GUJO COLLAR

Gujo collar is a warm and soft cowl to keep you warm all winter. Knitted in classic half-fisherman's rib with visible decreases on the front and back. The large neck has quite a dramatic effect but is also functional to be pulled up as a hood to keep your head and ears warm. The longer front piece will keep your chest warm. The collar can be worn underneath or on top of a coat.

SIZES

One size

Finished Measurement

From back neck to bottom: 39 cm / 15.4"

From front neck to bottom: 48 cm / 18.9"

YARN

1 strand Lang Yarns 'Carpe Diem'

300 g Carpe Diem (50 g / 90 m, 70% extra fine virgin merino wool, 30% alpaca)

Gujo Collar in the photo is made in color, Carpe Diem col. 0026

Or...

1 strand Lang Yarns 'Noble Cashmere' - 300 g (100 g / 200 m, 100% Cashmere)

GAUGE

18 sts x 18 rows = 10 x 10 cm / 4" on 4.5 mm / US 7 needle in half-fisherman's' rib.

It is NOT recommended to block Gujo to enjoy the extra texture.

NEEDLE SIZE

Circular needle 4.5 mm / US 7 (60 – 80 cm / 24 – 32")

Scrap yarn or stitch holder/cord, ~ 5 stitch markers

Always read through the pattern before you start. There may be important information.

ABBREVIATIONS

K, k: knit

P, p: purl

k1-b: knit one stitch below the stitch on the knitting needle

p1-b: purl one stitch below the stitch on the knitting needle

rep: repeat

Rnd(s): round(s)

Row(s): row(s)

st(s): stitch(es)

OS: OutSide (conventional WS of the Half-Fisherman's Rib pattern)

IS: InSide conventional (RS of the Half-Fisherman's Rib pattern)

BOR: Beginning Of Round

Sl wyif: Slip stitch with yarn in front

m: marker

pm: place marker

sm: slip marker

edge st: edge stitch, the first st: sl1 wyif,, last st: k1

kyok: knit, yarn over, knit into the same st. 2 st increased. These sts are worked as p, k, p on the IS when worked in flat.

SSSK: Sl 3 sts knitwise one at a time, insert the left needle into the front of the slipped stitches and knit them together, 2nd decreased in the left-leaning direction

K2tog: Knit 2 stitches together, 1 st decreased

tbl: through the back loop

LH/RH: Left Hand / Right Hand

BO: Bind Off

STITCH GUIDE

Half-Fisherman's Rib

Worked in the Round: Even number of sts.

Rnd 1: K all.

Rnd 2: *K1, p1-b; rep from * to end.

Rep Rnds 1 and 2 for pattern. When purling one below (p1-b), the knitting needle will be inserted under the purl bump below the stitch on the needle.

Worked in Flat/Rows: Odd number of sts

Row 1 (OS): K all.

Row 2 (IS): *K1-b, p1; rep from * to last 2 sts, k1, p1. Rep Rows 1 and 2 for pattern. When knitting one below (k1-b), the knitting needle will be inserted into the center of the stitch of the row below.

Note: In the GUJO collar, **OS** is what is conventionally considered the “wrong side” of this Half-Fisherman's Rib pattern. To avoid confusion, the terms **OS** & **IS** are used throughout this pattern, rather than RS & WS.

PATTERN BEGINS HERE

CO 120 sts on a 4.5 mm / US 7 needle with the Italian CO.

First st is a K st.

First 2 rows are worked flat:

Row 1 & 2: *k1, sl 1 wyif; repeat from * to last st. p1.

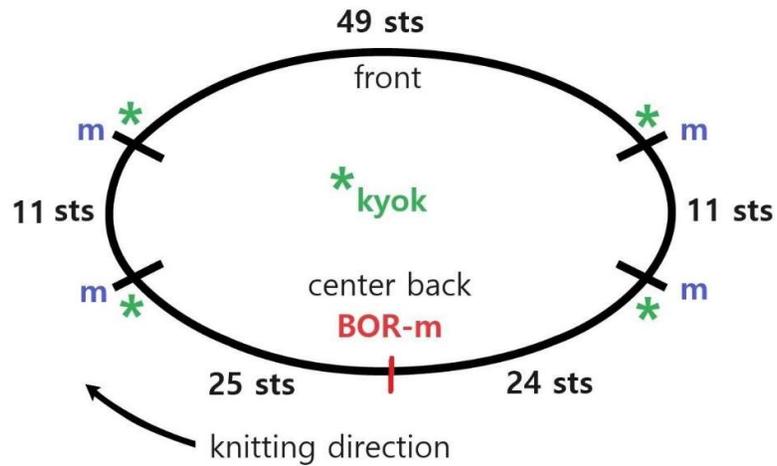
Join in the round carefully without twisting the work, and place a marker (m) for BOR. Work as below:

Rnd 1: k all.

Rnd 2: *K1, p1-b; rep from * to BOR

Rep Rnds 1 & 2 for pattern until work measures approx. 28 cm / 11", finish with Rnd 2.

Divide the work into 4 sections: back, 2 shoulders, and front. Place 4 markers as shown in the diagram below before the next Rnd; 25sts, pm, 11 st, pm, 49 sts, pm, 11st, pm, 24sts, pm for BOR (**BOR-m**).



DOUBLE INCREASES TO CREATE SHOULDERS

As indicated above in the diagram with *, k24 (or 1 st before m) **kyok, sm, k11, sm, **kyok**, k47, **kyok** (or 1 st before marker), sm, k11, sm, **kyok**, k23 to BOR.

Next Rnd: Work "Rnd 2" of the Half-Fisherman's Rib in the round. Make sure to match the sts pattern from the above, so you have the continuous rib pattern. Work new sts from the Double Increase (kyok) as K1, P1, K1. **

A total from **-* for a total of 6 times, ending with second Rnd. Total of 168 sts. 73sts each for back and front, 11sts for each shoulder. Break the yarn.

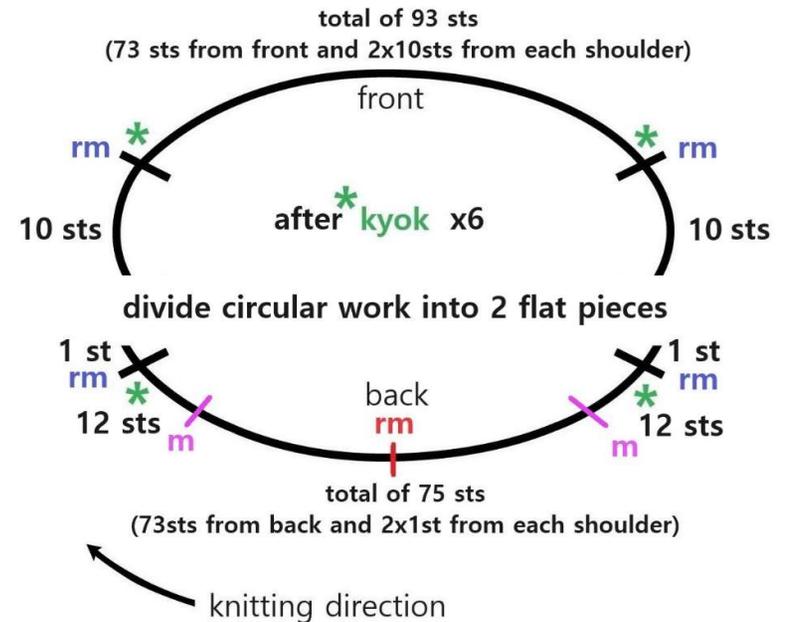
DIVIDE CIRCULAR WORK INTO 2 PIECES

BACK PIECE

Divide work into back, shoulders, and front pieces and work flat:
Remove BOR-m and move 36 sts on the right side of BOR-m (back right side) onto the same needle as the back left side sts. Also, move 1 st from each shoulder to either end of the same needle. Total of 75 sts on the needle for the back piece. The remaining 10 sts from each shoulder and front 73sts will be placed on a different circular needle or a stitch holder for the front & should pieces (total of 93 sts) to work later.

OS Row: with 4.5mm needle, add new yarn and **work 1 edge st, k12, pm, k to last 13sts, pm, k12, 1 edge st.

IS Row: 1 edge st, *p1, K1-b; rep from * to last st, 1 edge st. **
Repeat **-* for 10 times, total of 20 rows, ending with **IS** row.



Begin Double Decreases for tapered shape:

Row 1 (OS): 1 edge st, k12, sm, SSSK, k to 3 sts before next m, k2tog tbl, move st back onto LH needle, pass last st before m over the 1st you just worked (k2tog tbl), move st onto RH needle, sm, k to last st, 1 edge st.

Row 2 (IS): 1 edge st, *p1, k1-b; repeat from * to last st, 1 edge st. Slip markers as you pass them.

Row 3, 5 (OS): 1 edge st, k to last st, 1 edge st. Slip markers as you pass them.

Row 4, 6 (IS): 1 edge st, *p1, k1-b; repeat from * to last st, 1 edge st. Slip markers as you pass them.

Repeat Row 1-6, 3 more times. Total of 4 double decreases, 16 st decreased.

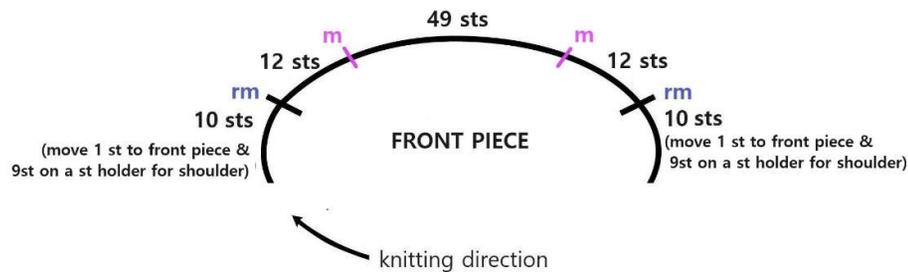
Set-up for Italian BO:

Set up Row 1 (OS): *Sl 1 wyif, k1; Repeat from * to last st, 1 edge st.

Set up Row 2 (IS): 1 edge st, *Sl 1 wyif, p1; repeat from * to end.

Finish with Italian BO: bind off the first 2 sts and the last 2sts as 1st.

FRONT PIECE



Arrange 93 sts from a holder to a 4.5 mm needle. Connect the yarn and work it in the same manner as the back piece:

OS Row: Place the first 9sts on a st holder (or a scrap yarn), with 4.5mm needle, **k1, rm, k12, pm, k49, pm, k12, rm, k1, place the remaining 9st on a st holder.

IS Row: 1 edge st, *p1, k1-b; repeat from * to last st, 1 edge st. Slip markers as you pass them.**

Repeat **-** for 10 times, 20 rows, ending with IS row.

Begin Double Decreases for tapered shape:

Row 1 (OS): 1 edge st, k12, sm, SSSK, k to 3 sts before next m, k2tog tbl, move st back onto LH needle, pass last st before m over the 1st you just worked (k2tog tbl), move st onto RH needle, sm, k to last st, 1 edge st.

Row 2 (IS): 1 edge st, *p1, k1-b; repeat from * to last st, 1 edge st. Slip markers as you pass them.

Row 3, 5 (OS): 1 edge st, k to last st, 1 edge st. Slip markers as you pass them.

Row 4, 6 (IS): 1 edge st, *p1, k1-b; repeat from * to last st, 1 edge st. Slip markers as you pass them.

Repeat Row 1-6, 5 more times. Total of 6 double decreases, 24 st decreased.

Set-up for Italian BO:

Set up Row 1 (OS): 1 edge st, *Sl 1 wyif, k1; Repeat from * to last st, 1 edge st.

Set up Row 2 (IS): 1 edge st, *Sl 1 wyif, p1; repeat from * to end.

Finish with Italian BO: bind off the first 2 sts and the last 2sts as 1st.

THE SHOULDERS

Place the 9 shoulder sts onto a 4.5 mm needle, BO with Italian BO.

No set up row is necessary. Repeat for the other shoulder.

FINISHING

Weave in loose ends.

Your Gujo Collar features a rugged texture and does NOT require the usual blocking.
