chosen size S, M, or L. Increase and decrease as shown on chart.

After thumb gusset is complete, slip the 13 (13, 15) thumb sts onto waste yarn or stitch holder. CO 9 sts over gap = 48 (52, 56) sts.

Continue, following charted pattern, decreasing at top as shown on chart.

Cut yarn and draw end through rem sts; tighten.

Weave in ends neatly on WS.

### THUMB

Slip held thumb sts onto larger size dpn. Pick up and knit 7 (9, 11) sts on back of thumbhole = 20 (22, 26) sts.

Knit thumb following thumb chart, adjusting stitch count as shown on chart.

Cut yarn and draw end through rem sts; tighten.

The chart shows the right-hand mitten. To knit the left-hand mitten, follow the chart mirror-image, from left to right.

### **FINISHING**

Weave in all ends neatly on WS.

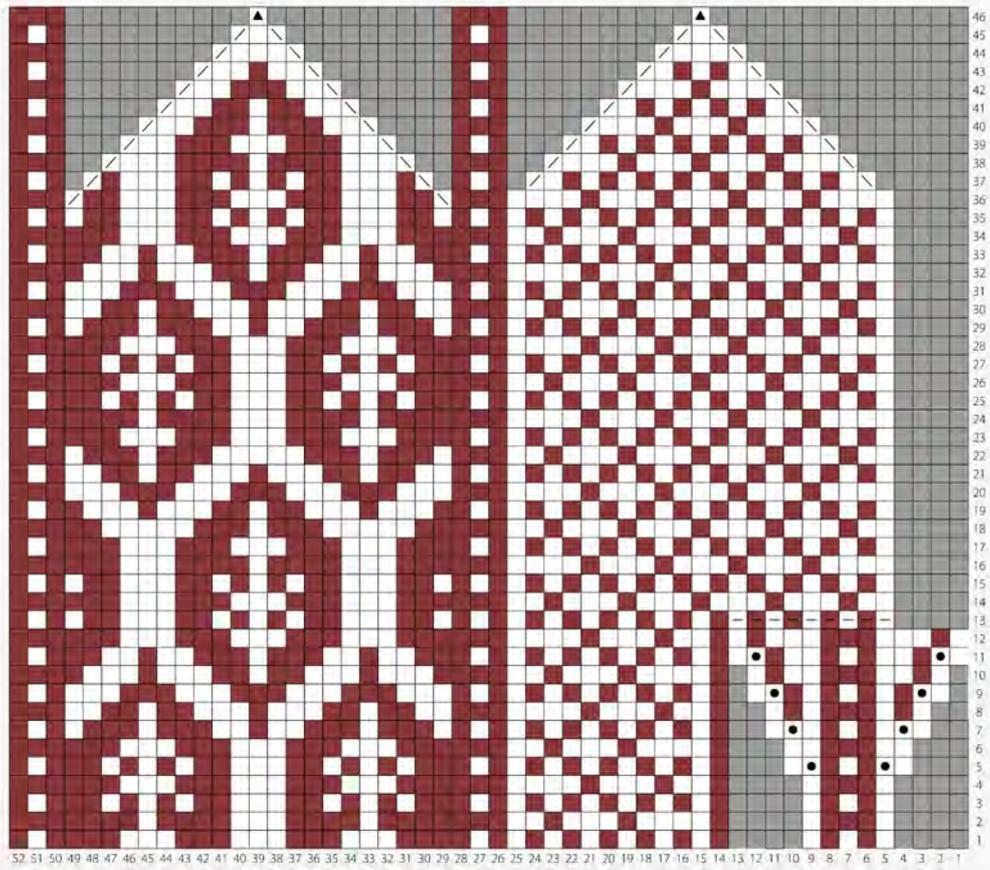
Lay out mittens to finished measurements and cover with a damp towel. Leave until completely dry. Or, soak in lukewarm water with no-rinse wool soap. Gently squeeze and then roll in towel to release excess water. Lay mittens flat to dry.

**GARMENT LENGTH** Approx. 22½ (22¾, 24, 24½, 24¾, 25½, 26, 27½, 28¾, 30¼) in / 57 (58, 61, 62, 63, 65, 66, 70, 73, 77) cm

**GARMENT SLEEVE LENGTH** Approx. 18½ (19, 19¼, 19¾, 20, 20½, 20¾, 21, 21, 21¼) in / 47 (48, 49, 50, 51, 52, 52, 53, 53, 54) cm

### YARN AMOUNTS AND COLORS

**Color 1, MC:** Approx. 250 (250, 250, 300, 300, 350, 350, 400, 400, 450) g (color 74103, Nostalgia / 74104, Silver Stream)

**Color 2, CC:** Approx. 200 (250, 250, 300, 300, 350, 350, 400, 400, 450) g (color 74112, Ashen Brown / 74122, Cranberry Red / 74135, Smokey Blue)

**NEEDLES** U. S. sizes 4 and 6 / 3.5 and 4 mm: circulars 16 and 32 in / 40 and 80 cm + sets of 5 dpn

**NOTIONS** Stitch markers

**LEVEL OF DIFFICULTY** \*\*\*

**Matching Mittens and Socks:** 92794 and 92795

### BODY

With smaller size circular and color 2 (CC), CO 204 (216, 228, 252, 264, 276, 288, 300, 312, 336) sts. Join, being careful not to twist cast-on row; pm for beginning of rnd. Work around in k2 with MC, p2 with CC ribbing for 2½ in / 6 cm.

Pm at side so there are 102 (108, 114, 126, 132, 138, 144, 150, 156, 168) sts each for front and back.

Change to larger size circular and knit 2 rnds with MC.

Work pattern following chart A and then work pattern on chart B.

Repeat chart B to desired length of body to underarms. The body length is measured from the underarm down to your desired length at hip.

When body measures 15 (15½, 15¾, 15¾, 15¾, 16¼, 16½, 16½, 17, 17¼) in / 38 (39, 40, 40, 40, 41, 42, 42, 43, 44) cm or desired length, BO 4 sts before and after each marker = 16 sts bound off in total.

Set body aside while you knit sleeves.

### **SLEEVES**

With smaller size dpn and color 2 (CC), CO 48 (48, 48, 52, 52, 56, 56, 56, 60, 60) sts. Divide sts onto dpn and join. Work around in k2 with MC, p2 with CC ribbing for 2½ in / 6 cm.

Change to larger size dpn and knit 1 rnd with MC.

Knit next rnd with MC, increasing 6 (6, 6, 8, 8, 8, 10, 10, 12, 14) sts evenly spaced around = 54 (54, 54, 60, 60, 64, 66, 66, 72, 74) sts. Pm before first st for beginning of rnd. The first st to left of the marker is a marked st. Always knit the sts before and after marked st with CC. The marked st is knit on alternate rnds with MC and CC. The marked st and the sts on each side of it are not included on chart.

Work following chart A and then chart B. *At the same time*, every 1 (1, 1, 1, 1, ¾, ¾, ¾, ¾, ¾) in / 2.5 (2.5, 2.5, 2.5, 2.5, 2, 2, 2, 2, 2) cm, increase 1 st on each side of marked st until there are a total of 80 (84, 88, 90, 94, 94, 100, 108, 116, 122) sts. Work all new sts with CC.

Repeat chart B until sleeve measures 18½ (19, 19¼, 19¾, 20, 20½, 20½, 21, 21, 21¼) in / 47 (48, 49, 50, 51, 52, 52, 53, 53, 54) cm or desired length.

BO 4 sts before and after beginning of rnd marker (= 8 sts bound off).

Set sleeve aside and knit second sleeve the same way.

### **YOKE**

Arrange body and sleeves on larger size circular = 332 (352, 372, 400, 420, 432, 456, 484, 512, 548) sts total.

Pm before first and after last st of each sleeve. The first and last st on each sleeve is a marked st (= 4 markers). Markers indicate where you will make raglan decreases. Continue as est in pattern B for yoke.

**Note:** The patten will not work out evenly at the raglan lines, but you should make sure that the yoke pattern aligns with pattern on body and sleeves.

#### **Raglan Shaping:**

Knit 10 (6, 6, 4, 4, 4, 4, 2, 2, 2) rnds in pattern as est before you begin decreasing.

**Summary of raglan shaping:** The sts before and after each marked st are always knitted with CC.

The marked st alternates with CC and MC on every other rnd.

Knit marked st, k2tog tbl with CC.

Knit until 2 sts before marked st, \*k2tog with CC, knit marked st, k2tog tbl with CC.

Continue with charted pattern until 2 sts before marked st. \* Rep \* to \* until you complete rnd = 8 sts decreased.

Knit next rnd without decreasing but remember to knit marked st in opposite color from previous rnd.

On next, third, rnd, decrease as above.

Continue, repeating the two raglan rnds (1 decrease rnd, 1 rnd without decreases) 25 (27, 27, 26, 26, 26, 25, 23, 21, 16) times = 132 (136, 156, 192, 212, 224, 256, 300, 344, 420) sts rem.

Now decrease on every rnd 0 (0, 2, 6, 8, 10, 14, 20, 24, 34) times = 132 (136, 140, 144, 148, 144, 144, 140, 152, 148) sts rem.

### **NECKBAND**

Knit 1 rnd with MC, decreasing 28 (32, 32, 30, 30, 22, 22, 18, 30, 26) sts evenly spaced around = 104 (104, 108, 114, 118, 122, 122, 122, 122, 122) sts rem.

Change to smaller size circular and, with MC, work in k1, p1 ribbing for 1½ in / 4 cm.

Purl 1 rnd for foldline.

Work in k1, p1 ribbing for 1½ in / 4 cm.

BO loosely in ribbing.

Fold neckband at foldline and loosely sew down edge on WS.

### **FINISHING**

Weave in all ends neatly on WS. Lay out sweater to finished measurements and cover with a damp towel. Leave until completely dry. Or, soak sweater in lukewarm water with no-rinse wool soap. Gently squeeze and then roll in towel to release excess water. Lay sweater flat to dry.

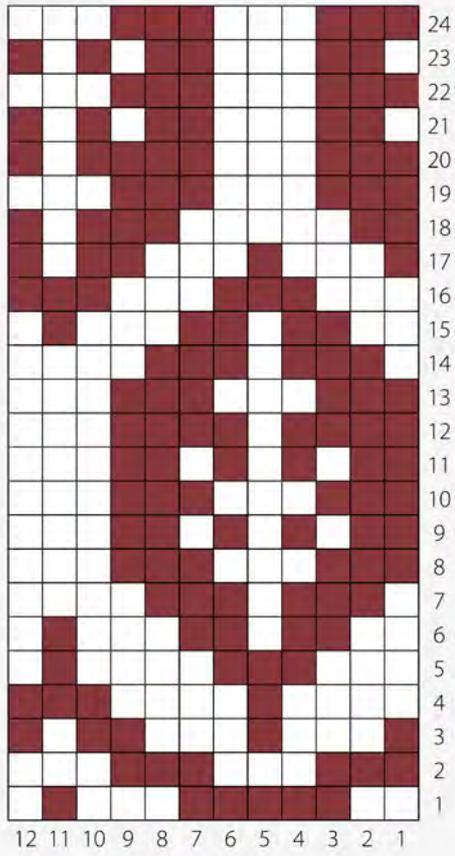

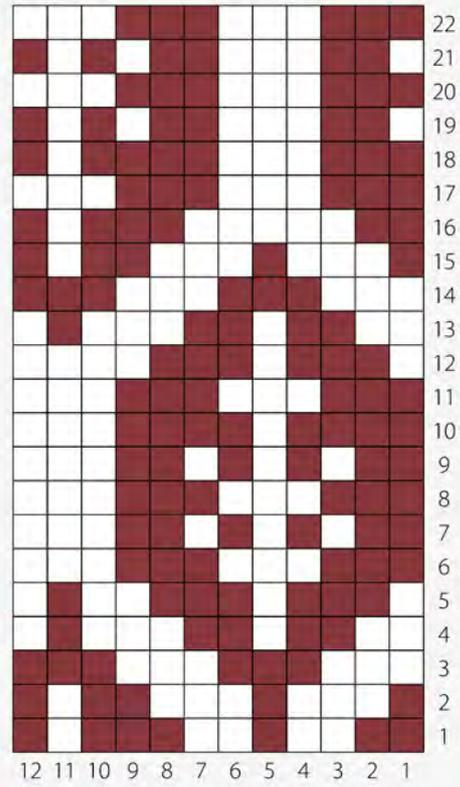

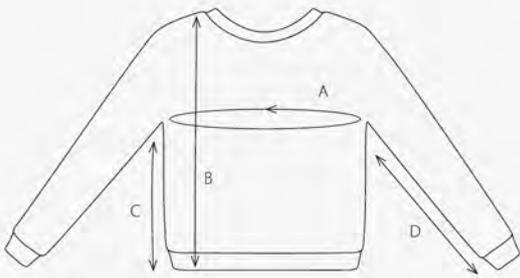

## TIPS & SHORTCUTS

**To avoid questions:** Before you begin knitting, read through the pattern.

**Stitch count:** Always knit or crochet a gauge swatch as recommended in the pattern. If your stitch count doesn't match the gauge given in the pattern, try again with larger or smaller needles or hook. If your gauge doesn't match that in the pattern, your item will not be the correct size or shape.

**Highlight** the size you will knit or crochet throughout the pattern to make it easier to follow the instructions.

**Charts:** It will be easier to follow a chart if you mark your row with a ruler and magnetic board or sticky note.

**Ease:** The amount of ease included in our garments varies depending on the type and shape of the garment. To determine the right size, we recommend that you first measure your body. Then you can calculate the garment size depending on how much ease you want the garment to have. The schematics for each piece show all the garment measurements.

**Two-color stranded knitting:** When knitting more than 3-4 stitches of the same color, twist the color strands around each other on the wrong side to avoid long strands or "floats" on the back. If the yarns need to be twisted on several rows/rounds, make sure you do not stack the twists in the same place to prevent the yarns from showing through on the right side.

**Yarn alternative:** Please be aware that the gauge (tension), yarn quantity and the shape of the work varies if you use another yarn (even in the same yarn group).

**Tips for hand dyed yarn:** Make sure you have enough yarn to complete your project. The colors may vary from time to time. To get a smooth color mix, you can alternate between two skeins: knit two rows from one and two rows from another skein.
