# -DETAILS-

SIZE: One Size

Updated Version: 35" (89 cm) wide by 44" (112 cm) tall rectangle that is folded in half with 8" (20 cm) sleeve openings

Original Version: 45" (114 cm) wide by 40" (102 cm) tall rectangle that is folded in half with 8" (20 cm) sleeve openings

## Expression Fiber Arts Moongleam Fingering

Updated Version shown in colors: A) Smoke, B) Champagne, & C) Clary Sage

*3 skeins of Color A and 1 skein EACH of Colors B and C are needed.*


If those colors aren't available, any from [this category](#) will work.



MATERIALS

**Original Version:** US size H (5.00 mm), or size needed to obtain gauge

**Updated Version:** US size E (3.5 mm) for beginning chain & US size D (3.25 mm) for remainder of project, or sizes needed to obtain gauge



HOOK

Tapestry needle for weaving in ends, optional stitch markers (2 for marking sleeves)



TOOLS

Both Versions: 18 sts and 12 rows = 4" (10 cm) in Half Double Crochet, blocked



GAUGE

**Intermediate:** This pattern is for those who feel comfortable with **crochet** and have made a few projects, using various skills and techniques. Skills/concepts include single, half double, and double crochet stitches and blocking and seaming techniques.

A Row Map is a printable checklist that accompanies each row in a knitting or crochet pattern. It provides clear guidance to the crafter, indicating which row they are currently working on, the corresponding written instruction to follow, and the recommended color to use. All you need to do is check off each row as you complete it, allowing the Row Map to seamlessly guide you from start to finish.

Our friend, Chad, a knitting instructor at a cancer center in Toronto, Canada, created his first Row Map to make knitting and crocheting more accessible for individuals experiencing the cognitive challenges associated with "chemo brain." He quickly recognized how this tool could benefit anyone experiencing difficulty with concentration.

We believe in supporting broader accessibility for all crafters. The Row Map included in this pattern is our gift to you. We believe that with the help of a Row Map, more crafters can confidently pick up their hooks and needles to continue following patterns with ease.

# -PATTERN-

## NOTES

- The Updated Version used approximately 1,669 yds/1,526 m total: Color A: 1,230 yds/1,125 m, Color B: 218 yds/199 m, and Color C: 221 yds/202 m.
- The Original Version was crocheted with our [Sincere Sock](#) yarn. It used three skeins of A) Gray Pearl, one skein of B) Clover, and one skein of C) Seedpod.
- Both sizes are shown modeled on a 34" (86 cm) bust.
- The pattern is designed for one size, but can easily be adjusted by adding or removing rows.
- This cardigan is worked from the bottom up in a simple rectangular shape. Once finished and blocked, the piece is then folded in half, and seams are worked along the indicated lengths on each side to form armholes. Sleeves are worked directly onto the armholes after seaming.
- Schematics are included for measurements and finishing.
- Gauge is very crucial to this project. Be sure to check often.
- Beginning chain does not count as a stitch in the row count unless otherwise stated.
- This pattern is written using three colors. If you choose to work the pattern in one color, ignore the color change directions, and proceed with your chosen color.
- When working with multiple skeins of the same hand-dyed color, alternating skeins every couple of rows is recommended to avoid color pooling. Watch a video of this technique [here](#). If you are only working with one skein of a given color, alternating is not necessary.

## PATTERN

With Color A, ch 204.

{Note: An alternate beginning would be to work a row of 202 fhdc and then continue pattern beginning with Row 2.}

**Row 1 (RS):** Hdc in 3rd ch from hook and in each ch to end, turn. [202 hdc]

**Row 2 (WS):** Ch 2, hdc in ea hdc to end, turn. [202 hdc]

**Rows 3 - 4:** Rep Row 2. Join Color B.

{Note: At this time, you may choose to break Color A, as you will be working 8 total rows in Color B.}

**Row 5:** Ch 1 (counts as 1 sc), work (1 hdc, 1 dc) into first hdc, \*sk next 2 hdc, work (1 sc, 1 hdc, 1 dc) into next hdc; rep from \* to last 3 sts, sk next 2 hdc, sc in top of beg ch 2 of prev row, turn. [202 total sts; 67 shells plus 1 sc]

**Row 6:** Ch 1 (counts as 1 sc), work (1 hdc, 1 dc)

into first sc at base of ch 1, \*work (1 sc, 1 hdc, 1 dc) into next sc; rep from \* to last st, sc in top of beg ch 1 of prev row, turn. [202 total sts; 67 shells plus 1 sc]

**Rows 7 - 12:** Rep Row 6. Break Color B, join Color A.

**Row 13:** Ch 2, hdc in each st to end, turn. [202 hdc]

**Row 14:** Ch 2, hdc in each hdc to end, turn. [202 hdc]

**Rows 15 - 16:** Rep Row 14. Break Color A, join Color C.

**Row 17:** Rep Row 5.

**Rows 18 - 24:** Rep Row 6. Break Color C, join Color A.

**Row 25:** Ch 2, hdc in each st to end, turn. [202 hdc]

**Row 26:** Ch 2, hdc in each hdc to end, turn.  
[202 hdc]

**Rows 27 - 104:** Rep Row 26. Break Color A, join Color C.

**Row 105:** Ch 1 (counts as 1 sc), work (1 hdc, 1 dc) into first hdc, \*sk next 2 hdc, work (1 sc, 1 hdc, 1 dc) into next hdc; rep from \* to last 3 sts, sk next 2 hdc, sc in top of beg ch 2 of prev row, turn. [202 total sts; 67 shells plus 1 sc]

**Row 106:** Ch 1 (counts as 1 sc), work (1 hdc, 1 dc) into first sc at base of ch 1, \*work (1 sc, 1 hdc, 1 dc) into next sc; rep from \* to last st, sc in top of beg ch 1 of prev row, turn. [202 total sts; 67 shells plus 1 sc]

**Rows 107 - 112:** Rep Row 106. Break Color C, join Color A.

**Row 113:** Ch 2, hdc in each hdc to end, turn.  
[202 hdc]

**Row 114:** Ch 2, hdc in each hdc to end, turn.  
[202 hdc]

**Rows 115 - 116:** Rep Row 114. Break Color A, join Color B.

**Row 117:** Rep Row 5.

**Rows 118 - 124:** Rep Row 6. Break Color B, join Color A.

**Row 125:** Ch 2, hdc in each st to end, turn.  
[202 hdc]

**Row 126:** Ch 2, hdc in each hdc to end, turn  
[202 hdc]

**Rows 127 - 128:** Rep Row 126.

FO and continue to Body Instructions Section.

## BODY INSTRUCTIONS

Using the Finishing Schematics on page 9, fold the rectangle in half with WS together. {Note: Blocking the finished rectangular body to measurements using the schematic will make the seaming process more even.}

Measure 8" (20 cm) from top fold down to form the sleeve opening. Place marker. Repeat for second sleeve. Make a seam from the marker to the bottom edge of your piece. Repeat for second sleeve.

## SLEEVES

With Color A, attach yarn at the base of the sleeve opening with RS out.

**Rnd 1:** Ch 2, work 72 hdc evenly around the armhole opening, sl st into top of beg ch 2 of rnd, turn. [72 hdc]

Join Color C, drop Color A. {Note: You will not need to break Color A at this point, as you will be picking it back up within one rnd.}

**Rnd 2:** Ch 2, hdc in ea hdc around, turn. [72 hdc] Break Color C, pick up Color A.

**Rnd 3:** Ch 2, hdc in ea hdc around, turn. [72 hdc] Drop Color A, join Color B.

**Rnd 4:** Ch 2, hdc in ea hdc around, turn. [72 hdc] Break Color B, pick up Color A.


**Rnd 5:** Ch 2, hdc in ea hdc around, turn. [72 hdc] FO.

Rep all 5 rnds for second sleeve.

## FINISHING


Weave in all ends with a tapestry needle. Either steam block or soak your cardigan for 20 minutes in lukewarm water. Press out any excess moisture with a towel, and lay your cardigan flat. Pin to shape using indicated measurements, and allow the cardigan to dry. Enjoy!

Fold rectangle in half.  
Sew seams over 12 inches on each side to create armholes.


