

## Murky Worsted - Hat

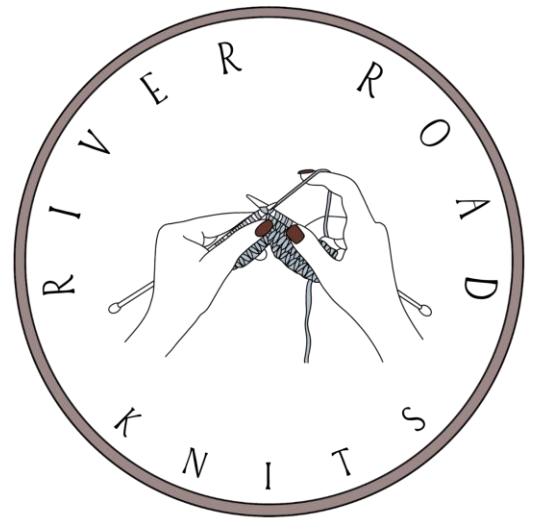
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Looking for a quick weekend knit, a way to use up some worsted scraps, or a gift? The Elbrook and Cowl may be just what you are looking for! If you are making the smaller hat and cowl, you can even get both pieces out of a set of 3 Murky Depths Targhee Worsted yarn! If you are making larger sizes, simply flip the MC with one of the CC in the other piece for a matching set.

This hat is available in three sizes (generally child, women's, and men's). The ribbing and Latvian braid match the details on the cowl. The crown of this hat ends in square decreases for a slightly oversized fit.

These can also be used as swatches for the upcoming Elbrook sweater, to be released in January!

## Sizing and Dimensions

Sizes: 1 (2, 3)

Finished measurements: 18.75 (20.75, 22.5)" / 47.5 (52.5, 57) cm circumference. 9.25 (10, 11)" / 23.5 (25.5, 28) cm from brim to crown.

This corresponds approximately to child, women's, and men's sizes. Sample is shown in Size 2.

## Yarn

MC: 110 (125, 135) yards / 125 (135, 145) meters worsted weight yarn (shown in Murky Depths Dyeworks Targhee Worsted in colorway Kid Glove, 100% non-superwash Targhee, 280 yards / 256 meters per 4 ounce / 115 gram skein)

CC1: 30 (35, 40) yards / 35 (35, 40) meters worsted weight yarn (shown in Murky Depths Dyeworks Targhee Worsted in colorway Blood Oath, 100% non-superwash Targhee, 280 yards / 256 meters per 4 ounce / 115 gram skein)

CC2: 30 (35, 40) yards / 35 (35, 40) meters worsted weight yarn (shown in Murky Depths Dyeworks Targhee Worsted in colorway Dark Slate, 100% non-superwash Targhee, 280 yards / 256 meters per 4 ounce / 115 gram skein)

## Supplies

US 8 (5 mm) 16" (40 cm) circular needle (or size needed to obtain Stockinette gauge)

US 8 (5 mm) DPNs (or size to match gauge needle)

US 6 (4 mm) 16" (40 cm) circular needle (or 2 sizes smaller than gauge needle)

Stitch markers

Yarn needle

## Gauge

4" / 10 cm = 17 sts and 24 rounds in Stockinette on larger needle (blocked)

## Construction

This hat is knit from the brim up. Square decreases shape the crown after the colorwork pattern is completed.

## Techniques and Tutorials

### ABBREVIATIONS

DPNs – double-pointed needles

CC1 – contrast color 1

CC2 – contrast color 2

CO – cast on

k – knit

k1CC2 – knit 1 stitch with contrast color 2

k1MC – knit 1 stitch with main color

k2tog – knit 2 stitches together

k1tbl – knit 1 through the back loop

m – marker

MC – main color

p – purl

p1CC2 – purl 1 stitch with contrast color 2

p1MC – purl 1 stitch with main color

pm – place marker

sm – slip marker

ssk – slip one stitch knitwise, slip one stitch knitwise, knit the stitches together through the back loops

st(s) – stitch(es)

## Hat

### Ribbing

With smaller needle and MC, CO 80 (88, 96) sts with a stretchy cast on. Pm and join in the round, being careful not to twist.

Ribbing Round: \*k1tbl, p1, repeat from \* until end of round.

Repeat Ribbing Round until ribbing measures 1 (1.25, 1.5) / 2.5 (3, 4) cm from CO.

Switch to **larger needle**. K 2 rounds in MC.

### Right Leaning Latvian Braid

*Some Latvian Braid Tips: Latvian Braids are created by twisting the working yarns around each other on Round 2, and then twisting them in the opposite direction on Round 3. While working Round 2, the yarns get more difficult to manage as the twist develops, but don't bother untwisting them – they will resolve themselves in Round 3. One suggestion is to set the balls or skeins of working yarn across the room as you work Round 2 to give some distance along which the twists can develop and make it more manageable.*

Round 1: Join **CC2**. \*k1MC, k1CC2, repeat from \* until end of round.

Round 2: Move both yarns to the front. \*P1MC, bringing CC under the working MC yarn, p1CC2, bringing MC under the working CC2 yarn, repeat from \* until end of round.

Round 3: \*bringing MC over the working CC yarn, p1MC, bringing CC2 over the working MC yarn, p1CC2, repeat from \* until end of round.

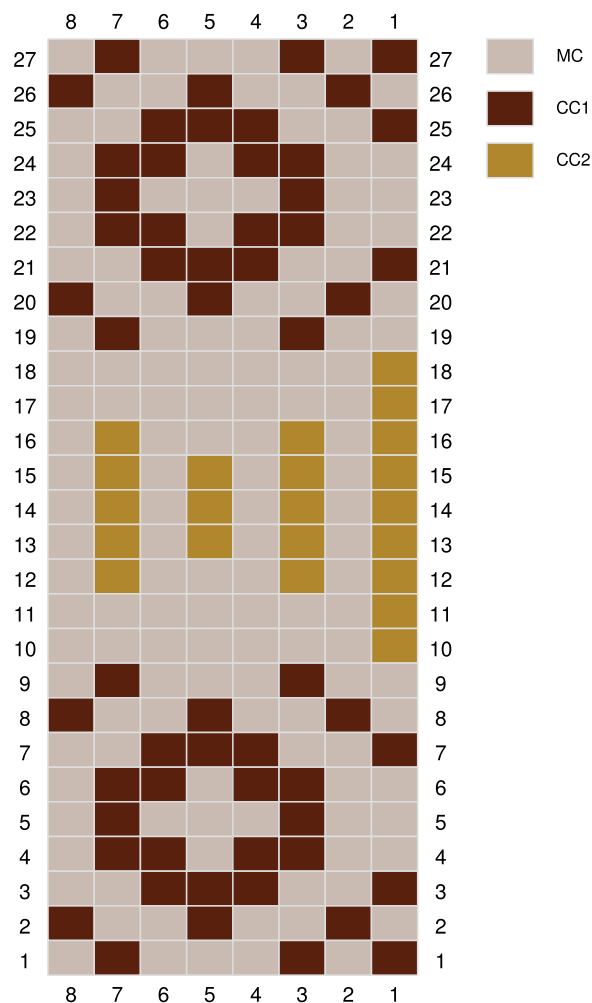
Break CC2, k 1 (2, 3) rounds in MC.

### Colorwork Chart

Joining CC1 and CC2 when appropriate, work the colorwork chart shown on right. You will work a total of 10 (11, 12) repeats of the chart in each round.

Break CC1 and CC2.

K1 (1, 2) rounds in MC.



### Crown

Setup Round: \*k20 (22, 24), pm, repeat from \* until end of round.

Round 1 (Decrease Round): \*k1, k2tog, k to 2 sts before m, ssk, sm, repeat from \* until end of round. 8 sts decreased.

Round 2: k all sts.

Work Rounds 1 and 2 a total of 5 (6, 7) times. 40 sts remain. Switch to DPNs when work circumference requires.

Work decrease rounds only until 16 sts remain.

Round 3 (Decrease Round): \*ssk, k2tog, repeat from \* until end of round. 8 sts decreased.

Cut MC. Pull tail through the remaining sts.

Weave in ends. Block to measurements. Enjoy!
