
DOUBLE HAT

Pattern by SuviKnits



A warm and reversible double layer hat.

The outer hat is worked first and the stitches for the inner hat are then picked up from the cast-on round of the outer hat. The inner hat is then worked in the opposite direction.

PATTERN INFORMATION

MEASUREMENTS

One size, fits an average adult head of 22" / 56 cm. Easy to adjust, see tips at the end of this page.
Height: 8 ½" / 21.5 cm

YARN

approximately 284 yds / 260 m fingering weight yarn **and** laceweight mohair to be held together **or** DK-weight yarn if working with a single strand.

If working with two colors as the sample, you need approximately 142 yds / 130 m each color.

The outer hat is shown in Filcolana Arwetta in color 950 and Knitting for Olive Soft Silk Mohair in color Putty.

The inner hat is shown in Knitting for Olive Merino and Knitting for Olive Soft Silk Mohair, both in color Ballerina.

NEEDLES

US 4 / 3.5 mm needles (either a short circular needle for the main hat and a set of double pointed needles for the crown decreases or a long circular needle for the entire hat if using Magic loop technique)

NOTIONS

stitch markers

tapestry needle for weaving in the yarn ends

GAUGE

24 sts and 32 rows in Stockinette stitch with yarns held together = 4" / 10 cm, washed and blocked

ABBREVIATIONS

BOR - beginning of round

k - knit

k2tog - knit 2 stitches together [-1 st]

p - purl

pm - place marker

sm - slip marker

ssk - slip two stitches one at a time as if to knit, insert left needle into these stitches and knit them together through the back loops [-1 st]

st / sts - stitch / stitches

PATTERN INSTRUCTIONS

Tip for adjusting the size:

If you'd like to make a smaller/larger hat, make sure that your cast-on number is divisible by 4. When it's time to start the crown decreases, divide stitches by 4 and place markers to separate these sections. Work the decreases as explained in the pattern, approximately half of the decreases on every 2nd round and the rest on every round.

OUTER HAT

Cast on 112 sts. Join for working in the round and place the BOR marker. This hat uses regular cast-on and stitches are later picked up from this cast-on round for the inner hat. You can also use provisional cast-on instead.

Work 3 $\frac{3}{4}$ " / 9.5 cm in (k1, p1) ribbing.

Work then in Stockinette stitch until the hat measures 6 $\frac{3}{4}$ " / 17 cm from the cast-on round.

Place markers for crown decreases: (k28, pm) 3 times, k28, slip BOR marker.

Work decrease round: * k1, k2tog, knit to 3 sts before the next marker, ssk, k1, sm; repeat from * to end = 8 sts decreased, 104 sts remain.

Repeat decrease round on every 2nd round until 56 sts remain, knitting the in-between rounds.

Repeat decrease round then on every round until 24 sts remain.

You can now remove all other markers except the BOR marker.

Next round: * k1, k2tog, ssk, k1; repeat from * to end = 16 sts remain.

Next round: repeat (k2tog, ssk) to end = 8 sts remain.

Break yarn, leaving a 10" / 25 cm tail, place it on the tapestry needle and thread through the remaining stitches. Tighten to close the gap. Weave in the yarn ends on wrong side of work.

INNER HAT

Hold the outer hat right side facing you and cast-on round pointing up. Pick up and knit 112 sts from the cast-on round of the outer hat. Place the BOR marker and continue working in the round. Work the inner hat in the same manner as you worked the outer hat. Weave in all the yarn ends that you have before starting the crown decreases. When the inner hat is finished, close the gap as you did for the outer hat and weave in the final yarn ends on right side of work.

FINISHING

Place the hat in lukewarm water and let it soak thoroughly. Gently squeeze out the excess water.

Place the hat on a towel and roll in to remove further moisture. Lay on a flat surface, stretching the ribbing a bit for more even look and let dry completely. Tug the inner hat inside the outer hat.
