**Size:** to fit oversize  
UK 10 - US 6 - EU 36  
**Skill Level:** intermediate

**How much yarn:** 5 balls (each ball 50g and 200m) of **Vip** yarn (80% Extrafine Merino Wool, 20% Cashmere) shade no. 8433 and 5 balls (each ball 25g and 212m) of **Silk Mohair** yarn

(75% Superkid Mohair, 25% Silk) shade no. 14524

**Needles:** A 4.00mm knitting needles

**Sewing needle:** Yarn needle with rounded point

## STITCHES

### Using needles:

REVERSE STOCKING STITCH (REV ST ST): 1 row P, 1 row K.  
CARTRIDGE STITCH: (work on all sts)

**Row 1:** P. **Row 2:** K. **Row 3 and 4:** P. **Row 5:** K. **Row 6:** P. **Row 7:** K. **Row 8:** P. **Row 9:** K. **Row 10 and 11:** P. **Row 12, 13, 14 and 15:** K. **Row 16:** P1, K1 rib. **Row 17:** K. **Row 18:** P. **Row 19:** K. **Row 20:** P. **Row 21:** K. **Row 22:** P. **Row 23:** K. **Row 24 and 25:** P. **Row 26, 27, 28 and 29:** K. **Row 30:** P1, K1 rib. **Row 31:** K. **Row 32:** P. **Row 33:** K. **Row 34:** P. **Row 35:** K. **Row 36:** P. **Row 37:** K. **Row 38:** P. Rep these 38 rows throughout.

## TENSION

20 sts and 31 rows measure 10cm square over cartridge stitch with 4.00 mm needles and two strands of yarn held together. Take time to check tension before starting work: it is essential to work to the stated tension to achieve success.

## INSTRUCTIONS

**Note:** work with two strands of yarn held together.

**Back:** with 4.00mm needles cast on 100 sts and work Cartridge, AT THE SAME TIME, inc 1 st at each end, inside first and last 2 sts, on 21st row and every following 12th row 3 more times, then every following 8th row once. There are 110 sts and 65 rows. Cont to work until 76 rows have been worked. Shape armholes by casting off 2 sts at beg of next 2 rows: 106 sts remain. Cont to work straight until 100 rows have been worked. Inc 1 st at each end, inside first

and last 2 sts on 101st row (there are 108 sts), then on 107th row and every following alternate row 3 times: there are 114 sts. Cont to work straight until 124 rows have been worked. Shape shoulders: dec 1 st at each end, inside first and last 2 sts on 125th row and every following alternate row 8 more times (96 sts rem), then every row 30 times: 36 sts remain and 172 rows have been worked. For neck, cont to work 30 rows on rem 36 rows. At end, cast off.


**Front:** work as Back.

**Sleeves:** sew shoulder and neck seams. Work sleeves top down. For each sleeve, with 4.00mm pick up 74 sts along Front-and-Back armhole and work Cartridge st for Sleeve as follows: \* **Row 1:** P. **Row 2:** K. **Row 3 and 4:** P. **Row 5:** K. **Row 6:** P. **Row 7:** K. **Row 8:** P. **Row 9:** K. **Row 10:** P. **Row 11:** K. **Row 12:** P1, K1 rib. **Row 13, 14, 15 and 16:** K. **Row 17 and 18:** P. **Row 19:** K. **Row 20:** P. **Row 21:** K. **Row 22:** P. **Row 23:** K. **Row 24:** P. **Row 25:** K. **Row 26:** P1, K1 rib. **Row 27, 28, 29 and 30:** K. **Row 31 and 32:** P. **Row 33:** K. **Row 34:** P. **Row 35:** K. **Row 36:** P. **Row 37:** K. **Row 38:** P.; rep from \* throughout and, AT THE SAME TIME, dec 1 st at each end, inside first and last 2 sts, on 17th row. Rep these decs 6 more times in correspondence of 4th, 17th and 31st rows of When work measures 38cm, end with rev st st band, cast off rem 60 sts.

## FINISHING

Sew side and sleeve seams.

**Note:** wash garment carefully at low temperature, with a very little fabric softener. Lay the garment to dry on a flat surface, without ever hanging them.

**Skill Level:** intermediate

**How much yarn:** 6 (7) balls (each ball 50g and 90m) of **Maxi Soft** yarn

(100% Extrafine Merino Wool) shade no. 13701

**Needles:** A pair of 5.00mm knitting needles

**Sewing needle:** Yarn needle with rounded point

## STITCHES

**Using needles:** K2, P2 rib - Stocking stitch (st st)

## TENSION

17 sts and 23 rows measure 10cm square over stocking stitch with 5.00 mm needles. Take time to check tensions before starting work: it is essential to work to the stated tensions to achieve success.

## INSTRUCTIONS


**Back:** with 5.00mm needles cast on 66 (72) sts and, for border, work 32 rows K2, P2 rib, corresponding to 15cm; then continue in stocking st increasing 1 st at each end, inside first and last 2 sts, on next and every following 12th row 3 times: there are 72 (78) sts. When work measures 32 (34)cm from beg, shape armholes: cast off 2 sts at beg of next 2 rows, then dec 1 st at each end, inside first and last 2 sts, on next and every following alternate row 5 times. In order to create a little armhole border on either side, work as follows: on RH side work 1st st K throughout and 2nd st P on RS and K on WS; on LH side work 1st st P on RS and K on WS and 2nd st K throughout. When armhole measures 8.5 (9.5), work other 10(11)cm K2, P2 on rem 58 (64) sts, then cast off.

**Front:** work as Back until Front measures 29 (31) cm from beg. On following row, on RS of work, purl the centre 2 sts to start K2, P2 Triangle Motif. Enlarge this Motif working 2 sts K2, P2 rib more on next and every following alternate row at both Motif sides until all sts are worked in K2, P2 rib. When work measures 32(34)cm from beg, shape armholes. When work measures 46(49)cm from beg, shape neck: cast off centre 20 (22)sts and continue separately on either side, casting off 3 more sts once at armholes, then dec 1 st every alternate row twice for each armhole. When neck shaping measures 4.5 (5.5)cm, cast off the 14 (16) sts remained on each shoulder.

## FINISHING

Join a shoulder seam. **Turtleneck:** pick up and K approx 66 (78) sts along Front-and-Back neckline and K2, P2 rib for 15cm, respecting the underlying motifs in order to create K2, P2 ribbing continuity. At end, cast off. Sew other shoulder and turtleneck seam. Sew side seams.

**Note:** wash garment carefully at low temperature, with a very little fabric softener. Lay the garment to dry on a flat surface, without ever hanging them.





**One size:** for women's head and hands  
**Skill Level:** intermediate

**How much yarn:** 2 balls (each ball 50g and 125m) of **New Baby Alpaca 70** yarn (70% Baby Alpaca, 30% Extrafine Merino Wool) shade no. 30177

**Needles:** A pair of 4.00mm needles. A pair of 5.00mm

needles. A double-pointed (Dp) needle

A set of four 5.00mm double-pointed needles

**Sewing needle:** Yarn needle with rounded point

**Other items:** Stitch-markers. Stitch-holder

A fake fur pompon colour-matched

## STITCHES

**Using needles:** K1, P1 rib.

STRAIGHT STOCKING STITCH (ST ST): 1 row K, 1 row P.

CIRCULAR STOCKING STITCH: all rounds K.

HERRINGBONE STITCH: (worked over 12 sts)

**Row 1:** P2, 4 Right Crossed stitches (4-st RC = slip next 2 sts to Dp needle and hold to back, K next 2 sts, K2 from Dp needle), 4 Left Crossed stitches (4-st LC = slip next 2 sts to Dp needle and hold to front, K next 2 sts, K2 from Dp needle), P2. **Row 2:** K2, P8, K2. Rep these 2 rows throughout.

## TENSION

18 sts and 24 rows measure 10cm square over stocking st with 5.00mm needles. Take time to check tension before starting work: it is essential to work to the stated tension to achieve success.

## INSTRUCTIONS BEANIE HAT

With 4.00mm needles cast on 98 sts and for border work 14 rows K2, P2 rib, corresponding to 5cm, increasing 2 sts evenly across last st. There are 100 sts. Change to 5.00mm and work **33 rows** as follows: P2, (12 sts in herringbone st) 8 times, P2. **Row 34:** K1, K2tog, K1, P8, \* K1, K2 tog, K1, P8; rep from \* 6 more times, K1, K2tog, K1: in this manner 9 sts have been decreased and 91 sts remain. **Rows 35, 36 and 37:** work as established. **Row 38:** K1, K2tog, P8, \* K1, K2 tog, P8; rep from \* 6 more times, K2tog, K1: in this manner 9 sts have been decreased and 82 sts remain. **Row 39:** work as established. **Row 40:** K2tog,

P8, \* K2 tog, P8; rep from \* 6 more times, K2tog: in this manner 9 sts have been decreased and 73 sts remain. **Row 41:** work as established. **Row 42:** \* K1, (P2 tog) 4 times; rep from \* 7 more times, K1: in this manner 32 sts have been decreased and 41 sts remain. **Row 43:** \* P1, (k2 tog) twice; rep from \* 7 more times, P1: in this manner 16 sts have been decreased and 25 sts remain. **Row 44:** work as established. **Row 45:** \* K2 tog; rep from \* ending with P1: 13 sts remain. Cut yarn leaving a long end. Leave sts on the needle. Then sew side seam. Sew pompon on top.

## INSTRUCTIONS MITTENS

**Left mitten:** with 4.00mm needles cast on 42 sts and for cuff work 16 rows K2, P2 rib, corresponding to 6cm, increasing 1 st on last st. There are 43 sts. Change to 5.00mm and work as follows: 26 sts in st st, 12 sts in herringbone st and 5 sts in st st. On 7th row, for **thumb**, work 21 sts, place 1 stitch-marker (= pm), work 1 st, pm, work to end. Inc 1 st, working M1 (= pick up horizontal yarn between last st and next st and knit into the back of it) inside each stitch-marker every alternate row 5 times. There are 11 sts for thumb. Place these 11 sts on a stitch-holder. Then work rem sts, inc 1 st instead of thumb st. When work measures 23cm from beg, shape upper part: **Next row (RS of work):** (K4, K2tog) 4 times, K2, 12 sts in herringbone st, K5. Four sts have been decreased. **Next row:** work sts as they appear. **Next row:** dec 4 sts above previous decs, work the 12 sts in herringbone st, K2tog and K3. Five sts have been decreased. Rep these 5 decs above previous every alternate row twice more. **Next row:** \* K2 tog; rep from \* to end. Cut yarn leaving a long end. Leave sts on the needle. Insert end into the yarn needle and thread it through rem sts, draw up tightly and secure on WS of work. Then sew side seam, considering that the border will be turned. With 4 Dp-needle set place on needle the 11 thumb sts, then pick up and K 3 sts in correspondence of increased st. There are 14 sts. Work **9 rounds** of circular st st. **Next round:** \* K2 tog; rep from \* to end. Cut yarn leaving a long end. Leave sts on the needle. Insert end into the yarn needle and thread it through rem sts, draw up tightly and secure on WS of work.

**Right mitten:** work as Left mitten, reversing shape.

**Needles:** A 4.50mm circular  
needle with 40cm cable  
A 4.50mm circular needle  
with 80cm cable

A 5.50mm circular needle with 40cm cable

A 5.50mm circular needle with 80cm cable

A Double-pointed (Dp) needle

**Hook:** A 5.00mm crochet hook

**Sewing needle:** Yarn needle with rounded point

**Other items:** White, yellow, green, red and pink  
stitch-markers. Two stitch-holders

## STITCHES

**Using needles:** K2, P2 rib - CIRCULAR STOCKING  
STITCH (ST ST): all rounds K. CIRCULAR REVERSE STOCK-  
ING STITCH (REV ST ST): all rounds P.

CIRCULAR CABLE: (work over 24 sts)

**1st round:** K24. **2nd and following even rounds:** K24.

**3rd, 5th, 7th, 9th and 11th rounds:** K24. **13th round:**  
work 16 Left Crossed stitches (16-st LC) as follows: slip  
next 8 sts to Dp needle and hold to front, K next 8 sts,  
K8 from Dp needle, K8. **15th, 17th, 19th, 21st and 23rd**  
**rounds:** K24. **25th round:** K8, work 16 Right Crossed  
stitches (16-st RC) as follows: slip next 8 sts to Dp  
needle and hold to back, K next 8 sts, K8 from Dp nee-  
dle, K8. **26th round:** K24. Rep from 3rd to 26th round  
throughout.

**KNIT INCREASE:** MIK = pick up horizontal yarn between  
last st and next st and knit into the back of it (K1 in-  
creased).

**SKIP** = slip 1 st, knit 1 st, pass slipped st over K1 (K1 de-  
creased).

**WRAP AND TURN (W&T) SHORT ROWS:** at end of a row,  
before turning, work until last st remains on left nee-  
dle, then work a W&T st either on the knit side or on  
the purl side. **On the knit side:** with the yarn in front,  
insert your needle purlwise into the stitch you are go-  
ing to wrap (in this case, that's the last st of the row);  
slip the st from left needle to right needle, pull the  
yarn around to the back of the work. Slip the stitch  
back onto the left needle again. There is a little bar (= wrap  
yarn) at stitch base. Turn work to the wrong  
side, preparing to work the purl row. Before you start  
to purl across on the wrong side, tug on the yarn to  
make sure the wrap around the stitch is snug (but  
don't pull too tightly, or you'll have a difficult time  
picking up wrap). Insert right needle under wrap yarn  
from front to back and place it on left needle, behind  
the W&T st, passing it over the stitch to hide it as

much as possible on RS of the work, then Knit wrap  
yarn and W&T st together, avoiding holes.

**On the purl side:** with the yarn in back, insert your  
needle purlwise into the stitch you are going to wrap  
(in this case, that's the last st of the row); slip the st  
from left needle to right needle, pull the yarn around  
to the front of the work. Slip the stitch back onto the left  
needle again. There is a little bar (= wrap yarn) at  
stitch base. Turn work. Next row: insert right needle un-  
der wrap yarn from back to front and place it on left  
needle, behind the W&T st, passing it over the stitch to  
hide it as much as possible on RS of the work, then Purl  
wrap yarn and W&T st together, avoiding holes.

**Using hook:** chain (ch).

## TENSIONS

18 sts and 26 rounds measure 10cm square over  
stocking stitch with 5.50 mm circular needle. The 24  
cable sts, worked with 5.50 mm circular needle,  
measure approx 9cm in width. Take time to check  
tensions before starting work: it is essential to work to  
the stated tensions to achieve success.

## INSTRUCTIONS

The jumper is worked in one piece, top-down,  
starting from neck.

**Neck:** using 4.50mm circular needle with 40cm ca-  
ble, cast on 78 sts plus 1st, overlapping the 2 needle  
tips to get a softer result; remove left tip and, making  
sure that sts aren't twisted, join to work in the round  
as follows: slip 1st stitch from right needle to left nee-  
dle, then pass last st over slipped st. 78 sts remain.  
Place white stitch-marker (SM) on right-hand needle,  
before this passed st, to indicate round beg. Then  
work as follows: 24 sts in K2,P2 rib starting with K2,  
place 1 pink SM, 24 sts cable, place 1 pink SM, 30 sts in  
K2,P2 rib starting with P2.

**Yoke:** when work measures 9cm, corresponding to  
26 rounds, place stitch-markes to indicate raglan in-  
creases as follows: count 9 sts, place 1 yellow SM into  
next st, count 6 sts (= sleeve), place 1 yellow SM into  
next st, count 7 sts, count 24 sts already placed be-  
tween the 2 pink SM, count 7 sts, place 1 yellow SM into  
next st, count 6 sts (= sleeve), place 1 yellow SM into  
next st, count 15 sts. Cont to work with 5.50mm circ-  
ular needle with 40cm cable as follows: 9 sts in st st, 1  
st in rev st st (= st with yellow SM, raglan line), 6 sts in  
st st, 1 st in rev st st (= st with yellow SM, raglan line), 2  
sts in st st, 1 st in rev st st, 4 sts in K2, P2 rib, 24 sts ca-  
ble, 4 sts in K2, P2 rib starting with P2, 1 sts in rev st st, 2  
sts in st st, 1 st in rev st st (= st with yellow SM, raglan  
line), 6 sts in st st, 1 st in rev st st (= st with yellow SM,  
raglan line), 15 sts in st st. When **1st round** has been  
worked, cont to work using wrap and turn short rows  
to shape neck and at the same time increase for  
raglans only on Back, placing stitch-markers as fol-  
lows: from white SM, which shows round beg, count 17 sts


towards RH side (therefore in the opposite direction to the working direction) and place 1 green SM, (count 2 sts and place 1 green SM) twice, then KI and work the st marked for raglan line. Counting again from white SM, but towards LH side, place 1 red SM after 11 sts, (count 2 sts and place 1 red SM) twice, then KI and work the st marked for raglan line. Working sts as set on previous rounds. Cont to work as follows: 1 wrap st and turn. **2nd row:** (WS of work) work until to first green SM, remove SM, 1 wrap st and turn. **3rd row:** (RS of work) work until to first red SM, working MIK on either side of both purl sts that indicate raglan line, remove red SM, 1 wrap st and turn. **4th row:** (WS of work) work until to second green SM, remove SM, 1 wrap st and turn. **5th row:** (RS of work) work until to second red SM working MIK on either side of both purl sts that indicate raglan line, remove red SM, 1 wrap st and turn. **6th row:** (WS of work) work until to third green SM, remove SM, 1 wrap st and turn. **7th row:** (RS) work until to third red SM working MIK on either side of both purl sts that indicate raglan line, remove red SM, 1 wrap st. Before turning, set again the working of W&T (= wrap and turn short rows) technique to complete anatomical neck and at the same time increase for raglans on Front and Back, placing stitch-markers as follows: from white SM, which shows round beg, towards RH side (therefore in the opposite direction to the working direction) count 1 st after first yellow SM of raglan line, place 1 green SM after this st, count 2 sts and place 1 green SM, (count 3 sts and place 1 green SM) twice. Counting always from white SM, but towards LH side, count 1 st after first yellow SM of raglan line and place 1 red SM after this st, count 2 sts and place 1 red SM, (count 3 sts and place 1 red SM) twice. Turn work and, working sts as previously set, cont to work as follows: **8th row:** (WS) work until to first green SM, remove SM, 1 wrap st and turn. **9th row:** (RS) work until to first red SM, working MIK on either side of 4 each of 4 purl sts that indicate raglan line, remove red SM, 1 wrap st and turn. **10th row:** (WS) work until to second green SM, remove this SM, 1 wrap st and turn. **11th row:** (RS) work until to second red SM, working MIK on either side of each of 4 purl sts that indicate raglan line, remove red SM, 1 wrap st and turn. **12th row:** (WS) work until to third green SM, remove SM, 1 wrap st and turn. **13th row:** (RS) work until to third red SM, working MIK on either side of each of 4 purl sts that indicate raglan line, remove red SM, 1 wrap st and turn. **14th row:** (WS) work until to fourth green SM, remove SM, 1 wrap st and turn. **15th row:** (RS) work until to fourth red SM, working MIK on either side of each of 4 purl sts that indicate raglan line, remove red SM, 1 wrap st and turn. **16th row:** (WS of work) work until to first white SM that indicates the beg and the end of the rounds. Working as previously set, cont to work next rounds increasing for raglans 1 st every alternate round, on either side of 4 purl sts marked with yellow SM, 30 times. **Note:** when the amount of stitches make it necessary, change to

5.50mm circular needle with 80cm cable. When work measures 29cm from neck (corresponding to 76 rounds - counting from Back center), divide work and continue only on body sts, leaving unworked the sts of each sleeve on a stitch-holder, as follows: work until first purl st which indicates raglan line, including it, cast on 5 new sts for armhole (alternatively, with a crochet hook and a scrap yarn ch5, then pick up 5 sts with the needle), leave next 77 sts on a stitch-holder for first sleeve (excluding purl st which indicates raglan line), work until next purl st which indicates raglan line, including it, cast on 5 new sts for other armhole, then leave next 77 sts on a stitch-holder for second sleeve: there are 218 sts for Back and Front. Join work in round.

**Back and Front:** work on 218 sts of Back and Front as established before. When work measures 28cm, corresponding to 72 rounds, change needle and with 4.50mm circular needle with 80cm cable work 16 rounds in K2, P2 rib, corresponding to 6cm, dec on first rib row 2 sts among cable 24 sts. There are 216 sts. You have to be careful to match the K2, P2 rib sts on the cable sides with the K2, P2 rib sts of lower edge (to get a perfect result, you have to count the stitches at round beg to calculate whether to start the round with K2 or P2). When the 16 rounds have been worked, cast off the sts loosely, as they appear.

**Sleeves:** with 5.50mm circular needle with 40cm cable, for each sleeve pick up 5 sts from 5 cast-on sts for armhole and cont to work the 77 sts from stitch-holder. Place 1 SM after 3rd of 5 armhole sts (this SM is used to indicate both the Back center Sleeve and the round beg) and work in circular stocking st on 82 sts obtained, removing, if necessary, the sts cast-on with scrap yarn. Dec 1 st at either side of SM on 7th and every following 12th round 7 times (on LH side work K2tog, on RH side SKIP). When Sleeve measures 35cm from beg, corresponding to 90 rounds, for cuff change to 4.50mm circular needle with 40cm cable and work 14 rounds K2, P2 rib, corresponding to 5cm, then cast off all sts loosely in rib.

**Note:** wash garment carefully at low temperature, with a very little fabric softener. Lay the garment to dry on a flat surface, without ever hanging them.





**Size:** UK 10/12 (14/16) - US 6/8 (10/12) - EU 36/38 (40/42)

**Note:** figures in brackets ( ) refer to larger size. Where only one figure is given this refers to both sizes.

**Skill Level:** intermediate

**How much yarn:** 18 (19) balls (each ball 50g and 83m) of **Nuovo Irlanda** yarn (100% Pure Merino Wool Machine Washable) shade no. 13701

**Needles:** A pair of 5.00mm knitting needles  
A Dp (double-pointed) needle

**Sewing needle:** Yarn needle with rounded point

**Other items:** Stitch-markers

## STITCHES

**Using needles:** K1, P1 rib - K2, P2 rib - Garter stitch (g st)  
STOCKING STITCH (ST ST): 1 row K, 1 row P.

REVERSE STOCKING STITCH (REV ST ST): 1 row P, 1 row K.

KNIT INCREASE: MIK = pick up horizontal yarn between last st and next st and knit into the back of it (K1 increased). PURL INCREASE: MIP = pick up horizontal yarn between last st and next st and purl into the back of it (P1 increased). 6 RIGHT CROSSED STITCHES: 6-st RC = slip next 3 sts to Dp needle and hold to back, K next 3 sts, K3 from Dp needle. 6 LEFT CROSSED STITCHES: 6-st LC = slip next 3 sts to Dp needle and hold to front, K next 3 sts, K3 from Dp needle.

## TENSION

(after work has been steamed and with closed cables)  
approx 23 sts and 23,5 rows measure 10cm square over cable motifs with 5.00 mm circular needle. Take time to check tension before starting work: it is essential to work to the stated tension to achieve success.

## INSTRUCTIONS

Poncho is worked in one piece. with 5mm circular needle cast on 150 sts. Work in forth-and-back rows. **Row 1 (RS):** K2, \* P1, K1; rep from \* to last 3 sts: P1, K2. Cont in K1, P1 rib with 2 sts in g st at each end for 3 rows more (= 2cm). Set up the work as follows: **Row 1 (RS):** K2, P1, (Right Cable Motif: K3, P2, K6, P2) 5 times, K3, P2, pm (= place a stitch-marker), K4, pm, P2, (Left Cable Motif: K3, P2, K6, P2) 5 times, K3, P1, K2. **Row 2:** K3, P3, (K2, P6, K2, P3) 5 times, K2, pm, P4, pm, K2, P3, (K2, P6, K2, P3) 5 times, K3. Rep these 2 rows, crossing Cable Motif 6 K sts on 5th row and every following 8th row as follows: right Cable Motif: K3, P2, 6 Right Crossed sts, P2; Left Cable Motif: K3, P2, 6 Left Crossed sts, P2. AT THE SAME TIME, inc at either side of centre 4 sts (in correspondence to pm) as follows: **1st inc row (RS):** work to marker, MIK or MIP (according to the setting of motif rep), sm (= slip marker), K4, sm, MIK or MIP, work to end (2 sts increased). **2nd row:** work even, i.e. first and last 2 sts in garter st, P centre 4 sts for st st and rem sts as they appear. **3rd inc row:** work to marker, MIK or MIP, sm, K4, sm, MIK or MIP, work to end (2 sts increased). **4th inc row:** work to marker, MIK or MIP, sm, P4, sm, MIK or MIP, work to end (2 sts increased). Rep last

4 rows 20 (25) times more, working increased sts according to motif rep. There are 276 (306) sts.


SMALLER SIZE ONLY - **Next inc row (RS):** work to marker, MIK or MIP, sm, K4, sm, MIK or MIP, work to end (2 sts increased). **Next row:** work even, i.e. first and last 2 sts in garter st, P centre 4 sts for st st and rem sts as they appear. **Next inc row:** work to marker, MIK or MIP, sm, K4, sm, MIK or MIP, work to end (2 sts increased). There are 280 sts.

LARGER SIZE ONLY - **Next row (RS):** work even, i.e. first and last 2 sts in garter st, centre 4 sts in st st and rem sts as they appear. There are 280 (306) sts. Cont to work for all sizes. NECK OPENING - **Next row (WS):** work even to marker, sm, P2 (first half worked), join a second ball of yarn and P2, sm, work to end (second half worked). Cont to work even on 140 (153) sts each side for a total of 25cm from beg of opening, ending with a WS row. Rejoin Halves. There are 280 (306) sts. Now work the center decs. **Note:** center decs are worked with first and last st of center 4 sts. Adjust marker placement as necessary to keep center 4 sts marked. **1st dec row (RS):** work to 1 st before 3 marked sts, K2tog, K2, SKIP (slip 1 st, knit 1 st, pass slipped st over K1), work to end (2 sts decreased).

**2nd row:** work even, i.e. first and last 2 sts in garter st, P centre 4 sts for st st and rem sts as they appear. **3rd dec row:** work to 1 st before 4 marked sts, K2tog, K2, SKIP, work to end (2 sts decreased). **4th dec row (WS):** work to 1 st before 4 marked sts, P2tog tbl, P2, P2tog, work to end (2 sts decreased). Rep last 4 rows 20 (25) times more, then rep 1st dec row, 2nd row and 3rd dec row once (0 times) more and work 1 (0) row even on WS. There are 150 sts whose whose 73 sts and 5 cable reps on EACH side of center 4 sts. **Next row (RS):** K2, \* P1, K1; rep from \* to last 3 sts: P1, K2. Cont in K1, P1 rib with 2 sts in g st at each end for 3 rows more. Cast off in rib.

**Collar:** with right side facing, pick up and K 102 sts evenly around neck opening. Join work in round and place marker for beg of round. Work 6 rounds in K1, P1 rib; 44 rounds in K2, P2 rib e 6 rounds in K1, P1 rib. Cast off loosely in rib.

## TENSION (after work has been steamed)

15 sts and 22 rows approx measure 10cm square over stocking stitch with 5.00 mm needles. Take time to check tension before starting work: it is essential to work to the stated tension to achieve success.

## INSTRUCTIONS

**Back:** with 4.50mm needles cast on 80 sts and, for border, work 7cm in K2, P2 rib. Change needles and cont to work in stocking st with 5.00mm needles. When work measures 58cm from beg, shape shoulders: cast off 7 sts at beg of next 4 rows and 8 sts at beg of following 2 rows. Then, cast off rem center 36 sts for neck.


**Front:** work as Back until work measures 35cm from beg. Now shape V-neck: divide work in half, join another ball of yarn and continue separately on either side, dec 1 st on neck edge, inside 1 st, on next and every alternate row 11 times, then every following 4th row 7 times. AT THE SAME TIME, when work measures 58cm from beg, shape shoulders as Back. No sts remain.

**Sleeves:** for each sleeve, with 4.50mm needles cast on 46 sts and, for border, work 6cm in K2, P2 rib. Change needles and cont to work in stocking st with 5.00mm needles. Inc 1 st at each end, inside first and last 2 sts, on 13th row and every following 8th row 7 times: there are 60 sts. For inc, work MIK = pick up horizontal yarn between last st and next st and knit into the back of it (K1 increased). When work measures 48cm from beg, shape upper part: cast off 8 sts at beg of next 6 rows, then rem 12 sts.

## FINISHING

Sew shoulder seams. **Neck border:** On RS of work, with 4.50mm needles and starting from V-neck base at Front center, pick up and K 148 sts across Back and Front neckline. Working in forth-and-back rows, work 5cm in K2, P2 rib, then cast off. Overlapping the RH side on the LH side, sew the border ends, crossed with each other as shown in picture, to Front center. Set in sleeves, then sew side and sleeve seams.

**Note:** wash garment carefully at low temperature, with a very little fabric softener. Lay the garment to dry on a flat surface, without ever hanging them.

**BASKET STITCH:** (worked over a multiple of 6 sts)

**Row 1:** \* 6 Left Crossed stitches (6-st LC = slip next 3 sts to Dp needle and hold to front, K next 3 sts, K3 from Dp needle); rep from \* to end. **Row 2:** P to end.

**Row 3:** \* 6 Right Crossed stitches (6-st RC = slip next 3 sts to Dp needle and hold to back, K next 3 sts, K3 from Dp needle); rep from \* to end. **Row 4:** P to end. Rep these 4 rows throughout.

## TENSION

36 sts measure 10cm in width over basket st with 5.00mm needles. Take time to check tension before starting work: it is essential to work to the stated tension to achieve success.

## INSTRUCTIONS COWL

With 5.00mm needles and a scrap yarn in contrasting colour cast on 96 sts. Then work with main yarn in garter st the first and last 3 sts for side borders and AT THE SAME TIME work in basket st the rem central 90 sts. When work measures 50cm from beg, work 2 rows with a scrap yarn in contrasting colour. Hold the sts on the needle. Unravel gradually the sts in contrasting colour at each end and, with main yarn and needle, join the work to obtain a ring, grafting in darning st the corresponding sts in main colour at beg and at end of work.

## INSTRUCTIONS BEANIE

With 5.00mm needles cast on 128 sts and for border work in K1, P1 rib for 4.5cm, increasing 42 sts evenly across last row: there are 170 sts. Cont in basket st on 168 central sts and work in st st the first and last st. Cont in this manner until work measures 17cm from beg, then dec as follows:

**Following dec row (RS):** K1, \* 6-st LC with decs = slip next 3 sts to Dp needle and hold to front, Ktog next 2 sts and K1, then work K1 and K2tog from Dp needle); rep from \* ending with K1. **Following row:**

P to end. **Following dec row:** K1, \* 6-st RC with decs = slip next 3 sts to Dp needle and hold to back, K2tog, then K2tog from Dp needle); rep from \* ending with K1. **Following row:** P to end.

**Last row:** \* K2tog; rep from \* to end. Cut yarn leaving a long end. Leave sts on the needle. Insert end into the yarn needle and thread it through rem sts, draw up tightly and secure on WS of work. Then sew side seam. With same yarn make a pom-pom approx 10cm in diameter. Sew pom-pom on beanie top.

JACQUARD STOCKING ST FOR HERRINGBONE PATTERN: work  
in stocking st, following diagrams, using a ball of yarn for  
each colour and crossing threads on WS of work to avoid  
holes between colour changes.

**INCREASES:** **Make 1 increase right (MIR):** using the left  
needle, pick up the bar between two stitches from back to  
front. Knit it. **Make 1 increase left (MIL):** using the left nee-  
dle, pick up the bar between two stitches from front to  
back. Knit it through the back loop.

## TENSION

22 sts measure 10cm in width over stocking stitch with  
5.50 mm circular needle. Take time to check tension be-  
fore starting work: it is essential to work to the stated ten-  
sion to achieve success.

## INSTRUCTIONS

The jumper is worked from the top down, beginning from  
HIGH RIBBED COLLAR, that is shaped using increases and  
short rows. The HERRINGBONE pattern begins together  
with raglan increases before body and sleeves are divid-  
ed. The pattern continues in the round on both body and  
sleeves. Using circular 4 mm needle (with 40 cm cable)  
and the main color (burgundy) cast on 97 sts. Work 2 rows  
in tubular st. Then, making sure that sts aren't twisted, join  
to work in round as follows: slip 1st stitch from right needle  
to left needle, then pass last st over slipped st. 96 sts re-  
main. Work around in ribbing (K1, P1) for 9 rounds. Place 8  
stitch-markers on the **next round** of ribbing as follows:  
work 19 sts in ribbing, place 1 stitch-marker (= PM), p1, PM,  
9 sts in ribbing. PM, p1, PM, 37 sts in ribbing, PM, p1, PM, 9 sts  
in ribbing, PM, p1, PM, 18 sts in ribbing (= center of back and  
beg of the round). Now you are ready to shape the high  
ribbed collar using increases on each side of previous  
stitch-markers as follows: **Next round:** \* work in ribbing to  
1 st before marker, pick up the bar between the sts from  
back to front, K1 and P1 in the bar, K1, slip marker (=SM), P1,  
SM, K1, pick up the bar between the sts from front to back,  
P1 tbl (through back of the loop) and K1 in the bar \*. Rep  
from \* to \* around. You have increased 16 sts and have  
112 sts, divided like this: 21 sts, 1 marker (= m), 1 st, m, 13 sts,  
m, 1 st, m, 41 sts, m, 1 st, m, 13 sts, m, 1 st, m, 20 sts. Keep the  
markers in place and work around in ribbing for 10 rounds.

Now shape the neckline using short rows. The turns are  
made on both the right and the wrong side as follows:  
**Right side:** work in ribbing across the back to the marker,  
slip m, p1, slip m, work in ribbing across the right sleeve, slip  
m, p1, slip m, k1. Turn. **Wrong side:** slip 1 st with yarn in front.  
Pull the yarn up and over the right needle, creating a dou-  
ble stitch on the needle. Work in ribbing across the back to  
the marker, slip m, k1, slip m, work in ribbing across left  
sleeve, slip m, k1, slip m, p1. Turn the work. **Right side:** slip  
1 st with yarn in front. Pull the yarn up and over the right  
needle. Work in ribbing to beg of round. Repeat these short  
rows 3 more times, working 2, 3 and 4 sts past the double  
st from the previous row. The double st is worked as a nor-  
mal knit or purl (whatever fits in ribbing) when you pass it.  
You have turned 4 times on each side and 9 rows total  
have been worked: the high ribbed collar has been fin-  
ished. **SHOULDERS:** on the **next round** work the shoulders  
as follows: K to marker, slip m, k1 (this will be the raglan st),  
slip m, \* MIL, k1 \*, repeat from \* to \* across the right sleeve  
and stop at the marker, MIL, slip m, k1, slip m, k across the  
Front, slip m, k1, slip m, \* MIL, k1 \*, repeat from \* to \* across  
the left sleeve and stop at the marker, MIL, slip m, k1, slip m,  
K to beg of the round. You have 27 sts for each sleeve,  
41 sts for Front, 41 sts for Back and 4 raglan sts, thus there  
are 140 sts total. K to the first marker, slip m, k1, change the  
marker to one that is different from the others. This is now  
the beg of round. Change to 5.50mm circular needle (with  
50 cm cable). **RAGLAN INCREASES:** cont working jacquard  
stocking st for herringbone pattern repeat and raglan in-  
creases on the body and sleeves. Follow Chart A (sleeve)  
and B (body) beginning from round 1 of Chart A. Read di-  
agrams (both diagram A and diagram B are divided in  
two parts but should be considered as a single unit) from  
right to left, bottom up. Work round 1 of Chart A (Sleeve  
plus raglan stitch), round 1 of Chart B (Front plus raglan  
stitch), round 1 of Chart A (other Sleeve plus raglan stitch),  
round 1 of Chart B (Back plus raglan stitch). Increases are  
worked every other round, and the raglan st is always knit-  
ted using the main colour burgundy. Work every round as  
shown in the chart. Change to longer circular needles  
when needed. When 54 rounds have been worked, there  
are 356 sts on needle. **DIVIDE BODY AND SLEEVES AS FOL-  
LWS:** slip 81 sts to a piece of scrap yarn (sts for the right  
sleeve), cast on 4 sts using main colour burgundy, 97 sts  
(the front) cont to work herringbone motif as established  
previously, slip 81 sts to a piece of scrap yarn (sts for the  
left sleeve), cast on 4 using main colour burgundy, 97 sts  
(the back) working herringbone motif as previously and  
place a marker. This is the new beg of the round. You have  
202 sts for BODY. Continue working herringbone motif as  
previously until Body measures approx 25cm from the  
body beg. Cut cream colour and change to 4 mm circular  
needle (with 60cm cable), K across all sts only in burgun-  
dy, then work 1 round P and 1 round K for garter st border.  
Cast off. **SLEEVE (MAKE 2):** transfer the 81 sleeve sts to a  
5.5 mm circular needle (with 40 cm cable) and pick up  
and knit 4 sts in the new sts on the body. Place a marker in  
the middle of these sts. This is beg the round. Continue  
working herringbone motif as previously until Sleeve  
measures approx 39cm from the armhole. Cut cream  
colour and change to 4 mm circular needle (with 60cm  
cable), working across all sts only in burgundy. **Next round:**  
\* K2 tog; rep from \* to last st, K1: 43 sts remain. **Next round:**  
P, dec 5 sts evenly. **Next round:** K38. Cast off. Weave in all  
ends with yarn needle on WS of work.

DIAGRAM A - SLEEVE





DIAGRAM B - UPPER PART OF FRONT AND BACK

STRAIGHT STOCKING STITCH (ST ST): 1 row K, 1 row P.

CIRCULAR STOCKING STITCH (ST ST): all rows K.

## TENSION

17 sts and 25 rows measure 10cm square over stocking stitch with 5.00 mm needles and double yarn. Take time to check tensions before starting work: it is essential to work to the stated tensions to achieve success.

## INSTRUCTIONS

**Note:** work using 2 strands of yarn held together throughout.

With 5.00mm circular needle cast on 97 sts and, making sure that sts aren't twisted, join to work in the round as follows: slip 1st stitch from right needle to left needle, then pass last st over slipped st. 96 sts remain. Place stitch-marker on right-hand

needle to indicate round beg and center of Back. Work 4 rounds K1, P1 rib, corresponding to 2cm, and cont to work in stocking st. On **9th round** dec 7 sts: work (12 sts and K2tog) 5 times and (11 sts and K2tog) twice. Rep decs, superimposed on the previous ones, on **17th round** (82 sts rem). On **37th round**, for Front opening, leave 19 sts on stitch-holder, then cont to work in forth-and-back rows of stocking st on rem 63 sts. Inc 1 st at either side of central stitch (= Back center) on **39th row** and every following 4th row 6 more times: there are 77 sts. Work 17 rows straight, then shape nape, dec 1 st at either side of central stitch, working K2tog on RH side and SKIP (slip 1 st, knit 1 st, pass slipped st over K1) on LH side. Rep these decs every alternate row 4 more times, then knit tog the 2 central sts: 66 sts remain. Divide work in half and continue separately on either side, working "wrap and turn short rows" as follows: work 33 sts, turn work, work 23 sts, turn work, work 23 sts, turn work, work 12 sts, turn work, work 12 sts, turn work, then work a row on all sts. Divide the work in half by putting the stitches on 2 needles and, with a yarn needle, join stitches of upper part in correspondence, grafting them in darning st.

**Finishing Border:** with 5.00mm circular needle pick up approx 116 sts, including the 19 sts on stitch-holder for Front opening and work 6 rounds of stocking st. On 1st round, make a hole at either side of Front opening 3 central sts: on RH side work K2tog and yarn forward and on LH side work yarn forward and SKIP. At end, fold border in half and sew stitches one by one evenly in back stitch.

**Cord:** using knitting rope mill work a 4 st cord as long as necessary, plus approx 35cm for each lace. Insert cord into Finishing Border, starting from RH side hole and ending at LH side hole. Sew a label on border (optional).
