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-DETAILS-

SIZE:

59" L x 18" W (150 cm x 46 cm), unblocked

72" L x 21" W (183 cm x 53 cm), blocked



DIMENSIONS

Expression Fiber Arts Signature Fingering

(448 yds/410 m per 3.5 oz/100 g skein)


Shown in color: Dream Chaser; Three skeins required for shawl.

If that color isn't available, any from [this category](#) will work.



MATERIALS

US size C-2 (2.75 mm) crochet hook or size needed to obtain gauge



HOOK

Tapestry needle for weaving in ends, stitch markers



TOOLS

21 sts and 26 rows = 4" (10 cm) in single crochet stitch, blocked

2 pattern repeats and 11 rows = 4" (10 cm) in pattern stitch, blocked



GAUGE

Adventurous Beginner: For crocheters who are ready to learn some new skills or stitch combinations. Stitches include chain, slip stitch, single crochet, and double crochet. In addition, the cluster stitch is used to form the flower petals, and picots are used in the edging.



SKILL LEVEL

CL	cluster
Dc	double crochet
FO	fasten off
Rep	repeat
Rnd	round
RS	right/front side of work
Sc	single crochet
Sl st	slip stitch
Sk	skip(ped)

YO	yarn over
WS	wrong/back side of work

SPECIAL STITCHES

Cluster: YO, insert hook in indicated stitch or space and pull up a loop (3 loops on hook), YO and pull through 2 loops, YO, insert hook in **same** stitch or space and pull up a loop (4 loops on hook), YO and pull through 2 loops, YO and pull through all 3 loops on hook.

Picot: (Sc, ch 3, sc) all in indicated stitch.

-PATTERN-

NOTES

- The sample shown used approximately 1,020 yds/933 m total.
- When working foundation chain, place a stitch marker every 25 chains to help keep track of the count.
- Gauge is not critical in this pattern, but it may affect the amount of yarn required and the final size.

PATTERN

Body of Shawl

Ch 424 (multiple of 12+4).

Row 1: (RS) Dc in 7th ch from hook (sk sts count as 2 ch, dc, 2 ch), *ch 2, sk 2 ch, dc in next ch; rep from * to end, turn. [141 dc, 140 ch-2 sps]

Row 2: Ch 5, [counts as (dc, ch 2) throughout], *(sl st, ch 3, cluster) in next dc [petal made], sk 1 dc, (cluster, ch 3, sl st) in next dc [petal made]**, ch 7, sk 1 dc; rep from *, ending last rep at **, ch 2, dc in 3rd ch of sk chs, turn.

Row 3: Ch 5, *(cluster, ch 3, sl st, ch 3, cluster) in sp between next 2 petals**, ch 3, sc in 4th ch of next ch-7, ch 3; rep from *, ending last rep at **, ch 2, dc in 3rd ch of ch-5 turning ch, turn.

Row 4: Ch 5, sc in top of next cluster, *ch 5, sc in top of next cluster; rep from * to last cluster, sc in top of cluster, ch 2, dc in 3rd ch of ch-5 turning ch, turn.

Row 5: Ch 5, *dc in next sc, ch 2, dc in ch-5 space, ch 2; rep from * to last sc, dc in last sc, ch 2, dc in 3rd ch of turning ch-5, turn.

Row 6: Ch 5, *(sl st, ch 3, cluster) in next dc, sk 1 dc, (cluster, ch 3, sl st) in next dc**, ch 7, sk 1

dc; rep from *, ending last rep at **, ch 2, dc in 3rd ch of turning ch-5, turn.

Rep Rows 3-6, 12 more times, and then rep Rows 3-5 one time. Do not turn at the end of the last Row 5, and do not FO.

Edging

Rotate piece 90° to work down long side.


Rnd 1: Ch 1, 2 sc in first dc-sp, 2 sc in each ch-2 sp and dc-sp to corner, 5 sc in corner sp, rotate piece 90 degrees to work along bottom edge, [3 sc in next ch-2 sp, 2 sc in next ch-2 sp] to last dc, 5 sc in turning ch-5 sp, rotate piece 90 degrees to work along second long side, 2 sc in each ch-2 sp and dc-sp to ch-5 turning ch, 5 sc in ch-5 sp, rotate piece 90 degrees to work along top edge, [3 sc in next ch-2 sp, 2 sc in next ch-2 sp] to last dc, 3 sc in last dc, join with sl st to first sc.

Rnd 2: Ch 1, sc in joining st, sc in next sc, picot, *sc in next 2 sc, picot in next sc; rep from * around, join with sl st to first sc. FO.

FINISHING

Weave in all ends. Soak shawl for 20 minutes in lukewarm water. Squeeze out excess water (do not wring). Roll shawl in a towel, and squeeze to remove more water. Lay flat and pin, stretching slightly to open lace. Leave until dry.


