## NOTES

This jumper pattern is unisex, has a boxy fit, and comes in ten different adult sizes. There are two options for body length options - cropped and regular. Because the jumper is knitted top down, you can easily customize the length by stopping or continuing after the recommended body length measurements. There are also two sleeve length options, bracelet length and full length, so you can customize the jumper to fit you best. There are optional chest short rows for a looser fit around the chest area. I used Japanese short rows as it is the least visible method, but any short rows method works. The colourwork charts are read from right to left, bottom to top. The intended positive ease is about 5cm / 2" to 10cm / 4".

## CONSTRUCTION

The jumper is knitted top-down and in the round. A seamless colourwork round yoke follows, with increase intervals throughout. Sleeve separation creates the distinction between armholes and body. The sleeves are knitted top-down and in the round as well.

biches and buches [le petit lambswool](#)  
held together with [le petit silk mohair](#)  
mc - rose grey  
cc - white

## NEEDLES

Size 3.5mm (US 4) & 4.5mm (US7) or size necessary to obtain gauge

## GAUGE


22 sts x 21.5 rows = 4" / 10 cm in colourwork sts & stockinette sts

## NOTIONS

Stitch markers  
Tapestry needle  
Stitch holders / Waste yarn

## WIRE LENGTHS

40cm/16"  
60cm/24"  
80cm/32"



## YARDAGE - DK

Yardage is listed for each yarn. For example, if you are knitting the smallest size, you will need 540 meters of colour a in lambswool and 540 meters of colour a in silkmohair.



## BEGIN PATTERN

neck

Using smaller needles and with mc, co with your preferred stretchy cast-on method 92 (92, 92, 96) 96, 96 [108, 108, 112] 112 sts.

Join in the rnd and pm to mark bor. Work \*k1,p1\* until work measures 2.5cm/1".

## NECK SHORT ROW SHAPING

Switch to larger needles. K 1 round.

SR1 (rs): k 45 (46, 46, 48) 48, 48 [54, 54, 56] 56, w&t.

SR2 (ws): p 68 (69, 69, 72) 72, 72 [81, 81, 84] 84, w&t.

SR3 (rs): k 61 (62, 62, 65) 66, 66 [75, 75, 78] 78, w&t.

SR4 (ws): p 54 (55, 55, 58) 60, 60 [69, 69, 72] 72, w&t.

SR5 (rs): k 47 (48, 48, 51) 54, 54 [63, 63, 66] 66, w&t.

SR6 (ws): p 40 (41, 41, 44) 48, 48 [57, 57, 60] 60, w&t.

SR7 (rs): k- (-, -, -) 42, 42 [51, 51, 54] 54, w&t.

SR8 (ws): p - (-, -, -) 36, 36 [45, 45, 48] 48, w&t.

Work in stockinette stitch (k all sts), picking up the wraps as you go. Knit an additional round, picking up remaining wraps and knit them together with the wrapped stitches as you go.



## SET-UP INC ROUNDS

Before starting chart a, knit the following increases. Refer to your size section for increase rounds in the yoke. Switch to longer cables as yoke size increases.

### SIZE 1

Rnd 1: K to end. (0 inc) [92]  
Rnd 2: \*K5, m1\* to end of rnd. (18 inc) [108]  
Rnd 3: K to end. (0 inc) [108]  
Rnd 4: \*K6, m1\* to end of rnd. (18 inc) [126]

### SIZE 2

Rnd 1: K to end. (0 inc) [92]

### SIZE 3

Rnd 1: K to end. (0 inc) [92]  
Rnd 2: \*K11, m1\* to last 4 sts, k4. (8 inc) [100]

### SIZE 4

Rnd 1: K to end. (0 inc) [96]  
Rnd 2: \*K6, m1\* to end of rnd. (16 inc) [112]

### SIZE 5

Rnd 1: K to end. (0 inc) [96]  
Rnd 2: \*K6, m1\* to end of rnd. (16 inc) [112]  
Rnd 3: K to end. (0 inc) [112]  
Rnd 4: \*K9, m1\* to last 4 sts, k4. (12 inc) [124]

### SIZE 6

Rnd 1: K to end. (0 inc) [96]  
Rnd 2: \*K5, m1\* to last 6 sts, k6. (18 inc) [114]  
Rnd 3: K to end. (0 inc) [114]  
Rnd 4: \*K6, m1\* to last 6 sts, k6. (18 inc) [132]

### SIZE 7

Rnd 1: K to end. (0 inc) [108]  
Rnd 2: \*K6, m1\* to end of rnd. (18 inc) [126]  
Rnd 3: K to end. (0 inc) [126]  
Rnd 4: \*K9, m1\* to end of rnd. (14 inc) [140]

### SIZE 8

Rnd 1: K to end. (0 inc) [108]  
Rnd 2: \*K6, m1\* to last 6 sts, k6. (17 inc) [125]  
Rnd 3: K to end. (0 inc) [125]  
Rnd 4: \*K8, m1\* to last 5 sts, k5. (15 inc) [140]  
Rnd 5: K to end. (0 inc) [140]  
Rnd 6: \*K11, m1\* to last 8 sts, k8. (12 inc) [152]


### SIZE 9

Rnd 1: K to end. (0 inc) [112]  
Rnd 2: \*K7, m1\* to end of rnd. (16 inc) [128]  
Rnd 3: K to end. (0 inc) [128]  
Rnd 4: \*K8, m1\* to end of rnd. (16 inc) [144]  
Rnd 5: K to end. (0 inc) [144]  
Rnd 6: \*k9, m1\* to end of rnd. (16 inc) [160]

### SIZE 10

Rnd 1: K to end. (0 inc) [112]  
Rnd 2: \*K7, m1\* to end of rnd. (16 inc) [128]  
Rnd 3: K to end. (0 inc) [128]  
Rnd 4: k10, m1, \*K6, m1\* to last 4 sts, k4. (20 inc) [148]  
Rnd 5: K to end. (0 inc) [144]  
Rnd 6: k11, m1, \*K7, m1\* to last 4 sts, k4. (20 inc) [168]

All sizes: Knit chart a.

## STITCH COUNT AFTER INCREASES

After rnd 4, you have

126 (138, 150, 168) 186, 198 [210, 228, 240] 252 sts.

After rnd 8, you have

168 (184, 200, 224) 248, 264 [280, 304, 320] 336 sts.

After rnd 21, you have

210 (230, 250, 280) 310, 330 [350, 380, 400] 420 sts.

After rnd 35, you have

252 (276, 300, 336) 372, 396 [420, 456, 480] 504 sts.

## SEPARATION OF SLEEVES

K the first 73 (83, 92, 103) 114, 123 [132, 140, 151] 162 sts for back of body.

Place the next 53 (55, 58, 65) 72, 75 [78, 88, 89] 90 sts on stitch holder or scrap yarn for sleeve a.

Backwards loop cast-on 11 (11, 12, 13) 14, 15 [16, 18, 19] 20 sts for underarm. Repeat for front, sleeve b and second underarm over remaining sts.

Pm to mark bor. The bor should be on the back of your left shoulder. You have 168 (188, 208, 232) 256, 276 [296, 316, 340] 364 sts on needles.

## CHEST SHORT ROW SHAPING - OPTIONAL

If you have a bigger chest circumference, or prefer a fit with more room around your chest area, knit the following section.

SR1 (rs): k 157 (177, 196, 219) 242, 261 [280, 298, 321] 344, w&t.

SR2 (ws): p 73 (83, 92, 103) 114, 123 [132, 140, 151] 162, w&t.

SR3 (rs): k 68 (78, 87, 98) 109, 118 [127, 135, 146] 157, w&t.

SR4 (ws): p 63 (73, 82, 93) 104, 113 [122, 130, 141] 152, w&t.

SR5 (rs): k 58 (68, 77, 88) 99, 108 [117, 125, 136] 147, w&t.

SR6 (ws): p 53 (63, 72, 83) 94, 103 [112, 120, 131] 142, w&t.

SR7 (rs): k 48 (58, 67, 78) 89, 98 [107, 115, 126] 137, w&t.

SR8 (ws): p 43 (53, 62, 73) 84, 93 [102, 110, 121] 132, w&t.

SR9 (rs): k - (-, -, 68) 79, 88 [97, 105, 116] 127, w&t.

SR10 (ws): p - (-, -, 63) 74, 83 [92, 100, 111] 122, w&t.

SR11 (rs): k - (-, -, -) -, - [-, 95, 106] 117, w&t.

SR12 (ws): p - (-, -, -) -, - [-, 90, 101] 112, w&t.

Work in stockinette stitch (k all sts), picking up the wraps as you go. Knit an additional round, picking up remaining wraps and knit them together with the wrapped stitches as you go.

## BODY

There are two options for body length - cropped or regular. If you are shorter or prefer a slightly cropped jumper, knit the section below labelled "cropped body". If you are taller or prefer a longer jumper, knit the section below labelled "regular body". Continue in stockinette st (k all sts) until work measures:

### CROPPED BODY


22.5 (23, 23, 23) 23, 23 [23, 23, 23] 23 cm /  
8¾ (9, 9, 9) 9, 9 [9, 9, 9] 9" from underarm.

### REGULAR BODY

35.5 (38, 40.5, 43) 46, 48.5 [49.5, 51.5, 51.5] 53.5 cm /  
14 (15, 16, 17) 18, 19 [19½, 20¼, 20¼] 21" from underarm.

## HEM

Switch to smaller needles. Work \*k1, p1\* until hem measures 2.5cm/1". Bind off loosely.



## SLEEVE

Transfer held stitches from stitch holder/scrap yarn onto longer needle for magic loop knitting, pick up an additional 11 (11, 12, 13) 14, 15 [16, 18, 19] 20 sts from underarm.

K the next 59 (61, 64, 72) 79, 83 [86, 97, 99] 100 sts, pm to mark bor.

You have a total of 64 (66, 70, 78) 86, 90 [94, 106, 108] 110 sts.

## SLEEVE LENGTHS

There are two sleeve length options - a shorter version (bracelet) and a longer version (full). Continue to your preferred length section.

### SHORTER SLEEVE - BRACELET

Rnd 1: Using mc, k all sts to end of rnd.

Dec rnd: \*k1, ssk, k to last 3 sts, k2tog, k1\*  
(2 sts dec'd).

Work the dec rnd every 7 (8, 8, 6) 5, 4 [4, 3, 3] 3rnds for a total of 12 (12, 12, 16) 19, 21 [22, 28, 29] 28 times.

After your final decrease, you have 40 (43, 46, 46) 48, 48 [50, 50, 50] 54 sts. Continue in stockinette stitch (k all sts) until sleeve measures 42 (43, 43, 44.5) 44.5, 45.5 [45.5, 47, 47] 47cm / 16½ (17, 17, 17½) 17½, 18 [18, 18½, 18½] 18½" from underarm.

Continue to cuff section.

### LONGER SLEEVE - FULL

Rnd 1: Using mc, k all sts to end of rnd.

Dec rnd: \*k1, ssk, k to last 3 sts, k2tog, k1\*  
(2 sts dec'd).

Work the dec rnd every 11 (10, 9, 7) 6, 5 [5, 4, 4] 4rnds for a total of 9 (10, 11, 15) 18, 20 [21, 27, 28] 28 times.

After your final decrease, you have 46 (46, 48, 48) 50, 50 [52, 52, 52] 54 sts. Continue in stockinette stitch (k all sts) until sleeve measures 44 (45, 45.5, 48) 50, 50.5 [52, 52, 53] 53.5 cm / 17¼ (17¾, 18, 19) 19½, 19¾ [20½, 20½, 20¾] 21" from underarm.

Continue to cuff section.

## CUFF

Switch to smaller needles. Work \*k1, p1\* until hem measures 2.5cm/1". Bind off loosely.

## FINISHING

Weave in all ends. Steam block to measurements.

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
