

Three Season Pullover



Construction Overview:

The body of the Three Season Pullover is worked flat, with sleeves knit in the round. The back shoulder pieces are knit separately, then joined across the back of the neck. The remainder of the back panel is knit following a chart, including an armscye (arm shaping) for sizes 4-10, and finishes with a 2x2 ribbed hem.

The front panels are then picked up from the shoulder stitches and worked flat, following charts that shape a V-neck (sizes 4-10 include an armscye). The front panels are then joined, worked flat, and finished with a 2x2 ribbed hem. The sides are seamed using mattress stitch to prepare the armholes.

The collar stitches are picked up and worked in the round. Sleeve stitches are picked up next and worked in the round, following the chart, and finished with cozy 1x1 ribbing.

Yarn

We strongly recommend a worsted weight blend of cotton and wool for a garment that is warm yet lighter on the body compared to a 100% wool. That being said our testers had great success with 100% merino as well! We suggest:

Cascade Cantata 70% cotton/30% superwash Merino

or

Concept Cotton - Merino by Katia 70% Cotton/ 30% Wool
50g/115yds

Needles - or as needed for gauge

US 7 (4.50mm) 16-40" circular needles

US 8 (5.00mm) 16-40" circular needles

US 10 (6.00mm) magic loop or double pointed needles (for sleeves)

cable needle if desired

Measurements - wet blocked

Sizes 1 (2, 3, 4, 5)(6, 7, 8, 9, 10): Choose a size with 4-8" positive ease measured at your full bust compared to measurement. If you choose a size smaller than the recommended ease you may have issues with the fit of your armholes, shoulders and sleeves.

A) Bust: 32 (36, 40, 44, 48)(52, 56, 60, 64, 68)"

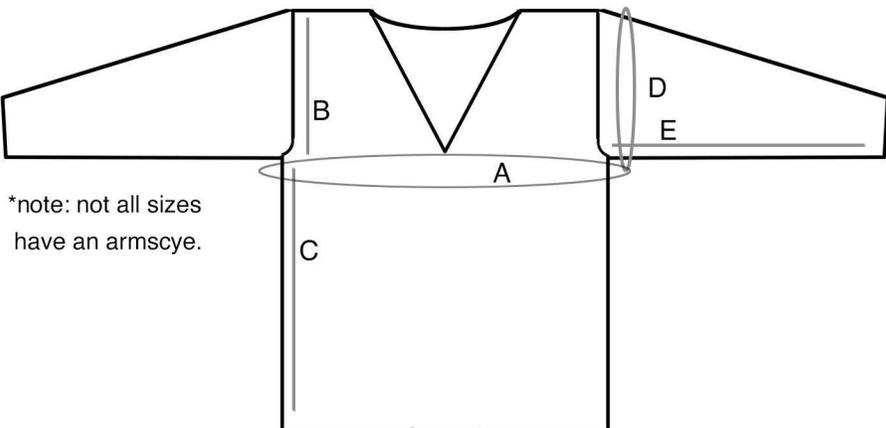

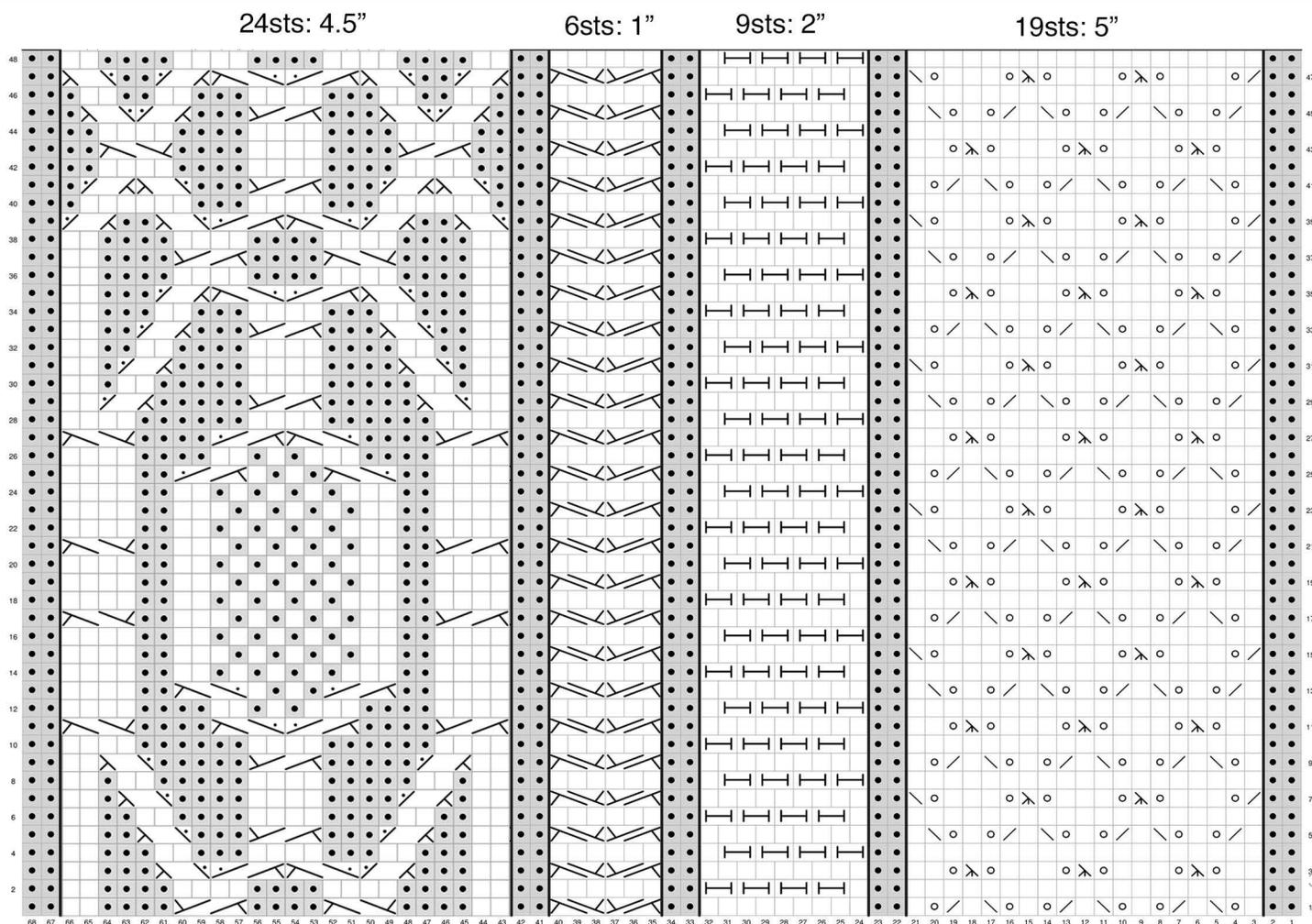
We suggest starting your swatching with US 8 needles. Some knitters may have difficulty matching gauge on all stitch textures, use a needle size that most closely matches the full swatch width of 15.5" after blocking.

- ⋈ • 1/1LC - place 1st on CN, hold to front, k1, k1 from CN.
- ⋈ • 1/1RC - place 1st on CN, hold to back, k1, k1 from CN.
- ⋈ • 1/2LC - place 1st on CN, hold to front, k2, k1 from CN.
- ⋈ • 1/2RC - place 2sts on CN, hold to back, k1, k2 from CN.
- ⋈ • 2/1LPC - place 2sts on CN, hold to front, p1, k2 from CN.
- ⋈ • 2/1RPC - place 1st on CN, hold to back, K2, p1 from CN.
- ⋈ • 2/2LC - place 2sts on CN, hold to front, k2, k2 from CN.
- ⋈ • 2/2RC - place 2sts on CN, hold to back, k2, k2 from CN.
- ⋈ • 2/2LPC - place 2sts on CN, hold to front, p2, k2 from CN.
- ⋈ • 2/2RPC - place 2sts on CN, hold to back, k2, p2 from CN.

Abbreviations

- CO - cast on - unless otherwise noted, use backwards loop cast on.
- CDD - central double decrease

1. Right Back Shoulder

note: When referring to the right or left side, it's always as worn; so 'right back shoulder' means the shoulder on your right when you're wearing the pullover.

1. Using the provisional cast on method, in size 8 needles CO 24 (26, 30, 28, 30)(34, 38, 33, 39, 43)sts.

Set up Row 1: K.

Set up Row 2: P.

2. **Sizes 1 (2, 3, 4, -)(-, -, -, -):**

- **Row 1 (RS):** P2, k5 (7, 11, 9, -)(-, -, -, -, -), p2, k2tog, yo, k3, yo, SK2P, yo, k3, yo, SSK, k2.
- **Row 2 (WS):** P15, k2, p1, ptwist 2 (3, 5, 4, -)(-, -, -, -) times, k2, CO2.
- **Row 3:** K2, p2, k5 (7, 11, 9, -)(-, -, -, -, -), p2, k1, yo, SSK, k1, k2tog, yo, k1, yo, SSK, k1, k2tog, yo, k3.
- **Row 4:** P15, k2, ptwist 2 (3, 5, 4, -)(-, -, -, -) times, p1, k2, p2, CO2.

Sizes - (-, -, -, 5)(6, 7, -, -, -):

- **Row 1 (RS):** K- (-, -, -, 13)(11, 15, -, -, -), p2, K1, k2tog, yo, *k1, yo, SSK, k1, k2tog, yo* - (-, -, -, 1)(2, 2, -, -, -) times, k1, yo, SSK, k3.
- **Row 2 (WS):** P- (-, -, -, 15)(21, 21, -, -, -), K2, ptwist - (-, -, -, 6)(5, 7, -, -, -) times, p1, CO3.

3. Cut yarn and put aside.

2. Left Back Shoulder

1. Using the provisional cast on method, in size 8 needles CO 24 (26, 30, 28, 30)(34, 38, 33, 39, 43)sts.

Set up Row 1: K.

Set up Row 2: P.

2. **Sizes 1 (2, 3, 4, -)(-, -, -, -):**

- **Row 1 (RS):** K2, k2tog, yo, k3, yo, SK2P, yo, k3, yo, SSK, p2, k5 (7, 11, 9, -)(-, -, -, -, -), p2, CO2.
- **Row 2 (WS):** P2, k2, p1, ptwist 2 (3, 5, 4, -)(-, -, -, -) times, k2, p to end of row.
- **Row 3:** K3, yo, SSK, k1, k2tog, yo, k1, yo, SSK, k1, k2tog, yo, k1, p2, k5 (7, 11, 9, -)(-, -, -, -, -), p2, k2, CO2.
- **Row 4:** P4, k2, ptwist 2 (3, 5, 4, -)(-, -, -, -) times, p1, k2, p to end of row.

Sizes - (-, -, -, 5)(6, 7, -, -, -):

- **Row 1 (RS):** K2, K1, k2tog, yo, *k1, yo, SSK, k1, k2tog, yo* - (-, -, -, 1)(2, 2, -, -, -) times, k1, yo, SSK, k1, p2, k- (-, -, -, 13)(11, 15, -, -, -), CO3.
- **Row 2 (WS):** P1, k2, ptwist - (-, -, -, 6)(5, 7, -, -, -) times, p1, k2, p to end of row.
- **Row 3:** K2, k2tog, yo, k1, *k2, yo, SK2P, yo, k1* - (-, -, -, 1)(2, 2, -, -, -) times k2, yo, SSK, p2, k- (-, -, -, 13)(11, 15, -, -, -), p2, k1, CO3.
- **Row 4:** P4, k2, p1, ptwist - (-, -, -, 6)(5, 7, -, -, -) times, k2, p to end of row.
- **Row 5:** K3, yo, SSK, *k1, k2tog, yo, k1, yo, SSK* - (-, -, -, 1)(2, 2, -, -, -) times, k1, SSK, yo, k1, p2, k- (-, -, -, 13)(11, 15, -, -, -), p2, 1/2RC, k1, CO3.
- **Row 6:** K1, p6, k2, ptwist - (-, -, -, 6)(5, 7, -, -, -) times, p1, k2, p to end of row.

Sizes - (-, -, -, -)(-, -, 8, 9, 10):

- **Row 1 (RS):** K4, yo *SK2P, yo, k3, yo* - (-, -, -, -)(-, -, 2, 3, 3) times, SK2P, yo, k2, p2, k- (-, -, -, -)(-, -, 10, 10, 14), CO3.
- **Row 2 (WS):** P1, ptwist - (-, -, -, -)(-, -, 6, 6, 8) times, k2, p to end of row.
- **Row 3:** K2, K1, k2tog, yo, *k1, yo, SSK, k1, k2tog, yo* - (-, -, -, -)(-, -, 2, 3, 3) times, k1, yo, SSK, k1, p2, k- (-, -, -, -)(-, -, 13, 13, 17), CO3.
- **Row 4:** P1, k2, ptwist - (-, -, -, -)(-, -, 6, 6, 8) times, p1, k2, p to end of row.
- **Row 5:** K2, k2tog, yo, k1, *k2, yo, SK2P, yo, k1* - (-, -, -, -)(-, -, 2, 3, 3) times, k2, yo, SSK, p2, k- (-, -, -, -)(-, -, 13, 13, 17), p2, k1, CO3.
- **Row 6:** P4, k2, p1, ptwist - (-, -, -, -)(-, -, 6, 6, 8) times, k2, p to end of row.
- **Row 7:** K2, k1, yo, SSK, *k1, k2tog, yo, k1, yo, SSK* - (-, -, -, -)(-, -, 2, 3, 3) times, k1, SSK, yo, k1, p2, k- (-, -, -, -)(-, -, 13, 13, 17), p2, 1/2 RC, k1, CO3.
- **Row 8:** K1, p6, k2, ptwist - (-, -, -, -)(-, -, 6, 6, 8) times, p1, k2, P to end of row.

28 (30, 34, 32, 39)(43, 47, 45, 51, 55) total

3. Do not cut yarn.

3. Joining Back Shoulders

All sizes, lay out your two shoulder pieces with the RS facing as seen below.



- Starting with the left back shoulder RS work as follows: K4, yo, *SK2P, yo, k3, yo* 1 (1, 1, 1, 1)(2, 2, 2, 3, 3) times, SK2P, yo, k2, p2, k5 (7, 11, 9, 13)(11, 15, 13, 17), p2, sizes 1 (2, 3, 4, -)(-, -, -, -) only: K4. sizes - (-, -, -, 5)(6, 7, 8, 9, 10) only: 1/2RC, 1/2LC, p- (-, -, -, 1)(1, 1, 1, 1, 1).
- All sizes, on your left hand needle use waste yarn and the provisional cast on method to CO 32 (32, 32, 32, 26)(26, 26, 26, 26)sts. To join into one row, use the yarn from your left shoulder and knit across the provisional cast on sts.



- As seen above, join into one row by taking the right back shoulder and work as follows: sizes 1 (2, 3, 4, -)(-, -, -, -) only: K4. sizes - (-, -, -, 5)(6, 7, 8, 9, 10) only: P- (-, -, -, 1)(1, 1, 1, 1, 1), 1/2RC, 1/2LC. All sizes, p2, k5 (7, 11, 9, 13)(11, 15, 13, 17), p2, k2, yo, *SK2P, yo, k3, yo* 1 (1, 1, 1, 1)(2, 2, 2, 3, 3) times, SK2P, yo, k4.

For the set up WS row below you can place markers to help keep track of the different chart sections, these are optional and can be left out.

- WS row: P15 (15, 15, 15, 15)(21, 21, 21, 27, 27), k2, pm, p1 ptwist 2 (3, 5, 4, 6)(5, 7, 6, 6, 8) times, k2, pm, p6, k2, pm, p2, k4, p4, k4, p4, k4, p2, k2, pm, p6, k2, pm, p1, ptwist 2 (3, 5, 4, 6)(5, 7, 6, 6, 8) times, k2, pm, p to end of row.

Your shoulders are now joined and the back is worked as one large piece.

88 (92, 100, 96, 104)(112, 120, 116, 128, 136)sts total.

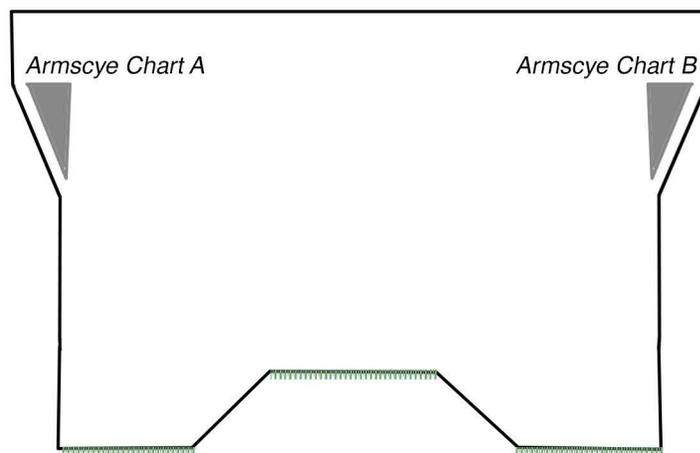
4. Upper Back

- Follow Chart 1 for 44 (46, 48, 46, 50)(54, 58, 56, 60, 64) rows.
- Armscye worked by sizes - (-, -, 4, 5)(6, 7, 8, 9, 10) only: After row - (-, -, 46, 50)(54, 58, 56, 60, 64) work rows as followed:
 - Rows 1, 3, 5 & 7 (RS):** K2 as seen in Chart 1, pm, insert Armscye Chart B, pm, work Chart 1 as established to last 2sts, pm, insert Armscye Chart A, pm, k2.

The armscye sts are worked between the two markers on either side. These sts stand alone and will not match the surrounding lace pattern until all 8 armscye rows are completed. Markers can be removed once the armscye are complete, and the new sts will be absorbed into the lace pattern of Chart 1.

- Rows 2, 4, 6 & 8 (WS):** P2 as seen in Chart 1, insert Armscye Chart A, work Chart 1 as established to last 2sts, insert Armscye Chart B, p2.

6sts (one lace rep) added per side.



- Sizes - (-, -, -, -)(-, -, 8, 9, 10) only: Rep rows 1-6 above once more, incorporated your previous 6sts added into the lace rep of Chart 1. **88 (92, 100, 108, 116)(124, 132, 140, 152, 160)sts total.** Place a removable row marker on either side to note the bottom of the armhole. You will reference this when seaming the sides.

5. Lower Back

- Continue to follow Chart 1 until you've worked 13" from under underarm row marker. We've included optional short rows below to ensure the back of your sweater sits evenly at the hem when worn.
- Short rows:
 - Row 1 (RS):** Work chart 1 to last 7sts of row, tmds. Each row note in chart where you turn.
 - Row 2 (WS):** Work chart 1 to last 7sts of row, tmds.
 - Row 3:** Work chart 1 to 6sts before double stitch, tmds.
 - Row 4:** Work chart 1 to 6sts before double stitch, tmds.
 - Row 5:** Work in chart 1 to double stitch, resolve double stitch, k to end of row.
- Switch to smaller needles, work 2x2 ribbing for 2", resolve double stitches as you come to them.
- Cast off using the faux sewn bind off.

6. Front Panels - worked individually, first the left, then the right panel.

Note: sts will not line up with the motifs from the back panel.

1. Slide the 24 (26, 30, 28, 30)(34, 38, 33, 39, 43)sts from the shoulders provisional cast on onto larger needles.
 - When picking up sts from your provisional cast on, pick up 2 (4, 2, 3, 3)(2, 2, 2, -, 2) extra sts.

26 (30, 32, 31, 33)(36, 40, 35, 39, 45)sts

2. With RS facing, start working Left/Right Front Chart A (A, A, A, B)(B, B, B, B, B) **on row 9 (7, 3, 1, 13)(9, 5, 1, 1, 1).**
3. Armscye worked by sizes - (-, -, 4, 5)(6, 7, 8, 9, 10) only:
After working - (-, -, 50, 50)(48, 52, 50, 54, 58) rows, place two armscye st markers 2sts in from the outside edge of either panel, and add armscye sts between them as follows:
 - **Rows 1, 3, 5 & 7 (RS):** Continue chart as established to armscye marker, insert Armscye Chart A for left panel and B for right panel, k2.
 - **Rows 2, 4, 6 & 8 (WS):** P2, work Armscye Chart A for left panel and B for right panel, sm, work chart as established.

6sts (one lace rep) added per side.

4. Sizes - (-, -, -, -)(6, 7, 8, 9, 10) only: Rep rows 1-6 above - (-, -, -, -)(1, 1, 2, 2, 2) more times, incorporated your previous 6sts added into the lace rep.
5. Working to rows 58 (58, 58, 58, 80)(80, 80, 80, 80, 80) in front chart.
6. Join fronts: Work across Right Front and Front left seamlessly using row 1 of Chart 2.

Place a removable row marker on either side to note the bottom of the armhole. You will reference this when seaming the sides.
90 (98, 102, 112, 114)(132, 140, 142, 150, 162)sts total

6. Front Panels Continued

7. Continue to follow Chart 2 until you've worked 13" from under underarm row marker, or have matched the length of your back.
8. Switch to smaller needles, work 2x2 ribbing for 2". Sizes 1 (-, 3, -, 5)(-, -, 8, 9, 10) work a k2tog at the start and a p2tog at the end of your first row for an even stitch count for your ribbing.
9. Cast off using the faux sewn bind off.

7. Collar

We suggest knitting the collar before the sleeves as it affects how the sweater fits on the shoulders, and therefore, how the sleeves will fit.

**Note: you can "shrink" or "grow" your neckhole if desired by picking up less or more sts respectively around the neckhole.*

1. In smaller needles, starting at the back right of the neck, slide provisional CO sts onto needle. Then pick up and knit up and around the shoulder and then down the left front. *Approximately 2sts for every 3 rows along either side of the neckline.* Make sure to pick up and mark the st in the middle of the V-neck so you'll know where to work your neckline decrease. Then pick up and knit up the right side of the neckline and shoulder. Place BOR and join in the round.

You'll want to have a stitch count divisible by 4, plus 1 marked stitch in the center of your v-neck.

2. Work in a *k2, p2* ribbing, when you reach your center st, k1, then mirror your ribbing back up and to your BOR. *Note to mirror your ribbing: if you ended on a "p1" before your center st, work a "p1" on the other side of your center st before continuing in 2x2 ribbing.*
3. Work Round repeat below for 14 rounds.
 - **Round repeat:** Work ribbing as established to 1st before your center st, CDD, work ribbing as established up to BOR.
4. Cast off using a stretchy bind off of your choice.



8. Sleeves

Work once for each sleeve.

Many knitters find they will need to size up two needle sizes to maintain gauge while working smaller circumference in the round.

1. From the hem up use the mattress stitch to seam the sides of your sweater up to the underarm markers, leaving a 7.5 (7.75, 8, 8.5, 9.25)(10, 11, 12, 12.75, 13.25)" armhole.
 2. Starting at the underarm, pick up and k56 (58, 60, 64, 72)(76, 82, 94, 98, 102) sts evenly around the sleeve hole, place BOR marker and join in the round. *Approximatly 2sts for every 3 rows.*
 3. K8 (9, 10, 12, 10)(12, 15, 15, 17, 19), pm, work Sleeve Chart, pm, k to end of round.
 4. Work round 1 below for 6 (6, 6, 6, 5)(5, 5, 4, 4, 4)", then begin inserting a decrease row every 6 (6, 5, 4, 6)(5, 4, 4, 4, 3) rounds until you have 40 (40, 40, 40, 52)(52, 52, 64, 64, 64)sts remaining.
 - **Round 1:** K to pm, work Sleeve Chart, k to end of round.
 - **Decrease round:** K2tog, k to pm, work Sleeve Chart, k to last 2sts, SSK.
- Note the last round of decreases will use the first and last st from the chart in the decrease, leaving exactly enough sts for the chart left in your sleeve.*
5. Continue working the Sleeve Chart until your sleeve measures 14" or 3" before your desired length.
 7. All sizes, use smaller needles and work in a 1x1 ribbing for 3".
 8. Cast off using the faux sewn bind off.

9. Finishing

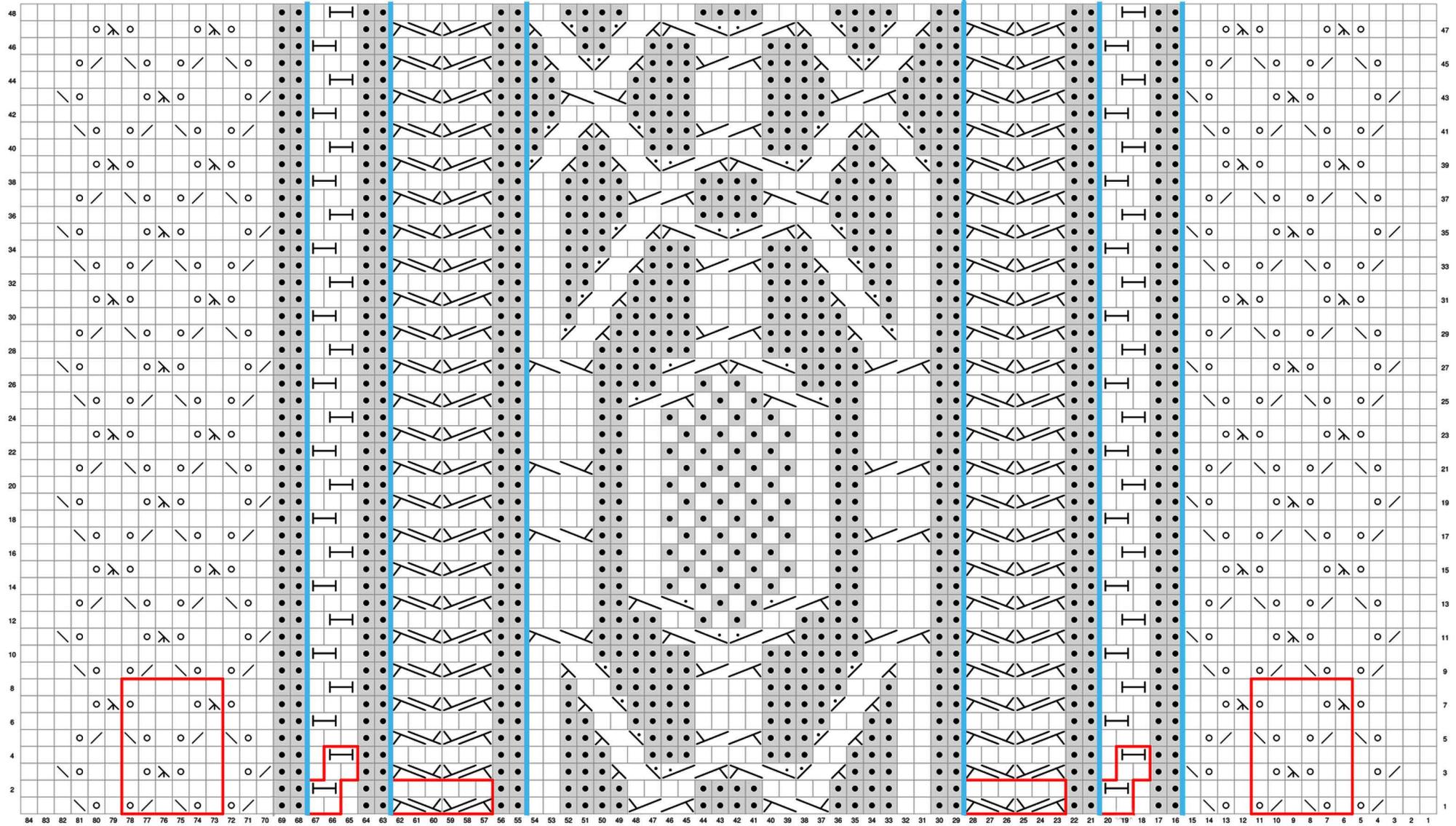
1. Weave in all ends.
2. Wet block to measurements seen in the schematic.
3. Wear and be fabulous!

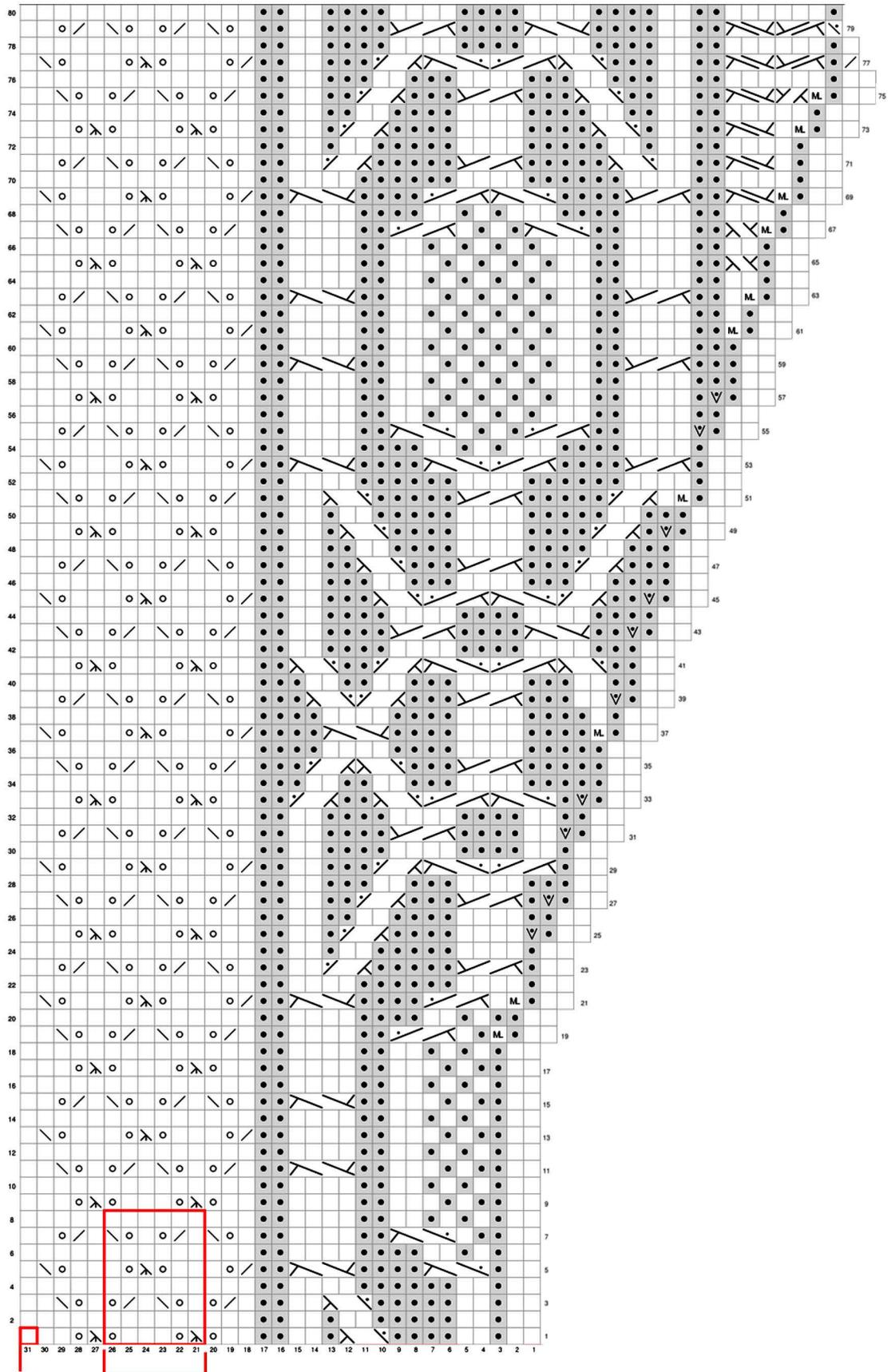

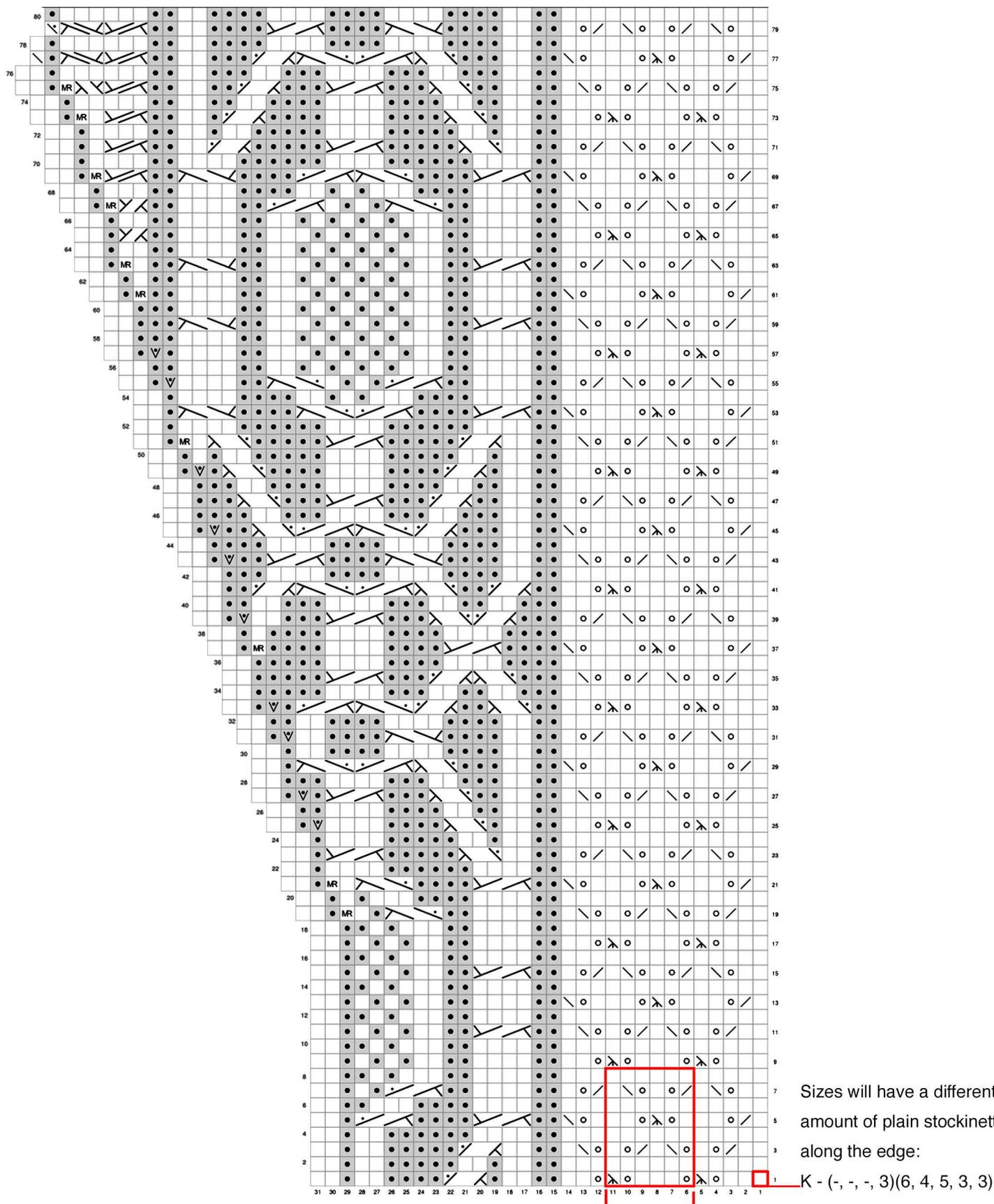

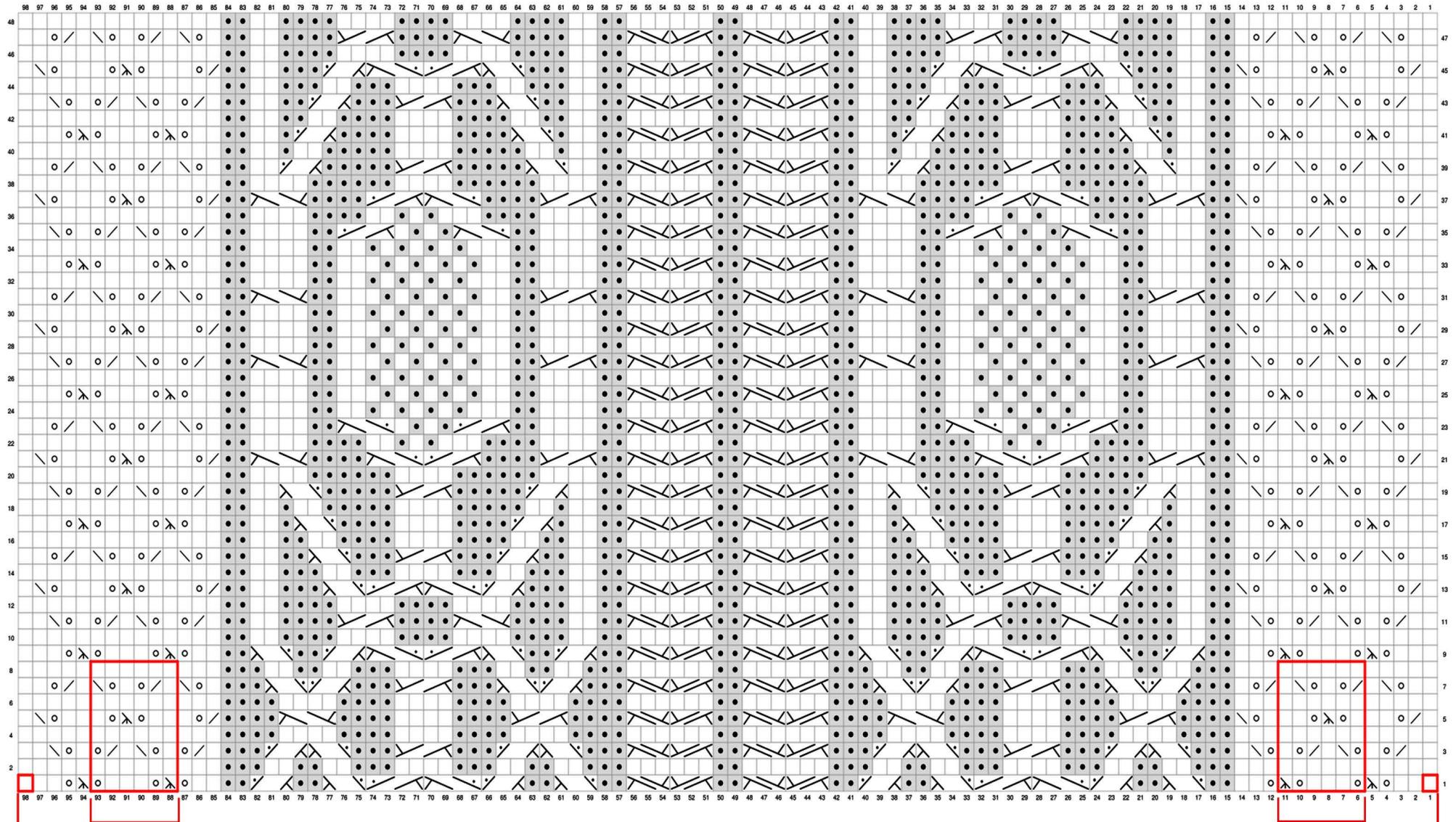

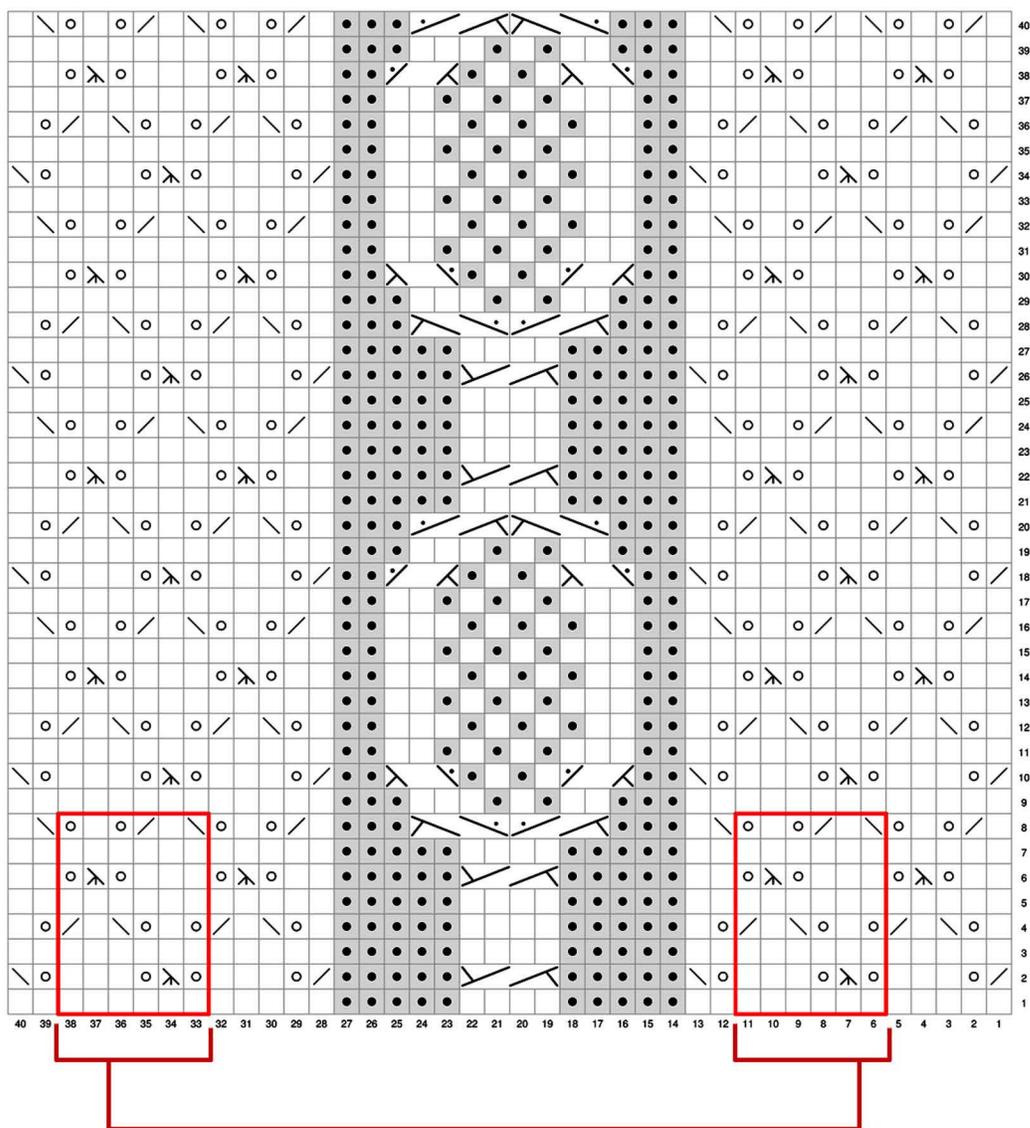
